

DEVANEY CENTER HOMECOURT EDGE

The Bob Devaney Sports Center is the home of Nebraska women's basketball. Named after legendary football coach and athletic director Bob Devaney, the Sports Center supplies the Huskers with a solid homecourt advantage. In fact, over the past two seasons Nebraska is 25-6 at home with four wins over top-25 teams at the Devaney Center. Over the past six seasons, NU owns a 71-22 record with 10 victories over top-25 foes in Lincoln.

Nebraska provides its basketball program with some of the best support in the country with major renovations to the coaches offices, locker room and team room over the past three years.





Nebraska set a single-game attendance record with 13,226 fans at the Devaney Center on Feb. 26, 2000. The Huskers attracted a pair of crowds over 12,000 in 2004-05.

Two HuskerVision screens were added to the arena in 2000, along with a sound system, message boards and lighting to add to the exciting atmosphere at the Devaney Center.

The major renovations in 2000 also included a Husker Hall of Honor and a Husker Walk of Fame to highlight nearly 120 years of Nebraska athletic success.
