HIS FAMILY SPENT NEARLY SEVENTY YEARS TRYING TO LEARN HIS FATE. FINALLY, THROUGH DNA TECHNOLOGY, MASTER SERGEANT CHINN'S REMAINS WERE IDENTIFIED AND RETURNED LAST JULY. POSITIONS ALONG THE 38TH PARALLEL, HIS BATTERY WAS TRAPPED IN A CONVERGENCE OF THREE BATTALIONS OF CHINESE ARMOR AND INFANTRY. HIS UNIT HAD BEEN ORDERED TO HOLD THEIR GROUND AT ALL COSTS, BUT ONCE THEY WERE SURROUNDED BY SUCH AN OVERWHELMING FORCE, HIS CONTINGENT REALIZED THAT THEIR UNDERSTRENGTHED COMPANY HAD ONLY ONE OPTION. HE WAS AMONG 40 U-S SOLDIERS TAKEN PRISONER WHILE ABOUT 25 OTHERS HAD BEEN KILLED IN ACTION THAT DAY. HUSKER FANS, PLEASE WELCOME U-S ARMY SERGEANT DENNIS PAVLIK TO MEMORIAL STADIUM.
