Series: Kansas leads 164-71 and has won the last 11 meetings. KU won the last matchup 64-54 in Kansas City, Mo., at the quarterfinals of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. KU is 60-44 against the Huskers in Lincoln.

Coaches: Kansas coach Bill Self is 157-36 in his sixth season at KU and 364-141 in his 16th overall. Nebraska head coach Doc Sadler is 49-33 in his third season at NU and 217-90 in his 10th season overall.

Polls: Kansas is receiving votes in both the Associated Press poll and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll released Jan. 26. Nebraska is not ranked.

Kansas vs. Nebraska

Kansas (15-4, 4-0) remains one of two Big 12 teams to be undefeated in conference play with Oklahoma at 6-0 as the Jayhawks continue Big 12 play at Nebraska on Wednesday, Jan. 28, at 6:30 p.m. on ESPN2. Kansas has won four straight and seven of its last eight games. The Jayhawks are 4-0 in Big 12 play for the second straight season after their 82-67 win at Iowa State Saturday. Nebraska is currently 12-6 on the season and 2-3 in Big 12 play. The Huskers are coming off a 76-74 overtime loss to Oklahoma State in Lincoln, Neb., on Saturday.

About Kansas

Kansas is 15-4 (4-0 Big 12) on the season after its 82-67 win at Iowa State Saturday. The win made the four-time defending Big 12 regular-season champions 4-0 for the second straight season. The Jayhawks are averaging 79.2 points per game and giving up 65.1 for a +14.2 scoring margin. KU has shot a 50 percent or better in each of its Big 12 games for a league-best 54.8 field goal percentage in conference play. The Jayhawks lead the Big 12 in field goal percentage at 38 percent. Conversely, KU has held its last five and 13 opponents in 19 games to under 40 percent shooting.

Junior guard Sherron Collins leads KU in scoring at 18.7 points per game, which is third most in the Big 12. He has led the team in scoring in 15 of 19 games this season. He has a team-high 43 three-point field goals and 101 assists. While scoring a career-high-tying 26 points at Iowa State Saturday, Collins became the 51st Jayhawk to score 1,000

points for his career, currently with 1,025 points. Sophomore center Cole Aldrich is next in scoring at 15.4 points per game and after his 16 points and 12 rebounds at Iowa State, he has a team-best 11 double-doubles on the season, second most in the Big 12. He leads the team with 9.8 rebounds per game, which is third in the conference and he leads the league in field goal percentage at 63.6 percent and blocked shots per game at 2.7. Aldrich is 26-of-37 (70.3 percent) from the field in Big 12 games. Aldrich has 51 of KU's 88 blocked shots in 2008-09. Freshman guard Tyshawn Taylor is scoring 10.2 points per game and has a team-best 26 steals. He is averaging 13 points in his first four conference games and was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Rookie of the Week for the third time on Jan. 19. Sophomore guard Brady Morningstar is a starter who is averaging 7.0 points per game with 56 assists and 21 steals. He has 21 assists, four turnovers and eight steals in his last six games. Freshman forward Marcus Morris has started the last two games for the Jayhawks and is scoring 7.5 points and pulling down 5.2 rebounds. Over the last four-plus games, junior guard Mario Little has made his last 11 field goals, including a 4-for-4 effort at Iowa State Saturday. He is scoring 5.0 points in seven games played this season. He missed the first 12 games of the season due to injuries. Freshman forward Markieff Morris (4.8 ppg, 4.5 rpg) and sophomore guard Tyrel Reed (7.5 ppg) are KU's top reserves. Reed has scored in double figures in two of his last three games, including 10 points at Iowa State on 2-of-3 shooting from three-point range.

About Nebraska

Nebraska is looking to rebound from a 76-74 overtime loss to Oklahoma State on Saturday in Lincoln. The Huskers are 12-6 on the season, 2-3 in Big 12 play and have lost two straight and three of their last four. Nebraska is 11-2 at home this season. Nebraska averages 67 points per game and has a stifling defense giving up 57.8 ppg. The Huskers have a balanced scoring attack with only two players averaging double figures and they are second in the conference with 7.1 steals per game. Senior guard Steve Harley leads NU in scoring with 12.1 points per game. He is second on the team in assists with 41 and steals with 25. Senior guard Ade Dagundero is the only other Husker averaging double figures at 10.7 points per game. He is shooting a team-best 51.8 percent from the field. Senior guard Paul Velandar comes off the bench to score 9.3 points per contest and he leads the team with 49 three-point field goals. Junior guard Sek Henry is just behind Velandar with 9.1 points per contest, while sophomore guard Cookie Miller (7.2 ppg) has a team-high 71 assists and is making 81.6 percent of his free throws. Freshman guard Toney McCray's 11 blocked shots are a team best. He is scoring 6.4 points per game. Junior guard Ryan Anderson (6.3 ppg) leads the team with a 4.8 rebound average to go along with his 6.3 ppg. Junior forward Chris Balham (2.1 ppg, 2.2 rpg) is a starter, while freshman guard Brandon Richardson (3.9 ppg) is averaging nearly 15 minutes a game for the Huskers.

The Coaches

In Bill Self's five seasons as head coach at Kansas he has won one national championship, four regular-season Big 12 titles and three league tournament championships. He has guided KU to three NCAA Elite Eights and one Final Four. In his sixth season at KU, Self is 157-36. He is 364-141 in his 16th season overall. KU's 91-84 win against Siena (Jan. 6) was Self's 500th game coached for his career. Heading into his sixth season at KU, Self's 81.6 winning percentage (142-32) the previous five years was the highest in NCAA Division I. Included were a combined 70 victories in 2006-07 and 2007-08. Under Self, KU has been ranked in the Associated Press Top 10 in 60 polls and in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 10 on 61 occasions. He has posted a 22-9 mark in NCAA Tournament play and has guided his teams to 10-straight 20-win seasons and 11 overall. Self has won eight league crowns in the last 10 years, including four straight at KU. Those other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes. The 2008 Winged Foot Award recipient for winning the national title, Self is a four-time finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award (2000, 2001, 2002 and 2003), and *The Sporting News* named him National Coach of the Year in 2000. In addition, Self is one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight. He has advanced KU to the NCAA Elite Eight three times (2004, 2007, 2008), including the 2008 Final Four. A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under Larry Brown. That team advanced to the Final Four in Dallas. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant from 1987-93 working under head coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. Self's first head coaching position was at Oral Roberts in 1994 where he was 55-54 in four years. He took over at Tulsa in 1998 with three winning seasons before taking over at Illinois from 2001-03. He was named the eighth head coach at Kansas on April 21, 2003. Self is 13-1 against Nebraska, including 11-1 while at Kansas.

Doc Sadler is in his third season at Nebraska with a 49-33 record. He is in his 10th season as a head coach with a 217-90 mark. Sadler guided the Huskers to 20 wins last season, including a postseason appearance in the NIT where they advanced to the second round. His 17 wins at NU in 2006-07 made him the third-winningest first-year coach in Nebraska history. Prior to Nebraska, Sadler was head coach at UTEP where he guided the Miners to a 48-18 record in two seasons and postseason play both years - the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and NIT in 2006. He is 0-5 against Kansas.

The Series

This series dates back to 1900 and Kansas leads 164-71. Kansas is 60-44 against Nebraska in games played in Lincoln, yet the series is tied at the Bob Devaney Center at 16-16. Kansas has won 11 straight against Nebraska and 20 of the last 21 dating back to the 1998-99 season. The last Nebraska victory in the series was 74-55 on Feb. 15, 2004, in Lincoln, Bill Self's first season at KU and his only loss to Nebraska. The previous NU win was 64-59 on Feb. 10, 1999, in Lawrence. Kansas holds a 25-3 record against Nebraska since the inception of the Big 12 and has swept the season series 10 times, including each of the last four seasons. KU and NU have played each other four times in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship with the Jayhawks winning all four contests, including last year, 64-54, in the quarterfinals of the event at Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

Team Notables

--Kansas ranks among the Big 12's top four teams in scoring margin (third at +14.2), free throw percentage (third at 71.4), field goal percentage (second at 48.6), field goal percentage defense (second at 38.0), three-point field goal percentage (third at 37.9) rebound defense (second at 32.7), rebound margin (second at +5.9), assists (second at 17.2), blocked shots (third at 4.6) and assist-to-turnover ratio (second at 1.2).

--KU has outshot 15 of 19 opponents this season and has shot 50 percent or better in 10 games, including all four Big 12 contests. Kansas is 14-1 when outshooting its opponent this season and 1-3 when outshot.

--Kansas has outrebounded 13 of 19 opponents this season.

--Through 38 halves, Kansas has held its opponent to under 30 points 14 times, including five of eight Big 12 halves.

--Kansas has shot 80 percent or better from the free throw line in six games this season.

--Through 19 games, four different Jayhawks have scored 20 or more points this season. Sherron Collins has six 20-point games, while Cole Aldrich has four. Tyshawn Taylor picked up his second in the conference opener with 20 points against Kansas State (Jan. 13), while Brady Morningstar has one 20-point effort.

--Kansas has held 129 of its last 132 opponents to under 50 percent shooting, including all 19 foes this season. Twelve of those opponents have shot below 40 percent. The last team to shoot 50 percent or better against KU was Louisiana-Monroe in the 2007-08 season opener (51 percent) as Kansas has held 57 straight foes to under 50 percent shooting.

--Kansas posted its 100th game of scoring 100 points in the 100-79 win against defending WAC champion New Mexico State (Dec. 3).

--Individually, eight different Jayhawks have led or tied for the team lead in steals this season, six in assists and three in scoring, rebounding and blocked shots.

--KU is 100-14 (87.7 percent) in its last 114 games dating back to Jan. 21, 2006.

Player Notables

--Junior guard SHERRON COLLINS leads Kansas with an 18.7 scoring average after his career-high-tying 26 points at Iowa State Saturday. He is scoring 21 points in Big 12 play. Collins has 44 assists in his last seven games. He has led (or tied for the lead) Kansas in scoring in 15 games this season. He is 19-for-19 from the free throw line in Big 12 play and has made 23 straight - which ties for fourth best in school history. Collins ranks third in the Big 12 in scoring at 18.7 ppg. He also ranks among the league leaders in assists (fourth at 5.3), free throw percentage (fifth at .833), field goal percentage (11th at .438), three-point field goals made (eighth at 2.3), three-point field goal percentage (12th at 39.8) and assist-to-turnover ratio (12th at 1.6).

--Sophomore COLE ALDRICH leads the Big 12 in field goal percentage at 63.6 percent and blocked shots at 2.7 per game. He has multiple blocked shots in each of his last eight games and 16 of 19 contests this season. His 85 career blocked shots are 19th on the school list. Aldrich is 26-of-37 (70.3 percent) from the field in Big 12 play. He is three rebounds shy of averaging a double-double and his 11 double-doubles this season are second most in the Big 12. Aldrich has 39 of KU's 63 dunks this season. Besides leading the league in field goal percentage and blocked shots, Aldrich is second in the Big 12 in rebounding at 9.8 rpg, sixth in free throw percentage at 80 percent and 12th in scoring at 15.4 ppg.

--Freshman guard TYSHAWN TAYLOR was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Rookie of the Week for the third time this season on Jan. 19 after averaging 17 points in his first two conference games. He is scoring 13 points in Big 12 play and 10.2 ppg on the season. His 10.2 scoring average is third most among Big 12 freshmen. Taylor is 15th in the league in assists at 3.1 apg (second among Big 12 freshmen) and 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.5. His 1.4 steals are tied for 14th in the conference and lead the Big 12 freshmen class.

--Sophomore guard TYREL REED is coming off a 2-for-3 performance at Iowa State with all three shots being three pointers. He is 5-for-9 (55.6 percent) from beyond the arc in his last three games. He has 11 games with multiple threes this season. Nominated for Academic All-American, Reed has scored in double figures in two of his last three games and eight contests this season.

--Sophomore guard BRADY MORNINGSTAR scored nine points on 4-of-7 shooting at Iowa State. He has seven assists, no turnovers and three steals in his last four games. Morningstar has no turnovers in five of his last six games. He has pulled down 17 rebounds (5.7 rpg) in his last three games. He has at least one steal in each of his last six outings. Morningstar has made multiple three pointers in seven games this season. A lockdown defender, Morningstar leads KU with 31 floor burns through 19 games. He is ahead of Sherron Collins (29) and Tyrel Reed (27) and Cole Aldrich (26).

--Freshman forward MARCUS MORRIS has started the last two games for KU. He pulled down six rebounds at Iowa State yet did not score a point for the first time this season. He has shot 50 percent or better in five of his last six games and is 13-for-24 (54.2 percent) in that span. He has shot 50 percent or better in 12 games this season. Marcus has eight starts for KU this season. He is second on the team

with 5.2 rebounds per game which leads the Big 12 freshmen in rebound average. His 5.2 boards are 18th overall in the conference.

--Freshman forward MARKIEFF MORRIS has started seven games this season and is third on the team with 4.5 rebounds per game. His 4.7 rebounds on the season are fourth among Big 12 freshmen.

--Junior guard MARIO LITTLE has made his last 11 shots dating back to the Kansas State contest on Jan. 13. In his last two games he was 6-for-6 against Texas A&M and 4-for-4 at Iowa State. He is averaging 5.0 points on the season and 8.0 in Big 12 play. Little, the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year, missed the first 12 games of the season due to injuries and has been working his way into the lineup.

--Freshman TRAVIS RELEFORD played a season-high 21 minutes at Michigan State (Jan. 10) and is averaging 7.7 minutes per contest.

Last Time Out (Kansas 82, at Iowa State 67 – Jan. 24, 2009)

AMES, Iowa - Sherron Collins matched his career-high with 26 points to help lead KU over Iowa State, 82-67 Saturday afternoon at Hilton Coliseum. He became the 51st player in KU history to reach the 1,000 career point milestone as he entered the day with 999 points. Iowa State's Craig Brackins scored 42 points for the Cyclones, finishing two points shy of a Big 12 Conference record. It was the most points by a KU opponent since Oklahoma State's Randy Rutherford scored 45 points against KU on March 5, 1995. It was also the seventh-most points ever scored against the Jayhawks. With a 44-38 lead entering the second half, Kansas extended its advantage to 14 points with a 10-2 run over a three minute span capped by a Cole Aldrich jumper at the 15 minute mark. A couple more buckets by Aldrich and a two-pointer from Markieff Morris gave the Jayhawks their largest lead of the game at 17 points with just 11 minutes left in the game. Iowa State didn't let up, answering back with a 13-2 run to cut its deficit to just six points at 66-60 and 6:33 left on the clock. Aldrich, who ended the game with his 11th double-double of the season with 16 points and 12 rebounds, stopped the Cyclones' momentum with a dunk on KU's next trip down the court and with that, ISU never got closer than eight points. Sophomore Tyrel Reed and freshman Tyshawn Taylor each scored 10 points, while Mario Little and Brady Morningstar each had nine in the effort. Little finished 4-for-4 from the field and has made 11 straight shots dating back to the 18:12 mark of the second half against Kansas State on Jan. 13.

During the first half, Kansas hit three of its first four shots, including a pair of three-pointers from Collins, to open the game with an 8-0 run.

KU-ISU Leftovers

--Kansas made 50.8 percent of its shots (31-for-61). It is the highest shooting percentage by an Iowa State opponent this season and the first Cyclone opponent to shoot over 50 percent this year.

--Iowa State's Craig Brackins was two points shy of tying a Big 12 Conference game record as he scored 42 points against the Jayhawks, the most by a KU opponent since Oklahoma State's Randy Rutherford scored 45 points against the Jayhawks on March 5, 1995. Brackins' 42 points are the seventh-most ever scored against KU.

--Kansas committed 11 turnovers during the contest, one shy of its season low, while ISU had just nine turnovers, also one shy of a KU opponent low this year.

--The Cyclones made 23-of-27 from the free throw line for an 85.2 percent, the highest free throw percentage of a KU opponent this season.

--Four Jayhawks were perfect from the free throw line: Tyrel Reed (4-for-4), Tyshawn Taylor (4-for-4), Sherron Collins (3-for-3) and Cole Aldrich (2-for-2). As a team, KU shot 77.8 percent (14-for-18) at the charity stripe.

--Collins became the 51st player in KU basketball history to reach 1,000 points for his career. Collins tied a career-high 26 points and ranks 47th all-time with 1,025 points. He also scored 26 points against Tennessee on Jan. 3, 2009.

--Collins was perfect from the free throw line for the third straight game as he hit 3-for-3 from the charity stripe. Collins has made 23 straight free throws dating back to his last four attempts on Jan. 10 at Michigan State.

--Collins also dished out five assists, while Brady Morningstar and Tyshawn Taylor handed out three each. Collins has recorded five or more dimes in three straight games and 10 times so far this season.

--Sophomore Cole Aldrich finished with his 11th double-double of the season scoring 16 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He scored 12 of his points in the second half. Aldrich also added a pair of blocks for his eighth straight game with multiple blocks.

--Junior Mario Little made all four of his attempts from the field and has now made 11 straight shots dating back to the Kansas State game on Jan. 13.

--Freshman Tyshawn Taylor pulled down a career-high six rebounds and finished with double digit points for the third time in the last four contests as he added 10 points against Iowa State.

--Sophomore Tyrel Reed scored 10 points. It marked his eighth double-digit scoring effort of the year and second in his last two outings and fourth in his last six.

Bill Self Press Conferences

The location of Bill Self's press conferences has not changed for the 2008-09 season. Coach will still address the media in Hadl Auditorium at noon on the designated days (schedule has been set and sent out). Coach and the media will then have a luncheon together in Dolph Simons Media Room following his press conference. Here are the remaining dates for Coach Self's press conferences (players will be available prior to practice the same day) – Feb. 5, 12, 16, 26; March 6, 9, 16.

--Freshman Quintrell Thomas pulled down four rebounds in just seven minutes of play. Both numbers were his most since recording five rebounds in 15 minutes against Albany on Dec. 30 (a span of seven games).

Conference Success

Kansas has won eight of the 12 Big 12 regular-season titles (includes ties), including the last four Big 12 championships. Kansas' 51 conference titles are the most in NCAA Division I. Amazingly, last season Kansas won its fourth straight league title for the sixth time in school history - five straight from 1908-12, six straight from 1922-27, four straight from 1931-34, four straight from 1940-43, four straight from 1995-98 and four straight from 2005-08.

Conference Notables

--Since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996-97, Kansas has a winning record against every team in the Big 12.

--Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 162-34 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 139-57. Including the league postseason championship, KU is tops at 187-40. Texas is second at 155-69.

--Kansas is the only Big 12 school to have won its regular-season championship with two different coaches – Roy Williams and Bill Self.

--Under Bill Self, Kansas is 20-6 in Big 12 road games in the last four seasons. He is 29-12 in league road games in his sixth season - 4-4 in 2004, 5-3 in 2005, 6-2 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 5-3 in 2008 and 2-0 in 2009.

--KU has won 10 or more league games for the last 14 seasons and 46 times overall.

The Road Under Bill Self

Under head coach Bill Self, Kansas is 67-29 (69.8 percent) in games away from Allen Fieldhouse, including a 35-17 (67.3 percent) true road game record. The Jayhawks have posted a better than .500 record away from AFH every season under Self. Last year, the Jayhawks were 8-3 in true road games and 9-0 in neutral contests en route to the 2008 NCAA National Championship.

Collins Climbing Charts

With the first points of the Iowa State game, junior guard Sherron Collins became the 51st player in Kansas history to score 1,000 career points. Collins vaulted to 47th on the school scoring list, currently with 1,025 points. Last season, Brandon Rush and Mario Chalmers each accomplished 1,000-point feat. Rush ended his career ranked 20th on the KU scoring list with 1,477 points, while Chalmers is 24th with 1,341 points. Collins already ranks 13th on the KU career three-point field goal list with 128 and 14th on the three-pointers attempted list at 329. His 319 career assists are also in the KU top 20 at No. 18.

KU Freshmen in the Big 12

The Kansas freshmen are making quite the impact in the Big 12. Guard Tyshawn Taylor is third among Big 12 freshmen in scoring at 10.2 points per game, first in steals at 1.4 per contest and second in assists at 3.1 apg. Marcus Morris leads the Big 12 frosh in rebounding at 5.2 rpg, while twin brother Markieff Morris is fourth at 4.5 rpg.

Youth Movement

Called the 11th youngest team in NCAA Division I by the 2009 Pomeroy College Basketball Ratings (kenpom.com), nine of Kansas' top 11 scorers are freshmen or sophomores and the two classes are scoring 72.8 percent of Kansas' points with the sophomores at 39 percent and freshmen at 33.8 percent. Below is a breakdown of KU's scoring for 2008-09. Note: Kansas' seniors Brennan Bechard and Matt Kleinmann are walk-ons and have combined for six points.

Tyshawn Taylor Named Big 12 Rookie of the Week For Third Time

Kansas freshman Tyshawn Taylor was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Rookie of the Week (Jan. 19) for the third time this season following his efforts in the victories against Kansas State and Colorado. The guard averaged 17 points and shot 73.3 percent in KU's two games. Taylor was named the league's rookie of the week Dec. 8 and Dec. 22 as well. Taylor became the first Jayhawk to be named Big 12 Rookie of the Week three or more times in one season since Brandon Rush won it three times in 2005-06. In all, a Jayhawk has been named Phillips 66 Big 12 Rookie of the Week 15 times since the league started in 1996-97.

Withey Joins Jayhawks

Freshman Jeff Withey (6-10, 225) has joined the Kansas men's basketball team after transferring from Arizona following the fall semester. Withey can practice with the team and will be eligible to play in games following the fall 2009 semester. A center from San Diego, Withey posted per game averages of 20.8 points, 13.0 rebounds, 7.3 blocked shots and 4.1 assists as a senior, while shooting 69 percent from the field at Horizon High School. He was ranked the No. 8 center in last year's class by scout.com and the No. 39 overall player.

Home Court Winning Streaks

Kansas has declared that games played at Allen Fieldhouse are its home designate so the Jayhawks take the nation's longest home court winning streak, 35-games home court winning streak into the Jan. 31 contest against Colorado. The 35-straight wins ranks third on KU's all-time home win streak list and is the longest since the all-time high 62 from 1993 to 1998. The current streak started Feb. 7, 2007, with a 97-70 win against Kansas State.

This Day in Kansas Basketball History

The Jayhawks are 16-3 all-time in games played on Jan. 28

Jan. 28, 1996: Freshman forward Paul Pierce led the Jayhawks to an 88-73 victory over Nebraska in Lincoln, Neb. Pierce scored a game-high 25 points and sophomore forward Raef LaFrentz notched a double-double with 17 points and 12 rebounds. Junior guards Jacque Vaughn and Jerod Haase also scored in double figures with 12 and 15 points, respectively. Kansas coach Roy Williams earned his 200th career victory in just his 252nd game to become the fifth-fastest coach in NCAA history to earn his 200th victory. The Jayhawks finished the season with a 12-2 record in the Big Eight conference and a 29-5 record overall. Kansas reached the Elite Eight in the NCAA Tournament before falling to Syracuse.

Head Coach Bill Self

Oklahoma State, 1985 * Sixth season at KU (157-36) * 16th season overall (364-141)



In his sixth season at Kansas, Bill Self is 157-36 (.813 percent). Overall, Self is in his 16th season with a 364-141 (.721 percent) record.

In Bill Self's five seasons as head coach at KU he has won one national championship, four regular-season Big 12 titles and three league tournament championships. In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. He was named just the eighth head coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.

In the past five seasons, all at KU, Self is the winningest coach in NCAA Division I with an 81.6 winning percentage (142-32). Included are a combined 70 victories in the last two years.

Self has guided his teams to 10-straight 20-win seasons and 11 overall. Self has won eight league crowns in the last 10 years, including four straight at KU. Those other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes.

The 2008 Winged Foot Award recipient for winning the national title, Self is a four-time finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award (2000, 2001, 2002 and 2003), and *The Sporting News* named him National Coach of the Year in 2000. In addition, Self is one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight.

A member of the USA Basketball Competition Committee and board member for the National Association of Basketball Coaches, Self has coached three league player(s) of the year and 36 all-conference performers.

Nominated for two ESPY Awards for best team and best game, the 2007-08 Kansas team will go down as one of the best in school history. Ranked seventh or higher all season, KU won a school-record 37 games in winning the school's fifth overall and third NCAA national championship. Kansas claimed its fourth straight Big 12 regular-season championship and third consecutive Big 12 tourney title. Additionally, a school record five Jayhawks were chosen in the 2008 NBA Draft.

The 2006-07 season was not only historic for Kansas basketball but also in the career of Self. As KU won its 50th league title and 1,900th all-time victory, Self won his 300th career game with a road victory at Missouri. Additionally, KU was preseason No. 1 by *Sports Illustrated* and was ranked in the Associated Press Top 10 for most of the season.

Self was named the 2006 Big 12 Coach of the Year and finished fourth in the Associated Press national coach of the year voting after guiding Kansas to a 25-8 record. The Jayhawks entered the 2005-06 season unranked and with less than 15 percent returning scoring and rebounding, yet Self orchestrated KU to a 15-2 record in its last 17 games, including a Big 12 Tournament championship to go along with its league's regular-season title.

In 2004-05, Kansas not only won a share of the Big 12 regular-season championship, but also opened the season ranked No. 1 nationally in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' polls. KU was ranked in the top 10 for all but the final poll of 2004-05.

In his inaugural season at Kansas - 2003-04 - Self guided the Jayhawks to 24 wins and the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight. He tied former KU head coach Dick Harp for the most wins by a first-year KU coach, and only Harp's 1956-57 team - which advanced to the NCAA title game - went further under a first-year coach than Self's Elite Eight squad.

Self came to KU from the University of Illinois, where he guided the Fighting Illini to a 78-24 record over three seasons, including two Big Ten regular-season championships, a Big Ten tournament title and three straight NCAA tourney appearances. In Self's first season in Champaign, the Illini advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight.

Prior to his stint at Illinois, Self coached at Tulsa from 1998 to 2000, where he led the Golden Hurricane to a record of 74-27 in three seasons, including trips to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 and 2000. Tulsa went 32-5 in 2000, setting a school single-season record for victories and made the NCAA Elite Eight.

Self began his head coaching career at Oral Roberts, where he resurrected the program. Before Self took over the reins, ORU had compiled the worst record in the program's history with a 5-22 mark in 1992-93. Although Self's first ORU team managed just six victories in 1993-94, the win total increased to 10 the following year. In his third season at the helm, Self guided ORU to an 18-9 record. In 1996-97, ORU registered a 21-7 mark and made the school's first postseason tournament appearance since 1983-84, receiving an invitation to the NIT.

Prior to his appointment at ORU, Self spent seven seasons as an assistant coach

A native of Edmond, Okla., Self competed in basketball at Oklahoma State where he was a four-year letterwinner from 1982 to 1985. He received his bachelor's degree in business in 1985 and a master's degree in athletic administration in 1989, both from OSU.

He and his wife, Cindy, have two children: daughter, Lauren, and son, Tyler.

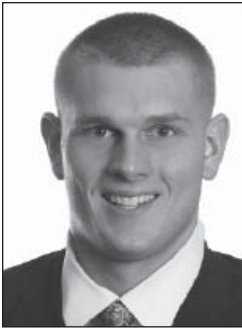

LAWRENCE, Kan. – Sherron Collins scored 16 points to lead 23rd-ranked Kansas to a 71-56 basketball victory against UMKC in the season-opener for the defending national champions.

The Jayhawks started their season with a victory for the seventh straight year, as well as the 17th time in the last 18 seasons. The win was also the 25th straight home win for KU.

In addition to Collins, Cole Aldrich scored 13 points, all in the second half, while Tyrell Reed added 12 for KU. Markieff Morris pulled down 15 rebounds, the most by a Jayhawk since Nick Collison had 21 in the 2003 NCAA Championship game against Syracuse.

UMKC was led by Dane Brumagin, who had 14 points, including making four of eight three-pointers and Reggie Hamilton, who scored 13.

After UMKC opened the second half with a three-point basket to take a 35-32 lead, Kansas ran off 10 straight points as part of a 17-5 run which gave the Jayhawks a 49-40 lead.

After shooting just 32 percent from the field in the first half, KU shot 65.2 percent in the second half. KU struggled from behind the three-point line; after Collins made a three on the first possession of the game the Jayhawks finished one of 13 from behind the line.

Kansas started the second half making 11 of its first 13 shots and cruised to the victory with a strong second half.

UMKC led for a 12:29 stretch of the half before KU tied the game at 21 with 6:36 left. However, UMKC pulled back ahead and led the rest of the way until KU scored the half's final five points.

KU did not score a basket from the 9:11 mark until Morningstar's layup at the end of the half. KU scored 13 straight points on free throws in that stretch, while slowing chipping away at the UMKC lead.

BOULDER, Colo. - Five players scored in double figures, led by Sherron Collins' team-high 18 points, as Kansas men's basketball defeated Colorado, 73-56, at the Coors Event Conference Center Saturday.

Sophomore center Cole Aldrich joined Collins in double figures adding 15 points along with 10 rebounds for his 10th double-double this year and fourth in the last five games.

Freshman guard Tyshawn Taylor contributed 14 points in the win, while sophomore Tyrel Reed and freshman Marcus Morris added 11 and 10, respectively.

Kansas turned 12 CU miscues into 17 points during the opening half and finished with 25 points from 18 Buffalo turnovers during the game.

The Buffs were able to stay within three possessions of the Jayhawks for much of the first part of the second half until KU began to pull away around the 10 minute mark scoring six quick points in less than a minute from two Reed three-pointers and a Marcus Morris basket in the paint.

Reed scored all 11 of his points in the final 11 minutes of the contest and hit 3-of-5 from the three-point line.

KU sank 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) from behind the three-point arc in the last 20 minutes and hit 69.6 percent from the field to help hold on to its lead over CU. The Jayhawks finished the game shooting a season-best 61.4 percent (27-of-44) from the field and 52.9 percent from the three-point line.

AMES, Iowa - Sherron Collins matched his career-high with 26 points to help lead KU over Iowa State, 82-67 Saturday afternoon at the Hilton Coliseum. He became the 51st player in KU history to reach the 1,000 career point milestone as he entered the day with 999 points.

Iowa State's Craig Brackins scored 42 points for the Cyclones, finishing two points shy of a Big 12 Conference record. It was the most points by a KU opponent since Oklahoma State's Randy Rutherford scored 45 points against KU on March 5, 1995. It was also the seventh-most points ever scored against the Jayhawks.

With a 44-38 lead entering the second half, Kansas extended its advantage to 14 points with a 10-2 run over a three minute span capped by a Cole Aldrich jumper at the 15 minute mark. A couple more buckets by Aldrich and a two-pointer from Markieff Morris gave the Jayhawks their largest lead of the game at 17 points with just 11 minutes left in the game.

Iowa State didn't let up, answering back with a 13-2 run to cut its deficit to just six points at 66-60 and 6:33 left on the clock. Aldrich, who ended the game with his 11th double-double of the season with 16 points and 12 rebounds, stopped the Cyclones' momentum with a dunk on KU's next trip down the court and with that, ISU never got closer than eight points.

Sophomore Tyrel Reed and freshman Tyshawn Taylor each scored 10 points, while Mario Little and Brady Morningstar each had nine in the effort.

Little finished 4-for-4 from the field and has made 11 straight shots dating back to the 18:12 mark of the second half against Kansas State on Jan. 13.

During the first half, Kansas hit three of its first four shots, including a pair of three-pointers from Collins, to open the game with an 8-0 run.
