MATCH PREVIEW

- The Nebraska volleyball team begins its 2023 campaign with the annual Red-White Scrimmage on Saturday, Aug. 19 at 6 p.m. at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.
- The match will be streamed online at B1G+ (BigTenPlus.com, subscription required). The Huskers Radio Network will broadcast all the action on their radio affiliates, including 107.3 FM in Lincoln and AM 590 in Omaha. A live audio stream will be provided at Huskers.com and on the Huskers app. John Baylor is in his 30th season doing play-by-play for the Husker volleyball program. Lauren (Cook) West, a former All-America setter for the Huskers, will provide color commentary.
- Prior to the match, the Huskers will have a Volleyball Fan Day on Saturday from 10 a.m. until Noon on the Devaney Center concourse. The Husker players and coaches will sign autographs for two hours before turning their attention to preparing for the scrimmage.
- For Fan Day, one item per person may be signed. Posters for the 2023 season will be available at the autograph tables. In an effort to get all fans through the line, no pictures will be permitted with the coaches and players. Fans will use only the North doors to enter the building. The North doors will open right at 10 a.m. Parking will be available in Lots 58 and 60. Concessions will be open for fans to purchase drinks or candy, and the Huskers Store on the concourse will be open for fans to shop.

- For the Red-White Scrimmage only, all lots are first-come, first-served public parking for \$8. Fans can purchase parking passes in advance through UNL Parking & Transit Services.

HUSKERS RANKED NO. 5 IN AVCA PRESEASON POLL

- Nebraska is ranked in a tie for fifth in the preseason AVCA Coaches Poll.
- The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 543 times, which is also the most in NCAA history.
- Nebraska has appeared in all 604 AVCA Coaches Polls it has been eligible for since it was established in 1982. Nebraska is the only program to be ranked in every eligible poll all-time.
- Nebraska's 604 consecutive weeks of being ranked is the longest active streak in Division I for any sport, leading Connecticut women's basketball and North Carolina women's soccer.
- Nebraska has been ranked No. 1 in 102 all-time polls, the most in NCAA history.

AVCA HALL OF FAMER JOHN COOK IN 24TH SEASON AT NEBRASKA

- Nebraska head coach John Cook is in his 24th season as the Nebraska volleyball head coach in 2023. He has led the Huskers to four national championships, 10 final fours, 12 conference championships and 21 top-10 final rankings since 2000.
- Cook has 817 career wins and is one of the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA history. Since taking over the program in 2000, Cook has led the Huskers to a nation-leading .870 win percentage (656-98).
- Under Cook, the Huskers have achieved 64 AVCA All-Americans and 20 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, both among the best in the nation. He is a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, earning the prestigious honor in 2000 and 2005, and a seven-time conference coach of the year, including Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016 and 2017, his first and second Big Ten honors with the Huskers in their Big Ten era (2011-present).
- Cook is one of only two active coaches and one of six all-time to be a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year and was honored in 2008 by USA Volleyball, receiving its All-Time Great Coach Award.
- Cook was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in 2017, joining former Husker volleyball coach Terry Pettit in the hall.

Huskers Add Transfer Merritt Beason

The Nebraska volleyball program announced the addition of Florida transfer Merritt Beason on Dec. 23. Beason, a 6-3 opposite hitter, joined the Huskers in January after playing the last two seasons at Florida, where she was an All-SEC and AVCA All-Southeast Region honoree in 2022, as well as an All-SEC Freshman Team selection in 2021.

As a sophomore at Florida in 2022, Beason helped the Gators win a share of the SEC Championship by averaging 3.35 kills per set with a .261 hitting percentage. She had double-digit kills in 21 of 28 matches played and had a career-best 21 kills with eight digs, three aces and a pair of blocks in a five-set win at Wisconsin in September. Beason also led the Gators with 38 service aces on the season – ranking third in the SEC - and contributed 1.92 digs per set and 0.88 blocks per set. She led the Gators in kills and aces per set and was second in digs and third in blocks. Beason received All-America honorable mention by VolleyballMag.com following the season after captaining the Gators to an NCAA regional semifinal appearance.

Beason was named the MVP of the 2022 Pan American Cup as the U.S. Women's U21 National Team won gold last June in La Paz, Mexico. Beason played alongside current Huskers Lexi Rodriguez and Bekka Allick on the team. In the 3-1 championship win over Argentina, Beason had a team-high 14 kills and three blocks, while Allick had 12 kills and two blocks and Rodriguez had 24 digs.

Volleyball Day in Nebraska Coming Aug. 30

The Nebraska volleyball program will look to shatter the NCAA volleyball attendance record on Wednesday, Aug. 30 when it hosts the University of Nebraska Omaha in Memorial Stadium on "Volleyball Day in Nebraska". The final capacity for the event is expected to be approximately 91,000, not including credentialed media and staff. Only a few hundred standing-room only tickets remain.

The record crowd for any NCAA volleyball match is 18,755 when Nebraska played Wisconsin on Dec. 18, 2021, in the NCAA Championship at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The largest NCAA volleyball regular-season crowd is 16,833 when Wisconsin hosted Florida at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis., on Sept. 16, 2022.

The largest crowd to attend a women's sporting event in the USA was 90,185 for the 1999 Women's World Cup Final between USA and China at Rose Bowl Stadium. That remained as a world record until 91,553 surpassed it when Barcelona played Real Madrid in Spain in a UEFA Women's Champions League match on March 30, 2022. Barcelona broke their own record a month later on April 22 as 91,648 gathered for a match in Camp Nou against Wolfsburg in a Women's Champions League semifinal.

Nebraska volleyball fans have continued to set the bar for attendance throughout the years:

- Eight of the top nine crowds in NCAA volleyball history are matches that have involved the Huskers.
- Of the 14 largest NCAA volleyball regular-season crowds, 13 have been Nebraska matches.
- The Husker volleyball program has sold out 303 consecutive regular-season matches dating back to 2001. The streak is an NCAA women's record.

Jordan Larson Named Assistant Coach

Nebraska volleyball and U.S. Women's National Team legend Jordan Larson has been named a full-time assistant coach for the Nebraska volleyball program, head coach John Cook announced June 13. Larson will join Cook and assistant coaches Jaylen Reyes and Kelly Hunter on the Husker staff once her summer playing schedule wraps up in September. The NCAA Division I Council adopted a proposal in January that, among other changes, allows teams that utilize a volunteer coach to add a full-time coach position beginning this season.

"One of the greatest honors of being the Nebraska volleyball coach is when I have the opportunity to coach with a former player," Cook said. "Jordan and I have talked for years about coaching at Nebraska. She will bring a wealth of experience that she can share with our players. There is no place like

One of the greatest American volleyball players in history, Larson was the team captain, Best Outside Hitter and Most Valuable Player when the U.S. won its first Olympic women's volleyball gold medal in Tokyo in 2021. After the Olympics, she continued to play club volleyball in China and Italy but planned to retire from international competition. However, in May she announced her return to the national team.

A native of Hooper, Neb., Larson was a standout on some of the greatest teams in program history from 2005 to 2008 and was inducted into the Nebraska Athletic Hall of Fame in 2020. She helped Nebraska to a top-five NCAA Tournament finish in each of her four seasons. The Huskers went 127-8 during her career with four Big 12 Conference titles and three trips to the NCAA semifinals, including the 2006 national title and a runner-up finish in 2005.

Individually, Larson was an All-American on the court and in the classroom. She was a three-time All-American and a two-time first-team All-American. At the conference level, Larson was a two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and the 2008 Big 12 Player of the Year. She was also an Academic All-American as a senior. Larson finished her Husker career with 1,600 kills, 1,410 digs and a school-record 186 aces.

The Nebraska volleyball team took a foreign team trip to Brazil in June 2023. The Huskers spent 17 days traveling in Belo Horizonte, Rio de Janeiro, Saquarema and Búzios. Nebraska went 5-0 on the trip and was crowned tournament champions. The highlights included a 4-1 win against the Brazil U21 National Team and a 3-2 win over the Brazil Military Selection Team after the Huskers trailed 2-1. The Huskers visited Sugarloaf Mountain and the Christ the Redeemer statue and also spent time at outreach events with local youth.

"It was perfect for us," Cook said. "The great thing was that we could play two teams because we took 14 players. Sometimes you don't get to take everybody so it was great. We had one team one night and then we switch setters and play another team. We mix them up, and so it was very productive in that way. We won a lot of close games. I think we only lost one close, deuce game. So we won all the other ones. I saw them step up. We were down, I think, 24-21 in a game and we made three unreal plays to tie it up and then win it. They were bigtime plays. So it's good to see your team step up on the road like that and be able to win those.

Beason, Rodriguez Named Team Captains

Junior opposite hitter Merritt Beason and two-time All-American libero Lexi Rodriguez will serve as the Huskers' team captains for the 2023 season. Rodriguez was one of three team captains as a sophomore last year, while Beason is in her first year in the program after transferring from Florida, where she was a captain in 2022. The Huskers have no seniors on their roster. Rodriguez and Beason were notified of their captaincy by the captain of the flight home from Brazil.

Rodriguez is a two-time AVCA All-American and All-Big Ten libero. She was also a third-team Academic All-American in 2022 majoring in advertising and public relations. Rodriguez led the Huskers to a nation-leading .128 opponent hitting percentage with 4.26 digs per set in 2022. Beason was an All-SEC and AVCA All-Region selection as a sophomore at Florida in 2022. As a sophomore she helped the Gators win a share of the SEC Championship by averaging 3.35 kills per set with a .261 hitting percentage.

- Rodriguez is a two-time AVCA All-American and All-Big Ten selection. The Sterling, Ill., native was a unanimous All-Big Ten pick last year after leading the Huskers to a nation-leading .128 opponent hitting percentage with 4.26 digs per set. Rodriguez earned AVCA second-team All-America accolades in 2022, and she was a first-team All-American and the AVCA National Freshman of the Year in 2021, as well as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year.
- The Huskers were picked second in the preseason poll behind Wisconsin. Minnesota was third, followed by Penn State and Purdue.


