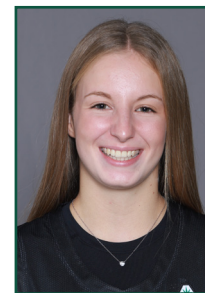

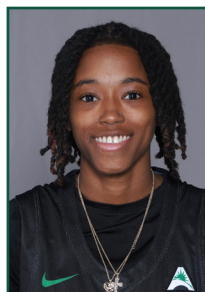

THE LYNN BRIA FILE

A four-time ASUN Conference champion and Stetson women's basketball's all-time winningest head coach, Lynn Bria enters her 18th season at the helm of the Hatters.

Over the past 17 seasons, Bria has built the Hatters into a force in the ASUN. She has guided the team to two conference championships, two NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT bids, eight winning seasons and 12 trips to postseason play.

Bria hit her 300th win at Stetson with a 70-56 win on the road over Morgan State.

In the topsy-turvy COVID season of 2020-21, Bria's Hatters made their 10th postseason appearance in 11 years and won just their third-ever NCAA postseason game, a 49-45 win over Loyola-Chicago in the WBI. Newcomer Yazz Wazeerud-Din earned three weekly awards from the ASUN and was named second team all-conference following the regular season.

Bria currently serves as chair of the NCAA Division I women's basketball rules committee, a role she has held since August of 2020.

In 2018-19, Bria earned her 200th victory with the Hatters in a 69-52 win over Liberty on Jan. 8. She also guided the Hatters to a second place finish in the ASUN and the team's fifth WNIT appearance. Senior McKenna Beach earned first team all-conference honors in a season where she posted a 37-point game against Kennesaw State and recorded a triple-double vs. Lipscomb.

Bria broke the program record for coaching victories with her 185th triumph on Dec. 21, 2017 when the Hatters defeated Texas State 61-54. Earlier, on Nov. 22, she led Stetson to its first win over the Florida Gators since 1988, a 85-71 victory in Savannah.

In a historic 2016-17 season, Bria guided the Hatters to 26 wins and the program's first-ever ASUN regular season championship with a 13-1 league record. Stetson ended FGCU's 75-game ASUN home court win streak on Feb. 25 to clinch the ASUN title and capture the No. 1 seed for the ASUN tournament. The Hatters also made their seventh straight postseason appearance with a berth in the WNIT.

Stetson set single-season school records for highest win pct. (.788), best free throw percentage (.791), and best scoring defense (57.5). The Hatters were also recognized with votes in the USA Today Coaches poll and a No. 10 ranking in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll.

Bria earned ASUN Coach of the Year honors for her efforts in 2016-17. In addition, Brianti Saunders was named ASUN Player of the Year and Sarah Sagerer the ASUN Defensive Player of the Year. Saunders finished her illustrious career as Stetson's all-time scoring leader with 1,975 points.

In 2015-16, Stetson won 20 games for the sixth year in a row despite not having any seniors on the squad. The Hatters also qualified for the WBI and earned their second NCAA postseason victory with a 89-54 win over McNeese State.

Saunders set the school single-game record with 40 points vs. Georgia State, and came within 11 points of tying the single-season scoring record. She was named first team all-conference, while Breana Bey was named second team all-conference and A-Sun Tri-Newcomer of the Year. McKenna Beach was named A-Sun Freshman of the Year.

Stetson posted its fifth-straight 20-win season in 2014-15, compiling a 23-8 record overall. The Hatters won 11 non-conference games for the first time ever, and the 23 wins overall tied for the third-winningest season in school history. Three Hatters were named First-Team All-Conference for the second year in a row, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year Amber Porter.

In 2013-14 and for the third year in a row, the Hatters set a school record for most victories in a single-season with 27. Stetson also won a school-record 16 conference games and won a school record 16 consecutive contests during the regular season. The Hatters also earned their second-ever bid to the WNIT and the program's first-ever NCAA postseason victory, a 70-63 win at Miami on March 20. Stetson had three players named First Team All-Conference, including A-Sun Freshman of the Year Amber Porter.

The 2012-13 season was one for the history books as the Hatters set numerous team records for success and captured their second A-Sun title in the past three seasons. Bria helped lead the Hatters to a school-record 24 wins overall, a 12-1 record at home, a school-record 14 wins in conference play, and winning streaks of 11-straight overall and 16 in a row at home. In the A-Sun Championship game, Stetson rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit to defeat top-seeded and previously undefeated FGCU 70-64, and then earned their highest-ever NCAA Tournament seed (14) and an appearance in the Columbus, Ohio, regional against UCLA.

In 2011-12, the Hatters won a school-record 23 games and advanced to the postseason for the second year in a row, participating in the WNIT for the first time in school history. Three players earned All-Atlantic Sun honors including A-Sun Player of the Year and All-Tournament Team selection Victoria McGowan, who led the nation with three triple-doubles. Also honored were Second Team All-Atlantic Sun forward Sasha Sims and A-Sun All-Freshman Team forward Cherisse Burris.

LET CAM COOK!

Leads the ASUN with 200 total points (20.0 ppg) while shooting a league-best 46.8% from three and 50.8% from the floor (second in the conference)

Reigning ASUN Newcomer of the Year after leading the league with 530 points last season; returned after being named ASUN Preseason Player of the Year following a junior year with 11 games of 20+ points

Closed last season with a season-high 30 points vs. South Alabama, totaling 50 points over a two-day tournament

Opened the 2024–25 season with 27 points on 8-of-14 shooting vs. Alabama, the most by a Hatter in a season opener in more than two decades

Earned her first ASUN Player of the Week award this season after a career-high 35-point performance — tied for the fifth-most in program history — in a 70–67 road win at UCF

Finished the UCF game with five 3-pointers and five rebounds, scoring 14 of Stetson's 18 first-quarter points and hitting two clutch fourth-quarter threes

That performance lifted Stetson to its first win over UCF in 10 years and first regular-season Power Conference victory since 2017, extending the Hatters' win streak to four games

Earned her second ASUN Player of the Week honor following the Holiday Hoops Classic, highlighted by 32 points and seven 3-pointers vs. Stonehill, tying the second-most made 3-pointers in a single game in program history

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

At Insight Credit Union Arena, Stetson average 89 points per game while only allowing an average of 52.3 to opponents

Thomas led the Hatters in the home efforts,

last season averaging 21.3 points per game in 15 games at the Edmunds Center.

They went 12–3 as a team at home last season, including 7–2 in ASUN Play

This season the Hatters are 2–1 at home, as they wrap up the home non-conference schedule on Saturday.

MCMILLAN MAGIC

ASUN assist leader with 51 assists (5.1 per game), also pacing the conference by a wide margin in assist-to-turnover ratio

Averaging 13.8 points per game (7th in ASUN) while ranking 6th in the league with 21 three-pointers

A steady playmaker in 2023–24, appearing in all 30 games and totaling 120 assists, the most by a Hatter since 2017–18

Posted a season-high 17 points and six assists vs. Utah State last season, helping Stetson build a 20-point advantage

Opened the 2024–25 season vs. Alabama with 14 points and eight assists, setting the tone as the Hatters' primary distributor

Recorded a 13-point, 10-assist double-double against North Florida, the program's first 10-assist game since 2018–19

Has handed out five or more assists in six of nine games this season

Named to the Music City Classic All-Tournament Team after totaling 45 points, 10 three-pointers, and nine assists over two games

WHAT IS A HATTER?

The unlikely combination of a famous hat manufacturer and a university produced a novel nickname for Stetson University. The athletic teams are called "Hatters," reflecting the university's association with John B. Stetson, maker of the well-known Stetson hats. It all began in 1883 when Henry DeLand founded the DeLand Academy. Three years later, after a disastrous freeze affecting the citrus industry left DeLand in financial distress, Stetson, who had a winter home in DeLand, became interested in the school. At DeLand's request, Stetson was made chairman of the Board of Trustees in 1889 and the university was renamed in his honor. Stetson University fielded the first football team in Florida in 1901. The name "Hatter" was used then and is still in use today.

GRAD-ITUDE ON THE COURT

The Hatters will enter the season with three graduates on their roster.

Mary McMillan returns for another season while Aleah Sorrentino and Rose Caso join Stetson as transfers.

RECORD RAINFALL

Set a program record with 17 made three-pointers vs. Northern Kentucky at the Music City Classic.

Broke the previous record of 14 threes (vs. Webber International, 11/30/18).

Shot 50 percent from deep in the record-setting win (17-for-34).

Followed up with 12 more threes vs. Saint Louis, totaling 29 made threes in Nashville.

Five different Hatters knocked down multiple three-pointers in the record-setting game.

Cameron Thomas tied the program's second-most threes in a game with seven vs. Stonehill.

As a team, Stetson has hit 101 threes on 267 attempts, leading the ASUN at 37.8 percent.

Thomas (32 threes) and Mary McMillan (21 threes) both rank among the ASUN's top shooters, with Thomas near the top of the league and McMillan inside the conference's top group.

ALL EYES ON ALEAH

Leads Stetson with 85 rebounds (8.5 rpg), ranking third in the ASUN, and averages 10.8 points per game (third on the team, 20th in the conference)

Recorded three double-doubles in her first season with the Hatters, including back-to-back double-doubles on the DMV road trip

Anchors the paint on both ends and is one of Stetson's top interior defenders with eight blocks, tied for 14th in the ASUN
