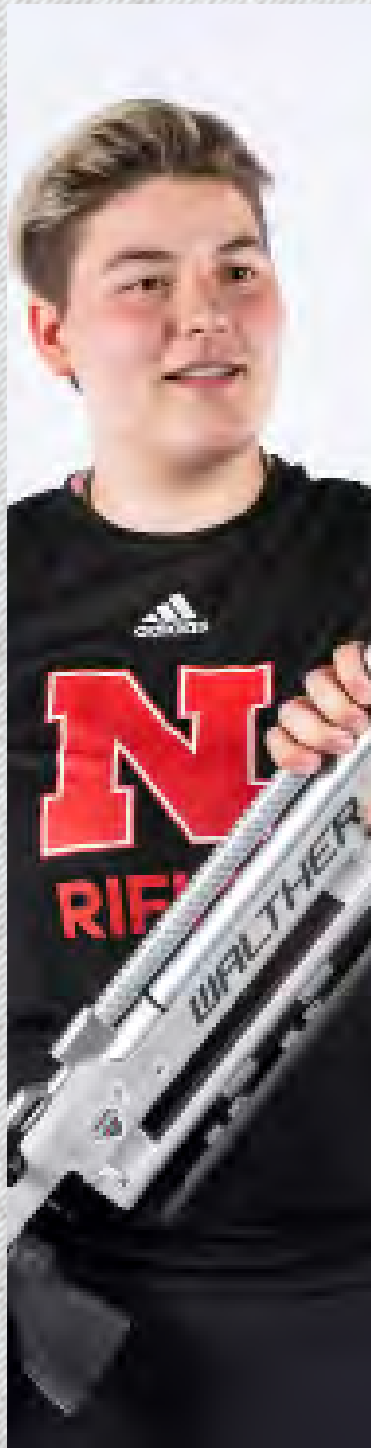

RIFLE GLOSSARY

Air rifle – A gun that uses a .177 caliber lead pellet propelled by compressed air instead of a gunpowder charge. The rifles can weigh up to 12.12 pounds.

Cleaned – A perfect target, in which the shooter hits a 10 on each of the 10 targets on the sheet for a score of 100. Can also be used to refer to a perfect match.

Front sight – The sight attached to the end of the barrel of the rifle, holding the front aperture.

Electronic targets – A target system that uses microphones and sound waves from the bullet or pellet going through the paper to send to a monitor on each point.

Iron sights – Sights that employ no magnification.

Kneeling – Shooting from a kneeling position with a sling and kneeling roll to support the position.

Off hand – The unsupported standing position.

Perfect match score – In air rifle and smallbore, 600 is perfect.

Prone – Shooting from a lying position.

Record shots – Also known as “shots for record,” those shots that are counted toward the match score, with “sighters” not included.

Relay – One group of shooters firing the match at the same time.

Shooting glove – A padded glove, with or without fingers, used to ensure the comfort of the non-dominant hand (i.e., a right-handed shooter wears

a glove on the left hand) as the shooter supports the rifle.

Shooting jacket – The jacket is made of leather or canvas and provides support and pads the shooter to minimize the effect of pulse and recoil. There are strict guidelines regarding the thickness.

Shooting boots – Boots designed for rifle shooting. They have the toe end of the sole and the heel cut flat for stability.

Shooting trousers – Snug canvas and/or leather pants usually worn over running tights or sweatpants. They often have padded reinforcements sewn on both knees and the seat to prevent the slipping of elbows and knees when firing from the kneeling position.

Sighting shots – Practice shots taken before going “for record.” Sighting shots are unlimited and may be fired before the beginning of each position. Once a position’s first record shot has been fired, no further sighting shots are permitted.

Sling – Adjustable strap with buckle adjustments and arm cuffs that provide stability. A sling is attached to the rifle and helps to support it in prone and kneeling positions.

Smallbore – A .22 caliber gun with an iron sight used in competition. It can be customized with special accessories and/or alterations (barrel length and style, stock, design, etc.) to fit the shooter’s needs and comforts.

SCORING SYSTEM

AIR RIFLE

Course of Fire – Competitors stand and shoot lead pellets from .177 caliber rifles at targets 10 meters away.

Rifle – Air rifles can be either air or gas powered and weigh up to 12.12 pounds by NCAA regulations.

Time – Competitors have 75 minutes to fire 60 shots from the standing position.

Perfect Match Score – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for air rifle.

SMALLBORE

Course of Fire – In smallbore three-position rifle, athletes fire .22 caliber rifles from the kneeling, prone, and standing (also called off hand) positions at targets 50 feet away.

Rifle – Smallbore rifles may not exceed 17.6 pounds by NCAA regulations.

Time – Competitors have 105 minutes for 20 record shots in the kneeling position, 20 record shots in the prone position and 20 record shots in the standing position.

Perfect Match Score – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for smallbore.

HUSKER LOOK TO BUILD ON 2021 NCAA FINISH

The Nebraska rifle team is excited about the prospects for the 2021-22 season. First, after having a limited schedule due to the pandemic, the Huskers will have a full schedule with 11 matches before the conference and NCAA qualifying meets.

Second, Mindy Miles begins her tenure in charge of the Husker program. A former All-American at TCU, Miles served as the Huskers' assistant coach for the past two seasons before taking over the program in May.

Finally, the Huskers return nearly its entire lineup from last season, a year where the Huskers finished sixth at the NCAA Championship. All five shooters who traveled to the NAAs are back, including returning All-Americans Emily Chermanie and Elena Flake.

With the benefit of a nearly full roster returning, Miles has been able to spend more time fine-tuning each shooter instead of having to learn a whole new roster.

"It was really nice coming into this season because I have worked with many of the girls last season and have the same knowledge base," Miles said. "It is more of fine-tuning everything and having to relearn everyone. We have been able to focus on the little things that make each shooter better."

Chermanie has been a strong competitor for the Huskers throughout her career. She is a five-time all-conference honoree, won the Great American Rifle Conference individual smallbore competition in 2020 and finished sixth at the NCAA smallbore finals in 2021. Last season, she paced the Huskers in smallbore (584.44), air rifle (591.44) and aggregate (1,175.88) and had a season-best aggregate of 1,183 at Kentucky. Chermanie has competed in over 50 matches as a Husker and tied the NU school record for air rifle in 2019-20 with a score of 597.

Flake was a staple for the Husker team last year. She ranked third in both smallbore and air rifle averages on the team and earned a first-place finish in air rifle at Army with a score of 596. She earned a score of 585 in smallbore last year against North Carolina State. She looks to regain her 2020 form which saw her earn second-team All-America honors from the National Rifle Association and the

Collegiate Rifle Coaches Association.

Kinga Aletto returns to the Husker lineup after competing in all ten meets in 2020-21 and has over 25 career appearances for the Huskers, making her a consistent contributor for her team. She averaged a 565.44 in smallbore and 584.70 in air rifle in 2021. She posted her season bests in both smallbore and air rifle against Kentucky last year, where she earned a 571 in smallbore and a 588 in air rifle. She tied that air rifle score at the NCAA Qualifier.

Cecelia Ossi settled into the rifle lineup well her freshman year, as she also competed in every meet in 2021. Her averages of 578.9 and 1,168.1 for smallbore and aggregate, respectively both ranked second on the team. She earned a first-place finish in smallbore against Air Force with a score of 584 and put up a season-high air rifle score of 594 against Army West Point. Ossi was selected by Miles as the team captain, and has the potential for a breakout season in 2021-22.

Cecelia worked incredibly hard over the summer," Miles said. "She has really improved, and I think her scores will jump this season."

Madelynn Erickson had a breakout freshman season, as she competed in every meet and averaged 590.90 in air rifle, which ranked second

on the team. Her season bests both came against Air Force, where she posted scores of 583 in smallbore and 594 in air rifle. She also earned a runner-up finish against Murray State in the NCAA Qualifier.

Incoming freshmen Payton Fry and Mackenzie Strauch also come in with impressive resumes. Strauch was a state champion in women's smallbore in 2021 and in air rifle in 2018, 19, and 21. Her club team also earned a Regional and State Championship in 2019. Fry was captain of the Arvada Rifle and Pistol Club for two years, which went to the 2019 NRA 3P Air State Competition. She is also a two-time Junior Olympics qualifier.

For Miles, she believes that the Husker can improve off of last year's sixth-place finish at NAAs and the schedule will help prepare NU for postseason competition.

"My expectation is to make the NCAA and do really well, but I'm looking forward to seeing the girls push themselves to a new level this year," Miles said. "I'm expecting them to dig their heels in and work hard this season. I think the girls are looking forward to getting right into it so that's really exciting."

Former five-time All-American and USA Shooting National Team member Mindy Miles is in her first season in charge of the Husker rifle team after being named head coach on May 24, 2021.

Miles is the seventh head coach to lead the Husker rifle program and takes over after serving as the assistant coach for the Huskers the last two years. She helped the Huskers qualify for the NCAA Championships both seasons, including a sixth-place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships in March.

Miles served as an assistant coach under Rachel Martin since 2019, as she played an instrumental part in the Huskers' accomplishments the past two years. In that time, Nebraska posted its four best teams scores since the current format began in 2004, including a school-record mark of 4,707 at the 2020 NCAA Qualifier.

Emily Cheramie earned three CRCA All-America awards in 2021 under Miles' tutelage, becoming the first shooter in school history to earn three All-America awards in the same season. Cheramie, who was named the 2021 Great America Rifle Conference Senior of the Year, was one of four Huskers to earn All-America honors the past two years, joining 2020 recipients Elena Flake, Hana Musser and Macey Way. The Huskers also finished third in the 2020 Great America Rifle Conference (GARC), while Cheramie and Way finished first and third, respectively, in the smallbore.

Off the range, NU had 14 CRCA Scholastic All-Americans in two seasons, including all six competitors on the Huskers' 2021 roster, and 29 spots on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll over the last three semesters. In May of 2021, the program took home the women's Herman Team GPA award, signifying the highest GPA for any Husker women's program on campus, posting a 3.744 GPA in the previous two semesters.

As a competitor at TCU, Miles was a three-time first-team NRA All-American in the air rifle (2016-18) and two-time NRA All-American in smallbore (2017-18). As a senior, she placed fifth in the air rifle and added a third-place NCAA finish in the smallbore, leading TCU to a third-place team finish at the NCAA Championships. Miles ranked second nationally in the air rifle (597.4) and seventh in smallbore (583.7) during her senior year. Miles led the nation in air rifle average (596.53) in 2016-17, including a score

of 599 at Alaska on Oct. 8. She finished fourth in the air rifle at the 2017 NCAA Championships with a score of 596. She was the NCAA air rifle runner-up as a sophomore in 2016, while posting a season average of 594. She added the 2016 NCAA Sportsmanship Award.

As a freshman in 2015, Miles became just the fifth shooter in NCAA history and the second at TCU to shoot a perfect 600, which came in the air rifle at the Patriot Rifle Conference Championships on Feb. 8 to help the Horned Frogs to the team title. Miles was a four-time Patriot Rifle Conference champion during her TCU career. She added a second perfect 600 against Nebraska and Memphis on Oct. 28, 2017.

Miles represented Team USA in competition dating back to the 2014 World Championships before retiring from competitive shooting in 2020. A two-time World Championships competitor for the United States (2014, 2018), she secured a quota spot for the United States at the Olympic Games in Tokyo by winning gold in the air rifle at the 2018 Championship of the Americas. Miles' score of 248.4 highlighted a 1-2 sweep in the event. Miles won a silver medal in the air rifle at the 2019 Pan American Games.

Originally from Weatherford, Texas, Miles earned a silver medal in air rifle and a bronze in smallbore at the 2013 Junior Olympics. She was a Junior World Cup finalist in Suhl, Germany in 2014.

Miles earned her bachelor's degree from TCU in May of 2018 after majoring in strategic communications with an emphasis in public relations and advertising and a minor in business. She was named the TCU Breakout Athlete of the Year in 2015 and was the TCU Pop Boone Award recipient in 2017.





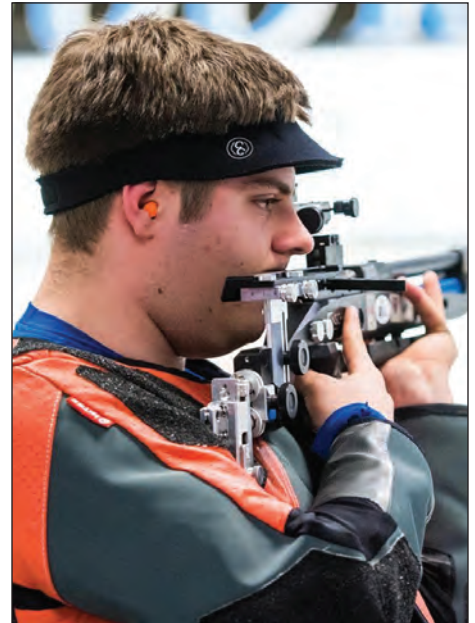
JT SCHNERING

Assistant Coach (First Year)

Former two-time All-American JT Schnering is in his first season as an assistant coach after joining the Husker program in July of 2021.

Schnering earned All-America honors for Alaska Fairbanks in both 2017-18 and 2018-19, as he helped the Nanooks qualify for the NCAA Championships in each of his four seasons at the school. He competed in 52 matches during his four-year career and posted 39 top-10 finishes as a competitor. His best season was as a senior in 2018-19, when he placed fourth in air rifle and earned second-team NRA All-America honors in the smallbore. He tallied 13 top-10 finishes that season, including a trio of first place showings, as was named team MVP and UAF's Male Athlete of the Year. In his career, he posted personal best scores of 597 in air rifle and 586 in smallbore.

Schnering earned a degree in psychology from UAF in 2019 and in sports and recreation business in 2020. He also helped out the UAF program while working on his second degree and coached club shooters at his home club in Fairbanks.

RONNIE GREEN

Chancellor

Green has served on the animal science faculties of Texas Tech University and Colorado State University, and as the national program leader for animal production research for the USDA's Agricultural Research Service and executive secretary of the White House's interagency working group on animal genomics within the National Science and Technology Council. Prior to returning to NU, Green served as a global executive for Pfizer Animal Health's animal genomics business.

Green has published 130 refereed publications and abstracts, nine book chapters and 56 invited symposia papers and has delivered invited presentations in 43 U.S. states and 21 countries around the world. He is a past-president of both the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS) and the National Block and Bridle Club and has served in a number of leadership positions for the U.S. Beef Improvement Federation, National Cattlemen's Beef Association, National Pork Board, the National Research Council of the National Academy of Sciences, the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities, and Alpha Gamma Rho national fraternity. He currently is a member of a number of boards including the Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors,

Neogen Corporation, and Supporters of Agricultural Research, and was recently named to the Presidential Forum of the NCAA representing the Big Ten Conference, and an inaugural member of the NCAA Division I Board Infractions Process Committee. He was named a fellow of ASAS in 2014 and a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science in 2015. In 2017 Dr. Green was honored with the American Society of Animal Science's Morrison Award, the highest international academic recognition for an animal scientist.

Ronnie and his wife Jane, a double UNL alumna, are the proud parents of four children – Justin, Nate, Kelli and Regan Green – all UNL graduates – and one granddaughter, Charlotte.

Dr. Ronnie D. Green is Chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Land-Grant and Big Ten institution, where he oversees an enrollment of over 25,000 students and 6,000 faculty and staff.

He received bachelor's and master's degrees in animal science from Virginia Tech and Colorado State University, respectively. His doctoral program was completed jointly at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the USDA-ARS U.S. Meat Animal Research Center in animal breeding and genetics.

Academy, his alma mater, where he served as superintendent. Under his leadership, the Naval Academy achieved a No. 1 national ranking and new records in student success and diversity. Carter previously was president of the U.S. Naval War College in Newport, R.I. A retired Vice Admiral with 38 years of service, Carter has logged more than 6,300 flying hours and holds the American record for carrier-arrested landings.

In his first year at the University of Nebraska – faced with the unexpected and unprecedented challenges presented by COVID-19 – Carter has led with a focus on the land-grant priorities of access and opportunity for students and families. He launched the Nebraska Promise, a financial aid program guaranteeing free tuition for low- and middle-income Nebraskans, and implemented a multi-year budget plan that included a two-year, across-the-board tuition freeze. The result was system-wide growth in enrollment, including record gains among underrepresented students.

Carter oversaw the awarding of a \$92 million federal contract for the university's National Strategic Research Institute, one of only 14 University-Affiliated Research Centers in the country conducting exclusive research for the Department of Defense. During Carter's tenure, the NU system has been ranked among the world's top 100 institutions for earning research patents, the Omaha campus was selected as the home for a new federal counterterrorism research center, the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources launched a new effort focused on rural vitality, and the medical center opened an education, training

and preparedness facility that positions Nebraska as the world leader in the fight against infectious disease.

Carter serves as the chair of the Daugherty Water for Food Global Institute's Board of Directors. He is a board member for the Greater Omaha Chamber of Commerce, the Nebraska State Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Naval Historical Foundation and the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation. Carter is also a member of the Aspen Institute's Higher Education Working Group and the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities' Council of Presidents. He is an ex-officio member on the board of the University of Nebraska Foundation, the philanthropic partner of the university system that has a \$1.7 billion endowment.

Carter earned his bachelor's degree in physics and oceanography from the U.S. Naval Academy, where he played hockey and served as team captain. He is a graduate of the Navy Fighter Weapons School (Top Gun) and holds educational credentials from the Navy Nuclear Power School, the U.S. Air Force Air War College, the Naval War College and the Armed Forces Staff College. Carter's military career includes service for the Carrier Strike Group Twelve, in which he commanded 20 ships, two nuclear-powered aircraft carriers, and two carrier wings that were deployed to Afghanistan and the Arabian Gulf.

The son of an English teacher, Carter was raised in the rural, one-high school town of Burrillville, R.I. He and his wife, Lynda, live in Lincoln and have two adult children, Brittany and Christopher.

Ted Carter became the eighth president of the University of Nebraska on Jan. 1, 2020.

As president, Carter leads a four-campus university system that enrolls nearly 52,000 students and employs 16,000 faculty and staff on campuses in Lincoln, Omaha and Kearney, plus academic divisions and research and extension centers across the state. He serves as chief spokesman and chief executive officer for the system, which operates on a \$2.8 billion annual budget and includes a flagship Big Ten institution, a world-renowned academic health sciences center, Division I athletics programs, and preeminent institutes focused on water and agriculture, national security and defense, infectious disease and early childhood education.

Carter brought with him a distinguished record in education, partnerships and military service, having come to Nebraska from the U.S. Naval

League for all of the department's then-Division II programs. His vision for UNO's reclassifying teams was demonstrated even before the four-year transition period had ended. The Omaha baseball team won back-to-back Summit League regular-season championships in 2013 and 2014, while the men's basketball team made its first Division I postseason appearance in 2014 with a berth in the CollegelInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

During UNO's time in the Division I ranks under Alberts tenure, the Mavericks had six teams and four student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Tournament, including hockey advancing to the Frozen Four in 2015 and men's soccer reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament in the spring of 2021. He also expanded opportunities, adding men's golf and men's soccer in 2011 and Omaha will begin a men's swimming and diving program in 2021-22.

Throughout his tenure in Omaha, Alberts was focused on enhancing the student-athlete experience, including the construction and staffing of the Hamilton Academic Excellence Room and the development of the Ethel S. Abbott Student-Athlete Development Wing. Those efforts paid off in Nebraska-Omaha student-athletes posting consistent collective semester grade point averages above 3.3 for 18 consecutive semesters, including at least a 3.5 in each of his final three semesters.

The facilities around Omaha Athletics received a major uplift during his tenure. Maverick Park opened in March of 2021 to rave reviews as the home to the Mavericks' baseball and softball

programs. Funding for the complex, which includes a 1,500-seat baseball facility and a 650-seat softball facility, were raised privately and provided both programs a permanent on-campus home for the first time.

Another crowning achievement was the opening of Baxter Arena in 2015. Alberts directed efforts to secure community support and funding to build the on-campus arena, which allowed the nationally prominent hockey program to play on campus and also serve as the home of the men's and women's basketball and volleyball programs. Caniglia Field underwent renovations in 2012, making it one of the finest collegiate soccer facilities in the country, highlighted by a FIFA 2-star rated playing surface and one of the largest LED videoboards in a soccer-only college facility.

Alberts' work on behalf of hockey, UNO's established Division I sport, also paid dividends. He successfully guided the Mavericks into the new National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The following year, Omaha reached the 2015 NCAA Frozen Four.

In addition, Alberts and his team led Omaha Athletics into a partnership with Learfield, a national leader in the marketing of collegiate athletics, and developed Omaha Sports Properties. As the exclusive corporate sponsorship sales unit for UNO Athletics, Omaha Sports Properties further enhanced revenue and increased brand prominence locally, regionally and nationally.

As part of UNO's reclassification to Division I, Alberts oversaw the rebranding of UNO athletics with new primary and secondary logos and a greater focus on strengthening the Maverick brand both regionally and nationally.

As a student-athlete, Alberts was an All-American on and off the football field as a Husker Blackshirt. He was Nebraska's first Butkus Award winner in 1993, helping Coach Tom Osborne's Huskers to an undefeated regular season and an Orange Bowl appearance against Florida State. A first-team All-American by every major publication in 1993, he was also the Football News National Defensive Player of the Year, the Big Eight Male Athlete of the Year, and the Big Eight Defensive Player of the Year. His No. 34 jersey was retired at the 1994 Red-White Spring Game. In 2015, he was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame.

Off the field, Alberts earned the NCAA's highest honor, The Today's Top Six Award. A three-time academic All-Big Eight honoree, he was a CoSIDA Academic All-American in 1993. He graduated from Nebraska before his senior season.

Alberts was the fifth pick in the 1994 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts and played for the Colts until 1996. Following his NFL career, he served as an analyst on college and professional football games for major national networks, including ESPN, CNN/SI and CBS Sports Network.

Alberts and his wife Angela have three children – Chase, Ashtynne and Breanna.

A veteran administrator and College Football Hall of Famer, Trev Alberts was named Vice Chancellor for Athletics at the University of Nebraska on July 14, 2021. Alberts returned to his alma mater after spending 12 years at Nebraska-Omaha, guiding the program through a successful transition to the Division I level.

Alberts' tenure leading UNO athletics was marked by successes in competition and in academics; by transitioning the university's athletic programs to NCAA Division I in 2011; and by establishing new homes for many UNO athletics teams, including Baxter Arena, the Maverick Park baseball/softball complex and the soccer pitch at Caniglia Field.

Alberts took the bold step in announcing that Omaha would reclassify from Division II to Division I in all sports in 2011 and simultaneously securing conference affiliation with the Summit

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to Chancellor Ronnie Green and consults with the Athletic Director. The representative splits academic year time equally between academic responsibilities and faculty representative duties.

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18.

In August 2018, Fuess was named director of the university's cross-disciplinary master's degree program that offers a specialization in intercollegiate athletics administration. The program - which has been completed by 48 Huskers - is built on MBA coursework, allowing students to earn hands-on experiences through Nebraska Athletics, industry professionals, other universities and alumni.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests revolve around issues of economics, primarily in labor, collegiate athletics and Japan.

EMILY CHERAMIE

Fifth Year Georgetown, Ky. (Lexington Catholic)

SENIOR (2020-21)

Emily Cheramie (pronounced Cher-a-me) put together one of the finest seasons in program history in 2020-21. She earned All-America awards in the smallbore (second team), air rifle (honorable mention) and the aggregate (third team), becoming the first shooter in school history to earn All-America honors in all three disciplines. Cheramie was just the fifth shooter to earn multiple All-America certificates in the same season. On the year, she paced the Huskers in smallbore (584.44), air rifle (591.44) and aggregate (1175.88) and qualified for the NCAA Finals in smallbore, where she finished sixth. The Great America Rifle Conference Senior of the Year and first-team all-conference pick in smallbore, she won three events and finished second six times in 16 regular-season events. She posted an aggregate of 1,180 or better on two occasions, including a 1,183 at Kentucky and a 1,181 at the NCAA qualifier. At Kentucky, Cheramie nearly tied her own school record in the air rifle with a 596, while her performance at the NCAA qualifier featured a career-high mark of 590 in smallbore. Cheramie also was recognized for her work in the community, where she was named one of four winners among all Husker senior student-athletes for the Heart and Soul Award and nabbed a spot on the Tom Osborne Citizenship team for the fourth straight year. Cheramie also earned a Nebraska Gold Academic Medallion, given to student-athletes who posted GPAs between 3.75 and 4.00 during the previous academic year.

JUNIOR (2019-20)

Cheramie competed in all 14 matches in both smallbore and air rifle for Nebraska in 2019-20. She helped the Huskers to a fourth-place finish at the GARC Championships while claiming the individual smallbore title. While the Huskers didn't compete at NCAAAs due to the Coronavirus pandemic, Cheramie helped the team qualify for the championships for the first time since 2018. Cheramie set career bests in smallbore with a 588 and air rifle with a school-record 597. Cheramie also earned all-GARC honors in smallbore for her efforts. Off the range, Cheramie was an Academic All-Big Ten pick, a member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll and earned a Nebraska Bronze Academic Medallion. In the community, Cheramie was named to the Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award and earned a spot on the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

SOPHOMORE (2018-19)

Cheramie played a key role for the Huskers. She competed in 15 matches over the course of her sophomore season, firing team-high scores on multiple occasions. By the conclusion of the season, Cheramie had increased her career averages in both smallbore (578.13) and air rifle (585.43). In the match against Coast Guard she tied her own personal best in smallbore (585) for the fourth time. She set a new career-high mark of 593 in air rifle against Memphis.

Cheramie earned honorable mention All-

GARC honors in both smallbore and combined guns at the annual Conference awards banquet. She was also counted on as a leader off the range as a member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

FRESHMAN (2017-18)

Cheramie made an immediate impact as one of three freshmen in 2017-18. She led the team with an average smallbore score of 577.73 for the season. Cheramie was honored with a place on the second-team all-conference smallbore team at the GARC awards banquet. Cheramie also posted air rifle scores in 12 matches, averaging 582.69 over the course of the season.

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Cheramie competed for the Bluegrass Rifle Club under Head Coach Ted Carr, who is a former Kentucky Wildcat shooter. Carr has coached a number of All-Americans, including UK shooter Hanna Carr. Cheramie was a four-time National Junior Olympic Qualifier. She also won the 4-H state championship in air rifle three times and claimed the 4-H state title twice in both precision smallbore and precision air rifle. Additionally, she was an 11-time 4-H district champion and a four-time 4-H district runner-up.

Cheramie attended Lexington Catholic High School where she was a star in the classroom and in the community. She served as a Student Ambassador and was a member of the National Honor Society, Beta Club and Student Council. In 2017, she earned the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Kentucky Academic Achievement Award and U.S. Army Reserve Spirit of Victory National Scholar-Athlete Award. Additionally, she was a member of the track and field team for three years before getting injured. She threw the shot put and discus and advanced to the KHSAA 2A State Outdoor Championships as a sophomore in the discus and the KHSAA 2A State Indoor Championships as a junior in the shot put. As a senior, she coached the boys throwing team and helped them to a second-place regional finish.

In the community, Aletto earned a spot on the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

FRESHMAN (2018-19)

As one of three freshmen in 2018-19, Aletto competed for regular action as the season progressed. She recorded highs of 576 and 587 in smallbore and air rifle, respectively. Aletto averaged 567.25 in smallbore and 581.88 in air rifle over the course of the 2018-19 season. She contributed in match action a total of nine times in each discipline and was counted as a squadded member six times, including the GARC Championships. Aletto also made an impact off the range by earning CRCA Scholastic All-American recognition. She was also a member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

Elena Flake was a mainstay in the Husker lineup, competing in all 10 matches and was one of three NU athletes to be in the lineup all season. Flake ranked third on the team in both smallbore (577.60) and air rifle (589.50) average. She had nine top-six finishes on the year, including a first-place performance in air rifle at Army with a season-best score of 596. She also turned in a strong performance in NU's win over Air Force, finishing second in air rifle (595) and fifth in smallbore (579). Her best smallbore effort of 2021 came against North Carolina State when she finished second with a season-best score of 585. Flake was selected for the Tom Osborne Citizenship team for her work in the community and captured a Silver Academic Medallion, signifying a GPA of at least 3.50 for the previous two semesters.

SOPHOMORE (2019-20)

Flake had a breakthrough sophomore season competing in every match for the Huskers in both smallbore and air rifle. second-team honors in both smallbore and air rifle from the NRA and was named a third-team honoree in combined disciplines from the CRCA. Off the range, Flake earned a spot on the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team for her leadership and community service.

Flake trained for one year at the National Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., under Coach Gregory Shaner. While a member of the National Training Center Shooting Club, Flake was a member of the Junior Air Rifle Precision offhand team that won the 2018 National Championships and set a Junior National Record. She also competed at the National Junior Olympics in 2017 and 2018.

Flake graduated from Oak Harbor High School in Oak Harbor, Wash. She competed for the S^3 shooting club under head coach LCDR (R) Dave Goodman. During her senior year she went undefeated in JROTC state competition and was the National Navy JROTC Precision Air Rifle Champion.

Cecelia Ossi was one of three Huskers to compete in every meet in 2021. She ranked second on the team in both smallbore (578.9), and aggregate (1168.1) and was fourth in air rifle (589.2), as Nebraska finished sixth at the NCAA Championships. She posted top-six finishes in 11 of 16 events during the regular season, including a first-place finish in smallbore against Air Force (584) and a pair of second-place showings. Ossi finished second in the smallbore at Ohio State (579) and second in the air rifle at Army West Point with a season-best mark of 594. She also tied that mark at the Great American Rifle Conference meet. Ossi earned a spot on the Tom Osborne Citizenship team for her contributions in the Lincoln community.

NU FINISHES SIXTH AT NCAA'S: 2020-21 RECAP



The 2020-21 Nebraska rifle season was a historic one. Following a year where the NCAA Championships were canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Huskers made another run to return to the NCAA Championships.

The Huskers faced an abbreviated schedule, but Head Coach Rachel Martin and the team earned a second straight bid to the NAAs. The team took sixth place, matching the program's best showing since 2015.

At the NCAA Championships, NU was led in the smallbore by Emily Cheramie, who qualified for the NCAA Finals after placing sixth in the team competition. Cheramie finished sixth in the event, as the Huskers finished the first day in sixth place. Elena Flake finished 25th with a score of 580, while freshman Madelynn Erickson placed 28th with a 579, marking her second-highest score of 2021. Freshman Cecelia Ossi rounded out the Huskers' scoring lineup with a 572.

The following day, it was a pair of freshmen who helped NU clinch a sixth place finish as Ossi and Erickson placed 17th and 24th respectively, followed by junior Elena Flake (33rd) and Kinga Aletto (34th). The Huskers totaled a team score of 4,676, missing a top-five finish by six points.

The NCAA Championship showing capped a strong year by Nebraska rifle on the range and in the classroom. In May, the program took home the women's Herman Team GPA Award for the highest grade-point average among the female teams on the Nebraska campus. The team posted a 3.744 GPA over the previous two semesters on its way to capturing its first Herman GPA award since 2009. The team GPA was the

second-highest of any NU program – male or female - dating back to the first Herman Team GPA award in 1995. All seven members of the 2021 squad also found their way onto the Tom Osborne Citizenship team for their work in the community.

Cheramie became the first shooter in school history to earn three All-America certificates in a single-season, as the Collegiate Rifle Coaches Association (CRCA) announced its 2021 All-America teams. She collected All-America awards in smallbore (second team), air rifle (honorable mention) and aggregate (third team), as she led the Huskers in smallbore (584.44), air rifle (591.44) and aggregate (1,175.88) during the 2020-21 season. She became the fifth shooter in school history to earn multiple All-America awards. Cheramie was also tabbed as the Great American Rifle Conference Senior of the Year in 2021.

The Huskers began their season with a 4,670-4,658 win at Ohio State. The Huskers swept the top three spots in smallbore with Cheramie (581), Ossi (579) and Flake (578). The next day, the Huskers competed against Ole Miss. The Huskers tied the Rebels in smallbore but were edged out in the air rifle, as Ole Miss squeaked out a 4,677-4,667 victory.

Following their loss to Ole Miss, Nebraska earned two home wins against No. 6 Air Force at the NU Rifle Range. On the first day, Cheramie placed first in air rifle (593) and earned runner-up honors in smallbore (580). The following day, the Huskers put together their best performance of the season with a 4,699-4,676 victory. NU

claimed four of the top six spots in each event, as Ossi won the smallbore with a score of 584, while Flake place second in the air rifle.

The Huskers hit the road for a pair of matches against top-ranked Kentucky and NC State. Against the loss to the Wildcats, the Huskers put together another strong score with a combined total of 4,695. Cheramie nearly broke the school record with a score of 596 in the air rifle, while Ossi and Aletto earned season highs in the Air Rifle with scores of 590 and 588, respectively.

Two days later, the Huskers bounced back against North Carolina State, winning 6,494-4,676. Cheramie and Flake swept the top two spots in smallbore, while Cheramie and Flake placed second and third, respectively, in air rifle.

Following their canceled match against Akron, Nebraska traveled out to New York to take on Army West Point. Despite Elena Flake and Cecelia Ossi taking the top two spots in the air rifle, Army beat the Huskers with a score of 4,689-4,677.

The Huskers then looked to earn a spot at the NCAA Championships by taking on Memphis in the NCAA Qualifier. NU's score of 4,685 clinched a return to the postseason for the Huskers. Cheramie was once again a huge performer in this match, scoring 590 in the smallbore and 592 in the air rifle, marking the first time she had hit 590 in both events. Erickson led NU in the air rifle, placing second with a score of 592.

The performance clinched a NCAA berth, as NU qualified for the 18th time since the program began during the 1998-99 season and the ninth time in the past 10 seasons.

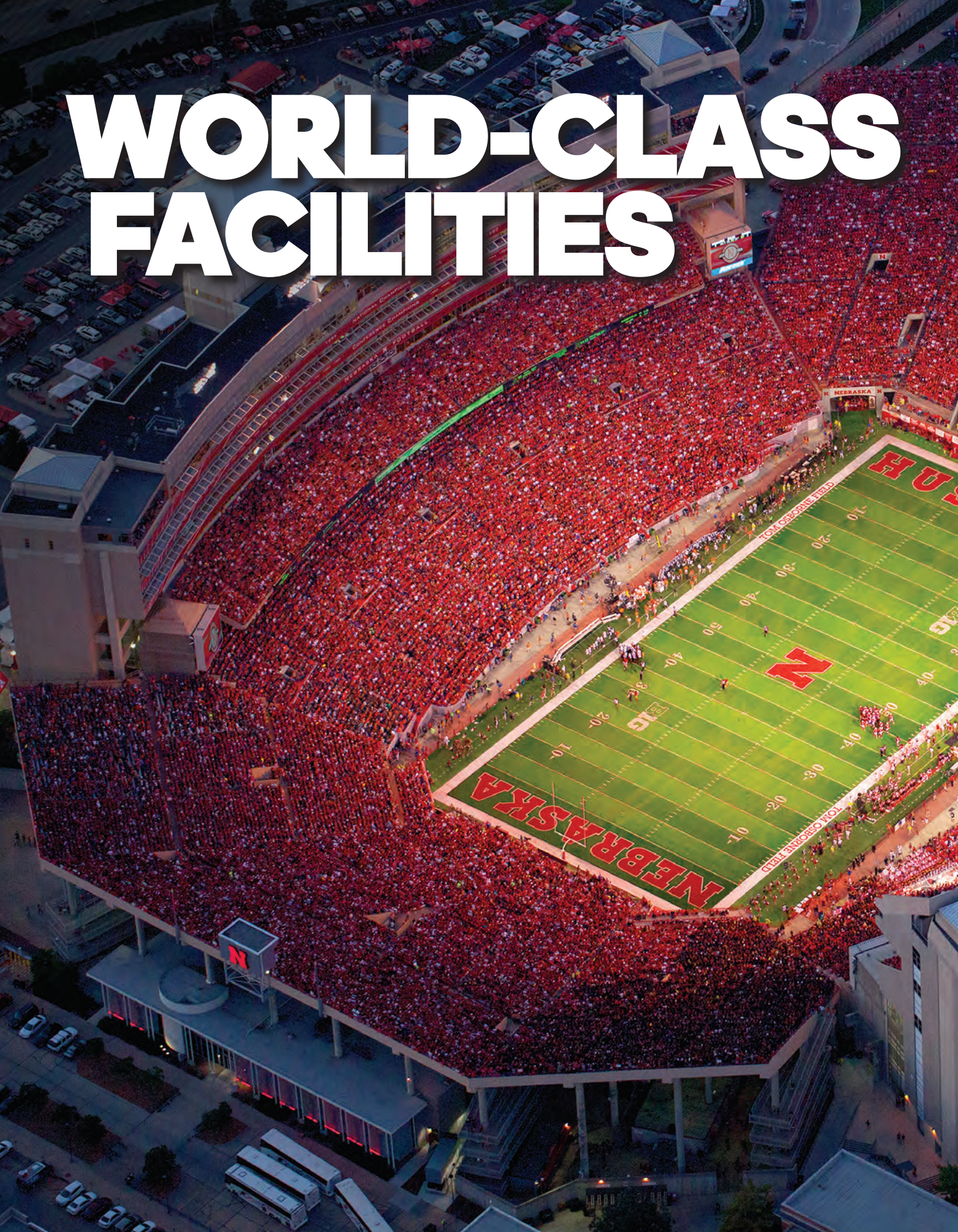

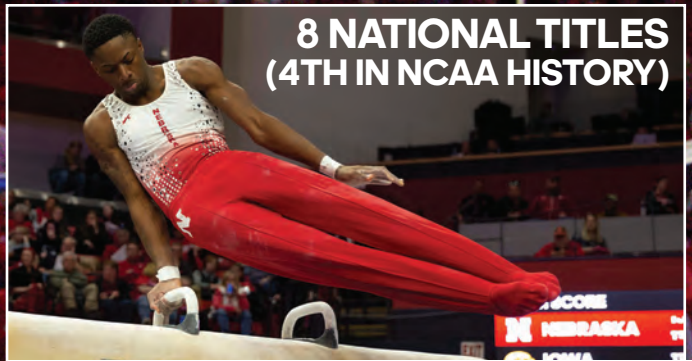

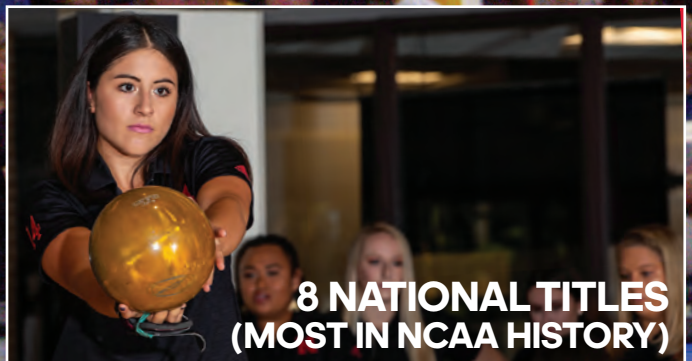

ACADEMIC COUNSELING

Eight academic counselors, three learning specialists, two assistant academic counselors and one administrative assistant are in place to monitor daily academic progress, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, unlimited tutorial support from approximately 75-100 tutors on staff is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. Tutorial support is provided both in-person and virtually. Nebraska's tutorial program is certified as a model tutoring program by the College Reading and Learning Association.

STUDY HALL

Student-athletes attend a supervised, flex-time study hall within the Herman Student Life Complex that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student-athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week as determined by their academic counselor and/or coach. Additional performance-based or tutor-based study hall also may be determined by the academic counselor.

MENTORING

Academic staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes. The student-athletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor, or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a consulting neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators, and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across campus.

PERSONAL COUNSELING

Student-athletes will find a supportive and caring environment at Nebraska. Transitional issues, stress management, time management, academic focus and problem resolution are all addressed in a proactive manner throughout the year. If necessary, counseling referrals are also made to designated practitioners.

COMPUTER RESOURCES

All student-athletes are provided the opportunity to have a laptop for use during their academic career at Nebraska. The Herman Student Life Complex has printers and desktop computers available for student-athletes to use in the facility.

Nebraska is a leader in providing all the resources and support necessary for student-athletes to become successful in Academics, Athletics and Life. Nebraska will continue to strategically plan for avenues to strengthen the resources to support more than 600 Husker student-athletes across 24 sports.

UNMATCHED SUPPORT

Nebraska has a history of providing unmatched benefits and support to student-athletes. In 2014, a change in NCAA governance and subsequent legislation paved the way for Nebraska to enhance the benefits for student-athletes. A few examples of these enhanced benefits are:

- All scholarship student-athletes have their scholarship calculated based on the full cost of attendance.
- Each student-athlete is offered a free Apple MacBook Air laptop computer to enhance their learning opportunities.
- Nebraska has increased resources and support in all academic and performance related areas including but not limited to Academic Services, Life Skills, Athletic Medicine, Athletic Training, Strength and Conditioning, Nebraska Athletic Performance Laboratory, Nutrition and Sports Analytics.
- As part of Nebraska's innovative Post-Eligibility Opportunity (PEO) program, every student-athlete graduate who has exhausted their athletic eligibility has the opportunity to pursue (with Nebraska support) an internship, participate in a study abroad program or attend graduate school within the University of Nebraska system.

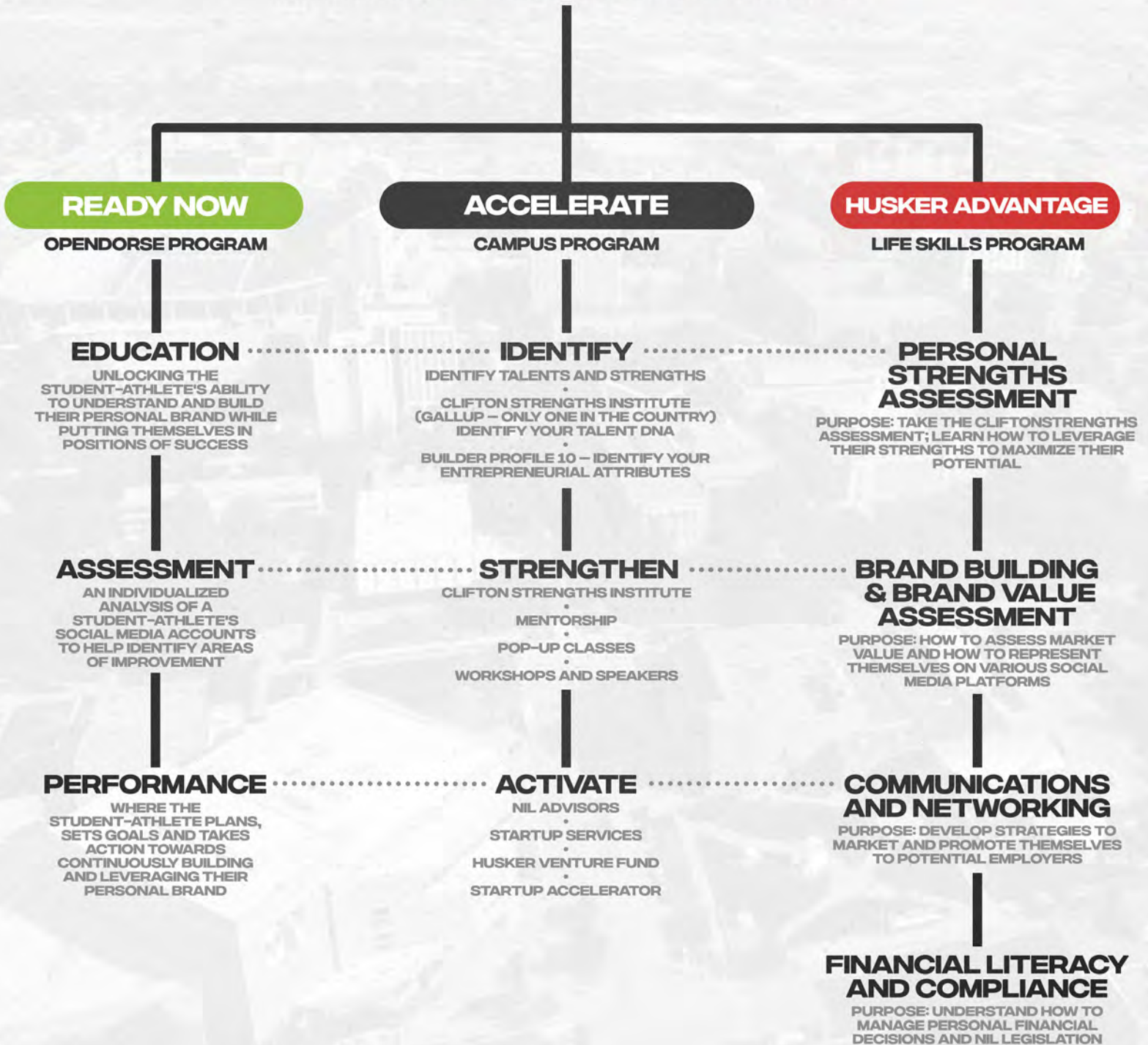
#NILBRASKA

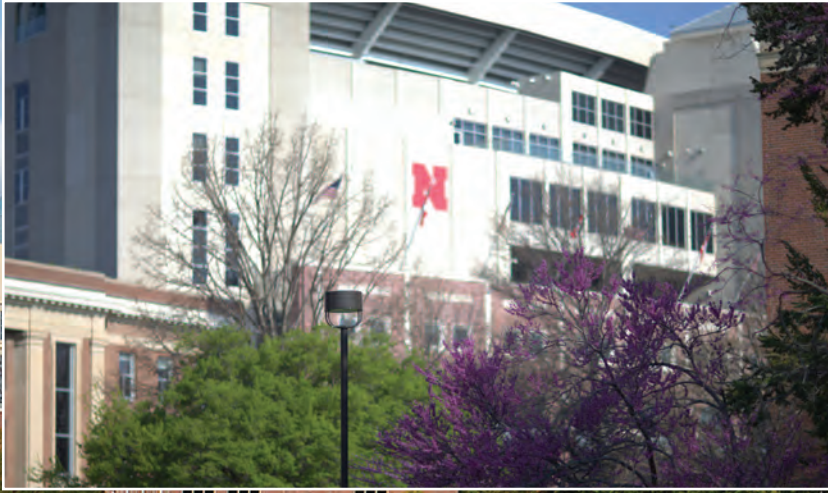

THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

Chartered in Lincoln by the Nebraska Legislature in 1869, the University of Nebraska was expanded in 1968 into a university system now comprising four campuses under the guidance of a Board of Regents and a central administration. The flagship University of Nebraska-Lincoln is an educational institution of international stature. Nebraska is classified within the Carnegie "R1: Doctoral Universities – Highest Research Activity" category. Nebraska is also a land-grant university and a member of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities. The university is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.

As a member of the Big Ten, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln is a member of the Big Ten Academic Alliance (BTAA), formerly the Committee on Institutional Cooperation, which is the academic consortium of the universities in the Big Ten Conference.
