Series vs. Nebraska

Saturday's contest marks the 20th meeting between Texas and Nebraska. The Longhorns hold a 15-4 lead in the all-time series which dates back to Dec. 18, 1964 (a 77-73 Texas victory in Austin). **UT has won seven straight in the series and is 9-1 against the Huskers during the Rick Barnes era entering Saturday's game.** The teams have split the previous eight meetings in Lincoln, although Texas has posted wins in each of its last three trips to Nebraska.

Did You Know ?

Facts on the Texas Basketball program

- Texas is one of just three schools to have advanced to at least the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament in five of the last seven years, joining Duke (5) and Kansas (5).
- Texas is one of just eight programs to have advanced to each of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments, joining Arizona, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State and Wisconsin.
- Texas is the only school in the country that can claim two National Player of the Year winners in the last six years (T.J. Ford in 2003; Kevin Durant in 2007).
- Texas has produced three consensus first-team All-Americans over the last six seasons, the top total in the country during this stretch (Ford in 2003; Durant in 2007; Augustin in 2008).
- Texas is the only school in the nation to have a Top 10 pick in each of the last three NBA Drafts (LaMarcus Aldridge, No. 2 in 2006; Kevin Durant, No. 2 in 2007; D.J. Augustin, No. 9 in 2008).
- Texas has produced four Top 10 NBA Draft picks in the last six years, the top total in the nation during this stretch.

ESPN/USA Today poll for 39 straight weeks (Feb. 19, 2007). **During the Barnes era, the Horns have spent 140 weeks in The AP Top 25, including 60 in the Top 10.**

A Homecoming for Hill

Redshirt sophomore forward/center Matt Hill makes his second trip as a Longhorn to his hometown of Lincoln, Neb. Hill was a true freshman on the 2006-07 Texas team that posted a 62-61 victory on Jan. 24, 2007, but he did not see action during the contest (left heel injury). A four-year letterwinner and three-year starter for coach Jeff Smith at Lincoln Southeast HS, Hill set school career records in scoring (1,242 points), rebounds (755) and blocks (244). He averaged 20.1 ppg, 12.7 rpg and 3.6 bpg as a senior while leading Southeast to a 20-5 mark and the state semi-finals. Hill was named Mr. Basketball and the Gatorade Player of the Year for the state of Nebraska in his senior year.

Texas-Missouri Game Notes

□ UT lost consecutive home games for the first time since the 2001-02 season (110-103 overtime loss to No. 2 Kansas on Feb. 11, 2002; 85-80 defeat to No. 13 Oklahoma State on Feb. 20, 2002).

□ The Horns posted a 40-33 advantage on the glass. This marked the 16th time in 21 games this year that Texas had outrebounded its opponent.

□ **Dexter Pittman** (25 points) set career highs in points and field goals made (9-of-12) and tied his career high in free throws made (7-of-10). Pittman topped the 20-point mark for the second time this season and in his career (86 games). He reached double figures in scoring for the eighth time this year and 11th time in his career.

□ **A.J. Abrams** (11 points) reached double figures in scoring for the 15th time this year and 83rd time in his career (130 games).

□ **Damion James** (10 rebounds) reached double digits in rebounds for the ninth time this year and the 39th time in his career (94 games).

□ **Justin Mason** tied his season high in minutes (38).

In "Sweet" Company

Texas has reached the NCAA "Sweet 16" five times in the last seven years. **The Longhorns are one of just three schools to accomplish this feat, joining Duke (5) and Kansas (5).** Texas has made 10 trips to the "Sweet 16" since 1960. UT made "Sweet 16" appearances in 1960 (25-team tournament), 1963 (25-team tournament), 1972 (25-team tournament), 1997, 2002 and 2004. Texas also advanced to the "Elite Eight" in 1990, 2006 and 2008 and the Final Four in 2003.

An "Elite" Program

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last three years and three times in the last six seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

10-in-a-Row

With their bid to the 2008 NCAA Tournament, the Longhorns extended their school-record streak of consecutive NCAA appearances to 10. **Texas has advanced to the Big Dance in each of Rick Barnes' 10 previous seasons in Austin.** Prior to the Barnes era, UT's previous mark for consecutive NCAA Tournament bids was four (set twice).

Success Against the AP Top 25

During his 11 seasons in Austin, Rick Barnes has registered a school-record 47 career victories against AP Top 25 opponents (previous mark: 10-44 by Tom Penders, 1989-98). Barnes has guided the Horns to a 47-52 (.475) record against ranked teams. Barnes has posted 77 career victories against AP Top 25 foes.

Strength of Schedule

To say the Longhorns will play a difficult schedule this season would be a gross understatement. **UT has faced five opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 during its first 21 games.** The Horns are 2-3 this year against the AP Top 25. **During its non-league schedule, Texas faced two opponents each from the Big East Conference, the Big Ten Conference and the Pac-10 Conference and one from the Southeastern Conference.** In addition, the Horns scrimmaged No. 20/20 Davidson and No. 10/11 Gonzaga in the preseason. Here's a look at the highlights of this year's non-conference schedule (ranking at time of game).

Beating the Best

UT posted two victories against AP Top Three teams during the 2007-08 season. Texas' win at No. 2 UCLA last year equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent that the Longhorns have defeated in school history. The Horns also claimed a home win against No. 3 Kansas last season. **Four of UT's seven all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come in the Rick Barnes era.**

Zaire Taylor had a team-high 17 points, including the decisive three-point play with five seconds remaining, to lead Missouri to a four-point win at the Erwin Center before an ESPN2 national television audience. The loss spoiled a career night for UT's Dexter Pittman. Pittman tallied 25 points, seven rebounds and two blocks in 23 minutes off the bench. He converted 9-of-12 field goals and 7-of-10 free throws on the night. Texas dropped back-to-back home games for the first time since the 2001-02 season. Missouri jumped out to an 8-1 advantage following a DeMarre Carroll jumper at the 16:30 mark. Trailing 10-3 after a Leo Lyons putback with 15:48 remaining, the Horns used a Pittman three-point play, a Justin Mason layup and an A.J. Abrams three-pointer to grab an 11-10 lead at the 14:16 mark. The contest saw five lead changes in the next two-and-a-half minutes. Trailing 16-15 after a Lyons layup with 11:51 left, Texas used a Clint Chapman layup, a three-point play from Gary Johnson, back-to-back three-point plays from Pittman and a Damion James layup to run off 13 straight points and build a 28-16 cushion at the 6:56 mark. Trailing 34-23 with 4:00 remaining, the Tigers closed the half on a 6-0 spurt to trim the margin to 34-29 at the break. Texas held Missouri to 35.3% FG shooting in the opening half. UT extended its advantage to 38-31 on a Johnson layup with 18:33 left, but the Tigers responded with a Lyons layup and a Taylor three-pointer to cut the gap to 38-36 at the 17:37 mark. After a Chapman dunk gave the Longhorns a 42-40 lead with 14:02 left, Missouri used a Keith Ramsey layup, back-to-back layups from Carroll and a J.T. Tiller layup to build a 48-42 cushion at the 9:53 mark. Trailing 50-45 with 9:30 remaining, Texas used a Varez Ward layup and a Pittman dunk to trim the margin to 50-49 at the 8:00 mark. After a James dunk gave the Horns a 53-52 advantage with 6:16 left, the Tigers responded with a 6-1 run to take a 58-54 lead following a Matt Lawrence three-pointer at the 5:05 mark. UT answered with a Mason free throw, a Pittman three-point play and a James jumper to build a 60-58 advantage with 3:57 left. After another Pittman dunk gave Texas a 62-60 cushion at the 3:01 mark, Missouri answered with back-to-back baskets from Lyons to take a 64-62 lead with 2:15 left. An Abrams floater in the lane tied the count at 65-65 with 1:05 remaining, setting the stage for Taylor's heroics in the final 10 seconds. Following Taylor's three-point play, the Longhorns turned the ball over. A single free throw from Carroll with four seconds left iced the victory. Taylor was joined in double-figure scoring by Lyons (14), Carroll (13) and Tiller (10). Abrams added 11 points, while James had six points and a game-high 10 boards. Mason also tallied six points, six rebounds and seven assists. Missouri converted 15-of-27 (.556) field goals and committed just two of its seven total turnovers in the second half. The Horns recorded a 40-33 advantage on the glass and a 20-8 margin in second-chance points.

the Horns have won the Big 12 title. All three championships have come during the Rick Barnes era. UT won the crown outright in 1998-99 and shared the league title with Kansas in 2005-06 (No. 1 seed in the conference tourney that year as well).

20 Wins ... Again

With a school single-season record 31 victories in 2007-08, the Longhorns reached the 20-win mark for the ninth straight season. Texas also reached the 30-win plateau for the second time in the last three years (30-7 mark in 2005-06). UT's current streak of nine straight 20-win campaigns is a school record. Prior to the current streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92).

10 League Wins ... Again

Texas recorded a 13-3 mark in Big 12 play during the 2007-08 season en route to claiming a share of the conference title. **This marked the ninth time in 10 seasons under Rick Barnes that the Horns have reached double digits in league wins.** Texas posted a 9-7 conference mark in 2004-05. UT has reached 12 league wins in each of the last three seasons (13-3 in 2005-06, 12-4 in 2006-07 and 13-3 in 2007-08) and recorded at least 13 conference victories in five of Barnes' 10 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 13-3 in 1999-2000, 13-3 in 2002-03, 13-3 in 2005-06 and 13-3 in 2007-08).

Defense Wins

Solid defense continues to be a Texas trademark under coach Rick Barnes. In its first 21 games this year, Texas has held its opponents to an average of 63.0 points per contest and a combined 39.4% FG shooting, including a 125-of-377 (.332) mark from three-point range. **UT has limited 13 of its first 21 opponents to under 40% FG shooting, including two to under 30% FG shooting.** Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 178 of their 361 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 162-16 (.910) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat (11-2 record this year).**

More Defensive Details

□ Texas held Stetson (Nov. 14) to 38 points on 26.0% FG shooting (13-of-50). This marked a tie for the fifth-lowest shooting percentage by a UT opponent since the 1960-61 season. The Horns limited Stetson to just one field goal over the first 11:16 of the game.

□ Texas held Tulane (Nov. 18) to 51 points on 31.0% FG shooting (18-of-58).

□ The Horns limited Saint Joseph's (Nov. 24) to 29.3% FG shooting (17-of-58).

□ Texas held Oregon (Nov. 26) without a field goal for a span of 12:29 in the first half (from 15:49 to 3:20).

□ UT limited Rice (Nov. 30) to 25.9% FG shooting (7-of-27) in the second half.

□ The Horns held No. 15/12 Villanova (Dec. 9) to 38.0% FG shooting (19-of-50), including a 4-of-18 (.222) mark from beyond the arc.

□ Texas limited Appalachian State (Jan. 2) to 43 points on 30.2% FG shooting (16-of-53), including a 3-of-18 (.167) mark from three-point range. The Mountaineers entered the contest averaging 82.8 ppg (UT held ASU 40 points below its season average).

□ The Horns held Iowa State (Jan. 10) to 38.8% FG shooting (26-of-67), including a 9-of-28 (.321) mark in the first half.

□ Texas limited Texas Tech (Jan. 17) to 34.0% FG shooting (18-of-53). The Longhorns held the Red Raiders scoreless for a span of 6:47 in the first half (from 17:14 to 10:27).

□ UT held Baylor (Jan. 27) to 37.5% FG shooting (24-of-64), including a 9-of-31 (.290) mark in the first half.

Cleaning the Glass

Texas has outrebounded its opponent in 16 of its first 21 games to start the season. UT posted a 41-29 rebound margin during the win against Texas A&M (Jan. 24). Dogus Balbay missed UT's season opener against Stetson due to a violation of the NCAA's amateurism rules which occurred prior to his enrollment at Texas. The NCAA determined that Balbay participated in a total of 11 games for a professional team in Turkey during the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons. The NCAA penalized Balbay on a 1-for-1 basis, meaning that each game Balbay played professionally in Turkey equaled one game that he would be withheld from competition at UT. Balbay injured his right knee on Oct. 4 and had surgery on Oct. 30 last year. He was medically cleared to play prior to UT's game at Texas Tech on March 1. Since Balbay did not participate in UT's final 10 games of the 2007-08 season (beginning with the game at Texas Tech), he served 10 of his 11-game suspension last year. He made his collegiate debut against Tulane (Nov. 18).

Balbay's International Experience

After fully recovering from his right knee injury and going through spring individual workouts, **Dogus Balbay returned home to Turkey to play for his country this summer.** Balbay led Turkey to a fourth-place finish at the Under-20 European

Championships (Riga, Latvia) on August 1-10. He ranked fourth on the team in scoring (8.3 ppg), led the squad in assists (4.9 apg) and minutes played (29.0 mpg) and ranked second in steals (10) and third in rebounding (4.1 rpg) during the eight-game tourney.

Hill Breaks Out at Texas Tech

Forward/center **Matt Hill** had a solid performance during the win at Texas Tech (Jan. 17). Called the "most valuable player on the court today" by Damion James in a post-game interview, Hill posted six points (3-of-5 FG), five rebounds and one block in a

career-high 27 minutes. **Hill's six points marked a season high and the most since he had six against Nicholls State on Nov. 21, 2006.** His five rebounds also marked a season high and the most since he had six against Texas State on Dec. 16, 2006.

Hill Climbs Back into the Rotation

Matt Hill returns for his redshirt sophomore year after missing the entire 2007-08 season with a left heel injury. Last year, he had surgery on his left heel (Dec. 21) and was granted a medical redshirt year. **Hill has played in 15 of UT's first 21 games this season.** As a true freshman in 2006-07, he played in 23 games. Hill saw action in all 18 games to start his career prior to a left foot injury that sidelined him on Jan 23. He missed 11 consecutive Big 12 Conference games before returning to play in five of the last six contests that year.

Pittman Producing

Junior center **Dexter Pittman** ranks fourth on the team in scoring (9.1 ppg) and third in rebounding (4.5 rpg) in just 13.4 minutes per contest. He has converted a team-best 60.9% (70-of-115) field goals and 51-of-69 (.739) free throws. **Pittman has reached double figures in scoring eight times in the first 21 games after achieving the feat just three times in his first two seasons (65 games).**

Pittman's Career Night

Dexter Pittman had a breakout performance during Wednesday's game against Missouri. **Pittman posted 25 points while hitting 9-of-12 field goals and 7-of-10 free throws.** He also added seven rebounds (five offensive) and two blocks in 23 minutes off the bench. Pittman set career highs in scoring and field goals made and tied his career best in free throws made.

Pittman Likes Home Cooking

Dexter Pittman has been at his best inside the friendly confines of the Erwin Center this season. In 11 home games, Pittman has averaged 12.6 points and 5.7 rebounds per game while hitting 68.9% (51-of-74) from the floor and 75.5% (37-of-49) from the free throw line in 15.5 minutes per contest. **During UT's last seven home games (dating back to the Texas State game on Dec. 13), Pittman has averaged 15.6 points and 6.9 rebounds per contest while hitting 70.2% (40-of-57) field goals.**

Dex-a-Trim

Dexter Pittman has dropped nearly 70 pounds since reporting to campus as a freshman at 366 pounds. Pittman also is expected to play a more prominent role in the frontcourt rotation this year. After a solid showing in spring individual workouts, he attended the prestigious Pete Newell's Big Man Camp in Las Vegas this summer.

The Lone Freshman

Combo guard **Varez Ward** is the only freshman on the 2008-09 Texas Basketball team. After a solid preseason, he has played in 20 of the first 21 games (missed the Tulane contest on Nov. 18 with a right ankle injury) and is averaging 3.5 points and 2.6 rebounds in 15.7 minutes per game (sixth on the team). He made his first collegiate start during the game at Arkansas (Jan. 6).

Ward Making Improvements

Varez Ward has put together three consecutive solid performances heading into Saturday's game. **In these last three contests, Ward has averaged 7.0 points and 4.0 rebounds in 22.7 minutes per game while hitting 11-of-14 (.786) free throws.** During the win at Baylor (Jan. 27), he tallied eight points (6-of-6 FT), four rebounds and two assists in 16 minutes. Ward followed with nine points (5-of-7 FT) and four rebounds in 24 minutes off the bench against Kansas State (Jan. 31). He then added four points, four boards and four assists in 28 minutes against Missouri on Wednesday.

Chapman Looking for More Consistency

Sophomore forward/center **Clint Chapman** returns to the front-court rotation. Chapman played in 35 of 38 games (one start) and averaged 1.3 ppg and 1.4 rpg in 6.6 mpg last year. He has played in 20 of the first 21 games (started the season opener against Stetson) and is averaging 1.4 ppg and 1.7 rpg in 8.0 mpg this year. **Chapman tied his career high with six rebounds (three offensive) during the win against No. 15/12 Villanova (Dec. 9) at the Jimmy V Classic.**

Smith Looking to Expand Backcourt Rotation

Junior guard **Harrison Smith** returns for his third season with the Longhorns. He dropped nearly 20 pounds (went from 213 to 195) during the offseason strength and conditioning program. Smith has seen action in five games this season. **He played a career-high 14 minutes and tied his career high in rebounds (three) during the game at No. 6/5 Oklahoma (Jan. 12).** Smith played in 12 games as a sophomore after seeing game action in eight contests as a freshman.

Wangmene Out for Remainder of Season

Sophomore forward/center **Alexis Wangmene** had surgery on his right knee on Dec. 17, and he will miss the remainder of the year. He played in four of the first five games and averaged 3.0 ppg and 3.0 rpg in 6.3 mpg. In the win against Saint Joseph's (Nov. 24), Wangmene had eight points (tied his career high), seven rebounds (one shy of his career high), one block and one steal in just nine minutes off the bench.

Three-Point Streak

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter Saturday's game having hit at least one 3-pointer in 604 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 732 of 739 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

Horns and the NBA Draft

When D.J. Augustin was taken with the ninth overall selection in the 2008 NBA Draft, it completed quite a three-year run for Texas at the Draft. **UT is the only school in the nation to have a Top 10 pick in each of the last three NBA Drafts.** In fact, Texas is just the fourth school since 1985 (when the current draft lottery system was implemented) to produce a lottery pick in three consecutive years. Georgia Tech (1989-91), Duke (1992-95) and Connecticut (1994-96) previously accomplished the feat. UT has produced four Top 10 picks in the last six years, the top total in the nation during this stretch.

Jai Lucas Transfers to Texas

Former University of Florida guard **Jai Lucas** (first name is pronounced: Jay) has transferred to The University of Texas. Lucas has enrolled in classes for the spring semester at Texas. Per NCAA transfer rules, Lucas is permitted to practice with the Longhorns, but he will not be able to participate in games or travel with the team. Lucas spent his freshman season (2007-08) at Florida and earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team while starting all 36 games for the Gators. He averaged 8.5 ppg and converted a team-best 43.5 percent of his three-point field goal attempts (37-of-85) while helping Florida post a 24-12 record (8-8 SEC, 4th East) and advance to the MasterCard Postseason NIT semifinals. Lucas earned McDonald's All-America and Parade All-America honors during his senior year at Bellaire High School in Houston, as he averaged 26.3 points and 7.5 assists per contest.

Texas Inks Trio in Fall Signing Period

Three high school hoop standouts signed National Letters of Intent during the fall signing period to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. **Avery Bradley (Tacoma, Wash.)**, **Jordan Hamilton (Los Angeles, Calif.)** and **Shawn Williams (Duncanville, Texas)** will join the Horns for the 2009-10 season.

□ Bradley (6-3, 175), a guard from Findlay College Prep (Henderson, Nev.) who plays under coach Michael Peck, is ranked as the No. 8 high school prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and the No. 10 prospect by Scout.com. Bradley played his first three years of high school at Bellarmine Prep in Tacoma. He averaged 25.7 points per game as a junior.

□ Hamilton (6-7, 215), a swingman from Dominguez High School, is ranked as the No. 5 high school prospect in the country by Rivals.com and the No. 13 prospect by Scout.com. Hamilton averaged 27.6 points and 11.1 rebounds per game as a junior.

□ Williams (6-7, 215), a swingman from Duncanville High School who plays under coach Phil McNeely, is ranked as the top player in the state of Texas by TexasHoops.com. He also is ranked as the No. 44 high school prospect in the nation by Scout.com and the No. 64 prospect by Rivals.com. He averaged 17 points and 9.5 rebounds per game as a junior.

Year 11 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in Texas Basketball history, **Rick Barnes** is in his 11th season at Texas and sports a **262-99 (.726)** mark with the Horns. He has compiled a **464-233 (.666)** record in 22 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. Along the way, he has guided his teams to a total of 16 NCAA (current streak of 13 consecutive) and three NIT trips.
