Game Highlights: Nebraska connected on a school-record 12 three-pointers on its way to a 96-47 season-opening victory over Weber State at the Devaney Center. NU, which improved to 33-2 all-time in home season-openers, had five players score in double figures. Cory Montgomery led NU with 13 points, while Kaitlyn Burke added 12 points including a team-best four three-pointers. Burke also pitched in four assists and a career-high three steals in the first start of her career. Kala Kuhlmann and Monique Whittaker both added career highs with 13 points. Yvonne Turner added all 11 of her points and a game-high four steals in the first half to help NU build a 51-19 halftime lead. NU held Weber State to a 19.6 field goal percentage, the second-lowest opponent total in school history. Tonya Schnibbe was the only Wildcat with a field goal in the first half, as WSU went just 3-of-21 from the floor in the opening half.

Game Highlights: Dominique Kelley tied her then-career high with 16 points, including the go-ahead three-pointer with 3:10 left to help carry Nebraska to a 72-67 victory at Creighton. Kelley hit 7-of-11 shots from the field including both three-point attempts. She also dished out four assists and grabbed three rebounds in 31 minutes. Yvonne Turner also made a string of huge plays down the stretch to put the Huskers in position to win. Turner scored 11 of her 13 points in the second stanza to bring NU back from a six-point deficit. Nebraska trailed 59-56 with 7:21 to play, when Turner scored seven straight points, including back-to-back three-pointers in a 1:01 span to tie the score at 63 with 3:43 left. Turner then hit Kelley on the left wing for the go-ahead three on NU's next possession. Cory Montgomery also played a major role, finishing with 11 points and a game-high nine rebounds. Montgomery hit all three of her field goals in the game's final 7:21 to help NU outscore the Jays 18-8 down the stretch. The Huskers also got a lift from Monique Whittaker, who came off the bench to score 10 consecutive first-half points

Game Highlights: Cory Montgomery tied her then-career high with 21 points while adding seven rebounds to lead Nebraska to a 65-57 win over a scrappy Southern Utah club at the Devaney Center. Dominique Kelley added 14 points and a career-high six assists to help the Huskers overcome a dismal shooting performance. NU hit just 35.2 percent of its shots from the field, including just 26.7 percent in the second half. NU connected on just 22.7 percent of its three-point attempts, and managed just 52.6 percent shooting from the free throw line. The Huskers survived a scare from the Thunderbirds by forcing 25 turnovers and converting them into 23 points. The Huskers also pounded the offensive boards, pulling down 17 offensive rebounds and converting them into 20 second-chance points. Nikki Bober, who made the first start of her career, provided a solid performance with eight points and a career-high seven rebounds. She added two blocked shots. Catheryn Redmon and Monique Whittaker each added six points off the bench for NU.

Game Highlights: Cory Montgomery produced game highs with 20 points and nine rebounds to lead four Huskers in double figures in a 76-55 victory at Denver. Montgomery went 10-of-10 at the free throw line to help the Huskers set a school record by going 18-for-18 at the line as a team, while improving to 4-0 on the year for the first time since the 2001-02 season. Montgomery scored 14 points in the second half, while Yvonne Turner added 10 of her 15 points after halftime to help NU outscore the Pioneers, 43-23, in the second half. Turner also distributed five assists, while grabbing a season-best four steals. Tay Hester added 11 points and a season-high four steals, as NU forced 25 Denver turnovers on the night. Kala Kuhlmann pitched in 11 points, including seven in the first half, while Nicole Neals matched her then-career high with nine points on a career-best three three-pointers. Neals scored all nine of her points off the bench in the first half to help shoot the Huskers to a 33-32 halftime lead, despite 58.3 percent first-half shooting by Denver.

The Huskers also struggled at the free line, hitting just 15-of-26 attempts. However, a strong effort on the glass powered NU to the victory, as the Huskers outrebounded BU, 53-35.

Montgomery added 11 points and 10 boards for her third double-double of the season and fourth of her career. Despite the solid numbers inside for the Huskers, NU trailed from nearly start to finish against the 2008 Conference USA champions. Dominique Kelley was whistled for two fouls in the game's first three minutes and sat out the rest of the first half. Yvonne Turner also picked up two fouls in the game's first 10 minutes, and NU's top two guards combined to play just 10 first-half minutes. Jareica Hughes, the 2008 Conference USA Player of the Year, took advantage by scoring 12 of her 14 points in the opening period to shoot UTEP to a 28-22 halftime lead. In the second half, Hughes got her teammates fully involved by dishing out a game-high eight assists. Sviatlana Trukshanina led the Miners with a game-high 17 points off the bench, as UTEP's reserves outscored NU's bench 22-2. ASU opened the game on an 18-2 run, as the Huskers went without a field goal for the game's first 9:45. NU missed its first 13 field goal attempts. The nine-point halftime deficit matched the largest margin overcome by the Huskers in Coach Connie Yori's seven years in Lincoln, joining a 43-34 deficit at Missouri on Jan. 8, 2005.

NU may have received its biggest lift from reserve center Jessica Periago, who erupted for a career-high 11 points, including eight points in a four-minute span in the first half to help the Huskers shoot to a 10-point lead. Periago helped NU head into the final 3:45 of the first half with a 33-23 lead, but Texas closed the half on a 9-0 run to pull within 33-32 at the break. The Longhorns seized control midway through the second half, as reserve Ashleigh Fontenette scored 11 straight points on her way to a career-high 21 to give UT a 13-point lead. Periago, Montgomery and Turner sent NU on one last surge to trim UT's lead to just 62-57 with 3:45 left, before Texas scored 12 straight points down the stretch to seal the win.

Dominique Kelley, who was honored as a "Hometown Husker" during the game, scored five points during the spurt, while Tay Hester pitched in four of her 10 points for the game off the bench. Cathryn Redmon scored all four of her points during the stretch. Montgomery and Turner then took control, combining for seven straight points after KU ended its field goal drought to push Nebraska's lead to 15 points. Danielle McCray, who scored 30 points for Kansas, helped whittle the lead to eight points twice in the second half. But Montgomery and Turner combined for 10 straight points for NU to regain a 15-point edge with 2:40 to play. Turner knocked down a trio of three-pointers on the night to move into a tie for ninth on the Huskers' career three-point list with 78. She also added four assists and three steals. Krysten Boogaard contributed 18 points and 13 rebounds for KU, as McCray and Boogaard combined for 48 of the Jayhawks' 58 points, including 23-of-25 in the second half. KU played without its second-leading scorer, Sade Morris, who suffered a concussion in KU's loss to Texas Tech on Jan. 17.

Game Highlights: Cory Montgomery scored 24 points, but Colorado came back from a 14-point first-half deficit and escaped with a 75-73 win over the Huskers at the Coors Events Center. Nebraska's pressure defense stymied the Buffs, as the Huskers forced 18 first-half turnovers by CU. NU capitalized early with big first-half efforts from Montgomery and Dominique Kelley, who led the Huskers with 14 first-half points including 3-of-3 shooting from long range. Montgomery, who had 12 first-half points, added a pair of three-pointers in the first 20 minutes, as NU knocked down six of its first seven shots from long range. Unfortunately for Nebraska, the Huskers missed their final 10 three-point attempts of the game, including an 0-for-8 afternoon by Yvonne Turner, who entered the game among the Big 12's best from beyond the arc. Bianca Smith answered NU from long range by hitting 7-of-10 threes for the game to finish with 21 points. Brittany Spears did the most damage for CU, scoring 17 of her game-high 25 in the second half, including the game-tying free throw with 33 seconds left and the game-winning shot from the right baseline with eight seconds remaining. The Huskers had a shot to send the game to overtime, as Turner went the length of the court but missed a layup as time expired.

Kaitlyn Burke, who scored all seven of her points in the second half, hit the three-pointer to cut Baylor's lead to just one possession in the closing seconds, before Kelli Griffin sealed the win with two free throws for the Lady Bears. Griffin went 10-for-10 at the line on her way to a career-high 14 points. Danielle Wilson added a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds, while Jessica Morrow contributed 14 points and BU's only two threes of the night. Yvonne Turner, who scored 15 of her 17 points in the second half, and Montgomery combined for all 13 points in a three-minute stretch to spark a 13-2 NU run midway through the second half. After Baylor took a 15-point lead at 52-37, the Huskers surged despite hitting just one field goal, a three-pointer by Turner, in the first 12:25 of the second half. Baylor answered with a 6-0 run to push the lead back to 10, before Turner responded with back-to-back three-pointers to cut the margin to 62-58. It remained a two-possession game the rest of the way.

Nebraska snapped a 12-game series losing streak to Texas Tech, dating back to the first year of Big 12 Conference play in 1997. The Huskers also ended their five-game overall losing streak on the season. Texas Tech, which entered the game ranked No. 33 in the RPI, was coming off a seven-point win over No. 10 Texas A&M in Lubbock on Feb. 11, just days after the Aggies had rolled to a win over the Huskers. Dominique Kelley played a major role in Nebraska's victory, pumping in 15 points, while adding five rebounds, three assists and a career-high three steals in a career-high 35 minutes. Yvonne Turner added 12 points, including a pair of three-pointers, to go along with four boards, four assists and two steals. Catheryn Redmon also played a key role down the stretch, knocking down a pair of clutch free throws with 26 seconds left to seal the victory.

Game Highlights: Cory Montgomery led four Huskers in double figures with 17 points and nine rebounds as Nebraska rolled to its second straight Big 12 home win with a 65-52 victory over Missouri at the Devaney Center. Dominique Kelley added 16 points and six rebounds, while Yvonne Turner pitched in 13 points and four boards for the Huskers. Tay Hester also played a major role off the bench, scoring 12 points to go along with eight rebounds and a season-high five assists. Nebraska's lone senior also helped slow down Missouri star Alyssa Hollins, limiting MU's senior guard to just 4-for-18 shooting from the field. The Huskers got off to a slow start and trailed by as many as nine points at 20-11 with 11:38 left in the first half, before storming back with a 13-3 surge in the final eight minutes to take a 28-25 halftime lead. Missouri regained a three-point lead early in the second half before Hester helped spark a 9-0 NU run to take control of the game. The Huskers took their first double-digit lead of the night on a Turner three-pointer to make it 49-39, and Missouri could not get closer than seven points the rest of the way. Nebraska hit 45.7 percent of its shots from the field, while outrebounding a Big 12 opponent for the first time all year. The Huskers also matched their season bests with just nine turnovers and nine fouls.

Sweat, who led KSU with 13 points, was the only Wildcat to hit a shot in the final 13 minutes of the game until Kelsey Nelson's unchallenged layup at the buzzer ended the scoring. Yvonne Turner added 13 points for the Huskers in a career-high 39 minutes, while Catheryn Redmon provided a dominant defensive presence with a career-high seven blocks to go along with eight rebounds.



Game Highlights: Cory Montgomery scored 20 points and grabbed nine rebounds, but ninth-seeded Nebraska fell to eighth-seeded Kansas, 61-56, in the first round of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship at the Cox Convention Center. Montgomery knocked down 9-of-16 shots from the field and both of her free throw attempts to help Nebraska build a 39-28 lead early in the second half. But KU's hot-shooting guard tandem of Sade Morris and Danielle McCray led the Jayhawks back for the victory. Morris, who finished with a game-high 24 points, hit 12-of-19 shots from the field, including 6-of-10 shooting in the first half and a 6-for-9 effort in the second half, while adding seven rebounds, four assists, two steals and a block. McCray, a first-team All-Big 12 performer, added 22 points on 8-of-17 shooting, including 6-of-10 attempts in the second half. She hit 3-of-5 three-pointers, while adding three assists, two steals and a block of her own. For the game, KU hit 52 percent of its shots from the field, while NU connected on just 37.5 percent of its attempts. However, the Huskers were able to take the game down to the wire by outrebounding the Jayhawks, 37-26, including a 15-3 advantage on the offensive glass. Unfortunately for the Huskers, they were only able to convert their 15 offensive boards into nine points, while the Jayhawks managed six points on their three offensive rebounds. Yvonne Turner added 13 points, three assists and a season-high six steals in a solid effort for the Huskers.

Game Highlights: Cory Montgomery scored a team-high 17 points, but it was not enough as Nebraska saw its season come to an end with a 54-43 loss to New Mexico at the Santa Ana Star Center. Playing after a 13-day layoff in the second round of the 2009 Postseason WNIT, the Huskers struggled with their shooting strokes to hit just 11-of-47 field goals. NU trailed by just one at 28-27 early in the second half and by just four at 37-33 after Montgomery's second straight three-pointer with 14:27 left in the game. Nebraska then went 11 minutes without a field goal, and New Mexico jumped out to a 16-point lead in a low-scoring contest before Montgomery hit another three-pointer to trim UNM's advantage to 51-38. Nebraska finished the season with a 15-16 overall record after advancing to its sixth consecutive postseason appearance. New Mexico went on to the WNIT semifinals before losing to Kansas. All-Mountain West guard Amy Beggin led all scorers with 25 points, while Angela Hartill added 18 for the Lobos. New Mexico shot out to a 12-1 lead, but the Huskers answered UNM's opening run with a 15-3 spurt to take their only lead of the game at 16-15.
