He's the last CU players to do that, 53 games ago Dec. 10, 2008 against Colorado State (in Boulder) when he scored 33 points, six rebounds, three 3-pointers and three steals in a Buff win.

BIG 12-ONLY **GAMES:** Cory Higgins ranks first in steals (2.0); Higgins is third (.500) and Alec Burks is fourth in FG% (.497); Nate Tomlinson is fourth in turnover-assist ratio (1.9)

and sixth in assists (4.2). Higgins (18.7 ppg., third overall) and Burks (16.7 ppg., ninth overall) and are one of two schools ranked with a pair in the scoring top-10 (K-State is the other).

SEASON/CAREER: Cory Higgins has connected on 55-of-63 (.873) free throws over his last 11 contests • Marcus Relphorde is 13.0 ppg., 5.0 rpg. in his last five games • Higgins is sixth all-time at CU with 373 career made free throws (460 attempts) and his career .811 FT%, ranking sixth all-time at CU • Burks and Hig-- notes continued on page 4



TEAM NOTES (after defeating ISU): CU is shooting a school record best .773 from the free throw line • CU's 13 overall wins and four Big 12 victories are bests under Coach Bzdelik in his three years • CU went a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line against lowa State. The last time CU was perfect at the charity stripe was Feb. 18, 2006 at Kansas State (11-of-11). Saturday against lowa State was the ninth time since 1952-53 CU has made all free throws in a game • CU is 10-2 this season when shooting 50 percent or better from the field • CU is 7-1 this season when shooting 50 percent or better in each half • CU committed nine turnovers against ISU, the seventh time they have performed nine and under this season. The team's 366 turnovers after 28 games is the second lowest in school history since 1977-78 when turnovers were kept as a stat.

MORE GOOD STUFF: Cory Higgins has led CU in scoring in four of the last five games (21.2 ppg.) and shooting 54.4 percent from the field and 52.6 from the three-point arc • Higgins has scored in double digits in all but one game this season and has moved into 12th on the Buffaloes' all-time scoring list with 1,324 points after his 33-point effort against lowa State. He needs 42 points to move into the top 10 of the school list • Colorado is 12-3 at home, its most victories since a 14-2 home mark in 2005-06.

LAST TIME vs. NEBRASKA: Alec Burks led Colorado's with 21 points, while Cory Higgins contributed 11 and Nate Tomlinson 10 in CU's 72-60 win against Nebraska back on Jan. 27 in Boulder. The Buffs led buzzer-to-buzzer and even enjoyed a rare 20-point advantage in a conference game, ramping up the Cornhuskers' desperation with the loss. The Buffs led by 10 points (31-21) at halftime and increased their advantage to as many as 20 (59-39) in the second half. Nebraska, falling to 12-8 overall, entered the game as the league's top-ranked in scoring defense, allowing 60.4 points a game.

HOME vs. ROAD: CU is 12-3 at home and shoots .4996 from the field and averages 77.6 ppg. (allows 68.1). Three players are stellar at home (Cory Higgins: 20.3 ppg., 4.2 rpg., .559 FG%; Alec Burks: 16.6 ppg., 4.4 rpg., .511 FG%; Marcus Relphorde: 12.0 ppg., 4.7 rpg., .478 FG%. On the road,

CU is 1-10 and averages 67.4 ppg. (allows (79.2) and shoots .425 FG%. Only two players average double figures (Burks: 16.5ppg., 5.1 rpg., .530 FG%; Higgins: 15.4 ppg., 3.1 rpg., .418 FG%).

NEAR MISSES: CU has lost 27 single-digit games under coach Bzdelik, 18 of those in the Big 12. The 27 losses are an average of 4.6 points.

2009-10: 7 games (three non-conference, four Big 12): 30 points, 4.3 ppg.).

2008-09: 11 games (three non-conference, eight Big 12 games): 50 points (4.5 ppg.).

2007-08: 9 games (three non-conference, six Big

12 games): 43 total points (4.8 ppg.).

BUFF TIDBITS: Cory Higgins and Alec **Burks** are separated by 75 points, closest the 1-2 scoring punch a CU team has had since 2003-04 [Da-

vid Harrison (497, 17.1 ppg) and Michel Morandais (467, 16.1 ppg.)] • CU had a season-low four turnovers at lowa State, the lowest in 28 years. On the season, CU has committed single-digits miscues seven times • Four times CU has placed only two players in double figures - all losses • 14 times CU has started Burks, Higgins, Tomlinson, Relphorde, Dufault. CU is 7-7 in those games.

TEAM NOTES: The Buffs are shooting 77.3 percent (495-of-640) overall from the free throw line, a mark that is first in the league. Colorado has never led the Big 12 in the category. CU's has lost six games by 17+ points this season (at Mizzou, at KU, at K-State, Missouri, at Texas, at Tulsa) • CU has been out-rebounded in the last 18 of 19 games (tied Oklahoma at 33-33) • CU has shot 50 percent or better in the second half 14 times (9-5 in those games). AFTER 14 BIG 12 GAMES: CU is 4-10 with wins over lowa State, Baylor, Nebraska and Oklahoma - all at home, and have placed three players in double-figures, averaging 70.9 points per game and shooting .449 percent from the field. ON THE ROAD vs. RANKED FOES: The Buffs have also lost 34-straight nationally ranked games away from Boulder, including 27 on the road and seven on neutral courts. Their last win over a top-10 opponent on the road was #5 at Missouri, 81-79 (ot), Jan. 15, 1973. CU's last win on the road against any ranked opponent came at No. 20 Texas Tech, 80-78 (Jan. 11, 1997).

ONE STREAK DOWN: The Buffaloes ended a ninegame losing streak to nationally ranked opponents by beating No. 22/24 Baylor (Jan. 12), 78-71 in Boulder. It's the first win against a ranked opponent dating back to the 2006-07 season when they defeated No. 12/14 Oklahoma State at home, 89-77 (Feb. 3, 2007).

BIG 12 HONOR: Marcus Relphorde was named Co-Big 12 Phillips 66 Rookie of the Week (Jan. 11-17) in voting by a panel of media covering the Conference. This was Relphorde's first rookie of the week honor and first CU player to earn the award since Dec. 27, 2004 (Richard Roby). Relphorde helped the Buffaloes to a 1-1 week against two nationally ranked opponents. He started with 17 points and seven rebounds as CU topped No. 22 Baylor, 78-71. The junior guard then chipped in 18 points and three boards as Buffs dropped an 87-81 decision to No. 12 Kansas State. In two outings, he averaged 17.5 points and 5.0 rebounds, and shot 57.9 percent (11-of-19) from the field.

FRESHMAN SCORING BESTS: Alec Burks has scored over 20 points six times this season and his 27-point effort against Missouri ranks eighth among all CU freshman. Here's the top-10 of freshman scoring bests in school history.

You're entering your third year, what's the one thing you are looking forward to this year?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if our players improve on a daily basis and play collectively up to their potential."

The team looks bigger and stronger. Was each studentathlete responsible for his own off-season workout?

"It's the direct result of having a weight room for basketball (at the Events Center) and having a strength and conditioning coach just for basketball. That piece has been sorely missing from this program and we now have it."

What's the difference from this year compared to last year with your team?

"We didn't have success on the scoreboard last year because we weren't deep enough, strong enough, mature or experienced enough. We have gotten deeper because of the five additional players, in addition to Trent Beckley (Beckley missed all of last season with a stress fracture in his lumbar spine). We have gotten stronger because of the weight room and with the strength coach coupled with the dedication of our players since last April. We are now a little bit more experienced based of the number of quality minutes of all our young players received last year and are little more mature."

Is this team better than the perception with only one senior?

"We are getting better, there's no question in my mind. I'm really excited about coaching this basketball team. I finally can coach; I think my first two years were spent with a lot of energy, time and emotion helping build the facilities, recruiting, drumming up support for the program; creating a culture that's positive and now a lot of those pieces are in place. So it's about developing our basketball team. Pretty much all my energy and

focus will be, opposed to just part of it."

Four returning starters averaged at least 30 or more minutes a year ago. Will that happen again?

"Not really, that was born out of necessity, but the days of Cory Higgins and Dwight Thorne playing 37 minutes a game are gone."

Your thoughts on senior guard Dwight Thorne?

"Maturity, energy ... to me he's the face of the Colorado program in terms of what you would want a Colorado basketball player to be like both on and off the court."

Your thoughts on junior guard Cory Higgins?

"One of the nation's best players at his position. Cory also leads by example; he has a quiet demeanor in some ways camouflages his intense fierce competiveness."

Sum up your newcomer class (four freshman, one transfer)?

"They're all going to contribute. From a coaching perspective, the depth now is a player can't take a possession off, if they do, they're coming out. In the past, I would walk down to the bench and look, and I would walk back to my seat. I don't have to rant and rave, and be boisterous. With this group, I like what I see, I enjoy it."

Entering the season, a high percentage of scoring (86.9%), rebounding (90.3%) among other stats return. How does that play into the 2009-10 outlook?

"It's what I envisioned for this program. What really excites me is that you are going to be saying the same thing a year from now will only be one senior. It's what fuels my cautious optimism about the future of Colorado basketball. I say cautious because we're in the Big Nasty, the Big 12 ... everybody is good. It's a beast."

What do you like about your non-conference schedule?

"Anybody who says anything negative about our schedule doesn't understand. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has everyone coming back from last year; the Maui Invitational is a monster; San Francisco has one of the top power forwards in the nation who's in a senior; Oregon State is picked at the higher echelon of the Pac-10; Miami OH is always a perennial threat to win the MAC and are extremely well-coached with a great basketball tradition; Tulsa is rated in the preseason top-25 and they have everyone coming back; at Colorado State, 'you don't think they're going to have Moby packed for that game?'; Cal State Northridge almost beat Memphis in the NCAA Tournament first round last year. Northridge has three starters returning, two of their top players come off the bench and they signed five junior college transfers. If we can have a winning record with this kind of schedule, we'll be in contention for some kind of postseason play."

What will constitute a successful season for you?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if my team plays to its fullest potential."

GAME #5 REVIEW: Cory Higgins scored 28 points, but was outdueled by Arizona's Nic Wise who scored 30 as the Wildcats defeated CU, 91-87 in overtime on the second day of the EA Sports Maui Invitational.

Wise scored 15 points in the second half and carried his hot hand into overtime, scoring eight of Arizona's 11 points in the extra frame. Higgins scored 22 of his points in the second half and overtime.

The game went to overtime after a wild finish in regulation that saw an 11-0 run by Arizona answered by an 8-0 run by Colorado. After a three-pointer by sophomore Austin Dufault put CU up 72-69 with 3:31 remaining, Arizona went on an 11-0 run, including two treys by Wise, to put the Wildcats up 80-72.

Sophomore Nate Tomlinson and Higgins each hit threes in the final minute, capitalizing on missed free throws by Arizona, to tighten the Wildcats' lead to 80-78 with 24 seconds left. A Dufault steal on an inbounds pass followed by two Higgins free throws knotted the game at 80 with 20 seconds remaining.

Tomlinson hit a three-pointer on CU's first possession of overtime and CU led 85-82 after Higgins hit a jumper with 3:35 left in the extra period. Then Nic Wise took over, scoring eight straight points to put Arizona ahead for good.

GAME #6 REVIEW: CU took a while to wake up, but finished strong in the second half to pull away with a 73-58 victory over Chaminade in the seventh-place game of the EA Sports Maui Invitational. The win over Chaminade was declared a road victory for the Buffaloes.

The NCAA determined later in the evening it was a home game for Chaminade. CU breaks a 18-game losing skid on the road and their last road win came on Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State, 73-70. Freshman Alec Burks and junior Marcus Relphorde led the Buffs in scoring with 13 points apiece. The game tipped at 9 a.m. local time and both teams struggled shooting in the first half.

The Buffaloes were 9-of-27 (33.3 percent) and Chaminade was 7-of-28 (25 percent) from the field in the half. The Silverswords kept the game tight for the first ten minutes of the second half behind the three-point shooting of Steven Bennett. Bennett made his first four treys after halftime and led Chaminade with 22 points for the game.

Sophomore Nate Tomlinson matched a career-high with eight assists. His previous high came earlier in the tournament against Gonzaga. Tomlinson also set a career high by recording five steals and freshman Shane Harris-Tunks notched a team-high seven rebounds; the first time he has led the Buffs in his young college career.

GAME #7 REVIEW: The Buffs improved to 5-2 overpowering San Francisco 78-54. Cory Higgins led all scorers with 22 points and was one of four Buffs players in double figures. Alec Burks added 12 while Dwight Thorne II and junior Marcus Relphorde, who was celebrating his 21st birthday, contributed 10 each.

It was the seventh consecutive game that CU has scored 70 or more points, as well as the seventh straight game CU has had four players reach double figures.

In a 16-2 Buffs run, Higgins scored six points as CU opened a 32-20 lead. But over the next 31/2 minutes, the Buffs got sloppy again and allowed the Dons to creep back to within five points (35-30).

Bzdelik quickly called a time out, and whatever was discussed in his huddle was taken to heart. The Buffs outscored the Dons 7-2 in the final 4:14 of the half and went to the locker room leading 42-32.

Higgins hit all six of his first-half field goal attempts - including a pair of three-pointers - and both free throw tries to finish the first 20 minutes with 16 of his total.

CU opened the second half with pressure on both ends. An 8-0 run pushed the Buffs ahead 50-32. The Buffs got another pair of baskets from Higgins and Relphorde - they hit their first six shots of the last half - to extend their run to 12-0 before USF guard Dontae Bryant hit a free throw at 16:13 for the Dons' first points of the second half.

But by then, the Buffs had surged ahead 54-33.

GAME #8 REVIEW: Freshman Alec Burks scored 19 points and junior Cory Higgins added 15, but it wasn't enough as the CU fell to Oregon State 74-69.

Oregon State's Calvin Haynes tied for a game-high with 19 points, including a critical jump shot with 1:08 left in the game to give the Beavers a 70-69 lead.

Facing a 64-61 deficit, junior Marcus Relphorde came up big for CU, hitting three-pointers on consecutive possessions to put Colorado ahead 67-64 with 2:34 remaining.

The Buffs led 69-68 before Haynes hit his jumper to give the Beavers the lead for good in a back-and-forth second half that saw seven lead changes. Burks led the way for Colorado in the first half, scoring 13 points, as the only time CU trailed in the half was 2-0.

Haynes kept the game close for the Beavers though, leading them with 11 first-half points. Higgins hit a jumper to beat the halftime buzzer and the Buffs took a 36-31 advantage into the break.

The Buffaloes were effective on the offensive glass, recording 15 offensive rebounds and scoring 23 second-chance points. Burks led with a career-high six offensive boards. Relphorde finished with 13 points, going along with Burks' 19 and Higgins' 15.

For the first time this season, CU failed to have at least four scorers reach double digits. Burks recorded a career-high nine rebounds to lead the team. Higgins and sophomore Nate Tomlinson each notched three assists.

GAME #9 REVIEW: The Colorado men's basketball team did what was expected of it Monday night, rolling over Division II Colorado Christian 84-65 at

The Buffaloes (6-3) got far more than a brisk workout - particularly after the Cougars (1-5) trimmed a 30-point first-half deficit to 10 midway through the second half.

To finally dispose of the visitors, CU needed 13 consecutive points during a key second half stretch by junior Cory Higgins, who finished with a gamebest 25 points. Teammates Alec Burks and Levi Knutson added 11 each, with Burks recording team highs in rebounds (six) and assists (four).

Knutson, recovering from a hip injury, played 22 minutes - his most of the season. "He adds more depth (and) is an extremely smart player," Higgins said. "He knows the system and knows his shots are going to come. He plays extremely hard and gives it his all."

Colorado Christian, located in Lakewood, opened with four consecutive losses, then defeated Western State College on Saturday before making the trip to Boulder.

The Buffs could have named their halftime score, so they went with 47-27. But a little over 5 minutes earlier, it was 41-11 - and in reality, the first 20 minutes weren't that close.

CU fashioned an 8-0 lead before Colorado Christian scored, with the Cougars finally getting their first basket - a jumper by Anthony Urrutia - at the 15:32 mark.

Then, they got a conventional three-point play by 6-foot-11 senior Justin Neuhaus, who finished with 16 points, to cut the Buffs' lead to 8-5. But with that, staying close before halftime became a quickly disappearing theme for the visitors. CU promptly embarked on a 20-3 run, opening a 20-point lead (28-8) that would ebb and flow until intermission.

GAME #10 REVIEW: After glimmers of progress in previous road trips to Hawaii and the Pacific Northwest, the Colorado Buffaloes took a shorter junket - and regressed.

Staying in-state for a road game didn't help CU. Neither did coach Jeff Bzdelik's past "Moby mojo."

Inspired Colorado State surged to a 10-point halftime advantage, increased its lead to 18 midway through the second half, then held on to defeat CU 77-62 in Moby Arena.

The Buffs surged back in the final 4 minutes, closing to within seven points twice, but could get no closer.

CU lost its 20th consecutive road game to a Division I opponent. The Buffs last won on a Division l opponent's home court on Dec. 22, 2007 - and that 73-70 win was at CSU.

Bzdelik, meanwhile, entered Thursday's game with a 6-0 mark against CSU and was undefeated in three previous trips to Moby. No more, and Bzdelik knew why.

CU's lack of discipline, said Bzdelik, was most apparent in the way it attempted to run his offense. The Buffs entered the game knowing they should kick the ball out to a perimeter shooter when Rams defense collapsed - but CU failed to do it with any regularlity.

He also was perturbed by CSU players stripping the ball from CU players and beating Buffs to loose balls and getting 12 offensive rebounds which translated to 13 second-chance points. The Buffs, dropping to 6-4, were outrebounded 41-27 and their 16 turnovers were the second-most of the season.

The Buffs' 36-26 halftime deficit was their largest of the season and their 34.8 field goal percentage in the first 20 minutes also was a season low. They finished the night at 37.3 percent from the field, hitting just 19 of 51.

GAME #11 REVIEW: As non-conference play trickles toward a conclusion, Jeff Bzdelik continues to call for more intensity and consistency from his Colorado men's basketball team.

Call it an early Christmas present, but he received a nice dose of each - plus some fairly impressive three-point shooting - in his team's 92-58 victory over Cal State Northridge. Improving to 7-4 and staying perfect (7-0) in the Coors Events Center this season, the Buffs recorded season-highs in points, three-pointers attempted (25) and steals (15). Their 10 trevs made were second to the 11 hit against Colorado Christian earlier this month.

Senior Dwight Thorne II, coming off the bench for the first time in 10 games, led CU with 19 points. Freshman Alec Burks and junior Cory Higgins added 14 each, with junior Marcus Relphorde contributing 13 and sophomore Austin DuFault 12.

Higgins also was his team's main delivery man, recording a career-best eight assists. Seven came in the first half as the Buffs opened a 41-21 lead at intermission and effectively buried the Matadors.

Mainly on the strength of seven three-pointers and a pair of conventional three-point plays, CU opened its 20-point halftime lead and put Cal State Northridge on the ropes.

CU forced Northridge, which features 10 junior college transfers on its 15-man roster, into 15 first-half turnovers while committing 11. The Buffs finished with 32 points off the Matadors' 26 total turnovers and outscored the visitors 34-18 in the paint. Of the Buffs' 14 first-half field goals, half were treys, with three of them coming on consecutive possessions (Nate Tomlinson hit two, Thorne one) and enabling them to go up 17-3 with 13:05 before intermission.

The Matadors, winless (0-3) in true road games this season, steadily fell behind in the second half as the Buffs kept up their defensive pressure. The visitors trailed by 32 points (78-46) with just under 5:00 left and by 35 (92-57) in the final minute.

GAME #12 REVIEW: If Colorado expected Ivy League member Yale to be a pushover, the Buffaloes were wrong...but fortunately not dead wrong.

The big and physical Bulldogs forced the Buffs to push back, which they did in the second half to earn a 70-59 victory.

Juniors Cory Higgins (23 points) and Marcus Relphorde (15) and freshman Alec Burks (19) led CU, which improved to 8-4 and remained unbeaten (7-0) on its home court.

Despite holding the Bulldogs (4-8) to seven points in the final 10 minutes of the first half, the Buffs led only 26-25 at intermission and were seldom in synch offensively throughout the night.

But Bzdelik said his team didn't allow that dysfunctional offensive performance to undermine its defensive energy, particularly in the second half when the Buffs opened with a 17-8 run and took their first double-figure lead of the game.

The Buffs were outrebounded 41-27, but they still made the night miserable for the Bulldogs by forcing them into 30 turnovers and pilfering a season-high 18 steals - a half dozen by Burks, who also hit 11 of his 13 free throw attempts.

During CU's early second-half surge, Relphorde, who fouled out with 5:16 remaining, scored 10 of his total in a variety of ways. He said the Buffs came out of the locker room at halftime "with some plays where I could attack" - and he took full advantage.

Early on, the Bulldogs relied on their size and muscle to take a 10-point lead (18-8) before the Buffs determined that defensive pressure and positioning might be necessary to win this one.

CU obviously met one goal in shutting down Yale guard Alex Zampier, who entered the game as the Ivy League's leading scorer (18.9 points a game). He was held to seven points.

GAME #13 REVIEW: The University of Colorado men's basketball team fell to the University of Tulsa Golden Hurricane, 84-59, at the Donald W. Reynolds Center in Tulsa, Okla. Saturday afternoon.

Colorado extends their on-the-road losing streak to 21 games while holding an 8-5 record in non-conference play. The Buffs' last road win over a Division I opponent occurred Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State (73-70).

Tulsa improved its record to 10-3 this season and remains undefeated at home (10-0).

Colorado battled Tulsa through much of the first half until the Golden Hurricane went on a 10-0 run putting them up 24-14 with 5:21 left. Cory Higgins contributed a three-point play after being fouled in the paint and making his free throw to put the Buffs down by a mere seven points (24-17).

A pair of good free-throws shots by Shane Harris-Tunks and a layup by Nate Tomlinson pulled the Buffs within four (25-21) with 3:30 left in the first half

The Golden Hurricane pulled ahead making the score 36-29 at the half.

The Buffalos struggled from the beginning shooting a season low 10-of-30 (.333) from the field in the first half.

Despite being unsuccessful from the field, Colorado stayed aggressive committing a total of 15 fouls in just the first half and grabbed a season high eight offensive rebounds (19 total).

Colorado's improved shooting percentage in the second half cannot be blamed on the ball going through the hoop but on the decreased number of shots taken. The Buffs shot 10-of-24 (41.7%) from the field in the final 20 minutes. "progressed."

Tulsa led the entire second half allowing the Buffaloes to come within 13 points only once with 12:15 left to play.

GAME #14 REVIEW: At the Coors Events Center, CU found itself in survival mode in the final 10 seconds as Miami closed to within one point and had a chance to win at the buzzer after Buffs senior Dwight Thorne II missed one of two free throws with 9.6 seconds to play.

Trailing by the final margin, RedHawks freshman guard Allen Roberts missed a three-pointer at the buzzer, allowing the Buffs to escape.

Freshman Alec Burks led CU with 17 points and 10 rebounds, while Thorne added 14 points, as did junior Marcus Relphorde, who was scoreless in the Buffs' weekend loss at Tulsa.

Junior Cory Higgins, CU's leading scorer, didn't get his first points until the game's final 6:54. But of his team's next 14 points, Higgins scored 11, finishing with that total.

CU was outrebounded by only two (27-25) and committed the same number of turnovers (14) as Miami.

The Buffs led 32-25 at halftime, but their biggest lead before intermission was 10 points. A 12-2 run in the game's first 7 minutes opened that gap - but CU couldn't hold it, allowing Miami to even regain the lead by a point (18-17) before the Buffs were able to take some semblance of temporary control once more.

With 6:54 to play, Higgins scored after a hard drive down the right lane - and it happened at an opportune time. When Higgins laid the ball off the glass, the Buffs went up 49-40. He then stole the ball at midcourt and made another layup, capping a 10-0 run that pushed CU in front 51-40 for the home team's biggest advantage of the night.

GAME #15 REVIEW: Freshman Avery Bradley scored 29 points and No. 2 Texas stayed unbeaten with a 103-86 win over Colorado to open Big 12 play.

Damion James added 20 points and 14 rebounds for the Longhorns, who are 15-0 for the first time since the 1932-33 season. Bradley was 12 of 14 from the field.

Marcus Relphorde scored 24 points for the Buffaloes (9-6, 0-1), but he also was one of four Colorado players to foul out in a four-minute stretch of the second half before Texas put the game away.

Offensively, Colorado looked early like a team determined to end its run of road futility. The Buffaloes made 12 of their first 17 shots. Both teams shot better than 50 percent for the game.

Bradley was 8 of 9 from the field in the first half. His 3-pointer put Texas up 35-28 and started a 17-4 Texas run helped by three consecutive missed 3-pointers by Colorado. Bradley closed the half with a twisting reverse layup at the buzzer to give Texas a 57-42 halftime lead.

Colorado shaved the lead early in the second and kept it close for a while. Bradley fouled Alec Burks on a dunk and the 3-point play made it 59-50 early in the second. But Bradley also kept making the baskets that held off the Buffaloes.

Bradley's 3-pointer from the corner and another jumper from the left wing kept Texas rolling until Colorado started running into serious foul trouble. Austin Dufault, Shane Harris-Tunks, Trey Eckloff and Relphorde all fouled out within four minutes.

Texas led by 11 when the exodus started and kept pushing the lead with every departure. Soon after Relphorde was gone, Texas built the lead to 97-77 with just under four minutes to play.

Committing a season-low five turnovers to Baylor's 18 and getting double-figure scoring from five players, CU rallied from a five-point halftime deficit and held Baylor at bay in the final 1:37.

The Buffs shot 50 percent from the field (26of-52) and were 16-of-26 (61.5 percent) in the second half.

Higgins got ample assistance from Marcus Relphorde (17), Burks (16), Nate Tomlinson (11) and Dwight Thorne II (10).

Badly outsized, CU compensated in the early going with defensive positioning and hustle, trailing Baylor by only three rebounds (17-14) at halftime and by five (32-27) on the scoreboard. Baylor eventually won the board battle 38-25.

Baylor forward Epke Udoh, honored in consecutive weeks as the Big 12's player-ofthe-week, didn't get his first basket until the 17:11 mark of the second half. The 6-foot-10, 240-pound junior transfer (Michigan) finished with 14 points, 14 rebounds, five assists and a pair of blocked shots.

CU promptly embarked on a 9-3 run and went ahead 59-51 - its largest margin of the game to that point - with 5:15 to play. The Buffs' advantage increased to nine (64-55) on a trey by Relphorde, then 10 (66-56) on a layup by Higgins with 2 minutes left.

The Buffs (10-7, 1-2) hit just 27 of their 40 attempts, while the Wildcats (15-2, 2-1) were 38-of-54 from the line. A telling companion stat: K-State shot 41.5 percent from the field (22-of-53), CU shot 53.2 percent (25-of-47). The Buffs were whistled for 36 fouls, the Wildcats 32.

CU's other double-figure scorers were Marcus Relphorde (18), Alec Burks (14) and Thorne (12). K-State had five players in double figures, led by Jacob Pullen's 18.

CU endured a jittery opening and a late 7-0 run by K-State to only trail 38-34 after a foul-a-rama of a first half - with more to come. A total of 36 fouls were called in the first 20 minutes - 19 on CU, 17 on the visitors.

They also suffered early turnover problems, committing five of their 17 - the Wildcats had the same total - in the first 4:10.

CU trailed 38-34 at halftime, holding K-State without a field goal in the half's final 2:43 and outscoring the Wildcats 7-3 to close to within four at the break.

The Buffs stayed close until Austin DuFault failed to convert a three-point play tying the score at 52-52. That might have been the opening the Wildcats needed; they went on a 9-2 run for an eight-point (61-53) lead and increased it to nine (78-69) with 2:13 to play.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Colorado erased a ten point deficit to tie the game late in the second half, but Texas A&M pulled out a 67-63 victory over the Buffaloes on Saturday afternoon.

Down 53-43 with 6:38 remaining in the second half, Colorado went on an 8-0 run fueled by five points from Alec Burks to close the Aggies' lead to two at the 4:45 mark. Two free throws by Cory Higgins later tied the game at 59 with 53 seconds left. Texas A&M responded though as Bryan Davis made a put-back dunk after a missed Donald Sloan layup to give the Aggies a 61-59 lead that they would hold onto.

Texas A&M finished with a 38-28 advantage in rebounding and had 14 on the offensive end. The Buffaloes fall to 10-9 for the season, 1-4 in the Big 12 while Texas A&M improves to 14-5, 3-2.

"Once again our demise was on the defensive boards," said CU Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik. "We gave them 16 second-chance points. Until we understand how to block people off and drive them back, this is what it's going to be. We need to do a better job off the defensive glass and finishing possessions defensively, and that's been our Achilles heel. It's something we need to correct obviously if we want to get where we want to get to."

Colorado led 32-30 at the break before the Aggies opened the second half on a 23-11 run to take a ten point lead.

Higgins and Burks led the Buffs with 19 points apiece. Austin Dufault added 13, hitting 3-of-4 three pointers. Dwight Thorne II chipped in with ten points off the bench.

Davis was the difference maker for Texas A&M going a perfect 6-of-6 from the field and grabbing six offensive rebounds to finish with 12 points and nine boards. Sloan led the Aggies with 18 points and Nathan Walkup scored a career-high 16.

Texas A&M struggled from beyond the arc, shooting only 8.7 percent (2-of-23). Colorado was 5-of-14 (35.7 percent) in three point shooting.

BOULDER - Style points often seemed as scarce as the other kind, but the Colorado Buffaloes gladly took a 72-60 win against Nebraska it for what it was - a Big 12 Conference victory taken from an opponent that nightly puts the 'D' in grind.

The Buffs led buzzer-to-buzzer and even enjoyed a rare 20-point advantage in a conference game, ramping up the Cornhuskers' desperation with the loss.

Nebraska was kept winless (0-5) in league play this season, while CU eased past its meager 2008-09 league win total (one). Improving to 11-9 overall and 2-3 in the league, the Buffs led by 10 points (31-21) at halftime and increased their advantage to as many as 20 (59-39) in the second half.

Nebraska, falling to 12-8 overall, entered the game as the league's top-ranked in scoring defense, allowing 60.4 points a game. With their deliberate style and a roster that could use another consistent scorer or three, the Huskers were last in the conference in scoring offense (67.4).

The Buffs held them to 39.6 percent field goal shooting (19-of-48) and limited them to one three-pointer in the second half (5-of-17 overall).

Faced with their night-long task of climbing out of a hole, Bzdelik said the Huskers "just put their heads down, abandoned their style and drove to the rim a little too often" to suit him.

He was referring to Nebraska creeping to within 11 points three times in the final 3:39 - the last with 1:13 left-then cutting CU's lead to 70-60 in the final minute.

That was as close as the visitors came, and Bzdelik credited the Events Center crowd (7,108) for helping the Buffs through a couple of late rough patches. Freshman Alec Burks led CU with 21 points, while Cory Higgins contributed 11 and Nate Tomlinson 10.

GAME #22 REVIEW

BOULDER - What could have been a much-anticipated breakthrough on Wednesday night for Jeff Bzdelik and his Colorado men's basketball team went the way of the Buffaloes' other close encounters this season.

And coming close isn't on Bzdelik's to-do list as he revamps CU hoops.

With a capacity crowd (11,027) standing at the Coors Events Center - and for once, the venue wasn't Allen Fieldhouse West - the Buffs couldn't convert on their final possession in regulation and end their gut-wrenching string of near-misses.

With the score tied at 60-60 and CU in possession with 10.6 seconds left, Bzdelik called a time out to set a play. The Buffs didn't get what they wanted - a drive by Cory Higgins, who wound up shooting a long three-ball as the shot clock expired.

And it left CU with very little shot to win, especially after KU opened the overtime with a 7-0 run. The Buffs pulled to 67-64 in the extra period before Jayhawks senior Sherron Collins shook loose for a layup and junior Brady Morningstar hit a free throw to give KU a 70-64 cushion with 34 seconds left.

CU, which had taken a top-ranked opponent into overtime for the first time, couldn't recover.

CU put itself in position to do that, rallying from a 14-point first-half deficit and staying with KU on the boards (the Jayhawks ended with a 45-41 advantage).

The Buffs, however, missed seven (10-of-17) themselves and shot a season-low 58.8 percent from the line. Moreover, they shot only 37.5 percent (24-of-64) from the field for the game - including 16.7 percent (1-of-6) in overtime.

CU played the game minus its second-leading scorer, freshman Alec Burks, who suffered a mild knee sprain Saturday at Iowa State and was held out. Bzdelik said Burks had been medically cleared to play, but it was a coach's decision that kept the talented guard on the bench.

BOULDER - Freshman Alec Burks returned to the Colorado lineup Saturday afternoon, but something equally vital for the Buffaloes went AWOL - the emotion and resolve CU exhibited on Wednesday night in pushing top-ranked Kansas into overtime.

The Missouri Tigers recognized the missing intangibles early and licked their chops, cruising to an 84-66 victory at the Coors Events Center and winning a Big 12 Conference game that Buffs fans believed their team was capable of taking.

It should have been for CU, but Burks, after scoring a game- and career-best 27 points, said CU coach Jeff Bzdelik told his team it played as if it had reached a milestone in the 72-66 loss against the No. 1 Jayhawks.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Colorado hung around with No. 9/9 Kansas State for the first half, but the Wildcats dominated after halftime to cruise to a 68-51 victory over the Buffaloes at Bramlage Coliseum on Saturday afternoon.

Kansas State opened the second half on a 29-12 run to take control of the game and capture their largest lead at 57-38 with 7:52 remaining. Luis Colon scored all nine of his points in this span to allow the Wildcats to pull away.

"We turned the ball over four or five times early on in the half and we gave them 26 free points off our turnovers," said CU Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik following the game.

"You can't help a team like that, the ninth-ranked team in the country, can't help them score like that."

The Buffs committed a season-high 22

turnovers and were outrebounded 36-28. Colorado led for much of the first half behind 12 points from Cory Higgins, but Kansas State ended thehalf on a 12-6 run with seven of those points coming from Jacob Pullen to take a 28-26 lead into the break.

Higgins led CU with 21 points and Alec Burks added 17. There was not much scoring production beyond those two as the next leading scorers were Dwight Thorne II and Casey Crawford with four points apiece. Burks led with six rebounds.

Marcus Relphorde did not play due to tendinitis in his left knee and is day-to-day. Relphorde had started all 23 games this season prior to today. Trey Eckloff made his first career start for the Buffs.

Pullen led Kansas State with 15 points and Curtis Kelly and Jamar Samuels each scored 12. Pullen and Kelly both recorded double-doubles as Pullen had ten assists and Kelly notched 11 rebounds.

BOULDER - Pushing the tempo whenever possible, CU ushered Oklahoma out of the Coors Events Center with a 77-67 Big 12 Conference win that could prove critical for the Buffs in their tenuous run to make a postseason tournament.

The Buffs (12-13 overall, 3-8 Big 12) entered the game having lost four straight and seven of their past eight games. But in the Sooners (13-12, 4-7), Bzdelik saw an opponent he believed his team could outrun - especially at altitude.

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Freshman Alec Burks scored 17 points, however the top-ranked Kansas Jayhawks never trailed and cruised to a 94-74 victory over Colorado at Allen Fieldhouse.

Burks, sidelined with a knee injury, did not play in Colorado's first game against Kansas this season, a 72-66 overtime victory for the Jayhawks on Feb. 3. His presence in the lineup was not enough for the Buffaloes to pull off the upset on the road.

Kansas went on a 29-9 run from the 16:51 to the 6:21 marks of the first half to open up a 37-16 lead. Cole Aldrich scored nine points for the Jayhawks in this stretch. The Buffs, behind eight points from Kansas-native Casey Crawford after KU's run, tightened the margin to 48-34 at the break. Kansas freshman Xavier Henry led all players with 12 points and six rebounds at halftime, making 3-of-5 three-pointers.

A pair of Cory Higgins free throws brought the score to 55-43 with 15:57 remaining, but that was as close as CU would get in the second half. Kansas continued to expand the lead and a three-pointer by Sherron Collins with 4:29 left in the game gave the Jayhawks their largest lead at 90-63.

For the 11th time this season, Burks led the Buffs in both scoring and rebounding in the same game as he pulled down seven boards. Burks also passed Donnie Boyce to move into third place on the Colorado freshman scoring list with 421 points on the season.

Marcus Relphorde had 16 points and Higgins added 13. Nate Tomlinson led the Buffaloes with four assists. Colorado committed 19 turnovers and was outrebounded 40-25.

Henry finished with a game-high 24 points for the Jayhawks. Aldrich recorded a double-double with 17 points and ten rebounds in addition to blocking five CU shot attempts.

GAME #27 Review

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Missouri started fast and never looked back in defeating Colorado 92-63 at Mizzou Arena.

Missouri (21-7, 9-4 Big 12) jumped out to a 21-6 lead in the first nine minutes of the game behind eight early points from Justin Safford. The Buffaloes (12-15, 3-10) fought back to bring the score to 32-20 after a Cory Higgins trey with 6:32 left in the first half.

Missouri responded though, pushing their lead to as many as 19 points before the break. Keegan Hornbuckle hit a three-pointer for Colorado at the first-half buzzer to make the game 48-32, but it remained CU's biggest halftime deficit of the season.

The Buffaloes could never get the game closer than 14 points in the second half as Missouri continued to expand the margin. The final score was the Tigers' largest lead of the game as a Marcus Denmon layup with 3:26 remaining closed the scoring at 92-63. The 29-point defeat was Colorado's largest of the season.

Higgins led the Buffs with 21 points while Alec Burks and Marcus Relphorde scored 13 and 11 points, respectively. Tonight marked the 15th time this season that Higgins led CU in scoring. Burks, Relphorde, and Levi Knutson all tied for the team lead with five rebounds apiece.

Denmon led Missouri with 21 points and Keith Ramsey added 13. J.T. Tiller scored ten points to go along with nine assists and seven rebounds. Missouri had very balanced scoring as nine different players all scored over five points in the contest. The Tigers also had an outstanding night from the field, making 35-of-60 field goal attempts (58.3 percent), including 9-of-14 (64.3 percent) from beyond the arc.

GAME #28 REVIEW (by B.G. Brooks)

BOULDER - In a basketball season where "getting over the hump" has been a mountainous challenge, the Colorado men's team might have begun a timely ascent on Saturday.

The Buffaloes -- in order -- won a close game, defeated a team they were rubbing shoulders with in the Big 12 Conference standings, and possibly put themselves in position for a higher seed in the league's postseason tournament. In an unforgiving league, progress sometimes has come in small steps for the Buffs -- but they're taking them.

With junior Cory Higgins scoring a season-high 33 points, including a pair of clutch free throws with 6.7 seconds to play, CU held off Iowa State 75-72 at the Coors Events Center. The win avenged a 64-63 loss to the Cyclones on Jan. 30 in Ames, Iowa.

"Our team has to learn how to win - and I hope (today) was a big step toward that," CU coach Jeff Bzdelik said. "I'm extremely proud of our team effort . . . it was a collective effort." How collective? In addition to Higgins' season-best total, three of his teammates reached double figures - Marcus Relphorde (12), Alec Burks (11) and Casey Crawford (10).

Crawford, who entered the game averaging 4.0 points a game, hit consecutive clutch three-pointers in the second half, scored a critical put-back after snaring an offensive rebound and was the key element in CU's bench outscoring ISU's 13-9.

"Casey helped spread their defense," Bzdelik said of Crawford's long-range shooting, but lowa State coach Greg McDermott was more effusive. He called Crawford "the difference in the game. We were trying to provide help on some of their back cuts and trying to make it difficult for Burks and Higgins as much as we could. We had to give up something and Casey Crawford was just that."

Bzdelik also liked his team's assists (17), low turnover total (9), field goal percentage (55.1) and clutch free-throw shooting (12-of-12, including six-for-six in the final 1:16 from Burks and Higgins).

And don't overlook the Buffs' effort; Bzdelik certainly didn't. "We scrapped our way to a great win for us," he said. "I'm proud of that." Higgins, whose previous season high was 30 against Kansas State, scored 12 of his total in the first half but helped the Buffs stay afloat throughout.

In an 8-minute stretch in the second half, he scored 15 of CU's 17 points as the Buffs (13-15, 4-10) overtook the Cyclones (14-15, 4-10) at the 9:05 mark and never allowed them to regain the lead.

Higgins, scoring 30-plus points for the fourth time in his career and moving into 12th place on the school's all-time scoring list, said he began the game "just wanting to attack the basket . . . but when my shots started falling, yeah, it felt good." He called the victory "huge for us; still a growing team. Everybody just made plays down the stretch." McDermott said Higgins "was very efficient with his game. He scored 33 points on 15 shots. He takes good care of the ball and makes good decisions. Some of his shots were challenged and some we were a little late on." Until the first half's final 51/2 minutes, the Buffs appeared somewhat in control, leading by as many as eight points (23-15) before the Cyclones made a move.

Working mostly inside with 6-foot-10 Craig Brackins, 6-9 LaRon Dendy and 6-7 Marquis Gilstrap, ISU overtook CU and went up 37-31 - the visitors' largest first-half advantage - with 45 seconds left before the break. But in the final 45, the Buffs limited the Cyclones to a Gilstrap free throw and got a

basket by Higgins and trey from Relphorde to close to within 38-36 at intermission. It was a much-needed surge, but the halftime deficit didn't bode well for the Buffs; entering the game they were 1-8 in Big 12 play when trailing at the half. ISU, coming to Boulder with one Big 12 road win (56-53 at Nebraska), outscored CU 8-4 to open the second half and reestablish a six-point (46-40) advantage.

Then, Higgins asserted himself. He cut that deficit in half with a three-pointer from the left corner with 15:58 to play, made a pair of free throws just over a minute later, and followed them with a trey from the top of the key.

The Buffs were down 49-48 with 13:36 remaining. But they didn't score again until - who else? - Higgins hit a jumper at the 10:00 mark, followed by a - who else, Part II? - Higgins trey that gave CU its first lead (53-52) since 27-25.

A couple of minutes later, Crawford entered the game and scored 10 of his team's next 12 points. His final basket came on a put-back following one of the Buffs' three offensive rebounds (the Cyclones had 18).

Bzdelik admitted that kind of imbalance normally doesn't occur in a win, and Crawford said his orders were to "grab a rebound . . (Bzdelik) didn't care how - just get it. I was able to sneak in there, get one and put it back.

"My role is to come off the bench when coach needs me. It's difficult sometimes, but it's (nice) to give a little boost and help the team get the 'W.' I just follow orders and play the best I can."

Over the final 9:05, ISU managed three ties and pulled to 71-70 on Justin Hamilton's three-point play with 54.5 seconds remaining.

But Burks, who has been in double figures this season in every game he's finished, and Higgins added four free throws in the final 23.6 and Diante Garrett missed a trey at the buzzer, delivering CU the critical win.
