## QUICK HITS

- The Miami Hurricanes wrap up their third season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Dec. 28 in the Pop-Tarts Bowl vs. Iowa State. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on ABC from Orlando.
- Miami has posted its first 10-win season since 2017 and only its second 10-win season since joining the ACC in 2004. UM is looking for its first 11-win season since 2003, when the Hurricanes finished 11-2.
- QB **Cam Ward**, the 2024 Davey O'Brien Award winner and a Heisman Trophy finalist, was named ACC Player of the Year in early December. Ward posted the best single season by a quarterback in Miami history, setting the program's single-season records for both yards (4,123) and TDs (36).
- Miami has an all-time record of 20-25 in bowl games, and is looking for its first win in a bowl game since topping West Virginia, 31-14, in the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl - a game also played in Orlando.

## STORYLINES + NOTABLES

- Miami is looking to wrap up its impressive 2024 season in winning fashion when it travels to Orlando for the 2024 Pop-Tarts Bowl on Dec. 28. With a win over Iowa State, the Hurricanes will secure their first 11-win season since 2003 and their first bowl victory since 2016.
- The Hurricanes ended the season just outside of the College Football Playoff, finishing as the No. 13 team in the final rankings before the start of the playoff released on Sun., Dec. 8. Miami finished the season with a 10-2 record and a 6-2 mark in conference play.
- Among Miami's top newcomers was Ward, who was named the winner of the Davey O'Brien Award honoring the nation's top quarterback on Monday, Dec. 9. Selected to nearly every major award watch list, Ward became the first player in Miami Hurricanes history to be named ACC Player of the Year. He was also named a consensus first-team All-American quarterback.

## THE MATCHUP

• #15/#16 Miami wraps up 2024 - its third season under head coach **Mario Cristobal** - on Sat, Dec. 28 in the Pop-Tarts Bowl vs. #19/#18 Iowa State. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on ABC from Camping World Stadium in Orlando.

• Saturday's game against the Cyclones represents the first-ever meeting between the two programs.

• Miami is looking to post 11 wins in a season for the first time since 2003, when the Hurricanes finished 11-2.

• Miami is playing in a bowl game for the 45th time in history and is 20-24 in 44 previous bowls. As a head coach, Cristobal has totaled a 3-3 bowl record, including a win at Oregon in the 2020 Rose Bowl.

## MIAMI WRAPPING UP IMPRESSIVE 2024 SEASON

• Despite falling to Syracuse in its regular season finale on Nov. 30, the Miami Hurricanes posted their first 10-win season since 2017, finishing 10-2 overall and 6-2 in ACC play. Miami ended the year No. 13 in the CFP rankings.

• Under the direction of head coach Mario Cristobal, Miami moved from five wins in Year 1 (2022, 5-7) to seven wins in Year 2 (2023, 7-6) to 10 wins in Year 3 (2024), 10-2) to continue an impressive trajectory.

• The Hurricanes posted their first undefeated season at home since 2002 and first regular season undefeated home slate since 2017. Miami had the No. 1 offense in America by nearly every metric during the regular season.

• QB **Cam Ward** became Miami's first Heisman Trophy finalist since 2002, and also won the Davey O'Brien Award as the nation's top quarterback. Both Ward and WR **Xavier Restrepo** were consensus NCAA All-Americans.

• Ward also became the first Hurricane to win ACC Player of the Year; he was also named ACC Offensive POY.

• Miami was ranked as high as No. 4 during the regular season, and ended the year ranked No. 13 in the year-end College Football Playoff rankings. In the new 12-team format, Miami ended the season as the "second team out."

## HURRICANES END YEAR AT #13 IN CFP RANKINGS

• Following a loss to Syracuse in their regular season finale in November, the Hurricanes checked in at No. 13 in the final College Football Playoff rankings on Dec. 8, listed as the "second team out" of the final 12-team field.

• **Mario Cristobal's** highest-ranked team as head coach came on Nov. 3, when UM was ranked No. 4 in both major polls (Associated Press, LBM Coaches Poll).

• Following a 56-9 win over Florida A&M on Sept. 7, Miami cracked the AP top 10 for the first time since Dec. 6, 2020 (No. 9). Following Miami's win over FSU on Oct. 26, UM cracked the AP top 5 for the first time since 2017.

• Bolstered by the addition of several impressive newcomers and anchored by a talented group of returning veterans, the Hurricanes were ranked in the top 25 of both preseason polls - checking in at No. 19 in both polls.

• Miami spent four weeks in the top 25 of 2022 (preseason, Sept. 6, Sept. 11, Sept. 18 polls) and also cracked the top 25 rankings of both polls for four weeks in 2023 (Sept. 10, Sept. 17, Sept. 24, Oct. 1). It was in the rankings of both polls for the entirety of the 2024 season heading into its bowl matchup with Iowa State on Dec. 28.

## RECORD 17 CANES EARN ALL-ACC RECOGNITION

• Seventeen Miami Hurricanes were recognized with end-of-season distinction from the Atlantic Coast Conference; Miami's 17 selections best the previous program record of 16, which was set during the 2017 season.

• QB Cam Ward, WR Xavier Restrepo, DT Simeon Barrow Jr. and PK Andres Borregales headlined the Miami student-athletes represented, as the quartet earned All-ACC First Team plaudits.

• TE Elijah Arroyo, OT Francis Mauigoa, LB Francisco Mauigoa and S Mishael Powell comprised the Hurricanes' second-team honorees. Restrepo and Borregales collected First Team All-ACC accolades for the second straight year, while Francisco Mauigoa took home second-team praise in back-to-back seasons.

• RB Damien Martinez, WR Jacolby George, OT Jalen Rivers, OG Anez Cooper, C Zach Carpenter, DE Tyler Baron, DE Rueben Bain Jr., DT Akheem Mesidor and CB OJ Frederique Jr. were All-ACC Honorable Mention.

## MIAMI HEADS BACK TO CAMPING WORLD STADIUM

• The Hurricanes have played in "The City Beautiful" Orlando multiple times for bowl games, including most recently, the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl. The Hurricanes also played in the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl, the 2013 Russell Athletic Bowl and the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl in the same stadium; Miami is 1-3 in bowl games in Orlando.

## EXCEPT FOR ONE: WARD A 2024 HEISMAN FINALIST

- Miami added one of the top quarterbacks in the country in the January transfer window, signing QB **Cam Ward** after two dominant years at Washington State. Ward, who began his career at FCS program Incarnate Word in 2020, started all 25 games of his Washington State career across 2022 and 2023. He finished his time at Wazzu with 6,963 passing yards and 48 passing touchdowns compared to 16 interceptions, and also added 13 rushing touchdowns in two years with WSU. He was one of four finalists to attend New York's Heisman Trophy ceremony.

- Ward won the 2024 Davey O'Brien Award and also became the first Miami Hurricane to ever win ACC Player of the Year honors. A consensus NCAA All-America, Ward additionally took home ACC Offensive Player of the Year.

- At the FBS level, Ward has 21 career performances of 300-or-more passing yards (including seven straight to start this season, the first UM quarterback to ever have seven consecutive 300-yard games). At the end of the 2024 regular season, 21 games of 300-or-more pass yards was the fourth-most among active FBS players.

- Ward (36) has more touchdown passes than any quarterback in Miami in a single season, surpassing Steve Walsh's previous UM standard of 29, set in 1988. A fifth-year senior, Ward (17,994) ended the regular season in third place on the NCAA's all-time, all-division passing list, trailing only Case Keenum (19,217) and Dillon Gabriel.

- Ward's 1,035 yards through the air in his first three games were the second-most in program history over a three-game start to the season, trailing only Craig Erickson's 1,126 in 1990. He passed Gino Torretta's 1991 start (989) with 346 in a 62-0 win over Ball State. Ward exited the first four games early with UM sporting substantial leads.

- In his first start as a Hurricane, Ward threw for 385 yards, three touchdowns and one interception on 26-for-35 passing in a road win over Florida. The 385 yards were the most by a Hurricane quarterback in the first start of his Miami career in the modern era of Hurricanes Football (since 1979). He added 33 rushing yards on three carries.

- He was the first Miami quarterback to throw for 300 yards and three touchdowns in a season opener since Ken Dorsey did so at Penn State in 2001. Ward was named ACC Quarterback of the Week and Maxwell Award National Player of the Week for his performance against the Gators. He was also named Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week, a member of the Davey O'Brien Award "Great Eight" and a Manning Award Star of the Week.

- He passed for 2,260 yards and an FCS-leading 24 touchdowns against four interceptions with two rushing touchdowns in six games during the shortened 2020-21 FCS season, which was played in spring 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He won the Jerry Rice Award as the most outstanding freshman in Division I FCS.

- Ward was named the ACC Preseason Player of the Year in a poll of conference media at the league's annual "ACC Kickoff" event in Charlotte. Before transferring to Washington State, Ward was named Southland Conference Offensive Player of the Year in his final year at UIW (2021), totaling 4,648 passing yards and 47 touchdowns.

- A native of West Columbia, Texas - with a population of 3,700 - Ward was a "zero star" recruit out of high school. Though he starred in high school, he threw for only 1,070 yards as a junior and had 12 passing attempts per game as a senior due to the program's focus on running the football.

• With a 42-14 victory over Wake Forest on Nov. 23, the Hurricanes made it 10 wins for only the second time since 2003 and first time since 2017. The Canes have not won 11 games since 2003, when they finished 11-2 overall.

## OFFENSE RANKS #1 IN EXPLOSIVES, 500+ GAMES

• At the conclusion of the regular season, Miami was ranked No. 1 in plays of 10-or-more yards (237) and No. 1 in plays of 20-or-more yards (91). Of the 91 plays of 20-or-more yards, 72 are passing - the most in FBS. Of the 199 plays of 10-or-more yards, 171 are passing - second-most in FBS. UM had only 48 passing plays of 20-or-more and 129 of 10-or-more yards in 2023. Miami was No. 1 in FBS in games of 500-or-more yards (10) this season.

## HURRICANES ARE FBS' BEST 4TH-QUARTER TEAM

• Miami is ranked No. 2 in FBS in scoring differential in second halves; UM's +14.00 scoring difference is ahead of Ohio State (+12.92), Notre Dame (+12.17) and Penn State (+10.23) and trails only Indiana (+14.08).

• Miami's +9.58 scoring differential in the fourth quarter this season stands as the best mark in the nation.

## GUIDRY'S CAUSING MAYHEM IN YEAR 2 AT MIAMI

• At the end of the regular season, Miami was #17 in FBS in "defensive mayhem" - plays on defense featuring a tackle for loss, an interception or a gained fumble. Miami has a 12.97% mayhem rate on defense; the Hurricanes have racked up a 8.43% sack rate, a 10.54% tackle-for-loss rate and a 3.68% interception rate in 2024 so far.

## ARROYO ENJOYING CAREER YEAR, TE<sub>s</sub> SHINING

• A season after the entire group finished with 154 receiving yards and one touchdown in 2023, Miami's tight ends emerged as go-to options for QB Cam Ward in 2024. In the season opener vs. Florida, **Elijah Arroyo** had a career-high 89 yards on four catches, **Cam McCormick** opened the game's scoring with his first touchdown as a Hurricane, and freshman **Elija Lofton** had two catches for 38 yards vs. the host Gators in a lopsided win.

• Through the regular season, UM tight ends have totaled 816 yards on 52 catches with 10 touchdown catches. In a win over FSU, Arroyo threw the first touchdown pass of his career on a trick play to Ward. Arroyo ranks fifth on Miami with 31 catches for 526 yards with six touchdowns, which ranks as the third-most touchdowns for Miami.

## UM GOES "THREE-AND-OUT" LESS THAN ANY TEAM

• Against FBS competition, Miami's offense has gone three-and-out on just 5.51% of drives this season, which ranks as the best mark in the country. Only one other team in the nation has a three-and-out percentage of less than 10% on offense - No. 1 Miami (5.51%) and No. 2 LSU (9.09%). The Hurricanes average 3.14 points per possession - the best in FBS - and averaged 1.60 plays per point - the third-most efficient in the nation behind Indiana (1.52) and Notre Dame (1.58). The Hurricanes punted on only 18.9% of possessions - the lowest mark in FBS.

## O-LINE NAMED JOE MOORE AWARD HONOR ROLL

• The Hurricanes' offensive line was one of 22 groups named to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award honoring the nation's top unit. Despite missing two players who started the opener for a stretch of five games, the Hurricanes made the cut for the second straight year. Mario Cristobal's OL won the award at Alabama in 2015.

## 50-BURGER: CANES MAKE IT FIVE GAMES OF 50+

• Miami scored 50 points for the third straight game on Sept. 21, topping USF 50-15. The last time Miami had a season featuring three offensive outputs of at least 50 points was 2001 - when it won the national title. Miami had never scored 50 points in three consecutive games prior to this season. UM is No. 1 in FBS in scoring offense.

• The Hurricanes eclipsed the 50 point mark for the fourth time at Louisville - the first year Miami had ever posted four game performances in a single season in Miami history. They made it five games with a 52-31 win over Duke.

## DEFENSIVE LINE AMONG MOST PROLIFIC IN FBS

• Several of Miami's most important offseason additions came on the defensive line, when DT **Simeon Barrow**, DE **Tyler Baron**, DT **CJ Clark** and DT **Marley Cook** all arrived via transfer portal, and DL **Akheem Mesidor** returned from injury. That formidable group joined returning ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year DL **Rueben Bain**.

• Baron, who has started 10 of 11 games, is 18th in career TFLs among active players with 36.0. Baron has 18.0 career sacks - which ranks among the top 25-highest active career total among all FBS players. The Knoxville, Tenn., native started once again and put together only the 10th three-sack game over the last 20 years by a UM player vs. Florida A&M. He was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his performance vs. the Rattlers.

• UM is the only program in the country with two players with at least 18.0 career sacks each (**Akheem Mesidor**, 22.0). The Hurricanes have three players in the top 40 in FBS in career sacks entering Week 11 - DL **Simeon Barrow** with 16.0 sacks. His streak of three straight games with at least one sack ended in Miami's win over Duke.

## WARD, X NAMED CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICANS

• The Hurricanes had two players earn consensus All-America recognition in QB Cam Ward and WR Xavier Restrepo; it marked the first time Miami had two first-team All-Americans in the same season since 2020, when both Jaelan Phillips and Jose Borregales were both recognized. A semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, Restrepo set new school records for career receptions (200) and career receiving yards (2,844) in a standout career at Miami.



## MIAMI AMONG MOST EFFICIENT SCORING TEAMS

• Even as the nation's most prolific offense, the Hurricanes have managed an impressive level of efficiency.

### Against FBS Competition:

- The Hurricanes score points on 58.27% of their offensive possessions - the best-mark in the nation. Miami scores touchdowns on 46.46% of possessions, which also represents the best mark in all of FBS.
- Miami's 5.51% three-and-out percentage on offense is by far the best such mark in the nation.
- The Hurricanes' 18.90% punt percentage on all offensive drives is the lowest such mark in the nation.
- The Hurricanes' 3.14 points-per-possession average is the best mark in the country.

## WARD BEGAN MIAMI CAREER WITH 300+ STREAK

• Cam Ward became the sixth FBS quarterback since 1996 to open a career at a school with seven straight 300-yard performances, joining Gardner Minshew (11 - WSU), Bailey Zappe (8 - WKU), Michael Penix, Jr. (8 - UW), Chase Holbrook (7 - NM State), Will Grier (7 - WVU) and Syracuse's Kyle McCord (7), also this year.

## BORREGALES ENDS BRILLIANT CAREER AT MIAMI

• One of the top kickers in the country for the entirety of his career with the Miami Hurricanes, **K Andy Borregales** is enjoying a senior year that could leave him atop the Miami record books among the best kickers in history.

- He moved into sole possession of third place in all-time made field goals at Miami with three field goals vs. Florida State on Oct. 26, and booted another one in a win over Duke on Nov. 2; he is alone in third place in FBS among active kickers in career field goals with 72.
- Borregales had eight points vs. Syracuse (one field goal, five extra points), moving him to 394 career points. Borregales currently trails only Carlos Huerta (397) & Michael Badgley (403) in career points, ranking third at UM.
- In a win over Virginia Tech earlier this season, Borregales kicked a career-long 56-yard field goal just before halftime - it was tied for the fourth-longest field in Miami Hurricanes history.
- Borregales, whose older brother Jose is the lone Lou Groza Award winner in Miami history (2020), went 22 for 26 on field goals in 2023, tied for the most made kicks in the Atlantic Coast Conference. He converted 44 of his 45 extra point attempts and recorded 46 touchbacks on 73 kickoffs. He was also an All-ACC first-team honoree.
- His 72 career field goals are the third-most in Miami history, trailing only Michael Badgley (77) and Carlos Huerta (73).
- Among active FBS kickers, Borregales is one of just four in the country who have 70 or more career field goals, joining Jonah Dalmas (Boise State - 93), Alex Raynor (Kentucky - 70) and John Hoyland (Wyoming - 73).

## “HURRICANE BAIN” IS BACK AFTER MISSING TIME

• One of the top performers in the nation last season was DL **Rueben Bai, Jr.**, who enjoyed a dominant rookie campaign that resulted in ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors. The 6-foot-3, 275-pound defensive lineman tallied 44 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks over 13 games, earning Freshman All-American honors. He was also selected to the All-ACC Third Team. Bain missed four weeks but is back after a soft tissue injury.

• Bain, who has 18.0 career TFLs, is tied for 15th among active FBS players in career TFLs per game (0.86).

• Bain’s uncle, Tolbert Bain, lettered for the Hurricanes from 1984-1987. His older brother, Reggie, is an offensive line graduate assistant. The rising sophomore, who was named to the preseason watch lists for the Bednarik and Lombardi Awards, has a nickname “Hurricane Bain” - a writeup from the Miami Herald on the moniker is below:

• *The “Hurricane” started swirling almost 30 years ago, years and years before Rueben Bain was even a thought in his father’s mind and long before the elite edge rusher was one of the crown jewels of the Miami Hurricanes.*

*It all started, fittingly, at “Traz” Powell Stadium in Miami, where Rueben Bain Sr. — just like his son — played his home games and wreaked havoc as a two-way lineman for Carol City. Willie Wilcox, the stadium’s iconic public address announcer, gave him the nickname because of his physicality and tenacity, inspired by the story of wrongfully imprisoned boxer Rubin Carter.*

*It turned out to be something like a premonition from Wilcox. After a solid career with the Chiefs, Bain Sr. graduated, played at Division II Morris Brown College in Atlanta, moved back to Florida, where he started a family. He had a few sons and gave one his own name, and, with it, his own nickname, once Bain Jr. started playing for Miami Central and Wilcox realized who he was. He became the latest in a long line of Bains to star athletically in Miami-Dade County, starting with grandfather Herman Bain, who was a three-sport star at Northwestern.*

*It turns out, Wilcox had something like a premonition...he also embodied the nickname in a way not even his father could, with four state championships in four years, 58 1/2 sacks across his final two seasons at Central and finally a nod as the MaxPreps Florida Player of the Year on Tuesday.” -David Wilson, Miami Herald, December 2022*

## CONTINUITY ON COACHING STAFF ENTERING 2024

• **Mario Cristobal** made significant changes to his coaching staff from Year 1 (2022) to Year 2 (2023) at Miami, including both coordinator positions and several other assistants prior to last year. Entering 2024, however, the Hurricanes returned eight of 10 “full-time” assistants, including both coordinators - **Shannon Dawson** and **Lance Guidry**, who are in their second seasons at Miami.

• The only two new faces to the “full-time” coaching staff are running backs coach **Matt Merritt**, who joined from USF, and cornerbacks coach **Chevis Jackson**, who arrived from Marshall - where he worked with Guidry in 2022.

• The Hurricanes were among the nation's most improved teams in almost every statistical category in their second year under head coach **Mario Cristobal**'s direction. Offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson** and defensive coordinator **Lance Guidry** enter their second seasons in 2024, after guiding units that jumped to No. 24 nationally in total defense (up from No. 64 in 2022) and No. 31 nationally in total offense (No. 85).

## MAUIGOA BROTHERS A FORCE ON FIELD AND OFF

• Brothers **Francisco** and **Francis Mauigoa** spent their first seasons in Coral Gables together in 2023 and delivered an immediate impact for the Hurricanes. Both were selected to the All-ACC Second Team in 2024.

• Francisco, who goes by "Kiko," was a second-team All-ACC linebacker after starting all 13 games and leading UM in tackles with 82. He also ranked among the top players nationally with 18.0 tackles for loss and had 7.5 sacks.

• Francis, who goes by "Sisi," entered the season as a five-star high school prospect and delivered on his potential as a Freshman All-America at right tackle. He started all 13 games and was a key member of a group named to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, honoring the nation's top offensive line unit.

• The elder Mauigoa, who spent the first two seasons of his career at Washington State before transferring ahead of his junior season, switched from jersey #51 to #1 prior to this year. His 18.0 tackles for loss last season were the most of any Power-4 returning player entering 2024.

• The Mauigoa Family is from Pago Pago, American Samoa; Fa'alialia and Telesia Mauigoa have three sons who all went on to become Power 5 football players. In addition to Francis and Francisco, their eldest son, Frederick, had a four-year career at Washington State, where he started his final 39 games at center.

## CRISTOBAL'S PROVEN TRACK RECORD STACKS UP

• **Mario Cristobal** is one of only nine active FBS head coaches to have won multiple Power-5 titles, one of only two coaches to have won two titles in six years or fewer (Ryan Day), and one of only six with a Power-5 championship game appearance rate of 50% or better (three in six years). He won two Pac-12s and a Rose Bowl at Oregon. He also pulled in two of the best recruiting classes in Oregon history (2020, 2021) before his departure to Miami.

## ONLY MIAMI HAD FRESHMEN AAs IN ALL 3 PHASES

• Mario Cristobal reeled in the best recruiting class in Miami history in 2023 - eventually topped by the 2024 class - and produced three Freshman All-Americans: DL **Rueben Bain**, Jr. P **Dylan Joyce** & OL **Francis Mauigoa**.

## MIAMI SIGNS TOP RECRUITING CLASS IN ACC AGAIN

- For the second straight year, the Miami Hurricanes reeled in the best recruiting class in program history by the 247Sports Composite Rankings in 2024. The Hurricanes' incoming group was ranked No. 4 in the nation.
- Miami's 2025 class, inked in December 2024, was the top-rated group in the ACC for the third consecutive cycle.
- Miami's group featured six players ranked in the Top247 rankings: DL **Justin Scott** (No. 11), DL **Marquise Lightfoot** (No. 34), DL **Armondo Blount** (No. 39), DB **Zaquan Patterson** (No. 63), WR **JoJo Trader** (No. 70) and WR **Ny Carr** (No. 98).
- Five others cracked the Top247 rankings - DL **Booker Pickett** (No. 142), TE **Elija Lofton** (No. 181), WR **Chance Robinson** (No. 185), DL **Artavius Jones** (No. 233) and RB **Jordan Lyle** (No. 237) - bringing Miami to 11 players in the Top247. UM signed 12 players that were ranked inside the ESPN300, including five rated in the top 50.

## UF WAS FIRST NON-CON ROAD OPENER SINCE '01

- The last time Miami opened a season in a true non-conference road game was 2001, when the Hurricanes traveled to Penn State and topped the Nittany Lions, 33-7. The Hurricanes have had multiple neutral site openers since - including Alabama in Atlanta in 2021, Florida in Orlando in 2019 and LSU in Arlington, Texas in 2018.
- UM opened the 2003 season at Louisiana Tech, but played the game in Shreveport, not at the Tech home venue.

## MARTINEZ DOMINATES VS FSU, HONORED BY ACC

- In addition to QB **Cam Ward**, the Hurricanes added another important offensive skill player in the second transfer portal window - RB **Damien Martinez**, who joined after spending his first two years at Oregon State, was named ACC Running Back of the Week this week after finishing with a season-high 148 yards and two TDs vs. FSU.
- Martinez inserted himself into Miami's backfield fresh off of the best season of his college career, rushing for 1,185 yards and nine touchdowns last year for the Beavers. Martinez was the Pac-12's third-leading rusher last season and a First-Team All-Conference selection. Martinez has started all five games for Miami at tailback; in a win at USF, he recorded the first three-TD game against an FBS opponent by a UM running back since Mark Walton in 2016.
- The Lewisville, Texas native had 2,167 career rushing yards and 16 career rushing touchdowns entering his career at Miami, while sporting a career rushing average of 6.1 yards per carry (355 career attempts). He rushed for a season-high 146 yards last year vs. Stanford. His career-high for a game (178 yards) came in 2022 vs. Colorado.
- Martinez joined a running back room that includes **Mark Fletcher Jr.**, who earned a starting job as a true freshman in 2023 by year's end but missed the spring after surgery on his leg, **Ajay Allen**, speedster **Chris Johnson Jr.**, and talented freshman **Jordan Lyle**, who rushed for a career-high 116 yards in Miami's win over Wake Forest.

## O-LINE PLAY WAS KEY TO MIAMI'S 2023 GROWTH

- The Hurricanes had one of the top performing offensive lines in the nation a season ago, and many of those contributors are back in 2024. Miami's group was named to the midseason honor roll for the 2023 Joe Moore Award, honoring the nation's top offensive line unit. Starting left tackle **Jalen Rivers**, starting right guard **Anez Cooper** and starting right tackle **Francis Mauigoa** all return.
- Joining that trio of returners is veteran center **Zach Carpenter**, who made 25 starts at Indiana over the previous three seasons (2021-2023). Carpenter started 20 times at center and five times at right guard during his career with Indiana, where he arrived after redshirting his freshman season (2020) at Michigan.
- Impressive statistics for Miami's offensive line from Pro Football Focus entering the 2024 season:
  - Of all ACC offensive linemen entering 2024, Carpenter had the second-best "blown block" rate - just 0.8%, trailing only Logan Parr of SMU (0.7%).
  - Miami led the ACC and ranked 10th in the nation in runs stopped for a loss or for no gain - just 15.2%.
  - Of the 17 teams in the ACC, Miami was first in highest yards-per-rush before contact last season, and also ranked first in lowest rate of pressures allowed. UM's pass-blocking efficiency was 91.0 - third-best in the ACC.
  - On non-blitz dropbacks last season, the Hurricanes allowed the second-lowest pressure rate of any team in the ACC at just 21.4% - Boston College ranked first in the conference (21.1%).
  - An eventual Freshman All-America last season, Mauigoa had zero blown run blocks last season - the only returning ACC offensive lineman with 300-plus run blocks to manage the feat.



## DAWSON'S PASSING OFFENSE IMPRESSED IN 2023

- Under the direction of first-year offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson**, who arrived at Miami as an “air raid” coaching disciple, the Hurricanes ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total team offense last year, averaging 431.2 yards per game – including 258.0 passing yards, which was second-best in the ACC
- The Hurricanes had two of the top receivers in the conference and in the country last year, in **Xavier Restrepo** (1,092 yards) and **Jacolby George** (864), who ranked second and third in the ACC in receiving yards
- 2023 was the first time since the Hurricanes joined the ACC that two players from the same school ranked in the top three in receiving yards in the conference in the same year
- There were only 31 seasons of 1,000 yards last year – one of which was Xavier Restrepo (1,092), who set Miami’s season catch record with 85 catches
- Miami’s average yards per play jumped to 6.51 in 2023, the second-best mark in the ACC and the No. 22 best mark in the country
- The Hurricanes ranked in the top 30 nationally in yards per play, total offense, least amount of passes intercepted and completion percentage, and in the top 40 nationally in scoring offense and passing offense.

## BARROW, JONES HONOR MIRA (#10), DOOLEY (#42)

- For the first time since originally being retired, the jersey numbers 10 (**Simeon Barrow**) and 42 (**Artavius Jones**) will be worn by Hurricanes on the field in 2024.
- There will be a jersey patch for both Barrow and Jones honoring George Mira Sr., and Jim Dooley, respectively, whose numbers are among the most recognizable in Miami history but have not been worn since their retirement.

### From their respective University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame bios:

#### George Mira Sr.

*“Mira Sr. will long be remembered by Hurricane fans as one of Miami’s greatest quarterbacks and perhaps the Canes greatest player ever. In his three year career, Mira set numerous passing records, some of which are still in the record books. During his career, Miami once again gained national prominence, reaching the 1961 Liberty Bowl, the first bowl appearance in 19 years. Mira was the quarterback and passer for the ‘60’s, he could drop back and pass and scramble when he had to, which earned him his nickname “The Matador”. In 1962 Mira lead the Hurricanes to the Gotham Bowl in New York City and proved to the country that he was the real deal”*

#### Jim Dooley

*“Jim Dooley is a football legend at the University of Miami. Dooley was the first Hurricane football player to have his jersey number retired, #42, the first Hurricane player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, to the Chicago Bears, in 1952, and the first, and only, UM player to be an NFL head coach. Jim came to the University of Miami in 1947 after a stellar high school career at Miami High. As a junior and senior Dooley was a true “sixty minute man” playing both offense and defense. He set several records during his UM days, 17 interceptions on defense and over 1,000 yards rushing on offense. In 1951, Dooley intercepted 10 passes and was named first-team All-American by the associated Press. Dooley played in both the 1951 Orange Bowl Calssic and the 1952 Gator Bowl where he earned MVP honors and setting a Gator Bowl record with 4 interceptions.*

## FIFTY YEARS AND COUNTING FOR #NFLU STREAK

- With four players selected in the 2024 NFL Draft, the Miami Hurricanes extended their streak to 50 consecutive years with at least one NFL Draft selection. The Hurricanes trail only Michigan (1939), USC (1939) and Florida (1952) in consecutive years with at least one pick; Miami’s streak began in 1975 and continued in 2024.

# HEAD COACH MARIO CRISTOBAL

## THIRD SEASON | MIAMI, 1993

**Career Record: 84-75 | UM Record: 22-15 | ACC Record: 12-12**

Mario Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons before arriving at Miami.

The Hurricanes showed tremendous growth from Year 1 to Year 2 under Cristobal's direction; Miami was No. 24 in total defense and No. 31 in total offense in all of FBS in 2023, jumping 40 spots in total defense (up from No. 64) and 60 spots in total offense (up from No. 85). Miami pulled in the top two recruiting classes in program history in the modern era by every ranking in his two full cycles - the No. 7 class in the nation in 2023 and the No. 4 class in 2024.

Cristobal brought more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen. Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season. During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.


In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.

The Miami Hurricanes defeated the Florida Gators 41-17 Saturday at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium before a crowd of 90,544. The 19th-ranked Canes improved to 1-0, while Florida fell to 0-1.

It was a thoroughly dominant performance from start to finish. The Canes racked up 529 total yards, while limiting Florida to just 261. Miami held a nine-minute edge in time of possession and converted all five red zone opportunities.

Quarterback **Cam Ward** dazzled with his arms, his legs and his poise, completing 26 of 35 passes to 10 different receivers for 385 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Wide receiver **Xavier Restrepo** caught 7 of those passes for 112 and one score, while tight end **Elijah Arroyo** had four grabs for 89 yards.

Running back **Damien Martinez** rushed for 65 yards, while fellow back **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** scored two rushing touchdowns. Safety **Jaden Harris** paced the Canes with seven tackles and one interception, while linebacker Francisco Mauigoa had six tackles and a sack. Miami's defense totaled three sacks and eight tackles for loss and held Florida to just 1 of 9 on third down.

Running back Montrell Johnson, Jr. rushed for 106 yards on 11 carries for the Gators. Quarterback Graham Mertz threw for 91 yards and one interception before being replaced in the fourth quarter.

"Certainly when you play an opponent of that caliber, playing against the SEC in their home stadium and getting a convincing win like that is great," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "But the most important thing we talked about in there was that for the first time in a long time Miami's had the chance to play a big-time game to start the season and now we've got to show that we can handle that success. We're in steps. We're in stages. But today was a really, really big step."

TAMPA, Fla. -- The crowd was fired up. The upper deck was unleashed. Even fighter jets zoomed overhead at the outset.

But while the USF Bulls delivered on a raucous home-field environment, the Miami Hurricanes ultimately – and emphatically — passed another road test. The eighth-ranked Canes pulled away in the second half to notch a 50-15 win over USF Saturday night before a gathering of 58,660 at Raymond James Stadium.

Miami improved to 4-0 for the second straight season, while the Bulls fell to 2-2. Down 15-14 in the second quarter, the Canes scored 36 consecutive points, shutting out USF 28-0 in the second half.

“Proud of our guys for responding like they did. It’s the first time we’ve actually trailed this year,” Miami coach Mario Cristobal said. “In the second half we played cleaner and better Miami Hurricane football.”

Quarterback Cam Ward threw for 404 yards and three touchdowns, surpassing 15,000 passing yards for his career. Running back Damien Martinez had three short touchdown runs, and wide receiver Isaiah Horton had a career night with eight catches for 108 yards and a score.

“He’s been great for a long time,” Horton said of Ward. “As soon as he got on campus, he made his mark instantly. I love playing with him.”

Wide receiver Xavier Restrepo had six catches for 99 yards and one touchdown, eclipsing 2,000 career receiving yards. Fellow wideout Sam Brown, Jr. had a 76-yard touchdown reception and running back Jordan Lyle rushed for 104 yards on just six carries, including a 91-yard scoring scamper.

USF quarterback Byrum Brown completed 19 of 30 passes for 254 yards and caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from wide receiver Sean Atkins, who had 11 receptions of his own for 125 yards.

Miami amassed 574 total yards — averaging 9.6 yards per play — and converted 7 of 9 third downs. The Canes’ defense pitched a shutout in the second half and racked up four sacks and seven tackles for loss. Linebacker Francisco Mauigoa paced Miami with 11 tackles, while safety Meesh Powell had nine stops and an interception. Defensive tackle Simeon Barrow recorded six tackles and a sack.

## UM RALLIES, BEATS VT IN WILD ACC OPENER

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- The seventh-ranked Miami Hurricanes had raced out to a 4-0 start to their season. But they knew that conference play hits different.

In their ACC opener, the Canes and the Virginia Tech Hokies traded punches all evening long in a rollicking, roller-coaster affair at Hard Rock Stadium. In the end the game came down to one last play – and one last review – and it was Miami that left the field with its first conference win.

The Canes rallied from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to score a wild, 38-34 win before 59,539 delirious fans on their home field. Miami improved to 5-0, 1-0 in the ACC. Virginia Tech fell to 2-3 overall, 0-1 in conference play.

Quarterback **Cam Ward** threw for 342 yards and four touchdowns to offset three turnovers. He also ran for 57 yards and a score, leading Miami to touchdowns on its final three drives of the game. But the Hokies drove 45 yards in the final two minutes to set up a Hail Mary throw on the last play. It was initially ruled a touchdown but then reversed, giving the Canes their first 5-0 start in seven seasons.

“Obviously a tremendous game,” head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. “We overcame a lot of stuff, a lot of self-inflicted issues to find a way to pull it out. They’re a really good football team...certainly it wasn’t our best performance but when you play in conference we tell our guys all the time expect it to be playoff football because that’s what you’re going to get.

“I’m proud of the way we just kept fighting, even when we were two scores down and got behind two scores again.”

Miami racked up 508 total yards and found its rushing groove in the second half with 132 yards on the ground. Wide receiver **Xavier Restrepo** paced the Canes with five catches for 60 yards, while wide receiver **Jacolby George**, wide receiver **Isaiah Horton**, tight end **Elijah Arroyo** and tight end **Cam McCormick** each had scoring grabs. Running back **Damien Martinez** gained 60 tough yards on 14 carries. Miami converted 10 of 16 on third down and possessed the ball for nearly 33 minutes.

Cornerback **Jadais Richard** led the Canes with eight tackles, while linebacker **Wesley Bissainthe** added six stops. Safety **Meesh Powell** had three tackles and an interception.

## MIAMI SHOCKS CAL IN EPIC COMEBACK WIN

**BERKELEY, Calif --** They flew across three time zones from South Florida all the way to the East Bay. The Miami Hurricanes weren't about to let a 20-point, fourth-quarter deficit spoil their cross-country trek.

Eighth-ranked Miami rallied for a 39-38 win over California on Saturday night, stunning the Golden Bears and their raucous sellout crowd at Memorial Stadium with a comeback for the ages.

The Canes improved to 6-0 overall and 2-0 in ACC play. Cal fell to 3-2 and 0-2 in conference play, still seeking its first-ever ACC win.

In front of one of college football's most picturesque backdrops, quarterback Cam Ward painted his latest Picasso, leading the Canes to touchdowns on their last four drives of the game and throwing for 249 yards in the fourth quarter alone. His five-yard scoring toss to tight end Elijah Arroyo with 26 seconds left tied the score and Andy Borregales' extra point put Miami on top.

Ward completed 35 of 53 passes for 437 yards and two touchdowns and one interception. He also had a 24-yard scoring scamper.

Meanwhile, Miami's defense, which had allowed four pass plays of 50-plus yards, forced two punts and a turnover in the fourth quarter, allowing the Canes to claw their way back.

Wide receiver Xavier Restrepo had another huge outing, catching seven passes for 163 yards. Fellow wideout Isaiah Horton had nine catches for 83 yards and a touchdown. Running backs Mark Fletcher, Jr. and Damien Martinez each had touchdown runs, combining for 123 yards on the ground. Overall, Miami racked up 575 total yards.

"When 1 has the ball in his hands, the game is never over," Restrepo said, referring to Ward's uniform number. "We have extreme confidence in that guy."

Linebacker Wesley Bissainthe paced the Canes with six tackles, while linebacker Francisco Mauigoa had the game-clinching interception. Defensive tackle Simeon Barrow posted three tackles and a sack.

## CANES EDGE CARDINALS IN 52-45 THRILLER

LOUISVILLE, Ky. - After two straight prime-time thrill rides, the Miami Hurricanes brought their edge-of-your-seat gridiron show to daytime television.

Hope you didn't blink.

Quarterback Cam Ward threw four touchdown passes, wide receivers Sam Brown, Jr. and Xavier Restrepo each topped the 100-yard receiving mark and Miami rushed for 219 yards in a wild 52-45 win over Louisville Saturday before a crowd of 59,115 — the second largest in L&N Federal Credit Union Stadium history.

The sixth-ranked Canes improved to 7-0 and 3-0 in ACC play. The Cardinals fell to 4-3 overall and 2-2 in conference play. In the process the Canes are bringing back to Coral Gables the Schnellberger Trophy — featuring a pair of bronzed boots worn by legendary Miami and Louisville head coach Howard Schnellenberger.

Miami racked up 538 yards of total offense and led by two touchdowns in the third quarter before Louisville stormed back with two touchdowns in 67 seconds to tie it. But the Canes pulled away in the fourth quarter, holding the ball for nine minutes and clinching the game with an 11-play, 80-yard scoring march.

"That was a hard-fought game, a lot of back and forth," head coach Mario Cristobal said. "Explosive plays by us, explosive plays by them. We had some errors on special teams that certainly hurt us, but one thing that didn't was our effort. We always played hard. There was resiliency. We made plays when it mattered. ... A lot of good stuff."

Ward completed 21 of 32 passes for 319 yards. Restrepo had seven receptions for 101 yards and one touchdown, while Brown totaled 125 yards on just three catches, including a score. Jacoby George and Isaiah Horton also had touchdown grabs.

Running back Damien Martinez carried 12 times for 89 yards and one touchdown, while fellow back Mark Fletcher, Jr. had 73 yards on 13 carries. The Canes were a crisp, efficient 9 of 15 on third down and converted both of their fourth-down attempts.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. - It's a rivalry game. You can throw out the records. Anything can happen.

That was one narrative to consider as the Miami Hurricanes and Florida State Seminoles renewed acquaintances on a football field for the 69th time Saturday night. Here's another.

One team would take the lead at the outset. One team would never take its foot off the gas. One team would ensure the outcome was never really in doubt.

That team was the Canes, who cruised to a 36-14 win before a sellout crowd of 66,200 at Hard Rock Stadium. Sixth-ranked Miami improved to 8-0 and 4-0 in the ACC. Florida State fell to 1-7 and 1-6 in conference play.

The Canes racked up 445 yards, scored on seven of their nine drives and held the ball for more than 35 minutes. Miami's defense held the Seminoles to 248 total yards and permitted FSU to convert just 3 of 13 third downs.

"Obviously a very hard-fought game," head coach Mario Cristobal said. "We never really lost control of the game but it took us a little while to start pulling away.

"We ran the ball well, got downhill, got hats on hats and ran through tackles. We were aggressive with some fourth downs. The defense was the story of the game. they just played their tails off."

Quarterback Cam Ward completed 22 of 35 passes for 208 yards and caught the first touchdown pass of his career. Running back Damien Martinez rushed for 148 yards and two touchdowns, while backfield mate Mark Fletcher, Jr. rushed for 71 yards and a score. Wide receiver Isaiah Horton caught six passes for 65 yards and tight end Elijah Arroyo threw the touchdown toss to his quarterback. Andy Borregales was perfect on three field goal attempts with a long of 45.

Linebacker Francisco Mauigoa paced Miami with seven tackles, while linebacker Wesley Bissainthe had six stops. Defensive end Akheem Mesidor had three tackles and a sack.

The win was Miami's first over FSU since 2020 and the Canes now lead the all-time series 36-33.

Quarterback Cam Ward threw for 400 yards and five touchdowns, while wide receiver Xavier Restrepo had eight catches for 146 yards and a career-high three scores, which propelled him past Santana Moss into first place on Miami's career receiving yards list with 2,573. Ward now has 29 touchdown passes on the season, which ties him with Steve Walsh for the school single-season record.

Miami racked up 526 total yards and forced four turnovers overall, leading to 21 points.

"Really love the way our team closed out the game after a fast start," head coach Mario Cristobal said. "We had some miscues that were uncharacteristic and just regrouped at halftime. The decision was simple — let's play Hurricane football and play as a team and play together and put forth our best effort and execute at a high level."

Wide receiver Jacolby George caught four passes for 74 yards and one score, while Isaiah Horton had six catches for 71 yards. Running backs Damien Martinez and Mark Fletcher, Jr. combined for 131 rushing yards.

Linebacker Francisco Mauigoa paced the Canes with nine stops, including two tackles for loss. Cornerbacks OJ Frederique and Jadais Richard and safety Meesh Powell each had interceptions.

Duke quarterback Maalik Murphy threw for 325 yards with three touchdowns and three picks.

Georgia Tech rushed 48 times for 271 yards, possessed the ball for nearly 35 minutes and held on late for a 28-23 win over the fourth-ranked Miami Hurricanes Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

The loss ended Miami's nine-game winning streak as the Canes fell to 9-1 overall and 5-1 in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets improved to 6-4 overall and 4-3 in conference play.

Quarterback Cam Ward threw for 348 yards and three touchdowns as Miami racked up 436 total yards.

But Tech quarterback Haynes King – splitting duties behind center with Aaron Philo – accounted for 125 total yards and two touchdowns, leading a balanced ground attack. The Jackets averaged 5.6 yards per rush and secured the game's lone takeaway, a late strip and sack that clinched the victory.

Ward broke Steve Walsh's Miami single-season record for touchdown passes and now has 32 on the season. Wide receiver Xavier Restrepo had four catches for 78 yards and a touchdown, passing Mike Harley to become the school's all-time receptions leader with 186.

Wide receiver Jacolby George paced Miami with seven catches for 88 yards, while fellow wideout Isaiah Horton caught five passes for 37 yards and a score. Tight end Elijah Arroyo recorded three catches for 82 yards, including a 74-yard touchdown. Running back Damien Martinez had 15 carries for 81 yards. Linebacker Jaylin Alderman posted nine stops and 2.5 tackles for loss, while defensive end Rueben Bain had eight tackles. Cornerback OJ Frederique, Jr. registered five tackles and two passes defensed.

Jackets running back Jamal Haynes rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown on just three carries before leaving the game with an injury. Philo completed 5 of 10 passes for 67 yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Malik Rutherford had four catches for 28 yards and a score. Tech's defense held Miami to 3 of 10 on third down and 1 of 4 on fourth down.

## CANES SURGE PAST DEACONS IN 42-14 WIN

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. - The Miami Hurricanes rode a stellar defensive effort and a dominant final quarter to secure their 10th win of the season for the first time in seven years.

The Canes broke open a close game with 22 points in the final eight minutes en route to a 42-14 win over the Wake Forest Demon Deacons Saturday before a Senior Day crowd of 64,210 at Hard Rock Stadium.

Miami improved to 10-1 overall and 6-1 in the ACC and wrapped up their regular season home schedule with a perfect 6-0 home mark. The Demon Deacons fell to 4-7 overall and 2-5 in conference play. The Canes racked up 508 total yards and their defense held Wake to just 193 total yards and 3.4 yards per play, racking up five sacks and six tackles for loss.

Quarterback Cam Ward completed 27 of 38 passes for 280 yards with two touchdowns and one interception and added a touchdown run. In the process he broke Bernie Kosar's single-season school record for passing yards, which Kosar set 40 years ago.

Wide receiver Jacoby George had seven catches for 91 yards and two scores, while tight end Elijah Arroyo hauled in six passes for 79 yards. Running back Jordan Lyle rushed for a career-high 115 yards and one score and fellow back Damien Martinez added 63 yards.

Safety Meesh Powell scored on a 76-yard interception return, adding three tackles and a sack. Linebacker Francisco Mauigoa paced the Canes with 12 tackles, while defensive end Akheem Mesidor recorded seven stops and a sack.

"The story of the game was the defense without a doubt," head coach Mario Cristobal said. "After that first series and the busted coverage that's what Miami Hurricane defense should look like. And then offensively we had our struggles. We caused a lot of it ourselves with penalties, miscues, dropped balls and some turnovers. But the defense we leaned on them and they came through in a big-time way even when they were on short fields.

"I hadn't seen a defensive performance like that anywhere in a long time. That was really awesome and they certainly deserve all the credit and all the mention of the game."

## UM DROPS REGULAR SEASON FINALE, 42-38

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - The Syracuse Orange rallied from an early 21-0 deficit to defeat the Miami Hurricanes 42-38 Saturday at the JMA Wireless Dome.

The Canes concluded the regular season with a 10-2 overall record and a 6-2 ACC mark. The Orange improved to 9-3 overall and 5-3 in ACC play.

The two teams combined for 982 total yards as the matchup of the nation's top passing yards leaders lived up to its billing. Syracuse's Kyle McCord threw for 380 yards and three touchdowns, while quarterback Cam Ward threw for 349 yards and two scores, tying Case Keenum for the most career NCAA Division I passing touchdowns (155).

Syracuse took its first lead on a 56-yard fumble return by safety Devin Grant late in the third quarter. Miami tied it on a two-yard touchdown run by running back Mark Fletcher, Jr., but the Orange countered with a three-yard scoring run and held on late for the victory.

Wide receiver Xavier Restrepo caught nine passes for 148 yards and one touchdown, while Jacoby George had six receptions for 121 yards. Running back Damien Martinez rushed for 84 yards and a score and Fletcher had 46 yards and two rushing touchdowns. Linebacker Cam Pruitt had three tackles, a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

Allen rushed for 82 yards and two touchdowns for the Orange, while wide receivers Jackson Meeks and Trebor Pena combined to catch 13 passes for 238 yards and three scores.

Miami got the ball to open the game and three snaps in Ward picked up a key third down with a 19-yard completion to George to the Orange 38. Six plays later, Restrepo drew a pass interference penalty in the end zone, setting the Canes up with first and goal from the two-yard line. Fletcher bulldozed in for the score and Miami had a 7-0 lead.

The Orange appeared to respond quickly when McCord hit wide receiver Darrell Gill, Jr. on a 40-yard catch-and-run to the end zone. But Syracuse was flagged for an illegal formation and four plays later linebacker Wesley Bissainthe broke up a fourth-down pass and Miami took over on its 37. Ward went back to work, finding Restrepo for 10 yards before connecting with George for 25 yards to the

A national television audience watched the "Battle For No. 1" and the Hurricanes found themselves 77 yards from the national championship with just over three minutes left to play. **Vinny Testaverde** engineered a thrilling drive that included a 31-yard strike to **Brian Blades** on a 4th-and-6 play from Miami's own 27. The pass to Blades was the first of six consecutive completions by Testaverde that brought Miami to PSU's 6-yard line. However, with 18 seconds remaining, Pete Giftopoulos ended UM's drive for the national title by intercepting a Testaverde pass at the goal line. The Canes finished with 445 total yards and 22 first downs while holding PSU to Fiesta Bowl record-lows of 162 yards and just eight first downs. But seven turnovers tripped the Canes on the road to the national title.

For the second time in five years, the Hurricanes were champions of the college football world. Just as they had done in 1983, the '87 Canes knocked off the nation's then No.1-ranked team in the Orange Bowl Classic. The second-ranked Hurricanes capped the school's second straight undefeated regular season with a 20-14 victory over Oklahoma. Sophomore QB **Steve Walsh** hit on 18-of-30 passing for 209 yards and two touchdowns. Senior fullback **Melvin Bratton** nearly broke a UM single-game receiving mark by hauling in nine catches for 102 yards before leaving the game with a knee injury. **Bernard Clark** stepped into the spotlight at middle linebacker and walked away with the game's MVP award after recording 12 unassisted tackles and 14 overall stops, while the defense limited OU to just 255 yards in total offense.

The Hurricanes totaled 377 yards of offense, including 174 rushing yards. The Badgers had allowed 150 rushing yards or fewer in 12 of 14 games this season. The Canes also held Wisconsin to just 142 rushing yards after the Badgers averaged 229 rushing yards per game this season. But Miami could not find a solution for Wisconsin quarterback Alex Hornibrook, who threw for 258 yards and four touchdowns en route to each MVP honors. **DeeJay Dallas** and **Travis Homer** each scored rushing touchdowns for the Hurricanes, while **Lawrence Cager** hauled in a 38-yard scoring strike. The loss dropped Miami's all-time Orange Bowl record to 6-4.

UW doubled its momentum when the Badgers' Eric Burrell picked off Miami quarterback **Malik Rosier** on the Canes' first play from scrimmage and returned the ball to the UM 7. One play later, Taylor made it 14-0. The Canes continued to shine defensively. With their second sack of the night, a four-yard loss by **Michael Pinckney**, Miami set the single-season record for tackles for loss in a season. The Canes finished with 10 tackles for loss on the night and closed out the season with a school record 136 TFLs. Miami's previous record of 130 was set in 1999.
