

NEBRASKA SERIES INFORMATION VS. 2009 OPPONENTS

FLORIDA ATLANTIC SERIES

Series Notes: The Huskers and Florida Atlantic will meet for the first time on Sept. 5...Nebraska faces three Sun Belt foes this season, but has not played a team from that league since facing Troy in 2006...this will be NU's first meeting with a team from Florida since facing Miami in the 2002 Rose Bowl...the Sept. 5 opener is Nebraska's latest since opening on Sept. 7 in 1996.

ARKANSAS STATE SERIES

Series Notes: This year's meeting will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools and the second of three matchups with Sun Belt Conference foes...Nebraska has not faced a team from Arkansas since a loss to the Razorbacks in the 1965 Cotton Bowl.

Series Notes: The game is the second of a home-and-home series... this year's game will be NU's fifth in five seasons against an ACC foe (Wake Forest in 2005, 2007, Va. Tech and Clemson in 2008)...before the meetings with the Demon Deacons, Nebraska last played an ACC foe in the regular season in 1973...Nebraska is 15-15 all-time against members of the ACC...Nebraska's 41-21 victory in the 1996 Orange Bowl was part of a 6-1 NU bowl run from 1994 to 2000...NU assistant coach John Papuchis is a Virginia Tech graduate.

LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE SERIES

Series Notes: This year's meeting will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools and the third of three matchups with Sun Belt Conference foes...The game will mark the 300th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium...Louisiana-Lafayette will be the 75th different opponent Nebraska has faced during the sellout streak...Nebraska last faced a team from Louisiana when it defeated Nicholls State in 2006.

Series Notes: The Thursday night meeting will be Nebraska's first Thursday game since a win at Southern Miss in 2003...NU has played in four ESPN Thursday night games, winning all four games on the road...Nebraska's 34-20 Homecoming win over Missouri in 2006 marked the 100th game in series history... NU was 22-6-3 in the first 31 games (1892-1937) and Missouri was 19-6-0 from 1938 to 1962...NU won 24 straight in the series before a 41-24 setback in 2003...Missouri handed NU its only loss in 1939 (7-1-1)...NU handed the Tigers their only loss in 1895 (7-1-0) and 1919 (5-1-2)...the Huskers' 1986 win was their 600th all-time and the 1941 loss was No. 100...NU played all-time game Nos. 400 (1938), 600 (1959) and 900 (1985) vs. Mizzou...NU's 51-0 win at Omaha in 1901 started a then-school-record 24-game win streak...the Huskers' 17-7 loss at Columbia in 1969 was their last before a 32-game unbeaten streak that included two national titles (1970, 1971)...the visiting team won six straight series games from 1974 to 1979...four times an unranked Tiger team has beaten a top-10 Nebraska team (1939, 1974, 1978, 2003)...the 1978 loss knocked the Huskers out of the national-title picture...NU's 45-38 OT win in 1997 was the first overtime game in Husker history...MU handed Husker coaches Bob Devaney and Tom Osborne their first NU losses, 16-7 over Devaney in 1962 and 13-12 over Osborne in 1973...the 1962 game started the NCAA-record sellout streak at NU's Memorial Stadium, which will reach 300 games this fall... NU was ranked in the top 10 nationally entering the Mizzou game 20 consecutive years and in the top 20 for 34 straight years from 1968-2001...the 1932 game was played on Thanksgiving Day...the 1999 contest was the earliest game ever (Sept. 25) between the two schools...NU has been ranked No. 1 in four meetings--1971, 1983, 1997, 2000, with NU winning those contests by an average score of 39.3-18.8...in 2001, quarterback Eric Crouch had the longest run from scrimmage and longest scoring run in NU history with a 95-yard scamper in Columbia.

Series Notes: This year's game will mark the 1,200th game in Cornhusker history...NU won the first seven games in the series, but Texas Tech has posted three straight wins...NU rallied from a 24-10 fourth-quarter deficit to force overtime last year in Lubbock...the OT loss was the first in six overtime games in school history... Nebraska trailed 21-0 in 2005 in Lincoln, before taking a 31-27 fourth-quarter lead, only to see Tech score the winning touchdown with 12 seconds left...in 2001, Tech became the first NU opponent since at least 1962 to score at least 28 first-half points at Memorial Stadium...NU overcame second-half deficits to win the first two
