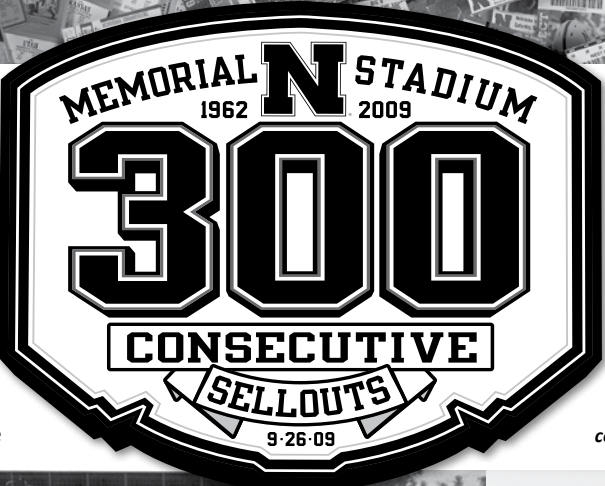




**NCAA RECORD
300 CONSECUTIVE
SELLOUTS**

Nebraska will celebrate an unprecedented show of fan dedication in 2009 when the sellout streak at Memorial Stadium reaches 300 games. A streak which began on Nov. 3, 1962 against Missouri will hit 300 games on Sept. 26 when the Cornhuskers take on Louisiana-Lafayette. During that streak Nebraska has captured five national championships and 22 conference



championships. Nebraska has dropped just 39 home games in the streak's 47 years and the memorable moments at Memorial Stadium in that streak are too many to count.

As part of the 300th straight sellout celebration against Louisiana-Lafayette on Sept. 26, the 2009 Huskers will wear uniforms designed by adidas to match those worn by Nebraska in 1962. The uniforms will be auctioned to the public as full sets, including pants, jersey and helmet, on Huskers.com throughout the fall. Replica jerseys and helmets will also be available for sale.

The throwback uniforms worn for the Sept. 26 matchup against Louisiana-Lafayette date back to the early to mid 1960s (right and above). That season also marked Bob Devaney's first year at Nebraska and the start of a stretch of 42 consecutive winning seasons for the Cornhuskers.
