NOTES: Richardson of Texas A&M enjoyed the best start, with King close behind out of the blocks. At 50 meters, King held a full stride lead and held off teammate Calvin Smith the last 20 meters. The 1-2 finish by King and Smith is a first such 1-2 placing in the NCAA 100 since 1970 when California's Eddie Hart and Isaac Curtis turned the trick.

QUOTES: King: "I had a good start. I got out and knew I had to run hard because Calvin (Smith) was pushing me. We wanted to go 1-2 together and it really didn't matter who won. I took the lead at 50 meters and just pushed as hard as I could. We have been close like this several times this year.

Smith: "I didn't have a very good start and that's what hurt me. I was finishing strong, but it came too late. We went 1-2 and that's the most important thing."

KERRY ZIMMERMAN, INDIANA/Decathlon Champion:

(Chance of winning going in) "I would say lower than average, below 50 percent. I haven't been training an awful lot because I'm a long jumper, high jumper for Indiana and in our conference meet I has to score in those. So a lot of training went toward that. I haven't put in mile one on the road for two weeks. I expect PRs in every event (second day) because my second day is not really up to power. I really relaxed in the hurdles and ran a good PR there, which I think was one of the keys to the whole thing. I knew if I could throw 200 in the javelin, and if Ramos didn't, it would be really close. I knew we were in position to win. I've always said I never had the incentive to run the 1500 meters hard because I really never had to do it. In this one I really had to stick with Ramos and I ran as hard as I could. In two weeks I haven't done anything at all. I haven't picked up the javelin in two months because of my elbow, but that's kind of a natural thing. It's like swimming, once you do it you don't forget. If I don't put ice on it, it will be really sore. The hurdles were the key to the whole thing because that was a big PR. I was really happy I got that. Now I am going to go home and put in a good three weeks of long jump training because I think I am a good long jumper. Then I'm going to the TAC meet in Indianapolis and long jump there. I'm going to skip the TAC meet in Los Angeles, the

On Leslie Brooks' lead off leg, his leg grabbed at the 200 mark and he almost had to stop, but that's the kind of guy he is. He's a 45 second quarter miler and he had a 48.2 tonight, but that 48.2 helped us win the championship."

RICHARD OLSEN (SEU) (Two-time NCAA Champion): "(Abour the circle) It's slow, but it's the same for everybody. I've thrown on electrical before. It's just a scapegoat for everybody that doesn't throw good. I don't think the lengths will be what they were last year. I think they will be five or six feet shorter because of the slow circle. But this is a major meet and you can never tell.

(About why his distance has gone from the 240s to the 220s). "I had an operation on my knee about a year and a half ago. It's fine, but there are several exercises that I cannot do. I can't do any squats or any jumping. I weigh about 215 now, down from about 240 a couple of years ago. I went for four months on a vegetarian diet. I got all the way down to 206 pounds. I went to see a specialist about three weeks ago and started eating red meat again. The specialist said some body types need red meat. I guess I'm one of them. But I feel strong. In fact, I feel strong enough to throw 80 meters (262 feet, 5 inches). The technique is what's messing me up. When I lost the weight, small things changed around. I guess it's mainly mental - the adjustments I had to make. I like to gamble. I wanted to do better than 240 feet. I wanted to start throwing 270 or 280 and am willing to try a few things differently.

ROBERT WEIR (who has the best collegiate throw this year). "It's a slow surface, but if I stay in the circle I'll be okay. I'm going to need to practice throwing tonight for 15 to 20 minutes. It's just a matter of getting confidence. If I do the right things, I hope the right results will come (About Olsen). He's been working on his own, separately. I haven't seen him too much lately. Obviously, this title means a lot to him, but it means a lot toother people (Asked whether he thinks about finishing second two years in a row) "Yes."

QUOTES FROM 1600 METER RELAY

David Walker of TCU: "I felt like I was in good shape when I got the baton.

My teammates gave it to me right where we needed to be. I didn't feel any pressure. I knew that they were back there, but I just ran relaxed. It was almost like I was running on my own. This wind is beautiful. I was disappointed after we didn't win the 400 relay, but we hung together and came back in the 1600. I've had some big things happen to me recently like winning the SAC and graduating from college, but this is the best feeling I've ever had."

Dean Crouser, Oregon (Defending cleapion in discus & shot put)

Crouser threw 205-4 in discus qualifying Wed. night.

"I think I have a shot at the meet record (210-0). I'm rested and feel good. The other night, I came out here and had the best workout of my life. I had five of five throws over 210 just by relaxing. Robert Weir (SNU) came over and told me to just slow down and relax. I did, and it felt great. I'm not nervous at all, and it's the first time in a big meet I have felt like this. It doesn't look like anybody is going to throw real far. Rick Never of Houston will probably be my main competition. He's geared up to do well at home.

(on competing in both discus and shot put): "At first the double was putting pressure on me. Now I'm just taking each individual event and not worrying about the double. I feel good in the shot put. Wearing Levis in warmups I was throwing 65 to 67 feet. Tonight was the first time I had met Michael Carter (two-time NCAA shot put champion from SNI). He's a great athlete. He has taken the last two weeks off and is really shooting for his one."

Bert Cameron, Texas-El Paso (NCAA 400 meters champion in 1980 and 1981, second in 1982) had fastest qualifying time of 45.27.

[&]quot;When I saw that I was in lane eight I knew I would have to go out hard. You have to win your heat to be assured of making the finals, and that was my goal. I just wanted to play it safe and win my heat.

[&]quot;I couldn't sleep last night I was so worried. In the finals I want to go out hard the first 110. If I do and it feels smooth, I know I can win. But you can't make any mistakes. Anybody in the finals is capable of winning. I'm sure I'll run under 45.0 in the finals. Lots of us will."

PATSY WALKER, HOUSTON/3rd

"Yeah, I am, because it is a personal best and that's what I came to the meet with (Are you happy with your efforts?). I thought everything was real solid except the long jump. That was a disappointment. I had some problems with my run, it just didn't go as far as expected, I don't think. I had a personal best in the javelin. The 800 was a good race, that's only the second 800 I've run all year. This is the second time this year (I've run the heptathlon). I've got four more to go this summer. It's really the beginning of the season for me because we run all the way through August.

JACKIE JOYNER, UCLA/1st

"I really enjoy playing basketball, but my first love is track and with the Olympics coming up you have one chance, I have one chance. This is the big chance for me to go to it and and not to put it off for the next four years. That's why I decided to give up basketball for that one year (next year). I know I'm in better condition than a 2:15 800. The first lap was too slow (in the 800). Before the 800, the final event, Bobby was saying it's a challenge, if we get it we get it, if we don't, just settle for what we get and we'll go on to the next day, next event, next heptathlon meket, knowing that it's there: I haven't really decided (plans this summer), I know I want to make the World Championship team to go to Helsinki, and whatever else comes up, and work on my long jump. I'm going in there to compete for myself to do my best in each event. But I won't go in there saying I've got to beat Jane Fredricks, because I think I would mess up, going in there just concentrating on Jane. Then someone else would slip in there and beat both of us.
