FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO MIAMI AT TUCKER CENTER WEDNESDAY NIGHT AT 9 P.M.

Florida State, which has won two of its last three ACC games, plays host to Miami on Wednesday, February 19, 2025 at 9:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles defeated the Hurricanes, 80-65, earlier this season on January 8, 2025 at the Watson Center in Coral Gables. Florida State has won 13 of the last 14 games played – including each of the last four games -- against Miami. The Seminoles current streak began with a 103-94 overtime win against the Hurricanes on January 27, 2018 in a game played in Tallahassee. The Seminoles are 6-1 at home against Miami and 7-0 on the road against the Hurricanes. Florida State is 15-2 against The Hurricanes since a 75-57 win in Coral Gables on February 1, 2017. Following Wednesday's game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to Louisville to face the Cardinals at the KFC YUM! Center (Saturday, February 22 at 12 Noon) before playing North Carolina in an ESPN Big Monday game (February 24, 7:00 p.m.). Including Wednesday's game against Miami, the Seminoles have three home games remaining on their 2024-25 regular season home schedule – Miami, North Carolina, and SMU (March 8, 4:00 p.m.).

LEONARD HAMILTON DAY SET FOR MARCH 8

Florida State Athletics will honor men's basketball head coach Leonard Hamilton on Saturday, March 8, following the Seminoles' regular season finale against the SMU Mustangs. Tipoff for the game is set for 4 p.m. The regular season finale will also serve as Senior Day. Tickets are available for all three remaining home games Hamilton, who recently announced his resignation effective at the end of the season, holds the FSU record with 436 career wins and is the fifth-winningest coach in the history of the Atlantic Coast Conference. In 23 seasons at FSU, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 16 postseason appearances and at least 20 wins 12 times. His Seminoles won the 2012 ACC Tournament championship, the first ACC basketball championship in program history, and earned the school's first ACC regular-season title in the 2019-20 season.

HAMILTON NEEDS TWO ACC WINS TO EARN 200 CAREER ACC REGULAR SEASON VICTORIES

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game against Miami ranked fourth in ACC history with 198 career regular season ACC victories. He needs just two regular season ACC wins to become just the fourth coach in the illustrious history of the league to win 200 or more regular season conference games.

HAMILTON IS THE ACC'S FIFTH ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton is all-time winningest coach in Florida State history and the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He is No. 5 in the ACC rankings alongside Mike Krzyzewski (Duke, 1,129 wins), Dean Smith (North Carolina, 879 wins), Roy Williams (North Carolina, 485), Gary Williams (Maryland, 461) and Hamilton (Florida State, 436).

SEMINOLES TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE IN TURQUOISE UNIFORMS AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State will wear its distinctive Nike Seminole Heritage turquoise uniforms in its game against Miami. It marks the 32nd time the Seminoles will wear the uniforms since first wearing them on November 17, 2013, in an 89-61 win over UT Martin. Florida State most recently wore the turquoise uniforms against Stanford on January 25, 2025. The Seminoles' game against Miami marks the second time they will wear the Heritage uniforms against Miami – the Seminoles won the first game by a 65-64 margin on January 11, 2022.

Jamir Watkins – "I have switched my number this season from No. 2 to No. 1 for my final collegiate season. I wore both No. 0 and No. 1 in high school at Trenton Catholic, No. 0 during my career at VCU, and No. 2 during my first season at Florida State. I think it's a great looking number. I will also become the first player in my family to earn a college degree and I want to show the younger members of my family that they, too, can earn a college degree."

FLORIDA STATE IS THE SECOND-TALLEST TEAM IN THE NATION

Florida State has been measured as the nation's second-tallest team in the nation by Ken Pomeroy's analytics. The Seminoles' roster contains 12 players listed at 6'5 or taller, 10 at 6'7 or taller, five taller than 6'10, and one seven-footer. Florida State is annually one of the tallest and lengthiest teams in all of college basketball. According to analytics supplied by the legendary Ken Pom, Florida State was the tallest team in the nation during the 2023-24 season.

HAMILTON NEEDS JUST FOUR REGULAR SEASON ACC WINS TO REACH 200 FOR HIS CAREER

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton needs just two regular season ACC victories to become just the FOURTH coach in the history of the ACC to win 200 regular season ACC games. He is the fourth-winningest coach in ACC history with 198 regular season victories and took sole possession of fourth place in the annals of the ACC with the Seminoles' win over Syracuse on January 4th in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE AGAINST MIAMI

The Florida State men's basketball team will continue its tradition and wear its special turquoise Nike Seminole Heritage uniforms in Wednesday's game against Miami to raise awareness for bringing the sport to Native American and Aboriginal youth. It marks the 32ndtime (and fourth time this season) the Seminoles will wear the special uniforms. This season (2024-25) marks the 12th consecutive season the Seminoles will wear the turquoise uniforms. Florida State makes a distinct departure from its traditional school colors to don turquoise Nike Seminole Heritage uniforms to stand for the importance of bringing sport and physical activity to Native American and Aboriginal youth. "The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program, and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms," said head coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Malique Ewin totaled his third career double-double of 20 points and 10 rebounds, the Seminoles closed the game on a 30-7 run, and defeated Miami, 80-65, at the Watsco Center on January 8, 2025. Ewin totaled 12 second half points and totaled four second half rebounds as Florida State won its second consecutive ACC game and earned its first ACC road win of the season. The Seminoles improved to 11-4 and 2-2 in the ACC. Miami fell to 4-11 and 0-4 in ACC play. Ewin led three Seminoles in double-figure scoring with his 20 points. Also in double figures were Taylor Bol Bowen with 16, and Jamir Watkins with 10. Both Ewin and Watkins have now scored in double figures in 12 consecutive games - each game since November 15. Bol Bowen was spectacular from 3-point range as he made all four of his attempts from long range. He added six rebounds and three assists. Daquan Davis, in the third ACC start of his career, totaled a career-high 10 assists. He also scored nine points and added three rebounds. Davis's night included 10 assists and only one turnover in 25 minutes of playing time. The 10 assists by Davis allowed the Seminoles to earn a season-high 26 assists on 32 baskets made. The Seminoles took the lead for good on two free throws by Jerry Deng at the 10:52 mark of the first half.

Leonard Hamilton's Trailblazing Career Started With Kentucky Basketball, Should End In HOF

Leonard Hamilton wanted to be the best Dow Chemical salesman in the nation.

At least, that's what he told himself after abruptly resigning as an assistant men's basketball coach at Austin Peay when he learned he wouldn't be considered for the head coach position.

Then coach Joe B. Hall and Kentucky basketball came calling.

Hamilton spent just a few days at his new job before tendering a resignation he wasn't sure who to give it to because everyone was out to lunch when Hall called to offer him a job. Hamilton wrote a "To whom it may concern" letter, left it on someone's desk and immediately packed up his belongings to leave Charlotte, North Carolina, for Lexington.

Now, 51 years after becoming the first Black assistant coach in UK program history, Hamilton brings his Florida State squad to the KFC Yum! Center for a final time as head coach to take on Louisville on Saturday.

Hamilton announced earlier in February that he will resign at season's end. His legacy will live on, thanks to his influence on a generation of coaches, players and programs, which is why Hamilton belongs in the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame

"I never, ever thought about anything other than doing the job that I was charged with," Hamilton said. "I don't worry about the past, and I don't worry about the future. I worry about that which I can control. And, if I do a good job on Sunday, I'm going to have a better Monday."

Hamilton's had a lot of better days.

Hamilton's win total is at 658 heading into Wednesday's game against rival Miami, which is also a program that reaped the benefits of having him lead it. The Hurricanes disbanded men's basketball from 1971-85. Hamilton took over in 1990, guided them to three NCAA Tournaments and won the Big East during the 1999-2000 season for their first conference title of any affiliation in program history.

"Some people can write books on just winning championships and starting on second and third base," said Missouri's Dennis Gates, who was an assistant under Hamilton from 2011-19.

"Leonard Hamilton can write a book on starting outside the ballpark, getting in a ballpark, getting in a dugout, painting the lines, making sure the grounds are right, and then getting in a batter's box to take a swing, to try to get on first base, second base, third base and then get to home. He's got that whole perspective. That's Hall of Fame worthy."

Hamilton has always taken on challenges of bad jobs and made them better.

He took Oklahoma State, his first job as a head coach, to its first postseason in six years when the Cowboys made the NIT in 1989.

Hamilton is the winningest coach in Florida State's history. He led the Seminoles to their first ACC Tournament Championship in 2012 and was awarded another in 2020 for winning the regular season when the league's tournament was canceled due to COVID-19.

Hamilton's never been to a Final Four, and his 2020 team was best suited to make a run. It finished ranked fourth in the AP Top 25 Poll and fifth in the Coaches Poll and had five future NBA players on its roster, including San Antonio guard Devin Vassell and Chicago Bulls forward Patrick Williams.

That was a team that Gates thought was built to make it to the Final Four and win a championship. He was so convinced that when he was offered the chance to coach Cleveland State in August 2019, he seriously considered not taking the job. Hamilton wasn't having it.

"He made my decision easy, where a lot of head coaches will put the golden handcuffs on somebody and give them a raise," Gates said. "He kicked me out of the nest and said, 'You'll be great,' and gave me the added assurance and confidence that I'd be great."

Hall knew Hamilton would be great.

The Wildcats were nearly knocked out of the 1973 NCAA Tournament by the Austin Peay team Hamilton helped recruit. His prize signee was James "Fly" Williams, whom Hamilton won over in part because he stayed in New York for several days recruiting him, sleeping in his car during the process. Williams scored 26 points in the Governors' upset bid, but UK won 106-100 in overtime in the NCAA Mideast regional semifinals.

Hall knew UK had to shed its reputation of being slow to integrate. Hamilton's presence helped erase any negative perception from the past.

"Bringing in Leonard Hamilton was maybe the best hire the basketball program as a whole has made even back since Adolph Rupp," said Jack "Goose" Givens, who starred on the Wildcats' 1978 national championship team. Givens arrived the same time Hamilton did in 1974.

There were a few Blacks in athletics. There were fewer on campus who were just students. Merion Haskins, who played forward at UK from 1973-77, said the players had a sense of pride having Hamilton as an assistant coach.

Hamilton knew what that was like as the player who integrated Tennessee-Martin's men's basketball team. So he began the work of bringing in players that Hall otherwise might have missed on getting. Hamilton did his best to help the players off the court, too, by arranging social outings like trips to the movies and dinners.

"He single-handedly resurrected and saved the program during a time where Black student athletes, it wasn't popular for them to go to Kentucky," Gates said. "He did something for an institution to help them diversify. And it's still standing."

Hamilton had work to do to win over hearts within Lexington's Black community, too, as many at the time were not moved to support the program.

Hamilton learned this firsthand while getting a haircut at a barbershop. Customers who did not know what he looked like spent the entire time he sat in the chair disparaging his name as the new UK assistant. Hamilton waited until his cut was finished to introduce himself and let them know he wasn't going anywhere.

Those are some of the battles behind the scenes Hamilton fought, but his father instilled in him to never make excuses for something he didn't accomplish. He cleared those obstacles without ever letting on they were there in the first place.

That's one of the reasons he's admired by so many of his former players.

"It's the silent giant that goes unheard of," Haskins said. "He was that solid person that's in the background. It's not necessarily always in the statistics who was making the most impact for these colleges and universities. Everybody

looks at, 'Oh my God, he's All-American, and he played (for the) University (of) Kentucky.' That's great, fantastic. But guess what? There's someone who made him great."

LaVon Williams played guard at UK from 1976-80. The Colorado native would have ended up at Kansas or UCLA had it not been for Hamilton's arrival on staff. Williams said he didn't appreciate the pressure Hamilton must have felt as the first Black coach until later in life.

"As we get older and we go from generation to generation, now we understand what he sacrificed, the mental pressure he was under and just teaching us how to cope with things that a lot of people couldn't cope with," Williams said.

Hall didn't hire him to be a chaperone. He gave Hamilton the task of shaping UK's defense as a 26-year-old assistant. What Hamilton took from his 12 seasons under Hall helped form his philosophy as a head coach.

"He gave me a lot of responsibility, and that let me know, as a head coach, in order to help your staff become more prepared, you got to include them to give them an opportunity to grow and gain the confidence that it takes to move on and become a head coach," Hamilton said.

The word "trailblazer" can get thrown around too freely, but Hamilton literally paved the way for so many, including Kansas Hall of Fame coach Bill Self. He hired Self at Oklahoma State and gave him a wealth of responsibility at the age of 23. During Hamilton's first weekly radio show after making his retirement announcement, Self called into it to say thanks.

Hamilton's coaching tree includes SMU's Andy Enfield and many more at all levels of basketball. Hamilton's never been much of a self-promoter. At his news conference announcing his retirement, he was asked about the Hall of Fame, and he replied he's trying to get to heaven not the Hall. Well, there should be room for him in both.

Jamir Watkins: Florida State's Leader on and off the Court, Gears Up for Miami Matchup

TALLAHASSEE -- Jamir Watkins is not only Florida State's leading scorer but also a key leader among his teammates. As a two-year veteran and All-American candidate, he has developed a deep understanding of Florida State's structure and embraced his role as a leader.

Watkins' dedication to his craft is evident in his shooting ability and relentless practice routine. His commitment to improving his shot has made him the No 4 scorer in the ACC while blazing towards several scoring milestones.

Florida State's game against Miami is one of four Seminole Heritage games the Seminoles are scheduled to play this season. The Seminoles will wear their celebrated turquoise uniforms against the Hurricanes.

It should be a great night for Watkins who averages 20.7 points, 5.9 rebounds and 2.0 steals while shooting .414. from the 3-point line in seven career games while the Seminoles have worn the Seminole Heritage uniforms.

He enters Wednesday's game against Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center just 14 points from the 1,500 mark for his collegiate career. He is also approaching 1,000 career points at Florida State. Watkins needs just 36 points to become the 50th player in Florida State history to score 1,000 or more career points.

"I am extremely blessed," said Watkins. "I trust in the practice and have faith in the process."

Watkins has scored in double figures in his last four games and is averaging 14.3 points per game since scoring 19 points at Boston College. He has scored in double figures in 23 of Florida State's 25 games this season.

Heading into Wednesday's game against the Hurricanes, he is enjoying his best season from beyond the arc. He has already set a personal best for 3-pointers made in a single season (44) and has matched his best single-season 3-point shooting percentage (.344). Watkins is averaging a career-best 1.8 made 3-pointers per game and has hit at least one 3-pointer in 15 straight games.

His leadership extends beyond his scoring.

Teammates look up to Watkins not only for his on-court excellence but also for his work ethic.

"Jamir is such a great example of a leader," said sophomore Taylor Bol Bowen. "Obviously, he's such a great player, but it didn't come easy to him. He puts in a lot of work."

With many new Seminoles this season, Watkins was already well-known for his skills before they arrived at Florida State. Now, as their teammate, he has built strong connections with each of them.

"I looked up to Jamir first coming here, like, when I first committed, because he was all about playing defense," said freshman AJ Swinton. "I've always kind of looked up to him like I would an older brother."

Watkins' impact is also evident in his playmaking ability, as he has earned 215 career assists.

"I try to lead by example," said Watkins. "I am trying to be more verbal, get out of my shell and comfort zone in different ways on and off the court."

"The practice before a game I make sure to go hard, but also make sure everyone else is getting better."

As he continues to grow during his final collegiate season, Watkins is a leader among his teammates.

TALLAHASSEE -- Malique Ewin (21 points and 15 rebounds) and Taylor Bol Bowen (13 points and 13 rebounds) earned double-doubles and Florida State defeated Winthrop 82-64 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles opened up a close game late in the first half as they outscored the Eagles 14-15 over the final 4:17 of the first half, and took a 25-point second half lead in earning the victory at home. Jamir Watkins led four Seminoles in double-figure scoring with 23 points. Ewin (21 points), Chandler Jackson (14 points) and Bol Bowen (13 points) all contributed to Florida State's eighth victory in their last nine home games dating to February 20, 2024. Watkins led the Seminoles with 23 points, three 3-point shots made, and eight of eight made shots from the free throw line. He has made 27 of 31 free throws in his last two games. He ranks third in the nation with 88 free throws made in the first 12 games of the season. Ewin's 21 points and 15 rebounds marked his second career double-double. He started the game well as he totaled 13 points and nine rebounds in the first. His 21 points ranks as his second-highest point total of his career following his 23-point performance against NC State on December 3. His 15-rebound performance also ranks as the second best of his career just behind his 17-rebound performance at LSU on December 3.

SUNRISE, Fla. -- Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 29 points, the Seminoles benefited from an early 29-4 run and defeated Tulane, 77-64, in the Orange Bowl Classic at the Amerant Bank Arena. Watkins drew 14 fouls and was 19 of 23 from the free throw line in reaching 29-point plateau for the second time this season. His 19 free throws made are a career-high and the fourth most made in a single game by a Florida State player. Watkins also contributed five assists, four rebounds, and one steal in his standout performance. He was chosen as the MVP of the Seminoles' victory. After surrendering the first six points of the game, Florida State scored 13 consecutive points and led 13-6 at the 13:56 mark of the first half. The Seminoles' extended their lead to 24-10 at the 8:34 mark and to 34-17 at the 3:10 mark. Florida State led 37-22 at halftime. Watkins, 11 points, and junior Malique Ewin led the Seminoles with 10 points in the first half. Florida State made 11 of 21 field goals, shot .524 percent from the field and earned seven assists in the first 20 minutes of play. The Seminoles' defense limited Tulane to .286 shooting from the field and 22 points. Florida State forced nearly as many turnovers (seven) as it allowed baskets (eight) in the first half.
