- SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO HURRICANES IN SECOND MEETING OF SEASON BETWEEN IN-STATE RIVALS
Florida State, which has won three consecutive and seven of its last nine ACC games, plays host to Miami on Tuesday night at 9:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The game will be televised on the ACC Network. The game between the Seminoles and the Hurricanes is the second meeting of the season between the two teams after Florida State took a 65-63 win over Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables on January 20, 2026. Including their victory over Miami on January 20 2026, the Seminoles have won 15 of the last 16 games played in the series. The Seminoles' streak includes six consecutive victories (current) in a winning streak that began with an 85-84 win over Miami in Coral Gables on February 25, 2023. The Seminoles' winning streak of 15 victories in the last 16 games in the series began with a 103-94 win over the Hurricanes in Tallahassee on January 27, 2018. Florida State's current hot streak of seven wins in their last nine games began with a 65-63 win over Miami on January 20, 2026. Following Tuesday's game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at Georgia Tech on Saturday at 12 Noon.
- FLORIDA STATE TO HONOR SEMINOLE TRIBE OF FLORIDA
Florida State will wear its distinctive Nike Seminole Heritage turquoise uniforms in its game against Miami. It marks the 35th time the Seminoles will wear the uniforms since first wearing them on November 17, 2013, in an 89-61 win over UT Martin. Florida State most recently wore the turquoise uniforms against UMass on December 13, 2025. The Seminoles' game against Miami marks the second consecutive year they will wear the Heritage uniforms against the Hurricanes at home.
- FLORIDA STATE AGAINST MIAMI THIS SEASON
Florida State faces Miami on Tuesday, February 24, 2026 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Hurricanes are one of only two ACC teams the Seminoles play more than once this season. The Seminoles played at SMU on January 24, and play host to the Mustangs on March 7 at 2:00 p.m. to close out the regular season.
- FLORIDA STATE IS THE FIRST TEAM IN THE ACC TO GO FROM 0-5 IN LEAGUE PLAY TO .500 AFTER 14 GAMES
Florida State has become the first team in ACC history to go from 0-5 to 7-7 in regular-season league play. Counting only seasons in which teams played or are scheduled to play more than or equal to 14 regular-season conference games, the 2025-26 Seminoles became the 52nd ACC team to start 0-5. They are the first of the 52 to get to the .500 mark at any point.
- MCCRAY V WITH DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING IN ALL 14 ACC GAMES
Senior Robert McCray V tied his Florida State career-high with 29 points in the Seminoles' 70-65 win over No. 24 Clemson on Saturday on the road in ACC play. He has scored in double figures in each of his last 14 games – each of his ACC games this season and enters Tuesday's game against Miami ranked 15th in the ACC with his 15.7 points per game scoring average.
- LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...
 - ...Defeat Miami and gain a victory over the Hurricanes for the 16th time in the last 17 games played between the two teams. The Seminoles have won 15 of the last 16 meetings between the two teams since a 103-94 win over the Hurricanes on January 27, 2018.
 - ...Defeat Miami and gain a two-game regular season sweep of the Hurricanes for the third consecutive season and for the fifth time in the last six seasons.

Luke Loucks One of three current ACC head coaches - Luke Loucks (Florida State, 2012), Jon Scheyer (Duke, 2009, 2010), and Hubert Davis (North Carolina, 1989, 1991) - who won ACC Basketball Championships at their alma mater. All three are currently coaching at their ACC alma mater.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S IMPRESSIVE TURNAROUND UNDER COACH LOUCKS AND HIS STAFF

Florida State has as many wins in its last nine games (seven) as it did in its first 20 games of the 2025-26 season (seven). The Seminoles have put together two winning streaks of three games (against Cal, Stanford, and Notre Dame and Virginia Tech, Boston College, and Clemson) as compared to one winning streak of three games (against UT Martin, Georgia Southern, and Cal State Bakersfield) in non-conference play. The Seminoles have won six of their last seven and seven of their last eight games and have gone from 0-5 in ACC play to 7-7 in ACC play in a span of 33 days.

LOOKING INSIDE FLORIDA STATE'S LAST NINE GAMES WITH A 7-2 RECORD

Including its 65-63 win over Miami on January 20, 2026, Florida State has won seven of its last nine games. The Seminoles are holding their opponents to nearly 19 points per game fewer and nearly nine percentage points lower in their field goal shooting percentage in winning seven of their last nine ACC games as compared to their first five ACC games. And Robert McCray V who is now ranked 15th in the ACC in scoring, is averaging more than six points more per game in the last nine than he did in his first five ACC games.

SEMINOLES FINISHING GAMES IN THE SECOND HALF

Florida State enters Tuesday night's game against Miami having won three consecutive ACC games for the second time this season (against Cal, Stanford and Notre Dame and against Virginia Tech, Boston College, and Clemson). It marks the first time since the 2023-24 season that Florida State has won at least three consecutive games during its ACC season. The Seminoles won five consecutive ACC games against Virginia Tech, Wake Forest, Notre Dame, Miami, and Clemson from January 6, 2024 through January 20, 2024 in finishing with 10 ACC wins and a 10-10 record in ACC play that season. The Seminoles have recovered from halftime deficits in each of their last three wins over Virginia Tech, Boston College and most recently Clemson to string together three of the most impressive second half performances of any of the teams in ACC play this season.

A STATISTICAL ODDITY FROM THE SEMINOLES' VICTORY OVER CLEMSON

In its 70-65 win over Clemson on Saturday, Florida State won the points off turnover battle (14-9), the points in the paint competition (22-6), the points of fast break totals (5-3), and the second chance points fight by an 11-0 margin. The Seminoles held the Tigers scoreless on second chance points despite being outrebounded on the offensive glass by a 10-5 margin.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State shot .875 from the free throw line against Clemson (5-5, 1.000 percent in the first half and 9-11, .818 percent) in the second half in outscoring the Tigers from the free throw line during its 70-65 win on Saturday in Littlejohn Coliseum. The Seminoles shot above 80 percent from the free throw line for the fifth time this season (and second time in ACC play) against Clemson. Florida State has outscored its opponents in five of its last seven games and have outscored (or been tied) with its opponent in eight of its last nine games. The Seminoles have shot 70 percent or better from the free throw line in a season-high six consecutive games.

LAST GAME AGAINST MIAMI

Robert McCray V led all scorers with 20 points, and Chauncey Wiggins added 10 in Florida State's 65-63 victory against the Miami Hurricanes at the Watsco Center January 20, 2026. The 20-point performance was McCray's third consecutive 20-point performance. Wiggins finished in double figures for the 13th time in a victory that gave Seminole head coach Luke Loucks his first career ACC win. Loucks became the third Seminole head coach to gain his first career ACC win on the road. The Seminoles' bench played a pivotal role in their victory, outscoring the Hurricanes in that category 20-5. Florida State has won the bench scoring battle in its last six ACC games. In addition to his 20-point night, McCray V finished with a team-high four assists and four rebounds. Florida State trailed 44-43 at the 16:49 mark of the second half. Florida State held a 60-58 lead with just over four minutes remaining in the game. Three straight made free throws from McCray V extended the Florida State lead back to five. The Hurricanes would tie the game at 63 with 20 seconds left. McCray V would respond by drawing a foul and making two free throws to ice the game.

.805 Senior Robert McCray V is shooting .805 from the free throw line (33 of 41) in the last seven games since Florida State's victory over Cal on January 28.

.484 Senior Robert McCray V has made at least one 3-point field goal in six consecutive game and is shooting .484 from the 3-point line (15 of 31) since the start of Florida State's game against Stanford January 31).

.778 Freshman Thomas Bassong is shooting .778 from the free throw line (seven of nine) in the last two games. He made five free throws and scored eight points in Florida State's victory over Boston College (February 17).

.833 Senior Lajae Jones is shooting .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) in the last three games. He made six of seven free throws and scored 10 points in Florida State's victory over Boston College (February 17).

1.000 Sophomore Martin Somerville was a perfect three of three from the free throw line (he made each of his awarded free throws after he was fouled on a 3-point shot in the first half against the Tigers) and enters Tuesday's game against Miami shooting .807 from the free throw line.

Robert McCray V – Playing on Basketball’s Biggest Stage at Florida State

TALLAHASSEE – On January 4, 2022, Robert McCray V scored two points and totaled one rebound in Wake Forest’s victory over Florida State at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston Salem, N.C. He was a freshman playing in his first season of college basketball on that cold and cloudy night on Tobacco Road, never imagining that he would one day be a Florida State Seminole.

Only three short years later, McCray is a Seminole and preparing for his final collegiate season as one of the most important additions to the roster for the first year of the Luke Loucks era. After playing one season at Wake Forest, and two at Jacksonville, he is ready to continue to thrive on the basketball court at Florida State.

“I came to Florida State knowing that it will give me a taste of playing at the next level,” said McCray at the conclusion of the Seminoles’ eight-week summer training camp. “The NBA is where I want to be, and I know this is the right place for me to continue to elevate my game. Florida State is the right place for me because of Coach Loucks and Coach (Jim) Moran with their backgrounds in the NBA, along with our fast-paced style of play.”

McCray has always been a standout athlete in a family of great athletes. While playing for his dad, Robert IV at A.C. Floria High School in his hometown of Columbia, S.C, he was twice named as the player of the year in his region, led the Falcons to regional and state championships in 2019, 2020, and 2021, and to the Class 4A Lower State Championship game in 2018. McCray was the No. 11 ranked combo guard in the nation as a senior.

He displayed his incredible athleticism as he won the South Carolina state championship in the high jump as a senior in 2021. His state championship winning jump was measured at 6-10 – a full six inches above his 6-4 height.

The lefthanded guard quickly caught the attention of Loucks and his staff as soon as the former Seminole accepted the job as the eighth head coach in school history on March 10, 2025.

“Robert was a guy we zeroed in on very early when we began putting our team together,” said Loucks. “He has the ability to create for himself, and more importantly, he has the ability to create for his teammates. He’s dynamic, he’s a team player, and he’s one of six seniors on our roster which was by design. Robert’s skill level and competitiveness are going to help us win games.”

As the middle child of nine brothers and sisters, McCray was one of the top guards in the Atlantic Sun during the past two seasons. He averaged a career-high 18.4 points per game in his first season and averaged 16.2 points, 4.8 rebounds, and 4.5 assists in earning All-Atlantic Sun First-team honors last year. McCray has also proven to be an excellent shooter who has made more than 100 3-point shots during his career.

“I learned to play college basketball at Jacksonville,” said McCray. “The main things I learned about college basketball is my ability to play every position, learning to be a strong facilitator, and getting all of my teammates involved on every play.”

First-year Seminole assistant coach Michael Fly, who helped coach McCray during his two years at Jacksonville, had a front row seat to McCray’s maturation as a basketball player and as a man.

“Rob carried a heavy load at Jacksonville for the past two seasons,” said Fly. “He is used to being the No. 1 player on the opposing teams’ scouting report. Rob improved a great deal as a shooter, as a decision maker, and as a leader during his time at Jacksonville. I expect him to continue his growth on and off the floor and represent the Garnet and Gold with character and integrity.”

McCray enters his first season at Florida State with 1,133 career points -- 1,107 which were scored in his two seasons at Jacksonville. His single season scoring totals of 589 points (2023-24, tied for 11th) and 518 points (2024-25, tied for 24th) make him one of only six players in school history (including the legendary Artis Gilmore) with multiple single-season scoring totals in the top 25 in history of the Jacksonville program. McCray's 1,107 career points is the 25th highest scoring total for career points in the history of Jacksonville basketball.

McCray helped lead the Dolphins to the 2025 College Basketball Invitational and is one of four Seminoles (McCray, Lajae Jones at St. Bonaventure, Alex Steen at Florida Southern, and Chauncey Wiggins at Clemson) who have played in the postseason during their collegiate careers.

McCray also completed his career at Jacksonville with his bachelor's degree in social science.

"Earning my degree from Jacksonville meant a lot to me," said McCray. "I knew earning my degree would make my parents proud."

As McCray prepares to suit up for the Seminoles this season, he knows there is a lot of basketball to be played in his future.

"The thing I enjoy most about playing basketball is how it makes me feel," said McCray. "Knowing that how I play can bring joy to my family, my friends, and now the passionate Florida State fans is special," said McCray. "The opportunities that playing basketball have created for me are amazing. The school spirit -- how much the fans love Florida State -- has been the most eye-opening aspect of being a Seminole. It's why I'm so excited for November 4 when we get to play in front of our fans."

While he didn't realize it when he first faced Florida State, it's much better to be a Seminole than to play against the Seminoles.

Game 00 -- Florida State 88, Florida A&M 54

TALLAHASSEE – Robert McCray V and Lajae Jones scored 15 points each, and Florida State totaled 15 steals in an 88-54 victory over Florida A&M in an exhibition game at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles led by 40 during the second half and never trailed in the first game between the two teams in 34 years. The game served as the final exhibition contest for both teams as the 2025 season approaches on November 3 against South Florida for Florida A&M and on November 4 at home against Alcorn State for Florida State. Florida A&M head coach and Seminole legend Charlie Ward had his Seminole basketball jersey (No. 12) honored and hung in the rafters of the Tucker Center in an emotional pre-game ceremony. He has now had both his Seminole basketball and football jerseys (No. 17) honored at Florida State. Florida State scored the first six points of the game on 3-point shots by Kobe MaGee and Lajae Jones and never relinquished the lead. The Rattlers got to within one point, 12-11, at the 13:43 mark of the first half on a 3-pointer by Kaleb Washington. The Seminoles outscored FAMU by a 17-8 margin over the next six minutes to increase their lead to 10 at 29-19. MaGee finished the game with 13 points, six rebounds, and three steals.

Florida State 88, Florida A&M 54 Donald L. Tucker Center

Game 1 -- Florida State 108, Alcorn State 76

TALLAHASSEE – Senior Robert McCray V was credited with a school-record 17 assists, and Luke Loucks won his first game as the Seminoles' head coach in a 108-76 season-opening win for the Seminoles over Alcorn State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. McCray broke the school record for assists in a single game, formerly held by Otto Petty in 1972 and matched by Tony William in 1983. With 12 points to go along with his 17 assists, McCray became the first player to record a double-double in a season-opener since Malik Osborn totaled a double-double of 18 points and 13 rebounds against Penn on Nov. 10, 2021. Loucks earned his first victory as Florida State's head coach as he became the eighth Seminole coach to win his first game. Every coach in school history has now won his first game as Florida State's head coach. McCray V also was the first player to record at least 13 assists since Loucks recorded 13 against North Carolina in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history on March 11, 2012. The Seminoles' 2025 season opened with an alley-oop slam from McCray to Alex Steen.

Game 2 -- Florida State 101, Alabama State 64

TALLAHASSEE – Florida State senior Lajae Jones scored a game-high 20 points, and the Seminoles made a near-school record 18 3-point shots, as they won their second consecutive game to open the season with a 101-64 win over Alabama State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles made 18 3-point shots (two shy of tying the school record for 3-point shots made in a game) while attempting a school and ACC record 47 3-point field goals. The 18 3-point baskets made by the Seminoles rank as the third highest total for made 3-point shots in a single game at Florida State and the most made since Florida State made 17 against Clemson on Feb. 5, 2017. The Seminoles' 47 three-point attempts set a single-game Florida State record, beating the previous record of 39, which was set against Wichita State on March 17, 2004, as well as a single-game ACC record. The previous ACC record for 3-point field goals attempted was 21 by Virginia Tech against Delaware on November 20, 2019.

TALLAHASSEE – Freshman Cam Miles scored a team and career-high 17 points, including 15 in the second half, and Robert McCray V added 16 in the Seminoles' 87-73 win over UT Martin at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Also in double figures for the Seminoles were Alex Steen with 13 and Lajae Jones and AJ Swinton with 12 points each. Florida State turned the Skyhawks over 26 times, 19 of which were credited as steals for the Seminoles. The 19 steals are tied for the second-most in a single-game in school history. The school record for steals in a game at Florida State is 20 against Tulane on Feb. 6, 1985. The 19 steals were the most in a single game by the Seminoles since they totaled 19 steals against Butler on Dec. 30, 1996.

Game 5 -- Florida State 98, Charleston Southern

TALLAHASSEE – Florida State's Lajae Jones scored a career-high 36 points – and tied the single-game school-record for 3-point shots made with 10 – to lead the Seminoles to a 98-72 victory over Georgia Southern at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Jones tied the all-time school record for 3-point shots made in a game first set by George McCloud at La Salle on Feb. 23, 1989. Jones' 36 points is the most by a Florida State player since Al Thornton scored 45 against Miami on March 3, 2007. Jones became the first Seminole to score at least 30 points since Jamir Watkins against Rice on November 9, 2024. As a team, Florida State made 17 3-point shots, which is tied for the fourth most made in a single game in school history. The Seminoles also attempted a school and ACC record 49 3-point field goals. The 49 3-point attempts broke the previous record of 47 set by the Seminoles against Alabama State earlier this season on November 7, 2025.
