QUICK HITS

- The Miami Hurricanes continue their fourth season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Oct 25 at Hard Rock Stadium against Stanford. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. on ESPN.
- Miami posted its first 10-win season since 2017 and only its second 10-win season in the last 20 years in 2024. The Hurricanes also finished the season undefeated at home for the first time since 2002 (6-0).
- The Hurricanes are looking to rebound from their first loss of the season, falling to Louisville, 24-21, last time out on Friday, Oct. 17 at Hard Rock Stadium.
- The Hurricanes opened 2025 with a thrilling 27-24 win over #6/#6 Notre Dame in their season opener on Aug. 31. Miami has three ranked wins so far this season in games vs. Notre Dame, USF and FSU.
- The meeting between the Hurricanes and the Cardinal is the first in program history.

STORYLINES + NOTABLES

- #9/#9 Miami continues its fourth season under head coach **Mario Cristobal** with a matchup against Stanford at Hard Rock Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 25. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. on ESPN, 104.3 WQAM, Radio Libre 790 AM and WVUM 90.5 FM.
- The Hurricanes entered the season ranked in the top 10 of both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls, checking in at No. 10 in both rankings, and rose to as high as No. 2 in both polls entering Week 8. Following its loss to Louisville, the Hurricanes dropped to No. 9/9 - Miami has been in the top 10 for the entirety of the season.
- Among UM's top newcomers is QB **Carson Beck**, who arrived from Georgia via transfer portal. Beck, who missed spring practices while recovering from UCL surgery, has a 29-4 (.878) record as a starting FBS quarterback, the best of any active player (minimum five games).

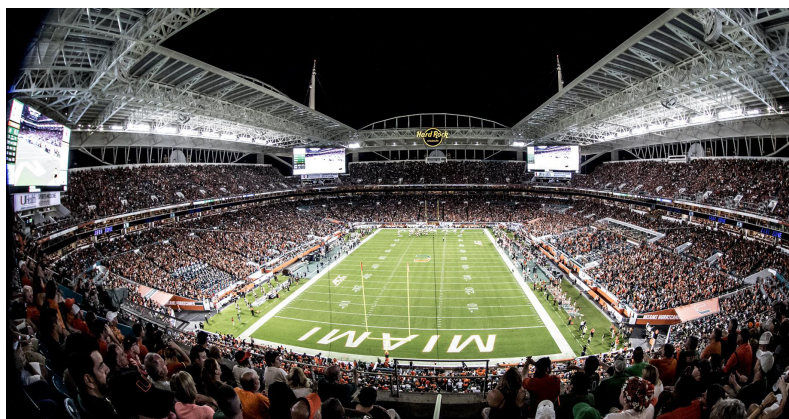

QB Steve Walsh

Steve Walsh is one of the long string of Hurricane signal callers, whose success from the early 80's into the 90's, helped Miami gain the nickname "Quarterback U". He led the Hurricanes to its second national championship in 1987 by defeating the Oklahoma Sooners in the 1988 Orange Bowl Classic 20-14. In his two years as starting QB, he compiled a 23-1 overall record. As a junior, he was named first team All-American quarterback by the Associated Press, the Football Writers Association of America and ESPN, and was The Football News College Player of the Year. He was fourth in the 1988 Heisman Trophy balloting. Walsh finished his career at UM tied with Vinny Testaverde for 1st in TD passes thrown with 48, now 2nd. Steve and his 1988 offensive line hold the NCAA record for fewest sacks allowed with four. Walsh was drafted in the first round of the NFL supplemental draft after his junior year by the Dallas Cowboys, he also played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and the Indianapolis Colts. He was inducted into the University of Miami Football Ring of Honor on October 24, 2009

THE MATCHUP

• #9/#9 Miami continues the 2025 football season with Stanford at Hard Rock Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 25. Kick-off is slated for 7 p.m. on ESPN, with radio broadcasts set for 104.3 WQAM, Radio Libre and WVUM 90.5 FM.

• Saturday's meeting between the two teams is the first in program history; Stanford joined the ACC prior to 2024.

• Head coach **Mario Cristobal** faced Stanford four times during his time as head coach at Oregon and finished with a 2-2 record against the Cardinal. Frank Reich is in his first year at the helm of Stanford.

A LOOK BACK: MIAMI FALLS FOR FIRST TIME, 24-21

• Miami fell for the first time in 2025 last time out, dropping its ACC home opener against Louisville, 24-21. The Hurricanes were driving with under a minute left before an interception thwarted the comeback effort.

• WR **Malachi Toney** had his second straight 100-yard effort in the defeat. He had a career-high nine catches for a career-high 135 yards, and added a 12-yard rushing touchdown. He is the top-producing freshman WR in FBS.

• In addition to Toney, WR **CJ Daniels** hauled in seven catches for 74 yards, while WR **Keelan Marion** added five catches for 33 yards. QB **Carson Beck** threw four interceptions, and UofL's defense held Miami to 63 rush yards.

• Louisville was paced by WR Chris Bell, who had nine catches for 136 yards with two touchdowns, and RB Isaac Brown, who rushed for 113 yards and averaged 7.5 yards on his 15 carries. He had a long run of 28 yards.

MIAMI RANKED 9TH, HAVE THREE AP T-25 WINS

• Following their 5-0 start to the season, the Hurricanes were ranked as high as No. 2 in the Associated Press top 25 released on Oct. 5. Now ranked No. 9 in both polls, UM has been in the top 10 of both polls for all of 2025.

• Miami's No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press top 25 released on Oct. 12 was tied for the highest of any **Mario Cristobal**-coached team in his career (earlier this year, UM also ranked No. 2); Cristobal's previous high was No. 3 at Oregon, obtained during Week 4 of the 2021 season (#3/#3).

• With a No. 5 ranking in the Associated Press poll attained on Sept. 2, the Hurricanes made it back-to-back years to crack the top five of the AP for the first time since a six-season run from 2000-05. Miami was ranked No. 10 in both preseason polls.

• Miami's resume as as impressive as any team's in the country through the first seven weeks of the season. The Hurricanes have three AP ranked wins this year, having topped Notre Dame, USF and Florida State through their first three games, all of whom were ranked in the AP poll released on Oct. 5. Prior to 2025, Miami hadn't had three wins over AP ranked teams in the same season since 2009.

• The Hurricanes opened the 2024 season at No. 19 in the poll and found their name in every top 25 ranking of the season. The Hurricanes reached as high as No. 4 (after improving to 9-0 to start the year) and ended No. 18 in the final poll, its highest final ranking since being ranked No. 13 to end 2017.

• Cristobal's highest-ranked finish as a head coach came in the final 2019 polls, when Oregon was No. 5/5.

RING OF HONOR CLASS TO BE HONORED OCT. 25

• Miami's 2025 Ring of Honor class - comprised of QB Ken Dorsey, WR Andre Johnson, OL Bryant McKinnie and LB Dan Morgan - will be recognized at halftime of Saturday's game against Stanford at Hard Rock Stadium.

• The Ring of Honor was established in 1997 and serves as the highest honor for a Miami football player or coach.

• Dorsey lined up under center for three seasons from 2000-02 and posted a remarkable 38-2 record as a starter. He is UM's career passing touchdowns leader with 86 and ranks second in career passing yards with 9,565 yards.

• Johnson played three seasons (2000-02) for the Canes and caught 92 career passes for 1,831 yards and 20 touchdowns. He was the Co-MVP of the Rose Bowl after hauling in seven passes for 199 yards and two scores.

• McKinnie didn't allow a sack at left tackle during his two seasons (2000-01) at Miami, helping the Canes win 23 of 24 games over that stretch, including the 2001 national title. He was twice named a first-team All-American and won the Outland Trophy as the nation's top lineman in 2001.

• Morgan was a four-year starter at linebacker from 1997-2000. He is Miami's career tackles leader with 532 and the only player in Miami history to post 100-plus tackles in each of his four seasons. In 2000, Morgan became the first player in college football history to sweep the Bednarik, Butkus and Lombardi Awards.

CARSON BECK ARRIVES IN CORAL GABLES AS QB I

• For the second straight year, the Miami Hurricanes added one of the top quarterbacks in the country in the January transfer window, signing QB **Carson Beck** after an eye-popping career at Georgia, where he finished 24-3 as a starting quarterback with the Bulldogs. He threw for 7,912 yards, 58 touchdowns and 20 interceptions at UGA.

• In a win over No. 18/23 USF on Sept. 13, Beck threw for 340 yards and three touchdowns. The performance marked Beck's 10th career 300-yard passing game - he is one of just four P-4 quarterbacks with 10-or-more 300-yard games, joining Josh Hoover of TCU (14), Tyler Van Dyke of SMU (11) and Chandler Morris of Virginia (10).

• Beck currently ranks second among FBS players in career passing yards (9,396), second in career passing efficiency (156.61) and seventh in career total offense (9,667). He is considered a Heisman Trophy candidate.

• He was named to the Davey O'Brien "Great 8" after a four-touchdown win in UM's road opener at Florida State. In Miami's win vs. the Seminoles, Beck had his 15th career game with multiple passing touchdowns and zero interceptions. That is the second most among active FBS players behind Vanderbilt QB Diego Pavia (19).

• Beck went 22-for-24 (91.7) against Bethune-Cookman, marking the highest completion rate by any Miami signal caller (min. 20 attempts) over the last 30 seasons.

• He now owns a 29-4 record as a starting quarterback at the FBS level (.878), the best of any active player.

• Beck, who assumed starting responsibilities at Georgia in 2023 as a fourth-year redshirt sophomore, led the Bulldogs to a 13-1 record and a win in the 2023 Capital One Orange Bowl, finishing just shy of a College Football Playoff berth in the four-team field. He was a member of back-to-back national championship teams as a backup.

• In his second year as the team's starting quarterback in 2024, Beck led Georgia to the College Football Playoff with an 11-2 record. Beck was hurt in the 2024 SEC Championship Game against Texas, which Georgia won, 22-19. He finished 2024 with 3,485 yards, a 64.7% completion percentage, 28 touchdowns and 12 interceptions.

• Beck underwent surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament (UCL) in his right elbow after the SEC Championship Game. Though he did not throw during all of spring practice at Miami after enrolling in January while completing his rehab, he was cleared for full participation shortly thereafter and took part in all summer team activity.

Opportunity Beckons: Carson Beck, Hurricanes looking for breakthrough 2025 (excerpts)

"New Miami Hurricanes quarterback Carson Beck has his share of tattoos covering both of his arms and his left leg. Two in particular stand out to him.

The first is a quote on his right elbow: 'Why do we fall?' It comes from the movie 'Batman Begins.' The answer to that question, as Thomas Wayne says to his son Bruce: 'So we can learn to pick ourselves up.' The second, right next to it and covering up most of his bicep, is a phoenix. Beck is a Harry Potter fan, and the phoenix is an integral figure in a couple of the books in the series. A phoenix is also a mythical symbol of resilience, as bird is said to be reborn from its ashes when it dies.

The scar that runs through them — a visual reminder of the UCL revision surgery he had in December after he injured his elbow in the SEC Championship Game with the Georgia Bulldogs — now gives the artwork a little extra meaning....

...will Beck fall or rise from the ashes? It's in his hands.

'That's how I want it,' Beck said. 'That's how it should be. That's how I've always wanted it my whole life. I feel like in those pressure moments, I thrive. That's what I look for.'

HETHERMAN'S "E.S.V." DEFENSE WREAKING HAVOC

• **Mario Cristobal** announced the hiring of Minnesota Golden Gophers defensive coordinator **Corey Hetherman** to the same post in January 2025. Hetherman arrived in Coral Gables after a dominant lone season at Minnesota.

• Hetherman has made a flawless transition through the Hurricanes' strong start. UM ranks No. 15 in total defense, allowing just 291.5 yards per game so far against an impressive first-half schedule of opponents. Hetherman's signature acronym, "E.S.V." - has been on display. The acronym stands for **Excitement, Swarm, Violence**.

• Miami has allowed 32 "big plays" this season (13 runs of 12-or-more yards, 19 passes of 15-or-more), good for the 10th-best "big play" defensive percentage in all of FBS (8.42%). Miami's "big play" pass percentage of 9.79% is third-best in FBS. UM is one of 18 teams entering Week 9 to allow fewer than 20 plays of 20-or-more yards (18).

• In a measurement of "defensive mayhem" - which charts the percentage of plays where a defense forces the opposition into either a sack, tackle for loss, interception or a fumble that is recovered by the defense - the Hurricanes rank No. 33 in FBS, posting a percentage of 12.11%. UM's 1.3 points-per-drive average is No. 17 in FBS.

BAIN, MESIDOR COULD BE FBS' TOP EDGE TANDEM

• Miami's defensive end tandem of **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, and **Akheem Mesidor** have been the top defensive end tandem in the country through the first eight weeks of the college football season by most metrics.

• Among 250 defensive ends across Power-4, Bain is the No. 1 overall edge player by Pro Football Focus (94.6), while Mesidor ranks 15th (88.3).

• In PFF's "run defense" grades, Bain is third (90.9) while Mesidor is 13th (84.6). Bain is fourth by PFF in "pass rush" (92.4) while Mesidor is 27th (86.9). Bain is tied for 10th in pressures (31) while Mesidor is tied for 24th (25).

MIAMI'S IMPRESSIVE HOME STREAK ENDS VS. UofL

• The Hurricanes had won 10 straight home games dating back to Sept. 7, 2024 - a stretch that encapsulated the entirety of 2024 and included Miami's 5-0 start to 2025 - before falling, 24-21, last time out to Louisville on Oct. 17.

• Miami's 10-game home winning streak was tied for the fourth-longest active streak among FBS programs and was one of only six double-digit home winning streaks across the entirety of FBS entering Week 8.

• In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes Football (since 1979), Miami's 10-game home winning streak was the third-longest, trailing only two streaks: a 58-game stretch at the Orange Bowl that began on Oct. 12, 1985 and ended on Sept. 24, 1994 - the longest home winning streak in college football history - as well as a stretch of 26 straight games at "The OB" from Oct. 30, 1999 - Oct. 18, 2003.

• With a win on Sept. 6, UM started the season 2-0 at home for the 13th time in the last 14 seasons (since 2012). The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 19 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.

• In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 20 times and is now 18-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 35-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

TONY PRODUCING AS NATION'S TOP FRESHMAN

• WR **Malachi Toney** has been among Miami's top playmakers in his true freshman season, emerging as a go-to target in the Hurricanes offense for QB **Carson Beck** and OC **Shannon Dawson**.

• Since at least 2008, no freshman (redshirt or otherwise) in all of FBS had ever led his team in the first two games of the season in both catches and yards until Toney did so for Miami against both Notre Dame (6 catches, 82 yards) and Bethune-Cookman (6 catches, 80 yards) in 2025. He leads Miami with 29 catches for 375 yards.

• Toney leads all true freshmen in catches (38) and yards (510), despite playing in only six games compared to the remainder of his peers in the top five, who have each played in seven games. He is one of only three freshmen in the country to lead his team in catches and yards (Florida's Vernell Brown III, Oregon's Dakorien Moore).

• Toney became the only Hurricane in the last 30 seasons to have at least six catches, 80 receiving yards and a receiving touchdown in his college debut. He was named 247Sports National True Freshman of the Week.

• Toney, who turned 18 years old on September 17th (9/17/2007), reclassified from the Class of 2026 to the Class of 2025 at American Heritage. He helped lead the Patriots to a 12-2 record and a Class 4A state title, finishing as the leading receiver with 1,018 yards and 12 touchdowns. He played quarterback the final three games of the season in place of the injured starter, completing 36-of-45 passes for 510 yards and seven touchdowns.

O-LINE NAMED JOE MOORE HONOR ROLL...AGAIN

• For the third straight year, the Miami Hurricanes' offensive line was selected to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, which recognizing the top performing units in the nation. Miami was one of 24 selected.

FLETCHER SECOND IN TDs AT HARD ROCK WITH 13

• RB **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** has been a key member of UM's offensive attack through its impressive start to the year. Fletcher posted back-to-back games of 100-yards-or more with at least one touchdown vs. USF and Florida. The last UM RB to have back-to-back such games vs. FBS foes was Cam'Ron Harris from September 10-19, 2020.

• Fletcher scored the 13th rushing touchdown of his career at Hard Rock Stadium vs. Louisville last time out, moving him into a tie for second place with Mark Walton for second-most touchdowns at the facility. He trails only Duke Johnson, who had 17 career TDs at Hard Rock Stadium, where Miami moved prior to the 2008 season.

• He delivered a dominant outing for the Hurricanes in their 49-12 win over No. 18/23 USF on Sept. 13, posting 120 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries. It was Fletcher's second 100-yard, multi-touchdown game of his career against an AP ranked team - he also did it vs. Louisville in 2023. Since 2000, there have been only eight such performances by the Hurricanes - two from Fletcher, two from Tyrone Moss, two from Willis McGahee and one each from Clinton Portis and Frank Gore.

• Fletcher now has four career 100-yard games - his 100-yarder vs. USF was his first since 11/18/23 vs. Louisville.

DANIELS, TONEY MAKE A DYNAMIC MIAMI DUO

• WR **CJ Daniels** and WR **Malachi Toney** comprise one of only two duos in the country with at least four catches in six games this season; Florida Atlantic's Easton Messer and Asaad Waseem have also managed the feat.

BECK TOPS 9,000-YARD MARK WITH ACCURACY

• QB **Carson Beck** surpassed 9,000 career passing yards in UM's win at Florida State. Of the 114 quarterbacks to reach that mark this century for power conference teams, Beck's completion percentage is among the best.

• Beck's 68.7 completion percentage on the journey to 9,000 trails only four players from power conferences: Colt McCoy (70.3%), Graham Harrell (69.8%), Will Rogers (69.5%) and Brandon Weeden (69.5%) to place him fifth.

MIAMI NOW HAS THREE RANKED WINS THIS YEAR

• The Hurricanes recorded a third ranked win when they topped #18/#19 Florida State on October 4; the last time Miami featured three ranked wins came in 2009 against No. 18 FSU, No. 14 Georgia Tech and No. 8 Oklahoma

• Prior to this year, where Miami has knocked off #6/6 Notre Dame and #18/#23 USF in addition to FSU, the last time Miami started a year with a 3-0 mark with at least two ranked wins in those first three games was the 1993 season. UM opened the year with wins over then-No. 20 Boston College, Virginia Tech and then-No. 13 Colorado.

FOLLOW THE BLUEPRINT: CANES ARE ON THE RISE

• Miami reached a number of notable milestones in 2024, its third season under **Mario Cristobal**. The Hurricanes managed only the second 10-win season in the last 20 years at Miami (2017), finished undefeated at home for the first time since 2002 and ended the season inside the Associated Press Top 20 at No. 18 - only its second finish that high since 2005. UM went from five wins (2022, 5-7) to seven (2023, 7-6) to 10 (2024, 10-3) under Cristobal.

• The Hurricanes had 10 NFL Combine invites and its seven NFL Draft picks ranked sixth-most nationally. The Hurricanes had just one NFL Draft pick in the draft prior to Cristobal taking the helm, in 2022 - and it came in the seventh round (Jon Ford, Green Bay Packers).

• QB Cam Ward, the winner of the Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award as the nation's top quarterback, was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the Tennessee Titans - it was the third No. 1 overall pick in program history.

BALLHAWK FITZGERALD LEADS FRESHMEN IN INTs

• DB **Bryce Fitzgerald** recorded an interception for the second straight game against USF on Sept. 13, picking off Byrum Brown to end what was the nation's longest passing streak without an interception (252 straight attempts).

• Fitzgerald is one of two true freshman in the country with three interceptions; he had his third pick at FSU

• Fitzgerald, one of Miami's top performers as a true freshman, had the first interception of his career against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 6. All three interceptions showcased his elite instincts, which have been praised by staff & teammates. A four-star safety out of Christopher Columbus High School, Fitzgerald debuted vs. Notre Dame.



CANES LEAD THE NATION IN FG PCT. SINCE 2020

• The Hurricanes have been the most accurate field-goal kicking team in the country over the last six seasons. Miami has made 87.9 percent of its field goal attempts since 2020 (102/116), including a 7-for-7 start to 2025.

MESIDOR 2ND IN CAREER SACKS IN ALL OF FBS

• A key member of Miami's defensive line who has been stellar through the first half of the season, veteran edge rusher **Akheem Mesidor** is second in all of FBS with 26.5 sacks over the course of his career. Mesidor, who grew up in Ottawa, Canada, spent much of his high school career traveling to the U.S. for recruiting camps and clinics.

• Now in his sixth year, Mesidor spent the first two seasons of his career (2020-21) at West Virginia before transferring to Miami. He is one of just three players with more than 25-or-more career sacks at the FBS level, joining Trey Moore of Texas (29.5) and David Bailey of Texas Tech (25.0).

DANIELS HEADLINES NEW-LOOK WIDEOUT CORPS

• The Hurricanes lost their top-six pass-catchers by receptions from a season ago, when the Hurricanes had the No. 1 offense in the country. Miami's three starting wide receivers were all making their debuts on Aug. 31 vs. Notre Dame: transfers **CJ Daniels** (LSU) and **Keelan Marion** (BYU) as well as true freshman **Malachi Toney**.

• The trio combined for 14 catches totaling 157 yards and two touchdowns in Miami's 27-24 win. Toney was targeted 10 times - more than any other player - while both he and Daniels had touchdown catches.

• Daniels is one of only two active FBS players with 2,500 receiving yards (2,777) and 20 touchdowns (26) over their careers at the FBS level. The other is Arkansas State's Corey Rucker (3,481, 25). Daniels' eye-popping one-handed score vs. ND was named the Crunch Time Play of the Week by the Football Writers Association (FWAA).

• Daniels ranks third among all FBS players with 2,782 career receiving yards, trailing Rucker and Caullin Lacy of Louisville (3,039). Including Daniels, there are only five players in FBS who have 2,500-or-more receiving yards.

"HURRICANE BAIN" IS POWER 4'S TOP-GRADED DL

• One of the top performers in the nation in his first two years at Miami was DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, who enjoyed a dominant rookie campaign that resulted in ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors in 2023. That year, the 6-foot-3, 275-pound defensive lineman tallied 44 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks over 13 games, earning Freshman All-American honors. He was also selected to the All-ACC Third Team.

• The standout junior has twice been named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week this year; Bain, mentioned by many analysts as a Heisman Trophy candidate, was recognized following standout performances against both Notre Dame (Aug. 31) and Florida (Sept. 20).

• Through seven weeks, Bain is graded as the No. 1 defensive edge by Pro Football Focus at the Power-4 level. He has a 94.6 defensive grade overall and 90.9 run defense grade - third in all of FBS.

• Bain, who has 21.5 career TFLs, ranks No. 22 nationally among active players in TFL per game (0.77). He has been projected as a top-10 overall pick by multiple prognosticators in advance of the 2026 NFL Draft.

• Bain's uncle, Tolbert Bain, lettered for the Hurricanes from 1984-1987. His older brother, Reggie, is an offensive line graduate assistant. The rising sophomore, who was named to the preseason watch lists for the Bednarik and Lombardi Awards, has a nickname "Hurricane Bain" - a writeup from the Miami Herald on the moniker is below:

• *The "Hurricane" started swirling almost 30 years ago, years and years before Rueben Bain was even a thought in his father's mind and long before the elite edge rusher was one of the crown jewels of the Miami Hurricanes.*

It all started, fittingly, at "Traz" Powell Stadium in Miami, where Rueben Bain Sr. — just like his son — played his home games and wreaked havoc as a two-way lineman for Carol City. Willie Wilcox, the stadium's iconic public address announcer, gave him the nickname because of his physicality and tenacity, inspired by the story of wrongfully imprisoned boxer Rubin Carter.

It turned out to be something like a premonition from Wilcox. After a solid career with the Chiefs, Bain Sr. graduated, played at Division II Morris Brown College in Atlanta, moved back to Florida, where he started a family. He had a few sons and gave one his own name, and, with it, his own nickname, once Bain Jr. started playing for Miami Central and Wilcox realized who he was. He became the latest in a long line of Bains to star athletically in Miami-Dade County, starting with grandfather Herman Bain, who was a three-sport star at Northwestern.

It turns out, Wilcox had something like a premonition...he also embodied the nickname in a way not even his father could, with four state championships in four years, 58 1/2 sacks across his final two seasons at Central and finally a nod as the MaxPreps Florida Player of the Year on Tuesday." -David Wilson, Miami Herald, December 2022.

B2B FL STATE CHAMPS... IN RESOUNDING FASHION

• The Hurricanes earned their second straight unofficial state championship when they topped Florida State on Oct. 4, picking up wins over the Seminoles, Florida and USF in the same season for the second straight year. Miami is 6-0 against those three programs with added wins over Florida A&M (2024) and Bethune-Cookman (2025). Against in-state opponents the last two years, the combined scorelines are 331-99 with an 8-0 record.

• Over the same stretch, Miami also has a +1784 yardage differential against its Sunshine State opponents.

BECK RISES TO THE OCCASION AGAINST TOP FOES

• QB **Carson Beck** has 12 wins against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25, double the next highest total (Noah Fifita, Arizona - 6). He is 12-3 against AP Top 25 teams (.800), including 3-0 at Miami (1.000).

CANES ARE DOMINATING NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

• Miami has won 12 straight regular season games against non-conference opponents, finishing 4-0 in each of the last three seasons (2023, 2024, 2025). That is its longest streak since a 15-game run between 2000 and 2003.

MIAMI 'D' PUT UP HISTORIC GAME VS. GATORS

• Miami's defense held Florida to under 100 yards on the ground (80) and air (61) while also not allowing a third-down conversion (0/13). The only other ACC team in the past 30 years with that kind of defensive outing was Boston College versus Howard in 2015.

BROWN WAS ONE OF JUST 30 IN 1,100/15 CLUB

• Despite having two running backs - **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** and **Jordan Lyle** - that will play massive roles for Miami's offense in 2025, **Mario Cristobal** went out and added one of the best players at the FCS level to the roster this offseason - former North Dakota State running back **CharMar "Marty" Brown** (*pronounced like Shemar*).

• Brown was one of 30 DI (FBS/FCS) players last season to record at least 1,100 rushing yards and 15 rushing touchdowns last season, and is the only active underclassman among that group. He is a redshirt sophomore.

• Brown, the Jerry Rice Award winner as the top freshman player in Football Championship Division last season, was a member of the Stats Perform, FCS Football Central and Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-America teams. Brown won Missouri Valley Football Conference Newcomer of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors, becoming just the third Bison player and sixth in league history to sweep both awards.

• The Omaha, Neb., native led all FCS freshmen in rushing attempts (244), yards (1,181) and touchdowns (15) and became the first Bison tailback in seven years to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark. He is a 5-11, 220-pound back.

BECK IN ELITE COMPANY W/LATEST 300/3+1 GAME

• QB **Carson Beck** became the the fourth Hurricanes quarterback in the last decade to throw for 300 yards (340) and at least three touchdowns (3) and run for a score in the same game when he did so in Miami's victory over USF, joining Cam Ward (2024), Malik Rosier (2017) and Brad Kaaya (2016).

• Ward, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2025 NFL Draft, had two such performances during his lone season at Miami.

MIAMI MAKES IT FOUR STRAIGHT YEARS OF 2-0

• With a 45-3 win over Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 6, the Hurricanes opened the season with a 2-0 start for the fourth straight year - something it has not done since a four-season span from 2001 to 2004 (2022-2025).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATLE CRUCIAL VS. ND

• Notre Dame led the country in turnovers gained in 2024 and were No. 5 in turnover margin. In its win over the No. 6 Irish, Miami had zero turnovers on offense. That marked the third time Miami defeated an AP Top 10 team this century while not giving the ball away, along with 2017 against No. 3 Notre Dame and 2004 at No. 10 Virginia

UM EARNS HIGHEST PRESEASON RANK SINCE 2018

• Bolstered by the addition of several impressive newcomers and anchored by a talented group of returning veterans, the Hurricanes were ranked in the top 10 of both preseason polls - checking in at No. 10 in both the US LBM Coaches Poll and Associated Press rankings. Miami's ranking inside the top 10 marked its highest preseason in seven years; the Hurricanes opened the 2018 season ranked No. 8/8.

• The Hurricanes opened the 2024 season at No. 19 in the poll and found their name in every top 25 ranking of the season. The Hurricanes reached as high as No. 4 and ended No. 18 in the final poll, its highest since 2017 (#13).

CRISTOBAL SHAKES UP MIAMI DEFENSIVE STAFF

• In addition to hiring **Corey Hetherman** as defensive coordinator, **Mario Cristobal** made significant changes to his defensive staff entering 2025. **Zac Etheridge** was hired as defensive pass game coordinator / defensive backs coach (from Houston), **Will Harris** was hired as safeties coach (from Florida) and **Damione Lewis** was hired as defensive tackles coach (from Colorado). The only returning coach, **Jason Taylor**, is Miami's defensive line coach / defensive pass rush coordinator. Four of five coaches were replaced on the defensive side of the ball.

"FREAK" MAUIGOA AN OUTLAND CANDIDATE AT RT

• Miami standout offensive tackle **Francis Mauigoa** was ranked No. 16 in Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list:

"The former five-star has started all 26 games at right tackle that he's played at Miami since arriving. Last season, Mauigoa earned All-ACC second-team honors. The 6-6, 335-pounder clocked a 1.57 flying 10-yard split. His power output registered almost 10,000 watts, by far the most on the team, almost 1,000 watts more than the next player. Last year, Mauigoa measured at 9,274 watts. His max velocity is 18 mph and his vertical jump is 30 1/2 inches."

• Mauigoa - who was listed as a Preseason All-American by multiple outlets, a preseason candidate for the Outland Trophy, Lombardi Trophy and earned All-ACC honorsshowed marked improvement as a pass blocker during his sophomore campaign, allowing just two combined sacks/hits on 534 pass-blocking snaps according to PFF.

• A former five-star recruit out of American Samoa by way of IMG Academy, Mauigoa was the only FBS tackle with two or fewer knockdowns allowed on 500-plus pass-blocking snaps. He is projected as a top-10 NFL pick in 2026.

NEW-LOOK DB ROOM MAKING PRESENCE FELT

• After a disappointing season by Miami's secondary in 2024, the Hurricanes added a number of key players who look to transform the unit's chances in 2025. A bright spot in the group was CB **OJ Frederique**, a Freshman All-America honoree by several outlets last season, who figures to play a key role in the secondary.

• The Hurricanes infused the room with several highly impressive players via the transfer portal, including CB **Xavier Lucas**, who impressed at Wisconsin in his true freshman season in 2024, as well as S **Zechriah Poyser**, a 2024 Freshman All-America as a redshirt freshman at Jacksonville State.

• S **Jakobe Thomas** (Tennessee) and nickel **Keionte Scott** (Auburn) have started all six games in the Miami secondary. Another key piece is CB **Damari Brown**, who missed nearly all of 2024, but started vs. Louisville.

HETHERMAN HIRED AS DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

• **Mario Cristobal** announced the hiring of Minnesota Golden Gophers defensive coordinator **Corey Hetherman** to the same post in January 2025. Hetherman arrived in Coral Gables after a dominant lone season at Minnesota.

• Under Hetherman's direction, the Gophers ranked No. 9 nationally in points allowed (16.9 per game), No. 5 nationally in total defense (285.7 yards per game), No. 9 in passing defense (176.1) and No. 12 in rushing defense (109.6). Hetherman was hired by Minnesota after spending two seasons (2022-23) as Rutgers' linebacker coach. Hetherman spent 2019-21 at James Madison as the defensive coordinator. His defense ranked in the top 10 in both total defense and scoring defense in all three years he was there.

• A native of Oxford, Massachusetts, Hetherman was promoted to Associate Head Coach and was named the AFCA FCS Assistant Coach of the Year after James Madison finished with the No. 2 defense in the nation.

What They're Saying:

DC Corey Hetherman: *"We're going to be aggressive. We want to be an attacking style defense. We're going to be very multiple..we're going to be an attacking, aggressive style defense and we're going to try and dictate the tempo."*

HC Mario Cristobal: *"He is an elite coach, individual, and teacher. That is the most valuable thing when it comes to coaching. A guy has to be able to teach and connect. Every single day, he finds a way to make those guys better so that their buy-in is really, really high. You see it in the way we communicate and the way we run to the football."*

DL Akheem Mesidor: *"I love Coach Hetherman. He's a great teacher. He's just an aggressive guy, as you guys can see in his interviews. But he really just gets it down to the point. He's a technician; anything you have, he'll probably answer your question before you ask it. But he's an amazing person, a great coach, and he just lets us play free, play fast."*

LB Wesley Bissainthe: *"It starts from meetings. He's emphasizing communication. 'Communication, swarm, violence' every day in meetings, so that when we come out here, we already know it. And from the start of practice"*

DOMINANT O-LINE PLAY A CRISTOBAL HALLMARK

• The Hurricanes' offensive line was one of 24 groups named to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award honoring the nation's top unit in 2025. The Hurricanes made the cut for the third straight year and have started the same five players all six games so far. **Mario Cristobal's** OL won the award at Alabama in 2015.

• Miami returned three starters from an offensive line that keyed the way for the No. 1 offense in FBS by nearly every metric last season: RT **Francis Mauigoa** (started all 26 games of his career entering 2025), RG **Anez Cooper** (30 career starts, including 26 straight entering 2025) and LG **Matt McCoy** (12 starts last year).

• In addition to those three starters, Miami also received significant contributions from LT **Markel Bell** - who made five starts last year in place of an injured Jalen Rivers in his first season at Miami in 2024 - and LG **Ryan Rodriguez**, who started the season opener against Florida before suffering a season-ending injury.

• According to SportSource Analytics, Miami ranked No. 3 in the country and No. 1 in FBS last year in offensive line efficiency at 109.2. Only teams ahead of Miami were New Mexico (134.5) and Army (110.5). Offensive Line Efficiency is a combination of five key metrics: tackle for loss percentage allowed (6.1%), sack percentage allowed (4.7%), percentage of rushes that went for four-plus yards (49.6%) and first down conversion percentage on 3rd & 4th Down runs where the necessary yardage was 1-2 yards (85.7% on third [24/28], 100% on fourth [6/6]).

• Miami added one of the top centers in the transfer portal for the third straight year this offseason, with C **James Brockermeyer** signing on from the Hurricanes for TCU. In his lone season in Fort Worth, Brockermeyer was All-Big 12 Honorable Mention. He allowed just one sack and eight quarterback pressures in 2024 according to PFF. Prior to adding Brockermeyer, Miami added Zach Carpenter (Indiana) in 2024 and Matt Lee (UCF) in 2023.

• During 13 of his 16 full seasons as head coach, Cristobal has entrusted **Alex Mirabal** with the development of the offensive line with stops at FIU, Oregon and now Miami. The two coaches, who met during their playing days at Christopher Columbus in Miami, were in each other's wedding parties - Cristobal was Mirabal's 'best man.'

CANES REEL IN #1 RANKED ACC CLASS YET AGAIN

• For the third straight year, the Miami Hurricanes reeled in the best recruiting class in the ACC by the 247Sports rankings in 2024. The Hurricanes' incoming group was ranked No. 13 in the nation. Miami's 2025 class, inked in December 2024, was the top-rated group in the ACC for the third consecutive cycle.

• Miami's group featured eight players ranked in the Top247 rankings: DL **Hayden Lowe** (No. 16), RB **Girard Pringle, Jr.** (No. 151), OL **Seuseu Alofaituli** (No. 163), TE **Brock Schott** (No. 174), WR **Joshua Moore** (No. 193), DL **Herbert Scroggins** (No. 195), DB **Bryce Fitzgerald** (No. 237) and QB **Luke Nickel** (No. 247).

• The Hurricanes' 2024 group ranked No. 6 in the nation, while its 2023 group - the first full cycle under Cristobal - was ranked No. 8. According to Pick Six Previews, Miami was one of just 14 programs to sign a top 25 high school recruiting class and transfer class and one of just six to do it in three consecutive years - 2023, 2024 and 2025.

A "MENACE" REUNITES WITH HIS FORMER COACH

• One of Miami's key additions via the transfer portal came in the second window following spring practice, when the Hurricanes added former Rutgers standout Mo Toure (pronounced tur-RAY) to its linebacker room.

• Toure had a breakout 2023, playing in all 13 games for Rutgers and making eight starts during that season. Then under now Miami defensive coordinator Corey Hetheman (then Rutgers linebackers coach), Toure was second on the team with 93 tackles and led the Scarlet Knights with nine-and-a-half tackles for loss. He also played in Rutgers' 2023 Pinstripe Bowl win over Miami. Toure has started both games at linebacker for Miami in 2025.

• Toure, who has the moniker "Mo The Menace," was named to the Butkus Award watch list in 2024, but suffered ACL injuries that ended his 2022 and 2024 seasons. Toure is in his seventh season of college football.

• **Mario Cristobal on Toure:** "There is a ton of versatility with Mo. He is very physical. He is large at 240 pounds and he has produced in the Big Ten at a high level. We have a motivated version of Mo and I am excited to see what that looks like. He is physical at the point of attack and a really good tackler."

CONTINUING THE TREND: UM WINNING T.O.P BATTLE

• While Miami's offense was among the most prolific throughout the 2024 regular season, the Hurricanes also methodically controlled the clock last season, ranking No. 9 in "T.O.P". Miami is ranked No. 20 in 2025 (32:17) so far.

51 YEARS AND COUNTING FOR #NFLU STREAK

• With seven players selected in the 2025 NFL Draft, the Miami Hurricanes extended their streak to 51 consecutive years with one pick. UM trails only Michigan (1939), USC (1939) and Florida (1952) in consecutive years.



DAWSON LED MOST EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE IN FBS

- In his second year at the helm of Miami's offense in 2024, OC **Shannon Dawson** orchestrated the nation's No. 1 unit in both points per game (43.9) and yards (537.2).
- The Hurricanes ended the 2024 ranked No. 2 nationally in both plays of 10-or-more yards (249) and 20-or-more-yards (99). In each category, Miami trailed a team that had played 16 games compared to their 13 - Penn State (253 of 10-or-more) and Texas (108 of 20-or-more).
- The Hurricanes had 10 games of 500-or-more yards in the 2024 regular season, marking only the sixth time in the previous decade (since 2014) an FBS team has had 10-or-more games of 500-or-more yards of offense; Alabama (2018, 11), LSU (2019, 10), Oklahoma (2018, 10), Oklahoma (2017, 10) and Baylor (2014, 10).
- Miami's offense, anchored by QB Cam Ward – who went on to win the Davey O'Brien Award, the Manning Award and ACC Player of the Year honors – helped lead the Hurricanes to their first 10-win season since 2017.
- Miami's offense was among the nation's most improved in its first season under Dawson's direction in 2023, with a jump to No. 25 in total offense (up from No. 85 in 2022), No. 22 in yards per play (from No. 67) and No. 35 in scoring offense (from No. 96).

UM WAS ELITE IN '24 2ND HALVES, 4TH QUARTERS

- Miami ended the season ranked No. 2 in both second-half point differential (+12.62) and fourth-quarter point differential (+8.54) last season. In both categories, UM trailed Indiana (+9.08 in fourth quarter, +13.31 in second halves).

UM 1 OF 7 TO RANK IN T-25 OF TOTAL O+D IN 2024

- Miami ended the regular season ranked in the top 25 of both total offense (#1) and total defense (#24) at the conclusion of the regular season - five of the other seven schools to qualify for the list were College Football Playoff teams, and the only other team to do so was Ole Miss, who also narrowly missed out on a CFP berth.

WE RUN THIS STATE: HURRICANES LEAD THE WAY

- Among what is commonly referred to as the "Big Three" programs in the Sunshine State - Miami, Florida and Florida State, the Hurricanes are now the all-time state leaders in both wins vs. in-state opponents and winning percentage. UM's win against Florida in 2024 was its 100th and propelled UM to the best winning percentage in the state.

FORMER RETIRED NUMBERS HONORED BY CANES

• For the second straight year since originally many of them were originally retired, jersey numbers 10 (**Raul Aguirre, Jr. & Malachi Toney**) and 42 (**Artavius Jones**) will be worn by Hurricanes on the field in 2025. In addition, two other retired numbers - 14 (**Hayden Lowe**) and 13 (**Bryce Fitzgerald & Daylyn Upshaw**) will also be worn.

• There are patches honoring George Mira Sr. (#10), Jim Dooley (#42), Gino Torretta (#13) & Vinny Testaverde (#14), whose numbers are among the most recognizable in UM history and came out of retirement in 2024.

From their respective University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame bios:

George Mira, Sr.

"Mira Sr. will long be remembered by Hurricane fans as one of Miami's greatest quarterbacks and perhaps the 'Canes greatest player ever. In his three year career, Mira set numerous passing records, some of which are still in the record books. During his career, Miami once again gained national prominence, reaching the 1961 Liberty Bowl, the first bowl appearance in 19 years. Mira was the quarterback and passer for the '60's, he could drop back and pass and scramble when he had to, which earned him his nickname "The Matador". In 1962 Mira lead the Hurricanes to the Gotham Bowl in New York City and proved to the country that he was the real deal"

Jim Dooley

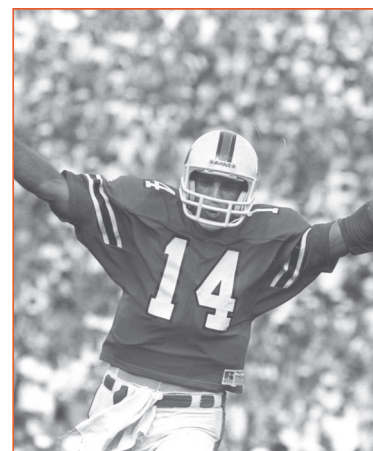
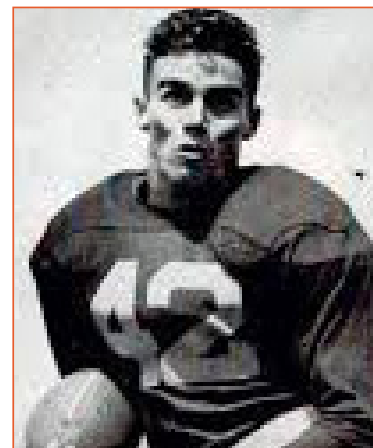
"Jim Dooley is a football legend at the University of Miami. Dooley was the first Hurricane football player to have his jersey number retired, #42, the first Hurricane player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, to the Chicago Bears, in 1952, and the first, and only, UM player to be an NFL head coach. Jim came to the University of Miami in 1947 after a stellar high school career at Miami High. As a junior and senior Dooley was a true "sixty minute man" playing both offense and defense. He set several records during his UM days, 17 interceptions on defense and over 1,000 yards rushing on offense. In 1951, Dooley intercepted 10 passes and was named first-team All-American by the Associated Press. Dooley played in both the 1951 Orange Bowl Classic and the 1952 Gator Bowl where he earned MVP honors and setting a Gator Bowl record with 4 interceptions"

Vinny Testaverde

Vinny Testaverde came to the Hurricanes by way of Elmont, New York in the fall of 1982. Vinny was the first player in U.M. history to win the Heisman Trophy, 1986. Vinny is one of only a handful of Hurricane football players to have his number retired (14). On the career lists Vinny ranked, at the time, second in passing yardage, (6,058), tied with Steve Walsh for first in touchdown passes (48) and fourth in pass completions (413). In addition to winning the Heisman Trophy, he also won the Davey O'Brien Award, the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, the Maxwell Award and was voted a consensus first-team All-American. As a starter, Vinny led the Hurricanes to a 21-1 regular season mark over two years. Testaverde was selected the first pick in the 1987 NFL draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and played on several other NFL teams during his long, and successful, career.

Gino Torretta

"Gino Torretta capped an illustrious collegiate career by bringing the prestigious Heisman Trophy award back to the Coral Gables campus in 1992. The 1992 season was to be Gino Torretta's coronation as the Heisman favorite. But the season started amidst disaster as Hurricane Andrew ripped through South Florida just 12 days before the season opener at Iowa. Dealing with the emotional aftermath, Gino led the Hurricanes to a 24-7 win over the Hawkeyes on national television by passing for 433 yards and two touchdowns. If there was a game that typified his career it was the win against Florida State. Miami trailed 16-10 with 9:05 left in the fourth period when Gino led the Hurricanes on a 58-yard scoring drive to take the lead. Torretta took every award available to him in '92: the Maxwell Award (best overall player), Davey O'Brien Award (top quarterback), Unitas Award (top senior quarterback), consensus All-American, and every Player of the Year Award."





HEAD COACH MARIO CRISTOBAL

FOURTH SEASON | MIAMI, 1993

Career Record: 89-77 | UM Record: 27-17 | ACC Record: 13-13

Mario Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons before arriving at Miami.

The Hurricanes showed tremendous growth from Year 1 to Year 2 under Cristobal's direction; Miami was No. 24 in total defense and No. 31 in total offense in all of FBS in 2023, jumping 40 spots in total defense (up from No. 64) and 60 spots in total offense (up from No. 85). Miami pulled in the top two recruiting classes in program history in the modern era by every ranking in his two full cycles - the No. 7 class in the nation in 2023 and the No. 4 class in 2024.

Cristobal brought more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen. Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season. During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.

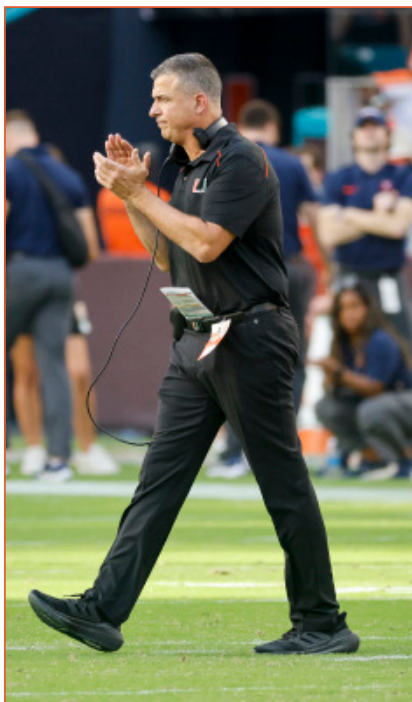

UM WIN THRILLER OVER NOTRE DAME, 27-24

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- From start to finish the roars reverberated from the hashmarks to the rafters.

Before a sold-out, orange-clad crowd of 66,793 at Hard Rock Stadium, the Miami Hurricanes defeated the Notre Dame Fighting Irish in a 27-24 thriller Sunday night, waking up their own echoes with a statement victory that no doubt made the star-studded sideline of Hurricanes legends beam with pride.

No. 10 Miami improved to 1-0, while the sixth-ranked Irish fell to 0-1. It was the Canes' highest ranked win since, well, Miami's 2017 victory over then-No. 3 Notre Dame at Hard Rock in 2017. The Canes have now won seven consecutive home games against Notre Dame, the last defeat coming in 1977.

Carter Davis kicked two field goals, including a 47-yarder with 1:04 remaining that broke a 24-24 tie. Miami's defense held from there, sacking Notre Dame quarterback CJ Carr on the final two snaps of the game.

Quarterback **Carson Beck** completed 20 of 31 passes for 205 yards and two touchdowns in his Miami debut. Running back **Mark Fletcher** rushed for 64 yards, while backfield mate **Marty Brown** rushed for 54 yards and a score. Wide receiver **Malachi Toney** paced UM with six receptions for 82 yards and a touchdown, while **CJ Daniels** had five catches for 46 yards, including a circus touchdown catch that will live on posters for years to come.

Miami's defense forced two turnovers, posted three sacks and held Notre Dame's vaunted rushing attack to just 93 yards on 28 carries. Defensive end **Rueben Bain, Jr.** registered six tackles and his first career interception, while **Akheem Mesidor** posted five stops and 1.5 sacks. Linebacker **Raul Aguirre** also had six tackles.

"This game, this victory is for everybody," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "It's for our university, our players, our students, alumni, former players. Coach (Jimmy) Johnson, got to see him earlier. I don't know where to start, but tremendously proud of this team. The resiliency, complimentary football overcoming a couple of hiccups and whatnot.

"But all in all, just an awesome, awesome night for the Miami Hurricanes."

HURRICANES TOP BETHUNE-COOKMAN, 45-3

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- Playing on a short week after an emotional victory, the Miami Hurricanes returned to Hard Rock Stadium and delivered just the performance they needed.

The fifth-ranked Canes were ruthlessly efficient on offense, stingy on defense and controlled the game from start to finish, defeating Bethune-Cookman 45-3 before a crowd of 60,617.

Miami improved to 2-0, while BCU fell to 0-2.

The Canes racked up 543 yards, averaging 8.4 yards per play and scoring on all five of their red zone trips. Quarterback **Carson Beck** completed 22 of 24 passes for 267 yards and two touchdowns. He completed his first 15 passes, setting a school record for consecutive completions in a single game; Vinny Testaverde held the previous mark, completing 14 straight passes against Oklahoma in 1986.

Both scoring strikes were to wide receiver **CJ Daniels**, who hauled in five passes for 73 yards. Fellow wideout **Malachi Toney** paced Miami with six receptions for 80 yards. Running back **Mark Fletcher** rushed 11 times for 86 yards and two scores, while backfield mates **Marty Brown** and **Girard Pringle** each added rushing scores.

Miami's defense kept the Wildcats out of the end zone and held BCU to 191 total yards, yielding just 3.8 yards per play. The Canes racked up 10 tackles for loss, led by safety **Keionte Scott** who had three TFLs. Defensive end **Rueben Bain** posted three tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. Linebacker **Kellen Wiley** led Miami with five stops.

"Pretty solid job by our guys coming out handling business, really efficient by the offense scoring on every drive," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "Our defense did a really good job, too, although their team was obviously trying to snap the ball with a low count on the shot clock to try and limit the number of possessions that we had and once we played the ones in the second half of the first drive, I thought that was a good time to work on developing the other half of our roster.

"Lots of guys got their first opportunity and the opportunity to get significant playing time and play within our system. So, a lot of positives, a lot of things to fix, a lot of things to get better at."

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- In 1987, the Miami Hurricanes beat three consecutive ranked opponents to start the season. Nobody has done it since.

After opening with ranked wins over Boise State and Florida, the USF Bulls had a chance to match that feat Saturday at Hard Rock Stadium. But the current Hurricanes kept the alumni streak intact – in a big way.

Fifth-ranked Miami defeated No. 18 USF 49-12 before a sellout crowd of 66,591 that thrived and vibed through a 100-minute weather delay but was treated to the Canes' ninth straight home win. UM improved to 3-0, while the Bulls fell to 2-1.

Miami racked up 576 total yards and held a 12-minute advantage in time of possession. The Canes averaged seven plays on their seven touchdown drives. Running back **Mark Fletcher** rushed for 120 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 7.5 yards per carry. It was the third 100-yard game of his career.

Quarterback **Carson Beck** completed 23 of 28 passes for 340 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions. Wide receivers **Keelan Marion** and **Malachi Toney** each had six receptions, while freshman **Joshua Moore** had three catches for 61 yards and the first two touchdowns of his career.

Miami's defense held USF to just 40 rushing yards. The Bulls converted 7 of 19 on third down and were 0 of 2 on fourth down. Defensive ends **Akheem Mesidor** and **Rueben Bain** each posted six tackles. Safety **Bryce Fitzgerald** picked off a pass for the second straight game.

USF quarterback Byrum Brown completed 20 of 36 passes for 274 yards with one score and one pick.

"Really just fired up, impressed with our players, our team, our entire organization, in handling the week in preparation for a team that had been playing really, really good football and handling what they do best, which is tempo," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "First goes out to our scout team. They simulated them as well as you possibly can all week long, and because that is a challenge, but the physicality, the level of energy that we played with tonight, although a couple of critical mistakes, was progress for our football team."

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- It started early in the morning, when thousands of Miami Hurricanes fans descended upon the university's Coral Gables campus and gave the college football world a show for the ages.

The scene shifted to Hard Rock Stadium Saturday evening, where thousands more were treated to another memorable show.

The Canes conducted a defensive masterclass from start to finish, defeating the Florida Gators 26-7 before a sellout crowd of 66,713. Fourth-ranked Miami improved to 4-0, while Florida fell to 1-3.

The Canes' defense held UF to just 141 total yards while racking up four sacks and seven tackles for loss. The Gators had 13 third down opportunities and didn't convert one. Linebacker **Mohamed Toure** led the onslaught with 10 tackles and a sack.

Linebacker **Wesley Bissainthe** recorded eight stops and defensive end **Rueben Bain, Jr.** registered seven and one-half sack.

Meanwhile, the Canes racked up 344 total yards on 76 plays. Running back **Mark Fletcher** rushed for 116 yards and one touchdown and fellow back **CharMar "Marty" Brown** rushed for 80 yards and two scores.

Quarterback **Carson Beck** completed 17 of 30 passes for 160 yards and one interception. Four Canes tied for the team lead with four receptions.

Gators quarterback DJ Lagway completed just 12 of 23 passes for 61 yards. Running back Jadan Baugh rushed for 46 yards and had Florida's lone touchdown. Defensive back Jordan Castell paced UF with 10 tackles.

"This game means a lot to us," head coach **Mario Cristobal** said. "It means a lot to our alumni, the fan base and certainty we always thought they were a very talented team. They have a lot of really good players and they were always a play or two away from being really, really good. Our guys kept their composure when we started getting in a rut a little bit there with the offense. The defense played off the charts football, again."

CANES OPEN ACC PLAY WITH WIN OVER FSU

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Amid a hostile, hyped-up collection of garnet and gold in Doak Campbell Stadium, the Miami Hurricanes didn't flinch.

They hit big plays through the air. They held onto the ball. They created turnovers. They kept the nation's top-ranked offense out of the end zone until the fourth quarter.

Equal parts efficient and ruthless, they opened ACC play Saturday night with a big-time win over a big-time rival to show they are a big-time force to be reckoned with as the college football calendar turns to October.

In their first road test of 2025, the third-ranked Canes defeated No. 18 Florida State 28-22. Miami improved to 5-0 overall, 1-0 in the ACC. FSU fell to 3-2 overall and 0-2 in conference play. It was the first ranked meeting between the teams since 2016, and the Canes now own a 37-33 lead in the series.

The Seminoles entered the game with the nation's best scoring offense (53 points per game) and total offense (600 yards per game) but were held to 404 total yards – 188 of those yards in the fourth quarter when the Canes had built a 25-point lead. FSU had 83 offensive snaps, 24 more than Miami.

Cornerback **Keionte Scott** paced Miami's defense with 11 tackles and had a fumble recovery. Safety **Zechariah Poyser** recorded eight stops and a forced fumble. Cornerback **Bryce Fitzgerald** and safety **Jakobe Thomas** each had interceptions with Thomas adding a sack. Defensive end **Akheem Mesidor** racked up six tackles and a sack. After kicking a field goal on their opening drive, the Seminoles didn't score again until their ninth drive.

Meanwhile, quarterback **Carson Beck**, who has played in his share of unwelcoming road environments, completed 20 of 27 passes for 241 yards and threw four touchdown passes – two each to wide receivers **CJ Daniels** and **Malachi Toney**. Toney finished with seven grabs for 107 yards and Daniels's five receptions went for 78 yards. Running back Mark Fletcher rushed for 40 yards on 12 carries. Miami didn't commit a turnover.

FSU quarterback Tommy Castellanos completed 25 of 45 passes for 272 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also led the Seminoles in rushing with 57 yards.

CARDINALS HAND CANES FIRST LOSS OF '25

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- For the third straight season, the battle for the boots was a barnburner.

The Louisville Cardinals forced four turnovers, including one in the waning seconds, to hold off the second-ranked Miami Hurricanes 24-21 Friday night before a crowd of 66,573 at Hard Rock Stadium.

The Cardinals improved to 5-1 overall, 2-1 in the ACC. The Canes fell to 5-1 and 1-1 in conference play. Louisville reclaimed the Schnellenberger Trophy, a pair of bronzed boots worn by legendary coach Howard Schnellenberger, who served as the head coach for both programs.

It was Miami's first home loss since dropping its 2023 home finale to the Cardinals.

Louisville's defense limited the Canes to 64 rushing yards and picked off quarterback Carson Beck four times. Cardinals running back Isaac Brown rushed for 113 yards on 15 carries, and quarterback Miller Moss threw for 248 yards and two scores -- both to wide receiver Chris Bell, who amassed 136 yards on nine grabs.

Beck completed 25 of 35 passes for 271 yards. Wide receiver Malachi Toney had another monster performance, hauling in nine passes for 135 yards and scoring on a 12-yard run. Fellow wideout CJ Daniels had seven receptions for 74 yards.

Cornerback Keionte Scott paced Miami with nine tackles, adding a sack, three tackles for loss and a forced fumble. Linebackers Wesley Bissainthe and Mohamed Toure each had six stops, and safety Zechariah Poyser recorded six tackles and a fumble recovery.

It was 14-0 Louisville just 10 minutes into the game.

But on the first play of Miami's second drive, Beck found Daniels for a 30-yard reception to the Louisville 45. He followed that with a dime to Toney down the left sideline for 39 yards. In just two plays, the Canes had the ball first and goal at the six-yard line. Running back Mark Fletcher followed with three runs, the last a two-yard scoring plunge that cut the lead to seven points.

Toney took a handoff from Beck on a jet sweep and raced to the end zone to cut Louisville's lead to 24-21, but that's as close as Miami would get, falling to the Cardinals for its first loss.
