QUICK HITS

- The Miami Hurricanes continue their third season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Oct. 5 at California. Kickoff for Miami's first trip to Berkeley since 1990 is set for 10:30 PM EDT.

- Miami is off to a 5-0 start for the first time under Cristobal's direction. The Hurricanes opened their conference slate with a 38-34 win over Virginia Tech at Hard Rock Stadium on Fri., Sept. 27.

- QB **Cam Ward** became the first Hurricanes quarterback in history to open his career with five straight performances of 300 passing yards or more; last time out, Ward threw for 343 yards and four touchdowns.

- Miami is looking to start a season 6-0 for the first time since 2017, when it started the season 10-0.

- Berkeley will also be the host site for ESPN's College Gameday show - the 25th time the show has involved a game with Miami (15-9 all-time record).

STORYLINES + NOTABLES

- Miami is looking to continue a strong start to Atlantic Coast Conference play when it travels to play Cal on Sat., Oct. 5. Miami opened its ACC slate with a 38-34 win over Virginia Tech and is traveling to Cal to play the Golden Bears for the first time since 1990 - a 52-24 win.

- Bolstered by the addition of several impressive newcomers and anchored by a talented group of returning veterans, Miami was ranked No. 19 in both preseason polls - and checked in at No. 8 in both the Associated Press poll and LBM Coaches Poll on Sept. 29.

- Among Miami's top newcomers is QB **Cam Ward**, who was named ACC Preseason Player of the Year in a poll of media at the conference's annual media day in Charlotte, N.C. Selected to nearly every major award watch list, Ward became the first quarterback in Miami Hurricanes history throw for 300 yards and three or more touchdowns in his first five starts of the year.

THE MATCHUP

• #8/#8 Miami continues the 2024 season - its third under head coach **Mario Cristobal** - on Sat, Oct. 5 at Cal. Kickoff for UM's ACC road opener is set for 10:30 p.m. EDT from California Memorial Stadium in Berkeley, Calif.

• Cal is in its first year in the ACC and is hosting UM for the first time since Sept. 15, 1990 - a 52-24 win for Miami. The Hurricanes and Golden Bears last met in the 2008 Emerald Bowl in San Francisco - a 24-17 Cal victory.

• UM is looking to start the season 6-0 for the first time under Cristobal and first time since 2017 (10-0). Berkeley will also be the host site for ESPN's College Gameday - the 25th time Miami has participated in a CGD game.

A LOOK BACK: MIAMI HOLDS ON IN ACC OPENER

• The Hurricanes opened their Atlantic Coast Conference schedule in thrilling fashion last time out, topping visiting Virginia Tech, 38-34, at Hard Rock Stadium on Fri., Sept. 27. Trailing for nearly the entire game, Miami took a fourth-quarter lead with 1:57 remaining and held on despite a near conversion on a Hokies' Hail Mary attempt.

• QB **Cam Ward** was responsible for five touchdowns on the day, including one rushing touchdown. He threw for 343 yards and four touchdown passes, finishing 24-for-38 with two interceptions to help Miami start the year 5-0.

• Ward is tied for the national lead with five games of 300 yards, encompassing all of 2024. His five-game streak of at least 300 yards and three TDs is the longest since Tyler Van Dyke had six straight such games to end 2021.

• DB **Meesh Powell** had his team-high third interception of 2024. DB **Jadais Richard** led Miami with eight tackles.

• It was the Hurricanes' first win to open ACC play since 2020, a 47-34 decision at Louisville. The Hurricanes had lost three straight ACC openers (2021 - Virginia, 2022 - North Carolina, 2023 - Georgia Tech) previously.

MIAMI CHECKS IN AT #8 IN BOTH MAJOR POLLS

• Following its 38-34 win over Virginia Tech last time out, Miami dropped one spot to No. 8 in the Associated Press top 25 (from No. 7) and moved up one spot to No. 8 (from No. 9) in the LBM Coaches Poll released on Sept. 29.

• Following a 56-9 win over Florida A&M on Sept. 7, the Hurricanes cracked the top-10 of the Associated Press poll on Sept. 8 at No. 10. It was the first time Miami has been ranked in the AP top 10 since Dec. 6, 2020 (No. 9).

• Bolstered by the addition of several impressive newcomers and anchored by a talented group of returning veterans, the Hurricanes are ranked in the top 25 of both preseason polls - checking in at No. 19 in both polls.

• **Mario Cristobal's** highest-ranked team as head coach came in the final 2019 polls, when Oregon was No. 5/5.

• The Hurricanes were not ranked in the 2023 preseason polls, but were ranked in the 2022 preseason polls in Cristobal's first year as head coach, checking in at No. 16 in that year's coaches poll and No. 17 in the AP top 25.

• Miami spent four weeks in the top 25 of 2022 (preseason, Sept. 6, Sept. 11, Sept. 18 polls) and also cracked the top 25 rankings of both polls for four weeks in 2023 (Sept. 10, Sept. 17, Sept. 24, Oct. 1). It has been in the rankings of both polls for the first four weeks of 2024.

RESTREPO BECOMES 10th CANE TO ECLIPSE 2,000

• With a six-catch, 99-yard performance vs. USF on Sept. 21, WR **Xavier Restrepo** became the 10th Hurricane in program history to eclipse 2,000 career receiving yards. Over his career, Restrepo has totaled 2,139 yards.

• Earlier this season against Florida A&M (104 yards), the eighth 100-yard game of Restrepo's career moved him past Andre Johnson (1,831) and Allen Hurns (1,891) into 10th place in program history.

• With 60 yards vs. Virginia Tech last time out, Restrepo moved past Phillip Dorsett (2,132) into ninth place. He needs eight yards to pass No. 8 Travis Benjamin (2,146), 20 to pass No. 7 Mike Harley (2,158) and 22 to pass No. 6 Leonard Hankerson (2,160). With 80 more yards, he'd move past Stacy Coley (2,218) into the top-five in history.

• With his eighth career 100-yard performance, Restrepo tied Andre Johnson for the most games with 100 receiving yards by a Miami player since 2000. He was previously tied with Santana Moss and Phillip Dorsett (7 each).

UM STARTS 5-0 FOR 4TH TIME SINCE JOINING ACC

• With a 38-34 victory over Virginia Tech last time out, the Hurricanes improved to 5-0 to start the season for the first time since 2017, when they started 10-0. Prior to 2017, the Hurricanes last started a season 5-0 in 2013 (7-0).

• Miami has only started 5-0 four times since joining the ACC - 2004 (6-0), 2013 (7-0), 2017 (10-0) and 2024 (5-0).

NEW HURRICANES SIGNALCALLER: QB CAM WARD

- Miami added one of the top quarterbacks in the country in the January transfer window, signing QB **Cam Ward** after two dominant years at Washington State. Ward, who began his career at FCS program Incarnate Word in 2020, started all 25 games of his Washington State career across 2022 and 2023. He finished his time at Wazzu with 6,963 passing yards and 48 passing touchdowns compared to 16 interceptions, and also added 13 rushing touchdowns in his two years with the Cougars.
- In a win over USF on Sept. 21, Ward became the 13th player to surpass 15,000 career passing yards in college - he now has 15,658 yards. He became the first ACC player since Miami joined (2004) with at least 300 passing yards and three touchdowns in each of their first five games and the first Miami quarterback to ever do so.
- Ward's 1,035 yards through the air in his first three games were the second-most in program history over a three-game start to the season, trailing only Craig Erickson's 1,126 in 1990. He passed Gino Torretta's 1991 start (989) with 346 in a 62-0 win over Ball State. Ward exited the first four games early with UM sporting substantial leads.
- In his first start as a Hurricane, Ward threw for 385 yards, three touchdowns and one interception on 26-for-35 passing in a road win over Florida. The 385 yards were the most by a Hurricane quarterback in the first start of his Miami career in the modern era of Hurricanes Football (since 1979). He added 33 rushing yards on three carries.
- Ward became the first Hurricane player in program history to throw for 300 yards in his first two starts when he tossed for 304 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions against Florida A&M. He also rushed for a touchdown in the victory to help propel Miami to a 2-0 start.
- He was the first Miami quarterback to throw for 300 yards and three touchdowns in a season opener since Ken Dorsey did so at Penn State in 2001. Ward was named ACC Quarterback of the Week and Maxwell Award National Player of the Week for his performance against the Gators. He was also named Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week, a member of the Davey O'Brien Award "Great Eight" and a Manning Award Star of the Week.
- He passed for 2,260 yards and an FCS-leading 24 touchdowns against four interceptions with two rushing touchdowns in six games during the shortened 2020-21 FCS season, which was played in spring 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He won the Jerry Rice Award as the most outstanding freshman in Division I FCS.
- Ward was named the ACC Preseason Player of the Year in a poll of conference media at the league's annual "ACC Kickoff" event in Charlotte. Before transferring to Washington State, Ward was named Southland Conference Offensive Player of the Year in his final year at UIW (2021), totaling 4,648 passing yards and 47 touchdowns.
- A native of West Columbia, Texas - with a population of 3,700 - Ward was a "zero star" recruit out of high school. Though he starred in high school, he threw for only 1,070 yards as a junior and had 12 passing attempts per game as a senior due to the program's focus on running the football.
- Among active players entering the 2024 season, Cam Ward's career total yardage of 14,140 at the FBS / FCS level far surpassed No. 2 Will Rogers (11,999), No. 3 Seth Henigan (11,483), No. 4 Grayson McCall (11,118) and No. 5 Shedeur Sanders (10,293). Since 2020, Ward and former Auburn / Oregon QB Bo Nix (14,110) were the only players to have surpassed 14,000 yards of total offense (pass and rush). He added 413 yards Week 1 vs. UF.

TIGHT ENDS SHINING THROUGH FIRST FIVE WEEKS

• A season after the entire group finished with 154 receiving yards and one touchdown in 2023, Miami's tight ends have emerged as go-to options for QB Cam Ward in 2024. In the season opener vs. Florida, **Elijah Arroyo** had a career-best 89 yards on four catches, **Cam McCormick** opened the game's scoring with his first touchdown as a Hurricane, and freshman **Eliza Lofton** had two catches for 38 yards vs. the host Gators in a lopsided win.

• Last time out in a 38-34 win over Virginia Tech, the group had five catches, 125 yards and two touchdowns.

• Through five weeks, Miami's tight ends have totaled 491 yards on 26 catches with six touchdown receptions.

GUIDRY'S DEFENSE CAUSING MAYHEM FOR TEAMS

• Entering Week 6, the Hurricanes rank No. 5 in the nation in "defensive mayhem" - plays on defense featuring a tackle for loss, an interception or a gained fumble. Despite no fumbles gained, Miami has a 16.33% mayhem rate on defense; the Hurricanes have a 9.94% sack rate, a 13.33% tackle-for-loss rate and a 5.52% interception rate.

OFFENSE HAS THREE STRAIGHT 50-POINT GAMES

• Miami scored 50 points for the third straight game on Sept. 21, topping USF 50-15. The last time Miami had a season featuring three offensive outputs of at least 50 points was 2001 - when it won the national title. Miami had never scored 50 points in three consecutive games prior to this season. UM is No. 2 in FBS in scoring offense.

BARON ONE OF JUST 14 WITH 7.5 TFL THIS YEAR

• One of Miami's most important offseason additions came on the defensive line, when DE **Tyler Baron** arrived to Coral Gables after an impressive career at Tennessee. Baron enrolled at Louisville for the spring but elected to transfer to the Hurricanes, where he has shined through the first five weeks of the 2024 season.

• Baron, who has started all five games, is one of just 14 players in FBS with 7.5 tackles for loss. Baron has 18.0 career sacks - which ranks as 15th-highest active career total among all FBS players. The Knoxville, Tenn., native started once again and put together only the 10th three-sack game over the last 20 years by a UM player vs. Florida A&M. He was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his performance vs. the Rattlers.

Despite the personnel losses, Miami ranks as the No. 12 performing secondary in FBS by pass coverage by PFF (91.0 grade).

• Miami ranks No. 35 nationally in passing yards allowed (168.0), No. 13 nationally in passing yards per completion (15.28), No. 2 nationally in passes intercepted (8) and No. 12 in FBS in team passing efficiency defense (90.50).

UM RANKS AMONG BEST TEAMS IN MIDDLE EIGHT

• In the "middle eight" rankings - which tracks the scoring in the final four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half, widely considered the most critical juncture of the game - Miami was No. 16 in FBS in the first two years under **Mario Cristobal**.

• The Hurricanes have taken another leap this year; Miami is ranked No. 10 in FBS in middle eight this year (+7.4).

• From 2014-2019, teams that won the "middle eight" minutes of the game at the FBS level won 74% of the time.



BORREGALES TIED FOR THIRD-MOST ACTIVE FGs

• One of the top kickers in the country for the entirety of his career with the Miami Hurricanes, K **Andy Borregales** is enjoying a senior year that could leave him atop the Miami record books among the best kickers in history.

• Last time out, Borregales kicked a career-long 56-yard field goal just before halftime - it was tied for the fourth-longest field in Miami Hurricanes history. It was his 62nd career made field goal - the fourth-most in UM history.

• Borregales had eight points last time out vs. Virginia Tech (one field goal, five extra points), moving him to 330 career points. After UM's win over Ball State, Borregales moved past Todd Sievers (310) for fourth in career points.

• Borregales, whose older brother Jose is the lone Lou Groza Award winner in Miami history (2020), went 22 for 26 on field goals in 2023, tied for the most made kicks in the Atlantic Coast Conference. He converted 44 of his 45 extra point attempts and recorded 46 touchbacks on 73 kickoffs. He was also an All-ACC first-team honoree.

• His 62 career field goals are the fourth-most in Miami history, trailing only Michael Badgley (77), Carlos Huerta (73) and Jon Peattie (64). Among active FBS kickers, Borregales is one of just five in the country who have more than 60 career field goals, joining Jonah Dalmas (Boise State - 83), Alex Raynor (Kentucky - 66), John Hoyland (Wyoming - 62) and Graham Nicholson (Alabama - 61).

WE RUN THIS STATE: HURRICANES LEAD THE WAY

• Among what is commonly referred to as the "Big Three" programs in the Sunshine State - Miami, Florida and Florida State, the Hurricanes are now the all-time state leaders in both wins vs. in-state opponents and winning percentage. UM's win against Florida was its 100th and propelled UM to the best winning percentage in the state.

CONTINUITY ON COACHING STAFF ENTERING 2024

• **Mario Cristobal** made significant changes to his coaching staff from Year 1 (2022) to Year 2 (2023) at Miami, including both coordinator positions and several other assistants prior to last year. Entering 2024, however, the Hurricanes returned eight of 10 "full-time" assistants, including both coordinators - **Shannon Dawson** and **Lance Guidry**, who are in their second seasons at Miami.

• The only two new faces to the "full-time" coaching staff are running backs coach **Matt Merritt**, who joined from USF, and cornerbacks coach **Chevis Jackson**, who arrived from Marshall - where he worked with Guidry in 2022.

TRIO OF WIDE RECEIVERS LEADING THE WAY IN '24

The Miami Hurricanes were the only team in the nation to have three players named to the preseason watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, honoring the nation's top pass-catcher: WR **Sam Brown**, WR **Jacolby George** and WR **Xavier Restrepo**. Along with Isaiah Horton, UM's wide receiver group has been impressive through five games.

• The trio garnered significant preseason praise, and with good reason: since 1997, there were only five other instances of an FBS team entering a season with three players who each had 800 receiving yards the year prior:

CANES PLACED FIVE ON ACC'S PRESEASON TEAM

• No team placed more players on the ACC's preseason all-conference football team than the Hurricanes, who saw five individuals recognized with the distinction. Highlighting the list was QB **Cam Ward**, who was named Preseason Player of the Year. Joining Ward were WR **Xavier Restrepo**, DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, LB **Francisco Mauigoa** and K **Andy Borregales**. Ward earned 71 of a possible 170 votes for Preseason ACC Player of the Year.

• Restrepo delivered one of the best seasons by a Miami wide receiver in program history a year ago, starting all 13 games. He set the program single-season record with 85 catches and posted just the sixth 1,000-yard campaign in Miami history with 1,092 yards and six touchdowns

• Bain Jr., the reigning ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year, dominated his competition in his first season of collegiate action in 2023. Bain was a consensus Freshman All-America last fall, posting 44 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks.

• An All-ACC Second Team pick in 2023, Mauigoa started all 13 games and led Miami with 82 tackles. Mauigoa posted a team-best 18 tackles for loss to go along with 7.5 tackles for sacks in his first campaign in the orange and green after two seasons at Washington State.

• Borregales served as Miami's primary placekicker for the third straight year last season and earned first-team All-ACC honors for the first time. He was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, finishing 22-for-26 on field goal attempts and 44-for-45 on extra point attempts.

22 FRESHMEN MAKE IMPACT IN WIN OVER FAMU

• 22 Miami freshmen played against Florida A&M on Sept. 7, and many made critical plays to help the Hurricanes start 2-0 for the third straight year. RB **Jordan Lyle** scored the first touchdown of his career, DL **Justin Scott** had his first career sack, while LB **Bobby Pruitt** and LB **Adarius Hayes** each recorded their first interceptions.

• Lyle scored another touchdown in Miami's win over Ball State, while several other freshmen earned key snaps in the 62-0 win. The Hurricanes' 2024 class was the highest-rated group in the 247Sports composite recruiting era.

MAJOR STRIDES IN YEAR TWO UNDER CRISTOBAL

• The Hurricanes were among the nation's most improved teams in almost every statistical category in their second year under head coach **Mario Cristobal**'s direction. Offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson** and defensive coordinator **Lance Guidry** enter their second seasons in 2024, after guiding units that jumped to No. 24 nationally in total defense (up from No. 64 in 2022) and No. 31 nationally in total offense (No. 85).

MAUIGOA BROTHERS A FORCE ON FIELD AND OFF

- Brothers **Francisco** and **Francis Mauigoa** spent their first seasons in Coral Gables together in 2023 and delivered an immediate impact for the Hurricanes. Both have started the first five games for the Hurricanes in 2024.
- Francisco, who goes by "Kiko," was a second-team All-ACC linebacker after starting all 13 games and leading UM in tackles with 82. He also ranked among the top players nationally with 18.0 tackles for loss and had 7.5 sacks.
- Francis, who goes by "Sisi," entered the season as a five-star high school prospect and delivered on his potential as a Freshman All-America at right tackle. He started all 13 games and was a key member of a group named to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, honoring the nation's top offensive line unit.
- The elder Mauigoa, who spent the first two seasons of his career at Washington State before transferring ahead of his junior season, switched from jersey #51 to #1 prior to this year. His 18.0 tackles for loss last season are the most of any Power-4 returning player entering 2024.
- The Mauigoa Family is from Pago Pago, American Samoa; Fa'alialia and Telesia Mauigoa have three sons who all went on to become Power 5 football players. In addition to Francis and Francisco, their eldest son, Frederick, had a four-year career at Washington State, where he started his final 39 games at center.

CRISTOBAL'S PROVEN TRACK RECORD STACKS UP

- **Mario Cristobal** is one of only nine active FBS head coaches to have won multiple Power-5 titles, one of only two coaches to have won two titles in six years or fewer (Ryan Day), and one of only six with a Power-5 championship game appearance rate of 50% or better (three in six years). He won two Pac-12s and a Rose Bowl at Oregon. He also pulled in two of the best recruiting classes in Oregon history (2020, 2021) before his departure to Miami.

MIAMI RANKED AMONG BEST IN "THREE-AND-OUT"

- Excluding OT, Miami's defense forced a three-and-out on 28.7% of its drives in 2023, which ranked fourth-best in the ACC and 10th best in FBS. On the other side of the ball - excluding overtime - Miami's offense went three-and-out on just 17.0% of its drives, which ranked fourth best in the ACC and 41st best in FBS.

ONLY MIAMI HAD FRESHMEN AAs IN ALL 3 PHASES

- Mario Cristobal reeled in the best recruiting class in Miami history in 2023 - eventually topped by the 2024 class - and produced three Freshman All-Americans: DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** P **Dylan Joyce** & OL **Francis Mauigoa**.

Though he starred in high school, he threw for only 1,070 yards as a junior and had 12 passing attempts per game as a senior due to the program's focus on running the football.

- Among active players entering the 2024 season, Cam Ward's career total yardage of 14,140 at the FBS / FCS level far surpasses No. 2 Will Rogers (11,999), No. 3 Seth Henigan (11,483), No. 4 Grayson McCall (11,118) and No. 5 Shedeur Sanders (10,293). Since 2020, Ward and former Auburn / Oregon QB Bo Nix (14,110) are the only players to have surpassed 14,000 yards of total offense (pass and rush).

MIAMI SIGNS TOP RECRUITING CLASS EVER...AGAIN

- For the second straight year, the Miami Hurricanes reeled in the best recruiting class in program history by the 247Sports Composite Rankings. The Hurricanes' incoming group was ranked No. 4 in the nation.
- Miami's group featured six players ranked in the Top247 rankings: DL **Justin Scott** (No. 11), DL **Marquise Lightfoot** (No. 34), DL **Armondo Blount** (No. 39), DB **Zaquan Patterson** (No. 63), WR **JoJo Trader** (No. 70) and WR **Ny Carr** (No. 98).
- Five others cracked the Top247 rankings - DL **Booker Pickett** (No. 142), TE **Elija Lofton** (No. 181), WR **Chance Robinson** (No. 185), DL **Artavius Jones** (No. 233) and RB **Jordan Lyle** (No. 237) - bringing Miami to 11 players in the Top247. UM signed 12 players that were ranked inside the ESPN300, including five rated in the top 50.

- Miami's 2023 class was ranked No. 8 in the nation by 247Sports and produced three Freshman All-Americans.

UF WAS FIRST NON-CON ROAD OPENER SINCE '01

- The last time Miami opened a season in a true non-conference road game was 2001, when the Hurricanes traveled to Penn State and topped the Nittany Lions, 33-7. The Hurricanes have had multiple neutral site openers since - including Alabama in Atlanta in 2021, Florida in Orlando in 2019 and LSU in Arlington, Texas in 2018.
- UM opened the 2003 season at Louisiana Tech, but played the game in Shreveport, not at the Tech home venue.

"HURRICANE BAIN" WAS 2023 ACC DEFENSIVE ROY

• One of the top performers in the nation last season was DL **Rueben Bai, Jr.**, who enjoyed a dominant rookie campaign that resulted in ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors. The 6-foot-3, 275-pound defensive lineman tallied 44 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks over 13 games, earning consensus Freshman All-American honors. He was also selected to the All-ACC Third Team.

• Bain's uncle, Tolbert Bain, lettered for the Hurricanes from 1984-1987. His older brother, Reggie, is an offensive line graduate assistant. The rising sophomore, who was named to the preseason watch lists for the Bednarik and Lombardi Awards, has a nickname "Hurricane Bain" - a writeup from the Miami Herald on the moniker is below:

• *The "Hurricane" started swirling almost 30 years ago, years and years before Rueben Bain was even a thought in his father's mind and long before the elite edge rusher was one of the crown jewels of the Miami Hurricanes.*

It all started, fittingly, at "Traz" Powell Stadium in Miami, where Rueben Bain Sr. — just like his son — played his home games and wreaked havoc as a two-way lineman for Carol City. Willie Wilcox, the stadium's iconic public address announcer, gave him the nickname because of his physicality and tenacity, inspired by the story of wrongfully imprisoned boxer Rubin Carter.

It turned out to be something like a premonition from Wilcox. After a solid career with the Chiefs, Bain Sr. graduated, played at Division II Morris Brown College in Atlanta, moved back to Florida, where he started a family. He had a few sons and gave one his own name, and, with it, his own nickname, once Bain Jr. started playing for Miami Central and Wilcox realized who he was. He became the latest in a long line of Bains to star athletically in Miami-Dade County, starting with grandfather Herman Bain, who was a three-sport star at Northwestern.

It turns out, Wilcox had something like a premonition...he also embodied the nickname in a way not even his father could, with four state championships in four years, 58 1/2 sacks across his final two seasons at Central and finally a nod as the MaxPreps Florida Player of the Year on Tuesday." -David Wilson, Miami Herald, December 2022

MARTINEZ JOINS TALENTED BACKFIELD AT THE U

• In addition to QB **Cam Ward**, the Hurricanes added another important offensive skill player in the second transfer portal window - RB **Damien Martinez**, who joined after spending his first two years at Oregon State.

• Martinez inserts himself into Miami's backfield fresh off of the best season of his collegiate career, rushing for 1,185 yards and nine touchdowns last year for the Beavers. Martinez was the Pac-12's third-leading rusher last season and a First-Team All-Conference selection. Martinez has started all five games for Miami at tailback; in a win at USF, he recorded the first three-TD game against an FBS opponent by a UM running back since Mark Walton in 2016.

• The Lewisville, Texas native had 2,167 career rushing yards and 16 career rushing touchdowns entering his career at Miami, while sporting a career rushing average of 6.1 yards per carry (355 career attempts). He rushed for a season-high 146 yards last year vs. Stanford. His career-high for a game (178 yards) came in 2022 vs. Colorado.

• Martinez joined a running back room that includes **Mark Fletcher Jr.**, who earned a starting job as a true freshman in 2023 by year's end but missed the spring after surgery on his leg, **Ajay Allen**, speedster **Chris Johnson Jr.**, and talented freshman **Jordan Lyle**.

O-LINE PLAY WAS KEY TO MIAMI'S 2023 GROWTH

• The Hurricanes had one of the top performing offensive lines in the nation a season ago, and many of those contributors are back in 2024. Miami's group was named to the midseason honor roll for the 2023 Joe Moore Award, honoring the nation's top offensive line unit. Starting left tackle **Jalen Rivers**, starting right guard **Anez Cooper** and starting right tackle **Francis Mauigoa** all return.

• Joining that trio of returners is veteran center **Zach Carpenter**, who made 25 starts at Indiana over the previous three seasons (2021-2023). Carpenter started 20 times at center and five times at right guard during his career with Indiana, where he arrived after redshirting his freshman season (2020) at Michigan.

• Impressive statistics for Miami's offensive line from Pro Football Focus entering the 2024 season:

• Of all ACC offensive linemen entering 2024, Carpenter had the second-best "blown block" rate - just 0.8%, trailing only Logan Parr of SMU (0.7%).

• Miami led the ACC and ranked 10th in the nation in runs stopped for a loss or for no gain - just 15.2%.

• Of the 17 teams in the ACC, Miami was first in highest yards-per-rush before contact last season, and also ranked first in lowest rate of pressures allowed. UM's pass-blocking efficiency was 91.0 - third-best in the ACC.



DAWSON'S PASSING OFFENSE IMPRESSED IN 2023

- Under the direction of first-year offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson**, who arrived at Miami as an "air raid" coaching disciple, the Hurricanes ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total team offense last year, averaging 431.2 yards per game – including 258.0 passing yards, which was second-best in the ACC
- The Hurricanes had two of the top receivers in the conference and in the country last year, in **Xavier Restrepo** (1,092 yards) and **Jacolby George** (864), who ranked second and third in the ACC in receiving yards
- 2023 was the first time since the Hurricanes joined the ACC that two players from the same school ranked in the top three in receiving yards in the conference in the same year
- There were only 31 seasons of 1,000 yards last year – one of which was Xavier Restrepo (1,092), who set Miami's season catch record with 85 catches
- Miami's average yards per play jumped to 6.51 in 2023, the second-best mark in the ACC and the No. 22 best mark in the country
- The Hurricanes ranked in the top 30 nationally in yards per play, total offense, least amount of passes intercepted and completion percentage, and in the top 40 nationally in scoring offense and passing offense.

BARROW, JONES HONOR MIRA (#10), DOOLEY (#42)

- For the first time since originally being retired, the jersey numbers 10 (**Simeon Barrow**) and 42 (**Artavius Jones**) will be worn by Hurricanes on the field in 2024.
- There will be a jersey patch for both Barrow and Jones honoring George Mira Sr., and Jim Dooley, respectively, whose numbers are among the most recognizable in Miami history but have not been worn since their retirement.

From their respective University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame bios:

George Mira Sr.

"Mira Sr. will long be remembered by Hurricane fans as one of Miami's greatest quarterbacks and perhaps the 'Canes greatest player ever. In his three year career, Mira set numerous passing records, some of which are still in the record books. During his career, Miami once again gained national prominence, reaching the 1961 Liberty Bowl, the first bowl appearance in 19 years. Mira was the quarterback and passer for the '60's, he could drop back and pass and scramble when he had to, which earned him his nickname "The Matador". In 1962 Mira lead the Hurricanes to the Gotham Bowl in New York City and proved to the country that he was the real deal"

Jim Dooley

"Jim Dooley is a football legend at the University of Miami. Dooley was the first Hurricane football player to have his jersey number retired, #42, the first Hurricane player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, to the Chicago Bears, in 1952, and the first, and only, UM player to be an NFL head coach. Jim came to the University of Miami in 1947 after a stellar high school career at Miami High. As a junior and senior Dooley was a true "sixty minute man" playing both offense and defense. He set several records during his UM days, 17 interceptions on defense and over 1,000 yards rushing on offense. In 1951, Dooley intercepted 10 passes and was named first-team All-American by the associated Press. Dooley played in both the 1951 Orange Bowl Classic and the 1952 Gator Bowl where he earned MVP honors and setting a Gator Bowl record with 4 interceptions.

FIFTY YEARS AND COUNTING FOR #NFLU STREAK

- With four players selected in the 2024 NFL Draft, the Miami Hurricanes extended their streak to 50 consecutive years with at least one NFL Draft selection. The Hurricanes trail only Michigan (1939), USC (1939) and Florida (1952) in consecutive years with at least one pick; Miami's streak began in 1975 and continued in 2024.

HEAD COACH MARIO CRISTOBAL

THIRD SEASON | MIAMI, 1993

Career Record: 79-73 | UM Record: 17-13 | ACC Record: 6-10

Mario Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons before arriving at Miami.

The Hurricanes showed tremendous growth from Year 1 to Year 2 under Cristobal's direction; Miami was No. 24 in total defense and No. 31 in total offense in all of FBS in 2023, jumping 40 spots in total defense (up from No. 64) and 60 spots in total offense (up from No. 85). Miami pulled in the top two recruiting classes in program history in the modern era by every ranking in his two full cycles - the No. 7 class in the nation in 2023 and the No. 4 class in 2024.

Cristobal brought more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen. Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season. During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.

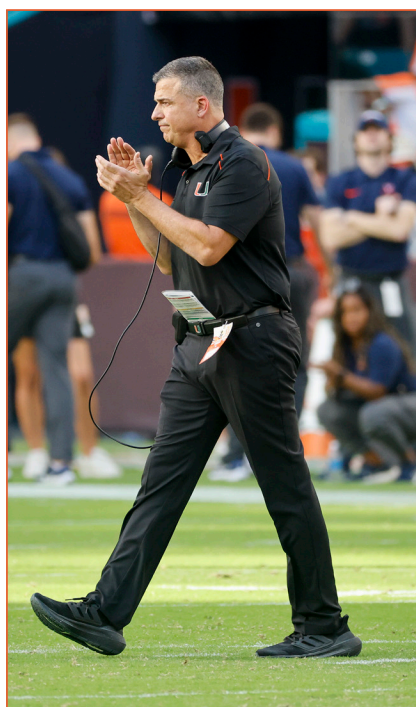

And when you can reduce the venerable Swamp on a season-opening Saturday to the decibel level of a church service on Sunday you deserve to take a bow.

The Miami Hurricanes defeated the Florida Gators 41-17 Saturday at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium before a crowd of 90,544. The 19th-ranked Canes improved to 1-0, while Florida fell to 0-1.

It was a thoroughly dominant performance from start to finish. The Canes racked up 529 total yards, while limiting Florida to just 261. Miami held a nine-minute edge in time of possession and converted all five red zone opportunities.

Quarterback **Cam Ward** dazzled with his arms, his legs and his poise, completing 26 of 35 passes to 10 different receivers for 385 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Wide receiver **Xavier Restrepo** caught 7 of those passes for 112 and one score, while tight end **Elijah Arroyo** had four grabs for 89 yards.

Running back **Damien Martinez** rushed for 65 yards, while fellow back **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** scored two rushing touchdowns. Safety **Jaden Harris** paced the Canes with seven tackles and one interception, while linebacker Francisco Mauigoa had six tackles and a sack. Miami's defense totaled three sacks and eight tackles for loss and held Florida to just 1 of 9 on third down.

Running back Montrell Johnson, Jr. rushed for 106 yards on 11 carries for the Gators. Quarterback Graham Mertz threw for 91 yards and one interception before being replaced in the fourth quarter.

"Certainly when you play an opponent of that caliber, playing against the SEC in their home stadium and getting a convincing win like that is great," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "But the most important thing we talked about in there was that for the first time in a long time Miami's had the chance to play a big-time game to start the season and now we've got to show that we can handle that success. We're in steps. We're in stages. But today was a really, really big step."

UM ROLLS PAST RATTLETS IN HOME OPENER

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- After a dominant win at Florida to open the season, the 12th-ranked Miami Hurricanes were determined to carry that momentum into their home opener.

They scored touchdowns on their first three drives of the first half. They scored touchdowns on their first three drives of the second half. They racked up 548 yards and yielded only 194 yards. They didn't allow a touchdown. They never punted.

The end result was a comfortable 56-9 win over Florida A&M on Saturday evening before a crowd of 57,886 at Hard Rock Stadium. The Canes improved to 2-0, while the Rattlers fell to 2-1.

Quarterback **Cam Ward** completed 12 of his first 13 passes and finished 20 of 26 for 304 yards and three touchdowns. He also scored on an eight-yard rush before calling it a night. Wide receiver **Xavier Restrepo** continued his stellar start to the season with four catches for 104 yards, including a 50-yard touchdown.

Running back **Damien Martinez** rushed for 90 yards and his first touchdown as a Cane.

Defensive **Tyler Baron** paced an impressive defensive effort with three sacks. Linebackers **Wesley Bissainthe**, **Cameron Pruitt** and **Adarius Hayes** each had interceptions. Overall, the Canes amassed five sacks and 10 tackles for loss, holding the Rattlers to just 52 yards on the ground and allowing them to convert only 3 of 13 third down opportunities.

Florida A&M quarterback Daniel Richardson completed 13 of 17 passes for 135 yards, while wide receiver Jamari Gassett had five receptions for 61 yards.

"It was good to play a lot of players tonight," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "Certainly a lot of young guys got action and actually played at a high level, particularly the defensive line. They seemed to get relentless pressure on the quarterback and did a good job stopping the run. It was good to see those freshman linebackers get in there and get a couple interceptions as well.

CANES CRUSH CARDINALS, MOVE TO 3-0

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- Never mind the Top 10 ranking, the weekly accolades and the gaudy stats. The Miami Hurricanes are approaching every game this season in the same laser-focused fashion. "The most important game of the year is at 3:30 on Saturday and we're looking forward to it," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said earlier this week. The Canes played like it. Miami dominated from start to finish Saturday against Ball State, defeating the Cardinals 62-0 before a crowd of 51,564 at Hard Rock Stadium in a game that was delayed more than two hours due to lightning in the area. The 10th-ranked Canes improved to 3-0 on the season. Ball State fell to 1-1. The 62-point shutout was Miami's largest ever shutout against an FBS opponent. The Canes racked up a program-record 750 total yards, averaging 10.6 yards per play. Miami's 159 points through the first three games of the season are its most ever. "From start to finish I thought we became a better football team," Cristobal said afterwards. "I thought we left the field different than how we entered. Just finishing drives, getting them off the field on three-and-outs more successively. Our third-down defense continued to play at a high level and got a shutout. All in all, a really good performance and looking forward to a great opportunity next week." Quarterback **Cam Ward** turned in another sensational performance, completing 19 of 28 passes for 346 yards and a career-high five touchdowns. Ten of his 19 completions went for 20-plus yards. Wide receiver **Jacolby George** caught six passes for 109 yards and one score — the third 100-yard game of his career. Fellow wideout **Xavier Restrepo** continued his strong start to the season with three receptions for 47 yards and two touchdowns. Running back **Ajay Allen** had 104 yards on just seven carries with a 56-yard touchdown run. The Canes punted just once, and their eight touchdown drives averaged 1:45 of clock time.

MIAMI

TAMPA, Fla. -- The crowd was fired up. The upper deck was unleashed. Even fighter jets zoomed overhead at the outset.

But while the USF Bulls delivered on a raucous home-field environment, the Miami Hurricanes ultimately – and emphatically — passed another road test. The eighth-ranked Canes pulled away in the second half to notch a 50-15 win over USF Saturday night before a gathering of 58,660 at Raymond James Stadium.

Miami improved to 4-0 for the second straight season, while the Bulls fell to 2-2. Down 15-14 in the second quarter, the Canes scored 36 consecutive points, shutting out USF 28-0 in the second half.

"Proud of our guys for responding like they did. It's the first time we've actually trailed this year," Miami coach Mario Cristobal said. "In the second half we played cleaner and better Miami Hurricane football."

Quarterback Cam Ward threw for 404 yards and three touchdowns, surpassing 15,000 passing yards for his career. Running back Damien Martinez had three short touchdown runs, and wide receiver Isaiah Horton had a career night with eight catches for 108 yards and a score.

"He's been great for a long time," Horton said of Ward. "As soon as he got on campus, he made his mark instantly. I love playing with him."

Wide receiver Xavier Restrepo had six catches for 99 yards and one touchdown, eclipsing 2,000 career receiving yards. Fellow wideout Sam Brown, Jr. had a 76-yard touchdown reception and running back Jordan Lyle rushed for 104 yards on just six carries, including a 91-yard scoring scamper.

USF quarterback Byrum Brown completed 19 of 30 passes for 254 yards and caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from wide receiver Sean Atkins, who had 11 receptions of his own for 125 yards.

Miami amassed 574 total yards — averaging 9.6 yards per play — and converted 7 of 9 third downs. The Canes' defense pitched a shutout in the second half and racked up four sacks and seven tackles for loss. Linebacker Francisco Mauigoa paced Miami with 11 tackles, while safety Meesh Powell had nine stops and an interception. Defensive tackle Simeon Barrow recorded six tackles and a sack.

UM RALLIES, BEATS VT IN WILD ACC OPENER

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- The seventh-ranked Miami Hurricanes had raced out to a 4-0 start to their season. But they knew that conference play hits different.

In their ACC opener, the Canes and the Virginia Tech Hokies traded punches all evening long in a rollicking, roller-coaster affair at Hard Rock Stadium. In the end the game came down to one last play – and one last review – and it was Miami that left the field with its first conference win.

The Canes rallied from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to score a wild, 38-34 win before 59,539 delirious fans on their home field. Miami improved to 5-0, 1-0 in the ACC. Virginia Tech fell to 2-3 overall, 0-1 in conference play.

Quarterback **Cam Ward** threw for 342 yards and four touchdowns to offset three turnovers. He also ran for 57 yards and a score, leading Miami to touchdowns on its final three drives of the game. But the Hokies drove 45 yards in the final two minutes to set up a Hail Mary throw on the last play. It was initially ruled a touchdown but then reversed, giving the Canes their first 5-0 start in seven seasons.

“Obviously a tremendous game,” head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. “We overcame a lot of stuff, a lot of self-inflicted issues to find a way to pull it out. They’re a really good football team...certainly it wasn’t our best performance but when you play in conference we tell our guys all the time expect it to be playoff football because that’s what you’re going to get.

“I’m proud of the way we just kept fighting, even when we were two scores down and got behind two scores again.”

Miami racked up 508 total yards and found its rushing groove in the second half with 132 yards on the ground. Wide receiver **Xavier Restrepo** paced the Canes with five catches for 60 yards, while wide receiver **Jacolby George**, wide receiver **Isaiah Horton**, tight end **Elijah Arroyo** and tight end **Cam McCormick** each had scoring grabs. Running back **Damien Martinez** gained 60 tough yards on 14 carries. Miami converted 10 of 16 on third down and possessed the ball for nearly 33 minutes.

Cornerback **Jadais Richard** led the Canes with eight tackles, while linebacker **Wesley Bissainthe** added six stops. Safety **Meesh Powell** had three tackles and an interception.
