After starting the conference season on the road, the Nebraska soccer team returns to Lincoln for an important homestand this weekend, as the Huskers conclude non-conference play and host Oklahoma State in the Big 12 home opener.

Nebraska (5-2-3, 0-1-1 Big 12) will meet Green Bay on Friday at 4 p.m., and then take on defending Big 12 champion Oklahoma State on Sunday at 1 p.m. Both games will take place at the Nebraska Soccer Field, located just northeast of Memorial Stadium.

The Huskers are now past the halfway point of the 2009 season as they begin a stretch of four straight home games. In its five-game homestand in September, Nebraska compiled a 4-0-1 record. The Huskers are 12-2-2 in their last 15 home games, including a 4-0-1 mark in Big 12 games.

Friday's matchup against Green Bay is a YMCA/CLCC home match, while Sunday's Big 12 home opener versus the Cowgirls is UNL Student Appreciation Day, with the first 150 students receiving free Husker soccer T-shirts and pizza. Live stats (Huskers.com) and live audio (krnu.unl.edu) will be available for both matches.

N Husker History vs. Green Bay

Nebraska and Green Bay will meet for the first time in school history this Friday. The Huskers hold a 5-1-0 record against Horizon League opponents as they have previously faced Loyola-Chicago (3-0-0), Wisconsin-Milwaukee (1-1-0) and Wright State (1-0-0).

The Phoenix are the last of seven first-time opponents for the Huskers in 2009.

Scouting the Green Bay Phoenix

A member of the Horizon League, Green Bay is 2-7-2 this season with a 0-2-1 record in conference action. The Phoenix come to Lincoln on a five-game winless streak (0-3-2) since they picked up their last victory on Sept. 13 against North Dakota State (3-1). Green Bay's other win came at Northern Iowa on Aug. 30, 2-1.

Sophomore midfielder Corey Arno leads the Phoenix with seven points on three goals and one assist while taking just nine shots. She earned Horizon League All-Newcomer honors last season and is one of two players to have multiple goals in 2009, along with freshman forward Nicole Dooher (two goals).

The Phoenix defense has struggled in the second half this year, giving up a total of 12 goals in the final period while just allowing five in the first half.

Head coach Trevor Warren is in his second year as Green Bay's head coach after leading the squad to a 5-7-4 record in his inaugural campaign last fall. Prior to Warren's arrival, the Phoenix struggled to a 2-16-0 mark in 2007. Warren began the women's college soccer at Division II Lock Haven (Pa.), leading the Lady Eagles to a 44-25-3 record in the school's first four seasons.

N Husker History vs. Oklahoma State

Nebraska has won nine of 13 match-ups against Oklahoma State for a 9-4 lead in the all-time series. The Huskers only lost to the Cowboys one time in the first 10 meetings, but Oklahoma State has been stronger in recent years and won the last three contests. The Cowgirls were ranked No. 9 nationally at the time of last year's NU-OSU matchup in Stillwater, which the Huskers dropped, 2-1, after a scoreless first half.

Scouting the Oklahoma State Cowgirls


Oklahoma State had its most successful season in school history in 2008, running to an 18-1-4 (7-1-2) record en route to the Big 12 regular-season championship. The Cowgirls were ousted from the NCAA Tournament in the second round and finished the season ranked No. 13.

Oklahoma State enters this weekend fresh off a 3-0 victory over No. 17 Kansas. The Cowgirls are 7-3-0 overall, with a 1-1-0 Big 12 record after dropping the season opener at Colorado, 1-0. Senior midfielder Siera Strawser and junior forward Katie Richardson each have four goals and two assists to lead the OSU attack, which has outscored its opponents 25-4 this season. The Cowgirl defense has posted seven shutouts in 10 games, tied for seventh-most in the nation.

Oklahoma State's Colin Carmichael is in his fifth season as the Cowgirls' head coach and holds a 66-19-3 record. He was co-head coach with Karen Hancock in 2005 and 2006, when OSU began a run of three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Last year's 18-win campaign marked the most victories

In his 16th year at the helm for the Huskers, Walker has produced the 14th-best career winning percentage among active Division I women's soccer coaches at .712 (225-86-17) at the start of the 2009 season. He also ranks 14th for all-time coaches and 20th among active Division I women's soccer coaches in victories with 225.

Under Walker, The Huskers have become perennial Big 12 Conference and national title contenders. NU has posted at least 10 victories every season in the history of the program. The Huskers have made NCAA Sweet 16 appearances in eight of the last 12 years, including two trips to the Elite Eight. They have won three Big 12 regular-season crowns and five Big 12 Tournament titles. NU swept both conference titles in 1996, 1999 and 2000.

N Marlborough Climbing the Charts

For the third straight week, freshman Morgan Marlborough is the national leader in women's college soccer in numerous offensive categories, including goals (15), goals per game (1.50), points (34) and points per game (3.40). With two goals last weekend, the forward from Lee's Summit, Mo., reached the school's all-time top-10 list for single-season goals (tie-10th) and moved into third all-time among NU freshmen.

Marlborough was voted Big 12 Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week on Sept. 15 after she turned in six goals and two assists in wins over North Dakota (Sept. 11) and Akron (Sept. 13), including four goals against the Zips to tie the single-game school record. It marked just the third time in Big 12 history that a player has earned two awards in the same week.

Aside from holding four nation-best marks, Marlborough is also the Big 12 leader in shots (53, 5.3 pg), tied for second in game-winning goals (3) and tied for third in assists (4). Her four-goal, eight-point game against Akron is the best single-game performance in the Big 12 Conference this season.

Marlborough has scored in all but two games this season (vs. Lehigh, at Colorado) and has five multiple-goal games.

N Huskers Rank Among Best Scoring Offenses in the Nation

Nebraska is the nation's second-highest scoring team and the Big 12's best with 39 goals through the first 10 games of the season - an average of 3.90 goals per contest and 10 more goals than second-place Texas Tech. The Huskers put up 30 goals during their five-game homestand to break the Nebraska Soccer Field season record of 26 set in both 2005 and 2006.

Last weekend, NU scored three goals in the first half at Texas Tech to mark the most first-half goals in a Big 12 game by the Huskers since Oct. 30, 2005 (also at Texas Tech). Nebraska's nine goals in a 9-0 victory over South Dakota on Sept. 18 is the best single-game total in the Big 12 this season.

N Thomas Continues to Score, Surpasses Freshman Totals

Sophomore Molly Thomas turned in a career-best two-goal, two-assist game in Nebraska's 9-0 win against South Dakota on Sept. 18, tying her for the second-best single-game point total (8) in the Big 12 Conference this season. Those numbers upped her season totals to six goals and three assists (15 points) to surpass her season numbers from 2008, when she finished the year with five goals and one assist. Thomas is ranked fourth in the Big 12 Conference with six goals and has had three multi-goal games this season.



Sophomore Molly Thomas has quietly put up big numbers in 2009 with six goals and three assists. She was named to the Big 12 All-Newcomer team last year.

N Macdonald Providing Solid Defense In the Net

Junior Tara Macdonald is one of the top goalkeepers in the Big 12 Conference, as she holds a 5-1-3 record in 2009 with a 1.10 goals-against average. The Austin, Texas native ranks second in the Big 12 Conference with an .820 save percentage and 4.56 saves per game, while ranking third in total saves with 41. Macdonald's career-best nine-save game at Villanova on Aug. 30 marks the second-most saves by a Big 12 goalie this season.

N Peetz, Caniglia Streaks Near 70

Senior defenders Carly Peetz and Anna Caniglia are bidding to end their collegiate careers having started every single game as a Husker. Now in their fourth seasons, the duo had each started all 69 games from 2006 to 2009. The seniors are primary reasons NU has held opponents to 1.30 goals per game, while each has produced four points on offense (Peetz two goals; Caniglia four assists).

N Freshmen See Playing Time in First Year with Huskers

Freshman Jordan Jackson has played in all 10 games this season, scoring three goals on 20 shots, while also tallying one assist. Freshman Bri Exstrom saw her first game action of the 2009 season against South Dakota on Sept. 18 and made the most of her opportunity by notching a goal in the 82nd minute. The freshman class scored five goals in the 9-0 win over the Coyotes and have 19 as a unit (Marlborough-15, Jackson-3, Exstrom-1).

N Time Differences at the Nebraska Soccer Field

N Review: Huskers End Road Swing with 3-3 Tie at Texas Tech

Nebraska jumped out to a 3-1 halftime lead, but Texas Tech scored two second-half goals as the Huskers and Red Raiders battled to a 3-3 double-overtime tie in Lubbock, Texas on Sept. 27, the highest-scoring Big 12 Conference game since Nov. 5, 2008.

Freshman Morgan Marlborough led a strong offensive attack with two goals to move into a tie for 10th all-time on the Nebraska single-season scoring charts with 15 goals this year. Marlborough's efforts helped the Huskers to a 3-1 halftime lead, but the advantage disappeared quickly after the break as the Red Raiders scored twice in the first 12 minutes of the second half to produce the final 3-3 score.

Marlborough struck early when she knocked in a 25-yard shot off the left post just 1:40 into the game, before scoring her second goal at the 22:50 mark after she cleaned up a missed header and beat Texas Tech goalkeeper Erin Wikelius.

The Red Raiders cut the lead to 2-1 with five minutes remaining in the first half on Leanne Mihelich's first of two goals in the game.

Powell responded for the Huskers just over a minute later on an open net goal after Wikelius was attempting to clear the ball out of the penalty box. The goal gave Nebraska a 3-1 halftime lead and marked the most scoring in a first half by the Huskers since Oct. 30, 2005 at Texas Tech.

Leading by two, the Huskers were unable to slow down a high-paced game as Texas Tech midfielder Taylor Lytle found the net 35 seconds into the second half before Mihelich scored her second goal of the game in the 56th minute.

After a combined six goals in the first 56 minutes of the game, the two teams went scoreless over the last 64 minutes.

The Huskers' offensive attack was slowed down with only two shots on goal in the second half after taking six in the first 45 minutes. Nebraska outshot Texas Tech overall, 18-13.

N Up Next: Huskers Welcome Big 12 South Foes, Baylor and Oklahoma

Nebraska continues its homestand next weekend, as the Huskers host Baylor and Oklahoma at the Nebraska Soccer Field on Friday, Oct. 9 at 4 p.m., and Sunday, Oct. 11 at 1 p.m.

The Huskers lead both all-times series with a 12-5 advantage over the Bears and 11-2 record against the Sooners. Nebraska lost to Baylor last season in Waco, 1-0, but defeated Oklahoma in Norman, 1-0.

It was only the third time in school history that the Huskers have opened the season on the road (4-0 win at Minnesota in 2000; 4-3 loss at Northwestern in 2008), but Nebraska (1-0-0) outshot Northern Colorado (0-1-0) and posted its first shutout since last October.

The Huskers used strong performances from two of its youngsters, as sophomore Molly Thomas recorded a pair of goals, while freshman Morgan Marlborough also scored one goal and added an assist in her Husker debut.

Marlborough accounted for the game-winning score, as she found the net on a rebound just 16 seconds before halftime. Thomas took advantage of a rebound as well, as she made it a 2-0 lead just two minutes later. Thomas added her second goal of the evening with 16 minutes remaining, receiving a pass from Marlborough for the final margin.

Marlborough is coming off a solid preseason in which she was one of Nebraska's most impressive freshmen, while Thomas is building on a strong first season in which she was named to the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

Junior transfer Tara Macdonald was superb in the net for NU, playing all 90 minutes at goalkeeper and stopping eight shots for her first shutout as a Husker.

The victory improved head coach John Walker's record to 9-5-2 in season openers.

Goetzmann's goal came in the 66th-minute when she found the bottom left corner of the net on an assist from freshman Jordan Jackson. The goal cut a 2-0 Mountain Hawk lead in half, but Lehigh was able to hold off Nebraska following an insurance score with just over four minutes remaining in the game.

Nebraska took 19 shots overall, but had a tough time getting past Lehigh goalkeeper Lauren Mains, who played all 90 minutes and stopped 10 of the 11 shots Nebraska fired on goal. Senior defender Anna Caniglia had a team-high four shots for the Huskers, while freshman Morgan Marlborough led NU in shots on goal with three.

Lehigh got on the board 10 minutes into the game when Natalie Hojnacki converted from the left side of the box off a pass from Jana Basubas. Nebraska controlled the ball in the first half, as it outshot Lehigh, 9-3, but still went into the locker room trailing 1-0.

The Mountain Hawks struck quickly again in the second half, as Liz Carlos used a header on a rebound in the 54th minute to give Lehigh a 2-0 lead. Following Goetzmann's goal to make it a 2-1 contest, Lehigh's Genna Pepe put the game away with 4:36 remaining on a goal from the middle of the box.

Nebraska's 11 shots on goal were the most in a game in nearly a year, when the Huskers also had 11 in a 2-1 win over Stephen F. Austin on Sept. 21, 2008. Goetzmann's goal was the second of her career as she also scored in Nebraska's 3-1 win against Iowa State last season.

Sixty-two seconds later, Ryan made good on her final opportunity when she chased down a long ball near the top of the penalty box and sent it over Macdonald's head for the game-tying score.

Neither team was able to convert in the overtime periods, as both teams had ample opportunities to score with seven shots apiece in the extra sessions, including three shots on goal.

Nebraska trailed 1-0 at halftime before notching its first goal of the game in the 57th minute on a header by freshman Morgan Marlborough. The Lee's Summit, Mo., native used a terrific pass from the corner from senior Shay Powell and headed the ball into the upper left side of the goal for her second score of the season. Nebraska outshot Villanova, 26-25, marking the most shots by the Huskers in a road game since Oct. 12, 2007 in a 4-0 shutout at Lamar (44 shots).

In the net, Macdonald registered nine saves for Nebraska, while playing all 110 minutes.

Marlborough added her second goal just 95 seconds into the second half on a penalty kick that beat Lamar goalkeeper Jennifer Gibbs on the right side of the net and increase the Husker lead to 5-1.

The Huskers' final scores came from junior Colleen Goetzmann off a corner kick from senior Anna Caniglia, while Fulmer wrapped up the scoring by adding a goal with 24 seconds left when she scored in the box off a free kick from sophomore Blair Slapper.

Nebraska held a 4-0 halftime advantage after senior defender Carly Peetz cleaned up a loose ball in front of the net following a corner kick with 2:54 remaining.

Sophomore forward Molly Thomas had an impressive outing as well, scoring two goals on six shots. A member of the 2008 Big 12 All-Newcomer team, Thomas gave Nebraska a 2-0 lead 6 1/2 minutes into the game when she took a pass from junior Brittany Goosen and fired a shot past the Akron goalkeeper from the right side of the penalty box.

Junior Colleen Goetzmann gave Nebraska a 2-0 lead with 24:56 to go in the first half when senior Anna Caniglia contributed the first of two assists in the game to pull into a tie for the team lead with four on the season.

Marlborough's NCAA-leading 13th goal of season came after she gained control near the top left side of the penalty box and beat an ASU defender to score from 15 yards away. With 13 goals and 30 points this season, the freshman has already put up the highest season totals by a Husker in both categories since 2005.

Nebraska held on to the 1-0 lead for the next 36 minutes behind solid goalkeeping by junior Tara Macdonald. The Husker goalie played all 110 minutes and did not allow a goal until 14:06 to go in the game when Arizona State's Taylor McCarter scored from nearly the same spot as Marlborough's goal in the first half. Macdonald finished the game with four saves, including three in the final 15 minutes of the first half.

Although Nebraska finished with two shots on goal, the offensive production was greater than the final stats indicate. Following a corner kick just 14 minutes into the game, junior Anna White headed a shot off the right post, before Marlborough hit the left post from 18 yards out two minutes later. Arizona State outshot Nebraska, 21-16 overall, with both teams registering three shots apiece in the overtime periods.

Aside from the goal, the Huskers' other shot on net came off the leg of junior midfielder Colleen Goetzmann with 2:42 remaining in the first half.

The tie was the second overtime game of the season for the Huskers, as Nebraska also tied Villanova, 2-2, on Aug. 30.

Notes: Nebraska outshot Colorado, 21-13, but the Buffaloes found some offensive punch in the second half to score the game-winning goal with 22 minutes remaining and drop the Huskers in their Big 12 Conference opener.

The Huskers were in control offensively for the majority of the first half, outshooting Colorado, 11-5. Sophomore Molly Thomas had four shots in the first 45 minutes, including one attempt in the 36th minute that hit the cross bar, but Nebraska found itself in a scoreless game at halftime for the first time this season.

Junior goalkeeper Tara Macdonald dealt with a more aggressive Buffalo offense in the second half, which took advantage of a rare scoring opportunity in the 68th minute. Macdonald was forced to come out of the goalie box to make a save, but was caught in cluster of players from both teams after she deflected the ball into the air. Colorado's Cassidy Fitzpatrick gained control of the loose ball and fired a shot into the open net for the game's only goal and eventually send Nebraska to its first loss since Aug. 28.

The Buffaloes took eight shots on goal to the Huskers' five, led by a pair from junior Colleen Goetzmann. Thomas, sophomore Blair Slapper and freshman Morgan Marlborough also registered shots on net for Nebraska, which was held scoreless for the first time this season.

Macdonald finished the game with seven saves.

Notes: Nebraska jumped out to a 3-1 halftime lead, but Texas Tech scored two second-half goals as the Huskers and Red Raiders battled to a 3-3 double-overtime tie in Lubbock, Texas, the highest scoring Big 12 Conference game since Nov. 5, 2008.

Freshman Morgan Marlborough led a strong offensive attack with two goals to move into a tie for 10th all-time on the Nebraska single-season scoring charts with 15 goals this year. Marlborough's efforts helped the Huskers to a 3-1 halftime lead, but the advantage disappeared quickly after the break as the Red Raiders scored twice in the first 12 minutes of the second half to produce the final 3-3 score.

Marlborough struck early when she knocked in a 25-yard shot off the left post just 1:40 into the game, before scoring her second goal at the 22:50 mark after she cleaned up a missed header and beat Texas Tech goalkeeper Erin Wikelius.

The Red Raiders cut the lead to 2-1 with five minutes remaining in the first half on Leanne Mihelich's first of two goals in the game.

Powell responded for the Huskers just over a minute later on an open net goal after Wikelius was attempting to clear the ball out of the penalty box. The goal gave Nebraska a 3-1 halftime lead and marked the most scoring in a first half by the Huskers since Oct. 30, 2005 at Texas Tech.

Leading by two, the Huskers were unable to slow down a high-paced game as Texas Tech midfielder Taylor Lytle found the net 35 seconds into the second half before Mihelich scored her second goal of the game in the 56th minute.

After a combined six goals in the first 56 minutes of the game, the two teams went scoreless over the last 64 minutes.

The Huskers' offensive attack was slowed down with only two shots on goal in the second half after taking six in the first 45 minutes. Nebraska outshot Texas Tech overall, 18-13.
