### For Openers

> Missouri Basketball concludes a mini two-game home stand on Saturday as the Tigers face a hot Nebraska club that was won three consecutive games ... Nebraska earned a 56-51 win over Missouri in the Big 12 opener and over the last three seasons, five of the six games between the clubs have been decided by five points or less, including a pair of overtime games in Lincoln.

> Despite that season-opening loss, Missouri has won eight of its last nine Big 12 games and has done it in a variety of ways ... Missouri has earned "grind it out" wins against both Texas (69-65) and Kansas (62-60) and has topped 80 points in five other Big 12 victories.

> Missouri will try to pick up another quality win this afternoon to enhance its postseason resume ... The Tigers are 5-2 vs. the RPI Top 50 this year, including RPI Top 50 road wins at Oklahoma State and No. 16 Texas ... The club is also 3-0 vs. ranked teams this year, defeating No. 19 USC in Puerto Rico and No. 16 Kansas and No. 16 Texas.

> Missouri has won 16 consecutive home games dating back to a double-overtime win against Iowa State last season ... Those 16 straight home wins are a Mizzou Arena record and is the nation's seventh longest home court winning streak.

> Missouri has simply been dominant at home this season and is averaging an incredible 88.6 points per game at Mizzou Arena in running their home record to 15-0 in 2008-09 ... The Tigers boast a 26.7 ppg margin of victory at home this season, including a 45-point win over Colorado (eighth-largest margin of victory ever in a Big 12 Conference game), a 31-point win over Iowa State (77-46) and a 27-point win (93-66) over a California team now hovering near the Top 25.

> Missouri is off to an 8-2 start in Big 12 play, which is its best start EVER in Big 12 action ... In addition, Missouri now owns its 21st 20-win season in school history ... It's Missouri's first 20-win campaign since 2002-03 ... 20-win seasons are nothing new for Head Coach **Mike Anderson** however ... Anderson led UAB to four consecutive 20-win years.

> The Tigers rank among the nation's leaders in several statistical categories heading into Saturday's game ... Mizzou is No. 3 nationally in scoring at 83.3 ppg, No. 2 in assists per game at 19.3, No. 2 in steals per game at 10.8, No. 2 nationally in assist/turnover ratio at 1.5 and No. 2 in scoring margin at 17.7 ... Another fun stat: Missouri is No. 6 nationally with 63.3 FG attempts per game and the Tigers have already made 177 more FGs than their opponents through 25 games thanks to the nation's No. 2-ranked turnover margin (+6.9).

### Mizzou Quick-Hitters

> Missouri Basketball faces Nebraska this weekend before enjoying its "bye" week in Big 12 play ... After Saturday's game, the Tigers won't play again until next Saturday at Colorado.

> Missouri will look to rebound from its Big 12-opening loss in Lincoln and both the Tigers and Cornhuskers enter this weekend with a combined seven consecutive wins.

> Missouri's 8-2 start in Big 12 play is its best in school history ... The Tigers had previously started 7-2 in 1998-99 and 1999-2000 ... The last time Missouri started 8-2 or better in league play was the undefeated Big Eight Championship year of 1993-94.

> The Tigers are off to their best start overall (21-4) since that 1993-94 season as well ... A win on Monday would push Missouri's record to 22-4 and MU's current total of 21 wins is its winningest season under **Mike Anderson**.

> In fact, **Mike Anderson's** .632 winning percentage through three seasons (thus far) makes him the winningest coach in Missouri history during that "first three year stretch" ... **Quin Snyder** is second with a .620 winning clip through his first-three years.

> The Tigers return to Mizzou Arena looking for their 17th consecutive home court win, which dates back to last season ... During that home court winning streak, Mizzou is outscoring its foes by an average margin of 26.7 points per game (88.6-to-61.9).

> The Tigers have been especially dominating at home in Big 12 play thus far ... Mizzou is 5-0 in league play at home and average a 21.2 ppg margin of victory, with 4-of-5 of its wins coming by double figures.

> The five Big 12 home wins is the most at Mizzou since the 2004-05 season.

> A huge factor in those wins was defense and this season Missouri has 269 steals through 25 games ... Last season the Tigers had 259 steals in 32 games ... Missouri needs just six

steals to move into the all-time Top 5 in school history and needs 34 more to break the school record.

> As you can tell, the Tigers have been a much-improved offensive team at home this year ... In running their record to 15-0 (this season), the Tigers are averaging 88.6 points and shooting 49.4 percent from the floor and 38.2 percent from three-point range.

> A huge key for the Tigers continues to be the play of their bench ... On the season, Missouri's reserves are averaging 29.9 points per game.

> The catalyst for Missouri's improved scoring punch off the pine is its five player freshman class ... So far this season that group is averaging 23.7 points.

> With those great bench-scoring totals, the Tigers have had a school-record 11 different players reach double figures this season, surpassing the 10 players that reached double figures in 1961-62, 1974-75, 1994-95 and

2007-08.

> It's not just scoring where the Tigers are balanced ... Missouri has 10 different players averaging nearly 10 minutes a game on the year, including five newcomers.

> Sticking with the balance theme, Missouri has had a school-record tying 10 different players dish out at least 20 assists this season ... The 1987-88 Tigers also had 10 players with 20 dimes on the year, which is truly an incredible stat ... Last year's Tiger team, which was one of the most "unselfish" in school history, had eight players accomplish that feat.

> Missouri has had four or more players reach double figures in the same game 10 times already this season and have had six players do it three in the same game, including twice in Big 12 play vs. Colorado and Oklahoma State.

> A major reason for Mizzou's large scoring totals is because the club has taken 175 more field goal attempts than its opponents this season and has made 177 more FG's ... Mizzou made 119 more FG's than its opponents throughout the entire 2007-08 season, so 177 more FGs through just 24 games is a HUGE differential.

> With that scoring surge, Missouri has topped the 80-point plateau 16 times in 25 games this season and is 16-0 on the year when scoring at least 80 points ... Missouri has topped 80 points 40 times in the Mike Anderson era (86 games) ... To put that scoring in perspective, the Tigers topped 80 points just 37 times (in total 160 games) the five seasons before his arrival.

> One thing Tiger fans are enjoying this season is points off turnovers ... Missouri is forcing 19.5

turnovers per game and is averaging 22.7 points off those opponent miscues each night.

> Missouri is scoring an impressive 30 percent of its points this season off turnovers (22.7-of-83.3).

> Another impressive stat regarding Missouri's defense is that the Tigers force a turnover on 27 percent of their defensive possessions ... That means opponents are turning it over a little more than once every four possessions vs. the *Fastest 40 Minutes in Basketball*.

> It's only February, but ESPN Bracketology guru **Joe Lunardi** has Missouri "in" the NCAA Tournament as a No. 5 seed ... Lunardi has the Tigers facing No. 12-seeded BYU in Portland.

> Although the 2008-09 campaign is just getting started, Mizzou actually got an early jump on exhibition play over Labor Day weekend with a three-game exhibition tour in Niagara Falls, Ontario ... Missouri went 3-0 throughout the tour and averaged a 35.3 ppg. margin of victory.

**Tiger Tidbits (Individual Notes)**

> Senior forwards **DeMarre Carroll** and **Leo Lyons** were named Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention picks prior to the start of the 2008-09 season.

> Carroll is the only player in the Big 12 to rank among the Top 10 in scoring, rebounding, field goal percentage and steals and he was named a Mid-Season First Team All-Big 12 pick by ESPN's Fran Fraschilla.

> In league play Carroll is all the way up to third in scoring average at 18.5 points per game, thanks to a career high 31 tallies at Iowa State on Feb. 7 and a 22.3 ppg scoring average over his last

> The 31 points were the most on the road in a Big 12 game for a Tiger since **Clarence Gilbert** poured in 40 at Colorado in 2002.

> Carroll also joined **Leo Lyons** as 30-point scorers this season ... The last Tiger teammates to drop 30 in the same season were **Arthur Johnson** and **Rickey Paulding** in 2003-04.

> The last time Missouri had two forwards score 30+ points in the same season was 1984-85 when **Derrick Chievous** scored 32 vs. Arizona in Hawaii and **Malcolm Thomas** dropped in 33 vs. Oklahoma at home.

> Carroll narrowly missed yet another double-double in Ames with nine points, five assists and two blocks in 31 minutes for an outstanding all-around contest.

> The forward has topped 20 points in four of his last six outings, including 24.7 ppg in his last three home games.

> Carroll topped the 1,000-point plateau vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff and now has 1,313 career tallies at the Division I level, 460 of which came during his first two seasons at Vanderbilt ... Lyons has 1,041 career points and became the 38th member of Missouri's 1,000-point club following his career high 30-point night vs. Baylor.

> Carroll has reached double figures in 22-of-25 games this season and either Carroll or Lyons have led Mizzou in scoring 19 times this year.

> Carroll has three double-doubles on the year following his 13-point, 11-rebound effort vs. Colorado.

> Carroll has nine other games this season with either eight or nine rebounds, so he's narrowly missed on a number of other double-doubles opportunities.

> Carroll has been especially active on the boards in Big 12 play, where he is averaging 7.7 rebounds a contest.

> The Junk Yard Dog also leads all Big 12 forwards with 42 steals thanks to a career high five thefts vs. Coppin State ... Carroll also ranks among the Big 12's leaders in scoring (5th), steals (7th), field goal percentage (3rd) and rebounding (8th).

> Over his last 25 regular-season games **Leo Lyons** has seven 20-point outings and has reached double figures in 25-of-27 contests.

> Lyons has actually reached double figures in 13 consecutive Big 12 regular-season games, which is the longest run of his career.

> The Kansas City, Kan., native enjoyed a memorable night vs. Baylor, as he hit 8-of-11 field goals and 14-of-15 free throws en route to a career high 30 points.

> Lyons became the first Tiger to top 30 points since former teammate **Thomas Gardner** dropped in 40 against Kansas in 2005-06 on ESPN Big Monday.

> **Matt Lawrence** is starting to heat up from the perimeter and has hit multiple three-pointers in 12 of his last 20 outings.

> In fact, over his last 12 games Lawrence is shooting 48.4 percent from bonus distance, hitting 31-of-64 treys.

> The news gets even better for Lawrence at

home, where he is shooting nearly 48 percent (19-of-40) over his last eight home contests.

> Lawrence has also been shooting it well away from home recently, as the 6-foot-7 sniper is 14-of-24 (.583) from bonus distance in his last three road games at Oklahoma State, Kansas State and Texas.

> The St. Louis native is already No. 3 in career three-point makes at MU with 215.

> Despite being a prolific shooter, Lawrence has 24 steals, 24 assists and just eight turnovers on the season.

> **Zaire Taylor** is Mr. Clutch for the Tigers, with game-winners at No. 16 Texas on Feb. 4 and the game-winner vs. No. 16 Kansas on Feb. 9.

> Taylor hit a driving lay-up at UT and was fouled with 5.5 seconds left and his 10-foot jumper with 1.3 seconds left lifted MU to a 62-60 win over Kansas and was the No. 1 play on ESPN's Top 10 Plays of the Day.

> Taylor was named the nation's Preseason No. 2 impact transfer in all of college basketball by Rivals.com ... **DeMarre Carroll** was the preseason No. 1 on that same Rivals.com list last season and didn't disappoint by winning Big 12 Newcomer of the Year honors.

> So far this season the Staten Island, N.Y., native has 87 assists and just 32 turnovers ... His 2.7-to-1 assist/turnover ratio ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 and No. 14 nationally.

> Since Big 12 play began, Taylor has dished 40 dimes and has just 15 turnovers (2.7-to-1).

> Despite being an active point guard, Taylor has a positive assist/turnover ratio in 22-of-25 games this year and has 5+ assists 10 times on the season, including a season high seven assists at Kansas State.

> Taylor enjoyed a season-high tying 17 points in that win at No. 16 Texas ... The Staten Island, N.Y. product also scored 17 points in the win at Georgia and helped lead Mizzou to the home win over Iowa State by scoring 15 points and grabbing five boards.

> He continued his offensive exploits with 10 points at Oklahoma State in a win.

> Junior guard **J.T. Tiller** is a strong candidate for the Big 12's Defensive Player of the Year and was named to **Fran Fraschilla's** Big 12 All-Defensive Team.

> Tiller is relentless on defense and turned in one of the great defensive efforts this season vs. Baylor, when he helped hold **Curtis Jerrells** to a then-season low five points and nine turnovers ... Jerrells entered the game leading the Bears in scoring at 17.4 ppg ... He also helped hold Texas All-American candidate **A.J. Abrams** to just 11 points and held Kansas' **Sherron Collins** to just nine points and six turnovers, nine points below his season average (18.0 ppg).

> Over his last four games Tiller has 23 assists and three turnovers.

> Tiller is one of Mizzou's most well-rounded players and recorded a then-career high six steals vs. Xavier ... The six thefts tied a tournament record and is No. 7 in Missouri single-game school history.

> Tiller later moved to No. 2 on that list with seven steals vs. Texas Tech, which equals **Rickey**

**Paulding** for the most ever by a Tiger in a Big 12 game.

> Tiller has had multiple steals in 14-of-25 games and is third in the Big 12 with 2.0 steals a night.

> Of Tiller's 20 career double-figure scoring games, 11 have come either on the road or on a neutral-court site, including 4-of-6 road games this season, counting a season high 15 points and seven rebounds at Oklahoma State and 10 points and five assists at Texas.

> Missouri Basketball is coming off a busy, but productive summer that saw all-13 Tigers remain on campus for workouts and classes ... Some members of the squad also had internships in town, including Tiller, who spent the summer as an intern at AFLAC.

> Perhaps the biggest improvement for Missouri this year is the play of its bench and that bench is being led by a host of young players.

> Sophomore forward **Justin Safford** scored a career high 13 points in the win over Colorado and has reached double figures twice this season.

> Freshman guard **Marcus Denmon** opened his Missouri career with 15 points on 5-of-8 shooting in the Tiger win over Prairie View A&M on Nov. 15 ... That was the highest scoring effort by a Tiger freshman in a debut since **Kelly Thames** scored 19 against Central Missouri State on Nov. 27, 1993.

> His 16 points vs. Iowa State was a career high for the KC native and he followed that up with 14 tallies in the win over Texas Tech, 11 of which came in the final 20 minutes.

> English has now reached double figures three times in Big 12 play, including those 16 tallies at Iowa State where he tossed in 4-of-5 treys, while adding four assists.

> In fact, English's hot streak started weeks ago ... Over his last 19 games the Baltimore native is 28-of-63 (.445) from bonus distance.

> Junior **Keith Ramsey** has played improved basketball over the past few weeks, especially on the defensive end en route to earning five starts in league play.

> The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native has blocked at least one shot in 13 of his last 17 games and has 14 blocks in his last 12 contests overall.

> Ramsey scored 10 points vs. Iowa State, which included 2-of-2 shooting from three-point range, before registering a career high 12 tallies at Oklahoma State.

> For his efforts against Oklahoma State and Texas Tech, Ramsey was named the Big 12's Newcomer of the Week on Jan. 26.

> Ramsey ignited Missouri's road win at Georgia, with a pair of blocked shots, two assists, two steals and four points.

> Bowers leads Missouri in dunks this season (7), including a pair of alley-oop slams vs. Coppin State ... **Bowers' second dunk was listed #1 on ESPN's Top 10 Plays of the Day on Jan. 6** ... We recommend you check it out ... Note that Bowers is right-handed, but caught the pass with his left hand and then flushed it all in the same motion.

### About The Nebraska Cornhuskers

Nebraska (15-7, 5-4 Big 12) has won three consecutive Big 12 games heading into Saturday and looks for its third consecutive win at Mizzou Arena ... The Cornhuskers own the Big 12's top scoring defense, holding foes to 62.2 points in league games and have won back-to-back road games in the Big 12 conference vs. Texas Tech and Colorado ... Nebraska is led in scoring by senior transfers **Ade Dagunduro** (11.8) and **Steve Harley** (11.5) ... Dagunduro has seen his scoring average

increase to 14.2 points in Big 12 play, while his 4.7 rebounds a game ranks second on the team ... **Cookie Miller** paces NU with 83 assists and Nebraska's outstanding defensive group forces 17.9 turnovers a night.

### Tiller, Carroll Earn Early Fraschilla Awards

**J.T. Tiller** and **DeMarre Carroll** received some nice mid-season props from ESPN's **Fran Fraschilla** this week, as Tiller was named to his Big 12 All-Defensive Team and Carroll was named an All-Big 12 First Team pick.

> Carroll has been dominating in Big 12 action, leading the Tigers with 18.5 points and 7.7 rebounds through 10 league games ... The forward scored a career high 31 points at Iowa State and has scored 22 point or more in four of his last six outings.

> Tiller has been a devastating defender all year and has held Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, Texas' **A.J. Abrams** and Baylor's **Curtis Jerrells** a combined 27.3 points below their scoring average in three games.

### Mizzou's J.Y.D Ruling The Lane

He plays the game with such passion and ferocity that Missouri senior forward **DeMarre Carroll** has earned the moniker *Junk Yard Dog* ... Considered by some to be undersized in the rough-and-tumble Big 12, Carroll has starred in the league due to his blue-collar style of play and was **named to Fran Fraschilla's Mid-Season All-Big 12 First Team** after averaging 17.4 points and 7.0 rebounds.

> The Birmingham, Ala., native has reached double figures in 22-of-25 games this season, including a career high 31 points in a key Big 12 road win at Iowa State, 29 points and 11 rebounds vs. No. 19 USC, 27 points in a win over Texas Tech and 25 in the win against Baylor.

> J.Y.D. also ranks ninth in the Big 12 with three double-doubles, including a 13-point, 11-rebound effort vs. Colorado.

> Carroll is also one of the Big 12's most well-rounded players, ranking No. 5 in scoring, No. 8 in rebounding, No. 3 in field goal percentage (.582), No. 7 in steals (1.7) and No. 6 in offensive rebounding (2.6) ... **Carroll is the only player in the Big 12 to rank among the Top 10 in scoring, boards and steals in the Big 12.**

**Tiller Earning Mentions As Big 12's Defensive Player of the Year**

There are a number of great defensive players in the Big 12 this season and Missouri will face one of the best defensive teams, the Nebraska Cornhuskers, on Saturday, but junior guard **J.T. Tiller** has earned national mention as the Big 12's top defender following some outstanding defensive efforts against some of the league's top perimeter players.

> Statistically, Tiller ranks third in the Big 12 with 2.0 steals per game, but also averages close to five deflections a night thanks to his relentless ball pressure ... He has also shut down some outstanding offensive talents:

**Curtis Jerrells, Baylor 17.4 PPG**

5 pts, 9 turnovers, 2-10 FGs

**A.J. Abrams, Texas 16.9 PPG**

11 pts, 4-9 FGs

**Sherron Collins, Kansas 18.0 PPG**

9 pts, 6 turnovers, 4-13 FGs

**20-Something Tigers**

Missouri returned to the 20-win category thanks to its 82-68 win at Iowa State ... Missouri now has 21, 20-win seasons in school history and this 21-4 start makes it MU's first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season.

> The 20 wins mark the fifth 20-win campaign for Head Coach **Mike Anderson** ... Anderson led UAB to four consecutive 20-win seasons at the start of his head coaching career before coming to Mizzou.

**Stealing Away The Wins**

Missouri is forcing an incredible 19.8 turnovers per game over its last nine outings (8-1) and is logging 10.4 steals a night ... The Tigers forced a season high 29 turnovers in the win against Texas Tech and produced a season-best 20 steals en route to the 97-86 win ... The 20 steals were the second most in school history and **J.T. Tiller's** seven steals vs. the Red Raiders were the second highest single-game total in school annals.

> Missouri also forced 27 turnovers against No. 16 Kansas and needed each one of those to grind out a hard-fought 62-60 win vs. the Jayhawks.

> The Tigers recorded 13 steals in the Kansas win, after enjoyed 20 thefts against Texas Tech and 12 s. both Colorado and Oklahoma State.

**Lyons Enters February Like a Lion**

**Leo Lyons** returned to the starting lineup in Missouri's 89-72 win against Baylor and scored a career high 30 points thanks to a 14-of-15 shooting night at the foul line and 8-of-11 shooting from the floor.

> Although he has reached double figures in his nine Big 12 games this season, Lyons had yet to score more than 13 points in a game in league play, so his 30-point outburst was a welcomed sign as Mizzou earned the huge win in front of a sold out arena.

**Trey-Mendous Defense**

Missouri is the Big 12's top club with regards to defending the arc this season and the Tigers have put forth some stellar defensive efforts against some of the nation's best three-point shooting clubs in 2008-09.

> So far this season teams are shooting just 30.3 percent from bonus distance against Mizzou and that includes games against California (No. 1 - 47.6%), Oklahoma State (No. 2 - 41.7%) and Baylor (No. 15 - 38.9%).

> The nation's top three-point shooting club, Cal, hit just six treys vs. the Tigers in Mizzou's 27-point win, while Oklahoma State hit just 8-of-24 treys (.333) in the MU road win in Stillwater ... The Tigers held Baylor's potent three-point attack to just 6-of-23 shooting (.261), including just 2-of-15 shooting in the final 20 minutes to earn the 17-point triumph ... Most recently Missouri held Kansas to just 2-of-15 shooting from bonus distance (13.3%).

**No Fear Zaire**

He's the Elmer's Glue of Mizzou Basketball with his steady assist, rebound and steal numbers, not to mention his defensive prowess, but in key wins at Georgia, Oklahoma State and No. 16 Texas, **Zaire Taylor** has flexed some offensive muscle, reaching double figures in three of four Tiger road wins, including season-high tying 17 tallies vs. the Bulldogs and Longhorns.

> Taylor also scored 10 points at Okie State, but his 17 points and game-winning "and-1" layup vs. the Longhorns propelled MU to the upset win and prompted Taylor to be named national Player of the Day by Fox Sports' **Jeff Goodman**.

> Taylor is quickly becoming Missouri's "Giant Killer", as he followed his game-winning bucket at No. 16 Texas, with a game-winner against No. 16 Kansas on ESPN Big Monday ... Taylor rimmed home a jumper with 1.3 seconds left to lift MU to a thrilling 62-60 win over the Jayhawks.

**Tigers Boast Home Winning Streak**

Missouri has won a Mizzou Arena-record 16 consecutive home games dating back to the 2007-08 regular-season finale vs. Iowa State ... The 16 wins are the seventh longest streak in school history ... Details of Missouri's home winning streaks can be found on page 113 of the 2008-09 Media Guide.

> Rookie forward **Laurence Bowers** led Missouri with 16 points vs. Colorado and **Marcus Denmon** poured in a career high 16 tallies vs. Iowa State.

> It's been nearly 30 years since the Tigers were led in scoring by freshmen in back-to-back league games ... **Steve Stipanovich** scored 20 points in a win over Oklahoma, while **Jon Sundvold** followed with 17 points in a win at Kansas State.

> Recently, fellow freshman **Kim English** tied a career high with 16 points on 4-of-5 three-point shooting in the 82-68 win at Iowa State, while also contributing four assists and five boards.

**English, Denmon Ripping It From Bonus**

Freshmen guards **Kim English** and **Marcus Denmon** have given the Tigers adding scoring this season and both English and Denmon are making big impacts from beyond the three-point arc in their rookie campaigns ... In fact, both English and Denmon rank among Missouri's all-time freshmen three-point shooters, with English ranking seven and Denmon checking in at No. eight.

**Mizzou Arena - House of Horrors**

Mizzou Arena has been a house of horrors for opponents this season as the Tigers have run their record to 15-0 and average 26.7 ppg margin of victory.

> The Tigers have won 13-of-15 games by double figure margins, 10-of-13 by 20+ points and have three wins by 45 points or more.

> The Tigers also have a huge quality win at home this year, stopping California by 27 (93-66) back on Dec. 7 and recently dropped Baylor by 17 (89-72).

**Balance Is Leading Tigers To Huge Scores**

Missouri has had six players reach double figures in a game **three times** this season, a feat that hasn't been accomplished three times in the same year since 1988-89.

> DeMarre Carroll (21), Miguel Paul (12), Marcus Denmon (11), Leo Lyons (11), Laurence Bowers (10) and Kim English (10) accomplished the feat vs. SIU Edwardsville.

> Bowers (16), Carroll (13), Justin Safford (13), Denmon (13), J.T. Tiller (13), and English (12) also did it vs. Colorado.

> Missouri most recently accomplished the feat at Oklahoma State with Carroll (19), Lawrence (19), Tiller (15), Ramsey (12), Lyons (10) and Taylor (10) all reaching double figures.

> In fact, Missouri leads the Big 12 Conference and has a school record with 11 different players having reached double figures in at least two game this season.

**High Scoring Tigers**

The 2008-09 Tigers are the highest scoring squad at Mizzou in 20 years ... Missouri's 83.3 ppg average is the highest since the 1988-89 squad registered 86.8 points per game en route to a 29-8 mark.

> This season's club has topped the 80-point plateau in 16-of-25 games and has reached the century mark three times, including 107 points vs. Colorado, which is the most for Missouri in a Big 12 regulation game (no overtimes).

> Mizzou also topped 90 points in back-to-back Big 12 games for the first time since 1989-90, which the club actually did it three times in a row in two wins against Colorado and a win at Iowa State.

**Quick Starts For Mizzou**

Missouri is off to its fastest start this century, as the Tigers look to improve to 22-4 on Saturday against Nebraska ... This current 21-4 start is Missouri's best since the 1993-94 campaign.

**The Good Tigers Giveth ...**

As a basketball team, Missouri is about as unselfish as it comes ... The Tigers are averaging an impressive 19.3 assists per game, **which is No. 2 nationally** and have a 1.5-to-1

assist/turnover ratio as a team, which also ranks No. 2 in America ... Missouri is logging assists on 63 percent of its buckets in 2008-09 and 10 players have a positive or even assist-to-turnover ratio so far this year ... In fact, Missouri has tied a school record by having 10 players record at least 20 assists this season with **Laurence Bowers** being the potential record-breaker with nine assists so far this season in just 8.3 minutes a game.

#### ... And Taketh Away

Missouri has no issues creating turnovers once again this season as they produce 19.5 turnovers a night and average 10.8 steals (No. 2 nationally) ... Missouri is averaging 22.7 points a game off turnovers and scores nearly 30.0 percent of its points off opposition throw-aways.

#### If You Build It ... They Will Come

Attendance has been a hot-button issue across the country, but Missouri is on the upward trend in **Mike Anderson's** third season ... With great attendances being enjoyed throughout Big 12 play, Missouri is already averaging 1,043 more fans per game in 2008-09 than the Tigers did at this same point in the schedule last season.

> It's important to note that Missouri uses actual attendance figures, not tickets sold and last Saturday's game vs. Baylor was the first sellout of the year.

> In fact, if you look at non-conference play alone, Missouri averaged 1,119 more fans per game in preseason play this season than they did one year ago, the highest figure since 2004-05.

#### L-Bow Ready To Go

His alley-oop vs. Coppin State was the No. 1 play on ESPN's Top 10 Plays of the Day and he leads the Tigers in dunks (7) despite averaging just 9.1 minutes a game, but Tiger fans have been watching the steady growth of freshman forward **Laurence Bowers** and it reached new heights following a 16-point outburst vs. Colorado.

> Bowers played a career high 19 minutes vs. the Buffaloes and hit 7-of-8 shots from the floor, while dishing two assists, blocking a shot and recording two steals.

> The athletic freshman also came up huge for the Tigers in the win at Oklahoma State, as he scored four points, grabbed three rebounds, blocked a shot and came away with a steal in nine minutes of action.

#### Lawrence Heating Up

Senior guard **Matt Lawrence** is starting to heat up for the Tigers and has seen his shooting percentages increase over the last 13 games, which includes 11 wins during that stretch ... Lawrence twice scored 18 points during the run, before recording a season high 19 tallies in the win at Oklahoma State and 17 more at Kansas State ... Lawrence is shooting 47.0 percent (31-of-66) from beyond the arc during that stretch.

> Lawrence has also been a much-improved

passer and defender this season and has 15 assists and 13 steals compared to just five turnovers during that 13-game run, thanks to his improved driving ability and added strength.

> For his career, the former walk-on is already No. 3 at Missouri in career three-point field goals with 215, despite making just nine triples his entire freshman season ... Lawrence needs just 12 treys to pass **Kareem Rush** for No. 2 all-time.

#### Missouri's Second Wave...

Head Coach **Mike Anderson** has consistently tried to build depth with his basketball teams and the 2008-09 Tigers may be his deepest club since arriving in Columbia two years ago.

> Missouri is averaging an impressive 30.0 points, 16.9 rebounds, 7.2 assists and 3.9 steals from its reserves this season, including 22.2 points per game from freshmen **Laurence Bowers, Marcus Denmon, Kim English** and **Miguel Paul**.

> Missouri's bench has been especially deadly of late **and actually outscored Stetson (45-44) and SIU Edwardsville (62-57) and tied Colorado (62-62)** ... The 62 points vs. Colorado and Edwardsville tied the school record, topping the 58 points the MU reserves scored in a double-overtime win vs. Iowa State last season.

> Last season Missouri averaged 25.4 points per game from its bench after setting the school record in 2006-07 with 26.4 ppg from reserve performers ... That mark is in serious jeopardy this season.

#### Wear & Tear Of The Fastest 40 Minutes

While Missouri leads the Big 12 and **ranked No. 2 nationally** with a +17.0 ppg scoring margin, the Tigers are doing extraordinary work extending their advantages in the second half this season ... With the Fastest 40 Minutes in Basketball taking full effect, Missouri is outscoring its opposition 45.2-to-34.9 in the second period alone and is allowing its opponents to shoot just 40.2 percent from the floor, 26.7 percent from the three-point stripe and yes, just 66.4 percent from the foul line ... In the first half of games Missouri owns a 38.2-to-31.4 ppg scoring margin, but opponents are shooting an improved 42.6 percent from the floor, 33.6 percent from three-point range.

It's a case of basketball imitating life and **J.T. Tiller** has carried his busy professional / student lifestyle onto the hardwood ... An outstanding student with an interest in International Business, Tiller spent his entire summer in Columbia, not only taking classes and working out, but also interning at AFLAC ... Tiller's play on the basketball court mimic's his busy lifestyle ... **He's probably the Big 12's best defender** and took his defensive prowess on a national stage in Puerto Rico, tying a Puerto Rico Tip-Off record with six steals against Xavier.

> The six thefts broke a then-career high for the Marietta, Ga., native, while his five assists and zero turnovers showcased his ability to run the point for MU.

> Tiller later recorded a career high seven steals in the win over Texas Tech, which was the second most in school history and tied former Tiger **Rickey Paulding** for the most by a Mizzou player in a Big 12 game, before turning in an impressive all-around efforts against Baylor, with 10 points, eight assists, seven boards and two steals vs. the Bears, while holding Baylor's sharp-shooting **Curtis Jerrells** to a season low five points and nine turnovers... He also held Kansas' Sherron Collins to 4-of-13 shooting for nine points and six turnovers.

> The former Georgia All-State triple jumper has shown he much more than a defensive stalwart as well, as he is averaging 9.1 points over his last 12 games, including double-figure scoring games in four of his last six road contests.

> While basketball is a main focus for Tiller, the 6-foot-3 guard plans on making his post-collegiate fortunes overseas ... not playing basketball mind you, but using that International Business degree.

**Taylor Worth The Wait For Mizzou**

It's been a long road for Missouri junior guard **Zaire Taylor**, but the Staten Island, N.Y., native is playing his first Division I basketball in nearly two years this season for the Tigers.

> Taylor began his career at Delaware in 2005-06 and led the CAA in steals as a freshman, earning All-Rookie Team honors ... After a coaching change in 2006-07, Taylor played just 13 games for the Blue Hens, before deciding to focus on his academics during the second semester, culminating with his eventual transfer to Mizzou in 2007.

> Taylor has been outstanding at the point for Missouri this season and has 84 assists compared to just 31 turnovers this season ... His 2.7-to-1 assist/turnover ratio ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 and No. 13 nationally.

... The Tigers went 3-0 vs. three Canadian clubs and averaged 115.3 points in those three wins.

> Mizzou outscored its opponents by 35.3 points per game over the three contests, with the largest margin of victory being a 49 romp (117-68) over Brock University, the 2008 Canadian National Champions ... Additionally, the Tigers never trailed at the end of the quarter in any game they played.

**Missouri played very balanced minutes in Canada and here is the breakdown of scoring over the three games:**

- 37.9 percent of its scoring from seniors
- 21.9 percent of its scoring from juniors
- 6.9 percent of its scoring from sophomores
- 32.7 percent of its scoring from freshmen
  
- 54.3 percent of its scoring from returners
- 45.7 percent of its scoring from newcomers

**Family Affair**

Mizzou Basketball is a family affair ... Head Coach **Mike Anderson** has three relatives on this season's squad ... His son, **Michael Anderson, Jr.**, is a senior for Missouri after transferring from the University of Alabama at Birmingham, while his nephew, **DeMarre Carroll**, enters his final season and is a Preseason All-Big 12 pick at forward ... Another of Anderson's nephews, **T.J. Cleveland**, is an assistant coach for the Tigers and spent his playing days under Anderson and **Nolan Richardson** at the University of Arkansas.

**Anderson = Championship Basketball**

The Tiger Slam is a term typically used in PGA Tour Golf when referring to Tiger Woods' run of four consecutive majors throughout the 2000 and 2001 seasons, but Missouri's sideline boss, Head Coach **Mike Anderson**, has achieved a Grand Slam of success of his own ... As a player, Anderson helped guide **Nolan Richardson** and the Tulsa Golden Hurricane to the 1981 NIT Title thanks to an 86-84 win over and Syracuse ... Anderson then continued his success in the coaching profession, helping Arkansas achieve (12) 20-win seasons, four 30-win campaigns, three Final Fours and the 1994 National Championship ... As a head coach, Anderson earned a conference title with UAB in 2004 and led the Blazers to the Sweet 16.

**The Freshness of Tiger Basketball**

Mizzou Basketball has an incredible seven newcomers entering the program this season, which ties Kansas for the most in the Big 12 Conference in 2008-09.

> Missouri has five freshmen (**Laurence Bowers, Marcus Denmon, Kim English, Steve Moore and Miguel Paul**), one Division I transfer (**Zaire Taylor** from Delaware) and one junior college transfer (**Keith Ramsey**) entering the program this season ... The five freshmen entering the program are the most since the 2000-01 class of **Arthur Johnson, Rickey Paulding, Travon Bryant** and Co., while the seven total newcomers (including Taylor) are

the most for Mizzou since the 1994-95 class of: **Scott Combs, Sammie Haley, Simeon Haley, Monte Harge, Troy Hudson, Kendrick Moore and Corey Tate.**

> Seven of Missouri's 13 players are newcomers this season, meaning 53.8 percent of the roster are first-year performers for Head Coach **Mike Anderson.**

**The Graduates**

Missouri had an incredible seven players claim their undergraduate degrees off of last season's team and two of those Tigers, seniors **Michael Anderson Jr.** and **DeMarre Carroll**, return for their final season of playing eligibility in 2008-09.

> Both Anderson and Carroll are in their fifth years of eligibility ... Anderson redshirted as a true freshman at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, while Carroll took the NCAA-mandated redshirt in 2006-07 after transferring to MU from Vanderbilt ... Both Tigers are currently working towards their graduate degrees.

**Tigers Seventh In Big 12 Preseason Poll**

Missouri Basketball was picked seventh in the Big 12 Conference Preseason Coaches Poll in October ... The Tigers finished just ahead of Kansas State and Nebraska and behind Oklahoma State (sixth).

> The Tigers return four starters from the final 12 games of the 2007-08 campaign and will be led by Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention picks **Leo Lyons** and **DeMarre Carroll.**

> Oklahoma edged out Texas for the top spot in the 2008-09 preseason poll and the Sooners' **Blake Griffin** was named the Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year.

Both Carroll and his son, Michael Jr. are 2008 graduates of Mizzou. His daughter Yvonne, is a freshman point guard at Texas.

Anderson's family extends beyond his program as well. On Thanksgiving Day, the Anderson's will host the entire team for dinner, but will first extend their arms to the Columbia Community, serving Thanksgiving Dinner to a number of local residents. The team also raised better than 1,922 pounds of food before the Black & Gold Game this season, which in turn was enough food to provide more than 1,400 meals to Columbia residents for the holidays.

Columbia, Mo. -- Leo Lyons and DeMarre Carroll combined for 40 points and 17 rebounds to lift Missouri to an 86-65 season-opening win over Prairie View A&M Saturday afternoon in Columbia, Mo.

The duo combined for 16-of-29 shooting and helped the Tigers earn a dominating 47-35 advantage on the glass.

Mizzou also got tremendous play from its newcomers as Marcus Denmon scored 15 points and hit 3-of-6 three-pointers, while Miguel Paul added 11 tallies in 15 minutes of action.

"I guess we'll see if they can do it again on Monday, but I think we saw some glimpses," Head Coach Mike Anderson said. "I thought those new guys gave us a lot of energy out there. They played with some passion and did some good things, but again, it's just one game. We all want to see it night in and night out."

During one stretch in the opening half Missouri newcomers scored 16 straight points, thanks to the hot shooting of Denmon and Paul. For the game, Missouri hit 8-of-20 three-pointers, with six of those eight makes coming from that rookie duo.

"We don't want to miss a beat when we come off the floor and Miguel and Marcus made sure that didn't happen," senior forward Leo Lyons said. "They really help us keep the pressure on opposing teams. They are a confident group. We need that."

Missouri got an impressive 37 points from its bench in the victory. Bench scoring has been a hallmark of Anderson coached clubs. Missouri averaged 25.4 points from its bench in 2007-08 and set a school record for bench scoring in 2006-07 at 26.4.

"We preach depth," Anderson said. "What we want are options. The more options, the better we can play our style. Options are of course a great thing to have as we get ready for a long, grueling season."

Missouri gets ready for a quick turnaround as it returns to action on Monday night against a good Chattanooga squad. Chattanooga returns four starters from last season's team. Game time at Mizzou Arena is slated for 7 p.m.

"It was tough sitting there in the final few minutes," Tiller said. "I wanted to be out there so bad with my teammates. It was a tough finish, a tough way to get beat, but if we take something away from this and get better, it could pay some benefits down the road."

Missouri will take on Fairfield Friday morning at 10 a.m. (central time). Fairfield lost to Virginia Tech in its tournament opener Thursday morning by a 74-57 score.

San Juan, P.R. -- DeMarre Carroll scored a career high 29 points and added 11 rebounds for his first double-double of the season to lift Missouri Basketball to an 83-72 win over No. 19 USC in the fourth-place game of the 2008 O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off on Sunday afternoon in San Juan.

Carroll dominated against the larger USC front line, hitting 11-of-17 shots from the floor and 3-of-3 shots from three-point range, while also adding the season high 11 rebounds, three steals, two assists and a blocked shot.

For the three-game event, including games against Xavier, Fairfield and the No. 19 Trojans, Carroll averaged 20.3 points, 6.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.3 steals for the Tigers, who improved to 4-1 on the young season.

"I thought we had a great all-around effort today and DeMarre sure made a lot of plays to keep us going against a good USC team," Head Coach Mike Anderson said. "I think our bench played excellent and really allowed us to impose our style late in the game, during some crucial minutes."

The Mizzou bench certainly performed well, scoring 27 points as a whole, outscoring the Trojan bench 27-18. The Tigers continued to be one of the nation's most unselfish teams as well, dishing 20 assists, while committing just 12 turnovers against a good USC backcourt.

Delaware transfer Zaire Taylor dished five assists and helped force Daniel Hackett into eight turnovers. While Missouri was out-rebounded 39-34 on the afternoon, the Tigers actually trailed 10-1 in rebounding early in the game and out-glassed the Trojans 33-29 over the game's final 34 minutes.

"That was certainly a big factor in the ball game," Anderson said. "They are a great rebounding team. They were physical early on, but when you have such a young team you have to withstand some of those early blows and find you comfort level. We were able to withstand them early and played well in the second half."

Missouri outscored USC 46-29 in the final 20 minutes as the Tigers battled back from a 12 point deficit to shoot in front by as many as 13 in the second half. Missouri used a 15-3 run in the final six minutes to build up that margin.

Columbia, Mo. -- Missouri Basketball cruised to the largest margin of victory in Mizzou Arena history on Tuesday night, blasting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 95-41.

The Tigers forced a season high 28 turnovers, scored 37 points off those Pine Bluff miscues and raced to 95 total points. Over their last three home games, Missouri is averaging an incredible 96.7 points a game and is one of the nation's top scoring units at 88.1 points a night.

Missouri had a season high five players reach double figures Tuesday evening, led by senior guard Matt Lawrence. Lawrence buried three three-pointers, while grabbing a pair of rebounds in an efficient 17 minutes.

Fellow senior DeMarre Carroll added 13 points and eight boards, while Leo Lyons chipped in 13 points and six caroms. No Missouri starter played more than 20 minutes in the route and Carroll eclipsed a career milestone on the evening, scoring his 1,000th career point. The Birmingham, Ala., native scored 460 career points at Vanderbilt as a freshman and sophomore and now has 547 career scores at Mizzou in a little over one season of play.

"It feels good, you take the pats on the back, but you have to keep it all in perspective," Carroll said. "We have a lot we want to accomplish as seniors and to be honest, scoring 1,000 points wasn't one of them. We have a lot of players capable of scoring on this team and you saw it tonight."

Like Carroll mentioned, Missouri had a season high 50 points come from its bench, led by freshman sharp-shooter Kim English who scored 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting and fellow freshman Marcus Denmon, who chipped in 11.

"I like the way our starters set the tone and I like the way our bench finished the job," Head Coach Mike Anderson said. "We are going to need these guys. It's a long season and that bench has been a big lift. We are better able to play our style for 40 minutes. We've never been able to do that before at Missouri. I like the progress this team is making, but there is always more we can make."

Missouri is on a four-game winning streak dating back to the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off. In that event Missouri earned an 83-72 win over No. 19 USC and now the Tigers will face their second Pac-10 foe of the year, the Cal Bears, in the Big 12 / Pac-10 Hardwood Series.

The Tigers led by nine (40-31) at the half and pushed that advantage to as many as 17 before thwarting a late Racer rally that cut the Tiger lead to as little as four points in the final few minutes.

DeMarre Carroll hit a pair of free throws to push the Mizzou lead back to six, 66-60, with just 2:24 left and junior transfer Zaire Taylor stole the in-bounds pass, made the lay-up, and was fouled (also made the free throw) to balloon Missouri's advantage to nine, 69-60, in a span of just two seconds.

"That was a key possession," Head Coach Mike Anderson said. "You have to find ways to win tight ball games. Zaire made a great play, an instinctive basketball play. It wasn't always pretty and I give Murray State a great deal of credit, but that's a good win over a very good program."

Lyons and fellow senior Matt Lawrence led the Tigers with 14 points apiece. Lawrence hit 3-of-6 treys on the night to move into seventh on Missouri's career three-point shooting chart. Lawrence looked destined for a big scoring night, but three quick fouls limited the 6-foot-7 shooting guard to just 16 minutes of action.

Kim English led the Tiger bench with eight points, including 4-of-5 free throw shooting, while fellow frosh Marcus Denmon added seven points, three boards and two assists.

Missouri is off for finals, but returns to action on Dec. 20 vs. Stetson at 6 p.m.

Columbia, Mo. -- Missouri unloaded 51 second-half points, shot 70-percent from the floor over the final 20 minutes and held Stetson to just 44 points for the game as the Tigers raced to a 78-44 win over the Hatters Saturday night at Mizzou Arena.

The Tigers showed a little bit of "finals" rust offensively through the first 20 minutes, but more than made up for that with their stifling defense, limiting the Hatters to just 18 tallies en route to a 27-18 lead at the break.

Missouri got great balance offensively, as 12-of-14 players scored, including DeMarre Carroll (14), Matt Lawrence (12) and Justin Safford (10) who each reached double figures to pace MU. Carroll also chipped in seven rebounds, while freshman guard Marcus Denmon led the club with four steals.

"We showed some rust in that first half, but our guys did a better job playing our style in the second," Head Coach Mike Anderson said. "We did a much better job protecting the basketball and we were able to get out and run, that was a big difference."

That hurried-up style also forced Stetson into 1-of-17 shooting from three-point range and limited the Hatters to just one assist, compared to 15 turnovers.

"I thought our defense was the constant for us tonight," senior guard Matt Lawrence said. "We weren't knocking down shots early, but our defense and hustle was there all along. If we can put forth that effort night-in and night-out, the offense will eventually come, because we'll be able to get some transition buckets."

Missouri dominated play in the paint as the club outscored Stetson 38-22 in the lane and Missouri's reserves actually outscored the Hatters as a whole 45-44.

Missouri returns to action on Tuesday for the annual Busch Braggins' Rights Game in St. Louis vs. Illinois. Game time is slated for 6:30 p.m. on ESPN2.

Illinois led by 20 points in the first half behind 55 percent shooting and cruised to its fifth straight victory overall.

Trent Meacham had 23 points with three 3-pointers and Mike Davis had 13 points and nine rebounds for Illinois (11-1), which won the previous two games in the series by a total of four points. The Fighting Illini shot 57 percent while beating a team that had been averaging 25-point blowouts during its winning streak.

The Tigers shot a season-worst 37 percent and were held well below their previous season low of 71 points.

Illinois took control early behind the hot hand of McCamey, who hit his first five shots and outscored the rest of his team 13-7 while fueling a 20-9 lead just over 8 minutes into the game. McCamey was 4-for-5 from 3-point range in the half three days after totaling seven points in a victory over Detroit, and had not scored in double figures in two of the three previous games.

Missouri trailed at halftime for only the third time after shooting 30 percent and missing all eight 3-point attempts and going without leading scorer DeMarre Carroll for 6 minutes after he injured his left ankle.

Carroll, who averages 17.6 points and seven rebounds, was held to six points and one rebound.

Columbia, Mo. -- No. 25 Missouri released some holiday frustration on Southern Illinois Edwardsville on Saturday afternoon, as the Tigers scored a season high 107 points and handed the transitional Division I program its worst loss of the season, a 107-57 defeat at Mizzou Arena.

The Tigers had all-14 players score at least two points in the game, led by senior forward DeMarre Carroll, who dropped in his second double-double of the season with 21 points and 10 boards in just 19 minutes of play. Mizzou's future also shined brightly on Saturday, as four freshman reached double figures in the win.

Miguel Paul (12), Marcus Denmon (11), Kim English (10) and Laurence Bowers (10) all topped double digits and Bowers narrowly missed a double-double of his own with seven boards, while English and Paul combined for nine assists and just two turnovers. For the game Missouri's bench outscored SIUE 62-57 and the 62 bench points set a new school record for the Tigers, breaking the 58 bench tallies recorded by the Tigers last season in a double-overtime win against Iowa State.

Missouri raced to a 59-24 halftime advantage led by Carroll. The Birmingham, Ala., native showed no ill-effects of an ankle injury suffered on Tuesday against Illinois, en route to 15 points and eight boards in 13 minutes. Carroll played just six minutes in the second half, giving way to Bowers and junior college newcomer Keith Ramsey, who added six points, six boards and two dimes.

Missouri shot 54 percent from the floor and dished 23 assists on 38 buckets, but still managed to grab a season high 50 rebounds while holding SIUE to just 35 percent shooting from the floor.

Missouri returns to action on Tuesday against Centenary College. Game time at Mizzou Arena is slated for 7 p.m.

Columbia, Mo. -- Missouri Basketball exploded for 51 first-half points and Matt Lawrence hit all five of his three-point attempts in the opening period to lift the Tigers to an 88-55 win over Coppin State Tuesday night at Mizzou Arena.

Lawrence and fellow senior DeMarre Carroll paced the Tigers with a combined 34 points, but the Tigers also got a great perimeter-shooting lift from freshman Kim English (three treys in the opening stanza) to push Mizzou's record to 13-2, the best for the school since the 1994-95 campaign.

"I thought we really shot the ball well early and things took off from there," Head Coach Mike Anderson said. "I'm not a guy that compares scores, but Coppin State played Syracuse tough and played Wisconsin well, both on the road, so they are a good team. We just shot it well early and we got the win."

Shooting well may have been an understatement in the first half, as Missouri hit eight first-half triples, with five coming from Lawrence and three coming from English. In fact, Missouri's two sharpest shooters were a combined 8-of-8 from bonus distance in the first 20 minutes, fueling Missouri's 33-point rout.

"I'm glad a couple of those shots in the first half went in, because they were pretty deep and had I missed them, Coach Anderson probably would have pulled me out," a joking Lawrence said during a post game interview. "It was one of those nights. My teammates were finding me and the shots were falling."

English also got it going early for the Tigers, finishing with nine first-half tallies in the win.

Carroll was second on the team with 16 points, but added a career high five steals, seven boards and three assists.

For the game Missouri shot 53 percent from the floor and hit a season high 13 three-pointers. The Tigers' previous best was 11 in the win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff. The Tigers also dished 25 assists, just two off their season best. MU's 16 steals on the night tied a season high, equaling the 16 thefts vs. Xavier in San Juan, P.R.

Mizzou opens Big 12 Conference action on Saturday afternoon at Nebraska. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2 at 1 p.m. CT.

Stillwater, Okla. – Survive and advance. That's a popular phrase used for college basketball when they get to the NCAA Tournament in March. Survive and advance is exactly what the Missouri Tigers did Wednesday in Stillwater, Okla., as they raced to a 20-point second-half lead, and held off a furious Cowboy last-minute rally to take a 97-95 win.

Perhaps the win will lead to the NCAA Tournament for Missouri when post-season play comes around. If the Tigers, who improved to 16-3 on the season and 3-1 in Big 12 Conference play, eventually get that berth, they'll likely look back on this game as a key.

And what a wild one it ended up being. After a pair of Zaire Taylor free throws with 3:50 to play gave Mizzou a 93-78 lead, Oklahoma State erupted to score 13 of the game's next 14 points and with 2:13 left to play, all of a sudden it was down to a 94-91 Tiger lead.

The teams first traded a pair of made free throws to maintain MU's three-point lead, and then each team got careless, with two turnovers coming from both sides. With :47 seconds left, OSU's Byron Eaton drove the lane and was fouled. He made both foul shots to cut the Tiger lead to one, at 96-95.

Taylor had the ensuing inbounds pass glance off his leg out of bounds, and all of a sudden, the Cowboys, coached by former MU player Travis Ford, had the ball and a chance at their first lead of the game. Eaton got under the basket and tried to force a shot in traffic, missed, got the rebound and was ruled to have been tied up by Mizzou's Leo Lyons. With the alternating possession arrow favoring Mizzou, the Tigers got the ball back with :27 seconds left.

The Tigers got the ball in the front court successfully this time, and managed to kill 13 seconds before J.T. Tiller was fouled with :14 seconds left. He missed the first, and made the second for a 97-95 lead. DeMarre Carroll blocked a quick three-point try by OSU out of bounds, and with the clock running out, Eaton tried a runner in the lane but came up short. Lyons grabbed the rebound with one-tenth of a second left and was fouled. He missed the first shot, then intentionally missed the second, but an inadvertent whistle by the referees during the shot stopped play and gave the ball to OSU.

That odd sequence thankfully didn't impact the outcome of the game, as the Cowboys by rule wouldn't have time to catch and shoot the ball, had to throw the ball 90 feet downcourt and pray for a Tiger foul. The inbounds pass sailed harmlessly out of bounds in the Cowboy bench, however, giving the ball back to Mizzou. The Tigers got the ball in and killed the clock to set off a collective sigh of relief.

Columbia, Mo. – Missouri Head Coach Mike Anderson was worried about this one coming in. His team's emotional win Wednesday at Oklahoma State could have put his Tigers in line for an emotional letdown against a dangerous Texas Tech team.

But Anderson's fears were put to rest early, as the Tigers got out to a double-digit lead early and cruised the rest of the way for a 97-86 win. The victory improved the surging Tigers' record to 17-3 overall, and 4-1 in Big 12 Conference play. The 17 wins has already surpassed MU's 16-win total from a year ago, and the 4-1 start in league play is MU's best since an identical 4-1 start in 2001-02 - a team which reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

Like they did last Wednesday, Mizzou got out to a good start. Freshman Kim English hit a pair of three pointers less than three minutes into the game, and MU held a 10-1 lead early on. A DeMarre Carroll dunk on an assist from Justin Safford (after Safford stole the ball) gave Mizzou a 20-10 lead with 13:44 left in the half, and the Tiger lead never got lower than 10 the rest of the half.

Carroll would finish the day with a game-high 27 points. He was one of four Tigers in double figures Saturday, with Marcus Denmon (14 points), Kim English (13) and Leo Lyons (12) joining in. J.T. Tiller had 8 points and a career-high 7 steals, as the Tigers had 20 steals thanks to their pressure defense.

Mizzou's defense was relentless early on, forcing 17 Tech turnovers in the first half alone, on the way to a whopping 29 turnovers for the game by the Red Raiders, who fell to 11-8 overall and 1-3 in league play. For the day, Mizzou outscored Texas Tech by a 35-15 margin in points off turnovers.

The Tigers also hit their free throws at a good clip, connecting on 32-of-41 on the day. That came in handy, as the Red Raiders had a big advantage on the glass, out-rebounding MU by a 46-30 clip.

Kevin Rogers had 18 points for Baylor (15-6, 3-4), which has lost three in a row. The Bears recovered from an early 13-point deficit to take its only lead at the start of the second half, and erased all but one point of an 11-point second-half deficit before again faltering.

Austin, Texas – With the final seconds winding down and the Texas crowd on its feet, Missouri's Zaire Taylor saw everything open up before him.

A clear lane to the basket, a quick drive into space and a tough shot that went in while he was fouled with 5.5 seconds left. Taylor made the free throw, DeMarre Taylor added one more 2 seconds later after a Texas turnover and the Tigers were skipping off the court with a 69-65 upset victory, their first on the Longhorns' court since 1999.

The last time the Tigers won in Austin was former longtime Missouri coach Norm Stewart's last career victory before he retired.

It was good enough to send the frustrated Longhorns (No. 17 ESPN/USA Today, No. 16 AP) to their second straight home loss just a few days after Kansas State snapped their 19-game home winning streak.

Texas had tied it at 65 on A.J. Abrams' floater in the lane with 1 minute to play. But Abrams, the Big 12's career leader in 3-pointers, missed from long range with 28 seconds left, giving Missouri a chance to set up for the winning shot.

After Taylor's play, Carroll intercepted the inbounds pass, drew a foul and hit one of two free throws to seal the win. Taylor finished with 17 points for the Tigers (19-4, 6-2).

Dexter Pittman scored a career-high 25 points for the Longhorns (15-6, 4-3).

Pittman and his 6-foot-10, 300-pound body had a huge game for the Longhorns. His large frame and hands dominated the Tigers under the basket with 9-of-12 shooting. He played a career-high 23 minutes.

But Pittman's foul troubles in the second half kept Texas from finding any kind of offensive rhythm and turned him into a defensive liability in the final minutes.

The teams were tied or traded the lead eight times in the final 5 minutes. Pittman's dunk with 3:01 to play gave Texas its final lead at 62-60 before Leo Lyons answered with two straight baskets -- both coming when he drove right by a passive Pittman -- for the Tigers.

Lyons finished with 14 points and Carroll had 13 for the Tigers. Abrams scored 11 for the Longhorns but continued to struggle to find his long-range stroke at critical times.

The Longhorns also missed their usual production from Damion James, who came in with eight double-doubles this season but finished with just six points while battling a sore knee.

Columbia, Mo. – Zaire Taylor hit a 10-footer from just outside the lane with 1.3 seconds to go, capping the Tigers' comeback from a 14-point half-time deficit in a 62-60 victory over No. 16 Kansas on Monday night.

DeMarre Carroll had 22 points and seven rebounds for the Tigers (21-4, 8-2 Big 12), who won their 16th in a row at home against a bitter border rival that had beaten them five straight times. Fans from a raucous sell-out crowd of 15,061 mobbed the floor after Cole Aldrich's desperation shot banged off the backboard at the buzzer as he was being knocked to the floor.

Aldrich had 15 rebounds, five blocked shots and eight points for Kansas (19-5, 8-1), which entered with an eight-game winning streak and as one of only six Division I schools unbeaten in conference play. Tyshawn Taylor added 11 points but leading scorer Sherron Collins was held to nine points, nine below his average, on 4-for-13 shooting.

Missouri called timeout after Mario Little's basket from the baseline tied it with 29 seconds to go, then used almost all the time before Taylor popped free for his second winning shot in three games. Taylor, who finished with only seven points, also got the go-ahead basket in a victory at Texas on Wednesday and pump-faked a defender in the air before taking the shot.

Missouri has won eight of nine, a run that enabled them to crack the Top 25 for the second time this season. The Tigers lasted only one week the first time after getting blown out by Illinois in St. Louis on Dec. 23.

Kansas dominated on the boards, outrebounding Missouri 42-26, but was undone by a season-worst 27 turnovers -- six more than the previous high. The Jayhawks also went cold down the stretch, limited to one basket the final eight minutes.

Kansas led 30-16 at the half, ignoring the pre-game atmosphere that featured Missouri mascot Truman the Tiger being lowered from the rafters in a harness, a throwback to a stunt the school used before every game at the old Hearnes Center. The Jayhawks seized control despite 36-percent shooting, including 2-for-12 from 3-point range and Collins' 2-for-8 start, mostly because they dominated on the boards with a 30-15 advantage.

Missouri's first-half scoring was a season low, two points fewer than in the Big 12 opener at Nebraska, with the frustration capped when freshman Marcus Denmon blew a pair of free throws with 8.7 seconds to go.
