COMING UP

The Huskers next head to Oklahoma City to participate in the 2009 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship at the Ford Center. The championship begins on Wednesday, March 11, and runs through Saturday, March 14. No matter the outcome of the final regular-season games, NU will be the No. 8 seed and will play No. 9 seed Baylor in the first round at 11:30 a.m. on March 11.

HUSKERS TAKE TO THE ROAD TO BATTLE BEARS IN REGULAR-SEASON FINALE

In one of the last scheduled Big 12 tipoffs of the regular season, Nebraska takes to the road to face Baylor on Saturday, March 7, in Waco, Texas. The Cornhuskers and Bears are set to tip off at 3:01 p.m. in a game seen in select markets around the country on the Big 12 Network (KLKN channel 8 in Lincoln; KXVO channel 11 in Omaha; and KIIT alternate channel 30 in North Platte) with Brad Sham and Stephen Howard calling the action.

All of Nebraska's games can also be heard on the IMG Husker Sports Radio Network, consisting of 31 stations around the state and on the Internet at Huskers.com. Veteran play-by-play man Kent Pavelka calls the action and former Husker Matt Davison provides color commentary.

Nebraska enters the final weekend with a renewed sense of purpose. The Huskers had lost four of five contests, including back-to-back heartbreakers by a combined seven points, before running past lowa State, 77-61, on Wednesday. Now Nebraska enters the regular-season finale with a chance to get back to .500 in Big 12 action and begins the weekend still alive for a tie for sixth place in the final league standings.

■ NU heads into the regular-season finale with the opportunity to reach 8-8 in Big 12 play. Nebraska has not finished .500 or better in conference play since 1998-99 when NU went 10-6 for the second straight year. The Huskers were 6-10 in coach Doc Sadler's first season and 7-9 last year.

- The Huskers entered the week ranked No. 17 nationally in scoring defense. NU is currently allowing a Big 12-low 59.4 ppg, including a league-best 62.4 ppg in conference games despite uncharacteristically giving up 70 or more points in each of its last three road contests.
- Nebraska has shot 50.5 percent from the floor and averaged 74.5 ppg over the past two games. It is the first time in Big 12 play this season that NU scored 70 or more points in consecutive games. The last time NU posted 70 or more points in three straight Big 12 games was 2005.
- Ade Dagunduro has averaged 20.0 points and 6.5 rebounds over the past two games while hitting 66.7 percent (14-of-21) from the field. Ryan Anderson has averaged 15.0 ppg in that span while hitting 10-of-14 shots (71.4 percent), including 5-of-8 from 3-point range.
- Cookie Miller has averaged 14.0 points and 5.0 assists in the past two games. Miller now has 101 assists this year, becoming only the second player in NU history (along with Tyronn Lue) to post at least 100 assists in each of his freshman and sophomore seasons.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

Nebraska and Baylor enter the weekend matchup looking to get a good feel for each other as they know they will be facing off again in the first game of the Big 12 Championship next week in Oklahoma City.

The Bears come into the regular-season finale with a 17-12 overall record and a 5-10 mark in conference play. BU will be the No. 9 seed at the league tournament, as even with a win Saturday it can not catch eight-seed Nebraska.

Like the Huskers, Baylor has lost three of its last four games. The Bears fell by a 73-57 count at Texas on ESPN's Big Monday earlier this week. The loss was BU's sixth straight road loss. At home, the Bears own a 13-4 record with wins over Oklahoma State in overtime and Texas A&M, both contenders to be in the NCAA Tournament field of 65. BU's losses at the Ferrell Center include South Carolina, Kansas, Texas and Oklahoma.

Saturday will be the final regular-season home contest for four BU seniors, as Mamadou Diene, Henry Dugat, Curtis Jerrells and Kevin Rogers try to help Baylor tie the Ferrell Center regular-season record for wins. Dugat, Jerrells and Rogers are all 1,000-point career scorers, with Jerrells ranking sixth all-time at BU.

Name

Jerrells leads the team with 16.3 points per game this season while adding 5.0 assists and 4.7 rebounds per contest. He is also second on the team with 44 steals, trailing only Dugat's 46 steals. Dugat is averaging 10.6 points per contest to rank fifth on the team in scoring. Among the other four double-figure scorers are Jerrells, LaceDarius Dunn (15.0 ppg), Kevin Rogers (12.1) and Tweety Carter (11.5).

Dunn paces the squad with 783-pointers on the season. Carter has added 62 treys, including a team-best 38 in Big 12 action, while Jerrells had put in 54 treys. On the year, Baylor has hit 36.3 percent from 3-point range, nailing 240of-662 attempts from beyond the arc.

The Bears have averaged 77.9 points per game to rank among the league's top offensive teams, but they have also allowed 71.3 points per contest on 43.6 percent shooting. BU has been outrebounded by a 35.7-34.7 margin and has hit a solid 70.7 percent from the charity stripe. Three Bears (Jerrells, 176; Rogers, 112; Dunn, 104) each have at least 100 attempts from the foul line this season.

Over the last five games, BU has averaged 68.0 points per game while hitting 43.5 percent from the floor. Jerrells and Carter have posted 15.4 ppg in that span.

Hometown (High School/Last School)

Baylor is coached by Scott Drew (Butler, 1993), who is in his sixth year with the Bears. Drew owns a 72-92 record in Waco and a 92-103 career mark as a college head coach. He began his head coaching career at Valparaiso, where he took over for his father and posted a 20-11 season in his rookie year.

THE SERIES VS. BAYLOR

The Cornhuskers and Bears have a brief history as they are meeting for just the 19th time in series history this weekend. The Huskers hold an 11-7 series lead although Baylor has won each of the past two matchups.

- The series is the Huskers' second-shortest against any current Big 12 opponent. The only other league foe with a shorter series history against the Huskers is Texas A&M, which has played only 17 games against Nebraska (NU leads 11-6).
- The teams first met in the 1949-50 season with a Nebraska victory at home. NU won the first three games of the series and also own another four-game win streak over Baylor.
- Nebraska trails in the series, 3-4, in games played in Waco, including trailing by a 2-4 mark in games contested in the Ferrell Center.
- Baylor has won the past two games in the series by a combined six points. The Bears have never won three straight over Nebraska.
- The Huskers have held Baylor to under 70 points 10 times in the Big 12 era, including five times allowing 60 or fewer points.
- Nebraska has allowed just 63 points in each of the past two matchups in Waco, although the Huskers are 1-1 in those contests.
- Last season both teams scored at least 70 points in the contest for only the second time in the series. The only other time both teams reached 70 points was an 82-79 Baylor win in 1987.
- Last year, Nebraska opened Big 12 play with an 0-4 start, including a 72-70 setback against a Baylor squad that eventually reached the NCAA Tournament. Aleks Maric had 21 points, nine rebounds and four blocks while Steve Harley had 15 points off the bench, but Nebraska shot just 38.2 percent from the floor. Baylor had 21 turnovers and shot 42 percent from the field, but hit 10-of-20 3-point attempts as four players scored in double figures led by Henry Dugat's 19 points. Kevin Rogers also added 13 points and 14 rebounds. Nebraska had a chance at the win but the Huskers were called for a controversial turnover in the final

seconds, helping BU improve to 15-2 overall and 3-0 in league play.

■ The last time the teams played in Waco, Nebraska was ice cold in the first half and finished the game hitting just 34 percent from the floor as BU took a 63-59 victory. Henry Dugat and Tweety Carter each had 15 points while combining to hit 7-of-13 from 3-point range, and Kevin Rogers added nine points and 13 rebounds. BU led 39-28 on the boards. Charles Richardson led the Huskers with 16 points while Ryan Anderson added 14 points and Aleks Maric had 11 points and 12 rebounds but committed seven turnovers. Baylor hit 11-of-22 (50.0 percent) from 3-point range to improve to 3-10 in league play.

THE NUMBER IS EIGHT

Unlike several teams in the league, the Cornhuskers already know their future as far as seeding and game time for the first round of the Big 12 Championship next week in Oklahoma City.

No matter the outcome of the final games of the regular season on Saturday, March 7, the Huskers will be the No. 8 seed at the Big 12 Championship and will face No. 9 seed Baylor. The teams will play the rematch on Wednesday, March 11, at 11:30 a.m. in the first game of the championship.

- Nebraska and Baylor have met twice before in the Big 12 Championship, splitting the two contests. Nebraska won the first meeting 65-46 over the Bears in 1998 while BU took the most recent contest by a 63-55 margin in 2000.
- The matchup with Baylor will mark the third time in four years Nebraska will play its final regular-season opponent in the first round of the Big 12 Championship. NU also played its season finale and first-round game against the same team in 2006 (Missouri) and 2007 (Oklahoma State).
- Nebraska has been the No. 8 seed at the league championship two times during the Big 12 era, losing to the No. 9 seed both times. NU lost to Baylor in 2000 and Colorado in 2002. The Huskers also played in the 8/9 game one other time, losing as the No. 9 seed to No. 8 seed Missouri in 2005.

SADLER REACHES MILESTONES

Coach Doc Sadler has been known to get everything possible out of his players and teams, as his work ethic has carried over to the court. In the past two seasons, Sadler's effort pushed the Huskers to 17 and 20 wins, respectively.

The Huskers' win over Texas Tech on the road on Jan. 31 marked Sadler's 50th victory at Nebraska. As of March 4, he currently owns a 54-38 record as the head coach in Lincoln, and was the fourth-fastest coach to reach 50 wins at NU in program history. Of the three who reached the mark faster at NU, two of those men coached in Lincoln before World War I.

Sadler reached another milestone in the victory over No. 16/17 Texas. The win was his 100th victory as a Division I head coach. Sadler won 100 of his first 152 games at this level.

STANDINGS NOT SET

While the Huskers are locked into the No. 8 seed next week at the Big 12 Championship, their final standing in the league is not set. Heading into the weekend, the Huskers can finish anywhere from sixth to eighth in the league standings.

- Nebraska will finish in sole possession of eighth place if Kansas State and Texas A&M win their respective games with Colorado and Missouri.
- The Huskers will tie for seventh place if they defeat Baylor and either Kansas State or Texas A&M loses its contest.
- If both Kansas State and Texas A&M lose and Nebraska wins this weekend, then all three will have eight league wins and will be in a three-way tie for sixth place.
- Nebraska has finished in the upper half (top six) of the league standings just once since 1999. The Huskers were 7-9 to finish in sole possession of sixth place in 2006.

QUICK HITS

Here is a guick look at the Huskers through games of March 4:

Quick team notes

- The 2009 Huskers recorded a .500 or better mark at the midway point of conference play for just the fourth time in the Big 12 era (1998, 4-4; 1999, 5-3; 2006, 5-3; 2009, 4-4).
- The 2009 Huskers are aiming for a .500 or better mark at the end of the regular season for just the third time in the Big 12 era (1998, 10-6; 1999, 10-6).
- Since the start of the 2008 league season, the Huskers have held 12 Big 12 opponents to under 60 points in a game, including four of their last nine games (Colorado, 53 points; Texas, 55; Colorado, 41; Texas A&M, 57).
- Overall, the Huskers have held Big 12 opponents to 70 or fewer points in 20 of their last 24 games against league teams, including last year's league tournament.
- With the Big 12 Conference's top defense, Nebraska is giving up just 59.4 points per game. Since 1951, the Huskers have had a better scoring defense through a whole season only once (1982, 55.3 ppg).
- The Huskers ranked 17th nationally in scoring defense on Monday, March 2.
- Nebraska's win over Colorado marked the third time this season Nebraska held an opponent to under 50 points (San Jose State,

- 46: IPFW. 48). Nebraska and Colorado set the Big 12 record low for combined points in NU's 46-41 victory in Lincoln.
- Nebraska tied the NCAA record with zero turnovers in a half in the opening period against Colorado at home and in the first half against Texas A&M. Nine times this season Nebraska has committed three or fewer turnovers in a
- Nebraska has forced three conference opponents (Kansas State, 25; Kansas, 21; at Texas Tech, 20) into 20 or more turnovers in a game this season.
- The Huskers lead in the league in fewest turnovers at 11.6 per game.
- NU is second in the league and entered the week seventh nationally in turnover margin.
- The Huskers were also in the top 75 nationally at the start of this week in turnovers per game (19th), steals per game (38th), assistto-turnover ratio (57th) and 3-point field-goal percentage (69th).
- In 28 games, only three teams (No. 6/5 Oklahoma, Oklahoma State in overtime and Kansas State) have topped the 70-point plateau against the Huskers this year. Two of those games - at Oklahoma and Kansas State were on the road.
- NU tied the school record (originally set at lowa State in 2002) with only three turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore. NU also had just six turnovers against Saint Louis and Colorado, seven at No. 6/5 Oklahoma and vs. Iowa State, and eight vs. Kansas and Texas A&M.
- With victories at Texas Tech and Colorado, Nebraska won consecutive road games in conference play for the first time since 2006-07. when the Huskers won at Missouri and came from 13 points down to win at Texas Tech. Overall it was just the fifth time since the formation of the league that the Huskers won consecutive road league contests.
- Nebraska posted its second double-figure comeback victory of the season by erasing a 12-point, second-half deficit vs. then-No. 16/17 Texas to win 58-55. It marked the ninth straight season NU has defeated a ranked team. NU currently owns a 5-12 record against ranked squads under Doc Sadler.
- Nebraska has 187 3-pointers this season. The 2009 Huskers move onto the season top-10 list at Kansas State on Saturday, and now rank seventh in school history. In each

of coach Doc Sadler's first two seasons, the Huskers posted at least 190 3-pointers and ranked in the top six in Nebraska history. Only four previous NU teams have posted 200 or more 3-pointers in a season.

Individual quick notes

- Senior guard Ade Dagunduro has posted at least 20 points in a game four times in Big 12 Conference play. He had not scored 20 points in any of his first 46 career games at Nebraska.
- Dagunduro is the only Husker averaging double figures on the road, as he has posted 11.1 points on 47.4 percent shooting in 10 games away from Lincoln. He has gained a team-best 18 steals but has only one 3-pointer (1-of-6) on the road this season.
- In conference road games, Dagunduro has averaged 12.4 points on 54.7 percent shooting while Ryan Anderson adds 10.3 points on 48 percent shooting. Cookie Miller is third in scoring in league road games at 8.1 ppg but has 31 assists against 14 turnovers, and adds a team-best 14 steals.
- Over the last five games, Dagunduro has averaged 17.4 points on 55.2 percent shooting while Anderson has added 11.0 points on 54.1 percent shooting, including 40.0 percent from 3-point range.
- Earlier this season Dagunduro hit 26-of-32 (81.3 percent) over a four-game span (ending with Maryland Eastern Shore).
- Dagunduro tied the school single-game record by hitting all nine field-goal attempts against UMBC, the second-best single-game mark in the league during the Big 12 era. He also set a new school record with 15 straight made field-goal attempts over three games.
- Senior guard Paul Velander has 58 treys and needs four 3-pointers to break into the Nebraska single-season top 10. He is already tied for eighth on the NU class list. Only five Huskers have had more than 60 3-pointers during their senior season, and only one has had more than 67 (Cary Cochran with school record 89 in 2002).
- Junior guard Ryan Anderson recorded his 100th career steal earlier this year against Kansas at home. He is nearing the Nebraska career top 10 as he needs 19 steals to reach the list.
- Sophomore guard Cookie Miller leads the team with 101 assists. He is the first Husker to lead NU in assists as a freshman and sophomore since Tyronn Lue in 1995-96 and 1996-97.

- With three assists against lowa State at home, Miller also joined Tyronn Lue as the only Huskers in program history to post at least 100 assists in each of their freshman and sophomore seasons.
- Redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson posted two steals against Iowa State in the home finale, moving onto the NU freshman top 10 chart. He now has 25 steals this season (in 24 games) and is tied with Ryan Anderson for eighth in the frosh record book.

CLOSE CALLS

Despite struggling on offense much of the season, Nebraska has been in nearly every game at the very end, leading to a large number of close calls this year.

Overall, the Huskers have had 11 games this season decided by six or fewer points with Nebraska holding a 5-6 record. The Huskers had 14 games decided by six or fewer points in coach Doc Sadler's first two seasons combined.

- Seven of the games in 2008-09 have been decided by one possession, with the Huskers holding a 3-4 record in games decided by three points or less. Nebraska had just four games decided by one possession in coach Doc Sadler's first two years at Nebraska.
- Nebraska is 2-2 in conference games decided by three points or less following its last-second loss to Texas A&M.
- The last time Nebraska had more than 11 games decided by six or fewer points in a season was 2000-01. Nebraska went 7-9 in those games that year.

BETTER AND BETTER

While the Huskers have found tough times on offense through much of conference play, one constant throughout the season has been the play of senior guard Ade Dagunduro.

The Inglewood, Calif., native has put his name into consideration for all-conference honors by averaging better than 15 points per game in league action while helping the Huskers fight for an upper division finish and a second straight postseason berth.

- Dagunduro has averaged 15.1 points per game in league action to rank among the top 12 scorers in the conference. He has 226 points through 15 Big 12 games, more than double his total in 16 contests last year (93 points, 5.8 ppg).
- He also ranks in Big 12-only stats in rebounding (t-16th) and field-goal percentage (4th).

- Dagunduro has scored at least 17 points in six games against Big 12 foes this year, including a career-high 24 points in a six-point setback against Kansas and again in a 16-point win vs. Iowa State. Last year, his Big 12 single-game high was 14 points at Kansas State.
- Dagunduro has scored in double figures in 12-of-15 Big 12 games this year, after posting just four double-figure scoring games against conference teams last year.
- He leads the team in Big 12 play with 5.0 rebounds per game. Dagunduro is also the team leader in league action for field goals (81), field-goal attempts (151), field-goal percentage (53.6), free throws (57), free throw attempts (83) and blocked shots (8).

SADLER SETS MARK

Husker coach Doc Sadler has quickly gained the attention of the rest of the coaches in the Big 12 Conference as, in just three seasons, he has made Nebraska one of the toughest squads to prepare for in the league.

A skillful tactician and master motivator, Sadler's excellence on the sideline has taken hold as he has shot up the NU record book.

- Sadler surpassed Moe Iba's school record for most wins in the first three seasons on the NU sideline when the Huskers gave Sadler his 54th victory, 77-61 victory over Iowa State at home on March 4.
- Sadler previously tied the school record with 37 wins in his first two seasons, equaling the mark originally set by Paul Schlisser who coached two years at Nebraska in the early 1920s.
- Last year, Sadler joined Danny Nee as the only Nebraska coaches to reach the postseason at least once in their first two seasons on the Husker sideline.
- Sadler and Nee are the only two Nebraska coaches since World War II to post at least one 20-win season in their first two years.

BACK TO THE 50S

Nebraska has been one of the top defensive teams in the nation each of the past two seasons under coach Doc Sadler.

The Huskers led the Big 12 Conference in scoring defense in 2007-08, allowing just 60.7 points per game to rank 18th nationally. It was the Huskers' best scoring defense since 1982 (55.3 ppg).

- Nebraska entered this week ranked 17th nationally in scoring defense and is currently holding teams to 59.4 points per game despite allowing a season-high 77 points at Kansas State last weekend. In league play, the Huskers are also first in scoring defense, allowing 62.4 points per game in Big 12-only games.
- Nebraska is one of only two league teams (also Kansas, 64.9 ppg) allowing less than 68.0 points per game in Big 12 play.
- Through 15 Big 12 games, the Huskers have held five teams to 55 or fewer points, including Missouri (51), Kansas State (51), at Colorado (53), Texas (55) and vs. Colorado (41). Nebraska previously had held four league teams to 55 or fewer points in coach Doc Sadler's first two seasons combined. The Huskers also held Texas A&M to 57 points to give it six games allowing less than 60 points in league action.
- Before this year against Colorado (53 points) and Texas (55), the last time Nebraska held consecutive Big 12 opponents to 55 or fewer points was 1999 when NU held lowa State and Colorado to 52 points apiece in back-to-back road games.
- Dating to last season, Nebraska has held seven of its last 10 Big 12 Conference foes at the Devaney Center to 57 or fewer points. Three times in that frame the Huskers have held teams under 50 points.
- Nebraska's 59.4 ppg scoring defense gives the 2009 Huskers a chance to become only the second NU squad since 1951 to allow less than 60 points per contest for a whole season. In that span, only the 1982 NU squad has finished a season allowing less than 60 points per contest, as it gave up 55.3 points per game to rank 10th nationally.
- NU has held teams to 55 or fewer points 30 times under coach Doc Sadler in the past three years, including 11 times against league opponents.

AND ONE IN THE 40S

Nebraska's defensive effort reached even deeper when it faced Colorado at home on Feb. 18. The Huskers needed the strong defensive effort as Nebraska's offense struggled to score against the Buffs, but still managed to record a 46-41 victory.

- The 87 combined points were a Big 12 record low. The previous low was 89 points between two teams on two occasions, both in 2006 and with both games involving Texas A&M.
- The Huskers held CU to 41 points, marking the fifth time in the past six meetings NU held the Buffs to 55 or fewer points, and second straight game in Lincoln it held CU to 49 or fewer points.
- Colorado's 41 points were the fewest Nebraska has allowed a league opponent since giving up just 41 points in a two-point loss to Kansas State in the 1984 Big Eight Tournament.
- Nebraska's 46 points were the fewest by the Huskers in a victory since 1966, when NU defeated Oklahoma 45-41 in Stillwater, Okla., in a game that went into overtime.

HANDLING WITH CARE

Nebraska coach Doc Sadler has preached that the Huskers need to be efficient within their offense and not give away easy points. That philosophy includes taking care of the ball, something the Huskers have succeeded in doing well this season.

- Despite posting a season-high 20 turnovers at No. 17/19 Missouri on Feb. 14, NU has averaged just 11.6 turnovers per game this season and entered the week ranked 19th nationally in the category.
- The Huskers are first in the Big 12 Conference after several noteworthy performances, particularly when NU had zero turnovers in the first half in games against Colorado and Texas A&M. In conference-only games, NU also leads the league standings for turnovers per game at 11.5, joining Texas (11.7 tpg) as the only teams averaging less than 12 turnovers per game in Big 12 play.
- Nebraska tied the NCAA, Big 12 and school record with zero (0) turnovers in the first half at home against Colorado and turned the trick again in the opening frame against Texas A&M. NU posted its Big 12-best with six total miscues against the Buffs, all after the half, while finishing with eight TOs against the Aggies.
- The Huskers tied the school record by committing just three turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore. NU equaled the

team mark originally set in 2002 at Iowa State. Nebraska had just one turnover in the first half against Maryland Eastern Shore, and two miscues following the break.

- The Huskers began the week ranked No. 7 nationally in turnover margin. Nebraska currently has a +5.6 margin to rank second in the Big 12 Conference entering the weekend.
- Nebraska posted just six turnovers against Saint Louis, tying the previous low mark for miscues in Sadler's first three years. NU also had just six turnovers against Colorado in 2007, and at home vs. the Buffs in 2009.
- Nebraska posted 10 turnovers at Kansas, marking the 11th time overall under coach Doc Sadler that NU had 11 or fewer turnovers in a game away from Lincoln. It was the fourth time this season (also at Oregon State, 11 TO; 7 at Oklahoma; 11 at Texas Tech; 10 at Kansas).
- The Huskers have recorded nine halves this season with three or fewer turnovers.

FINDING ROAD SUCCESS

Nebraska has seen its share of road struggles in the past but the Huskers put that behind them on Saturday, Jan. 31, when NU snapped a three-game losing streak with an 82-69 victory over Texas Tech in Lubbock. The win also snapped a four-game regular-season Big 12 road losing streak dating to last year.

Nebraska made it two straight league road wins when it defeated Colorado 55-53 in Boulder. It was the fewest points Nebraska has allowed on the road since giving up 42 points in a 15-point victory at Kansas State in 2006.

The Huskers broke out quickly in both games before making key plays down the stretch to hold on for victory.

■ Nebraska hit 55.1 percent (27-of-49) from the field against Texas Tech, easily its best performance on the road this season. The Huskers followed up with a 47.4-percent effort at Colorado. NU has hit better than 43 percent from the field only one other time (at Kansas State, 49.0 percent) in its other eight games away from Lincoln this year.

NOTING THE IOWA STATE GAME

- Nebraska improved to 17-11 and 7-8 in the Big 12 Conference with the 77-61 win. With one regular-season game left, Nebraska now has a chance to finish with a .500 league record for the first time in a decade. The last time Nebraska was at least 8-8 in Big 12 play was 1998-99 when NU went 10-6 to finish tied for fifth.
- Nebraska started all four of its seniors on Senior Night. It was the third career start for Paul Velander and first career start for Nick Krenk.
- The Huskers scored 77 points in the game, marking their highest point total in a Big 12 Conference home game this season and highest since scoring 78 in an overtime loss to Missouri on Feb. 23 last season. It was the Huskers' second straight game topping the 70-point plateau after six straight games not reaching 60 points.
- Senior Ade Dagunduro tied his career high with 24 points in the victory. Dagunduro also scored 24 against Kansas on Jan. 28. In the Huskers' eight Big 12 home games this season, Dagunduro averaged 17.4 points per game while scoring 20-or-more points three times. Overall, Dagunduro has scored 20 points four times this season.
- Nebraska had three first-half turnovers. Over the last three home games combined, NU has had just three turnovers before the intermission as the Huskers tied an NCAA record with zero (0) turnovers in the first half against Colorado and Texas A&M. NU finished with seven turnovers in the game.
- Junior guard Ryan Anderson hit his first two 3-point attempts and finished 3-of-4 from 3-point range. He has now hit 13-of-27 from 3-point range over the past eight games.
- Redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson had two steals and now has 25 to move into the Nebraska freshman top 10. He now sits in a tie for ninth place with Ryan Anderson.
- Junior guard Sek Henry had a balanced night offensively. In addition to scoring nine points, Henry dished out a season-high tying four assists, while pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. Henry's previous career high in rebounds was seven.
- Nebraska shot 52.0 percent from the field in the game, marking the eighth time this season the Huskers have shot 50 percent or better, and the first time since hitting 55 percent at Texas Tech..
- The Huskers hit eight 3-pointers in the game, marking the eighth time this season they have knocked down at least eight 3-pointers, including the second time in conference play.

DIAZ JOINS HUSKERS; WILL REDSHIRT

After an entry process that took longer than anticipated, Nebraska finally got some good news regarding freshman center Brian Diaz. The 6-11, 235-pounder was admitted to the University of Nebraska and was enrolled in classes on Jan. 17.

He was originally cleared by the NCAA Clearinghouse in September 2008 before finally making it to Nebraska as a true freshman in January when he was immediately eligible to play. Diaz suited up against No. 6/5 Oklahoma and Oklahoma State, but did not play in either contest.

Diaz told coach Doc Sadler of his intention to redshirt this season prior to the Kansas game on Jan. 28. He will sit out this season and will have four years remaining.

Diaz, whose given name is Jorge Brian Diaz, added to a Nebraska lineup that was listed by kenpom.com as the shortest in the nation. Before Diaz joined the squad, the Huskers had just one eligible scholarship player who stood taller than 6-6 (Chris Balham, 6-8; 10.0 minutes per game).

Diaz also gives NU 12 scholarship players this season, as Nebraska entered the year with an open scholarship and lost one scholarship player at the semester.

The Huskers could have a dramatically different look next season. Not only will the Huskers have the 6-11 Diaz, but 6-11 Christopher Niemann is sitting out this year under an NCAA eligibility ruling and NU has signed 6-9 Brandon Ubel for next season as well.

HUSKERS ROLL UP WINS AT HOME

When coach Doc Sadler took over the program before the 2006-07 season, Nebraska made winning at home a priority especially in the non-conference season

- Following the win over Florida A&M to end the nonconference schedule, Nebraska is now 29-1 under Coach Doc Sadler at home against non-conference opponents.
- Before falling to UMBC, Nebraska's last home loss to a non-conference team came on Dec. 3, 2005 against UAB in a 73-72 setback.
- The Huskers are 42-2 in non-conference play at home since last suffering consecutive home non-league losses in 2004-05.
- During the school-record tying 31-game home nonconference win streak, NU had one game decided by five or fewer points (two-point win over Creighton this year) and one other decided in overtime (win over Oregon at Qwest Center).

- The last time Nebraska won a conference road game when scoring 55 or fewer points was Feb. 4, 1984, at Kansas State when the Huskers won 47-46.
- When the Huskers allowed Colorado just 53 points in Boulder, it was only the 12th time in the Big 12 era that Nebraska held its opponent to under 60 points in a road contest. The Huskers improved to 9-3 in those games.

- The 55.1 percent shooting at TTU is NU's best in a league road game since hitting 59.0 percent from the field in a 65-59 win at No. 22 Texas A&M last season, the last road victory in league regular-season play before downing the Red Raiders.
- The Huskers' 82 points at Texas Tech were their most in a Big 12 game since March 5, 2007, when NU scored 85 in a win over Oklahoma State at home. That was a span of 26 games before the Huskers topped the 80-point plateau (home, away or Big 12 Championship).
- The last time Nebraska scored at least 80 points on the road was an 87-83 overtime loss at No. 7 Oklahoma State on Feb. 21, 2004, a span of 37 Big 12 regular-season road games before topping the 80-point mark again.

STEALING THE SPOTLIGHT

Nebraska has been among the national leaders for steals all season, entering this week ranked No. 38 in the country. The Huskers currently average 8.5 steals per game to rank second in the league. Overall seven Huskers have posted at least 19 steals this year, with six averaging at least 1.0 steal per game.

It's much of the same from a pair of familiar faces when it comes to steals. Junior guard Ryan Anderson and sophomore guard Cookie Miller have shown an impressive court awareness since joining the Huskers and have been among the teams' top defenders despite their size.

- Anderson became just the 14th player in Nebraska history to record 100 steals in a career when he picked off one pass against Kansas on Jan. 28. At his current pace (12th in the Big 12 entering the week), Anderson could finish this season just outside of the Nebraska top 10.
- Miller ranks 11th in the league in steals at 1.5 per contest and has a chance to reach 100 before the end of his sophomore season. He moved into the Nebraska all-time top 15 with one steal in the victory over No. 16/17 Texas.
- Miller is trying to join Cookie Belcher and Erick Strickland as the only Huskers ever with at least 100 steals at the end of their sophomore seasons. Belcher had 162 in his first two years while Strickland had 107. Belcher owns the Nebraska freshman record for steals with 87 and holds the NU and Big 12 Conference record with 353 steals in his career.
- Overall the Huskers have three players ranked in the top 12 in the Big 12 Conference listing for steals. Along with Anderson and Miller, Steve Harley leads the Huskers and ranks seventh in the league at 1.6 steals per game (43 total), including ranking fifth in league-only games.

TURNING TEAMS OVER

Nebraska has turned up the defensive pressure this season, especially while playing with a heavily guard-oriented lineup, including many sets with five guards on the floor at once.

That strong defensive push was evident in NU's opener as they forced 25 San Jose State turnovers. Spartans' point guard Justin Graham was frustrated into 10 turnovers while going 0-of-5 from the floor in 33 minutes of action.

- The 25 turnovers NU forced against San Jose State were the second-highest total under Coach Doc Sadler. The most turnovers a Husker squad has forced in Sadler's tenure is 26 last season against North Carolina Central.
- NU also forced a season-high tying 25 turnovers against Kansas State on Jan. 17.
- The Huskers have now forced 482 turnovers through 28 games, while allowing teams to record just 305 assists on 569 baskets.
- The Huskers have forced at least 20 turnovers in nine games this year. Last year, the Huskers forced 20 turnovers in a game six times all season.

- The 24 turnovers forced at Oregon State are the most by a Husker opponent away from Lincoln since Texas Tech had 26 turnovers against Nebraska in the first round of the 1999 Big 12 Championship.
- Nebraska posted 16 steals in the defensive effort against San Jose State, the most by the Huskers under Sadler. The previous best under Sadler was 15 steals vs. North Texas in 2006.
- The Huskers have had double-figure steals seven times this season and at least eight steals in 21 games this season.
- The most steals in a game by a single Husker this season is five on two occasions, most recently by sophomore guard Cookie Miller who tied his career high with five at Texas Tech. Junior guard Ryan Anderson also had five steals against Kansas State on Jan. 17. Four other players have recorded eight games with four steals each.

- The defensive pressure has helped Nebraska to a 515-325 advantage in points off turnovers this season.
- Nine Huskers have recorded a steal this year, including six averaging at least 1.0 steal per game.

BOMBS AWAY

Nebraska has been strong from outside the arc during coach Doc Sadler's tenure, including this year. The Huskers are among the national leaders, hitting 37.3 percent from long range. Last season, Nebraska hit 34.2 percent from beyond the arc.

- Sek Henry has become one of the team's most improved 3-point shooters this year, as he has hit 35.3 percent (24-of-68) from long range. He came into the year hitting just 26 percent in his first two years, draining 37-of-140 attempts. He already has more 3s this year than either of his first two seasons (17 and 20, respectively).
- Paul Velander has been effective this season from beyond the arc as he is hitting 43.3 percent to currently rank fourth in the Big 12 Conference.
- Velander is also 10th in the league in 3-pointers made. He currently has 58 treys after nailing 3-of-7 over the past four games. In the seven games before that, he had hit just 7-of-31 from 3-point range.
- Nebraska has hit better than 40 percent from the 3-point line as a team seven times this season, including at least 50 percent five times this year. The Huskers hit at least 50 percent from long range three times against Big 12 Conference teams at home (vs. Kansas, Texas and Iowa State).
- The Huskers have hit 10 or more 3-pointers three times this season, including against Alabama State (14), Florida A&M (10) and Kansas State (10).
- Nebraska hit an impressive 14-of-25 (56.0 percent) from beyond the arc against the Alabama State. NU "only" connected on 51.7 percent (30-of-58) from the floor overall.

2008-09 SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska faced a rugged schedule as it played 13 of its 29 regular-season games against teams that reached the 2008 postseason. Eight of the 13 game against postseason teams were played at the Devaney Center. Among the Huskers' opponents that reached last year's NCAA Tournament were: NCAA champion Kansas (twice), Elite Eight participant Texas, NCAA second-round qualifiers Kansas State (twice) and Texas A&M along with NCAA qualifiers Baylor, Oklahoma and UMBC. NU also faced Arizona State, Creighton, Alabama State and Oklahoma State, all of which played in the postseason NIT.
- The Huskers played 18 regular-season games at the Devaney Center for the second straight season. Last year, the Huskers went 15-3 in the building with the only losses coming to eventual national champion Kansas and NCAA qualifier Baylor, along with an overtime setback to Missouri.
- Nebraska played its 500th game in the Bob Devaney Sports Center last season. Through March 4, the Huskers own a 398-125 record in their 33rd season at the Devaney Center, good for an impressive .762 winning percentage.
- Nebraska have keep an outstanding home winning streak alive in 2008-09 as the Huskers have posted their 33rd straight winning season at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The Huskers, who are 14-4 at home this season, have never had a losing season in the Devaney Center since the building opened for the 1976-77 campaign.
- The Huskers played three true road games during the non-conference slate, facing Arizona State in the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series along with Oregon State and TCU. It was the sixth time in the Big 12 era that the Huskers played at least three true road games in non-league action and the first time since 2004-05 when Nebraska played at UAB, Marquette and Tennessee.
- The Huskers have been seen on television within the state at least 24 times during the season, including every road game for the second straight year. Every conference road game will be televised for the third consecutive season. The Huskers have averaged more than 13 televised contests (national, regional and local) each of the past seven years.
- Nebraska has been seen nationally at least eight times this season on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, FSN and CBS College Sports. More than 10 additional games will also be available around the country on satellite.

HUSKERS SIGN FOUR FOR 2009-10

Third-year coach Doc Sadler announced Friday, Nov. 14, that a strong lineup of four talented athletes, including three standing 6-8 or taller, have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Nebraska basketball squad for the 2009-10 season. Among the signees are: 6-10, 220-pound center Vander Joaquim from Luanda, Angola (see note at bottom of column); 6-8, 210-pound forward Christian Standhardinger from Munich, Germany; 6-9, 220-pound forward Brandon Ubel from Overland Park, Kan.; and 6-2, 175-pound point/shooting guard Rayes Gallegos from Jordan, Utah.

"I'm excited about this class and what they can bring to Nebraska," Sadler said. "When we go on the road, something we look for in addition to talent is character, and that has been a continued priority this year. I feel good about the way they will represent Nebraska. On the court, I feel they will help us continue to improve and compete for a Big 12 championship."

- Joaquim averaged 21.1 points and 16.8 rebounds per contest last year with 89 blocks. He was ranked at one point the No. 12 high school center in the country by Scout.com (71st nationally overall) and No. 15 center by Rivals.com (115th nationally overall). Joaquim was tabbed the No. 2 power forward on the West Coast by Scout.com before moving to West Virginia to attend Mountain State Academy in 2008-09.
- Standhardinger was named the MVP of the NBBL in 2008 and in the final of the 2008 U19 German Championship, he scored 37 points and posted 12 rebounds. He also earned top scorer honors at the Europe's Best Junior Tournament in 2007 and was the MVP of the German Top 4 in 2007. Standhardinger also was a member of the German Junior National Team in 2007 and 2008. This season, Standhardinger has averaged 19.1 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.3 steals and 1.1 assists per game for his club team as of late November.
- Ubel is a skilled forward with a nice touch from outside who also possesses the ability to score off a number of post moves and mid-range jumpers. Last year as a junior, he helped Blue Valley West to the state tournament and his team won the Class 6A state title during his sophomore season. During the summer AAU circuit, Ubel averaged close to 20 points and eight rebounds per game for the Wedman. He owns a 4.1 grade-point average in high school and his sister, Kayla Ubel, is a sophomore on the NU track team.
- Gallegos came on during the summer AAU circuit when he averaged about 25 points per game. Gallegos was rated the No. 53 shooting guard in the country by Scouts.com and was tabbed the No. 7 shooting guard on the West Coast. Gallegos was the team's third-leading scorer at 10.5 points per game as a junior, helping the team to the state tournament.

NOTE: Vander Joaquim left Mountain State Academy following Christmas. He enrolled at the College of Eastern Utah, a junior college, for the second semester this year. He is expected to redshirt this year and start playing at CEU during the 2009-10 season.

- The 14 3-pointers were the most by the Huskers since hitting 15 against Miami on the road in the 2006-07 season. The school record is 18 3-pointers against No. 1 Kansas in 2002.
- Six Huskers hit from outside the arc, including four players with three 3-pointers apiece. Sek Henry led the way with a perfect 3-for-3 night beyond the arc while Ryan Anderson (3-of-4), Steve Harley (3-of-5) and Paul Velander (3-of-6) each had three treys apiece.
- Nebraska had another game where all the shots were falling as the Huskers hit 10-of-18 (55.6 percent) against Kansas State on Jan. 17. Velander hit 6-of-10 by himself, while Cookie Miller connected on all three of his attempts. NU hit 50.0 percent overall from the field.
- After struggling in recent weeks, the Huskers hit 50.0 percent (8-of-16) from beyond the arc against Iowa State on Wednesday, helping Nebraska to a 16-point victory. It was the first time in five games that NU had hit above 40 percent from 3-point range. The eight treys were Nebraska's most since posting eight against No. 6 Oklahoma on Jan. 21 (11 games).

KEEPING OPPONENTS IN LINE

While the 3-point line moved back one foot – from 19-9 to 20-9 – for the first time in men's college basketball this season, Nebraska's 3-point defense has improved dramatically with the change in the line.

- Nebraska's 3-point defense this year has been solid as opponents have hit just 33.1 percent from beyond the arc. Last season, opponents hit 36.4 percent on the year.
- The Huskers currently are tied for second in the Big 12 Conference in that category. NU has held eight teams under 25.0 percent shooting from beyond the arc this season.
- Thirteen of Nebraska's 28 opponents have been held to five or fewer 3-pointers in a game, including five with three or fewer.

ON THE GLASS

The Huskers will put a small lineup on the floor just about every night this season, giving coach Doc Sadler reason to be interested in Nebraska's rebounding, especially on the defensive end. All of NU's guards will need to be capable rebounders this season to keep the opposing team from getting easy baskets on second chances.

■ Through 28 games, Nebraska trails on the glass by over five rebounds per game (-5.6 rpg, 34.0 to 28.4).

- Nebraska has trailed on the glass in 21 contests this season, including each of its first seven league contests before outrebounding Colorado on the road. Overall, the Huskers have trailed on the boards in 18 of the past 22 games.
- NU has trailed on the boards in all but two of its Big 12 contests, and has a -7.7 rebounding margin in league action. Nebraska's 38 rebounds against No. 17/19 Missouri were its second-highest total of the season and just the second time in league play NU outrebounded (38-36) an opponent.
- Nebraska's +8 rebound advantage at Colorado (30-22) was its biggest against a league squad. The Huskers' -22 margin at Kansas (46-24) was its worst. Nebraska's two least productive rebounding games came against KU (-26 and -16).
- Nebraska, which is listed as the shortest team in Division I by kenpom.com, held nearly even on the boards against Texas, the Big 12 Conference's tallest team. UT only posted a +4 (34-30) advantage on the glass over the Huskers.
- NU has had at least 10 offensive rebounds in a game eight times, most recently at Kansas State when 11 of the Huskers' 25 boards were on the offensive glass. NU also had at least 10 offensive boards at No. 6/5 Oklahoma (10) and against Kansas (13), Texas (11) at home and at Missouri (11).

LINE TIME

Nebraska has had its ups and downs at the free throw line this season, but one of the better efforts came at just the right time in a road game at Texas Tech.

The Huskers hit 76.7 percent (23-of-30) from the line vs. the Red Raiders, including 80.8 percent (21-of-26) in the second period to pull away for an 82-69 victory. The Huskers had entered the game hitting 68.1 percent from the charity stripe.

- The 76.7 percent from the foul line is still Nebraska's third-best effort this season when attempting at least 20 free throws in a game. The only times NU has topped the mark was when it hit 87.1 percent (27-of-31) against Oklahoma State and 81.3 percent (18-of-22) at Kansas State.
- Senior guard Ade Dagunduro did most of the hard work against Texas Tech, hitting all 10 of his attempts from the line. He entered the game hitting 69.0 percent from the free throw line on the season.

■ Dagunduro became just the fifth Husker in the Big 12 era to hit all of his free throws when attempting at least 10 in a game, and the second under coach Doc Sadler. Overall, he's the 12th Husker since 1982 to accomplish the feat.

DAGUNDURO PUTS UP ALL-BIG 12 STATS

After a sluggish start to the season, senior guard Ade Dagunduro has turned up the intensity on both ends of the court during league play and now should be in the mix for All-Big 12 honors.

One of the most athletic players in the league, Dagunduro has recently brought his scoring average up to lead the squad with 12.8 points per game. He has scored in double figures in 17 of the past 21 games, including at least 17 points eight times.

In Big 12 play, he is averaging a team-best 15.1 ppg. He is averaging a team-best 5.0 rebounds per game in Big 12 action (no other Husker is over 3.8 rpg) and he has 24 assists, 17 steals and eight blocks while hitting 53.6 percent (81-of-151) from the field.

- Dagunduro started the season averaging just
 4.8 points per game in three contests against
 San Jose State, TCU and Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- Dagunduro has set a career high by scoring in double figures in his last seven consecutive games. Previously, he had scored in double figures five straight games just once, in nonconference play. Last year, he did not score in double figures more than three consecutive contests.
- The senior posted a then-career high in the Big 12 opener, gaining a game-high 20 points on 6-of-11 shooting while helping Nebraska to its third league-opening win in 13 years. He also had five rebounds and three steals in 29 minutes.
- Dagunduro had the best offensive game of his career against Kansas at home, posting a career-high 24 points on 10-of-16 shooting. He added five rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block in 29 minutes while helping the Huskers remain within one point in the final 30 seconds.

- Dagunduro recorded his second straight 20-point performance while helping Nebraska to a road victory over Texas Tech. He hit 5-of-6 from the field and 10-of-10 at the line for 20 points, while adding a season-high tying six rebounds with three assists and three steals.
- The senior tied his career best on Senior Night, pouring in 24 points on 9-of-15 shooting to help Nebraska earn a 77-61 win over lowa State. He had six boards, one block and one steal in 33 minutes while dueling his close friend, ISU's Craig Brackins, who had 25 points and 13 rebounds before fouling out.
- He also had solid games with 17 points and nine boards against No. 16/19 Texas, 18 points and six boards vs. Colorado at home and 16 points and seven rebounds at Kansas State.
- Possibly Dagunduro's biggest points of the non-conference season came in the final seconds of a comeback victory over Creighton. The Inglewood, Calif., native got free on the right block when his defender hedged to the middle of the lane as Steve Harley drove to the basket. Harley made a nice wrap-around pass to Dagunduro, whose uncontested layup with 2.7 seconds remaining was the game-winner.
- Dagunduro's slow start this season was the exact opposite of last year, which has been a good thing for the Huskers in the long run. Dagunduro started 2007-08 on fire, averaging 11.8 points per game in non-conference play while hitting 54.8 percent from the field. In league action last year, he gained only 5.8 points per game while knocking down just 40.4 percent from the field.

RECORD PERFORMANCE

Senior guard Ade Dagunduro had a breakout game against UMBC as he posted 19 points in 27 minutes of action. He topped his previous career best of 17 points last year in an overtime road loss to Western Kentucky.

Dagunduro scored 15 of his 19 points against UMBC in the second half and added three rebounds, three assists, two blocks and two steals for an impressive all-around performance.

But the most impressive aspect of Dagunduro's line on the stat sheet was the field-goal column. He finished the game hitting 9-of-9 attempts from the field, helping Nebraska hit 48.9 percent from the floor.

- Dagunduro tied the school single-game record by hitting all nine of his attempts from the field against UMBC.
- Dagunduro became the fifth Husker in history to connect on nine consecutive shots from the floor in a single game. It was the fourth time

HUSKERS EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

Nebraska senior guards Paul Velander and Nick Krenk were each named to the Academic All-Big 12 first team, the conference office announced March 5. For Velander, it was the third straight season he was a first-team pick, making him the seventh Husker ever to win three straight accolades. Krenk was named to the team for the first time in his career.

Velander was previously named to the 2008-09 CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District 7 First Team in the University Division on Thursday, Feb. 5. Velander was the only Big 12 player to earn the honor.

In mid-December, Velander earned his first academic accolade of the year as he was among 30 candidates for the 2008-09 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I studentathlete in nine sports.

HUSKERS VS. RANKED TEAMS

Nebraska has defeated at least one ranked team for nine straight years since the 2000-01 campaign. This year, the Huskers are 1-4 vs. ranked squads with the lone victory coming against No. 16/17 Texas, 58-55.

Overall, Nebraska is 5-12 against ranked squads under coach Doc Sadler with one road victory at No. 22 Texas A&M, 65-59, last year.

Nebraska has won at least two games against ranked teams in two of the past three seasons. The three wins last year against ranked teams are the most for the Huskers since going 4-1 against ranked squads in 1998-99.

The Huskers are 8-14 in their last 22 games against ranked opponents since defeating No. 4 Oklahoma State in Lincoln in 2005. The win over Oklahoma State was NU's first victory over a top-10 squad since beating No. 7 lowa State in overtime in Ames in 1996-97.

The win against OSU in 2005 was the Huskers' first against a top-five team since the 1994 Big Eight Tournament, when the Huskers knocked off No. 3 Missouri. The last time NU had defeated a top-five team at home was 1993, when the Huskers beat No. 3 Kansas.

The Huskers own a 55-204 all-time record against ranked teams (AP poll), including a 19-107 mark against teams ranked in the top 10 and an 11-61 mark against top-five squads. The Huskers are 19-59 against ranked teams in the Big 12 era, including 2-27 against top-10 teams and 1-16 against top-five squads.

MCCRAY NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Nebraska redshirt freshman guard Toney McCray was named the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in a vote by league sportswriters on Monday, Nov. 17. McCray was honored alongside Oklahoma's Blake Griffin, who won the league's player-of-the-week award.

The 6-6, 205-pounder from Missouri City, Texas, was the Huskers' leading scorer and rebounder in both its exhibition win and the season-opening win over San Jose State. McCray, one of four Huskers who redshirted last year, quickly made his presence felt on the court as he posted a game-high 17 points against the Spartans. He also added a team-high nine rebounds, just missing out on becoming the first Husker since Aleks Maric to produce a double-double in his first career game. McCray added a steal and an assist in 23 minutes off the bench, helping the Huskers to a 43-16 advantage in bench scoring.

McCray is the second player in Coach Doc Sadler's three years to earn the league's rookie-of-the-week award. Last year, guard Ade Dagunduro won the award on Dec. 17 for his effort in helping the Huskers defeat nationally ranked Oregon. Overall, McCray is the eighth Husker to win the league award. Only two players, Joe McCray and Kimani Ffriend, have won the rookie-of-the-week award more than once for the Huskers as each earned it two times in their first season in Lincoln.

JONES OPTS FOR SURGERY

Coach Doc Sadler announced during his postgame press conference on Dec. 3, that Eshaunte 'Bear' Jones is done playing this year because of a foot injury.

"He's finished as far as playing for this year," Sadler said. "We wanted to try to get through the year because he's such a good offensive player and he has some size, but he's not going to be able to play anymore."

On the year, Jones played in four contests, averaging 1.8 points and 1.3 rebounds per game. He played 16 minutes in the season opener and then 12 minutes, 13 and 5 over the next three games before sitting out against Creighton and Alabama State. He had successful surgery on his foot on Dec. 18 and is expected to need a 3-4 month rehab.

NIEMANN INJURES KNEE

Coach Doc Sadler announced during his postgame press conference on March 4 that Christopher Niemann suffered an ACL injury earlier that day and now will require surgery before returning to the court. Niemann injured his knee while working out on his own following a game-day shootaround before the lowa State contest in Lincoln.

CHAPMAN LEAVES NEBRASKA

Sophomore Alex Chapman transfer away from NU following the end of the fall semester. The forward from Canby, Ore., had not played in a game in his three semesters at Nebraska after suffering a knee injury that required surgery during the preseason each of the past two years.

Despite sitting out because of injury, Chapman was the Huskers' tallest eligible player this season before he left the team.

- Dagunduro's mark was originally believed to be a single-game conference record, however, since then it has been established that Colorado center David Harrison had a 10-for-10 effort versus Baylor in 2004. It is believed that Dagunduro's mark ties for second place in the Big 12 record book.
- Dagunduro extended his streak of consecutive made field-goal attempts to 15 over three straight games, setting a new Nebraska record. He had three made shots to end the game against IPFW, added nine against UMBC and then hit his first three against South Carolina State to surpass Mikki Moore, who held the previous NU record by hitting 13 straight shots in three games in 1997.

■ Dagunduro's streak of 15 straight made shots fell two shy of the old Big 12 record. His streak is second in the league this season behind Baylor's Quincy Acy, who set the new Big 12 record by making his first 20 attempts from the field to start his career.

MILLER READY TO LEND A HAND

Cookie Miller was the only true freshman to play for the Huskers last year when he posted near-record numbers for assists (109) and steals (58). This year, he is trying to take it a step higher as one of the top returning point guards in the Big 12 Conference.

Miller was sixth in the league in assists (3.6 apg) last year and the only freshman in the top 10 for assist-to-turnover ratio (1.7). He was fourth in the Big 12 for steals (1.93), and led the league in Big 12-only contests (2.0 spg).

- This season, Miller leads NU with 101 assists (3.7 apg) and is second on the team with 40 steals (1.5 apg). He is one of seven Huskers with at least 19 steals.
- Miller has 53 turnovers to go with his 101 assists, helping him rank in the top eight in the Big 12 Conference in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.9-to-1).

- After posting a season-high five miscues with one assist against Kansas State on Jan. 17, Miller rebounded to have his best game distributing the ball at Oklahoma. He had seven assists with just two turnovers against the No. 6/5 Sooners on the road. Miller also had seven assists on the road against Kansas State.
- Miller has had at least four assists in 15 contests this season, including five straight games to end non-conference play. He has had six assists six times, including posting six assists with just one turnover against Kansas in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Miller was efficient in leading the Huskers to a win in the Big 12 opener against Missouri. He had three assists against two turnovers in 36 minutes, but helped NU continually break the Tigers' press. His defense also helped NU force MU into 16 turnovers with only 10 assists after the Tigers came into the game ranked third nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio. Miller also drew three charges, all in the first half, against MU.
- Miller also sparked a struggling Husker squad in the second half against IPFW. He came off the bench and posted six assists, including four in the second half, with four steals to lead the Huskers to a come-from-behind victory.

HENRY ADDING TO ARSENAL

After a strong offseason, junior guard Sek Henry started out on a tear while helping the Huskers win six straight games to open a season for just the second time in the Big 12 era.

Henry has been more consistent on offense this season than at any point in his career. He is averaging 8.1 ppg to rank third on the team.

- Henry has posted double figure points 12 times in 28 games this season, after scoring in double figures just nine times in the first 64 games of his career. Henry posted double figures five times last year and four times as a freshman.
- Henry posted 19 points against each Saint Louis and Florida A&M, one off his career high and the most points he has scored at home in the Devaney Center. He nearly matched the mark with 18 points vs. South Carolina State.
- Henry added 13 points against Missouri to help Nebraska to a win in the Big 12 opener. It was the second-highest point total of his career against a Big 12 squad, trailing the 14 points he scored last season at Missouri.
- Overall, he has scored at least 10 points five times in league play this season after posting double figures just four times in his first two Big 12 campaigns combined (35 games including league tourney).

- Henry has hit 78-of-174 shots (44.8 percent) from the field, including 24-of-68 (35.3 percent) from 3-point range this season. His career averages entering this season were 36.7 percent shooting and 26.4 percent from beyond the arc.
- Henry has twice this season tied his career high with four steals in a game. He is currently fifth on the team with 28 steals through 28 contests.
- On the glass, Henry set a new personal high with nine rebounds against lowa State. He just missed his first career double-double as he had eight points, while also tying his season high with four assists.
- Henry raised his free throw average significantly of late, hitting 39 of his last 53 (73.6 percent) attempts over the past 17 games. Henry hit an impressive 7-of-8 from the line against UMBC after entering the game hitting 45.0 percent in his first nine games, and followed with a 7-of-9 effort against SCSU.

ENERGY GUY

Following the season-opening contest against San Jose State, Coach Doc Sadler praised several players for their energy and hustle, especially the ones off the bench.

Leading the way that day was redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson, who posted six points, three rebounds, an assist and four steals in 16 minutes in his career debut.

Richardson's numbers did not tell the whole story as he made several dives to the floor and other hustle plays to ignite NU in the second half after SJSU cut the lead from 18 points to five. His steal off an inbounds and three-point play turned the game around, helping NU score 10 points in less than a minute to pull away for good.

Following another strong performance in Nebraska's game against IPFW, Sadler said:

- "Brandon Richardson makes plays that don't show up on the box score. When we went to the 1-3-1 for the first time (that night), he made two huge hustle plays. He does things that might give you three or four more possessions that you wouldn't otherwise get in a game."
- After sitting out the first four games of Big 12 Conference action with an injury, Richardson came back to hit 2-of-3 attempts, including both 3-point tries, to score eight points in 15 minutes against Oklahoma State.
- Richardson scored 11 points in a road victory at Texas Tech. He came off the bench to hit 4-of-5 shots, including 3-of-4 from long range, in 19 minutes.

- In another strong road performance, Richardson scored a career-best 12 points on 3-of-5 shooting to lead Nebraska at No. 17/19 Missouri. He added four rebounds, two assists and a steal in 20 minutes.
- He has posted at least three steals in a game three times this year. He is sixth on the team with 25 steals, and reached the Nebraska freshman top 10 against Iowa State. His 25 steals tie him with Ryan Anderson for ninth on the Nebraska frosh chart.

ENERGY GUY...TOO

Along with Richardson, senior Paul Velander has also been praised by Sadler for his energy coming off the bench, including following the Saint Louis game. In his postgame press conference that night, Sadler said:

- "We've got to get the rest of the team to make effort plays like Paul Velander. There's not a player in the country who makes more effort plays than that guy."
- Velander has come off the bench to hit 58 3-pointers in 28 games, including 12 games with at least three treys apiece. He is fourth on the team in scoring at 7.5 points per game.
- Paul Velander has hit at least three 3-pointers in 12 games this season. Dating to last year, he has hit at least three treys in 17 of his last 37 games. Before that, he had hit at least three 3-pointers in a game just six times in his first 51 career games.
- Velander struggled in the seven games starting with the Jan. 24 game against Oklahoma State. In that span, he hit just 8-of-33 attempts (24.2 percent) from long range before getting back on track by hitting a 3-of-7 in the past four games. Before that, he led the nation by hitting 50.0 percent (48-of-96) to open the year.
- Velander is currently fourth in the Big 12 Conference in 3-point percentage, hitting 43.3 percent from behind the arc.
- Entering the regular-season finale at Baylor, Velander needs four 3-pointers to move onto the Nebraska single-season top-10 chart. Velander also currently ranks sixth in NU single-season history for 3-point percentage.
- Velander posted as career-high tying 20 points behind a career-best six 3-pointers against Kansas State on Jan. 17.
- Velander leads the team with 25 charges taken in 28 games, including three against each San Jose State and Saint Louis. If the statistic were kept nationally, it's possible that Velander would lead the nation in charges taken.

VELANDER REACHES TOP 10

Senior guard Paul Velander is the second Husker this season to place his name on the Nebraska career 3-pointers made top-10 list, following junior guard Ryan Anderson.

- Velander hit 1-of-2 from long range in the Big 12 opener against Missouri to match Ray Richardson's mark for 10th place. He now is eighth in Nebraska history with 126 treys. He moved past teammate Ryan Anderson as Velander posted six 3-pointers against Kansas State on Jan. 17, although Anderson has caught him again and they are tied at 126.
- Velander has hit at least three 3-pointers in 12 games this year, with a career-high six against Kansas State (6-of-10 overall).
- Velander leads the team with 58 3-pointers in 28 games despite struggling lately. He has hit 10-of-38 over the past 11 games, although he has connected on three of his last seven over the past three games.
- Velander's 43.3 percent accuracy from beyond the arc is currently fourth in the Big 12 Conference.

ANDERSON, VELANDER AMONG HUSKERS' MOST ACCURATE DUOS

Senior Paul Velander has become one of the most accurate long-range shooters in Nebraska history.

The only fifth-year player for the Huskers this season, Velander ranks sixth in NU history for 3-point field-goal percentage at 40.3 percent (126-of-313) while coming off the bench in 85-of-88 contests.

He leads the team with 58 3-pointers this season, including three or more 3s in each of 12 games this year. With Anderson and Velander, four of the players in the NU top 10 have played under coach Doc Sadler.

■ Velander's effort finally rubbed off on his teams against IPFW. NU had six charges taken, each by a different individual, including one by Velander. As a team, NU has taken 51 charges in 28 games this year.

BALHAM MAKING MOST OF MINUTES

Junior forward Chris Balham has been limited by chronic knee problems throughout his career and while he has not been able to practice or get on the court in games as much as he and coach Doc Sadler would like, Balham has made the most of his court time lately.

- Over his last 16 games played (he missed the CU contest at home), Balham has averaged 12.4 minutes per game, with a total of 198 minutes of action. He saw 46 minutes of action combined in his first seven games of the year, with a high of 10 minutes at TCU. He also missed four games this year because of chronic knee issues.
- He played 18, 14, 17, 14, 10 and 12 minutes, respectively, between the Maryland Eastern Shore and Oklahoma games, the first time in his career he gained at least 10 minutes in more than three straight games. Overall, he has played at least 10 minutes in 13 of the last 17 games he has played.
- Balham played a Big 12-high 17 minutes against Texas, the tallest team in the conference. He fared extremely well, posting six points on 2-of-3 shooting while adding three boards, including two on the offensive end, as Nebraska was outrebounded by just four boards, 34-30.
- He came back to log another 17 minutes at No. 17/19 Missouri, posting a team-best-tying seven rebounds (three offensive) with two points.
- Balham tied his career high with eight boards vs. Florida A&M. He added six boards on the road at Texas Tech for his most in conference play this year. Of his 50 rebounds in his past 16 games played, 24 are offensive boards.
- Balham scored a season-high seven points in consecutive games near the end of the non-conference slate this season. The only time Balham has scored more than seven points (his totals against SCSU and UMES) in a game was a career-high 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting in a road win over No. 22 Texas A&M last season.

HITTING FROM LONG RANGE

At 6-4, guard Ryan Anderson may be a little undersized to play in the front court, but he is one of the biggest players on the court when he steps outside the 3-point line. Anderson has made a living with the long ball, hitting 126 treys in his career to tie teammate Paul Velander for eighth in NU history.

- Despite being one of the best 3-point shooters in the league the past two years, Anderson has struggled this season. He has hit 28-of-82 attempts (34.1 percent) after coming into the season hitting better than 39 percent in his career.
- Anderson's best long-range game this year came with four 3-pointers at No. 6/5 Oklahoma, marking the 15th time in his career he has had at least three treys in a single game. He also had three treys earlier this season against Alabama State and at home on Senior Night against lowa State.
- He went 3-of-3 from the field against Florida A&M but did not attempt a 3-pointer. It was the first time in 30 games that he did not attempt a 3-pointer in a game. He also did not attempt a trey at Texas Tech, just the sixth game in his career he did not shoot from long range.
- Anderson is the only Husker ever to post at least 48 treys in each of his first two years at Nebraska.
- Anderson ranks second on the NU freshman list with 48 3-pointers in 2006-07 and last year posted 50 treys to rank third on the Huskers' sophomore chart.
- Only Nebraska's all-time 3-point leader, Cary Cochran, made more shots from outside the arc by the end of his sophomore season, as Cochran had 101 through two years.

COMEBACK KIDS

Under coach Doc Sadler, the Nebraska Cornhuskers have become a team that is hardly ever out of a contest as it has shown the determination and will to come back repeatedly in difficult situations.

Nebraska's most recent account of a major comeback was against No. 16/17 Texas at home on Feb. 7. The Huskers trailed by 12 points early in the second half and by 10 points with just under 11 minutes remaining. NU continued to chip away at the lead and went ahead with less than two minutes remaining before Ade Dagunduro's 3-pointer in the final minute sealed the 58-55 victory.

It was the second time this season Nebraska posted a significant come-from-behind win. Against Creighton, the Huskers were keyed by a strong second-half performance from Steve Harley and Cookie Miller. Harley finished with a game-high 18 points with three steals and had the key assist on Dagunduro's game-winning basket with 2.7 seconds remaining. Miller posted six assists and two steals and got the Huskers' offense into high gear after trailing by 13 points at halftime.

- By coming back from 12 points down against Texas, the Huskers made their ninth double-digit comeback against league teams in the Big 12 Conference era. It was the second time under Sadler, as NU came back from 13 points down on the road against Texas Tech in 2007.
- The 13-point deficit the Huskers overcame against Creighton matched the largest comeback under Coach Doc Sadler. It tied for the second-largest comeback by Nebraska during the Big 12 era, matching the 13-point deficit NU overcame at Texas Tech.
- The largest deficit Nebraska has rebounded from to win since the formation of the Big 12 Conference was 20 points against Kansas State in the first year of the league (1996-97). KSU also had the biggest halftime lead that NU has overcome in the Big 12 era as the Wildcats led by 18 points at the break.

■ Nebraska nearly added another fantastic finish to the list as it rallied from a 16-point halftime deficit, and 20-point overall deficit in the first half, to have the final shot at the win against UMBC.

- The near comeback against UMBC came just three days after the Huskers rallied from a five-point halftime deficit at home to pull away for a 75-48 victory over IPFW.
- In an continuing theme, NU fell behind by 13 points at Iowa State before battling back to tie the game at 45-45 with under seven minutes to play. With 2:13 remaining, NU trailed by just two points, 55-53, but saw the Cyclones go on a 10-0 run to end the game.
- Unfortunately, the Huskers saw the other end of a comeback against Texas A&M as Nebraska led by 18 points twice in the second half before the Aggies rallied. The Huskers led the whole second half until Josh Carter's 3-pointer with less than a second remaining gave A&M the come-from-behind victory.

FOUR HONORED BY NEBRASKA BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

On the weekend of Jan. 16-17, the Husker basketball program proudly inducted two new members into the Nebraska Basketball Hall of Fame when former coach Danny Nee and Husker standout Erick Strickland earned the prestigious honor. Nee and Strickland were joined in the celebration by Kent Pavelka, the Bud Cuca Special Merit Award winner, and Rex Ekwall, the Distinguished Hall of Fame Alumni Award winner.

Nee and Strickland joined elite company. Nee is the sixth head coach enshrined in the hall and first since 1996, while Strickland is only the second player inducted in the past five years.

Nee recorded more wins at Nebraska than any coach, accumulating 254 victories over 14 years. He led the Huskers to five NCAA Tournament and six NIT berths, as well as the 1994 Big Eight Tournament and the 1996 NIT titles. Nee led NU to a school-record 26 wins in 1991 and earned league coach-of-the-year accolades as the Huskers posted the school's highest-ever final ranking of No. 9 (AP) and 11 (UPI). He coached 10 of Nebraska's 25 1,000-point scorers and recruited and coached all three of NU's first-round selections in the NBA Draft (Rich King, 1991; Eric Piatkowski, 1994; Tyronn Lue, 1998), as well as 1999 Big 12 Player of the Year Venson Hamilton (second-round NBA pick).

Strickland was a key component of Husker squads that won 79 games between 1992-93 and 1995-96, with three seasons earning at least 20 wins. During his career, Strickland played in two NCAA Tournaments and two NITs, including helping Nebraska win five straight games in March to earn the 1996 NIT championship.

Strickland played in 127 games with 84 starts, while averaging 12.5 points per game for his career. A native of Bellevue, Neb., Strickland was the MVP of the 1996 NIT and earned Big Eight All-Defensive Team honors three times. A complete player, Strickland ranks third in Nebraska history in career games played, fourth in 3-pointers (179), third in 3-point attempts (512), fifth in assists (414) and second all-time at Nebraska in steals with 257.

Following his Husker career, Strickland earned a spot in the NBA as a free agent, playing more than 500 games over nine years in the league primarily with Dallas and Milwaukee.

Pavelka is the 19th person to earn the Special Merit Award and first since 2003. The award is given to someone who helps shape the Husker basketball program from a supporting role. Pavelka returned to the microphone as the Huskers' basketball voice in 2006-07, and now has more than 20 years under his belt calling Nebraska hoops.

Ekwall, a letterwinner for the Huskers from 1955 to 1957, still holds the Nebraska career record for rebounding average, as he pulled in 679 boards in 65 games for an average of 10.4 per game. More than 50 years after he last played, Ekwall is still 10th on the rebounds chart and 35th in scoring at Nebraska (880 points, 13.5 points per game).

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 1-10)

GAME 1 VS. SAN JOSE STATE (NU 63, SJSU 46)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers jumped out of the gate in fine fashion, using a 17-0 second-half run to keep San Jose State at bay in a 63-46 victory at the Devaney Center. The Huskers went into halftime with an 18-point lead but saw it nearly vanish as, at one point, NU went more than eight minutes without a field goal. SJSU cut the lead to five before redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson and senior Paul Velander turned it up a notch on defense and redshirt freshman Toney McCray led the Huskers on offense as they picked up their sixth straight season-opening victory. McCray paced the squad with 17 points and nine rebounds while Velander added nine points on three 3-pointers. Nebraska harassed the Spartans into 25 turnovers on the day while collecting 16 steals, the most under third-year coach Doc Sadler.

GAME 2 AT TOU (NU 62, TOU 50)

Playing in their first road game of the season, the Nebraska Huskers responded in strong fashion, holding off TCU for a 62-50 victory in Ft. Worth. The win snapped a streak of 12 straight losses in true road openers, and was only Nebraska's third win in the Big 12 era in the first game of the season away from Lincoln. Nebraska shot the ball well from 3-point range, hitting 5-of-10 from beyond the arc in the opening period while overcoming 15 first-half fouls. NU used a 9-0 run to burst out to a 37-24 lead at the break. The Huskers were up 16, 42-26, before the Horned Frogs mounted a comeback, pulling within seven, 46-39, before redshirt freshman Toney McCray drained a 3-pointer from the corner with the shot clock winding down to ignite the offense. Nebraska held TCU to just 10 field goals, including only three 3-pointers on 19 attempts, as the Horned Frogs shot just 27.0 percent from the floor. The 50 points were the fewest NU has allowed in a true road opener since 1977.

GAME 3 VS. ARKANSAS-PINE BLUFF (NU 67, UAPB 53)

Nebraska was sluggish to start but picked up the pace over the final minutes of the first half and held off a hard-nosed effort by Arkansas-Pine Bluff, 67-53, at the Devaney Center. The Huskers used a 17-3 run over the last 7:42 before halftime to go into the break up 32-24. Sek Henry scored 12 of his 14 points in the opening frame while Steve Harley led the Huskers with 18 points in the contest. Nebraska forced 23 turnovers and won despite losing the battle on the boards, 33-27. Along with Harley and Henry, Paul Velander added three 3-pointers for the third straight game and Brandon Richardson had the best of his young career, scoring nine points with two assists in 23 minutes. NU had 11 steals in the contest with Henry leading the way with four.

GAME 4 VS. SAINT LOUIS (NU 71, SLU 57)

Sek Henry and Ade Dagunduro jump-started the Husker offense and Nebraska executed the defensive game plan to near perfection, running away with a 71-57 victory over Saint Louis. Henry hit 7-of-8 attempts from the floor for a game-high 19 points, just one off his career high. He added four assists without a turnover, as Nebraska had just six turnovers as a team. Dagunduro added 14 points on 5-of-7 shooting, after entering the game with just 13 points in his first three games. He helped Nebraska hit 59.1 percent from the floor, including an impressive 65.0 percent in the second half. Saint Louis led 28-20 on the boards, but were held to just 41.7 percent shooting. NU kept the Billikens off the scoreboard for just over six minutes while powering to a 9-0 run. The surge extended the Husker lead to 16 points with just over three minutes to play, sealing the victory.

GAME 5 VS. CREIGHTON (NU 54, CU 52)

Steve Harley scored a game-high 18 points, but it was his lone assist that made the biggest difference as Harley set up Ade Dagunduro's game-winner in the final seconds of a tremendous comeback victory. Harley, who hit 8-of-16 shots from the floor and tied his career high with six rebounds, had the ball on a designed play for him in the final seconds. With the shot clock off, Harley drove the lane with less than seven seconds remaining. As he got into the lane, Creighton hedged to the middle and while in the air, Harley fed the ball to a wide-open Dagunduro, who had an uncontested layup with 2.7 seconds remaining to give NU the win. Nebraska hit just 30.4 percent from the floor in the first half and trailed by 13 points at the intermission. NU used a 27-7 surge, including a 13-0 run that included three 3-pointers, to move back ahead and hold on for its fifth straight victory to open the season. The 13-point comeback tied the largest for a Husker squad under Coach Doc Sadler, equaling the mark set in 2007 on the road against Texas Tech. Dagunduro finished with 11 points while Cookie Miller's strong second-half play helped him finish with six assists, four rebounds and two steals off the bench as Nebraska won for just the second time in the last 10 regular-season matchups between the in-state opponents.

GAME 6 VS. ALABAMA STATE (NIL 80, ASIL 51)

Nebraska had four players record three 3-pointers apiece as the Huskers hit 14 treys on the night while running past Alabama State, 80-51, to end a four-game home stand at the Devaney Center. Steve Harley led the way with 16 points including a trio of 3-pointers while Ryan Anderson added 11 points by hitting 3-of-4 from long range. Anderson, who moved into the career top 10 for 3-pointers made with the effort, added a game- and career-best seven assists without a turnover. Nebraska posted 23 assists on the night as it hit 51.7 percent from the floor, including a blistering 56.0 percent from beyond the arc. Sek Henry was a perfect 3-for-3 from long range while Paul Velander added his fifth game with three 3-pointers. The Huskers also held Alabama State to 51 points on 36.0 percent shooting, including a paltry 25.0 percent from long range.

GAME 7 AT NO. 19 ARIZONA STATE (ASU 64, NU 44)

No. 19 Arizona State used a pair of key runs and strong second-half play by All-America candidate James Harden to ease past Nebraska, 64-44, at Wells Fargo Arena in Tempe. The Sun Devils evened the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series with the Huskers at 1-1. NU defeated ASU, 62-47, last year in Lincoln. Nebraska came out strong and led by as many as five points as ASU had just one basket in the first 10 minutes of the game. The Sun Devils stormed back at the end of the period, using a 15-2 run to end the frame and go into the locker room with a 30-18 advantage. After the break, a key 8-0 surge spurred by Harden knocked back the charging Huskers. Harden finished with 20 points, nine rebounds and six assists. The Huskers struggled against the ASU zone, hitting just 28.9 percent from the field with only Steve Harley (11 points) reaching double figures.

GAME 8 AT OREGON STATE (OSU 64, NU 63)

Ade Dagunduro's arcing shot from the baseline hit off the back of the rim and bounced away at the buzzer as Oregon State held on for a 64-63 victory over the Huskers in Gill Coliseum as the Huskers dropped their second straight road game. The teams went back and forth all game, accumulating 11 ties and 20 lead changes before the Beavers got four free throws in the final 30 seconds from Daniel Deane to ice the game. Dagunduro put NU up 63-62 on a pair of free throws with 11 seconds remaining before Deane had the ball stripped, but Cookie Miller was called for the foul to put Deane at the line with 8.3 seconds left. Deane hit both and Miller's jumper at the other end missed and went out of bounds with 1.1 seconds remaining to set up Dagunduro's final attempt. Dagunduro led the Huskers with 16 points while Toney McCray came off the bench for 13 points, seven rebounds and two steals.

GAME 9 VS. IPFW (NU 75. IPFW 48)

Nebraska was sluggish in the first half and trailed by five, 34-29, at the intermission following a 16-4 run by IPFW to end the period. But the Huskers, led by Steve Harley and Cookie Miller, caught fire on offense in the second half and clamped down defensively while posting their 31st consecutive non-conference home win to tie the school record. Harley scored a career-high 21 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the floor, helping Nebraska hit at a scorching 60.9-percent clip from the field. He had 12 points at the half and became the first Husker this season to eclipse the 20-point plateau. Miller continually set up Harley and his teammates, finishing with six assists without a turnover. He had four steals and seven points off the bench, although he started the second half, and helped Nebraska to a 31-8 run to put the game away. Defensively, the Huskers held IPFW to just 14 points on 21.7 percent shooting in the second period while forcing 24 Mastodon turnovers.

GAME 10 VS. UMBC (UMBC 66, NU 64)

The Huskers' furious second-half rally came up just short as Nebraska fell at home to a non-conference opponent for the first time since 2005, falling 66-64 to UMBC. NU never led in the contest and trailed by as many as 20 points in the first period following a 13-0 run. UMBC led by 16 at the intermission before the Huskers started a comeback, cutting within two points in the final minute. Nebraska held the Retrievers without a field goal over the final 6:42 to get back into the contest, but UMBC hit 15-of-18 at the free throw line, including their last nine points, to record the upset. Ade Dagunduro led the comeback with 15 of his career-high 19 points in the second period. He finished the game 9-of-9 from the field, tying the NU single-game record for field goals without a miss. Dagunduro's basket with 30 seconds remaining cut the deficit to three points, and after the teams traded free throws, Paul Velander had a trey that would have tied the game rim out with 14 seconds left. NU added a free throw by Steve Harley to cut it to the final deficit but one last shot attempt with under a second was blocked out of bounds. Velander finished with 14 points including four 3-pointers while Harley had 13 points and Sek Henry added 12 points.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 11-19)

GAME 11 VS. SOUTH CAROLINA STATE (NU 77, SCSU 63)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers made their final appearance at the Bob Devaney Sports Center in 2008 a happy one as they used a strong second half to run past South Carolina State, 77-63. Sek Henry nearly tied his season high with 19 points while Ade Dagunduro scored 14 points and finished 5-of-8 from the field. Dagunduro set a school record as he knocked down his first three attempts from the floor, extending his consecutive field-goals made streak to 15 straight over three games. He surpassed the previous Nebraska record of 13 consecutive made field goals by Mikki Moore in the 1997 NIT. Dagunduro and Henry helped the Huskers to a 15-0 run in he second half, pushing a tie out to a 51-36 advantage. Henry was 7-of-9 at the free throw line, as the Huskers got to the stripe 35 times (22 made) while hitting 46.3 percent from the field in their second-highest scoring game before New Year's.

GAME 12 VS. MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE (NU 88, UMES 56)

Senior guard Ade Dagunduro continued his torrid shooting, hitting 8-of-9 shots from the floor to help Nebraska hit better than 60 percent from the field for the second time in four games as the Huskers ran to a 32-point victory. Dagunduro scored 18 points by hitting his first eight shots from the floor while Steve Harley added 12 points. Ten other Huskers also scored, as Nebraska posted its highest point total in regulation under Coach Doc Sadler. The Huskers' offensive efficiency came as NU tied the school record by turning the ball over only three times (once in the first half, twice after the intermission), while adding 18 assists on 33 baskets. Nebraska hit 28-of-39 from inside the 3-point line and limited the Hawks to 41.3 percent shooting, including just 32.0 percent in the second half. Dagunduro helped Nebraska to a 13-0 run late in the second half that pushed the lead out to 36 points.

GAME 13 VS. FLORIDA A&M (NU 81, FAMU 56)

Junior guard Sek Henry tied his season high with 19 points and the Cornhuskers hit better than 55 percent from the field for the second straight game as NU ran past Florida A&M 81-56. The Huskers topped the 80-point plateau for the third time this season and only the third time in the past three years NU has reached the mark in consecutive games. Henry got Nebraska out early as he hit 8-of-14 from the floor, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range, in just 24 minutes to pace the Huskers. He helped Nebraska hit 10 3-pointers, their second-highest total in non-conference play. Senior Steve Harley had 15 points and senior Paul Velander came off the bench to hit four 3-pointers for 12 points. Chris Balham added a career-high tying eight rebounds, as Nebraska held a +14 advantage on the glass, its highest total in non-conference play this season. Despite hitting 37.7 percent from the field overall, FAMU kept it from being a bigger deficit by hitting 9-of-13 from 3-point range in the second period. The Rattlers hit 12-of-24 from long range on the game.

GAME 14 VS. MISSOURI (NU 56, MU 51)

Guards Ade Dagunduro and Sek Henry combined for 33 points and eight rebounds and the Huskers held off a furious second-half comeback to earn a 56-51 victory over Missouri at the Devaney Center. The win was Nebraska's fifth in the last six games against the Tigers under coach Doc Sadler while marking the Huskers' first win in a Big 12 opener since 2005-06. Overall, NU improved to 3-10 in league openers since the formation of the Big 12. Dagunduro got the Huskers started strong, pouring in 13 first-half points as Nebraska opened a 32-18 lead the intermission. NU went ahead by as many as 18 early in the second half before the Tigers started to rally. Leo Lyons and DeMarre Carroll, who came into the game combining for more than 31 points per game, were held scoreless in the first half but posted 19 points in the second frame. The inside punch helped the Tigers rally to tie the game at 51 with less than two minutes remaining, but MU never took the lead in the game as Henry's driving basket down the baseline put NU back on top for good. Ryan Anderson set a season high with 10 rebounds, including one with less than 10 seconds remaining and his three free throws in the final seconds iced the victory for Nebraska.

GAME 15 AT IOWA STATE (ISU 65. NU 53)

Nebraska fell behind by 12 points at halftime and despite a strong comeback that included tying the game at 45-45 with under seven minutes to play, the Huskers fell at Iowa State, 65-53, to drop to 1-1 in the Big 12 Conference. Ade Dagunduro led NU with 13 points, but his missed layup with less than six minutes to play was the last chance the Huskers had to take a lead as Iowa State capitalized on the offensive end over the final minutes of the contest. ISU hit four of its last five field-goal attempts and 3-of-4 free throws, all in the final three minutes, to pull away for the double-figure victory. Point guard Cookie Miller had a season-high 11 points and Steve Harley had 10 points despite going 4-of-14 from the floor. Nebraska led 13-12 on Miller's third basket of the opening half but ISU used a 15-1 run to break up the contest. The Cyclones led 32-20 at the break and held NU to 34.5 percent shooting in the game while outrebounding the Huskers 42-28.

GAME 16 VS. KANSAS STATE (NU 73, KSU 51)

Nebraska hit 50.0 percent from the floor behind the solid shooting of Paul Velander and Cookie Miller, who combined for 35 points in the Huskers' 73-51 victory over Kansas State. The win against the Wildcats served as the largest margin of victory over a Big 12 opponent under coach Doc Sadler, and was the largest vs. a conference team since defeating No. 25 Texas Tech, 72-44, in 2004. Velander tied his career high with 20 points, connecting on 6-of-10 shots from 3-point range while adding two steals in 25 minutes. Miller posted a season-high for the second straight game, earning 15 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including hitting all three of this 3-point attempts. They combined to help NU hit 10-of-18 from long range and 15-of-18 at the free throw line to offset KSU's 33-22 lead on the boards. KSU was held to 41.5 percent shooting, including 23.1 percent (3-of-13) from 3-point range. The Wildcats were forced into 25 turnovers, as the Huskers had nine steals and 15 assists, although they also turned the ball over 15 times.

GAME 17 AT NO. 6/5 OKLAHOMA (OU 72. NU 61)

Ryan Anderson scored 19 points, including 17 in the first half, to help Nebraska keep pace with the No. 6/5 Sooners, but in the end Oklahoma was too much for the Cornhuskers as it pulled away for a 72-61 victory in Norman. The game was still in doubt heading into the final minutes as the pesky Nebraska defense kept the Huskers within a basket until a decisive 8-0 Sooner run over the final four minutes gave OU its 18th win of the season. Anderson scored a season high with 19 points, after scoring just 11 points in the first three conference games combined. He hit four 3-pointers in the first half and helped Nebraska to a 38-32 lead at the intermission. Nebraska, which led by as many as seven points in the game, withstood an OU rally and had the score tied at 53-53 and had two possessions to try to take the lead. Anderson misfired on a 3-pointer on the first try and Steve Harley missed a pair of free throws before OU's Austin Johnson hit a 3-pointer to put the Sooners ahead for good. Blake Griffin, who did not score his first basket until nearly 12 minutes into the game, had 16 second-half points on his way to a 27-point, 18-rebound game. Despite Griffin's individual domination on the glass, OU outrebounded the Huskers by only three boards, 39-36.

GAME 18 VS. OKLAHOMA STATE (OSU 76. NU 74. OVERTIME)

After trailing early, Nebraska came back to force overtime but was unable to hold on to a lead in the extra period as Oklahoma State snapped the Huskers' five-game home Big 12 Conference win streak dating to last season with a 76-74 overtime victory. The Cowboys became just the second team this season to hit better than 47 percent from the field against Nebraska, which allowed a season high for points for the second straight game. Cookie Miller's free throws with 20 seconds left in regulation tied the game at 66-66 and his defense on Byron Eaton in the final seconds forced a missed shot, leading to overtime. In the extra frame, NU led with just over two minutes to play but could not hold on. Miller led the way with a career-high tying 19 points, including hitting 9-of-10 at the free throw line as NU knocked down 27-of-31 at the stripe overall. Ryan Anderson added 14 points and eight rebounds for his second straight solid game off the bench while five players scored in double figures for the Cowboys, who held a 35-26 advantage on the glass.

GAME 19 VS. KANSAS (KU 68, NU 62)

In another down-to-the-wire finish, the Cornhuskers were within one point in the final two minutes but were unable to get over the hump as Kansas held on for a 68-62 come-from-behind victory at the Devaney Center. Nebraska shot just 30 percent from the field in the second half but Sek Henry's consecutive 3-pointers 25 seconds apart cut the deficit from seven to one, 63-62, with 1:06 to play. After a pair of KU free throws with 29 seconds remaining, the Huskers had the ball with a chance to tie but a turnover – one of only eight Husker miscues in the game – led to the Jayhawks icing the game at the line. Nebraska forced Kansas into a season-high 21 turnovers, but KU's young squad overcame the ballhandling mistakes by hitting 56.4 percent from the field and taking a 38-22 advantage on the glass. Nebraska led by as many as 13 points in the first half and held a slim, 34-29, lead at the intermission. Ade Dagunduro led the Huskers with a career-high 24 points on 10-of-16 shooting, his second 20-point game in six league games.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 20-28)

GAME 20 AT TEXAS TECH (NU 82, TTU 69)

Unlike the last time the Huskers went to Lubbock when they needed to rally from a 13-point halftime deficit to win at the buzzer, the Huskers took control from the opening tip and in the end, pulled away for an 82-69 victory over Texas Tech. Nebraska built a 17-point lead in the first half and 18-point advantage in the second period before holding on after furious Red Raider rallies to end each half. TTU pulled within three in the final four minutes of the first half and, after coach Pat Knight was ejected following two technicals with 9:49 remaining in the game, the Red Raiders pulled within five twice down the stretch at the end of the game. NU squashed the rallies by hitting their free throws (23-of-30) and pressuring TTU in 20 turnovers. The Cornhuskers hit 55.1 percent (27-of-49) from the field with Ade Dagunduro leading the way with 20 points, six boards, three assists and three steals. Cookie Miller tied his career high with 19 points while adding five assists and five steals, and Brandon Richardson came off the bench to post a career-best 11 points on 3-of-4 shooting from long range.

GAME 21 AT COLORADO (NU 55, CU 53)

Nebraska built a seven-point lead in the last minute but had to hold on as Colorado made a furious push at a comeback that included cutting the lead to one with 18 seconds remaining. After NU missed the second of two free throws, CU's Cory Higgins took the ball up the court, driving right through the middle of the lane and making his way to the basket, but his floater hit off the back of the rim and Sek Henry rebounded. Henry missed both free throws with 2.6 seconds left but Colorado's desperation 60-foot heave fell short as the Huskers held on for a 55-53 win. Nebraska led by as many as nine points in the second half and had a seven-point lead twice in the first half before leading by two, 27-25, at the break. Ryan Anderson and Steve Harley had 12 points apiece for the Huskers, who hit 47.5 percent from the field but just 54.2 percent from the free throw line. NU also outrebounded the Buffs, 30-22, the first time in Big 12 play that Nebraska held an advantage on the glass.

GAME 22 VS. NO. 16/17 TEXAS (NU 58, UT 55)

The Cornhuskers put together a strong defensive effort and hit timely shots as they knocked off at least one ranked opponent for the ninth straight season with a 58-55 victory over No. 16/17 Texas at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. Nebraska trailed by seven at the intermission and faced a 12-point deficit early in the second half before responding for their second win this season when rallying from a double-digit deficit. The Huskers got back into the game as they wore down the Longhorns with lengthy offensive possessions, taking the shot clock under five seconds on several occasions before hitting a big basket, including three 3-pointers in the final minutes. Ade Dagunduro hit the biggest of the baskets, connecting on his first 3-point attempt in three games with just over 50 seconds remaining to give NU a four-point cushion. A.J. Abrams drained a 3 seconds later to cut the lead back to one, but the Huskers hit 2-of-4 free throws down the stretch to ice the victory. Dagunduro posted a team-best 17 points with a career-high nine rebounds while redshirt freshman Toney McCray added eight points and five rebounds off the bench.

GAME 23 AT NO. 17/19 MISSOURI (MU 70, NU 47)

After a sluggish start the first few minutes of the game, the No. 17/19 Missouri Tigers turned up the defensive pressure and got into a groove with their transition game to run past Nebraska 70-47 at Mizzou Arena. The Tigers snapped Nebraska's threegame win streak by holding NU to 28.6 percent shooting and forcing 20 turnovers, the worst numbers of the season in each category. The Cornhuskers hung around through the first half, trailing by just six at the intermission. Nebraska again pulled back within six points with about 14 minutes to play, but Missouri turned up the intensity to a level NU could not match and the Tigers pulled away. One bright spot in the worst loss of the season was redshirt freshman Brandon Richardson, who led Nebraska with 12 points on 3-of-5 shooting. He also added career bests in rebounds (4) and assists (2). Senior Ade Dagunduro added 11 points and seven rebounds, helping Nebraska outrebound only its second Big 12 foe of the year, 38-36.

GAME 24 VS. COLORADO (NU 46, CU 41)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers clamped down on defense right from the start and held on for a 46-41 victory over Colorado to sweep the season series for the fourth time in the Big 12 era. The Huskers' 46 points were their fewest in a victory since 1966 and the 41 points allowed to a league opponent were the fewest since 1984. The teams set a Big 12 record for fewest combined points at 87, two lower than the previous mark set in 2006. Nebraska led from start to finish but got out front by only eight points on two occasions as the Buffs hit enough shots to stay in it until the end. CU hit just 31 percent from the field and had 16 turnovers while Nebraska connected on 34.8 percent with six miscues. Nebraska had zero turnovers in the first half. Ade Dagunduro led the Huskers with 18 points and six rebounds but was the only Husker scoring in double figures.

GAME 25 AT NO. 15/18 KANSAS (KU 70, NU 53)

Kansas's stifling defense held the Huskers to 38.2 percent shooting and the Jayhawks dominated the glass as No. 15/18 Kansas rolled to a 70-53 victory over Nebraska at Allen Fieldhouse. Looking for its first win in Lawrence in more than 10 years, the Huskers held close in the opening minutes but a 10-0 KU run as the Huskers went without scoring a point for nearly seven minutes. The Jayhawks hit 50 percent from the floor in the opening frame and ran to an 11-point lead at the intermission behind guard Sherron Collins' hot hand, as he hit four straight baskets in less than three minutes late in the period. In the second half, the Huskers cut the deficit to six on two occasions early in the period but KU's tall frontcourt limited the Huskers' second-chance opportunities and then dominated the offensive glass. KU held a 46-24 overall advantage on the boards, including a 15-4 margin on the offensive end.

GAME 26 VS. TEXAS A&M (TAMU 57, NU 55)

Nebraska lost out on a golden opportunity to move up in the league standings as it let an 18-point lead slip away as Texas A&M rallied for a two-point victory. The Huskers held command nearly the whole way, leading by 13 at the intermission and moving ahead by 18 points with under 17 minutes remaining in the game. Nebraska again led by 18 points with 14:23 left on a pair of Brandon Richardson free throws. Richardson added two more free throws with 8:50 to play, the Huskers' only points in more than eight minutes until Cookie Miller's driving layup put NU ahead 52-45 with 6:07 to play. Nebraska still had a seven-point lead with two minutes to play but the Aggies would not quit, holding NU without a field goal over the final 2:14 to set up a wild finish. The Huskers had three turnovers in the last 1:29, including one with 5.4 seconds remaining after a scramble for rebound of a missed A&M shot. The Huskers fouled quickly but still gave A&M time for one last attempt, which Josh Carter hit with time running out to give the Aggies their first lead since 5-4 with just under 14 minutes remaining in the first half.

GAME 27 AT KANSAS STATE (KSU 77, NU 72)

The Cornhuskers finally got a strong offensive performance in the month of February, hitting 49 percent from the floor and topping 60 points for the first time in six games, but offensive rebounding and miscues proved the difference as Kansas State held on for a 77-72 win at Bramlage Coliseum. The Huskers were outrebounded by the league's top rebounding squad 36-25, including 21-11 on the offensive boards, while taking an 18-10 advantage in second-chance points. Nebraska added 17 turnovers, its second-highest total of the season, while sending Kansas State to the free throw line 37 times (25 made). The Huskers led at the intermission and rebounded from each KSU run behind junior Ryan Anderson, who posted a game-high 19 points on 7-of-9 shooting. Along with Anderson, senior guard Ade Dagunduro helped the Huskers despite battling foul trouble. Dagunduro stemmed the tide following a 9-0 Kansas State run, converting a three-point play and keeping Nebraska in the game until the end.

GAME 28 VS. IOWA STATE (NU 77, ISU 61)

Nebraska got back on the winning track on Senior Night as the Huskers hit 52 percent from the floor and forced 17 turnovers to defeat lowa State 77-61 at the Devaney Center. The Huskers were locked in a back-and-forth struggle before turning up the defensive pressure right before the half, leading to a 5-0 surge in the final 15 seconds to take a three-point advantage into the locker room. NU then forced 10 second-half turnovers and used a 14-2 run to break open a tight game. The Huskers, who started all four seniors, connected on 26-of-50 field-goal attempts, including hitting 8-of-16 from 3-point range, as they won their 14th home game of the season. Ade Dagunduro posted a career-high tying 24 points with six boards while Cookie Miller came off the bench to score 14 points with three assists. Sek Henry added nine rebounds as the Huskers were outrebounded by only six, 31-25. ISU's Craig Brackins had 25 points and 13 rebounds before fouling out, with all five of his fouls coming in the second half.
