HUSKERS SHOOT FOR SENIOR NIGHT WIN OVER BUFFS

Nebraska ends a two-game homestand with its final regular-season home contest as it plays host to Colorado on Tuesday, March 2. The 7:07 p.m. tipoff can be seen in Nebraska on FS Midwest, in Colorado on FS Rocky Mountain and nationally on ESPN FullCourt. The telecast will feature Greg Sharpe (play by play) and Eric Piatkowski (analyst) and will be seen on channel 37 in Lincoln; channel 47 in Omaha; DirecTV channel 652; and Dish Network channel 449.

The game will also be heard live around the state of Nebraska on the IMG Husker Sports Radio Network (Kent Pavelka, play by play; Matt Davison, color). Free audio and live stats will also be available on the Internet at Huskers.com.

Nebraska will be aiming for its second straight win while trying to send out the senior class in style. Four Huskers – guards Ryan Anderson and Sek Henry, forward Ben Nelson and student coach Chris Balham – will be honored before the game. Fans are encouraged to be in their seats by 6:40 p.m. for the Senior Night presentation.

Once the teams hit the court, the Huskers will be gunning for a season split with the Buffs. CU won the first matchup 72-60 last month, but the

Huskers have since found a scoring touch that would have come in handy in Boulder. Nebraska has averaged 75.8 points per game over the past four contests. During that span, the Huskers have had at least one player each game post 20 or more points (five total 20-point games), after having just four 20-point games in the first 25 contests of the season.

In Saturday's double overtime victory, senior Sek Henry was the latest to step up. Henry hopes to build off his career-high 21-point game, which included 12 points in overtime plus two free throws with less than a minute remaining in regulation. Starting with those free throws with 42 seconds to play, Henry connected on his last nine scoring attempts, including three field goals (two 3-pointers) and six free throw attempts. Henry's strong effort helped the Huskers post their second-largest comeback victory in the Big 12 era, after being down by 14 points in the first half.

The Huskers will be trying to split the season series with CU for the fourth time in five years, while holding off the Buffs' attempt at just their second season sweep of NU since 1972-73. Nebraska is 11-2 at home against Colorado since the formation of the Big 12 Conference.



HUSKER QUICK SHOTS

- >> Nebraska has had at least one player score 20 or more points in each of the last four games (five times total). Before the streak started at KSU, NU had a total of four 20-plus point games in the first 25 games of the year. Overall, six Huskers have combined for the nine 20-point contests.
- PRedshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz is the top freshman in the league in blocked shots with 37 while ranking seventh in the Big 12 Conference. He needs three blocks to set a new Nebraska freshman record.
- >> Nebraska is hitting 39.8 percent from 3-point range, a total that is on pace to set the NU single-season record, just ahead of the current top two spots of 38.9 and 38.3.
- After hitting 6-of-39 from 3-point range vs. Baylor and Texas combined, NU has hit 38-of-78 the last four games (48.7 pct.), including 14-of-21 at No. 7 Kansas State.
- The Huskers tied the school record with just three turnovers against No. 24 Baylor, including only one in the first half. It was the second time a Doc Sadler-led Husker squad tied the mark.
- >> Senior guard Ryan Anderson has reached the 1,000-point barrier and now has 1,083 career points in 119 games (9.1 ppg). He reached the milestone with 12 points at No. 1 Kansas. He also reached the 500-rebound plateau on Jan. 16 when he had eight boards against lowa State (currently 558) and crossed the 200-assist plateau at Colorado (currently 221).
- Manderson became the second player in Nebraska history with at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 150 3-pointers, 150 assists and 150 steals in a career. The only Husker to reach at that level was Erick Strickland, who went on to a nine-year career in the NBA.
- >> Anderson, who has six games this year with at least four steals, now has 162 career steals to tie for fifth place in Nebraska history.
- Manderson has played in 119 games including 98 starts in his career while fellow senior Sek Henry has played every game in his Husker career, 124 straight including 95 total starts.
- Nebraska has had five different scholarship freshmen in the starting lineup in a game this season. Four freshmen Jorge Brian Diaz, Brandon Ubel, Eshaunte Jones and Christian Standhardinger have each started at least one game in Big 12 play this year. Ray Gallegos also started during non-conference play.
- >> The scholarship freshman class has accounted for 46 games started (of 145 total) this season, while adding 775 of the team's 1,932 points, or 40.2 percent of the scoring.
- Three Husker freshmen have had 20-point contests this season, an NU record. Christian Standhardinger had the ninth-highest single-game scoring mark by a freshman and the most ever by a Husker freshman in his first career start with 25 points at Iowa State. Jorge Brian Diaz has added two 20-point games with 22 vs. TCU and 20 at No. 1 Kansas, making him only the eighth Husker freshman in school history with multiple 20-point games. Eshuante Jones also added 21 points against BYU.

SERIES HISTORY VS. COLORADO

Nebraska and Colorado will be meeting for the 146th time this season when they face off on Tuesday in Lincoln. The Huskers hold a slim 76-69 advantage in the series that dates back to the 1902-03 campaign. While the teams' first meeting was more than 100 years ago, it wasn't until 1947-48 during Big Seven Conference play that the teams started facing each other every season.

- >> The series between the Huskers and Buffaloes is NU's second shortest among former Big Eight teams at 145 games. The only team in the old Big Eight Conference that NU has faced fewer times is Oklahoma State at 114 matchups (NU leads 62-52). Nebraska has won 33 of the last 50 meetings overall.
- >> Colorado will be aiming for its first season sweep of Nebraska since 2003-04. That was the Buffs' first sweep against the Huskers since 1972-73.
- ▶ In Lincoln, Nebraska holds a 50-14 series advantage, including a commanding 28-6 lead at the Devaney Center. In the Big 12 era, Nebraska holds a 16-12 overall lead in the series, including 11-2 at home.
- Nebraska's 46-41 victory over Colorado last season in Lincoln marked the fewest combined points ever recorded in a Big 12 contest. It surpassed the previous record of 89 points set on two occasions, both in 2006.

- Deliver Colorado's 41 points last year in Lincoln marked the fewest points Nebraska has allowed against a conference opponent since giving up just 41 in a two-point loss at home during the 1984 Big Eight Tournament. The Huskers' 46 points in that contest were the fewest by Nebraska in a victory since 1966, when NU defeated Oklahoma State 45-41 in overtime in Stillwater, Okla.
- >> Nebraska has held the Buffaloes to 55 or fewer points in four of the last five meetings, and six times in the past 10 matchups. CU has not topped 50 points in the Devaney Center for three straight seasons, since scoring 77 in a loss in 2006.

SCOUTING THE COLORADO BUFFALOES

Colorado enters the midweek matchup looking to post its fifth conference win and, like the Huskers, is aiming for its first two-game win streak of the league season. The Buffs own 13-15 overall record and are 4-10 in conference action after defeating lowa State, 75-72, on Saturday.

Colorado will be looking for its first league road win of the season. CU is 0-7 against Big 12 teams on the road and 1-10 away from Boulder this year with the lone win coming against Chaminade in Hawaii in November.

When they hit the road, the Buffs hope to see guard Cory Higgins keep his hot hand after he led the way with 33 points against the Cyclones. He hit on 12-of-15 shooting to help CU connect on 55.1 percent from the field and 12-of-12 at the line. Along with Higgins, Marcus Relphorde had 12 points, Alec Burks added 11 and Casey Crawford came off the bench for 10 to give CU four double-figure scorers.

On the season, Higgins leads CU and ranks among the Big 12 leaders with 18.6 points per game on 49.7 percent shooting. He has hit 30 3-pointers to lead the squad, although seven Buffs have at least 15 treys this year. He is also extremely accurate at the charity stripe, hitting 146-of-173 attempts (84.4 percent) to rank among the Big 12 free throw percentage leaders. He is second on the team with 67 assists and paces the squad with 51 steals.

Along with Higgins, Burks is among the highest scoring freshmen in the league with 16.5 ppg while Relphorde adds a third double-figure scorer (10.8 ppg) for the Buffs. Burks is the team's top rebounder at 4.7 boards per game, and has hit a team-high 52.3 percent (149-of-285) from the field, helping CU hit 46.7 percent on the season. As a team, the Buffs are among the top free throw shooting squads in the country, hitting 77.3 percent as a team this year. That accuracy has helped CU rank among the top scoring teams in the league, averaging 73.7 ppg on the year, including 70.6 ppg in Big 12 action.

The Buffaloes are coached by Jeff Bzdelik (Illinois-Chicago, 1976). He owns a 34-57 record in his third season guiding the Buffs' program and a 109-104 record in seven seasons as a collegiate head coach.

RECENT MEETINGS - NEBRASKA AND COLORADO

Nebraska has been strong against the Buffs in Lincoln, owning a 28-6 all-time advantage at the Devaney Center, including an 11-2 mark since the formation of the Big 12 Conference. Last year, the Huskers grinded out a difficult win in an ugly contest to earn a season sweep. This year, CU will be looking for just its second series sweep over Nebraska since 1972-73.

>> Last year in Lincoln, Nebraska edged past Colorado, 46-41, in a defensive battle at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. Neither team shot well as Nebraska hit just 34.8 percent from the field, and Colorado connected on only 31.0 percent of its shots.

The Huskers, however, did do an outstanding job taking care of the ball, finishing with just six turnovers. Nebraska did not commit a turnover in the first half and had just two over the final 13 minutes of the contest. The Huskers forced Colorado into 16 turnovers, which led to 17 NU points.

The 87 total combined points by Nebraska and Colorado was a Big 12 record for fewest combined points in a league contest, surpassing the previous record of 89 points set on two occasions, both in 2006. Colorado's 41 points marked the fewest Nebraska has allowed against a Big 12 opponent since giving up just 41 in a two-point loss at home during the 1984 Big Eight Tournament, while the Huskers' 46 points were the fewest by Nebraska in a victory since 1966. That year, NU defeated Oklahoma State 45-41 in overtime in Stillwater, Okla.

>> Earlier this season in Boulder, Colorado came out as the aggressor, forcing 16 Husker turnovers and hitting 48.8 percent from the floor to pull away for a 72-60 victory at the Coors Events Center.

A sluggish start for both teams limited the production until CU gained traction on offense late in the first period. After NU closed to 18-13 on Eshaunte Jones' 3-pointer with 4:11 to play in the half, Colorado posted quick 10-2 run to stretch the lead to 28-15. The Huskers surpassed their season turnover average in the first 20 minutes of the game and Colorado converted those miscues into eight points on the other end to lead 31-21 at the half.

Colorado extended the lead to 15 points, 40-25, with 16:45 to play. CU eventually pushed the lead out to 20 points as NU recorded only one field goal in the first six minutes of the second half.

Freshman Christian Standhardinger led the Huskers with 14 points as the only Husker in double figures while freshman Alec Burks scored a game-high 21 points to pace Colorado.

HUSKERS STILL HITTING AT RECORD PACE

Although Nebraska has been not and cold while shooting from 3-point range in league play, the Cornhuskers are still hitting at a school-record pace from beyond the arc.

- >> Nebraska ranks second in the league and 12th nationally by hitting at a 39.8-percent clip from beyond the arc this season. That average would be a school record if the season ended today as the current mark stands at 38.9 percent by the 2003-04 squad. The current second-place percentage is 38.3 by the 2000-01 Huskers, marking the only times Nebraska has hit better than 38 percent over a season.
- The Huskers hit 9-of-22 3-point attempts vs. Texas Tech (40.9 percent) and have now drained 194-of-487 attempts from 3-point range this season. The 194 3-pointers tie for sixth place in the Nebraska single-season record book. Only five NU teams (2002, 2007, 2006, 2004, 2009) have topped 200 3-pointers in a season.
- Mall four of coach Doc Sadler's Nebraska squads now rank in the top eight in school history for 3-pointers. His 2007 squad is second with 244 treys, while the 2009 (206, 5th) and 2008 (190, 7th) squads also rank among the program's best.
- Despite shooting just 6-of-39 (15.4 percent) combined from 3-point range in games against No. 24 Baylor and No. 14 Texas, Nebraska came back in the next contest to connect on a season-high 14 3-pointers in 21 attempts, for a 66.7 percent accuracy at No. 7 Kansas State. The Huskers hit their last six attempts over the final three minutes of the game and had the contest tied on the scoreboard in the final 30 seconds after scoring nine points in 20 seconds off the clock.

CHART CLIMBING

Senior guard Ryan Anderson was assured of a spot in the Nebraska record books as he entered his final season among the most accurate and most prolific long-distance threats in school history.

In his final season, Anderson owns 179 career 3-pointers to rank fourth in school history. Anderson is not only among the top 10 in made treys, but he is among the most accurate as he ranks eighth all-time by hitting 39.2 percent (179-of-457) in his career.

- In addition to his long-range exploits, Anderson has also climbed into the Nebraska career top 10 for steals this season. A Big 12 All-Defense Team member last season by the sportswriters, Anderson has 162 steals to rank fifth at NU.
- Manderson became the 25th Husker in program history to reach 1,000 career points with 12 points at No. 1/1 Kansas on Feb. 6. He reached the 500-rebound plateau with eight boards against lowa State on Jan. 16.

- >> NU has hit at least 50 percent from 3-point range in eight games this season, including four times in Big 12 play. In two home games, the Huskers drained 11-of-21 (52.4 percent) against No. 3 Kansas and 5-of-9 (55.6 percent) against No. 10 Kansas State. NU also did it on the road at Allen Fieldhouse, connecting on 10-of-17 3-point attempts (58.8 percent) against the No. 1 Jayhawks on Feb. 6, and at Bramlage Coliseum against No. 7 Kansas State, when NU hit 14-of-21 (66.7 percent) from long range.
- >> Anderson has moved up to third among the Big 12 3-point percentage leaders by now hitting 42.5 percent from beyond the arc. Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones leads Nebraska in all games by hitting 44.7 percent from 3-point range but does not have enough made shots to qualify for the Big 12 statistics. His 38 treys are sixth in the NU freshman record book.
- >> In conference games only, Anderson leads the Big 12 3-point percentage at 48.5 after hitting 16 of his last 24 attempts over four games.

COMEBACK TRAIL

Entering their game against Texas Tech on Feb. 27, the Huskers owned a 1-12 league record and had lost nine games when either leading or trailing by a basket or less in the second half, including five losses when leading or trailing by a basket in the final 10 minutes of the game. Despite the lack of success in finishing

games, the Cornhuskers never gave up and finally came through in memorable fashion against the Red Raiders.

- Nebraska overcame a 17-0 first-half run by Texas Tech and surged ahead in the second half by using its own 18-0 run, which started when the Huskers trailed by 10.
- >> After the Red Raiders held the Huskers to one field goal in the final five minutes to send the game to overtime, Nebraska again had to respond as it trailed by five points with 2:44 to play in the first overtime before rebounding to force the second OT.
- The comeback was the second-largest in a Husker victory during the Big 12 era, trailing only the 20-point comeback NU made against Kansas State in 1996-97. It was the 12th

double-digit comeback for an NU win in the Big 12 era, and the third under coach Doc Sadler, whose teams now own three of the top four largest comebacks by Nebraska since the formation of the Big 12.

>> Senior Sek Henry led the way for the Huskers with a career-best 21-point performance. Henry scored 12 points in the overtime periods, after knocking down two free throws with less than a minute left in regulation to help push the Huskers to overtime. He hit all three of his shots in overtime, including two 3-pointers, and was 4-of-4 at the free throw line in the extra session to help the Huskers to the win.

MAKING THEIR PRESENCE FELT

Seven of Nebraska's 11 active scholarship players this season are freshmen and sophomores, giving several youngsters more than ample opportunity to step up and play a major role for the Huskers this season. That is exactly what has happened on more than one occasion as three Husker freshmen have recorded 20-point contests this season while helping the rookie class account for 40 percent of the team's scoring.

- >> Forward Christian Standhardinger is the most recent freshman to step up for the Huskers as he posted a career- and team-season high 25 points in his first career start at Iowa State on Feb. 24. The 25 points were the ninth-most by a freshman in school history and the most in the first career start by an NU freshman.
- >> Standhardinger's 25 points came on 9-of-17 shooting from the field and 5-of-7 shooting at the free throw

line. He also filled the stat sheet by hitting a pair of 3-pointers, adding eight rebounds, three assists and two steals in 34 minutes. Each was a career high.

- Along with Standhardinger, redshirt freshmen Jorge Brian Diaz (twice) and Eshaunte Jones (once) have each recorded 20-point contests this season. The three freshmen with 20-point games in the same season is a Nebraska record.
- Diaz became just the eighth Husker freshman with multiple 20-point contests as he posted 20 points on 9-of-17 shooting in his first trip to Allen Fieldhouse as the Huskers played at No. 1

Kansas on Feb. 6. He added nine rebounds, two steals and two blocks, helping NU to a four-point lead with less than 16 minutes remaining before the Huskers fell by 11. Early in the season, Diaz posted 22 points as he helped the Huskers raced past TCU on Nov. 21 in a 90-77 victory. Diaz connected on 9-of-10 shots from the floor.

- >> Jones followed as he produced 21 points on 6-of-11 shooting in a loss to BYU in the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic. He hit 5-of-7 3-point attempts while adding three rebounds and two assists without a turnover.
- >> Overall, the trio became the 21st, 22nd and 23rd freshmen to record a 20-point game for the Huskers since freshmen were reinstated by the NCAA for the 1972-73 season.
- >> Nebraska's freshmen have accounted for 46 starts this season including 23 by Diaz and 16 by Brandon Ubel. The Huskers have seen five different freshmen start a game this year, including one game (BYU) with three freshmen in the starting lineup together.

STANDHARDINGER SHOWING FLASHES

After sitting out the non-conference slate, freshman forward Christian Standhardinger jumped right into the action as conference play got started on Jan. 9 at Texas A&M. The 6-8, 210-pounder quickly made his presence felt as he had a team-high 13 points and seven rebounds vs. the Aggies, but it wasn't until NU's game lowa State on Feb. 24 that he showed much of his potential that only his teammates had seen in practice.

- >> Standhardinger has averaged 7.5 points and 3.6 rebounds per game in league play despite struggling with foul trouble that has limited his playing time in some stretches. Of Standhardinger's 47 rebounds this season, 21 have come on the offensive end, the second-highest total among Huskers in league action despite his limited minutes.
- After hitting just 37.5 percent (21-of-56) from the floor in his first 11 appearances (all off the bench), Standhardinger made his first career start at Iowa State and hit 9-of-17 shots (52.9 percent) from the floor. He also hit 2-of-4 from 3-point range after entering the game having hit just 2-of-8 in his first 11 games.
- >> Standhardinger has gotten to the free throw line 44 times in Big 12 play, hitting 34 shots (77.3 percent). He is second on the team in free throw attempts in Big 12 play despite averaging just 15.0 minutes per contest.
- >> Standhardinger scored 25 points against lowa State in his first career start. It's the most points ever by a Husker freshman in his first career start, and the ninth-highest single-game point total by an NU freshman ever. He is the third Nebraska freshman to post a 20-point game this season, joining Jorge Brian Diaz (twice) and Eshaunte Jones.
- >> Standhardinger has posted three double-figure scoring games this season, including 13 points in his debut at Texas A&M and 14 points at Colorado. In the seven games between the Colorado and Iowa State games, Standhardinger had just 32 points before exploding for 25 against the Cyclones in Ames.
- >> An NCAA amateurism ruling mandated that the freshman forward had to sit out the first 15 games of the season because the club team he played on in his native Germany included a professional. It was the same team that produced fellow Husker Christopher Niemann, who had to sit out all of last season because of the NCAA's ruling at the time. Standhardinger was not allowed to travel with the team, but practiced with the Huskers during the non-conference season.

DIAZ GIVES STRONG PLAY BUT STILL LOOKS FOR CONSISTENCY

Center Jorge Brian Diaz has been fairly strong in the scoring department for a freshman although he is still looking to become more consistent night in and night out in league play. The 6-11, 235-pounder has averaged 8.6 points per game on the season to rank second on the squad and has been one of the top shot blockers in the league this season.

- >> On the year, Diaz has posted 11 double-figure scoring games and has had seven other games with between seven and nine points. He is the leading Husker freshman with 250 points this season, and could still challenge for a spot on the Nebraska freshman scoring list. Tenth place is Jamel White with 8.7 points per game in 2006.
- In conference play, Diaz has hit 49.1 percent (57-of-116) from the field. He has hit at least 55 percent from the field in six league games, but has had more than 10 attempts only four times vs. Big 12 teams.
- >> After struggling for three games, Diaz hit 5-of-9 attempts against Oklahoma including a pair of dunks as the Huskers won their first league game of the year. He then came back to add 13 points on 5-of-12 shooting against No. 10/11 Kansas State and 20 points on 9-of-17 shooting at No. 1 Kansas.

RECAPPING NU VS. TTU

Lincoln, Neb. --- Nebraska staged an 18-0 run in the second half to rally from a 10-point deficit and help force overtime, then turned to senior guard Sek Henry in the second overtime session as the Huskers outbattled the Texas Tech Red Raiders for a thrilling 83-79 win at the Bob Devaney Sports Center Saturday afternoon.

The Huskers, who were down by 14 points in the first half, trailed by 10 with 11:53 to play, but chipped it all away and surged ahead to an eight-point lead during a 5:26 stretch in the second half. However, the Red Raiders would not go easily as they responded with a 10-2 run at the end of regulation to force overtime. After Tech missed a shot to win the game at the buzzer in the first overtime, Henry secured the win for the Huskers with seven straight points for NU in the final overtime frame.

Before they could even think about overtime, each team had to answer a double-digit run by the other in the game's first 40 minutes.

The Red Raiders reeled off a 17-0 run midway through the first half to take what looked like a commanding lead and momentum into the second half. Nebraska then surged ahead in the second period before Tech came back to send it to overtime. TTU then went up 69-64 with 2:44 left in the first overtime period on a Mike Singletary jumper.

Freshman Brandon Ubel, who played an instrumental role in the Huskers' 18-0 run in the second half, then converted an old-fashioned 3-point play to draw the Huskers within two, 69-67. After a defensive stop for the Big Red, Henry hit a 3-pointer with 1:39 left to give the Huskers a 70-69 lead. Tech's John Roberson hit two free throws to take back the lead, and Lance Jeter hit 1-of-2 free throws with seven seconds left to force double overtime.

With the game again tied at 73-73, Henry connected on a jumper, then sank a 3-pointer and answered a Roberson 3 with two free throws to put the Huskers in front for good at 80-76 with 1:51 remaining. After a Jeter free throw, Tech's Nick Okorie drained one of his six 3-pointers to cut the lead to 81-79 with 38 seconds left. But Jeter iced the game with two free throws with 17 seconds remaining to account for the final margin.

Postgame notes

- The 14-point deficit overcome was the second-largest deficit Nebraska has erased in the Big 12 era, trailing only the 20-point deficit NU overcame against Kansas State in 1997. NU also overcame a 13-point deficit against Texas Tech in Lubbock in coach Doc Sadler's first season at the helm when Charles Richardson Jr. hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer for the victory.
- >> The contest was just the fourth multiple overtime game in the building's history, improving Nebraska to 4-0 in multiple overtime games and 19-5 overall in overtime contests in the Devaney Center. It was the third multiple overtime game at home in the Big 12 era and first since a 2005 win over Kansas State.
- Nebraska had a season-high 52 rebounds, the team's most in a single game under coach Doc Sadler. It's the first time Nebraska has had at least 50 rebounds in a contest since 2006. Ryan Anderson led the way with eight reobunds, while Lance Jeter and Brandon Richardson each had seven rebounds apiece. The seven boards by Jeter ties his career high and Richardson's seven set a career high.

FRESH FACES

Nebraska had an inexperienced roster entering 2009-10, as the Huskers returned only four scholarship players from last season's 18-win campaign. Among the veterans on the squad are seniors Ryan Anderson and Sek Henry, along with sophomore Brandon Richardson. Sophomore Toney McCray also returned, but played just three games before sitting out the rest of the season with an injury.

When Nebraska hit the court for its season opener, it had two freshmen - forward Brandon Ubel (true frosh) and center Jorge Brian Diaz (redshirt frosh) - in the starting lineup, marking the second time in coach Doc Sadler's tenure that NU had two freshman start a season opener. The last time that happened was Sadler's first year at Nebraska when Anderson and Henry opened in the starting lineup.

- >> Ubel and Diaz were the seventh and eighth freshmen to start a season opener for Nebraska in the Big 12 era. However, they were only the second and third freshmen who stood over 6-4 to start for the Huskers in a season opener during that span, joining 6-11 Brian Conklin in 2000-01. The full list of Nebraska's frosh starters in a season opener since 1996-97 includes:

- Against UMKC on Nov. 24 this season, another freshman made an appearance in the starting lineup as redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones earned his first career start. With Ray Gallegos' start against Jackson State on Dec. 19 and Christian Standhardinger against Iowa State on Feb. 24, it marked the first time in the Big 12 era that Nebraska has had five different freshmen start in the same season.
- >> On Dec. 23 this season against BYU, Nebraska started three freshmen with Diaz. Ubel and Gallegos on the floor for the opening tip. It was the second time in the Big 12 era that NU had three freshmen start in the same contest. On Dec. 23, 2006, in a 70-56 win over Houston in the Rainbow Classic, former Husker Jay-R Strowbridge to make it three freshmen in the same starting lineup as he joined regulars Anderson and Henry to start the game.
- >> Overall, Nebraska has now had 23 freshmen start games during the Big 12 era. That list includes:

- >> Diaz had three straight games with double figures against Oklahoma (10), Kansas State (13) and at Kansas (20), before being held to 23 combined points over four straight games (six vs. Baylor; eight at Texas; zero at Kansas State; nine vs. Missouri). He came back with 12 points on 6-of-9 shooting at Iowa State on Feb. 24.
- Diaz matched his season high with three blocks vs. Iowa State and added two more at ISU. With two blocks against Texas Tech, he now has 14 blocks in 14 league games to rank 11th (1.0 bpg) in league-only games while ranking seventh (1.3 bpg) in the overall season stats. He is the highest-ranking freshman on each season list.
- While his scoring numbers continue to climb, Diaz has also shown flashes that he can compete on the boards. His best rebounding effort during league play came with nine boards against No. 1 Kansas in his first-ever trip to Allen Fieldhouse. He also had seven rebounds including two offensive boards while helping the Huskers to their lone league win over Oklahoma a week earlier.
- Diaz moved onto the Nebraska freshman rebounds top-10 list with six rebounds against Texas Tech. He has 118 rebounds this season including a team-high 49 offensive boards.
- Here is a breakdown of Diaz's season stats compared with those of a few other notable Husker freshman post players in

history. Diaz ranks favorably in several categories against the other top freshman post players in NU history, including the school's all-time scoring leader (Dave Hoppen) and three others who went on to rank among the top 15 scorers all-time at Nebraska (Andre Smith, Aleks Maric and Venson Hamilton):


JETER DOES A LITTLE OF EVERYTHING

Coming into the season, there was some question about who would become Nebraska's floor general as, after last season, two-year starting point guard Cookie Miller decided to transfer and go to school back in his home state of West Virginia. Today, there is no question who that commander is as point guard Lance Jeter has made his presence felt both on and off the court.

- >> Jeter leads the team with 117 assists and his 4.0 assists per game are ninth in the Big 12 Conference. In conference play, he is seventh entering the week with 4.1 assists per
- >> Jeter's teammates helped him post possibly his most well-rounded game of the year as they made shot after

shot against No. 7 Kansas on Feb. 17, leading to the point guard's first career double-double. Jeter had 12 points and finished with a career-high 12 assists as the Huskers hit 58.3 percent from the field.

- >> Jeter needs 18 assists this season to reach 10th place on the single-season chart.
- >> He also has shown good decision-making as he is fourth in the league this season with a 2.1 assist-toturnover ratio (117 to 57). Entering the week, Jeter ranked 69th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio and his assist average placed him 142nd in the nation.
- >> Jeter has had at least five assists in 10 games this season, including six straight between Dec. 23 and Jan. 13. The six straight games with at least five assists is the longest streak by a Husker in the Big 12 era, surpassing the five straight games Charles Richardson Jr. had at least five assists in 2006-07.
- >> Jeter can also be a force on the glass as he has shown recently. While he has had 42 assists in the last 12 contests (3.5 apg), he has also posted 52 rebounds (4.3 rpg), setting a career best four times. He posted a then-best six boards against lowa State and had a team- and career-high seven boards three times -- at Missouri and at home against Oklahoma and Texas Tech. He also added six boards against Baylor.

ANDERSON REACHES 1,000-POINT CLUB

Senior Ryan Anderson joined the 1,000-point club when he posted his first basket of the day against No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse on Feb. 6. Anderson joined one of the program's elite fraternities as he became only the 25th Husker ever to cross the 1,000-point barrier. He currently ranked No. 23 on the scoring chart with 1,083 points, as he passed former Husker Cary Cochran, the Huskers' all-time 3-point leader, with 12 points against Texas Tech.

- >> Anderson is first Husker to join the 1,000-point club at Nebraska since Aleks Maric did it his junior year in 2006-07. Overall, Anderson is only the sixth Husker to reach the mark while playing in the Big 12 era, including just the fourth to play his whole career after the formation of the conference. The other Huskers to cross the plateau while playing against current Big 12 Conference teams include:
- Aleks Maric (No. 5 all-time, 1,630 points, 2005-08)
- Tyronn Lue (No. 8, 1,577 points, 1996-98)
- Cookie Belcher (No. 9, 1,552 points, 1997-2001)
- Venson Hamilton (No. 11, 1,416, 1996-99)
- Cary Cochran (No. 23, 1,082, 1999-2002)
- During his career, Anderson has posted 283 points (10.1 ppg) as a freshman, 278 points (8.4 ppg) as a sophomore, 213 points (7.1 ppg) as a junior and has a career high 309 points (11.0 ppg) as a senior.

VERSATILE ANDERSON IN ELITE COMPANY

Even before Ryan Anderson joined the 1,000-point club at No. 1 Kansas on Feb. 6, he was already among an elite list with some of his on-court accomplishments over the past three-plus seasons.

- With his 12 points at No. 1 Kansas on Feb. 6, Anderson became one the ninth player in the Big 12 era and second of three this season - to surpass 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers in a career. He is the first Cornhusker in the Big 12 era to do it and just the third Husker ever, joining Eric Piatkowski and Erick Strickland. The other players to play solely in the Big 12 era and reach those three marks are (as of Feb. 27):
 - Tony Crocker (Oklahoma, 2007-present): 1,314 points, 531 rebounds, 195 3-pointers
 - Ryan Anderson (Nebraska, 2007-present): 1,083 points, 558 rebounds, 179 3-pointers
 - Obi Muonelo (Oklahoma State, 2007-present): 1,316 points, 571 rebounds, 232 3-pointers
 - Terrel Harris (Oklahoma State, 2005-09): 1,319 points, 512 rebounds, 153 3-pointers
 - Josh Carter (Texas A&M, 2005-09): 1,566 points, 509 rebounds, 299 3-pointers
 - Brandon Rush (Kansas, 2006-08): 1,477 points, 602 rebounds, 205 3-pointers
 - Richard Roby (Colorado, 2004-08): 2,001 points, 659 rebounds, 214 3-pointers
 - Cartier Martin (Kansas State, 2003-07): 1,546 points, 540 rebounds, 178 3-pointers
 - Rickey Paulding (Missouri, 2000-04): 1,673 points, 526 rebounds, 191 3-pointers
 - Kirk Hinrich (Kansas, 2000-03): 1,753 points, 532 rebounds, 236 3-pointers
- >> Last year Anderson became just the seventh Husker to record at least 100 3-pointers, 100 assists and 100 steals in a career. Among that short list are Eric Piatkowski, Tyronn Lue, Erick Strickland, Cookie

Belcher, Cary Cochran and Jaron Boone, along with Anderson. For his career, Anderson now has 179 3-pointers, 162 steals and 221 assists. With his five steals against lowa State on Jan. 16, Anderson joined Strickland as the only two Huskers ever with at

least 150 in each of those three categories.

- >> Anderson reached the 500-rebound mark when he posted a team-high eight boards against Iowa State on Jan. 16. The 6-4 Anderson has since moved his way into all-time top 25 rebounders at Nebraska. His 558 rebounds are currently No. 19 on the list.
- >> Anderson crossed the 200-assist plateau with three assists at Colorado this season. Anderson, who posted a career-high tying seven assists (zero turnovers) at Iowa State on Feb. 24, now has 221 assists in his career to rank No. 19 on the Husker all-time list.
- With at least 40 steals in each of his final three seasons. including a career-high 49 steals this year, Anderson has climbed among the top 10 in Husker history for career steals. His 162 career steals currently rank fifth all-time.

BENCH PRODUCTION

The Cornhuskers have spread the scoring around this season with only one player averaging double figures. Much of that production has come from the bench, as NU has a deeper roster than many recent seasons.

- >> The Husker bench outscored opponents in each of the first eight games and 20 times overall this season.
- Nebraska posted its top bench production when it got 37 points from the non-starters against No. 24 Baylor. The Husker bench players outscored Baylor's bench 37-7, and NU's bench accounted for 69.8 percent of its scoring. The Huskers also had a tremendous effort from the bench at Colorado, when the bench scored 35 points for 58.3 percent of its 60 points scored against the Buffs.
- The Huskers' production of 31 points against Texas Tech was one of 17 games when the Huskers had at least 25 points off the bench.
- On the season, Nebraska has gotten 752 points (of 1,932 on the season) from its bench. That's 38.9 percent of the production that has come from outside the starting lineup.
- The most points by a Husker off the bench this year is 22 by Jorge Brian Diaz, who went 9-of-10 against TCU, while Eshaunte Jones added 21 points, including five 3-pointers, in a loss to BYU. Brandon Richardson also had 18 points off the bench against No. 3 Kansas and 16 points against Oklahoma, while Christian Standhardinger had 14 points in 12 minutes off the bench at Colorado.
- Mebraska had three players score in double figures off the bench against No. 24 Baylor. Myles Holley led all Nebraska scorers with 11 points while Eshaunte Jones and Brandon Richardson each had 10 points. The Huskers also had two in double figures off the bench against Texas Tech as Richardson had 15 and Brandon Ubel posted a career-high 14 points.

FREE BASKETBALL

Nebraska gave its fans more than just a victory on Feb. 27 with the win over Texas Tech. It gave everyone a little free basketball as the teams traded baskets back and forth, forcing the game into two overtimes.

- The double overtime game was the just the fourth multiple overtime contest in Devaney Center history and the third in the Big 12 era. Nebraska's first multiple overtime game was a four overtime affair against UAB in 1979, while the Huskers also played two overtime games against Eastern Illinois (1999) and Kansas State (2005).
- The Huskers improved to 4-0 in multiple overtime games in the Devaney Center with today's win.
- With the win, Nebraska improved to 19-5 in overtime games at the Devaney Center. It snapped a three-game losing streak in overtime contests for the Huskers, who improved to 3-3 in overtime games under coach Doc Sadler.

HITTING SHOTS

Nebraska had struggled from the offensive end for two straight games before exploding for 87 points on the road at No. 7 Kansas State on Feb. 17. The Huskers had posted less than 60 points in three of their previous four games before putting up their highest point total in a Big 12 game under coach Doc Sadler.

- Nebraska's point total was its highest in a road Big 12 game since putting up 96 points at No. 25 Oklahoma (won 96-81) in 1999. Overall, it was the Huskers' most points in a game away from Lincoln since falling in the 1999 National Invitation Tournament at TCU (101-89).
- >> The Huskers hit a season-high 14 3-pointers, tying for their most in a game since posting 15 at Miami in 2006. It's also tied for the fourth-highest total by the Huskers in the Big 12 era.
- >> NU's 58.3 percent shooting from the floor was a season high, as were the Huskers' 23 assists.
- >> Over the final 2:36 of the KSU contest, the Huskers went 6-of-6 from 3-point range, including scoring nine points on three treys in a span of 20 seconds to tie the game at 87-all in the final minute. Nebraska also went 2-of-2 at the line and Kansas State was 14-of-14 at the free throw stripe. Nebraska missed one layup and KSU hit one, meaning the teams combined to hit 23 of the last 24 scoring attempts (field goal or free throw) in the last three minutes of game action.
- Three of Nebraska's five highest-scoring games in league play have come on the road at No. 1 Kansas (64), at No. 7 Kansas (87) and at Iowa State (74). The other games came at home against then-No. 3 Kansas (72) and vs. Texas Tech (83) in two overtimes.
- In the four games since scoring just 51 points in a 40-point loss at then-No. 14 Texas, the Huskers have averaged 75.8 points per contest on 44.8 percent shooting. NU has hit 70.5 percent from the free throw line in those games while nailing 48.7 percent from 3-point range. The Huskers also trailed on the glass just 35.8-34.0. Opponents have averaged 80.5 points on 44.2 percent shooting, including 44.0 percent from long range and 73.0 percent at the charity stripe in the stretch.

BOARD SUPPORT

Despite struggling on the glass in league play, Nebraska has won the rebounding advantage 12 times this season, including 10 times at home. The Huskers are 11-1 in those contests. Senior Ryan Anderson and redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz have led the way for the Huskers this season, averaging 4.9 and 4.1 rebounds per game, respectively.

- Anderson has been a mainstay on the backboards for the Huskers the past four years. While he will not break into the career top 10, the 6-4 Seattle native moved past the 500-rebound plateau on Jan. 16 against lowa State when he had a team-high eight boards. Anderson became the 24th Husker in history to record at least 500 rebounds, and he has moved into the top 20 all-time as he now has 558 rebounds.
- >> Anderson posted a career-best and team season-high 14 rebounds to go with 16 points in a win over Oregon State in December. It was his sixth career double-figure rebounding game and his third career double-double.
- >> In the regular-season opener, Diaz had 11 rebounds to go with nine points in his first career game. He added a second double-figure rebounding game with 12 boards against Chicago State.
- Diaz narrowly missed his first career double-double when he posted 20 points and nine rebounds against No. 1 Kansas in Lawrence on Feb. 6. It was his highest rebounding total since mid-December.
- Along with Diaz and Anderson, sophomore Myles Holley is the only other Husker with a double-figure rebounding game this year. He had 11 boards and seven points against Southern Utah.

As a team, Nebraska posted a season-high 52 rebounds against Texas Tech in a two overtime win. It was the highest total for a Doc Sadler-led Husker squad and the first time NU topped 50 rebounds since 2006. The last time NU had more than 52 rebounds was the 2004-05 season opener against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Coach Doc Sadler's teams at Nebraska have always been noted for their blue-collar work ethic and their attitude toward having a stalwart defense, but over the past couple years another area has become a trademark of a Sadler-led program: ball security.

Last season, the Cornhuskers ranked 18th nationally and first in the Big 12 Conference in turnovers per game, giving up the ball just 11.5 times per contest. NU was one of only two teams (also Texas) to give up less than 12 turnovers per game in 2009 Big 12 Conference play as the Huskers led the league with just 185 turnovers in league action (11.6 tpg).

- This season, Nebraska is still strong with the ball although not quite at the level it was last year. NU entered the week ranked 62nd nationally in turnovers per game, and is currently averaging 12.4 turnovers per contest despite giving up at least 16 miscues in five of its last 10 contests. Nebraska has averaged 12.9 turnovers per game in Big 12 play.
- The Huskers have turned the ball over seven or fewer times in five games, and less than 10 times on eight occasions. Nebraska set this year's season low and tied the school record with just three miscues against No. 24 Baylor. NU had one turnover in the first half and two in the second, marking the third time in school history a Husker squad posted three turnovers in a game, and the second time under coach Doc Sadler.
- Nebraska had 13 turnovers in the double overtime win against Texas Tech on Feb. 27. The total matched NU's average coming into the game (12.9 tpg), although taking care of the ball was a primary reason the Huskers won the game. NU had 10 turnovers in the first half, and had three more in the first 10:15 of the second period. From there, the Huskers went nearly 20 minutes without committing a turnover in the last 9:45 of the second period and the two, five-minute overtime sessions.

RANKINGS GAME

Nebraska had plenty of chances during February to extend a streak of knocking off ranked teams to 10 straight seasons, but fell to 0-6 on the year when it dropped a high-scoring affair, 91-87, at No. 7 Kansas State on Feb. 17.

- >> The stretch of five straight games against ranked teams vs. No. 10 Kansas State, at No. 1 Kansas, vs. No. 24 Baylor, at No. 14 Texas and at No. 7 Kansas State was Nebraska's longest stretch of consecutive games (5) against ranked teams in school history.
- Four of the games were against top-15 teams, including each of the last two on the road. The last time the Huskers faced top-15 squads in consecutive games was the 2004-05 campaign, but to put things in larger perspective, the last time Nebraska played consecutive true road games vs. top-15 teams was 1958-59.
- The Huskers beat at least one ranked team for nine straight seasons from 2000-01 to 2008-09. Since the start of the streak, Nebraska is 13-45 against ranked teams, including 3-31 against top-15 squads. Nebraska is 8-9 against teams ranked between Nos. 20 and 25 during the streak, and 2-5 against teams from Nos. 16-19.
- ▶ Before this season, the Huskers had previously faced four consecutive ranked squads on four separate occasions, but never faced five straight. Nebraska's best mark in a four-game stretch vs. AP ranked teams was 2-2 in 1991-92. NU also went 1-3 in 1994-95 and 1996-97, and was 0-4 in 1999-2000.
- >> Overall, Nebraska is 5-17 against ranked squads under coach Doc Sadler with one victory last season, a 58-55 home win over No. 16 Texas.
- >> The Huskers own a 55-210 all-time record against ranked teams, including a 19-111 mark against teams ranked in the top 10 and an 11-63 mark against top-five squads. The Huskers are 19-65 against ranked teams in the Big 12 era, including 2-31 against top-10 teams and 1-19 against top-five squads.
- Nebraska has played a top-three ranked team 11 times (0-11 record) in the Big 12 era, with all of the matchups coming against Kansas. In the Big 12 era, Nebraska is 0-5 against KU when the Jayhawks are ranked No. 1, 0-3 when ranked No. 2 and 0-3 when ranked No. 3. Two of those 10 games were decided by one field goal (once at home, 2002; once in Lawrence, 2005).
- >> The Cornhuskers' last win over a top-10 team came in 2005, when the Huskers defeated No. 4 Oklahoma State, 74-67, at the Devaney Center. That was NU's first win against a top-five team since the 1994 Big Eight Tournament, when the Huskers knocked off No. 3 Missouri, and the first home win over a top-five team since 1993, when the Huskers beat No. 3 Kansas.

HUSKERS SIGN 6-11, 315-POUND CENTER FOR 2010-11

Lincoln (Nov. 14) --- Fourth-year coach Doc Sadler added a big recruit for the 2010 signing class as 6-11, 315-pound Andre Almeida signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of Nebraska and join the Husker basketball team next fall.

One of the top post players in the junior college ranks last year, Almeida will add to what is expected to be a huge front court for the Huskers next season as Nebraska currently has three freshmen and sophomores who stand at least 6-10.

"Andre is as talented as he is big," Sadler said. "He has good hands and footwork and he knows how to get around in the paint and score. He has tremendous strength, and when you're that big, it's hard to be moved around. Andre will help us when we get into Big 12 play where we're facing great big men every night. He also has a tremendous work ethic and I think Nebraska fans will enjoy seeing him play alongside some of our other younger big guys."

A 2010 NJCAA Division preseason All-American, Almeida is the fifth international player to sign with the Cornhuskers under Sadler. A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, Almeida recently played for current Nebraska assistant coach Walter Roese, who served as the head coach of the Brazilian U24 national team that competed in the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia, in July. Almeida also played under Roese on the 2006 U18 national team that competed at the Copa America tournament in San Antonio, Texas, qualifying Brazil for the Junior World Cup in Belgrade. Brazil finished in fourth place in the world that year.

During his first season in the United States, Almeida led Arizona Western College to a 26-6 record in 2008-09, including an 18-4 mark in conference action, as AWC finished the year ranked 17th nationally in NJCAA Division I. The Matadors won their fourth regional title in five years before falling in the district finals. Almeida led the way as he averaged 13.8 points over 32 games while ranking first in the nation in field-goal percentage by hitting an outstanding 71.0 percent (184-of-261) from the floor. He also led the league in blocked shots with 3.5 per game (112 total) while adding 7.9 rebounds and 1.6 assists per contest.

After finishing with 11 double-doubles on the year, Almeida was honored as a second-team All-American and a first-team all-conference and all-region selection. He was also named the Arizona Community College Athletic Conference Player of the Year after helping coach Kelly Green and the Matadors to their second straight league regular-season title. Earlier in the season, Almeida was named the NJCAA Division I Player of the Week on Jan. 19 after averaging 20.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game while hitting 81.0 percent from the field over two games.

SADLER SETTING NEW MARKS

Nebraska coach Doc Sadler has said from the beginning that he hopes to do something at Nebraska that's never been accomplished before: get to the NCAA Tournament and win a game. Since he's been at NU, his record has spoken volumes as he has reached marks rarely seen in Lincoln.

Over his first three years, Sadler had more victories than any Husker coach to open a career. Through his first three seasons, Sadler owned a 55-40 mark, two more wins than Moe Iba had in his first three years and four more than Danny Nee. Sadler also had the most wins in the first two years at NU (37) and is the first coach in school history to win at least 17 games in each of his first three years guiding the Cornhuskers.

The Huskers' win over Texas Tech on the road on Jan. 31, 2009, marked Sadler's 50th victory at Nebraska. He was the fourth-fastest coach to reach 50 wins at NU in program history and among the three who reached the mark faster at NU, two of those men coached in Lincoln before World War I.

BLOCK PARTY

Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz has made a name for himself on the offensive end with a pair of 20-point contests this season, including a 20-point, nine-rebound effort at Allen Fieldhouse against No. 1 Kansas on Feb. 6. He owns two of the Huskers' nine 20-point games this season as he also added 22 points on 9-of-10 shooting against TCU in his third career game. But it is on the defensive end that he is looking like one of the top freshmen in school history.

Diaz, who is the top-ranked freshman in blocks in the league, easily leads NU with 37 blocked shots. His 1.3 blocks per game are seventh in the Big 12 Conference this season where he is the top-ranked freshman. He is also 11th in league-only games with 1.0 bpg.

- Diaz ranks third in the Nebraska freshman record book with his 37 blocks. The only two rookies to ever record more are Venson Hamilton (1996) and John Turek (2002), who hold the Nebraska freshman record with 39 blocks each in their initial season.
- Despite his strong start to the season, Diaz has had just seven blocked shots in the last 10 games, including zero in four straight contests until posting two at lowa State. Of his 14 blocks in league play, five came against the Cyclones.
- >> Diaz has had a career high with three blocked shots in five contests this season including the Huskers' contest against lowa State at home, his high in league play.
- >> As a team, the Huskers own 86 blocked shots this season in 29 games, averaging 3.0 blocks per game. Last year, Nebraska had just 52 blocks in 31 games (1.7 bpg).

JONES HITS FROM LONG RANGE

With so many new faces on the squad, it was only a matter of time before one of the youngsters was asked to step up and make a game-changing play. At USC on Nov. 29, it was more than just a game-changing play... it was a game-deciding shot.

>> Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones, playing in his ninth career game, had made just two field goals in the first half and had only been off the bench for five minutes in the second period before being called upon with less than a minute to play in a tie game. Jones didn't hesitate as

the buried the game-winning shot from the corner, a 3-pointer with 11.7 seconds left. From there, the Huskers defended the perimeter well and USC only managed to get off an off-balance desperation shot at the buzzer to hold on for the win.

>> Jones finished the USC game with seven points, and his 3-pointer gave the Huskers their first road win of the season, and just the second true road win over a non-conference opponent under fourth-year coach Doc Sadler. It was NU's first road victory over a non-conference BCS team since defeating Tennessee, 62-61, in Knoxville in 2004.

- >> Jones also led the Huskers in scoring in both games at the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic just before Christmas. He posted 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting, all from 3-point range, to lead the Huskers to a victory over Tulsa, and came back a night later to record a career-best 21 points. He hit 6-of-11 shots from the field with five made baskets from 3-point range (seven attempts).
- >> Jones has connected on 44.7 percent (38-of-85) from beyond the arc this year to rank first on the team the season. His 38 3-pointers are sixth on the NU freshman top 10 list and just one away from fifth place. He is aiming to become only the fifth freshman in school history and first since current teammate Ryan Anderson to post 40 treys as a freshman.

NIEMANN, MCCRAY OUT FOR SEASON

After making what looked to be a successful return from a torn ACL suffered in the final week of the regular season last year, 6-10, 265-pound sophomore center Christopher Niemann had a major setback as he tore the same ACL for a second time in the first week of September. After surgery to repair the damage that occurred during a non-basketball conditioning workout, Niemann will be out for all of the 2009-10 campaign.

Niemann is currently making good progress through rehab again, and is on pace to join the team for offseason workouts in late spring. He will have three years remaining on his original eligibility clock to play three seasons with the Huskers.

Nebraska coach Doc Sadler announced following Nebraska's game against UMKC on Nov. 24 that sophomore guard Toney McCray would have surgery on his elbow and be out for the remainder of the season. McCray injured the elbow in a pickup game in early September, sustaining a torn ligament. McCray tried to play through the pain as doctors assured him that it would get no worse if he waited until after the season to have surgery. But Sadler said that McCray indicated he had little confidence in his elbow and wasn't able to help the team the way he wanted to, and thought it would be better to have surgery now and be ready for the offseason in the spring of 2010.

McCray had successful surgery on Dec. 7 to repair the UCL in his elbow. He started rehab that week and is doing well, as he is on pace to try to join the team in the spring during offseason workouts.

>> Both Niemann and McCray were looked at as possible starters heading into the start of the season. McCray averaged 6.3 points and 4.0 rebounds over three games this year, hitting 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from the field. He played 18.3 minutes per game. Niemann has yet to play a game in a Husker uniform.

NEW FACES LINE HUSKER ROSTER

While the Huskers will rely on three returning scholarship players for leadership – seniors Ryan Anderson and Sek Henry, and sophomore Brandon Richardson – most of the eyes will be focused on the faces of several newcomers who dot the inexperienced Nebraska roster.

- Manning the scholarship newcomers who have seen action for the first time in their Husker careers this season are juniors Lance Jeter and Quincy Hankins-Cole, sophomore Myles Holley, redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz and freshmen Ray Gallegos and Brandon Ubel. Freshman Adrien Coleman also played in the first semester before transferring at the holiday break.
- Freshman Christian Standhardinger, who was forced to sit out the first 15 games of the season because of an NCAA amateurism ruling, became eligible for the league opener at Texas A&M. He is the eighth scholarship Husker to play his first game for Nebraska this season.
- >> Including walk-ons Matt Karn and Mike Fox, more than 60 percent (9 of 14 active players; 64.2 percent) of the Huskers who have recorded time during the regular season are playing for the first time in a Nebraska uniform this year. Another Husker Eshaunte Jones played only four games last year before an injury forced him to redshirt.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

While Nebraska entered the season knowing it will have a number of young players in the lineup on any given night, it did not realize it would have two of the youngest players in their respective classes.

- >> Freshman Brandon Ubel is the third-youngest player overall in the Big 12 Conference this season. Born on Aug. 29, 1991, only Jaye Crockett of Texas Tech (Oct. 16, 1991) and Tyler Stone of Missouri (Sept. 8, 1991) are younger than Ubel.
- While Ubel is one of the youngest in the league, another Husker is the youngest for his class. Junior college transfer Quincy Hankins-Cole, who graduated high school when he was 16 and played the past two years at Polk (Fla.) CC, did not turn 20 years old until Feb. 18, 2010. The next youngest junior in the Big 12 is Kansas State's Jacob Pullen, who turned 20 on Nov. 10. In fact, Hankins-Cole is three months younger than redshirt-freshman Jorge Brian Diaz, who turned 20 on Nov. 13.

RICHARDSON, JONES NAMED TO ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

Las Vegas (Dec. 23) --- Sophomore Brandon Richardson and redshirt freshman Eshuante Jones were named to the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic All-Tournament team for their play while helping the Cornhuskers to the championship game of the eight-team event.

Nebraska won a pair of games at home over Chicago State and Jackson State as part of the Classic and then defeated Tulsa, 74-70, in Las Vegas to earn a shot at the title. NU fell in the championship matchup, dropping an 88-66 battle against BYU, which has since earned a top-20 national ranking.

During the two games in Las Vegas, Jones led the Husker attack by averaging 16.5 points per game on 62.5 percent (10-of-16) shooting. He scored a career-best 21 points including five 3-pointers in the loss to BYU and had 12 points on four treys against Tulsa as the Huskers earned their second win away from Lincoln this season. He was 9-of-12 (75 percent) from 3-point range in the the two games and added 2.0 rebounds and 1.0 assist per game.

Richardson's numbers were more subtle as he played just 19.5 minutes per game, but his defensive effort and intensity on the court helped drive the Huskers to the win over the Golden Hurricane. Richardson averaged 11.0 points per game but his just 4-of-6 shots from the field, including both of his 3-point attempts. Most of his offensive damage came at the free throw line where he knocked down 12-of-14 attempts, including hitting six straight charity shots in the final 18 seconds to ice the victoy over Tulsa. He also had five assists against one turnover and a pair of steals.

HUSKERS NAMED TO BIG 12 COMMISSIONER'S HONOR ROLL

The Nebraska basketball team had seven current members named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Fall Honor Roll for the first semester of the 2009-10 academic year.

Among the honorees for the fall were: Jorge Brian Diaz, Mike Fox, Quincy Hankins-Cole, Myles Holley, Lance Jeter, Matt Karn and Brandon Ubel. Also earning the honor was former Husker Paul Velander who was completing his undergraduate degree.

The eight hoops players were part of 359 Nebraska student-athletes who were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. The honor roll recognizes those student-athletes who achieved a 3.0 or better grade-point average during the fall semester.

GAME 1 VS. USC UPSTATE (NU 76, USCU 49)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers opened their 114th season in program history with a solid 76-49 victory over USC Upstate at the Devaney Center. The Huskers and Spartans swapped leads six times in the first half with NU heading into the locker room with a seven-point lead, 31-24, but a 25-2 run early in the second period sealed the Huskers' ninth straight season-opening victory. Nebraska, which hit 54.8 percent from the floor in the second half, started a pair of freshmen in Brandon Ubel and Jorge Brian Diaz, who combined for 21 points, 13 rebounds, three assists and three blocked shots. Another newcomer, junior college transfer Lance Jeter also made his first career start, leading the way with 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting including dropping in all three attempts from 3-point range as NU was 11-of-20 from beyond the arc. He added six assists and two steals. Senior Ryan Anderson also had a solid all-around performance, posting five points, five rebounds, five assists and a career-best six steals, the most steals by a Husker since 2001.

GAME 2 AT SAINT LOUIS (SLU 69, NU 55)

Saint Louis's Kwamain Mitchell scored 20 points, including 15 in the second half when the Billikens' defense held Nebraska to just 33.3 percent shooting, as SLU ran away with a 69-55 victory at Chaifetz Arena in St. Louis. In their first road game of the season, the Huskers fell behind early, but used a late first-half surge to pull within one, 28-27, at the half. NU allowed just one Billiken basket over the final 7:33 of the period before coming out of the locker room with a quick basket that gave Nebraska its only lead of the game, 29-28, less than a minute into the second period. From there, SLU hit four 3-pointers in the next five minutes, including three in a decisive 11-0 run as the Billikens led by double figures the rest of the way. Sek Henry led the Huskers with 14 points while Anderson had 10. Nebraska played all but four minutes without starting center Jorge Brian Diaz, who had a bloodied mouth and loosened teeth less than a minute into the game and did not return until just over eight minutes remained.

GAME 3 VS. TCU (NU 90, TCU 77)

In the highest scoring game in the Doc Sadler era at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers outraced TCU to the finish line, earning a 90-77 victory at the Devaney Center in a game that featured 11 ties and 13 lead changes. The Huskers shot the ball extremely well, hitting 60 percent in the second half and 54.0 percent for the game while reaching the 90-point plateau for the first time since 2006. Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz, who had two teeth knocked loose at Saint Louis where he played just four minutes three days earlier, came off the bench to hit 9-of-10 shots for a team-high 22 points, leading five Huskers in double figures. Diaz was the first NU freshman with a 20-point game since Sek Henry in 2006. Henry set Diaz up all day long, as he finished with 11 points and 11 assists for the first Husker double-double since Aleks Maric in 2008. Henry missed a triple-double by three rebounds as he added seven boards with three steals and two blocked shots. Brandon Richardson made his first career start and finished with career highs in points (15) and rebounds (4), helping Nebraska outrebound the Horned Frogs 35-24. With the game tied at 67-67 with five minutes to play, the Huskers put the accelerator down as they scored 23 points in the stretch run, including hitting 13-of-15 at the charity stripe in final 3:24.

GAME 4 VS. UMKC (NU 70, UMKC 48)

After a sluggish start, the Nebraska offense picked up and Huskers locked down the defense locked down as NU ran away with a 70-48 victory over UMKC in the Devaney Center. The teams were tied three times in the early going as the Roos forced four early turnovers and had the score within one, 20-19 with less than seven minutes remaining in the first half. But senior Sek Henry's back-to-back 3-pointers within 30 seconds ignited the offense, which went on to hit better than 53 percent for the game. The Huskers used a 21-5 run to end the first half with a 41-24 advantage and pushed the lead out to 28 points before clearing the bench in the final five minutes. Henry led all scorers with 14 points while adding five rebounds and four assists. Point guard Lance Jeter added 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting and Jorge Brian Diaz came off the bench to score double figures for the second straight game, adding 10 points with three blocked shots. The Huskers limited UMKC to 35.3 percent shooting and forced 14 turnovers while committing just seven miscues. Jay Couisnard was the only Kangaroo in double figures with 11 points but he fouled out with more than 11 minutes remaining in the game.

GAME 5 AT USC (NU 51, USC 48)

Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones made just one shot in the second half, but it was the biggest one of the game as he drilled a 3-pointer from the corner with 11.7 seconds left in the contest to give Nebraska a 51-48 victory over USC at the Galen Center. Playing in the first game of this year's Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series, the Huskers and Trojans had eight ties and 20 lead changes as Nebraska evened its road record at 1-1 in November. Just two minutes before Jones' shot, the Huskers looked unlikely to capitalize on missed chances, including going just 3-of-11 at the free throw line. But Quincy Hankins-Cole made a strong play on an offensive rebound to record NU's first basket in nearly six minutes to pull the Huskers within one at 46-45. Ryan Anderson then gave the Huskers the lead less than 30 seconds later with a steal out near the top of the key and a layup before converting the traditional three-point play. USC tied the game at 48-all with less than 40 seconds remaining on a Nikola Vucevic putback, setting up Jones' exciting finish. Following a timeout, the Huskers worked the ball around the perimeter and got the clock down to under 15 before Jones got the ball and fired. Following a lengthy review by the officials, the shot was confirmed as a 3-pointer and NU defended the arc for the final 11 seconds before USC's desperation heave at the buzzer went wide. Anderson led all scorers with 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including three 3-pointers. He also had four of NU's 11 steals on 17 USC turnovers, while Nebraska committed just seven miscues.

GAME 6 VS. TEXAS-PAN AMERICAN (NU 81, UTPA 53)

Ryan Anderson posted 21 points on 8-of-9 shooting, including 11 points in a three-minute burst in the second half that pushed the Cornhuskers to an 81-53 victory at the Devaney Center. Anderson, a senior guard, led all scorers, although the Husker freshmen made their presence felt, combining for 46 points as the Huskers shot 53.7 percent from the floor, including a building record 75.0 percent (9-of-12) from 3-point range. Freshman Ray Gallegos (3-of-4) and redshirt freshman Eshuante Jones (3-of-3) combined to hit six 3-pointers, including helping the Huskers drain seven straight from downtown at one point. Gallegos finished with 13 points, three more than his first four career games combined, while Jones had 11 points along with 11 from redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz. Anderson also had four steals to move into the Nebraska career top 10. The Huskers led just 40-32 at the intermission and UTPA pulled within five, 45-40, with 17:16 to play before a 22-2 Husker run put the game out of reach. During the six and one-half minute run, Anderson had 11 points, three steals, two rebounds and an assist. Sek Henry led the Huskers on the glass with eight rebounds as Nebraska outrebounded its fifth opponent of the season, 31-26.

GAME 7 AT CREIGHTON (CU 67, NU 61)

Nebraska turned the ball over 20 times while Creighton capitalized on 32 free throw attempts, making 26 as the Bluejays held off the Huskers for a 67-61 victory at the Qwest Center Omaha in front of a crowd of 16,739. The Huskers had 12 first-half miscues but stayed in the game as they shut down the Bluejay offense that came into the contest averaging 25 3-point attempts to open the season. Nebraska's improved perimeter defense harassed the Bluejays who finished 1-of-10 from long range. But Nebraska's struggles holding onto the ball were too much to overcome even while hitting 50.0 percent (24-of-48) from the floor. NU was outrebounded 31-25 and committed a season-high 25 fouls, helping CU to 26 free points. Lance Jeter scored 13 points and Sek Henry had 10, while the bench hit 11-of-13 shot attempts for 26 points. Kenry Lawson Jr. had his first career double-double for Creighton as he posted 25 points and 10 rebounds to help CU snap a three-game losing streak.

GAME 8 CHICAGO STATE (NU 74, CSU 39)

Nebraska held Chicago State to just 39 points on 24.2 percent shooting as the Huskers cruised to a 35-point victory, 74-39, at the Devaney Center. CSU connected on just 18.8 percent from the floor in the opening period and the Huskers capitalized, jumping to an 11-1 start before going into halftime ahead 30-14. An 18-1 Husker run to open the second period broke the game open as Nebraska shot 55.6 percent from the field on the game, moving ahead by as many as 39 points in the fourth quarter. Eleven players scored, led by Lance Jeter's 13 points while Brandon Richardson and Adrien Coleman each added 10. Jorge Brian Diaz came off the bench to post nine points, 12 rebounds and three blocks while Myles Holley helped the Huskers bust the CSU zone, finishing with nine points. Nebraska had a season-high 41 rebounds, but allowed CSU to post 37 boards, including 23 on the offensive end. Nebraska shot 55.6 percent from the field and had 17 assists on 25 baskets while holding CSU to 0-of-11 from 3-point range.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 9-18)

GAME 9 VS. OREGON STATE (NU 50, OSU 44)

Senior guard Ryan Anderson posted his third career double-double and sealed a defensive battle with a rebound and then two free throws in the final five seconds as Nebraska held on for a 50-44 victory over Oregon State at the Devaney Center. Anderson finished with 16 points to pace the Huskers and tie for game-high honors as he hit 6-of-13 attempts from the field. The rest of the team was 13-of-39 against the difficult Oregon State zone defenses as the Huskers shot a season-low 36.5 percent from the floor. The Seattle native also added a career-best 14 rebounds, bettering his previous mark of 11 set on two occasions. It was the third time he posted a double-double, but the first since his sophomore year in 2008. Neither team was able to get into an offensive groove as the defenses, which rank among the best in the nation, were on display from the start. Nebraska got the better hand in the end as it turned the ball over just 11 times -- after averaging 18.5 turnovers over the past two games -- and held OSU to just 10 offensive rebounds. The Huskers also forced 16 turnovers and held even on the boards with a 34-34 tie.

GAME 10 VS. JACKSON STATE (NU 57, JSU 41)

Junior forward Quincy Hankins-Cole produced a career-high 15 points on 7-of-8 shooting and the Nebraska defense held Jackson State to nine first-half points on its way to a 57-41 victory at the Devaney Center. Hankins-Cole posted 13 points after the break and helped NU go ahead by as many as 24 points while holding JSU to 32.7 percent shooting. The Huskers grabbed a 41-32 advantage on the boards and forced 17 turnovers, but Nebraska did not execute well on offense, hitting just 41.5 percent for the game, allowing the Tigers to hang around. JSU was within seven points before Hankins-Cole spurred a 16-3 run midway through the second half to put the game out of reach. Senior guard Ryan Anderson added 10 points on 5-of-10 shooting and had five rebounds while Jorge Brian Diaz had five points, five rebounds, three blocked shots and three assists.

GAME 11 VS. TULSA (NU 74, UT 70)

Sophomore Brandon Richardson hit six free throws in the final 20 seconds and redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones nailed a career-best four 3-pointers to lead Nebraska past Conference USA favorite Tulsa in the Las Vegas Classic. After heading into halftime tied at 31-31, the Huskers used a strong second half shooting performance to earn their second win away from Lincoln this season. NU hit 53.8 percent after the intermission, including three treys from Jones. Nebraska went ahead by 13 points in the second frame before a seven-minute field-goal drought helped UT get back into the game. Ben Uzoh had 16 second-half points for the Golden Hurricane, but it was not enough as Nebraska hit just enough shots and Richardson connected at the stripe to push the Huskers in the tournament championship game. Ryan Anderson and Jorge Brian Diaz added 11 points each while seven Huskers had at least eight points.

GAME 12 VS. BYU (BYU 88, NU 66)

Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones produced a career-best 21 points and sophomore Brandon Richardson added 13 points but the Huskers dug too deep a hole while watching BYU run away with an 88-66 victory in the championship game of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. Jones knocked down five 3-pointers while helping Nebraska fight back from a 37-5 deficit to open the game. NU cut the Cougar advantage to 14 points at the intermission, but that was as close as they could get as BYU hit 61.2 percent from the field, including 66.7 percent in the opening half. The Cougars drained 15 of their first 17 shots to open the contest before Nebraska reeled off a 20-3 run to cut into the lead before the break. Jones added 12 second-half points, including 3-of-3 beyond the arc, as NU hit 52.2 percent from the field after the intermission.

GAME 13 VS. SOUTHERN UTAH (NU 94, SUU 61)

Quincy Hankins-Cole matched his season-high as Nebraska's bench came up big in a 94-61 victory over Southern Utah at the Devaney Center. Hankins-Cole led Nebraska (10-3) with 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting, as the Huskers put up their highest offensive total in five years. NU, which is a perfect 8-0 at home, relied on a bench that put up 48 points, including 15 by Hankins-Cole in just 11 minutes of action. Jorge Brian Diaz added nine points and four rebounds in 15 minutes, while Myles Holley came up big with seven points and a career-best 11 rebounds in just 14 minutes of action. All 13 players who saw action broke into the scoring column, as the Huskers ended the first half on a 19-6 spurt and cruised to a 33-point victory. Hankins-Cole was one of four players to finish in double figures, as freshman Brandon Ubel added 12 points, while Sek Henry and Brandon Richardson chipped in 12 and 10 points, respectively. Nebraska shot 68 percent over the final 20 minutes and was sharp with the basketball all night, dishing out 18 assists and committing a season-low four turnovers, while harassing Southern Utah (4-9) into 19 turnovers on the night.

GAME 14 VS. MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE (NU 74, UMES 60)

Ryan Anderson posted 17 points in 24 minutes and sparked the Husker offense in the second half as Nebraska pulled away for a 74-60 victory over Maryland Eastern Shore in the first game after the New Year. Anderson hit 6-of-9 shots from the field and was one of four Huskers with at least four assists as the Huskers improved to 11-3 to open the season, including 9-0 at home. After leading 30-26 at the intermission on his 3-pointer with 30 seconds to play, Anderson came out in the second half and had five points and two assists in the first six minutes of the period as Nebraska used a 15-2 run to break the game open. Jorge Brian Diaz had 11 points off the bench and Brandon Richardson added 10 points, including eight in the first half. Richardson hit 2-of-4 from 3-point range as the Huskers drained 40.0 percent (8-of-20) beyond the arc. Lance Jeter had five assists against one turnover, as the Huskers posted a season-high 20 assists while forcing UMES into an opponent season-high 21 turnovers. The Hawks also had an opponent high 40 rebounds, taking an eight-board advantage on the glass.

GAME 15 VS. SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA (NU 77, SLU 59)

Sophomore guard Brandon Richardson came out strong, scoring six of the Huskers' first 11 points and had 11 points in the opening period before finishing with a career-high 15 as the Cornhuskers cruised past Southeastern Louisiana 77-59 at the Devaney Center. Richardson and senior guard Ryan Anderson combined for 29 points on 15-of-24 shooting, including hitting 3-of-4 apiece from long range. They helped the Huskers shoot 63.2 percent (12-of-19) from 3-point range, including a sizzling 7-of-8 from beyond the arc in the second period. After SLU pulled within eight, 49-41, following a 7-0 run, the Huskers responded with Sek Henry's 3-pointer and went on to stay ahead by double figures the rest of the way. The Huskers posted 19 assists on 27 baskets and had just six turnovers – two off their season low – while forcing SLU into 20 turnover. Nebraska turned the miscues into a 22-4 advantage in points off turnovers, while also holding a 17-8 lead in second-chance points.

GAME 16 AT TEXAS A&M (A&M 64, NU 53)

Nebraska trailed for the first 30 minutes of the game and when it finally got over the hump, Texas A&M responded with authority, rolling off an 18-6 run to seal a 64-53 victory in both teams' Big 12 opener. Freshman Christian Standhardinger made his career debut after being forced to sit out the first 15 games of the season under an NCAA ruling, and he did not disappoint. The 6-8, 210-pound German produced a team-high 13 points and seven rebounds in 22 minutes of action, including a 3-pointer that gave NU its last lead of the game at 43-42. Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz added 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting but neither Nebraska nor A&M were able to top the 40-percent plateau as both defenses were in top form. NU held the Aggies to just 3-of-21 shooting from 3-point range, but A&M pulled away for its fourth win in the last five games in the series by hitting 25-of-33 at the free throw line. Nebraska 6-of-9 at the charity stripe. Donald Sloan led all scorers with 26 points for the Aggies, who also held a 40-28 advantage on the boards.

GAME 17 VS. NO. 3 KANSAS (KU 84, NU 72)

Nebraska saw its 11-game home winning streak snapped as third-ranked Kansas used a pair of 8-0 second-half runs to erase a one-point halftime deficit and pull away from the Huskers for a 84-72 victory. Nebraska, which had jumped to a 12-1 lead in the first four minutes of the game, led 44-43 at the half thanks to a strong first-half shooting performance. The Huskers hit eight 3-pointers and shot 55.6 percent from the field but NU nailed only 30.8 percent in the second half while getting outscored 41-28. Kansas shot the ball well in both halves, connecting on 57.8 percent in the game, including 13-of-21 from behind the arc. Kansas used the strong shooting to become only the second Big 12 team in the five seasons to score 80 points at the Devaney Center. Four Jayhawks were in double figures, led by 22 points from Sherron Collins and 19 from Marcus Morris. Nebraska was led by Brandon Richardson, who scored a career-high 18 points on 5-of-6 shooting from the field. Richardson was also 2-of-3 from the 3-point line and hit all five of his free throws. Jorge Brian Diaz added 15 points, while Eshaunte Jones nailed four 3-pointers to chip in 12 points.

GAME 18 VS. IOWA STATE (ISU 56, NU 53)

The Cornhuskers fought back from a 12-point first-half deficit to take a one-point lead at the intermission and the teams battled back and forth throughout the second period until Iowa State knocked down a couple of late shots and NU misfired in the final minute as the Cyclones snapped a 17-game conference road losing streak with a 56-53 victory. NU held All-Big 12 forward Craig Brackins in check, allowing just six points and 11 boards, but newcomer Marquis Gilstrap had a game-high 15 points and 12 rebounds, helping ISU earn a 45-36 advantage on the glass. NU hit just 5-of-19 from 3-point range. Ryan Anderson led the Huskers with 13 points, eight rebounds and five steals while Lance Jeter had 12 points in his best scoring effort in a month.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 19-27)

GAME 19 AT MISSOURI (MU 70, NU 53)

Senior guard Sek Henry led Nebraska with 15 points on 5-of-8 shooting, but Missouri used a key 15-1 run late in the second half to pull away for a 70-53 victory at a soldout Mizzou Arena. The Huskers trailed by just one, 45-44, on Ray Gallegos' 3-pointer with 10:46 to play, but Nebraska failed to convert another field goal until Henry's layup with 3:25 to play and the damage was done. Missouri hit just 39.3 percent but had just five turnovers and knocked down 18-of-21 free throw attempts, including 17 made shots at the charity stripe after the intermission, to win their 31st straight home game, a streak that ranked third nationally. Along with Henry, sophomore Brandon Richardson added 11 points while point guard Lance Jeter had seven points and a career-best seven rebounds. Nebraska trailed by nine points early but chipped away at the Tiger lead, cutting the deficit to just two points, 28-26, at halftime. In the second period, Gallegos had all eight of his points and helped the Huskers get off to a strong start, but NU could not keep up the pace as Missouri pulled away.

GAME 20 AT COLORADO (CU 72, NU 60)

Colorado came out the aggressor, forcing 16 Husker turnovers and limiting Nebraska to just 39.6 percent shooting as the Buffs took a 72-60 victory at the Coors Events Center. Nebraska struggled scoring in the first six minutes of each half, including opening the game with just one field goal over the first seven minutes. The Huskers finally got into a groove in the second period, but a late first-half 10-2 run gave the Buffs a 10-point margin at the break, which they extended to 20 points in the second period by connecting on 17-of-22 shots at the free throw line after intermission. CU hit 48.8 percent from the field and had just 11 turnovers. Nebraska held a rebounding advantage against a conference opponent for the first time this year, 30-26, while also hitting a season-best 81 percent (17-of-21) at the charity stripe. Freshman Christian Standhardinger hit 8-of-9 from the line and 3-of-5 from the floor for a team-high 14 points in just 12 minutes off the bench. Senior Ryan Anderson added nine points, six boards, three assists and two steals for the Huskers, who saw their losing streak stretch to five games, marking their worst start to league action in the Big 12 era.

GAME 21 VS. OKLAHOMA (NU 63, OU 46)

Sophomore Brandon Richardson led Nebraska on offense and the Huskers showed a more aggressive, hard-nosed approach on defense as NU ran away with a 63-46 victory over Oklahoma at the Devaney Center to snap a five-game losing streak. The Huskers' first league win came behind a defensive effort that held OU to just 34.9 percent shooting and forced 15 turnovers while the offense drained 51.7 percent after intermission to cruise to their first Big 12 win in January. Richardson paved the way with 16 points, including 10 in the second half when Nebraska went ahead by as many as 19 points. Senior Ryan Anderson added 11 points and redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz has one of his best all-around games of the year with 10 points on 5-of-9 shooting to go with seven boards, two assists, a block and a steal in 30 minutes. Nebraska shot 44.4 percent for the game including 45.5 percent beyond the arc and 71.4 percent at the line while holding a 36-27 advantage on the boards. Nebraska dominated the glass which led to a 30-10 margin in the paint.

GAME 22 VS. NO. 10/11 KANSAS STATE (KSU 76, NU 57)

Kansas State used an efficient offensive effort to wear down the Huskers as the No. 10/11 Wildcats snapped a three-game NU series win streak in Lincoln with a 76-57 victory at the Devaney Center. KSU led by 14 at the intermission, but Nebraska came out strong, scoring the first seven point of the second half to force a timeout. The Wildcats responded and put the game away as Denis Clemente posted a game-high 23 points, including 12 in the second period with four 3-pointers. Clemente led four Wildcats in double figures, including Jamar Samuels, who came off the bench to produce 15 points on 7-of-12 shooting while leading all players with nine boards. Nebraska shot just 41.7 percent from the floor, and had 16 turnovers, including 11 in the opening frame, as the Huskers fell to 1-6 in league action. Jorge Brian Diaz led the Huskers with 13 points on 5-of-12 shooting.

GAME 23 AT NO. 1/1 KANSAS (KU 75, NU 64)

Top-ranked Kansas hit 48.1 percent from the floor and used a key 15-1 run midway through the second half to take control before holding on for a 75-64 victory over Nebraska at Allen Fieldhouse. The Cornhuskers kept falling behind and then charging back, trailing by four at halftime, 37-33, before using a 10-2 run to open the second period and take a 42-39 lead before the Jayhawks rattled off 28 of the next 33 points to win for the 15th straight time over Nebraska. Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz dominated the paint, scoring 20 points on 9-of-17 shooting while adding nine rebounds, two steals and two blocks for the Huskers, who played a top-10 team for the second straight game. Senior Ryan Anderson added four 3-pointers for 12 points and became the 25th Husker in program history to top the 1,000-point mark for his career. Anderson helped NU hit 58.8 percent (10-of-17) from long range.

GAME 24 VS. NO. 24/- BAYLOR (BU 55, NU 53)

Sophomore Myles Holley led a 37-point attack from the bench and the Huskers shut down one of the most explosive offenses in the Big 12, but it wasn't enough as No. 24/- Baylor hung on for a 55-53 victory at the Devaney Center. The game was the fourth straight regular-season contest between the teams decided by four points or less. Holley posted a career-high 11 points on 5-of-11 shooting, after coming into the game with just 15 points in Big 12 play this season. He led three Huskers in double figures, all off the bench. He was joined by Eshaunte Jones and Brandon Richardson who each had 10 points despite combining to go 3-of-10 from beyond the arc. As a team, the Huskers hit just 4-of-21 (19.0 percent) from 3-point range after entering the game on a school-record pace at 40.5 percent. The Huskers held a three-point lead in the last two minutes after Richardson's trey pushed NU ahead 53-50. The Huskers missed three 3-point attempts in the final minute and BU's Ekpe Udoh hit the game-winning jumper with 25 seconds remaining. Quincy Acy had a free throw for the final margin and then blocked the Huskers' last shot attempt to seal the victory. The Huskers tied the school record with just three turnovers but shot only 31.6 percent from the field while holding Baylor to 40 percent and a season-low point total.

GAME 25 AT NO. 14/14 TEXAS (UT 91, NU 51)

Texas came out looking like it was the No. 1 team in the country, the ranking it held just three weeks earlier, as the Longhorns hit 61.3 percent from the field in the first period before running away with a 91-51 victory at the Frank Erwin Center in Austin. Freshman Avery Bradley hit his first six 3-point attempts, including five in the opening half, as he posted 25 points to lead five Longhorns in double figures. UT hit 48.3 percent from the field in the game and dominated the glass, holding a 49-27 rebounding advantage while holding the Huskers to just 28.1 percent shooting. Nebraska hit only 2-of-18 from 3-point range, including missing all nine attempts in the second period. Avery started the game with a 3-pointer and the Longhorns never trailed. Nebraska pulled within 15-11 and was down just nine, 31-22, with six minutes to play in the first before Texas rolled off a 20-0 run in the next five minutes to break the game open and lead by 27, 53-26, at the half. Ryan Anderson led the Huskers with nine points and seven rebounds, as Nebraska did not have a player score in double figures.

GAME 26 AT NO. 7/7 KANSAS STATE (KSU 91, NU 87)

Nebraska scored nine straight points in less than 30 seconds to tie the game at 87-all in the final minute, but Kansas State hit a pair of free throws and forced the Huskers' 20th turnover of the night as the No. 7 Wildcats held on for a wild 91-87 victory at Bramlage Coliseum. Nebraska, which led by 10 twice in the first half and by nine in the second half before a 15-0 KSU run, trimmed the lead all the way back down after holding KSU without a field goal for the final four minutes of the game. Instead, the Wildcats hit 14 straight free throws but NU responded in kind. With Nebraska trailing 87-78, redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones drained a 3-pointer with 56 seconds left to cut the deficit to six. Husker pressure on the inbounds forced a travel and set off a chain reaction as Anderson drilled the first of two 3-pointers just 13 seconds apart - sandwiched around another Wildcat turnover - to tie the game in the final 30 seconds before an NU turnover led to the final four-point margin. The Huskers finished the game hitting a season-high 58.3 percent from the field including 63.6 percent in the first half. They added season highs with 23 assists and 14 3-pointers but Nebraska's Achilles heel ended up being turnovers, as NU also had a season-high tying 20 miscues. Anderson led Nebraska with a season-high 22 points on 8-of-9 shooting, including a season-best five 3-pointers. Brandon Richardson added 15 points before fouling out and Lance Jeter added the Huskers' third double-double of the year with 12 points and a career-best 12 assists.

GAME 27 VS. MISSOURI (MU 74, NU 59)

Ryan Anderson hit five first-half 3-pointers and Nebraska trailed by just a basket at the intermission, but Missouri hit 57.9 percent from beyond the arc, including 6-of-12 in the second period, to pull away for a 74-59 victory over the Huskers at the Devaney Center. Marcus Denmon came off the bench for a career-high 24 points including five 3-pointers and Zaire Taylor added four treys and 18 points as the Tigers won their 20th game of the season and third straight over Nebraska. Anderson was red-hot from the beginning, hitting his first three attempts from long range in the opening four minutes as NU raced out to a 10-1 lead. The senior from Seattle then added three more 3-pointers but was straddled with a pair of fouls and sat the last five minutes of the half. In the second period, MU handcuffed Anderson and the Husker offense, limiting him to just 1-of-5 shooting, with his lone trey coming with 52 seconds left in the game. His basket snapped a nearly eightminute long field-goal drought by the Huskers. Nebraska shot 43.5 percent for the game and had 17 turnovers while getting outrebounded 35-27, including allowing 13 offensive rebounds. The Tiger bench scored 41 of the team's 74 points as Laurence Bowers added 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 28-29)

GAME 28 AT IOWA STATE (ISU 78, NU 74)

lowa State's Craig Brackins scored 11 of his team-high 21 points in the final six minutes to lead the Cyclones past Nebraska, 78-74, to sweep the season series. Brackins and Scott Christopherson combined for 17 straight points down the stretch as they overcame a nine-point deficit midway through the second period. Nebraska got out to a strong start and led by 10 points twice in the first period behind the play of freshman Christian Standhardinger, who may his first career start. Standhardinger and Lance Jeter kept the Huskers in the game, combining for 45 points as each set a personal high. Standhardinger's 25 points were the ninth-highest single-game total by an NU freshman in program history. He also added eight rebounds, three assists and two steals. Jeter hit 7-of-10 from the field including four 3-pointers as the Huskers hit 9-of-19 from long range. Nebraska outshot the Cyclones, held a lead in 3-pointers, assists and trailed by just one in turnovers but still came up on the short end for the seventh straight game, including the third consecutive game leading by double figures before falling. It was also the fourth contest in league action that Nebraska lost by four points or less.

GAME 29 VS. TEXAS TECH (NU 83, TTU 79, 20T)

Senior Sek Henry scored 12 points in overtime and the Huskers overcame a 14-point first-half deficit to record an 83-79 double overtime victory over Texas Tech at the Devaney Center. Henry hit two free throws with 42 seconds remaining in regulation and TTU answered with a basket 13 seconds later to send it to overtime. The Red Raiders went ahead by five with 2:44 left in the first overtime before Henry answered and pushed the Huskers to a second extra period, where Henry scored seven straight points to push the Huskers to their second-largest comeback victory in the Big 12 era. Nebraska fell behind in the first half as Texas Tech reeled off a 17-0 run to take a 33-19 lead with 3:51 left to play before intermission. The Huskers turned the ball over 10 times in the opening half, but better ball control and execution in the second half turned the game in NU's favor. The Huskers did not have a turnover after the 9:45 mark of the second period, going the remaining 19:45 turnover free. Nebraska also hit 21-of-26 attempts at the free throw line in the second half and the overtime periods as they defeated Texas Tech for the fourth straight season. Henry led the way with 21 points while Brandon Richardson came off the bench for 15 and Brandon Ubel also came off the bench to add a career-high 14, including a pair of 3-pointers during the Huskers' 23-5 surge (18 straight at one point) to the lead in the second half.
