• FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS SOUTH TO PLAY AT MIAMI ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 20 AT 7:00 P.M.
Florida State, which has won 14 of its last 15 games against Miami, travels south to Coral Gables to face the Hurricanes at the Watsco Center on Tuesday, January 20, 2026, at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles' recent success against Miami began with a 103-94 win over the Hurricanes on January 27, 2018 and includes winning streaks of nine games (January 27, 2018 through January 22, 2022 - the longest winning streak by either team in the 95-game series) and five games (February 25, 2023 through February 19, 2025 - current). The Seminoles' current five-game winning streak is their longest against any of their ACC opponents. Following Tuesday's game at Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at SMU for the first time in school history on Saturday, January 24, 2026 at 4:00 p.m. Florida State's games at Miami and at SMU are their first of two consecutive ACC road games for the Seminoles this season. The Seminoles also play at Georgia Tech (February 28) and at Pitt (March 4) later in the season.

FLY NAMED TO SILVER WAVES MEDIA LIST OF 100 MOST IMPACTFUL HIGH MAJOR COACHES

• Michael Fly, who is in his first year on the Florida State men's basketball staff as its general manager and assistant coach, has been named to the 2026 Silver Waves Media list of the 100 Most Impactful High Major Coaches. The Seminoles are one of 11 schools from the ACC and one of only three schools from the conference to have multiple coaches named to the prestigious list. Fly is considered to be one of the top assistant coaches in the ACC. After serving as the associate head coach at Jacksonville University from 2023 to 2025, Fly returned to Florida State for the 2025-26 season after serving as a graduate assistant under the legendary head coach Leonard Hamilton.

SILVER WAVES MEDIA NAMES MORAN TO LIST OF 100 IMPACTFUL HIGH MAJOR COACHES

• First-year Florida State associate head coach Jim Moran has been named to the 2026 Silver Waves Media list of the 100 Most Impactful High Major Coaches. Moran is in his first season in Tallahassee on head coach Luke Loucks' Seminole staff. Moran brings over a decade of NBA and developmental league coaching experience to the Seminoles' bench. Most recently, Moran has served as an assistant coach for the Sacramento Kings under Head Coach Mike Brown since 2024. Before that, he was the Head Coach of the Rip City Remix (2023-2024), the G League affiliate of the Portland Trail Blazers. From 2021 to 2023, he worked as an Assistant Coach for the Detroit Pistons under Dwane Casey.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

• Defeat Miami and give Seminole head coach Luke Loucks his first career ACC victory. A win at Miami would make Loucks the third Seminole head coach to gain his first career ACC win on the road in conference play. Pat Kennedy won his ACC opener at North Carolina (December 15, 1991) while Steve Robinson earned his first ACC win at NC State (January 3, 1998).
• ...Defeat Miami and win its sixth consecutive game against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles have won each game in the series since an 85-84 victory on February 25, 2023 in Coral Gables.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Led by seniors Chauncey Wiggins and Robert McCray, V who both finished a perfect five-of-five from the free throw line against Wake Forest, the Seminoles shot .895 from the free throw line (17 of 19) against Wake Forest on Saturday at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles' .895 shooting mark from the free throw line against the Demon Deacons marked its highest percentage in ACC play, their second highest free throw percentage of the year, and the fourth time they have shot better than .800 from the free throw line this season.

Led by Chauncey Wiggins' career-high .912 free throw percentage, the Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against Miami shooting .717 from the free throw line. The Seminoles made more free throws than Wake Forest attempted (17-12) and outscored the Demon Deacons from the free throw line (17-9) on Saturday in the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES APPROACHING 200 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Miami ranked third in the ACC with 196 3-point shots made. The Seminoles are averaging 10.9 3-point field goals made per game in the first 18 games of the season. The Seminoles are one of only four teams in the ACC that is averaging more than 10 3-point field goals made for the entire season.

FLORIDA STATE GOES TO THE BOARDS AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Led by LaJae Jones' 10 rebounds, the Seminoles totaled 44 rebounds against Wake Forest, outrebounded the Demon Deacons by a +16 rebound margin (44-28), won the offensive rebounding battle by a +7 margin (16-9), and won the second chance point battle (16-12) on Saturday in Tallahassee. Florida State earned a +16 rebound margin against Wake Forest - tying their season high which also came against Alabama State (November 7, 2025) and Jacksonville (December 22, 2025) earlier this season.

Florida State has outrebounded 10 of its first 18 opponents including Alcorn State (36-33, +3) Alabama State (49-35, +14), Georgia Southern (46-39, +7), Cal State Bakersfield (38-37, +1), Houston (37-35, +2), UMass (39-37, +2), Dayton (37-35, +2), Mississippi Valley State (40-31, +9), Jacksonville (44-28, +16), and Wake Forest (44-28, +16).

FLORIDA STATE'S STRONG BENCH PLAY IN ACC ACTION

Florida State's strong bench play has been a bright spot for the Seminoles in their first five games of the ACC. The Seminoles bench players have outscored their opponents bench players in each of their first five ACC games and averaging 26.2 points per game.

LAST GAME AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State's Malique Ewin scored a career-high 24 points and Jamir Watkins scored 16 to lead Florida State to a 74-66 win over Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center on February 19, 2025. Ewin finished a perfect 10 of 10 from the field to become just the fourth player in school history - and the first since 1992 - to finish perfect on at least 10 field goals in a game. The junior was 10 of 10 from the field to match a record for field goal perfection last set by Douglas Edwards against UNC Asheville on January 2, 1992. In a game that saw seven lead changes and eight ties, the Seminoles took advantage of a 7-0 run midway through the second half to turn a one-point advantage into an eight-point advantage in just 1:04 of game time. During the run, Ewin scored four points and freshman AJ Swinton added three more on a 3-point shot to give the Seminoles the breathing room they needed to gain their third ACC win in their last four conference games.

FLORIDA STATE BY THE NUMBERS

.417 Sophomore Martin Somerville is shooting .417 from the free throw line (five of 12) in his last two games against Syracuse and Wake Forest.

.714 Senior Ales Steen is shooting .714 percent from the field in ACC play. He was a perfect four-of-four from the field and scored his ACC career-high of eight points at Syracuse (January 13).

.912 Senior Chauncey Wiggins is shooting a career-high .912 from the free throw line and enters Tuesday's game against Miami having made 10 consecutive free throws. He current streak of free throws made begin in the first half of Florida State's game against North Carolina (December 30).

.958 Sophomore Martin Somerville is shooting .958 from the free throw line (23 of 24) in his last seven games.

1 Robert McCray V is the only Seminole who has started each of Florida State's first 18 games of the 2025-26 season.

2 Two different Seminoles – Chauncey Wiggins against North Carolina (December 30) and Lajae Jones against Wake Forest (January 17) – have earned double figures in rebounds in ACC play (10 both times) in Florida State's first five conference games of the 2025-26 season.

7.9 Freshman Thomas Bassong is averaging 7.9 points in his last three games (55 total points) and has scored in double figures (14 against NC State and 11 against Wake Forest) in two of his last three games.

10 Sophomore Martin Somerville has started 10 of his first 18 games as a Seminole and has started 22 games in his first two collegiate season at UMass Lowell (12 starting assignments) and Florida State (10 starting assignments).

11.8 Senior Kobe MaGee is averaging 11.8 points scored (59 total points) in his last five games with his ACC career high of 20 points coming in Florida State's game at Syracuse (January 13).

12 Senior Lajae Jones has made at least one 3-point field goal in 12 consecutive games.

13.9 Senior Robert McCray V has scored in double-figures in 10 of the last 11 games since totaling 18 points against Georgia in the ACC/SEC Challenge and is averaging 13.9 points scored since December 2.

14 Sophomore AJ Swinton totaled one steal in Florida State's game against Wake Forest. He enters Tuesday's game against Miami with 14 steals in 14 games this season – twice as many steals as he earned in 28 games as a freshman during the 2024-25 season (seven).

293 Sophomore Martin Somerville enters Tuesday's game against Miami having attempted 293 career 3-point field goals. He needs to attempt just seven to reach 300 for his career.

LaJae Jones – A Great Shooter On A Team of High Level Shooters

TALLAHASSEE – Just before one of the final practices of his first summer at Florida State, head coach Luke Loucks gathered his team on the court at the FSU Basketball Training Center and cued video coordinator Kyle Washington to start an eye-opening series of shots.

Once the video started, Loucks began to count ...

1 ... 2 ... 3 ... 4 ... 5 ... 6 ... 7... 8 ... 9.

When he got to nine, he led a loud cheer with his team as they had just witnessed nine consecutive 3-point shots made during an earlier scrimmage by newcomer LaJae Jones, a transfer from St. Bonaventure University.

"We've got some serious high-level shooters," said Loucks as he extolled Jones's nine consecutive made 3-point shots. "And that's from me coming from the NBA, where it's the best shooting in the world. We have some guys who can really, really shoot the ball."

A natural lefthander with a disruptive 6-10 wing span, Jones comes to Florida State known both for his offense and as a lock down defender. In three collegiate seasons and 80 career games played – most recently at St. Bonaventure in the Atlantic 10 during the 2024-25 season -- he averages 12.2 points scored and shoots .399 percent from 3-point range. Jones averaged nearly 50 made 3-point shots in the last two seasons.

In his only season at St. Bonaventure, he averaged 10.8 points and 5.8 rebounds in leading the Bonnies to the 2025 NIT.

Jones was born into a basketball family and has been told that his father, Jackie, put a basketball in his hands the day after he was born.

"My parents have had a very big impact on my life and my basketball career," said Jones. "They sacrificed a lot of their time for me to play the game I love. My mom and dad blessed me with a very good childhood."

It's also from his parents that he got his first name. LaJae's dad wanted him to be known as 'Little Jackie' without having the formal name of Jackie.

Jones credits his father with instilling the love of basketball into his everyday life.

Jackie was an All-American at Barton Community College and finished his career as one of the most prolific players in Cougar history. He averaged a double-double in points and rebounds in helping Barton to a program record for wins, including the program's highest ever ranking. Jackie moved onto the University of Oklahoma where he is still in the Sooners' record book for blocks during his 'Big Eight Newcomer of the Year' season. He averaged 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds during his one season at Oklahoma and was a member of the Dallas Mavericks' roster prior to the start of the 1991 NBA season.

"My father impacted my basketball career by teaching me how to play the game the right way," said Jones. "He instilled a work ethic in me and always pushed me to improve myself. No matter what, he has always had my back."

Jones followed his dad to Barton C.C., following his first collegiate season at Tarleton State.

And what a year it was.

Jones led the Cougars to the junior college national championship, leading the team in scoring (15.4 points per game), rebounding (9.2 rebounds per game) and field goal shooting percentage (.540). Barton finished with a 36-1 record – a record that included a 27-game winning streak. Jones earned All-American Second-Team honors from the National Junior College Athletic Association, was named to the Region VI/KJCCC (Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference) First Team, and was named as the Most Valuable Player of the NJCAA Division I Tournament (winning the William French Most Valuable Player Award).

While he was starring at Barton during the 2023-2024 season, he was on hand to watch in person as his father was inducted into the Barton Community College Athletics Hall of Fame.

"It was a great experience for me," said Jones. "My dad had me come up and give a speech at the last minute. I had to come up with something to say; the speech and the ceremony turned out great."

Jones celebrated his father's Hall of fame induction with a 19-point, four-rebound effort in a 71-65 win over Cloud Community College on January 31, 2024 – the day of his father's ceremony on the Barton campus.

As illustrated by his statistics throughout his career, Jones has always been an exceptional player.

He totaled 1,426 points, 594 rebounds, 197 assists, 176 steals and 165 blocks in his high school career at Duncan U. Fletcher in Jacksonville. Upon his graduation in 2022, he became the first player from Fletcher since 1997 to sign a scholarship at a Division I men's basketball program directly out of high school.

In three seasons as a collegian, he is shooting .508 percent from the field, .394 from the 3-point line, and .760 percent from the free throw line. He's made 95 career 3-point shots and needs just 26 points to reach 1,000 career points for his career.

As he makes the journey down Interstate 10 from his hometown on the Gold Coast of Florida, he is squarely focused on earning his degree in social science in May of 2026 and being the best version of himself on the basketball court.

"With Coach Loucks and his staff coming from the NBA, I am looking forward to continuing to improve as a basketball player," said Jones. "The NBA knowledge of our coaching staff at Florida State definitely influenced me to become a Seminole. I felt like Florida State under Coach Loucks was the best fit for my style of play and Florida State University was the best fit academically."

One of Jones's most vivid memories of his first season at Florida State will certainly date back to the beginning of his Seminole career when Loucks made a big deal of his success from the 3-point line in a mid-week practice during his third month on campus.

"It definitely felt good for Coach to show that clip," said Jones. "All of the coaches like to celebrate the big wins as well as the little wins, too. That's a big part of what's going to make this year special for me."

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – The Florida State Seminoles men's basketball team fell in its first exhibition game of the 2025-26 season against the Alabama Crimson Tide 109-105 at the Boutwell Auditorium in the Ballin' in Boutwell event. Alabama's Labaron Philon scored a game-high 28 points, and Aden Holloway contributed 20 points to the Crimson Tide's four-point victory. A 7-0 run fueled by threes from Kobe MaGee and LaJae Jones gave Florida State a 48-47 lead at halftime. In the second half, the Seminoles scored 57 points, making eight threes. Game 1 -- Florida State 108, Alcorn State 76

TALLAHASSEE – Senior Robert McCray V was credited with a school-record 17 assists, and Luke Loucks won his first game as the Seminoles' head coach in a 108-76 season-opening win for the Seminoles over Alcorn State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. McCray broke the school record for assists in a single game, formerly held by Otto Petty in 1972 and matched by Tony William in 1983. With 12 points to go along with his 17 assists, McCray became the first player to record a double-double in a season-opener since Malik Osborn totaled a double-double of 18 points and 13 rebounds against Penn on Nov. 10, 2021. Loucks earned his first victory as Florida State's head coach as he became the eighth Seminole coach to win his first game. Every coach in school history has now won his first game as Florida State's head coach. McCray V also was the first player to record at least 13 assists since Loucks recorded 13 against North Carolina in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history on March 11, 2012. The Seminoles' 2025 season opened with an alley-oop slam from McCray to Alex Steen.

TALLAHASSEE – Florida State senior LaJae Jones scored a game-high 20 points, and the Seminoles made a near-school record 18 3-point shots, as they won their second consecutive game to open the season with a 101-64 win over Alabama State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles made 18 3-point shots (two shy of tying the school record for 3-point shots made in a game) while attempting a school and ACC record 47 3-point field goals. TALLAHASSEE – Florida State's LaJae Jones scored a career-high 36 points – and tied the single-game school-record for 3-point shots made with 10 – to lead the Seminoles to a 98-72 victory over Georgia Southern at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Jones tied the all-time school record for 3-point shots made in a game first set by George McCloud at La Salle on Feb. 23, 1989. Jones' 36 points is the most by a Florida State player since Al Thornton scored 45 against Miami on March 3, 2007. Jones became the first Seminole to score at least 30 points since Jamir Watkins against Rice on November 9, 2024. As a team, Florida State made 17 3-point shots, which is tied for the fourth most made in a single game in school history. The Seminoles also attempted a school and ACC record 49 3-point field goals.
