COMING UP

The Cornhuskers cap off their only two-game home stand in league play on Wednesday, Jan. 28, when Nebraska plays host to Kansas. The Huskers and Jayhawks will tip off at 6:30 p.m. at the Devaney Center in a game that will be televised nationally on ESPN2. NU then hits the road for its next two games.

DEFENSIVE HUSKERS WELCOME HIGH-SCORING COWBOYS TO DEVANEY CENTER

After pushing No. 6 Oklahoma to the final minutes on the road Wednesday, Nebraska returns to comfortable surroundings to start its only two-game home stand of the league slate by playing host to Oklahoma State at the Bob Devaney Sports Center on Saturday, Jan. 24.

The Huskers and Cowboys will tip off at 3:01 p.m. in a contest carried in select markets around the country on the Big 12 Network. Brad Sham (play by play) and Paul Splittorff (color) will call the action. In the state of Nebraska, the game will be seen on KLKN Channel 8 in Lincoln, KXVO Channel 15 in Omaha and KIIT Channel 30 in North Platte.

All of Nebraska's games can also be heard on the IMG Husker Sports Radio Network, consisting of 31 stations around the state and around the world for free on the Internet at Huskers.com, the official Web site of Nebraska Athletics. Veteran play-by-play man Kent Pavelka calls the action and former Husker Matt Davison adds color commentary.

The Cornhuskers hope to have the same effort and execution Saturday as their first two home league contests. Nebraska has opened its home Big 12 schedule by holding two of the league's top scoring teams (Missouri, Kansas State) to 51 points apiece while improving to 11-7 all-time at home in conference action under coach Doc Sadler.

■ Nebraska has won five straight home Big 12 games dating to last season. Overall, NU has won seven of its last eight home contests vs. league teams with the only loss in overtime last year vs. Missouri.

■ The Huskers have been impressive on the defensive end at the Devaney Center, holding each of their last four league opponents to 51 or fewer points at home.

■ In what will make an intriguing matchup, the Cowboys are the nation's fourth-highest scoring team and have been held under 70 points only once this year, while the Huskers entered the week ranked second nationally in scoring defense (currently 56.8 ppg).

■ Fans could see some impressive 3-point shooting this weekend. NU's Paul Velander leads the Big 12 Conference in 3-point shooting (50.0 pct.) this week while the Cowboys' Terrel Harris (44.8), James Anderson (44.4) and Keiton Page (44.3) all rank in the top five in the league. OSU's Obi Muonelo (43.0) also ranks eighth in the league. Velander is second nationally while Anderson is 12th and Muonelo is 20th.

■ Junior guard Ryan Anderson started to see his shot fall at OU Wednesday, as he had a season-high 19 points. Anderson added seven boards and is currently 10th in Big 12-only games with 6.5 rpg.

SCOUTING THE COWBOYS

The Oklahoma State Cowboys enter this weekend's matchup in Lincoln with an identical record as the Huskers at 12-5 overall, although the Cowboys are 1-2 in league action after already having a bye in their Big 12 schedule.

The league's highest-scoring team has dropped a pair of high-flying affairs in the last week, falling in each game despite topping the 90-point plateau. OSU has reached at least 90 points seven times in the regular season and is currently averaging 86.0 points per game to rank fourth nationally in scoring offense.

OSU fell at home in its last contest on Wednesday, dropping a 97-95 contest against a surging Missouri squad that has not lost since being held to a season-low 51 points at Nebraska in each team's Big 12 opener. OSU trailed by 20 points with less than 13 minutes remaining, but nearly pulled off the comeback.

The Cowboys had three players top the 20-point plateau in the contest vs. the Tigers. In contrast, Nebraska has had only three games all season with one player reaching 20 points.

The Cowboys have gotten most of their production out of their four-guard lineup this season. The bench (four players) and the lone forward starter (Malcolm Kirkland) combined for

14 points Wednesday, while the four guards combined to produce 81 points.

Obi Muonelo posted a team-high 22 points and 12 rebounds against Missouri, but was just 7-of-19 shooting from the field, including 3-of-9 from 3-point range. Byron Eaton and Terrel Harris also each posted 21 points on a combined 12-of-25 shooting. The Tigers' pressure defense forced 19 OSU turnovers, with Eaton and Muonelo having six apiece.

James Anderson added 17 points for the Cowboys, hitting all eight shots from the free throw line while helping OSU knock down 31-of-39 (79.5 percent) at the stripe. Anderson leads the team with 17.9 points per game to rank fourth in the league in scoring this year. He is one of five Cowboys averaging double figures, along with Muonelo (15.9 ppg), Harris (14.7), Eaton (13.7) and Keiton Page (10.2). Muonelo has nearly averaged a double-double by ranking second in the league with 9.8 rebounds per game this year.

Harris, Anderson and Page each rank in the top three in the league in 3-point percentage, as OSU ranks second nationally in 3-point shooting by hitting 42.0 percent as a team. The Cowboys are also third in the country with 10.8 3-pointers per game. Defensively, OSU has allowed more than 74 points per game.

Oklahoma State is coached by Travis Ford (Kentucky, 1994). Ford is in his first season with the Cowboys, but is in his 12th year overall as a head coach. He spent three years at UMass before coming to Stillwater and now owns a 202-151 career record, including an 81-40 record at Division I.

THE SERIES VS. THE COWBOYS

Nebraska and Oklahoma State are meeting for the 114th time in series history. The Cornhuskers hold the upper hand in the series, taking a slim 62-51 advantage.

■ The teams first met in 1926-27. Oklahoma State took that contest, 27-24, in Stillwater before the Huskers won on their home court later that season, 35-25.

■ Oklahoma State won six of the first seven matchups and had an early lead in the series before Nebraska won 15-of-18 matchups between 1966 and 1972.

■ More recently, the Cowboys have won 22 of the last 33 matchups.

■ The Huskers own a 35-13 advantage in Lincoln, including a 19-8 lead in games played in the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

■ Nebraska has won each of the past two contests in Lincoln, and three of the last four at home. The 2004-05 contest marked the last time Nebraska defeated a top-10 team, as OSU came into the game ranked No. 4 nationally and fell to NU, 74-67.

■ Last year, Oklahoma State and Nebraska came into the contest in Stillwater fighting to get into the NCAA Tournament talk. OSU walked away the winner, 77-63, as the Cowboys outdueled NU by hitting 52.4 percent from the floor compared to the Huskers' 50.0 percent. Steve Harley and Aleks Maric had 17 points apiece while Ade Dagunduro added 12 for NU. OSU countered with Byron Eaton (20 points) and Marcus Dove (17 points) while Obi Muonelo helped the team hit 9-of-19 from 3-point range while scoring 12 points.

QUICK HITS

Here is a quick look at the Huskers through games of Jan. 21:

Quick team notes

■ The last time Nebraska opened a year with at least 13 wins in its first 18 games was 1995-96, when NU started 14-4 before finishing 21-14 while winning the National Invitation Tournament title.

■ The last time Nebraska opened a year with a 3-2 mark through five Big 12 Conference games was 1998-99. Nebraska lost its first two league games that year but then reeled off five straight wins to open 5-2.

■ NU has the Big 12 Conference's top scoring defense, allowing just 56.8 points per game. NU entered the week ranked second nationally in scoring defense.

■ The Huskers held each of their first 16 opponents under 67 points, becoming the first NU squad since 1981-82 to accomplish the feat. The only team to top 70 points against the Huskers this year was No. 6/5 Oklahoma in Norman.

■ The Huskers have held opponents in each of their last four home Big 12 Conference games to 51 or fewer points. Starting with Oklahoma last year, NU has allowed 45 points, 49 (Colorado), 51 (Missouri) and 51 (Kansas State).

■ The Huskers have held Big 12 opponents to 65 or fewer points in 10 of NU's last 13 games against league teams, including last year's league tournament.

■ Nebraska started the week ranked third nationally in turnover margin and is second in the Big 12 Conference at +6.4.

■ The Huskers were also in the top 75 nationally entering the week in steals per game (16th), turnovers per game (18th), 3-point field-goal percentage (35th), 3-point field-goal percentage defense (41st), scoring margin (40th), assist-to-turnover ratio (44th), field-goal percentage defense (61st) and field-goal percentage (65th).

■ NU tied the school record (originally set at Iowa State in 2002) with only three turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore. NU also had just six turnovers against Saint Louis and seven at No. 6/5 Oklahoma.

■ Nebraska snapped a streak of trailing on the boards in five straight games by gaining a 30-23 advantage on the glass against Maryland Eastern Shore.

■ In Big 12-only games, junior guard Ryan Anderson ranks 10th in rebounding with 6.5 boards per game. He also is tied for third in steals with 1.8 per contest against league teams. Senior guard Paul Velander also ranks third in the league-only games by hitting 57.1 percent (12-of-21) from 3-point range.

■ Ade Dagunduro is averaging a team-best 13.1 points per game over the last 10 contests. He has hit 63.3 percent from the field in that span.

■ Earlier this season Dagunduro had hit 26-of-32 (81.3 percent) over a four-game span (ending with Maryland Eastern Shore).

■ Dagunduro tied the school single-game record by hitting all nine field-goal attempts against UMBC, the second-best single-game mark in the league during the Big 12 era.

■ Dagunduro had three straight made field goals to end the IPFW contest, connected on nine consecutive against UMBC and then knocked in his first three shots against South Carolina State to set the school record for consecutive made field goals at 15. Dagunduro surpassed Mikki Moore for the mark, as Moore had 13 straight made shots over three games in the 1997 NIT.

■ Paul Velander has reached double figures just five times this season but is third on the team with 9.5 points per game. He ranked second nationally from 3-point range entering this week and has now hit 50.0 percent (48-of-96) to date to rank first in the Big 12 Conference.

■ Also entering the week, Velander ranked 44th nationally in 3-pointers per game (2.9).

■ Because of his quick release, Velander is averaging a 3-pointer every 8.8 minutes he is on the court (48 3s in 422 minutes), but has had a turnover only every 84.4 minutes (5 TOs in 422 minutes).

■ Velander has hit at least three 3-pointers in 12-of-17 games this season. Dating to last year, he has hit at least three treys in 17 of his last 24 games. Before that, he had hit at least three 3-pointers in a game just six times in his first 51 career games.

■ Senior guard Steve Harley leads the team with 12.2 points per game, and scored in double figures in 11 straight games to end

non-conference play. Harley has found a tough stretch to open league play, hitting just 29.8 percent (14-of-47) to open the conference slate while averaging 8.0 points per game.

■ Sek Henry has been proficient with the basketball on the year, hitting 49.6 percent from the field, including a solid 40.0 percent from 3-point range.

■ Henry has scored in double figures nine times in 17 games this season, after scoring in double figures just nine times in the first 64 games of his career.

■ Sophomore Cookie Miller posted season highs in points in consecutive games, gaining 11 points at Iowa State and 15 points against Kansas State. He hit 9-of-14 shots from the floor, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range, in the two games with five assists.

■ Miller leads the team with 67 assists after posting a season-high seven assists at No. 6/5 Oklahoma. He is looking to become the first Husker to lead NU in assists as a freshman and sophomore since Tyronn Lue in 1995-96 and 1996-97.

■ Miller's seven assists at Oklahoma were one less than his total (8) over the first three Big 12 Conference games.

SADLER APPROACHES PLATEAU

Coach Doc Sadler has been known to get everything possible out of his players and teams, as his work ethic has carried over to the court. In the past two seasons, Sadler's effort pushed the Huskers to 17 and 20 wins, with last year's first-round NIT victory giving the Huskers just the 12th 20-win season in the 112-year history of the program.

Behind his solid guidance, the Huskers have won 49 games in the past two-plus seasons. Should the Huskers earn a victory on Saturday against Oklahoma State, it will mark Sadler's 50th victory in just 82 games on the Nebraska sideline. Only two coaches in Husker history have recorded 50 wins faster than 82 games, and both of those men coached at Nebraska before World War I.

DIAZ JOINS HUSKERS

After an entry process that took longer than anticipated, Nebraska finally got some good news regarding freshman center Brian Diaz. The 6-11, 235-pounder was admitted to the University of Nebraska and was enrolled in classes on Jan. 17.

He is immediately eligible to play (he was originally cleared by the NCAA Clearinghouse in September 2008) as a true freshman this season. Diaz suited up against No. 6/5 Oklahoma but did not play.

Diaz, whose given name is Jorge Brian Diaz, will add to a Nebraska lineup that was one of the smallest in the nation. Before Diaz joined the squad, the Huskers had just one eligible scholarship player who stood taller than 6-6 (Chris Balham, 6-8; 10.0 minutes per game).

The Huskers could have a dramatically different look next season. Not only will the Huskers have the 6-11 Diaz, but 6-11 Christopher Niemann is sitting out this year under an NCAA eligibility ruling and NU has signed 6-9 Brandon Ubel for next season as well.

HUSKERS HIT MARKS VS. KSU

Just three days after struggling on the road at Iowa State, the Cornhuskers hit on all cylinders on Jan. 17 against Kansas State, running past the Wildcats by a 73-51 margin.

■ Nebraska hit 50.0 percent from the floor, the fifth time in nine Big 12 Conference regular-season games NU hit at least 50 percent from the floor. The Huskers had hit just 36 percent from the field in their first two league games this year.

■ NU hit 10 3-pointers against the Wildcats, the Huskers' most treys against a league team since March 8, 2007, when Nebraska hit 13 against Oklahoma State.

■ The Huskers outscored KSU by 22 points, the largest margin of victory over a Big 12 Conference opponent during the coach Doc Sadler era. The last time NU posted a larger margin of victory over a league foe was 2003-04, when the Huskers defeated No. 25 Texas Tech 72-44 in Lincoln.

TURNING TEAMS OVER

Nebraska will try to turn up the defensive pressure at times this season, especially while playing with a heavily guard-oriented lineup, including many sets with five guards on the floor at once.

That strong defensive push was evident in NU's opener as they forced 25 San Jose State turnovers. Spartans' point guard Justin Graham was frustrated into 10 turnovers while going 0-of-5 from the floor in 33 minutes of action.

■ The 25 turnovers Nebraska forced in the season opener against San Jose State were the second-highest total under Coach Doc Sadler. The most turnovers a Husker squad has forced in Sadler's tenure is 26 last season against North Carolina Central.

■ NU also forced a season-high tying 25 turnovers against Kansas State on Jan. 17.

■ The Huskers have now forced 306 turnovers through 17 games, while allowing teams to record just 182 assists on 324 baskets.

■ The Huskers have forced at least 20 turnovers in seven games this year (25 vs. San Jose State; 23 vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff; 24 vs. Creighton; 24 at Oregon State; 24 vs. IPFW; 21 vs. South Carolina State; 25 vs. Kansas State). Last year, the Huskers forced 20 turnovers in a game six times all season.

■ The 24 turnovers forced at Oregon State are the most by a Husker opponent away from Lincoln since Texas Tech had 26 turnovers against Nebraska in the first round of the 1999 Big 12 Championship.

■ Nebraska posted 16 steals in the defensive effort against San Jose State, the most by the Huskers under Sadler. The previous best under Sadler was 15 steals vs. North Texas in 2006.

■ The Huskers have had double-figure steals six times this season and at least eight steals in 14 games this season.

■ Eight Huskers have recorded a steal this year, including seven averaging at least 1.0 steal per game.

■ The most steals in a game by a single Husker this season is five by junior guard Ryan Anderson against Kansas State on Jan. 17. Four other players have recorded five games with four steals.

■ The defensive pressure has helped Nebraska to a 342-185 advantage in points off turnovers this season.

HANDLING WITH CARE

Nebraska coach Doc Sadler has preached that the Huskers need to be efficient within their offense and not give away easy points. That philosophy includes taking care of the ball, something the Huskers have succeeded in doing well early in the season.

■ Nebraska has averaged just 11.6 turnovers per game this season to rank 18th nationally entering the week and first in the Big 12 Conference. NU is the only team in the league averaging fewer than 12.2 turnovers per game.

■ The Huskers entered the week ranked third nationally in turnover margin, and currently have a +6.4 margin to rank second in the Big 12 Conference.

■ The Huskers tied the school record by committing just three turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore. NU equaled the team mark set in 2002 at Iowa State. Nebraska had just one turnover in the first half against Maryland Eastern Shore, and two miscues following the break.

■ Nebraska posted just six turnovers against Saint Louis, tying the previous low mark for miscues in Sadler's first three years. NU also had just six turnovers against Colorado in 2007.

■ Nebraska had only three turnovers in the first half against Alabama State. NU also had two turnovers in the second half against Saint Louis and three in the first half at No. 6/5 Oklahoma, giving the Huskers five halves this season (including each half vs. UMES) with three or fewer turnovers.

■ Nebraska posted just seven turnovers at No. 6/5 Oklahoma, marking the ninth time under coach Doc Sadler that NU had 11 or fewer turnovers in a road game, and second time this season (also at Oregon State, 11 TO).

BOMBS AWAY

Nebraska has been strong from outside the arc during coach Doc Sadler's tenure, including this year. The Huskers are among the national leaders, hitting 38.2 percent from long range. Last season, Nebraska hit 34.2 percent from beyond the arc.

■ Only two Huskers are averaging more than one 3-pointer per game, Paul Velander (2.8) and Sek Henry (1.1), although the team is averaging 7.1 treys per game.

■ Velander has been more effective than ever despite stepping back further to shoot. He is hitting 50.0 percent (48-of-96) from beyond the arc to rank second in the Big 12 Conference and second nationally entering the week.

■ Nebraska has hit better than 40 percent from the 3-point line as a team five times this season, including a season-high 56.0 percent against Alabama State.

■ The Huskers have hit 10 or more 3-pointers three times this season, including against Alabama State (14), Florida A&M (10) and Kansas State (10).

■ NU has posted at least eight 3-pointers in a game eight times.

■ Nebraska hit an impressive 14-of-25 (56.0 percent) from beyond the arc against the Alabama State. NU "only" connected on 51.7 percent (30-of-58) from the floor overall.

■ The 14 3-pointers were the most by the Huskers since hitting 15 against Miami on the road in the 2006-07 season. The school record is 18 3-pointers against No. 1 Kansas in 2002.

■ Six Huskers hit from outside the arc, including four players with three 3-pointers apiece. Sek Henry led the way with a perfect 3-for-3 night beyond the arc while Ryan Anderson (3-of-4), Steve Harley (3-of-5) and Paul Velander (3-of-6) each had three treys apiece.

■ Amazingly when all the 3s were falling against Alabama State, Velander attempted his first two shots inside the arc, missing both. Velander's first 26 attempts from the field this season were 3-point attempts until a missed jumper in the first half against Alabama State.

■ Nebraska had another game where all the shots were falling as the Huskers hit 10-of-18 (55.6 percent) against Kansas State on Jan. 17. Velander hit 6-of-10 by himself, while Cookie Miller connected on all three of his attempts. NU hit 50.0 percent from the field in the game.

DEFENSE AMONG NCAA'S BEST

Nebraska is among the Big 12 and national leaders in several defensive categories in 2008-09.

■ Nebraska was second in the country entering the week and currently leads the Big 12 in scoring defense at 56.8 ppg. No other team in the league is holding opponents below 61 points per game as Texas ranks second at 61.2 points per contest.

■ Nebraska ranked 61st nationally entering the week and is currently seventh in the conference in field-goal percentage defense. NU has held eight opponents below 40 percent shooting, and has allowed just one team to hit over 47 percent from the field this season.

■ The Huskers have allowed teams to hit just 31.2 percent from 3-point range, and ranked 41st nationally entering the week. NU has held eight teams under 25.0 percent shooting from beyond the arc this season.

■ The Huskers did not allow any of their first 16 opponents to score more than 66 points in a game. It was the longest streak to open a season without allowing an opponent to reach 67 points since the 1981-82 NU squad did it through the first 18 games of the year.

■ Only one other time (2003-04) in the 3-point era before this season has Nebraska held every non-conference team below 67 points.

■ Nebraska held each of its first six opponents to fewer than 58 points. The last time NU held opponents to less than 60 points over the first six games of the year was the start of the 1943-44 season.

■ The last time Nebraska held six consecutive opponents to fewer than 60 points in any stretch was the seven contests between games 12 through 18 of the 1981-82 season. That was a streak of 820 games before it was matched starting this season.

■ The Huskers have allowed 965 points in the first 17 games of the year. Nebraska has held its first 17 opponents to fewer than 1,000 combined points to open a season just 11 times since 1947-48.

■ Nebraska has forced at least 20 turnovers in a game seven times this season, including once in Big 12 Conference play (Kansas State, 25).

■ Nebraska held TCU to just 10 field goals in NU's first road game of the season. The 10 field goals allowed were the second-lowest by a Husker squad under Sadler, trailing only the nine baskets allowed at home by North Carolina Central last season.

■ The 10 field goals by the Horned Frogs were the fewest by an opponent away from the Devaney Center since Centenary had 10 baskets to open the 2002-03 season at the Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska.

■ The 50 points scored by TCU marked the fewest Nebraska has allowed on the road since NU held Kansas State to 42 points in the first league road game of the 2005-06 campaign.

■ TCU's 50 points were also the fewest Nebraska has allowed in a true road opener since giving up just 49 points at Minnesota in the 1977-78 season.

KEEPING OPPONENTS IN LINE

While the 3-point line moved back one foot – from 19-9 to 20-9 – for the first time in men's college basketball this season, Nebraska's 3-point defense has improved dramatically with the change in the line.

■ Nebraska's 3-point defense this year has been solid as opponents have hit just 31.2 percent from beyond the arc. Last season, opponents hit 36.4 percent on the year.

■ Nebraska's 3-point percentage defense was 41st nationally entering the week and is currently second in the Big 12 Conference.

■ Ten of Nebraska's 17 opponents have been held to five or fewer 3-pointers in a game, including five with three or fewer.

ON THE GLASS

The Huskers will put a small lineup on the floor just about every night this season, giving coach Doc Sadler reason to be interested in Nebraska's rebounding, especially on the defensive end. All of NU's guards will need to be capable rebounders this season to keep the opposing team from getting easy baskets on second chances.

■ Through 17 games, Nebraska trails on the glass by over four rebounds per game (-4.4 rpg, 33.5 to 29.1).

■ Nebraska has trailed on the glass in 12 contests this season, including five straight games before outrebounding Maryland Eastern Shore by seven on Jan. 3.

■ NU has trailed in each of its four Big 12 contests, by margins of -5, -14, -11 and -3. Nebraska's 36 rebounds against No. 6/5 Oklahoma were its third-highest total of the season.

■ The Huskers posted 11 offensive rebounds in each of the last three non-league games (33 total) after recording 27 offensive boards in the previous five games combined. NU has had at least 10 offensive rebounds in a game five times, most recently against No. 6/5 Oklahoma.

DAGUNDURO GETTING ON TRACK

After a sluggish start to the season, senior guard Ade Dagunduro has begun to turn up the intensity on both ends of the court.

One of the most athletic players in the Big 12 Conference, Dagunduro has recently brought his scoring average up to rank second on the squad with 10.6 points per game. He has scored in double figures in seven of the past 10 games, including at least 18 points three times.

■ Dagunduro started the season averaging just 4.8 points per game in three contests against San Jose State, TCU and Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

■ After posting 11 combined points against Alabama State and Arizona State, Dagunduro has averaged a team-best 13.1 ppg on 63.3 percent shooting (50-of-79) over the past 10 games.

NOTING THE OKLAHOMA GAME

■ Nebraska fell to 12-5 on the season and 2-2 in the league. The Huskers have lost both of their league road games this season.

■ Nebraska led 38-32 at halftime, the second time this season NU held an advantage at the break on the road (also TCU).

■ NU led by as many as seven points in the first half and had the game tied at 53-53 until Austin Johnson hit a 3-pointer for OU with about six and a half minutes remaining. NU was still within one, 53-52, until the final four minutes when OU used an 8-0 run to pull away for the victory.

■ Senior guard Paul Velandier recorded two 3-pointers, hitting both of his attempts from beyond the arc. He has now hit 50.0 percent (48-of-96) from long range this season.

■ Junior guard Ryan Anderson had a season-high 19 points, just missing the third 20-point contest of his career. Anderson had 17 points in the first half, hitting 4-of-8 from 3-point range in the period.

■ Anderson had scored just 11 points in the first three Big 12 Conference games combined before his outburst against the Sooners.

■ Anderson also led the Huskers with seven rebounds. Nebraska was outrebounded by just three, 39-36, on the game, but held a 10-9 advantage on the offensive glass.

■ Sophomore guard Cookie Miller scored just four points but he had seven assists against two turnovers. His assists were a season high, topping the six he had in four contests.

■ Oklahoma's Blake Griffin scored 27 points and grabbed 18 rebounds, including posting 16 points and 11 boards in the second half. Both totals were Nebraska opponent highs this season.

HUSKERS ON THE RADIO

The IMG Husker Sports Radio Network is in its 13th year producing and marketing live broadcasts of University of Nebraska football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball and softball games.

The Husker Sports Network has created a large network of state and national affiliates. All regular-season men's basketball games and any postseason contests will be broadcast on a 31-station basketball network in 2007-08. KFAB (1110 AM) is the Omaha affiliate, KLIN (1400 AM) is the Lincoln affiliate and while KRVN (880 AM) in Lexington also serves as a primary state affiliate.

All the men's basketball games can be heard around the world for free on Huskers.com. A great number of Nebraska's games will also be heard live on SIRIUS Satellite again this season.

Veteran radio announcer Kent Pavelka leads the NU men's basketball broadcast in 2008-09, along with former Husker letterwinner Matt Davison. Former Husker Andy Markowski will also fill in as the color analyst for a limited number of contests. Lane Grindle serves as the host of Sports Nightly, a live daily call-in show. Grindle will also host the Doc Sadler Radio Show on Monday nights throughout the season beginning at 7 p.m.

■ Dagunduro set a career high by scoring in double figures in five straight games (Oregon State, IPFW, UMBC, South Carolina State, Maryland Eastern Shore).

■ The senior posted a career high in the Big 12 opener, gaining a game-high 20 points on 6-of-11 shooting while helping Nebraska to its third league-opening win in 13 years. He also had five rebounds and three steals in 29 minutes.

■ In the last 10 games, Dagunduro has also averaged 3.7 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.4 steals per game.

■ Possibly Dagunduro's biggest points of the non-conference season came in the final seconds of a comeback victory over Creighton. The Inglewood, Calif., native got free on the right block when his defender hedged to the middle of the lane as Steve Harley drove to the basket. Harley made a nice wrap-around pass to Dagunduro, whose uncontested layup with 2.7 seconds remaining was the game-winner.

■ Dagunduro's slow start this season is the exact opposite of last year, which could be a good thing for the Huskers in the long run. Dagunduro started 2007-08 on fire, averaging 11.8 points per game in non-conference play while hitting 54.8 percent from the field. In league action, he gained 5.8 points per game while knocking down just 40.4 percent from the field.

RECORD PERFORMANCE

Senior guard Ade Dagunduro had what the Huskers hope to be a breakout game against UMBC as he posted 19 points in 27 minutes of action. He topped his previous career best of 17 points last year in an overtime road loss to Western Kentucky.

Dagunduro scored 15 of his 19 points against UMBC in the second half and added three rebounds, three assists, two blocks and two steals for an impressive all-around performance.

But the most impressive aspect of Dagunduro's line on the stat sheet was the field-goal column. He finished the game hitting 9-of-9 attempts from the field, helping Nebraska hit 48.9 percent from the floor.

■ Dagunduro tied the school single-game record by hitting all nine of his attempts from the field against UMBC.

■ Dagunduro became the fifth Husker in history to connect on nine consecutive shots from the floor in a single game. It was the fourth time the feat happened by a Husker against a non-conference opponent.

■ Dagunduro's mark was originally believed to be a single-game conference record, however, since then it has been established that Colorado center David Harrison had a 10-for-10 effort versus Baylor in 2004. It is believed that Dagunduro's mark ties for second place in the Big 12 record book.

■ Dagunduro extended his streak of consecutive made field-goal attempts to 15 over three straight games, setting a new Nebraska record. He had three made shots to end the game against IPFW, added nine against UMBC and then hit his first three against South Carolina State to surpass Mikki Moore, who held the previous NU record by hitting 13 straight shots in three games in 1997.

■ Dagunduro's streak of 15 straight made shots fell two shy of the old Big 12 record. His streak is second in the league this season behind Baylor's Quincy Acy, who set the new Big 12 record by making his first 20 attempts from the field to start his career.

HARLEY IS LEADER OF THE PACK

Guard Steve Harley came on strong at the end of last season when he was named to the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team by the league's sportswriters for his play in league action.

Over the final 12 league games and the postseason, Harley assumed a lead role in the Husker offense, ranking second with 11.0 points per game while hitting 45 percent from the floor including nearly 43 percent from 3-point range. He shot better than 78 percent from the charity stripe in that stretch.

This year he has picked up where he left off as he tries to guide the Huskers to their second straight postseason berth.

■ Harley is currently leading the team with 12.2 points per game despite averaging just 8.0 points – fifth on team – over the first four league games.

■ Despite struggling to score in NU's three Big 12 games this year, Harley has still come up big for the Huskers. He grabbed five rebounds three times in the first four contests, and averaged more than two assists per game. He also made a tremendous hustle play

against Missouri, tossing a blocked shot by Ade Dagunduro back up court while diving out of bounds on MU's baseline. Dagunduro eventually tracked down Harley's toss and scored at the other end.

■ Harley set a career high with 21 points on 9-of-15 shooting against IPFW. It was his second career 20-point performance and the Huskers' first 20-point game this year.

■ He has been one of the most aggressive Huskers getting to the basket, as he is second on the team with 61 trips to the free throw line (41 made free throws, 67.2 percent). Harley is also averaging 3.6 rebounds and is second on the team with 40 assists and tied for second with 23 steals.

■ Harley has tied his career high for rebounds twice this season, posting six against San Jose State in the season opener and again in the come-from-behind win over Creighton. He has had at least four rebounds in a game seven times this season.

■ Harley had just one assist against Creighton, but it was the biggest one of the game. With the contest tied at 52-52, Nebraska had the ball with the shot clock off. Coach Doc Sadler drew up a play for Harley as the first scoring option. As he drove the lane to the basket, CU hedged to the middle and Harley made a nice wrap-around pass to Ade Dagunduro, who had an uncontested layup for the game-winning basket with 2.7 seconds remaining.

■ Harley is one of only two players (also Cookie Miller) averaging more than 26 minutes per game. Harley has played 31.2 minutes per contest this season, including a career-high 40 minutes against UMBC.

HOT HENRY

After a strong offseason, junior guard Sek Henry started out on a tear while helping the Huskers win six straight games to open a season for just the second time in the Big 12 era.

Henry has been more consistent on offense through the first 17 games of this season than at any point in his career. He is one of four players averaging at least 9.5 ppg, and has recorded nine double-figure scoring games.

■ Henry posted 19 points against each Saint Louis and Florida A&M, one off his career high and the most points he has scored at home in the Devaney Center. He nearly matched the mark with 18 points vs. South Carolina State.

■ Henry added 13 points against Missouri to help Nebraska to a win in the Big 12 opener. It was the second-highest point total of his career against a Big 12 squad, trailing the 14 points he scored last season at Missouri.

■ He has scored in double figures nine times in 17 games this season, after scoring in double figures just nine times in the first 64 games of his career. Henry posted double figures five times last year and four times as a freshman.

■ Henry has hit 56-of-113 shots (49.6 percent) from the field, including 18-of-45 (40.0 percent) from 3-point range. His career averages entering this season were 36.7 percent shooting and 26.4 percent from beyond the arc.

■ Henry has twice this season tied his career high with four steals in a game. He is currently fourth on the team with 21 steals through 17 contests.

■ Being aggressive is in Henry's nature on the court and it is showing this year. Although he has hit just 66.0 percent from the free throw line, he has done a nice job getting to the stripe as he is one of only three Huskers with at least 30 attempts from the line (31-of-47).

■ Henry raised his free throw average significantly of late, hitting 22 of his last 27 (81.5 percent) attempts over the past seven games. Henry hit an impressive 7-of-8 from the line against UMBC after entering the game hitting 45.0 percent in his first nine games this year, and followed with a 7-of-9 effort against SCSU.

ENERGY GUY

Following the season-opening contest against San Jose State, Coach Doc Sadler praised several players for their energy and hustle, especially the ones off the bench.

Leading the way that day was redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson, who posted six points, three rebounds, an assist and four steals in 16 minutes in his career debut.

Richardson's numbers did not tell the whole story as he made several dives to the floor and other hustle plays to ignite NU in the second half after SJSU cut the lead from 18 points to five. His steal off an inbounds and three-point play turned the game around, helping NU score 10 points in less than a minute to pull away for good.

Following another strong performance in Nebraska's game against IPFW, Sadler said:

"Brandon Richardson makes plays that don't show up on the box score. When we went to the 1-3-1 for the first time (that night), he made two huge hustle plays. He does things that might give you three or four more possessions that you wouldn't otherwise get in a game."

■ Against UAPB, he scored a season-high nine points and had two assists without a turnover in 23 minutes of action.

SCHEDULE NOTES

■ Nebraska faces a rugged schedule as it will play 13 of its 29 regular-season games against teams that reached the 2008 postseason. Eight of the 13 game against postseason teams will be played at the Devaney Center. Among the Huskers' opponents that reached last year's NCAA Tournament were: NCAA champion Kansas (twice), Elite Eight participant Texas, NCAA second-round qualifiers Kansas State (twice) and Texas A&M along with NCAA qualifiers Baylor, Oklahoma and UMBC. NU will also face Arizona State, Creighton, Alabama State and Oklahoma State, all of which played in the postseason NIT.

■ The Huskers will play 18 regular-season games at the Devaney Center for the second straight season. Last year, the Huskers went 15-3 in the building with the only losses coming to eventual national champion Kansas and NCAA qualifier Baylor, along with an overtime setback to Missouri.

■ Nebraska played its 500th game in the Bob Devaney Sports Center last season and will be gunning for its 400th win in building history in 2008-09. Through Jan. 17, the Huskers own a 396-122 record in their 33rd season at the Devaney Center, good for an impressive .765 winning percentage.

■ Nebraska will look to keep an outstanding home winning streak alive in 2008-09 as the Huskers' look for their 33rd straight winning season at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The Huskers have never had a losing season in the Devaney Center since the building opened for the 1976-77 campaign.

■ The Huskers played three true road games during the non-conference slate, facing Arizona State in the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series along with Oregon State and TCU. It was the sixth time in the Big 12 era that the Huskers played at least three true road games in non-league action and the first time since 2004-05 when Nebraska played at UAB, Marquette and Tennessee.

■ The Huskers will be seen on television within the state at least 24 times during the season, including every road game for the second straight year. Every conference road game will be televised for the third consecutive season. The Huskers have averaged more than 13 televised contests (national, regional and local) each of the past seven years.

■ Nebraska will be seen nationally at least eight times this season on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, FSN and CBS College Sports. More than 10 additional games will also be available around the country on satellite.

HUSKERS SIGN FOUR FOR 2009-10

Third-year coach Doc Sadler announced Friday, Nov. 14, that a strong lineup of four talented athletes, including three standing 6-8 or taller, have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Nebraska basketball squad for the 2009-10 season. Among the signees are: 6-10, 220-pound center Vander Joaquim from Luanda, Angola; 6-8, 210-pound forward Christian Standhardinger from Munich, Germany; 6-9, 220-pound forward Brandon Ubel from Overland Park, Kan.; and 6-2, 175-pound point/shooting guard Rayes Gallegos from Jordan, Utah.

"I'm excited about this class and what they can bring to Nebraska," Sadler said. "When we go on the road, something we look for in addition to talent is character, and that has been a continued priority this year. I feel good about the way they will represent Nebraska. On the court, I feel they will help us continue to improve and compete for a Big 12 championship."

■ Joaquim averaged 21.1 points and 16.8 rebounds per contest last year with 89 blocks. He was ranked at one point the No. 12 high school center in the country by Scout.com (71st nationally overall) and No. 15 center by Rivals.com (115th nationally overall). Joaquim was tabbed the No. 2 power forward on the West Coast by Scout.com before moving to West Virginia to attend Mountain State Academy in 2008-09.

■ Standhardinger was named the MVP of the NBBL in 2008 and in the final of the 2008 U19 German Championship, he scored 37 points and posted 12 rebounds. He also earned top scorer honors at the Europe's Best Junior Tournament in 2007 and was the MVP of the German Top 4 in 2007. Standhardinger also was a member of the German Junior National Team in 2007 and 2008. This season, Standhardinger has averaged 19.1 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.3 steals and 1.1 assists per game for his club team as of late November.

■ Ubel is a skilled forward with a nice touch from outside who also possesses the ability to score off a number of post moves and mid-range jumpers. Last year as a junior, he helped Blue Valley West to the state tournament and his team won the Class 6A state title during his sophomore season. During the summer AAU circuit, Ubel averaged close to 20 points and eight rebounds per game for the Wedman Pumas. He owns a 4.1 grade-point average in high school and his sister, Kayla Ubel, is a sophomore on the NU track team.

■ Gallegos came on during the summer AAU circuit when he averaged about 25 points per game. Gallegos was rated the No. 53 shooting guard in the country by Scouts.com and was tabbed the No. 7 shooting guard on the West Coast. Gallegos was the team's third-leading scorer at 10.5 points per game as a junior, helping the team to the state tournament.

NOTE: Vander Joaquim left Mountain State Academy following Christmas. He enrolled at the College of Eastern Utah, a junior college, for the second semester this year. He is expected to redshirt this year and start playing during the 2009-10 season.

■ He posted 13 points over the past two games of non-conference play after scoring just 12 points in his previous eight games.

■ Richardson hit 3-of-6 from the field against Maryland Eastern Shore and knocked down 2-of-3 vs. Florida A&M. The recent surge (before sitting out the first four games of Big 12 Conference action with an injury) has come as a direct result of the coaching staff telling Richardson to focus on being more aggressive on the offensive end.

■ He has posted at least three steals in a game three times this year, and is sixth on the team with 17 steals. He needs seven steals to move onto the Nebraska freshman top-10 list.

ENERGY GUY . . . TOO

Along with Richardson, senior Paul Velander has also been praised by Sadler for his energy coming off the bench, including following the Saint Louis game. In his postgame press conference that night, Sadler said:

"We've got to get the rest of the team to make effort plays like Paul Velander. There's not a player in the country who makes more effort plays than that guy."

■ Velander has come off the bench to hit 48 3-pointers in 17 games, including 12 games with at least three treys apiece. He is third on the team in scoring at 9.5 points per game.

■ Velander leads the Big 12 Conference and is second nationally this week in 3-point percentage, as he has hit 50.0 percent from behind the arc.

■ Velander posted as career-high tying 20 points behind a career-best six 3-pointers against Kansas State on Jan. 17.

■ He has hit double figures five times this season, including three of the last four games of the non-conference slate.

■ He also made his first 2-point basket of the year against UMBC and now has hit just 2-of-9 from inside the arc.

■ Velander leads the team with 16 charges taken, including three against each San Jose State and Saint Louis. If the statistic were kept nationally, it's possible that Velander would lead the nation in charges taken.

■ Velander's effort finally rubbed off on his teams against IPFW. NU had six charges taken, each by a different individual, including one by Velander. As a team, NU has taken 30 charges in 17 games.

BALHAM MAKING MOST OF MINUTES

Junior forward Chris Balham has been limited by chronic knee problems throughout his career and while he has not been able to practice or get on the court in games as much as he and coach Doc Sadler would like, Balham has made the most of his court time lately.

■ Over the past six games, Balham has averaged 14.1 minutes per game, with a total of 85 minutes of action. He saw 46 minutes of action combined in his first seven games of the year, with a high of 10 minutes at TCU. He also missed three games this year because of chronic knee issues.

■ He has played 18, 14, 17, 14, 10 and 12 minutes, respectively, over the past six contests, the first time in his career he has gained at least 10 minutes in more than three straight games.

■ Balham tied his career high with eight rebounds against Florida A&M. Of his 27 rebounds in the past seven games, 15 are offensive boards. He helped NU average 11 offensive boards per game over the final three non-conference contests of the year. NU also posted 10 offensive boards at No. 6/5 Oklahoma.

■ Balham scored a season-high seven points in consecutive games near the end of the non-conference slate this season. The only time Balham has scored more than seven points (his totals against SCSU and UMES) in a game was a career-high 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting in a road victory over No. 22 Texas A&M last season.

MILLER READY TO ROLL

Cookie Miller was the only true freshman to play for the Huskers last year when he posted near-record numbers for assists (109) and steals (58). This year, he is trying to take it a step higher as one of the top returning point guards in the Big 12 Conference.

Miller was sixth in the league in assists (3.6 apg) last year and the only freshman in the top 10 for assist-to-turnover ratio (1.7). He was fourth in the Big 12 for steals (1.93), and led the league in Big 12-only contests (2.0 spg).

■ This season, Miller leads NU with 67 assists and leads the team with 24 steals. He is one of seven Huskers with at least 17 steals.

■ Miller has 34 turnovers to go with his 67 assists. After posting a season-high five miscues with one assist against Kansas State on Jan. 17, Miller rebounded to have his best game distributing the ball at Oklahoma. He had seven assists with just two turnovers against the No. 6/5 Sooners on the road.

■ Miller has had at least four assists in 11 contests this season, including five straight games to end non-conference play. Miller's season high is seven assists at No. 6/5 Oklahoma, and has had four assists on four occasions this year.

■ Miller was efficient in leading the Huskers to a win in the Big 12 opener against Missouri. He had three assists against two turnovers in 36 minutes, but helped NU continually break the Tigers' press. His defense also helped NU force MU into 16 turnovers with only 10 assists after the Tigers came into the game ranked third nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio. Miller also drew three charges, all in the first half, against MU.

■ Miller had one of his better offensive games of the season against Iowa State, posting 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting while adding four assists and three steals in 30 minutes.

■ He also had a solid game against Alabama State, scoring nine points with six assists and four rebounds in 25 minutes. It was the first game he started this season.

■ Miller came off the bench to efficiently guide the Husker offense in the second half of a comeback victory over Creighton. Miller had five assists and a steal in 15 minutes in the second half as Nebraska came back from 13 points down to earn the win. He finished with a season high in rebounds (4) while adding six assists and two steals in the win.

■ Miller also sparked a struggling Husker squad in the second half against IPFW. He came off the bench and posted six assists, including four in the second half, with four steals to lead the Huskers to a come-from-behind victory.

■ Former Husker great Cookie Belcher owns the Nebraska freshman record for steals with 87 and holds the NU and Big 12 Conference record with 353 steals in his career. Miller is trying to join Belcher and Erick Strickland as the only Huskers with 100 steals at the end of their sophomore seasons. Belcher had 162 in his first two years while Strickland had 107.

VELANDER REACHES TOP 10

Senior guard Paul Velandar is the second Husker this season to place his name on the top-10 list, following junior guard Ryan Anderson who needed just seven treys entering the year.

■ Velandar hit 1-of-2 from long range in the Big 12 opener against Missouri to match Ray Richardson's mark for 10th place. He now ranks ninth in Nebraska history with 116 treys. He moved past teammate Ryan Anderson as Velandar posted six 3-pointers against Kansas State on Jan. 17.

■ Velandar has hit at least three 3-pointers in 12 games this year, with a career-high six against Kansas State (6-of-10 overall).

■ Velandar's 50.0 percent accuracy from beyond the arc is currently best in the Big 12 Conference.

■ He leads the team with 48 3-pointers in 17 games, ranking 44th nationally in 3s per game entering the week. He entered the week ranked second nationally in 3-point percentage.

HITTING FROM LONG RANGE

At 6-4, guard Ryan Anderson may be a little undersized to play in the front court, but he is one of the biggest players on the court when he steps outside the 3-point line. Anderson has made a living with the long ball, hitting 112 treys in his career to rank 10th in NU history.

■ Despite being one of the best 3-point shooters in the league the past two years, Anderson has struggled this season. He has hit just 14-of-47 attempts (29.8 percent) after coming into the season hitting better than 39 percent in his career.

■ Anderson's best long-range game this year came with four 3-pointers at No. 6/5 Oklahoma, marking the 15th time in his career he has had at least three treys in a single game. He also had three treys earlier this season against Alabama State.

■ He went 3-of-3 from the field against Florida A&M but did not attempt a 3-pointer. It was the first time in 30 games, and only the fifth game in his career, that he did not attempt a 3-pointer.

VELANDER NAMED LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS CANDIDATE

In mid-December, Nebraska senior guard Paul Velandar was announced among 30 candidates for the 2008-09 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports.

Based on criteria including character, achievements in the classroom and community and competition on the court, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.

From each of the two lists of 30 nominees, a national media committee will select 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in February 2009. Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA, will present the winners with trophies during the weekends of the respective NCAA Men's and Women's Final Four.

Velandar is a two-year letterwinner under Coach Doc Sadler and is currently third on the Husker squad in scoring at 9.5 points per game. The Blacksburg, Va., native has averaged nearly three 3-pointers per game, as he paces the squad with 48 treys in 17 contests.

Velandar is a two-time first-team academic All-Big 12 performer in the classroom and has earned Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll accolades four times. Last season he was also named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court for his achievements in the classroom.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the CLASS Award was launched during the 2001-02 season to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who remain committed to their university and pursue the many rewards that a senior season and complete college education brings.

The list of 2008-09 basketball candidates includes a range of universities and conferences across the country. There are 30 male award candidates representing 27 schools and 14 conferences. The Big 12 Conference leads the way with five candidates. The women's award list includes 30 candidates from 18 conferences and the Big 12 Conference also landed the most candidates with five.

The Lowe's Senior CLASS Award is in its eighth year for men's and women's basketball. Previous winners of the men's award include Juan Dixon of Maryland (2002), David West of Xavier (2003), Jameer Nelson of St. Joseph's (2004), Wayne Simien of Kansas (2005), J.J. Reddick of Duke (2006), Alando Tucker of Wisconsin (2007) and Shan Foster of Vanderbilt (2008).

MCCRAY NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Nebraska redshirt freshman guard Toney McCray was named the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in a vote by league sportswriters on Monday, Nov. 17. McCray was honored alongside Oklahoma's Blake Griffin, who won the league's player-of-the-week award.

The 6-6, 205-pounder from Missouri City, Texas, was the Huskers' leading scorer and rebounder in both its exhibition win and the season-opening win over San Jose State. McCray, one of four Huskers who redshirted last year, quickly made his presence felt on the court as he posted a game-high 17 points against the Spartans. He also added a team-high nine rebounds, just missing out on becoming the first Husker since Aleks Maric to produce a double-double in his first career game. McCray added a steal and an assist in 23 minutes off the bench, helping the Huskers to a 43-16 advantage in bench scoring.

McCray is the second player in Coach Doc Sadler's three years to earn the league's rookie-of-the-week award. Last year, guard Ade Dagunduro won the award on Dec. 17 for his effort in helping the Huskers defeat nationally ranked Oregon. Overall, McCray is the eighth Husker to win the league award. Only two players, Joe McCray and Kimani Ffriend, have won the rookie-of-the-week award more than once for the Huskers as each earned it two times in their first season in Lincoln.

JONES OPTS FOR SURGERY

Coach Doc Sadler announced during his postgame press conference on Dec. 3, that Eshaunte 'Bear' Jones is done playing this year because of a foot injury.

"He's finished as far as playing for this year," Sadler said. "We wanted to try to get through the year because he's such a good offensive player and he has some size, but he's not going to be able to play anymore."

On the year, Jones played in four contests, averaging 1.8 points and 1.3 rebounds per game. He played 16 minutes in the season opener and then 12 minutes, 13 and 5 over the next three games before sitting out against Creighton and Alabama State. He had successful surgery on his foot on Dec. 18 and is expected to need a 3-4 month rehab.

CHAPMAN LEAVES NEBRASKA

Sophomore Alex Chapman transfer away from NU following the end of the fall semester. The forward from Canby, Ore., had not played in a game in his three semesters at Nebraska after suffering a knee injury that required surgery during the preseason each of the past two years.

Despite sitting out because of injury, Chapman was the Huskers' tallest eligible player this season. Freshman center Christopher Niemann, who stands 6-11, is ineligible to play this season because of an NCAA ruling.

■ Anderson is the only Husker ever to post at least 48 treys in each of his first two years at Nebraska.

■ Anderson ranks second on the NU freshman list with 48 3-pointers in 2006-07 and last year posted 50 treys to rank third on the Huskers' sophomore chart.

■ Only Nebraska's all-time 3-point leader, Cary Cochran, made more shots from outside the arc by the end of his sophomore season, as Cochran had 101 through two years.

ANDERSON, VELANDER AMONG HUSKERS' MOST ACCURATE DUOS

Senior guard Paul Velander has proven to be one of the most accurate long-range shooters in Nebraska history.

The only fifth-year player for the Huskers this season, Velander ranks third in NU history for 3-point field-goal percentage at 42.2 percent (116-of-275) while coming off the bench in 76-of-77 contests.

He leads the team with 48 3-pointers this season, including three or more 3s in each of 12 games this year. With Anderson and Velander, four of the players in the NU top 10 have played under Coach Doc Sadler.

MCCRAY LOOKING FOR MORE

Guard Toney McCray started the season out strong, scoring game highs with 17 points and nine rebounds in the season opener against San Jose State. McCray hit 6-of-15 shots from the floor in his career debut against the Spartans and just missed becoming the first Husker freshman to record a double-double in his first career game since Aleks Maric accomplished the feat in 2004-05.

After redshirting last year, he is showing the ability Coach Doc Sadler has seen in practice, which translated into three starts at the end of non-conference play.

■ McCray ranks fifth on the team with 6.8 points per game. He is tied for fourth on the team with 3.4 rebounds per game and leads the squad with 11 blocked shots.

■ McCray hit three 3-pointers against IPFW (3-of-5) after connecting on just 3-of-10 3-point attempts in his first eight games. Overall, he is 8-of-21 this season from long range.

■ McCray had nine points and five boards in the first road game of his career at TCU. He has shown he likes playing on the road as he added 13 points, seven rebounds and two steals at Oregon State.

■ In his first game in front of a big crowd, McCray settled in nicely, posting six points, five rebounds, three blocked shots and two steals in 23 minutes off the bench against Creighton.

■ In his first Big 12 Conference tilt, McCray posted five points with one rebound in five minutes. His 3-pointer late in the second half was a needed offensive spark as the Huskers held on for a victory over Missouri.

■ In Big 12 Conference play, McCray has hit 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the floor while averaging 5.0 points per game.

HUSKERS ROLL UP WINS AT HOME

When coach Doc Sadler took over the program before the 2006-07 season, Nebraska made winning at home a priority especially in the non-conference season.

When adding in the Huskers' home game against Oregon at the Qwest Center in Omaha (considered a home contest due to RPI standards by NCAA), the Huskers won 31 straight games against non-conference teams, including 26 straight under Sadler, to tie the school record with 31 consecutive non-conference home wins. The streak ranked eighth nationally until NU fell to UMBC on Dec. 23.

■ Following the win over Florida A&M to end the non-conference schedule, Nebraska is now 29-1 under Coach Doc Sadler at home against non-conference opponents.

■ Before falling to UMBC, Nebraska's last home loss to a non-conference team came on Dec. 3, 2005 against UAB in a 73-72 setback.

■ The Huskers are 42-2 since last suffering consecutive home non-conference losses in 2004-05.

■ During the school-record tying 31-game home non-conference win streak, NU had one game decided by five or fewer points (two-point win over Creighton this year) and one other decided in overtime (win over Oregon at Qwest Center).

■ Overall, the Huskers are 39-8 in all games (non-conference and Big 12) at the Devaney Center under Sadler.

COMEBACK KIDS

Nebraska not only picked up its second straight win in Lincoln over in-state foe Creighton on Nov. 29, but it also made for one of the more memorable comebacks by the Huskers since the formation of the Big 12 Conference.

Nebraska's come-from-behind victory was keyed by a strong second-half performance from Steve Harley and Cookie Miller. Harley finished with a game-high 18 points with three steals and had the key assist on Ade Dagunduro's game-winning basket with 2.7 seconds remaining. Miller posted six assists and two steals and got the Huskers' offense into high gear after trailing by 13 points at halftime.

■ The 13-point deficit the Huskers overcame matched the largest comeback under Coach Doc Sadler. It also tied for the second-largest comeback by Nebraska during the Big 12 era, matching the 13-point deficit NU overcame at Texas Tech during Sadler's first season on the sideline.

■ The largest deficit Nebraska has rebounded from to win since the formation of the Big 12 Conference was 20 points against Kansas State in the first year of the league (1996-97). KSU also had the biggest halftime lead that NU has overcome in the Big 12 era as the Wildcats led by 18 points at the break.

■ Nebraska nearly added another fantastic finish to the list as it rallied from a 16-point halftime deficit, and 20-point overall deficit in the first half, to have the final shot at the win against UMBC. The Huskers pulled within two in the final minute and had the ball with less than 8 seconds remaining but came up short, falling by two points, 66-64.

■ The near comeback against UMBC came just three days after the Huskers rallied from a five-point halftime deficit at home to pull away for a 75-48 victory over IPFW.

■ In an continuing theme, NU fell behind by 13 points at Iowa State before battling back to tie the game at 45-45 with under seven minutes to play. With 2:13 remaining, NU trailed by just two points, 55-53, but saw the Cyclones go on a 10-0 run to end the game.

FOUR HONORED BY NEBRASKA BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

On the weekend of Jan. 16-17, the Husker basketball program proudly inducted two new members into the Nebraska Basketball Hall of Fame when former coach Danny Nee and Husker standout Erick Strickland earned the prestigious honor. Nee and Strickland were joined in the celebration by Kent Pavelka, the Bud Cuca Special Merit Award winner, and Rex Ekwall, the Distinguished Hall of Fame Alumni Award winner.

Nee and Strickland joined elite company. Nee is the sixth head coach enshrined in the hall and first since 1996, while Strickland is only the second player inducted in the past five years.

Nee recorded more wins at Nebraska than any coach, accumulating 254 victories over 14 years. He led the Huskers to five NCAA Tournament and six NIT berths, as well as the 1994 Big Eight Tournament and the 1996 NIT titles. Nee led NU to a school-record 26 wins in 1991 and earned league coach-of-the-year accolades as the Huskers posted the school's highest-ever final ranking of No. 9 (AP) and 11 (UPI). He coached 10 of Nebraska's 25 1,000-point scorers and recruited and coached all three of NU's first-round selections in the NBA Draft (Rich King, 1991; Eric Piatkowski, 1994; Tyronn Lue, 1998), as well as 1999 Big 12 Player of the Year Venson Hamilton (second-round NBA pick).

Strickland was a key component of Husker squads that won 79 games between 1992-93 and 1995-96, with three seasons earning at least 20 wins. During his career, Strickland played in two NCAA Tournaments and two NITs, including helping Nebraska win five straight games in March to earn the 1996 NIT championship.

Strickland played in 127 games with 84 starts, while averaging 12.5 points per game for his career. A native of Bellevue, Neb., Strickland was the MVP of the 1996 NIT and earned Big Eight All-Defensive Team honors three times. A complete player, Strickland ranks third in Nebraska history in career games played, fourth in 3-pointers (179), third in 3-point attempts (512), fifth in assists (414) and second all-time at Nebraska in steals with 257.

Following his Husker career, Strickland earned a spot in the NBA as a free agent, playing more than 500 games over nine years in the league primarily with Dallas and Milwaukee.

Pavelka is the 19th person to earn the Special Merit Award and first since 2003. The award is given to someone who helps shape the Husker basketball program from a supporting role. Pavelka returned to the microphone as the Huskers' basketball voice in 2006-07, and now has more than 20 years under his belt calling Nebraska hoops.

Ekwall, a letterwinner for the Huskers from 1955 to 1957, still holds the Nebraska career record for rebounding average, as he pulled in 679 boards in 65 games for an average of 10.4 per game. More than 50 years after he last played, Ekwall is still 10th on the rebounds chart and 35th in scoring at Nebraska (880 points, 13.5 points per game).

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 1-10)

GAME 1 VS. SAN JOSE STATE (NU 63, SJSU 46)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers jumped out of the gate in fine fashion, using a 17-0 second-half run to keep San Jose State at bay in a 63-46 victory at the Devaney Center. The Huskers went into halftime with an 18-point lead but saw it nearly vanish as, at one point, NU went more than eight minutes without a field goal. SJSU cut the lead to five before redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson and senior Paul Velander turned it up a notch on defense and redshirt freshman Toney McCray led the Huskers on offense as they picked up their sixth straight season-opening victory. McCray paced the squad with 17 points and nine rebounds while Velander added nine points on three 3-pointers. Nebraska harassed the Spartans into 25 turnovers on the day while collecting 16 steals, the most under third-year coach Doc Sadler.

GAME 2 AT TCU (NU 62, TCU 50)

Playing in their first road game of the season, the Nebraska Huskers responded in strong fashion, holding off TCU for a 62-50 victory in Ft. Worth. The win snapped a streak of 12 straight losses in true road openers, and was only Nebraska's third win in the Big 12 era in the first game of the season away from Lincoln. Nebraska shot the ball well from 3-point range, hitting 5-of-10 from beyond the arc in the opening period while overcoming 15 first-half fouls. NU used a 9-0 run to burst out to a 37-24 lead at the break. The Huskers were up 16, 42-26, before the Horned Frogs mounted a comeback, pulling within seven, 46-39, before redshirt freshman Toney McCray drained a 3-pointer from the corner with the shot clock winding down to ignite the offense. Nebraska held TCU to just 10 field goals, including only three 3-pointers on 19 attempts, as the Horned Frogs shot just 27.0 percent from the floor. The 50 points were the fewest NU has allowed in a true road opener since 1977.

GAME 3 VS. ARKANSAS-PINE BLUFF (NU 67, UAPB 53)

Nebraska was sluggish to start but picked up the pace over the final minutes of the first half and held off a hard-nosed effort by Arkansas-Pine Bluff, 67-53, at the Devaney Center. The Huskers used a 17-3 run over the last 7:42 before halftime to go into the break up 32-24. Sek Henry scored 12 of his 14 points in the opening frame while Steve Harley led the Huskers with 18 points in the contest. Nebraska forced 23 turnovers and won despite losing the battle on the boards, 33-27. Along with Harley and Henry, Paul Velander added three 3-pointers for the third straight game and Brandon Richardson had the best of his young career, scoring nine points with two assists in 23 minutes. NU had 11 steals in the contest with Henry leading the way with four.

GAME 4 VS. SAINT LOUIS (NU 71, SLU 57)

Sek Henry and Ade Dagunduro jump-started the Husker offense and Nebraska executed the defensive game plan to near perfection, running away with a 71-57 victory over Saint Louis. Henry hit 7-of-8 attempts from the floor for a game-high 19 points, just one off his career high. He added four assists without a turnover, as Nebraska had just six turnovers as a team. Dagunduro added 14 points on 5-of-7 shooting, after entering the game with just 13 points in his first three games. He helped Nebraska hit 59.1 percent from the floor, including an impressive 65.0 percent in the second half. Saint Louis led 28-20 on the boards, but were held to just 41.7 percent shooting. NU kept the Billikens off the scoreboard for just over six minutes while powering to a 9-0 run. The surge extended the Husker lead to 16 points with just over three minutes to play, sealing the victory.

GAME 5 VS. CREIGHTON (NU 54, CU 52)

Steve Harley scored a game-high 18 points, but it was his lone assist that made the biggest difference as Harley set up Ade Dagunduro's game-winner in the final seconds of a tremendous comeback victory. Harley, who hit 8-of-16 shots from the floor and tied his career high with six rebounds, had the ball on a designed play for him in the final seconds. With the shot clock off, Harley drove the lane with less than seven seconds remaining. As he got into the lane, Creighton hedged to the middle and while in the air, Harley fed the ball to a wide-open Dagunduro, who had an uncontested layup with 2.7 seconds remaining to give NU the win. Nebraska hit just 30.4 percent from the floor in the first half and trailed by 13 points at the intermission. NU used a 27-7 surge, including a 13-0 run that included three 3-pointers, to move back ahead and hold on for its fifth straight victory to open the season. The 13-point comeback tied the largest for a Husker squad under Coach Doc Sadler, equaling the mark set in 2007 on the road against Texas Tech. Dagunduro finished with 11 points while Cookie Miller's strong second-half play helped him finish with six assists, four rebounds and two steals off the bench as Nebraska won for just the second time in the last 10 regular-season matchups between the in-state opponents.

GAME 6 VS. ALABAMA STATE (NU 80, ASU 51)

Nebraska had four players record three 3-pointers apiece as the Huskers hit 14 treys on the night while running past Alabama State, 80-51, to end a four-game home stand at the Devaney Center. Steve Harley led the way with 16 points including a trio of 3-pointers while Ryan Anderson added 11 points by hitting 3-of-4 from long range. Anderson, who moved into the career top 10 for 3-pointers made with the effort, added a game- and career-best seven assists without a turnover. Nebraska posted 23 assists on the night as it hit 51.7 percent from the floor, including a blistering 56.0 percent from beyond the arc. Sek Henry was a perfect 3-for-3 from long range while Paul Velander added his fifth game with three 3-pointers. The Huskers also held Alabama State to 51 points on 36.0 percent shooting, including a paltry 25.0 percent from long range.

GAME 7 AT NO. 19 ARIZONA STATE (ASU 64, NU 44)

No. 19 Arizona State used a pair of key runs and strong second-half play by All-America candidate James Harden to ease past Nebraska, 64-44, at Wells Fargo Arena in Tempe. The Sun Devils evened the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series with the Huskers at 1-1. NU defeated ASU, 62-47, last year in Lincoln. Nebraska came out strong and led by as many as five points as ASU had just one basket in the first 10 minutes of the game. The Sun Devils stormed back at the end of the period, using a 15-2 run to end the frame and go into the locker room with a 30-18 advantage. After the break, a key 8-0 surge spurred by Harden knocked back the charging Huskers. Harden finished with 20 points, nine rebounds and six assists. The Huskers struggled against the ASU zone, hitting just 28.9 percent from the field with only Steve Harley (11 points) reaching double figures.

GAME 8 AT OREGON STATE (OSU 64, NU 63)

Ade Dagunduro's arcing shot from the baseline hit off the back of the rim and bounced away at the buzzer as Oregon State held on for a 64-63 victory over the Huskers in Gill Coliseum as the Huskers dropped their second straight road game. The teams went back and forth all game, accumulating 11 ties and 20 lead changes before the Beavers got four free throws in the final 30 seconds from Daniel Deane to ice the game. Dagunduro put NU up 63-62 on a pair of free throws with 11 seconds remaining before Deane had the ball stripped, but Cookie Miller was called for the foul to put Deane at the line with 8.3 seconds left. Deane hit both and Miller's jumper at the other end missed and went out of bounds with 1.1 seconds remaining to set up Dagunduro's final attempt. Dagunduro led the Huskers with 16 points while Toney McCray came off the bench for 13 points, seven rebounds and two steals.

GAME 9 VS. IPFW (NU 75, IPFW 48)

Nebraska was sluggish in the first half and trailed by five, 34-29, at the intermission following a 16-4 run by IPFW to end the period. But the Huskers, led by Steve Harley and Cookie Miller, caught fire on offense in the second half and clamped down defensively while posting their 31st consecutive non-conference home win to tie the school record. Harley scored a career-high 21 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the floor, helping Nebraska hit at a scorching 60.9-percent clip from the field. He had 12 points at the half and became the first Husker this season to eclipse the 20-point plateau. Miller continually set up Harley and his teammates, finishing with six assists without a turnover. He had four steals and seven points off the bench, although he started the second half, and helped Nebraska to a 31-8 run to put the game away. Defensively, the Huskers held IPFW to just 14 points on 21.7 percent shooting in the second period while forcing 24 Mastodon turnovers.

GAME 10 VS. UMBC (UMBC 66, NU 64)

The Huskers' furious second-half rally came up just short as Nebraska fell at home to a non-conference opponent for the first time since 2005, falling 66-64 to UMBC. NU never led in the contest and trailed by as many as 20 points in the first period following a 13-0 run. UMBC led by 16 at the intermission before the Huskers started a comeback, cutting within two points in the final minute. Nebraska held the Retrievers without a field goal over the final 6:42 to get back into the contest, but UMBC hit 15-of-18 at the free throw line, including their last nine points, to record the upset. Ade Dagunduro led the comeback with 15 of his career-high 19 points in the second period. He finished the game 9-of-9 from the field, tying the NU single-game record for field goals without a miss. Dagunduro's basket with 30 seconds remaining cut the deficit to three points, and after the teams traded free throws, Paul Velander had a trey that would have tied the game rim out with 14 seconds left. NU added a free throw by Steve Harley to cut it to the final deficit but one last shot attempt with under a second was blocked out of bounds. Velander finished with 14 points including four 3-pointers while Harley had 13 points and Sek Henry added 12 points.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 11-17)
GAME 11 VS. SOUTH CAROLINA STATE (NU 77, SCSU 63)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers made their final appearance at the Bob Devaney Sports Center in 2008 a happy one as they used a strong second half to run past South Carolina State, 77-63. Sek Henry nearly tied his season high with 19 points while Ade Dagunduro scored 14 points and finished 5-of-8 from the field. Dagunduro set a school record as he knocked down his first three attempts from the floor, extending his consecutive field-goals made streak to 15 straight over three games. He surpassed the previous Nebraska record of 13 consecutive made field goals by Mikki Moore in the 1997 NIT. Dagunduro and Henry helped the Huskers to a 15-0 run in the second half, pushing a tie out to a 51-36 advantage. Henry was 7-of-9 at the free throw line, as the Huskers got to the stripe 35 times (22 made) while hitting 46.3 percent from the field in their second-highest scoring game before New Year's.

GAME 12 VS. MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE (NU 88, UMES 56)

Senior guard Ade Dagunduro continued his torrid shooting, hitting 8-of-9 shots from the floor to help Nebraska hit better than 60 percent from the field for the second time in four games as the Huskers ran to a 32-point victory. Dagunduro scored 18 points by hitting his first eight shots from the floor while Steve Harley added 12 points. Ten other Huskers also scored, as Nebraska posted its highest point total in regulation under Coach Doc Sadler. The Huskers' offensive efficiency came as NU tied the school record by turning the ball over only three times (once in the first half, twice after the intermission), while adding 18 assists on 33 baskets. Nebraska hit 28-of-39 from inside the 3-point line and limited the Hawks to 41.3 percent shooting, including just 32.0 percent in the second half. Dagunduro helped Nebraska to a 13-0 run late in the second half that pushed the lead out to 36 points.

GAME 13 VS. FLORIDA A&M (NU 81, FAMU 56)

Junior guard Sek Henry tied his season high with 19 points and the Cornhuskers hit better than 55 percent from the field for the second straight game as NU ran past Florida A&M 81-56. The Huskers topped the 80-point plateau for the third time this season and only the third time in the past three years NU has reached the mark in consecutive games. Henry got Nebraska out early as he hit 8-of-14 from the floor, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range, in just 24 minutes to pace the Huskers. He helped Nebraska hit 10 3-pointers, their second-highest total in non-conference play. Senior Steve Harley had 15 points and senior Paul Velandar came off the bench to hit four 3-pointers for 12 points. Chris Balham added a career-high tying eight rebounds, as Nebraska held a +14 advantage on the glass, its highest total in non-conference play this season. Despite hitting 37.7 percent from the field overall, FAMU kept it from being a bigger deficit by hitting 9-of-13 from 3-point range in the second period. The Rattlers hit 12-of-24 from long range on the game.

GAME 14 VS. MISSOURI (NU 56, MU 51)

Guards Ade Dagunduro and Sek Henry combined for 33 points and eight rebounds and the Huskers held off a furious second-half comeback to earn a 56-51 victory over Missouri at the Devaney Center. The win was Nebraska's fifth in the last six games against the Tigers under coach Doc Sadler while marking the Huskers' first win in a Big 12 opener since 2005-06. Overall, NU improved to 3-10 in league openers since the formation of the Big 12. Dagunduro got the Huskers started strong, pouring in 13 first-half points as Nebraska opened a 32-18 lead the intermission. NU went ahead by as many as 18 early in the second half before the Tigers started to rally. Leo Lyons and DeMarre Carroll, who came into the game combining for more than 31 points per game, were held scoreless in the first half but posted 19 points in the second frame. The inside punch helped the Tigers rally to tie the game at 51 with less than two minutes remaining, but MU never took the lead in the game as Henry's driving basket down the baseline put NU back on top for good. Ryan Anderson set a season high with 10 rebounds, including one with less than 10 seconds remaining and his three free throws in the final seconds iced the victory for Nebraska.

GAME 15 AT IOWA STATE (ISU 65, NU 53)

Nebraska fell behind by 12 points at halftime and despite a strong comeback that included tying the game at 45-45 with under seven minutes to play, the Huskers fell at Iowa State, 65-53, to drop to 1-1 in the Big 12 Conference. Ade Dagunduro led NU with 13 points, but his missed layup with less than six minutes to play was the last chance the Huskers had to take a lead as Iowa State capitalized on the offensive end over the final minutes of the contest. ISU hit four of its last five field-goal attempts and 3-of-4 free throws, all in the final three minutes, to pull away for the double-figure victory. Point guard Cookie Miller had a season-high 11 points and Steve Harley had 10 points despite going 4-of-14 from the floor. Nebraska led 13-12 on Miller's third basket of the opening half but ISU used a 15-1 run to break up the contest. The Cyclones led 32-20 at the break and held NU to 34.5 percent shooting in the game while outrebounding the Huskers 42-28.

GAME 16 VS. KANSAS STATE (NU 73, KSU 51)

Nebraska hit 50.0 percent from the floor behind the solid shooting of Paul Velandar and Cookie Miller, who combined for 35 points in the Huskers' 73-51 victory over Kansas State. The win against the Wildcats served as the largest margin of victory over a Big 12 opponent under coach Doc Sadler, and was the largest vs. a conference team since defeating No. 25 Texas Tech, 72-44, in 2004. Velandar tied his career high with 20 points, connecting on 6-of-10 shots from 3-point range while adding two steals in 25 minutes. Miller posted a season-high for the second straight game, earning 15 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including hitting all three of this 3-point attempts. They combined to help NU hit 10-of-18 from long range and 15-of-18 at the free throw line to offset KSU's 33-22 lead on the boards. KSU was held to 41.5 percent shooting, including 23.1 percent (3-of-13) from 3-point range. The Wildcats were forced into 25 turnovers, as the Huskers had nine steals and 15 assists, although they also turned the ball over 15 times.

GAME 17 AT NO. 6/5 OKLAHOMA (OU 72, NU 61)

Ryan Anderson scored 19 points, including 17 in the first half, to help Nebraska keep pace with the No. 6/5 Sooners, but in the end Oklahoma was too much for the Cornhuskers as it pulled away for a 72-61 victory in Norman. The game was still in doubt heading into the final minutes as the pesky Nebraska defense kept the Huskers within a basket until a decisive 8-0 Sooner run over the final four minutes gave OU its 18th win of the season. Anderson scored a season high with 19 points, after scoring just 11 points in the first three conference games combined. He hit four 3-pointers in the first half and helped Nebraska to a 38-32 lead at the intermission. Nebraska, which led by as many as seven points in the game, withstood an OU rally and had the score tied at 53-53 and had two possessions to try to take the lead. Anderson misfired on a 3-pointer on the first try and Steve Harley missed a pair of free throws before OU's Austin Johnson hit a 3-pointer to put the Sooners ahead for good. Blake Griffin, who did not score his first basket until nearly 12 minutes into the game, had 16 second-half points on his way to a 27-point, 18-rebound game. Despite Griffin's individual domination on the glass, OU outrebounded the Huskers by only three boards, 39-36.
