News & Notes

- The Big 12 has seven teams ranked in the top 49 of the last RPI rankings published at rpiratings.com. As a league, the Big 12 is ranked fourth.
- The Big 12 has six of its squads ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring offense. Six place in the top 47 in field goal percentage.
- The Big 12 has recorded a .780 winning percentage in non-league games so far this year. The percentage marks the best in Big 12 history.
- The Big 12 is second in the nation in non-conference victories in 2008-09 with 136. The total is a league record for the regular season. The Big 12 has more non-conference wins per team than any other league.
- The Big 12 has won seven games versus nationally-ranked non-league opponents in 2008-09. A year ago, the Big 12 led the nation in victories against nationally-ranked non-conference foes.
- The Big 12 boasts three teams - Baylor, Oklahoma and Texas - ranked in the USA Today/ESPN top 25 poll in both men's and women's basketball. The total ties for the most of any conference in the nation (Big East).
- The Big 12 has a .500 or better record against 28 of the 31 conferences it has faced so far this year. Among those are unbeaten records versus 15 other leagues.
- During the early-signing period, the Big 12 fared very well nationally. Seven schools were ranked on the Rivals.com list of top 25 classes, more than any conference in the country. In its conference breakdown, Rivals rated the Big 12 as "the clear winner of conferences during the early signing period."



Coaches vs. Cancer Suits & Sneakers Set for Jan. 30-Feb. 1

The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), in conjunction with the American Cancer Society, will once again stage its annual Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers awareness weekend on Jan. 30 - Feb. 1. Coaches vs. Cancer, a nationwide collaboration between the NABC and the American Cancer Society, exists to leverage the strength, community leadership and celebrity of our country's basketball coaches to raise awareness and in turn, reduce cancer risk through education programs while raising funds for the fight against cancer. Through the efforts of more than 500 basketball coaches and the nation's largest voluntary health organization, nearly \$40 million dollars has been raised since 1994. All Big 12 men's basketball coaches are expected to participate in the weekend.

BAYLOR (15-3, 3-1 Big 12)

Next Game: at Oklahoma (Jan. 24)

Recent Result: Won at Kansas State, 83-65

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/8-2

- Sophomore guard LaceDarius Dunn scored a season-high 33 points in 32 minutes at Kansas State. He was 11-of-14 from the field, including 9-of-12 from 3-point range.
- Dunn's nine shots from beyond the arc tied the BU school record for 3-pointers made in a game (David Hamilton vs. TCU, Feb. 14, 1995). It is also the most made by a Big 12 player this season.
- Freshman forward Quincy Acy has 29 points and 21 rebounds over his last two games. He had scored 26 points in the previous seven games combined prior to the current string.
- Baylor was ranked in the Associated Press top 25 poll for seven straight weeks between Dec. 1 - Jan. 12. Prior to the current string, BU had been ranked a total of five weeks in its 102-year history.



COLORADO (8-9, 0-3 Big 12)

Next Game: Kansas State (Jan. 24)

Recent Result: Lost at Texas Tech, 63-55

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 1-4/4-6

- Sophomore guard Cory Higgins led the Buffaloes with 21 points at Texas Tech. He has scored in double figures in all but one game this season, including 20 points or more seven times.
- Junior guard Dwight Thorne added 13 points for CU on 5-of-11 shooting. It marked the 11th time this year that both Higgins and Thorne have posted double-digit points in the same game.
- CU had a season-high 14 steals at Texas Tech. It was the most steals for the Buffs since posting 19 versus Savannah State on Jan. 3, 2006 and most in a league game since Feb. 17, 2001 (14 vs. Nebraska).
- Higgins has made 78-of-82 (.951) from the charity stripe over the last 12 outings and has 109 free throws made in 2008-09, more than any other Big 12 player.



IOWA STATE (12-6, 1-2 Big 12)

Next Game: Kansas (Jan. 24)

Recent Result: Lost at Missouri, 77-46

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/6-4

- The Cyclones were led by freshman center Justin Hamilton with 13 points at Missouri. It was the second time in the last five contests he has reached double figures.
- Sophomore guard Lucca Staiger has made at least one 3-point field goal in 12 consecutive games. He leads the team with 47 made from beyond the arc this season.
- Sophomore guard Diante Garrett has recorded five or more assists in 10 of 18 outings in 2008-09. He ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 95 assists this year.
- ISU has held 13 of 18 opponents to below 40 percent shooting from the field. The Cyclones are 12-0 when outshooting their opponent and are second in the Big 12 in field goal percentage defense (.382).



KANSAS (14-4, 3-0 Big 12)

Next Game: at Iowa State (Jan. 24)

Recent Result: Defeated Texas A&M, 73-53

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 4-1/7-3

- Junior guard Mario Little finished with a career-high 15 points versus Texas A&M. He had scored a total of 11 points in his first five games played this season.
- Junior guard Sherron Collins is averaging 21.2 points with 39 assists over his last six contests. He needs one point to reach the 1,000-point plateau for his career.
- Kansas has shot 50 percent or better nine times this season, including each of its last three games. The Jayhawks are outshooting their opponents 56.5 to 36.5 percent in their last three outings.
- KU has limited its opponents to 38.2 percent shooting this season. The Jayhawks have held 128 of the last 131 foes to under 50 percent from the floor, including all 18 in 2008-09.



KANSAS STATE (11-7, 0-4 Big 12)

Next Game: at Colorado (Jan. 24)

Recent Result: Lost to Baylor, 83-65

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 1-4/6-4

- Junior guard Denis Clemente led K-State with 17 points against Baylor. He has scored in double digits 10 times this season, including four of the last six games.
- Junior center Luis Colon grabbed 10 rebounds against the Bears, his second double-digit rebounding output of the season. He is third on the team with 92 boards this year.
- Entering this season, senior forward Darren Kent had one double-figure scoring effort and 104 career points. This year, he has had eight outings with 10 points or more and has scored 157 points.
- Kansas State has started conference play with an 0-4 record for the first time since the 1996-97 season, the first year of Big 12 competition. That year, KSU dropped its first nine contests.



MISSOURI (16-3, 3-1 Big 12)

Next Game: Texas Tech (Jan. 24)

Recent Result: Won at Oklahoma State, 97-95

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 4-1/8-2

- Missouri had six players score in double-figures at Oklahoma State, led by seniors Matt Lawrence and DeMarre Carroll with 19 points each. Lawrence's scoring total came in 20 minutes off the bench.
- The Tigers have posted a 3-1 start in Big 12 play for the first time since the 2005-06 season. The last time a MU squad began 4-1 in league play was the 2001-02 campaign.
- Mizzou has had 11 different players reach double digits this year, more than any Big 12 squad. Only two players - Carroll (15.7) and Leo Lyons (14.2) - are averaging double-figure points for the year.
- MU has won 13 straight games at home, a Mizzou Arena record. The string is the 10th-longest home winning streak in school history.

**NEBRASKA (12-5, 2-2 Big 12)****Next Game:** Oklahoma State (Jan. 24)**Recent Result:** Lost at Oklahoma, 72-61**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/6-4

- Junior guard Ryan Anderson finished with a season-high 19 points to go along with seven rebounds at Oklahoma. Prior to the game, he had scored a combined 17 points in the previous four contests.
- Senior guard Paul Velander has shot 50 percent or better from 3-point range in 11 outings this year. He leads the Big 12 in 3-point percentage (.500) and was second nationally in the latest NCAA rankings.
- Nebraska tops the conference in scoring defense (56.8 ppg). NU is looking to lead the Big 12 in the category for the second straight season after never doing so once in the league's first 11 years.
- The Huskers have limited 16 of their first 17 opponents to no more than 66 points. In 11 contests in 2008-09, the opposition has been at 57 points or less.

**OKLAHOMA STATE (12-5, 1-2 Big 12)****Next Game:** at Nebraska (Jan. 24)**Recent Result:** Lost to Missouri, 97-95**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/7-3

- Junior guard Obi Muonelo led the Cowboys with 22 points and 12 rebounds versus Missouri. He is averaging 18.8 points and 8.8 boards over the last five contests.
- Muonelo has scored in double figures in each of his last 14 contests, with 9.8 rebounds per game overall. The last time an OSU player averaged nine boards or more in a season was 1994-95.
- Oklahoma State is one of two teams in the Big 12 (Baylor) that has five players averaging double-digit points. The Cowboys are the only squad with three players in the top 15 in Big 12 individual scoring.
- The Cowboys lead the Big 12 in 3-point shooting (.420) and were second in the nation in the latest NCAA rankings. OSU is on pace to set a school record for 3-pointers with 25.2 attempts per game.

**TEXAS A&M (15-4, 1-3 Big 12)****Next Game:** at Texas (Jan. 24)**Recent Result:** Lost at Kansas, 73-53**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-3/7-3

- Senior guard Josh Carter has scored 1,346 career points, moving into 10th place on the all-time A&M scoring list. He needs 36 points to tie for ninth on the school points chart.
- Junior forward Chinemelu Elonu has 10 double-figure scoring outputs this year after having two in his career prior to 2008-09. He leads the Aggies in field goal percentage with a .655 mark.
- Junior forward Bryan Davis has grabbed at least five rebounds in 14 of 19 games this season, including double-figure boards three times. He is second on the team with 116 rebounds this year.
- Texas A&M and Texas have split the last six meetings between the schools. The last time the Aggies won in Austin was the 2001-02 campaign, a 80-74 victory.

**OKLAHOMA (18-1, 4-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** Baylor (Jan. 24)**Recent Result:** Defeated Nebraska, 72-61**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 5-0/9-1

- Sophomore forward Blake Griffin posted 27 points and 18 rebounds versus Nebraska. It marked his eighth game this year with at least 20 points and 15 boards, a Big 12 single-season record.
- The Sooners are the first team in the nation to win 18 games this season. Oklahoma's 18-1 start is the fourth-best in Big 12 history and its 4-0 league beginning is the best since 2004-05.
- Senior guard Austin Johnson has 49 points in the last three games after posting 6.6 per contest this year prior to that string. Dating back to last season, OU is 20-1 record when he scores in double figures.
- Junior guard Tony Crocker has scored in double digits in nine of the last 12 outings. The backcourt of Crocker, Johnson and freshman Willie Warren are averaging 34.3 points since the start of league play.

**TEXAS (13-4, 2-1 Big 12)****Next Game:** Texas A&M (Jan. 24)**Recent Result:** Won at Texas Tech, 71-49**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/7-3

- Junior guard Justin Mason recorded his first career double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds at Texas Tech. He has 43 assists with just 11 turnovers in the last nine contests.
- Senior guard A.J. Abrams needs three 3-pointers to match the Big 12 career record (Jeff Boschee, KU, 1999-2002). Abrams is third in the conference with 51 field goals from beyond the arc this year.
- Abrams has scored 1,684 points in his career, one point from 15th place on the all-time Big 12 scoring list. He has totaled 33 points in his last two outings.
- Texas has won 13 straight conference home games, the longest Big 12 home win streak in school history. The overall league mark for consecutive conference victories is 21 (Kansas, 1997-99).

**TEXAS TECH (11-7, 1-2 Big 12)****Next Game:** at Missouri (Jan. 24)**Recent Result:** Defeated Colorado, 63-55**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-3/4-6

- Sophomore forward Mike Singletary led Texas Tech with 20 points and nine rebounds against Colorado. He scored the Red Raiders' final 12 points of the game.
- Sophomore guard John Roberson has 108 assists in 2008-09, surpassing his total (101) from all of last year. He has had five assists or more in all but two contests this season.
- Sophomore forward D'walyn Roberts has seven double-figure scoring efforts this season after having just one a year ago. He has 129 points, more than double his output from all of 2007-08 (55 points).
- Tech has won four of the last five and five of the past seven meetings in the series versus Missouri. The Red Raiders have won twice in Columbia, with the last victory there on Jan. 19, 2005 (78-62).



Non-Conference Success

The Big 12 has won at least 71 percent of its non-conference games in each of the past 10 seasons and in 10 of 12 years overall. **In 2008-09, the conference has the best winning percentage in league history after having the most wins a year ago. The number of wins in the regular season this year is also first, surpassing the total (133) from 2007-08.**
