SAN JOSE STATE FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

San Jose State's defense sacked Nebraska quarterback Joe Ganz twice on the Huskers' opening possession. In the season opener against UC Davis, the Spartans only had one quarterback sack in the game.

Kyle Reed scored his first touchdown at the major college level on a 12-yard run in the first quarter.

Yonus Davis' 24-yard first quarter run was his longest since a 90-yard run against Louisiana Tech on October 28, 2006.

Both Nebraska interceptions were by Cornhusker defensive linemen. Ndamukong Suh's 49-yard interception return for a touchdown was the first time since October 1, 2005 an opponent scored via interception. Nevada's Nate Hawthorne scored on a 40-yard interception in the Wolf Pack's 23-7 win over the Spartans.

Steve Lightsey played both offense and defense in the Nebraska game.

Duke Ihenacho's second-quarter interception was his first at the major college level.

San Jose State used its two kickers against Nebraska. Will Johnson missed an extra-point and a 41-yard field goal try. Jared Strubeck made field goals of 41 and 27 yards, but hit the right upright with a 32-yard field goal attempt.

Kevin Jurovich became the 18th San Jose State player with at least 100 career receptions. Jurovich entered the Nebraska game with 96 receptions and finished with four receptions for 84 yards.

Tight end Jeff Clark matched a single-game best with his four receptions for 22 yards.

For the second game in a row, defensive end Carl Ihenacho had a quarterback sack. After two games, Ihenacho leads the team with 16 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 quarterback sacks.

After two games, the San Jose State defense has yielded an average of 283.5 yards per game.
