#### SEMINOLES TRAVEL SOUTH TO FACE MIAMI IN CORAL GABLES

Florida State, which defeated Syracuse in its most recent game, travels to play at Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla., on Wednesday, January 8, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. The game is scheduled to be televised on the ACC Network. The Seminoles defeated the Orange, 90-74, as they reached the 90-point scoring mark in an ACC game for the first time this season, and for the third time in the last two seasons. Florida State has won 13 of its last 14 games played against the Hurricanes since a 103-94 overtime win in Tallahassee on January 27, 2018. Included in that stretch of games is a six-game winning streak by the Seminoles at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables -- a streak that began with a 78-66 win on January 27, 2019. Following Wednesday's game at Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at Clemson on Saturday, January 1, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. Florida State begins a two-game ACC homestand against Pittsburgh on January 15, 2025, at 9:00 p.m.

#### SEMINOLES' HAMILTON IS RANKED FOURTH ALL-TIME FOR REGULAR SEASON ACC VICTORIES

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton won his 193<sup>rd</sup> career regular season ACC game as he led the Seminoles over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee to move into sole possession of fourth place in ACC history for regular season conference wins. Hamilton enters Wednesday's game at Miami ranked fifth in ACC history with 429 overall wins, fifth in ACC regular season and ACC Tournament victories with 207, tied for ninth with 15 ACC Tournament victories, fifth among ACC coaches with 18 career NCAA Tournament victories, fourth in the ACC with 125 ACC homecourt wins, and sixth with 93 ACC road wins.

#### FLORIDA STATE DEFENSIVELY LEADS THE ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS AND STEALS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Miami ranked as the ACC leaders in blocked shots (73 blocked shots / 5.2 bpg) AND steals (128 seals / 9.14 spg). The Seminoles totaled six blocked shots in their win over Syracuse on Saturday and have earned at least six blocked shots in seven of their first 14 games of the season. The Seminoles also totaled nine steals against the Orange and have totaled at least nine steals in eight of their first 14 games.

#### WATKINS AND EWIN WITH MATCHING 11-GAME DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING STREAKS

Senior All-American candidate Jamir Watkins (215 total points / 19.5 ppg) and junior All-ACC candidate Malique Ewin (179 total points / 16.3 ppg) enter Wednesday's game against Miami having scored in double figures in each of the Seminoles' last 11 games – each game since November 15 against Florida. As the Seminoles' top two scorers through the first 14 games of the season (Watkins is ranked third in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 19.3 ppg scoring average while Ewin is averaging a career-high 13.3 points per game), the duo is averaging a combined 32.6 points per game – more than 41 percent of the Seminoles' total scoring out for the season. Watkins is only two points shy of scoring in double figures in all 14 games while Ewin is just 14 points shy of a season-long double-figure scoring streak.

#### DAQUAN DAVIS TIES FLORIDA STATE RECORD FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST SYRACUSE

Freshman guard Daquan Davis totaled 18 points and was a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line in Florida State's 90-74 win on Saturday. He enters Wednesday's game against Miami ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the ACC with a .811 free throw shooting percentage.

...Defeat Miami and gain a win over the Hurricanes for the 14<sup>th</sup> time in the last 15 games between the two teams. The Seminoles' current streak began with a 103-94 win over the Hurricanes on January 27, 2018, in Tallahassee;  
...Defeat Miami and win its fourth consecutive game played against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles' streak of consecutive wins over Miami began with an 85-84 win over the Hurricanes on February 25, 2023, in Coral Gables;  
...Defeat Miami and win its seventh consecutive game against the Hurricanes – a streak that began with a 78-66 Seminole win at the Watsco Center on January 27, 2019.

Noting All-America Candidate

Jamir Watkins

Jamir Watkins – I have switched my number this season from No. 2 to No. 1 for my final collegiate season. I wore both No. 0 and No. 1 in high school at Trenton Catholic, No. 0 during my career at VCU, and No. 2 during my first season at Florida State. I think it's a great looking number. I will also become the first player in my family to earn a college degree and I want to show the younger members of my family that they, too, can earn a college degree.

FLORIDA STATE IS THE SECOND-TALLEST TEAM IN THE NATION

Florida State has been measured as the nation's second-tallest team in the nation by Ken Pomroy's analytics. The Seminoles' roster contains 12 players listed at 6'5 or taller, 10 at 6'7 or taller, five taller than 6'10, and one seven-footer. Florida State is annually one of the tallest and lengthiest teams in all of college basketball. According to analytics supplied by the legendary Ken Pom, Florida State was the tallest team in the nation during the 2023-24 season.

FLORIDA STATE ENTERS WEDNESDAY'S GAME AVERAGING 79.1 POINTS SCORED PER GAME

Florida State has scored at least 90 points in three different games (92 in its victory over UMass, 91 in is victory over Western Carolina, and 90 in its victory over Syracuse) and enters Wednesday's game against Miami ranked fifth in the ACC with a 79.1 points per game scoring average. The Seminoles' scoring average ranks them fifth in the ACC for the second consecutive season. Florida State's 79.1 points per game scoring average is its highest scoring average since averaging 80.2 points scored per game during the 2017-18 season

SEMINOLES' HAVE SCORED 90 POINTS THREE TIMES THIS SEASON

Led by All-American candidate Jamir Watkins' team-leading 19.3 points per game scoring average, the Seminoles have scored 90 or more points in three different games this season. The Seminoles scored 90 points or more five times during the 2023-24 season (94 in its victory over Kennesaw State, 94 in its victory over Central Michigan, 91 in its victory over North Florida, 92 against Louisville, and 90 in its victory over NC State).

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Miami shooting .711 from the free throw line and has shot better than 71 percent in each of its last five games. The Seminoles have shot 71 percent or better from the free throw line in each of their games since December 7 against NC State and are shooting nearly 80 percent from the line as a team since their ACC opener against the Wolfpack. Florida State is shooting .784 percent (58 of 74) and is averaging 19.6 made free throws in each of its first three ACC games of the 2024-25 season.

SEMINOLES FINDING THEIR RANGE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State averages 6.5 made 3-point shots per game through its first 14 games of the 2024-25 season and has made at least seven 3-point field goals made in eight of its 14 games this season. The Seminoles have made 22 3-point field goals in their last eight games, are averaging 7.3 made 3-point field goals in those last three games, and are shooting .378 from the 3-point line during that stretch of three games.

SEMINOLES RANKED THIRD IN ACC IN TURNOVER MARGIN

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami tied for third in the ACC with a +2.8 turnover margin and is ranked first in the ACC in forcing turnovers by its first 14 opponents (+15.7 turnovers forced per game). The Seminoles have earned a positive assist:turnover mark in eight of its first 14 games including a 17 assists and 9 turnover ratio in its win over Syracuse on Saturday. The Seminoles have totaled 30 assists (17 against Syracuse and 13 against Louisville) against only 18 turnovers (nine each against Syracuse and Louisville) in their last two games.

DOUBLE, DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Malique Ewin (21 points and 15 rebs) and Taylor Bol Bowen (13 pts and 13 rebs) both earned double-doubles in Florida State's 82-64 win over Winthrop. The double-doubles by Ewin and Bol Bowen marked the first time since January 21, 2021, that two Seminoles recorded double-doubles in the same game. RaiQuan Gray (10 points and 11 rebounds) and Malik Osborne (11 points and 10 rebounds) earned double-doubles in an 81-59 win over Miami at the Tucker Center.

Florida State vs. Miami – The Last Game

Darin Green Jr. scored 26 points to lead Florida State to an 83-75 victory on March 9, 2024 at the over Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The win marked the Seminoles' third straight and 12th in its last 13 games against Miami. The win moved Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton into a tie for fourth in ACC history with Maryland's Gary Williams with his 192nd career ACC regular season victory. Green Jr. tied his career-high with eight 3-point field goals made for a season-high 26 points. He previously made eight 3-point field goals against St. John's on December 17, 2022. Green Jr. came within four points of tying his career-high of 30 points in the Orange Bowl Classic game against the Red Storm. Green's eight 3-point field goals made marked the sixth time in school history that a player had made at least eight triples in a single game. The Seminole record for 3-point field goals made is 10 by George McCloud at La Salle on February 23, 1989. Following a pregame ceremony honoring seven seniors who've played integral roles in the success of the Seminoles program for Senior Day, Florida State struck first with a Jamir Watkins steal turned into a dunk within the first minute of play.

## Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

**.417** Senior All-America candidate Jamir Watkins is shooting .417 from the 3-point line (10 of 24) the last four games. He made a career-high tying four 3-point shots and scored 25 points in Florida State's game against Louisville on December 21.

**.500** Freshman Daquan Davis is shooting .500 from the 3-point line (four of eight) in the last two games. He has made two 3-point shots each against Louisville and Syracuse.

**.600** Sophomore Taylor Bol Bowen is shooting .600 from the field (15 of 25) and averaging 11.7 points scored per game in the last three games.

**.800** Freshman Alier Maluk is shooting .800 from the field (four of five) and averaging 4.5 points in the last two games against Louisville and Syracuse.

**DAQUAN DAVIS PERFECT FORM THE FREE THROW LINE**

Freshman Daquan Davis **BECAME THE FIRST FRESHMAN IN SCHOOL HISTORY** to finish perfect on at least 10 free throw attempts in a single game in school history as he made 10 of 10 free throws (all in the second half) in Florida State's 90-74 win over Syracuse on Saturday. He became the first player to accomplish the feat since Matthew Cleveland was 10 for 10 at Duke on December 31, 2022 – during his sophomore season. Davis is the eighth player in school history to make at least 10 of 10 free throws in an ACC game.

**DAVIS AND WATKINS NOW SHARE THE PERFECTION HONOR**

Daquan Davis (10 of 10 against Syracuse on January 4, 2025) and senior All-America candidate Jamir Watkins (11 of 11 against Wake Forest on January 9, 2024) are two current Seminoles who have finished perfect on at least 10 free throws in a game as Seminoles. The record for perfection from the free throw with the most free throws made and attempted in a single game is 16 of 16 by Bob Sura against South Florida on November 19, 1994.

...He has earned at least one assist in 12 consecutive games, has 30 assists, and ranks third on the team in assists (30 / 2.1 apg);

## **Alier Maluk Becoming A Standout For the Seminoles**

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – Adapting to change isn't just a skill for Florida State freshman forward Alier Maluk, it's been the foundation of his basketball journey.

He was born in the South Sudan in East Africa. At age three, he moved from Kenya to Western Pennsylvania where he began playing basketball. He attended school in Baldwin and Bethel Park, Pa., (suburbs of Pittsburgh) and began blossoming as a sophomore in high school at Imani Christian Academy in the heart of Pittsburgh.

As a sophomore at Imani Christian, he averaged 15.1 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.1 blocks per game as the Saints went 23-6, winning WPIAL and PIAA Class A titles. In the state finals he had 20 points, 11 rebounds and three blocks.

Following his successful sophomore season at Imani Christian, he and his family chose to transfer to Long Island Lutheran – a national high school basketball powerhouse.

With his addition to the Lutheran roster in August 2023, the team was ranked No. 3 in the National Interscholastic Basketball Conference (NIBC) preseason rankings. Maluk averaged 5.2 points and 3.8 rebounds while leading the Crusaders with 26 blocked shots in conference play during his only season at Long Island Lutheran.

Maluk participated in the USA Basketball Men's Junior National Team minicamp in 2022 and helped Lutheran advance to the quarterfinals of the Geico National Championship Tournament in 2023.

After his successful season at Lutheran and head-turning play in the Nike Elite Youth Basketball League that spring Maluk and his family faced another adjustment period. A long line of coaches hoped to lure the talented forward to their campus.

Maluk and the Seminoles (10-4, 1-2 ACC) travel south to face the Miami Hurricanes (4-10, 0-3 ACC) on Wednesday night at the Watsco Center. The game begins at 7:00 and will be televised on the ACC Network.

Because he had earned enough high school credits, Maluk was eligible to reclassify himself academically and graduate a year early. Originally a member of the high school class of 2025, he graduated from Long Island Lutheran in 2024.

"Reclassification wasn't always the plan for me," said Maluk. "My circle of family and coaches helped me make that decision as I progressed through high school and continued to develop as a player."

As a top-25 national prospect, Maluk committed to Florida State because of the culture within the program and the history that head coach Leonard Hamilton and his coaching staff have of preparing players to reach the next level.

"Coach Hamilton and his staff help their players to reach their goals. I want to be the next Seminole to achieve my goals under this staff," said Maluk the day he signed to play for Hamilton at Florida State.

Maluk, a cousin of Bol Bol a 7-3 forward who plays for the Phoenix Suns, chose Florida State over Maryland, LSU, Ohio State, and Pittsburgh. Maluk received his first scholarship offer while he was in the eighth grade from current Seminole assistant coach Kevin Nickelberry when he was an assistant coach at LSU.



He has quickly and seamlessly adjusted to life as a student-athlete at Florida State since his arrival in Tallahassee in August.

Maluk cites his biggest adjustments in assimilating himself into life as student-athlete have been getting used to the speed and physicality of the college game. He has played in 13 of the Seminoles' 14 games and averages 3.1 points scored per game. Maluk is tied for second on the team in blocked shots with 10, is shooting right at 50 percent from the field, and is playing an average of more than 10 minutes per game.

Hamilton has certainly noticed how quickly Maluk has adjusted from starring in high school to helping the Seminoles to a 10-4 record.

"Alier came in against Syracuse and was very comfortable," said Hamilton. "I thought he was active, changing shots, contesting, and blocking shots. He didn't have any hesitation once he got the ball from an offensive standpoint. He wasn't doing that earlier this year when he was very hesitant. He is growing up and maturing. I think you are going to continue to see him get better and better."

While Maluk has successfully faced his challenges during his transition from becoming a high school student athlete to a college student-athlete, he has also aced his academic transition.

During his first semester on campus, he helped the Seminole basketball team achieve a cumulative grade point average of 3.059.

"The easiest part of my transition to becoming a student-athlete at Florida State has been academically," said Maluk. "The toughest part of the transition would be practices after traveling to and from games. The academic counselors are great; they provide all of the help we need to be successful in the classroom."

Maluk earned a 3.0 grade point average in his first semester with his first collegiate grade of A in his Public Administration and Society class. He has chosen communications as his major.

Not only has the coaching staff realized Maluk's potential to be a top player in the Seminoles' program throughout his career, but that potential has been observed by his teammates.

"I feel like Alier is more mature, and learned a lot during his first semester at Florida State," said roommate Bostyn Holt. "He's learned how to balance his academic assignments with long days at practice. Because I am around him every day, I can see the growth he's made, and continues to make each day."

As he continues to carve out his place on the team, Maluk is illustrating why he is destined to fit and thrive in garnet and gold.

The Seminoles led 68-64 with 2:15 remaining in regulation before the Wolfpack outscored the Seminoles 6-2 to tie the game at 70-70 and force overtime. NC State then scored nine of the first 11 points of the overtime period to take the upper hand in the extra session. The Seminoles were only able to cut the deficit to five as the Wolfpack scored 14 of the 18 total points scored in the overtime period.

Game 11 -- Florida State 77, Tulane 64

SUNRISE, Fla. -- Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 29 points, the Seminoles benefited from an early 29-4 run and defeated Tulane, 77-64, in the Orange Bowl Classic at the Amerant Bank Arena. Watkins drew 14 fouls and was 19 of 23 from the free throw line in reaching 29-pointstg plateau for the second time this season. His 19 free throws made are a career-high and the fourth most made in a single game by a Florida State player. Watkins also contributed five assists, four rebounds, and one steal in his standout performance. He was chosen as the MVP of the Seminoles' victory. After surrendering the first six points of the game, Florida State scored13 consecutive points and led 13-6 at the 13:56 mark of the first half. The Seminoles' extended their lead to 24-10 at the 8:34 mark and to 34-17 at the 3:10 mark Florida State led 37-22 at halftime. Watkins, 11 points, and junior Malique Ewin led the Seminoles with 10 points in the first half. Florida State made 11 of 21 field goals, shot .524 percent from the field and earned seven assists in the first 20 minutes of play. The Seminoles' defense limited Tulane to .286 shooting from the field and 22 points. Florida State forced nearly as many turnovers (seven) as it allowed baskets (eight) in the first half.
