HUSKERS SET TO FACE BRONCS IN RETURN HOME

After picking up its first road win of the season in a thrilling, last-second victory at USC last weekend, the Nebraska basketball team returns to the friendly surroundings of the Bob Devaney Sports Center when it takes on Texas-Pan American on Wednesday, Dec. 2.

The game will tip off at 7:06 p.m. and will be heard around the state on the IMG Husker Sports Radio Network with veteran play-by-play man Kent Pavelka calling the action and former Husker Matt Davison adding color commentary. It will also be heard for free around the world on the Internet on Huskers.com and can be heard on Sirius Satellite Radio channel 130.

Nebraska hopes to use the momentum created in its road win over Southern California as it plays four of its next five contests at home, starting with this week's matchup with the Broncs. One of the least experienced teams in the Big 12 Conference, the Huskers have found different ways to win this season with someone new seeming to step up each game.

Against TCU, the Huskers put up their highest point total in four years under coach Doc Sadler, scoring 90 points and hitting 30-of-41 free throw

attempts. This past weekend, the Huskers held USC to just 48 points, the fewest points NU has allowed in a non-conference true road game since giving up 42 in a win at Northern Iowa on Dec. 29, 1981. USC hit four of its first five attempts from 3-point range and was 5-of-7 from beyond the arc in the first half, but the Huskers' adjustments helped hold the Trojans to just 0-of-2 from long range after the intermission.

Nebraska also forced 17 USC turnovers while collecting 11 steals. Senior Ryan Anderson, who had a critical traditional three-point play with just over a minute remaining Sunday, recorded four of those steals while posting a game-high 14 points. Anderson, who hit 3-of-4 from 3-point range, leads the Huskers this season with 10.6 points per game, scoring in double figures three times in five contests.

The Huskers' balanced offense has seven players averaging between 9.0 and 6.0 ppg. Sek Henry is second on the squad with 9.8 ppg while adding a team-high 18 assists. His 3.2 assists-to-turnover ratio (18-to-5) leads the Big 12 and has helped the Huskers rank third with just 11.6 turnovers per game early in the season. NU has had a total of 14 turnovers in its last two games combined.

Nebraska has just 14 turnovers in the last two games, with seven TOs in each contest. The last time NU had 14 or fewer combined turnovers in consecutive games was 2001-02 when NU had seven at Texas A&M and a school-record low three at Iowa State. NU added eight in its next game for a total of 18 TOs in three contests.

Senior guard Ryan Anderson needs just two steals to move into the Nebraska career top 10. After posting four steals at USC on Sunday, he now has 126 steals in his career, trailing Eric Johnson (1988-89) and Jack Moore (1979-82), who each had 128 in their careers to rank ninth in the NU record book. With 11 more steals, Anderson would move into the top seven.

HUSKER QUICK SHOTS

****--** Senior guard Sek Henry has been strong with the ball this season as he leads the team with 18 assists while turning the ball over just five times. His 3.2-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio leads the Big 12 Conference.

****--** Henry missed the school's first-ever triple-double by three rebounds when he had 11 points, 11 assists and seven rebounds against TCU.

****--** Senior Ryan Anderson posted a career-high six steals against USC Upstate in the season opener. It was the most steals by a Husker since Cookie Belcher had eight in a game in 2001.

****--** Anderson added a second game with four steals at Southern California.

****--** Anderson's three 3-pointers at USC gave him 137 in his career and moved him within nine of sixth place in the Nebraska career record book.

****--** Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones has hit at least one 3-pointer in every game this season, including the game-winner with 11.7 seconds remaining against USC.

****--** Junior point guard Lance Jeter is leading the team in shooting percentage, hitting 55.2 percent (16-of-29) from the field including 66.7 percent (6-of-9) from 3-point range.

****--** Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz had 22 points off the bench against TCU, becoming the 21st Husker freshman ever to record a 20-point contest. Nebraska has three current players on that list, as seniors Ryan Anderson and Sek Henry each had a 20-point game as freshman as well.

****--** Diaz hit 9-of-10 shots from the floor against TCU, the second-best single-game shooting percentage in the Big 12 this season (Dexter Pittman, Texas, was 10-of-11).

****--** Diaz is averaging 9.4 ppg this season with two double-figure scoring contests. The last Husker freshman to average double figures was Ryan Anderson with 10.1 ppg in 2006-07. Only six freshmen in school history have averaged double figures.

****--** Nebraska's 41 free throw attempts against TCU were the most by the Huskers since 2005 when Nebraska made 45 attempts against Texas A&M.

****--** The Huskers are averaging just 11.6 turnovers per game to rank third in the Big 12 Conference.

****--** The Huskers are hitting 66.2 percent from the line at home and just 54.8 percent at the stripe on the road. Nebraska has averaged 35.7 rebounds per game at home and only 31.0 boards per contest on the road.

****--** Nebraska attempted just seven 3-pointers against a difficult Saint Louis 3-point defense (the Billikens were third nationally in 3-point defense last year). The last time Nebraska attempted fewer 3-pointers in a game was Nov. 29, 2003, as the Huskers hoisted just six from beyond the arc against Eastern Michigan.

****--** Coach Doc Sadler's 59 victories at Nebraska tie for seventh in school history. He will move into sixth with six more victories.

SCOUTING THE TEXAS-PAN AMERICAN BRONCS

UTPA enters the midweek matchup with the Huskers with a 1-6 overall record after splitting its games last weekend in the South Padre Island Invitational. The Broncs, who also lost at Missouri and Mississippi State as part of the tournament, won their opening game of the weekend against Tennessee-Chattanooga, 61-50, before falling to Bethune-Cookman, 67-64, in the final contest Saturday.

Against Bethune-Cookman, Texas-Pan American was led by Jared Maree with 18 points, including hitting 12-of-14 at the free throw line and 3-of-4 from the field. He helped UTPA hit 70.4 percent (19-of-27) from the free throw line while also connecting on a solid 48.6 percent (18-of-37) from the field. Along with Maree, Ben Smith hit 5-of-8 shots for 15 points with all five of his makes from 3-point range.

UTPA had just eight turnovers in the contest and shot 47 percent (9-of-19) from long range, but Bethune-Cookman snuck out the win by connecting on 58.1 percent (24-of-43) from the field. CJ Reed led the charge with 27 points against the Broncs, hitting 12-of-19 shots from the floor as the only double-figure scorer for BCC.

On the season, UTPA is led by Maree who paces the squad with 9.0 points per game while shooting 44.4 percent from the field. Luis Valera leads the Broncs by hitting 56.3 percent (27-of-48) from the floor while ranking second with 8.9 points per contest. Overall, Texas-Pan American has averaged only 58.3 points per game on 37.3 percent shooting while allowing opponents 75.1 points on 51.5 percent accuracy. UTPA has also been outrebounded 37.7 to 30.4 and has seen foes block 39 shots (UTPA has blocked just eight).

The Broncs are coached by Ryan Marks, who is in his first season with UTPA. Marks owns a 1-6 mark with the Broncs but is 148-89 in his ninth year as a head coach.

SERIES HISTORY VS. TEXAS-PAN AMERICAN

The Cornhuskers will be matching up with the Broncs for the first time in program history on Wednesday when UTPA comes to Lincoln. It will be one of four first-time matchups for the Huskers this season, along with the contests against USC Upstate, Jackson State and Southeastern Louisiana.

Texas-Pan American is one of 12 independent schools competing in Division I in 2009-10. The independents will be forming a league of their own – the Great West Conference – starting next season.

Nebraska owns a perfect 11-0 record against independents all-time.

FRESHMAN SENSATION

A game after playing just four minutes at Saint Louis because of an injury that included a pair of loosened front teeth and a cut inside his mouth, redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz made his presence felt early and often as the Huskers raced past TCU on Nov. 21 in a 90-77 victory.

The newcomer from Caguas, Puerto Rico, set a team season high with 22 points as Nebraska reached the 90-point plateau for the first time since 2006. He was the first Husker this season to hit the 20-point mark.

Diaz became the first freshman since Sek Henry in 2006 to post a 20-point contest for the Huskers. Henry's outburst came one day after Ryan Anderson put his name on the list with 29 points, the second-highest total by a Husker freshman ever.

Overall, Diaz is the 21st freshman to record a 20-point game for the Huskers since freshmen were reinstated by the NCAA for the 1972-73 season. Joe McCray set the record with the most 20-point games by a Husker freshman when he had 10 contests with at least 20 points in 2004-05. Only six Husker freshmen in history have had multiple 20-point contests.

Against TCU, Diaz connected on 9-of-10 shots from the floor, with only a first-half miss keeping him from the NU record book. The Husker single-game record for most field-goals attempted without a miss is nine set on five occasions, including last year by Ade Dagunduro. Diaz's .900 shooting percentage is the second highest in the Big 12 this season, trailing only Texas's Dexter Pittman, who hit 10-of-11 in a contest.

Over his past three games (TCU, UMKC, USC), Diaz has come off the bench twice and averaged 13.0 points per game while hitting 17-of-26 (65.4 percent) from the field.

TAKING THE SHOT

With so many new faces on the squad, it was only a matter of time before one of the youngsters was asked to step up and make a game-changing play. At USC on Nov. 29, it was more than just a game-changing play... it was a game-deciding shot.

Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones, playing in his ninth career game, had made just two field goals in the first half and had only been off the bench for a total of five minutes in the second period before being called upon with less than a minute to play in a tie game. Jones didn't hesitate as he buried the game-winning shot from the corner, a 3-pointer with 11.7 seconds remaining. The shot was reviewed at length by the officials who determined it was indeed a 3-pointer. From there, the Huskers defended the perimeter well and USC only managed to get off an off-balance desperation shot at the buzzer.

Jones finished with seven points, and his 3-pointer gave the Huskers their first road win of the season, and just the second true road win over a non-conference opponent under fourth-year coach Doc Sadler. It was NU's first road victory over a non-conference BCS team since defeating Tennessee, 62-61, in Knoxville in 2004.

SENIOR MOMENT

Coach Doc Sadler has said that he's trying to find ways to get his team to be more aggressive since the start of practice in September, letting them know that he wants them going after other teams and not sitting back and waiting for opponents to come at them. Senior guard Sek Henry took the coach's words to heart against TCU as he had easily the best statistical game of his career.

Henry's strong play was highlighted by his unselfishness as he distributed the ball efficiently, posting a career-best 11 assists. He is the first Husker since Charles Richardson Jr. (15 at Rutgers in 2006) to post more than 10 assists in a game. Overall, Henry's assist total ranks second on the Nebraska single-game chart for the Big 12 era, and ties for the ninth-best total by a Husker in any game since the 1983-84 season.

Along with his 11 assists, Henry posted 11 points, seven rebounds, three steals and two blocked shots in 30 minutes of action. He missed the school's first regular-season triple-double by three rebounds. The only known triple-double by a Husker came when Brennon Clemmons had 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists in an exhibition game in 2002 vs. Northwest Sports Tours. In the 15 years before that, the closest a Husker came to a triple-double in a game that counted was Beau Reid's 14-point, 12-rebound, 8-assist performance against Toledo in 1990.

Henry came back the next contest against UMKC to produce a game-high 14 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including drilling both of his 3-point attempts. The treys came less than 30 seconds apart and started a game-changing 21-5 run to end the first half. Henry added five rebounds, four assists and two blocks against the Kanagros.

OFF TO THE RACES

While the season is still young and the Huskers have yet to enter the meat-grinder portion of the schedule known as the Big 12 Conference slate, Nebraska has shown the potential to be an efficient force on the offensive end with its revamped roster.

The best example came as the Huskers posted 90 points against TCU, making it the highest-scoring game for the Huskers in the Doc Sadler era at Nebraska. In fact, the last time NU topped the 90-point plateau was 2006 when the Huskers earned a 93-77 victory over Colorado. NU improved to 14-0 under Sadler when topping 80 points.

The Husker offense was running in high gear against the Horned Frogs as Nebraska hit 54.0 percent (27-of-50) from the field. They made it two straight games knocking down at least 50 percent from the floor when they hit 53.1 percent against UMKC four days later. With the win over UMKC, NU improved to 28-2 - including 26-0 at home - under Sadler when topping the 50.0-percent mark from the field.

MAKING THE RIGHT CHOICE

Coach Doc Sadler continually talks about how important shot selection is and the Huskers have taken that to heart, especially from the 3-point line. Nebraska has averaged about 13 attempts per game from long range this year, and have hit an impressive 45.5 percent (30-of-66).

Newcomer Lance Jeter, a junior college All-American last year, has led the charge by hitting 66.7 percent (6-of-9) from beyond the arc, including a 3-for-3 effort in the season opener. Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones and senior Ryan Anderson are tied with Jeter for first on the squad with six treys apiece, while senior Sek Henry has five treys. All four are hitting better than 42 percent from beyond the arc.

UPON FURTHER REVIEW

In a change to what was published in the 2009-10 Nebraska media and recruiting guide, please note that redshirt-freshman Jorge Brian Diaz would like to be referred to by his full name instead of just Brian Diaz. Also, the pronunciation for freshman Ray Gallegos's last name should be Guy-eh-goes. The previous pronunciation listed in the media guide is incorrect. We appreciate the media's assistance in these matters.

OPENING UP

Nebraska opened the 2009-10 season at home against South Carolina Upstate with its ninth straight win in a season opener. A couple other notes about Husker season openers:

- The Nov. 14 opener was the second-earliest season-opening date in school history, only behind the Nov. 10 season opener in 2007. Nebraska has also opened a season on Nov. 14 twice before, in the 2006 and 1998 seasons.
- Nebraska has won nine straight season openers since an 87-83 setback at Oral Roberts in 2000. Overall, Nebraska is 12-2 in season openers during the Big 12 era, and 75-39 all-time.
- The last time Nebraska lost a season opener at home was 1980 when NU fell to Wyoming, 62-59, in overtime. The Huskers have won 20 straight season openers at home since that loss.

ANDERSON AIMS FOR TOP THREE

Senior guard Ryan Anderson is already assured of a spot in the Nebraska record books as he entered the season among the most accurate and most prolific long-distance threats in school history.

In his final season, Anderson owns 137 career 3-pointers to rank eighth in school history and needs just nine to move up two more spots on the career chart. With 50 treys – a total he reached in his sophomore season – Anderson would move into third place all-time.

Anderson is not only among the top 10 in made treys, but he is among the most accurate as he ranks ninth all-time by hitting 38.3 percent (137-of-358) over the past three-plus years.

LINE TIME

Part of Nebraska's ability to put away TCU came with solid effort knocking down free throws. The Huskers hit 73.2 percent from the line on the day, including draining 13-of-15 in the final 3:24 of the game.

Overall, Nebraska got to the line 41 times against the Horned Frogs, making 30. It was the most free throw attempts by a Husker squad since 2005 when Nebraska hit 32-of-45 (71.1 percent) against Texas A&M. Sophomore Brandon Richardson led the charge this time, hitting 9-of-10, while Ryan Anderson (6-of-7) and Sek Henry (4-of-5) each only missed one with at least five attempts.

Henry's miss snapped a personal streak of 18 straight made free throws dating back to last season, over a total of eight games. He hit a NU postseason record seven free throws without a miss at New Mexico last year and added a 6-of-6 effort last week at Saint Louis.

Henry's 18 straight made free throws ties for the third-longest Husker streak without a miss in the Big 12 era. On the season he has hit 73.7 percent (14-of-19) from the stripe, after coming into the season a career 64.0 percent shooter at the line. He is 5-of-9 at the stripe since seeing his career-high streak come to an end.

Nebraska's shooting at the line has not been consistent as the Huskers hit just 3-of-11 (27.2 percent) attempts at USC, their lowest free throw percentage for a game since hitting just 20 percent (1-of-5) at Missouri to open the 2002 Big 12 slate.

BOARD SUPPORT

So far this season, one area that has jumped out on the box score, especially in comparison to last year, is the rebound column. During exhibition play, Nebraska held a 45.5-28.5 advantage on the glass against Arkansas-Fort Smith and Hastings College, and once it finally started to count, NU has continued the solid play on the boards.

Nebraska held a 39-27 rebounding advantage in the season opener against South Carolina Upstate. The total against USCU was the best for the Huskers since last season's opener when NU had 42 rebounds vs. San Jose State and the +12 advantage was also better than all but one game last year (+14 vs. Florida A&M).

Nebraska came back to post 35 boards against both Saint Louis and TCU, giving the Huskers three straight games of at least 35 rebounds for the first time since the final three games of non-conference play in the 2007-08 campaign. Last year, the Huskers did not have consecutive games with at least 35 rebounds and had only six games all year with 35 or more boards.

Leading the way in the exhibition slate was redshirt-freshman Jorge Brian Diaz, who had a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds against Arkansas-Fort Smith and added eight points and nine rebounds vs. Hastings. In the regular-season opener, Diaz had 11 rebounds to go with nine points in his first career game. NU did not have a player with a double-double last season as Ryan Anderson had the team's high for single-game rebounds with 10 boards against Missouri on Jan. 10, when he had just eight points.

Against Saint Louis, Diaz left in the first minute of the game after he was hit in the mouth while going for a rebound. He has two severely loosened teeth and a cut inside his mouth, keeping him out until the 8:21 mark of the second half. He only played a total of four minutes and had one rebound. Sophomore guard Toney McCray helped pick up the slack as he had eight rebounds, one off his career high, while newcomer Quincy Hankins-Cole added six, including three offensive boards.

On the year, the Huskers have outrebounded their opponents by a 33.8-30.8 margin, winning the rebound battle in each of their first four contests before trailing for the first time at USC. NU has had five players lead the team in rebounding in individual games, including a different person in each of the first three contests.

VERSATILE ANDERSON IN ELITE COMPANY

Ryan Anderson joined an elite club last year as he became just the seventh Husker to record at least 100 3-pointers, 100 assists and 100 steals in a career. Among that short list are Eric Piatkowski, Tyronn Lue, Erick Strickland, Cookie Belcher, Cary Cochran and Jaron Boone, along with Anderson.

He showed exactly that versatility when he had an uncommon stat line that included five points, five rebounds, five assists and six steals in 27 minutes of action in the season opener against USC Upstate. The

six steals were a career high for Anderson and were the most by a Husker since 2001 (Cookie Belcher had season high of eight that year).

For his career, Anderson now has 137 3-pointers, 126 steals and 173 assists and needs 13 treys and 24 steals to join Strickland as the only two Huskers ever with at least 150 in each category.

FRESH FACES

Nebraska had an inexperienced roster entering 2009-10, as the Huskers returned only four scholarship players from last season's 18-win campaign. Among the veterans on the squad this season are seniors Ryan Anderson and Sek Henry, along with sophomore Brandon Richardson. Sophomore Toney McCray also returned but played just three games before sitting out the rest of the season with an injury.

When NU hit the court for its season opener, it had two freshmen – forward Brandon Ubel (true frosh) and center Jorge Brian Diaz (redshirt frosh) – in the starting lineup, marking the second time in coach Doc Sadler's tenure that NU had two freshman start a season opener. The last time that happened was Sadler's first year at Nebraska when Anderson and Henry opened the campaign in the starting lineup.

That season, Anderson and Henry started 14 games together including the first nine of the year. The duo was joined by former Husker Jay-R Strowbridge to make it three freshmen in the same starting lineup on Dec. 23, 2006, in a 70-56 win over Houston in the Rainbow Classic in Hawaii.

Against UMKC on Nov. 24, another freshman made an appearance in the starting lineup as redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones earned his first career start. Together, they became just the second threesome of freshmen to start games in the same season for the Huskers in the Big 12 era, including:

- 2009-10 with Ubel (5 total starts), Diaz (3), Jones (1)
- 2006-07 with Anderson (25), Henry (18) and Strowbridge (13)

Ubel and Diaz were the seventh and eighth freshmen to start a season opener for Nebraska in the Big 12 era. However, they were only the second and third freshmen who stood over 6-4 to start for the Huskers in a season opener during that span, joining 6-11 Brian Conklin, who started six games as a redshirt freshman in 2000-01, including the opener at Oral Roberts. REACHING HIGHER

According to statistics provided by kenpom.com, Nebraska was the shortest team in Division I basketball (344 teams) last season. The Huskers' active roster in 2008-09 had just two scholarship players who stood at least 6-7, while the average height of the 20 players on the full roster was just over 6-4.

This season, Nebraska has a taller lineup across the board as the average height for all 18 players on the roster is 6-5 1/2. NU has four active players available in the non-conference slate who stand at least 6-8, with another – Christian Standhardinger – who will be eligible at the start of the Big 12 season.

RECAPPING NU VS. USC

Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones made his only basket of the second half count, calmly knocking down a clutch 3-pointer with just 11.7 seconds left to lift Nebraska to a 51-48 victory over USC at the Galen Center on Sunday in the first game of the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series.

Jones' basket broke a 48-48 tie after the Trojans (2-2) knotted the game with 42.4 seconds remaining on a Nikola Vucevic putback of a missed shot, the eighth tie of the game. The Huskers then came down and took their final timeout with 37.4 seconds left, leaving time for coach Doc Sadler to set up a play for the Indiana native that gave the Huskers the 20th and final lead change.

After the Huskers worked the ball around the perimeter to get the clock under 15 seconds, Jones, who had just four points in the first period, came around a screen and shot without hesitation, hitting the bottom of the net to give the Huskers (4-1) their first road win of the season. The basket was reviewed at length and called a 3-pointer, setting up a last shot for the Trojans, when the Husker defense locked down and did not allow a good opportunity, as USC put up a wild shot at the buzzer that only hit the backboard.

It was much like the end of the first half when the Huskers also hit the last shot of the period and then grinded it out on defense, not allowing USC to score as the clock wound down. This time, however, it was the Trojans' last chance.

Jones finished with just seven points while senior Ryan Anderson led the way with a game-high 14 points. Anderson was 5-of-9 from the floor including a trio of 3-pointers while adding three rebounds, as the Huskers were outrebounded 38-27.

Anderson played a big role down the stretch along with Jones, giving the Huskers' the lead with 1:06 to play. Anderson sneaked up past the top of the key and intercepted a pass for his fourth steal of the game before racing down the court for a layup and 47-46 lead. He was fouled on the play and knocked down the free throw, despite early struggles at the charity stripe by the Huskers. It was one of just three free throws made by Nebraska in 11 attempts (27.3 percent).

Postgame notes

*- Nebraska snapped a four-game road losing streak against non-conference opponents with the win. The Huskers had lost on trips to Arizona State, Oregon State, New Mexico (NIT) and Saint Louis since defeating TCU in Fort Worth last year.

*- Anderson had his third double-figure scoring game of the year and best outing from beyond the arc, hitting 3-of-4 from downtown. He now has 137 3-pointers in his career and is within nine treys of seventh place in the NU record book.

*- Anderson also had four steals, the second time in five games he has had at least four steals (season- and career-high six in opener vs. USC Upstate).

*- Freshman Brandon Ubel posted 10 points on 4-of-6 shooting, his second double-figure scoring effort of the year.

*- Nebraska had just seven turnovers for the second straight game, while forcing 17 USC miscues.

HUSKERS SIGN 6-11, 315-POUND CENTER FOR 2010-11

Lincoln (Nov. 14) --- Fourth-year coach Doc Sadler added a big recruit for the 2010 signing class as 6-11, 315-pound Andre Almeida signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of Nebraska and join the Husker basketball team next fall.

One of the top post players in the junior college ranks last year, Almeida will add to what is expected to be a huge front court for the Huskers next season as Nebraska currently has three freshmen and sophomores who stand at least 6-10.

"Andre is as talented as he is big," Sadler said. "He has good hands and footwork and he knows how to get around in the paint and score. He has tremendous strength, and when you're that big, it's hard to be moved around. Andre will help us when we get into Big 12 play where we're facing great big men every night. He also has a tremendous work ethic and I think Nebraska fans will enjoy seeing him play alongside some of our other younger big guys."

A 2010 NJCAA Division I pre-season All-American, Almeida is the fifth international player to sign with the Cornhuskers under Sadler. A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, Almeida recently played for current Nebraska assistant coach Walter Roesse, who served as the head coach of the Brazilian U24 national team that competed in the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia, in July. Almeida also played under Roesse on the 2006 U18 national team that competed at the Copa America tournament in San Antonio, Texas, qualifying Brazil for the Junior World Cup in Belgrade. Brazil finished in fourth place in the world that year.

During his first season in the United States, Almeida led Arizona Western College to a 26-6 record in 2008-09, including an 18-4 mark in conference action, as AWC finished the year ranked 17th nationally in NJCAA Division I. The Matadors won their fourth regional title in five years before falling in the district finals. Almeida led the way as he averaged 13.8 points over 32 games while ranking first in the nation in field-goal percentage by hitting an outstanding 71.0 percent (184-of-261) from the floor. He also led the league in blocked shots with 3.5 per game (112 total) while adding 7.9 rebounds and 1.6 assists per contest.

After finishing with 11 double-doubles on the year, Almeida was honored as a second-team All-American and a first-team all-conference and all-region selection. He was also named the Arizona Community College Athletic Conference Player of the Year after helping coach Kelly Green and the Matadors to their second straight league regular-season title. Earlier in the season, Almeida was named the NJCAA Division I Player of the Week on Jan. 19 after averaging 20.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game while hitting 81.0 percent from the field over two games.

STANDHARDINGER SITTING DOWN

Although it was expected all along, Nebraska is in the unenviable position to have to replace the scoring punch provided during the exhibition season by freshman forward Christian Standhardinger.

After leading the Cornhuskers with 17.5 points per game in the exhibition season, Standhardinger must sit out 50 percent of the Huskers' games this season – a total of 15 games, equalling all of the non-conference schedule – because of a ruling by the NCAA regarding his amateur status when he played with a club team in his native Germany. He will be allowed to practice with the Huskers during the non-conference slate but will not be able to travel with the team until he is eligible for competition on Jan. 9 at Texas A&M.

Standhardinger came from the same school and club team that produced sophomore center Christopher Niemann, who was forced to sit out all of his first season with the Huskers.

NIEMANN, MCCRAY OUT FOR SEASON

After making what looked to be a successful return from a torn ACL suffered in the final week of the regular season last year, 6-10, 265-pound sophomore center Christopher Niemann had a major setback as he tore the same ACL for a second time in the first week of September. After surgery to repair the damage that occurred during a non-basketball conditioning workout, Niemann will be out for all of the 2009-10 campaign.

Niemann is currently making good progress through rehab again, and is on pace to join the team for offseason workouts in late spring. He will have three years remaining on his original eligibility clock to play three seasons with the Huskers.

Nebraska coach Doc Sadler announced following Nebraska's game against UMKC on Nov. 24 that sophomore guard Toney McCray will have surgery on his elbow and will also be out for the remainder of the season. McCray injured the elbow in a pickup game in early September, sustaining a torn ligament.

McCray tried to play through the pain as doctors assured him that it would get no worse if he waited until after the season to have surgery. But Sadler said that McCray indicated he had little confidence in his elbow and wasn't able to help the team the way he wanted to and thought it would be better to have surgery now and be ready for the offseason in the spring of 2010.

Both Niemann and McCray were looked at as possible starters heading into the start of the season. McCray averaged 6.3 points and 4.0 rebounds over three games this year, hitting 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from the field. He played 18.3 minutes per game. Niemann has yet to play a game in a Husker uniform.

NEBRASKA RECEIVES RARE WAIVER

Nebraska petitioned the NCAA with a waiver that was granted in early September, allowing the Huskers to have 14 players on scholarship for the 2009-10 season. The rare allowance given to NU is only for this season and Nebraska will be required to return to 13 scholarships for the 2010-11 season.

While the Huskers were able to receive the waiver, the stipulation was that one player had to redshirt to get the active roster down to 13 scholarship players. Unfortunately with Christopher Niemann's preseason injury, he is out for the year and it was determined that he would count as the one who would sit out.

NEW FACES LINE HUSKER ROSTER

While the Huskers will rely on their returning scholarship players for leadership early in the season, most of the eyes will be focused on the faces of several newcomers who will dot the inexperienced Nebraska roster.

Among those scholarship newcomers who have already seen action for the first time in their Husker careers are juniors Lance Jeter and Quincy Hankins-Cole, sophomore Myles Holley, redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz and freshmen Ray Gallegos, Brandon Ubel and Adrien Coleman. Freshman Christian Standhardinger (sitting out because of NCAA ruling) is still counting the games until he becomes available to play on Jan. 9.

Including walk-ons Matt Karn and Mike Fox, more than 50 percent (9 of 15; 60.0 percent) of the Huskers who have recorded time during the regular season are playing for the first time in a Nebraska uniform. Another Husker – Eshaunte Jones – played only four games last year before an injury forced him to redshirt.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

While Nebraska entered the season knowing it will have a number of young players in the lineup on any given night, it did not realize it would have two of the youngest players in their respective classes.

Freshman Brandon Ubel is the third-youngest player overall in the Big 12 Conference this season. Born on Aug. 29, 1991, only Jaye Crockett of Texas Tech (Oct. 16, 1991) and Tyler Stone of Missouri (Sept. 8, 1991) are younger than Ubel.

While Ubel is one of the youngest in the league, another Husker is the youngest for his class. Junior college transfer Quincy Hankins-Cole, who graduated high school when he was 16 and played the past two years at Polk (Fla.) CC, will not turn 20 years old until Feb. 18, 2010. The next youngest junior in the Big 12 is Kansas State's Jacob Pullen, who turned 20 on Nov. 10. In fact, Hankins-Cole is three months younger than redshirt-freshman Jorge Brian Diaz, who turned 20 on Friday, Nov. 13.

NU LOOKING FOR FIFTH POSTSEASON BERTH IN SEVEN YEARS

Despite their lack of experience entering the year, the 2009-10 Huskers will be shooting for the program's fifth postseason berth in seven years and third straight under coach Doc Sadler. Overall, Nebraska's NIT bid at the end of the 2008-09 campaign was the Huskers' 22nd all-time postseason appearance. NU has 16 appearances in the NIT, including the 1996 title, and six berths in the NCAA Tournament.

HUSKERS LOOK TO BUILD ON 8-8 LEAGUE MARK

While the Huskers have more than six weeks before they start league action, Nebraska will have one thing in mind while it prepares for facing arguably the nation's toughest conference: continuing its upward momentum against Big 12 foes.

Last year, the Huskers finished with an 8-8 record in Big 12 Conference play, their best mark in a decade and just the third time since the formation of the league that NU has finished at .500 or better. That mark came as the Huskers won each of their last two regular-season games, giving Nebraska its third straight season with a better league mark. NU had six league wins in 2007 and seven in 2008.

Since the start of the 2007 conference season, only three teams in the Big 12 have improved their win total in league play each of the past three years. That small group includes Nebraska, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State.

This year, Nebraska will try to do something done only once before in program history as the only other time the Huskers improved their conference win total for four straight years was from 1952 to 1955.

SADLER SETTING NEW MARKS

Nebraska coach Doc Sadler has said from the beginning that he hopes to do something at Nebraska that's never been accomplished before: get to the NCAA Tournament and win a game. Since he's been at NU, his record has spoken volumes as he has reached marks never before seen in Lincoln.

Over his first three years, Sadler had more victories than any Husker coach to open a career. Through his first three seasons, Sadler owned a 55-40 mark, two more wins than Moe Iba had in his first three years and four more than Danny Nee. Sadler also had the most wins in the first two years at NU (37) and is the first coach in school history to win at least 17 games in each of his first three years guiding the Cornhuskers.

The Huskers' win over Texas Tech on the road on Jan. 31, 2009, marked Sadler's 50th victory at Nebraska. He was the fourth-fastest coach to reach 50 wins at NU in program history and among the three who reached the mark faster at NU, two of those men coached in Lincoln before World War I.

The IMG Husker Sports Radio Network is in its 15th year producing and marketing live broadcasts of University of Nebraska football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball and softball games.

The Husker Sports Network has created a large network of state and national affiliates. All regular-season men's basketball games and any postseason contests will be broadcast on a 32-station basketball network in 2009-10. KFAB (1110 AM) is the Omaha affiliate, KLIN (1400 AM) is the Lincoln affiliate and while KRVN (880 AM) in Lexington also serves as a primary state affiliate. All games can be heard around the world for free on Huskers.com and a great number of Nebraska's games will also be heard live on SIRIUS Satellite again this season.

Veteran radio announcer Kent Pavelka leads the NU men's basketball broadcast in 2009-10, along with former Husker letterwinner Matt Davison. Former Husker Andy Markowski will also fill in as the color analyst for a number of contests. Lane Grindle serves as the host of Sports Nightly, a live daily call-in show. Grindle will also host the Doc Sadler Radio Show on Monday nights throughout the season beginning at 7 p.m.

HUSKERS HEADING TO PUERTO RICO IN 2010

Lincoln (Nov. 19) -- The Nebraska basketball team will get a tough early season test when it plays in the 2010 O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off tournament next November. The tourney will run Nov. 18-21, 2010, and the Huskers will play three games, with all the tourney contests slated to be carried by ESPN or ESPN360.com.

The 2010 tourney field was announced during the opening games of the 2009 Puerto Rico Tip-Off. Rounding out the talented eight-team field alongside Nebraska next year will be North Carolina, West Virginia, Minnesota, Vanderbilt, Davidson, Western Kentucky and Hofstra. This season, the Tar Heels, Mountaineers and Golden Gophers are all ranked in the national top 25.

"This is going to be a test. With a field like that, you're going to find out real quick what kind of team you have," coach Doc Sadler said. "These early season tournaments are fun for the fans, but it's tough for the team because you have three games in four days and have to make that quick turnaround. Hopefully it will be something good for us with so many young guys coming back."

Nebraska will be playing in its first regular-season tournament since 2006-07 when the Huskers went 2-1 at the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. The last time the Huskers played in San Juan was the 2000 San Juan Shootout, when NU won three straight games by a total of four points. NU had one-point wins over Iona and Kent State and won by two points over Southern Methodist to take the title. Overall, it will be Nebraska's eighth regular-season tournament away from home during the Big 12 era.

The Huskers currently have 12 scholarship players who are juniors, sophomores or freshmen who will have eligibility remaining after this season. Among those are six freshmen or redshirt freshmen, including center Jorge Brian Diaz, who is from Caguas, Puerto Rico.

NU LOOKS FOR DEFENSIVE 3-PEAT

In 2009-10, Nebraska looks to continue its dominance on the defensive end under coach Doc Sadler. Each of the past two seasons, the Huskers have led the Big 12 Conference in scoring defense and ranked among the national leaders.

The Huskers started this year in solid fashion, allowing just 49 points on 19-of-49 shooting (38.8 percent) in the season opener against South Carolina Upstate. Over its next two games, Nebraska allowed 69 and 77 points, before getting back on track by holding UMKC to 48 points while USC managed just 48 points. On the season Nebraska has now allowed opponents 58.2 points per game on 40.6 percent shooting.

Last year, Nebraska allowed just 60.4 points per game to rank 22nd nationally while a year earlier, it gave up 60.7 ppg to rank No. 18 in the nation. Nebraska also led the league in conference-only defense in 2009 by giving up just 62.5 ppg to league teams. NU finished as one of only two teams (also Kansas, 65.4 ppg) that allowed less than 69.0 points per game in Big 12 play.

The Huskers' top-ranked defense last year marked the first time NU had led the league in scoring defense in the Big 12 era. Dating to the 2007-08 season, Nebraska has held seven of its last 10 Big 12 Conference opponents in the Devaney Center to 57 or fewer points, including three times under 50 points. NU held five teams to less than 57 points in Big 12 play last year, including Missouri (51), Kansas State (51), at Colorado (53), Texas (55) and vs. Colorado (41).

HUSKERS FACE DIFFICULT SCHEDULE

Nebraska faces a rugged schedule as it will play 16 of its 31 regular-season games against teams that reached the 2009 postseason. Among the Huskers' opponents that reached last year's NCAA Tournament were: Elite Eight participants Missouri (twice) and Oklahoma, Sweet 16 participant Kansas (twice), NCAA second-round qualifiers Oklahoma State, Texas, Texas A&M and USC. NU will also play 2009 postseason NIT qualifiers Baylor (runner-up), Creighton, Kansas State (twice) and Tulsa, along with CBI champion Oregon State. At the Las Vegas Classic, NU faces either BYU or Nevada, which played in the NCAA and NIT, respectively, last year.

- The Huskers are set to play 18 regular-season games at the Bob Devaney Sports Center for the third straight season. Last year, the Huskers went 14-4 in the building and NU is now 45-11 at home under coach Doc Sadler.
- Nebraska will look to keep an outstanding home winning streak alive in 2009-10 as the Huskers' look for their 34th straight winning season at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The Huskers have never had a losing season in the Devaney Center since the building opened for the 1976-77 campaign.
- For the third straight season, the Huskers will have at least 21 games televised regionally or nationally, including three games set to be seen around the country on the ESPN family of networks. The Huskers have averaged more than 13 televised contests (national, regional and local) each of the past eight years.
- Nebraska will play five games away from the Devaney Center in non-conference action for the first time since Doc Sadler's first season when the Huskers went 3-3 away from Lincoln in 2006-07. It is the second straight season NU has played three true road games in non-conference play, the most by the Huskers since playing four true road games in 1997-98.
- The Huskers faced USC in the third annual Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Classic on Nov. 29, starting the series with USC on the road with the Trojans returning the game to Lincoln in 2010-11.
- Nebraska will face Tulsa and either BYU or Nevada at the Las Vegas Classic on Dec. 22-23. It will be NU's first regular-season tournament since competing in the 2006 Rainbow Classic, where the Huskers went 2-1.

NEBRASKA GAME-BY-GAME NOTEBOOK (GAMES 1-5)

GAME 1 VS. USC UPSTATE (NU 76, USC 49)

The Nebraska Cornhuskers opened their 114th season in program history with a solid 76-49 victory over USC Upstate at the Devaney Center. The Huskers and Spartans swapped leads six times in the first half with NU heading into the locker room with a seven-point lead, 31-24, but a 25-2 run early in the second period sealed the Huskers' ninth straight season-opening victory. Nebraska, which hit 54.8 percent from the floor in the second half, started a pair of freshmen in Brandon Ubel and Jorge Brian Diaz, who combined for 21 points, 13 rebounds, three assists and three blocked shots. Another newcomer, junior college transfer Lance Jeter also made his first career start, leading the way with 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting including dropping in all three attempts from 3-point range as NU was 11-of-20 from beyond the arc. He added six assists and two steals. Senior Ryan Anderson also had a solid all-around performance, posting five points, five rebounds, five assists and a career-best six steals, the most steals by a Husker since 2001.

GAME 2 AT SAINT LOUIS (SLU 69, NU 55)

Saint Louis's Kwamain Mitchell scored 20 points, including 15 in the second half when the Billikens' defense held Nebraska to just 33.3 percent shooting, as SLU ran away with a 69-55 victory at Chaifetz Arena in St. Louis. In their first road game of the season, the Huskers fell behind early, but used a late first-half surge to pull within one, 28-27, at the half. NU allowed just one Billiken basket over the final 7:33 of the period before coming out of the locker room with a quick basket that gave Nebraska its only lead of the game, 29-28, less than a minute into the second period. From there, SLU hit four 3-pointers in the next five minutes, including three in a decisive 11-0 run as the Billikens led by double figures the rest of the way. Sek Henry led the Huskers with 14 points while Anderson had 10. Nebraska played all but four minutes without starting center Jorge Brian Diaz, who had a bloodied mouth and loosened teeth less than a minute into the game and did not return until just over eight minutes remained.

GAME 3 VS. TCU (NU 90, TCU 77)

In the highest scoring game in the Doc Sadler era at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers outraced TCU to the finish line, earning a 90-77 victory at the Devaney Center in a game that featured 11 ties and 13 lead changes. The Huskers shot the ball extremely well, hitting 60 percent in the second half and 54.0 percent for the game while reaching the 90-point plateau for the first time since 2006. Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz, who had two teeth knocked loose at Saint Louis where he played just four minutes three days earlier, came off the bench to hit 9-of-10 shots for a team-high 22 points, leading five Huskers in double figures. Diaz was the first NU freshman with a 20-point game since Sek Henry in 2006. Henry set Diaz up all day long, as he finished with 11 points and 11 assists for the first Husker double-double since Aleks Maric in 2008. Henry missed a triple-double by three rebounds as he added seven boards with three steals and two blocked shots. Brandon Richardson made his first career start and finished with career highs in points (15) and rebounds (4), helping Nebraska outrebound the Horned Frogs 35-24. With the game tied at 67-67 with five minutes to play, the Huskers put the accelerator down as they scored 23 points in the stretch run, including hitting 13-of-15 at the charity stripe in final 3:24.

GAME 4 VS. UMKC (NU 70, UMKC 48)

After a sluggish start, the Nebraska offense picked up and Huskers locked down the defense locked down as NU ran away with a 70-48 victory over UMKC in the Devaney Center. The teams were tied three times in the early going as the Roos forced four early turnovers and had the score within one, 20-19 with less than seven minutes remaining in the first half. But senior Sek Henry's back-to-back 3-pointers within 30 seconds ignited the offense, which went on to hit better than 53 percent for the game. The Huskers used a 21-5 run to end the first half with a 41-24 advantage and pushed the lead out to 28 points before clearing the bench in the final five minutes. Henry led all scorers with 14 points while adding five rebounds and four assists. Point guard Lance Jeter added 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting and Jorge Brian Diaz came off the bench to score double figures for the second straight game, adding 10 points with three blocked shots. The Huskers limited UMKC to 35.3 percent shooting and forced 14 turnovers while committing just seven miscues. Jay Cousinard was the only Kangaroo in double figures with 11 points but he fouled out with more than 11 minutes remaining in the game.

GAME 5 AT USC (NU 51, USC 48)

Redshirt freshman Eshaunte Jones made just one shot in the second half, but it was the biggest one of the game as he drilled a 3-pointer from the corner with 11.7 seconds left in the contest to give Nebraska a 51-48 victory over USC at the Galen Center. Playing in the first game of this year's Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series, the Huskers and Trojans had eight ties and 20 lead changes as Nebraska evened its road record at 1-1 in November. Just two minutes before Jones' shot, the Huskers looked unlikely to capitalize on missed chances, including going just 3-of-11 at the free throw line. But Quincy Hankins-Cole made a strong play on an offensive rebound to record NU's first basket in nearly six minutes to pull the Huskers within one at 46-45. Ryan Anderson then gave the Huskers the lead less than 30 seconds later with a steal out near the top of the key and a layup before converting the traditional three-point play. USC tied the game at 48-all with less than 40 seconds remaining on a Nikola Vucevic putback, setting up Jones' exciting finish. Following a timeout, the Huskers worked the ball around the perimeter and got the clock down to under 15 before Jones got the ball and fired. Following a lengthy review by the officials, the shot was confirmed as a 3-pointer and NU defended the arc for the final 11 seconds before USC's desperation heave at the buzzer went wide. Anderson led all scorers with 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including three 3-pointers. He also had four of NU's 11 steals on 17 USC turnovers, while Nebraska committed just seven miscues.
