- After a six-month wait, Volleyball Day in Nebraska is finally here. The fourth-ranked Nebraska volleyball team will play in front of one of the largest crowds all-time for a women's sporting event when it hosts Omaha on Wednesday at 7 p.m. at Memorial Stadium.
- To begin the day, UNK will play Wayne State in an exhibition at 4:30 p.m. Memorial Stadium gates will open at

- Wednesday's Nebraska-UNO match will be televised nationally on Big Ten Network and streamed on FoxSports. com. The UNK and Wayne State exhibition will be televised on Nebraska Public Media and will be best of three
- The Huskers Radio Network will broadcast all the action on their radio affiliates, including 107.3 FM in Lincoln and AM 590 in Omaha. A live audio stream will be provided at Huskers.com and on the Huskers app.
- John Baylor is in his 30th season doing play-by-play for the Husker volleyball program. Lauren (Cook) West, a former All-America setter for the Huskers, will provide color commentary.

HUSKERS AIM TO SHATTER ATTENDANCE RECORD

- The largest NCAA volleyball regular-season attendance is 16,833 when Wisconsin hosted Florida at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis., on Sept. 16, 2022.
- The largest-ever crowd for any NCAA volleyball match is 18,755 when Nebraska played Wisconsin on Dec. 18, 2021 in the NCAA Final at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio.
- The American record attendance for a women's sporting event is 90,185 for the USA vs. China FIFA World Cup final on July 10, 1999 at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.
- The world record attendance for a women's sporting event is 91,648 for the Barcelona vs. Wolfsburg UEFA Champions League match on April 22, 2022 at Camp Nou in Barcelona, Spain.
- The Husker volleyball program has sold out 306 consecutive regular-season matches, though the Memorial Stadium match would not count toward the streak as it is being played outside the Huskers' main home facility, the Devaney Center. Nebraska's sellout streak is an NCAA women's record. The Huskers have led the nation in attendance every season since moving into the Bob Devaney Sports Center in 2013.
- Eight of the top nine crowds in NCAA volleyball history are matches that have involved the Huskers.
- Of the 14 largest NCAA volleyball regular-season crowds, 13 have been Nebraska matches.
- When Nebraska played at Creighton on Sept. 7, 2022 at the CHI Health Center, a then-regular-season NCAA record crowd of 15,797 turned out to watch the Huskers defeat the Bluejays, 3-2. It shattered the previous regular-season record of 14,022 (set by Nebraska and Creighton in 2018). The record lasted nine days, however, as Wisconsin and Florida drew a crowd of 16,833 to the Kohl Center on Sept. 16.

ABOUT THE HUSKERS

- Nebraska is coming off a successful opening weekend, going 3-0 with three sweeps at the Ameritas Players Challenge. Harper Murray (most outstanding player), Lexi Rodriguez and Laney Choboy were all named to the All-Tournament Team.
- Murray was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after averaging 3.67 kills per set with a .343 hitting percentage. She also posted 2.33 digs per set and totaled six blocks, five aces and four set assists.
- Merritt Beason contributed 3.11 kills per set and 2.00 digs per set.
- Andi Jackson averaged 2.17 kills per set with a team-best .526 hitting percentage and put up 11 blocks in two matches played. Bekka Allick had 2.00 kills per set and a .304 hitting percentage and also had 11 blocks in

two matches as the Huskers rotated their middle blockers all weekend.

- Freshman setter Bergen Reilly became just the second true freshman setter to be a day one starter under John Cook (Nicklin Hames). Reilly had 9.33 assists per set and 2.78 digs per set in the three wins.
- Libero Lexi Rodriguez led the NU back row with 3.67 digs per set.
- The Huskers, who led the nation in defense in 2022, held their three opponents to a combined .064 hitting percentage, which ranks fifth in the nation.
- The Big Red averaged 3.11 blocks per set on opening weekend, good for a tie for 18th nationally.

SERIES HISTORY

- Nebraska is 17-1 all-time against Omaha. The lone UNO win was on Sept. 2, 1986.
- The teams last played on Sept. 3, 2021, a 3-2 Husker win at the Devaney Center after the Huskers trailed 2-1.
- Nebraska is 2-0 against Omaha both in the John Cook era and in UNO's Division I era.

SCOUTING REPORT: OMAHA

- Omaha went 0-2 on the first weekend of the season. The Mavericks hosted a four-team tournament at Baxter Arena, falling 3-1 to Texas A&M and 3-0 to Kansas.
- Kali Jurgensmeier and Shayla McCormick led the Mavs with 2.86 kills per set in the two matches. McCormick hit a team-best .237 and added 2.00 digs per set.
- McKenna Ruch had eight blocks to lead the Mavericks defensively.
- Omaha is coming off a 20-11 season and 14-4 record in the Summit League last year. That came one year after the Mavericks won the Summit League regular-season title with a 16-2 conference record. Head Coach Matt Buttermore took over the program in 2019 and has led the Mavs to back-to-back 20-win seasons, their first since making the transition to Division I in 2011.

HUSKERS RANKED NO. 4 IN AVCA COACHES POLL

- Nebraska is ranked fourth in the AVCA Coaches Poll this week.
- The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 544 times, which is also the most in NCAA history.
- Nebraska has appeared in all 605 AVCA Coaches Polls it has been eligible for since it was established in 1982. Nebraska is the only program to be ranked in every eligible poll all-time.
- Nebraska's 605 consecutive weeks of being ranked is the longest active streak in Division I for any sport, leading Connecticut women's basketball and North Carolina women's soccer.
- Nebraska has been ranked No. 1 in 102 all-time polls, the most in NCAA history.

AVCA HALL OF FAMER JOHN COOK IN 24TH SEASON AT NEBRASKA

- Nebraska head coach John Cook is in his 24th season as the Nebraska volleyball head coach in 2023. He has led the Huskers to four national championships, 10 final fours, 12 conference championships and 21 top-10 final rankings since 2000.
- Cook has 820 career wins and is one of the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA history. Since taking over the program in 2000, Cook has led the Huskers to a nation-leading .871 win percentage (659-98).
- Under Cook, the Huskers have achieved 64 AVCA All-Americans and 20 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, both among the best in the nation. He is a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, earning the prestigious honor in 2000 and 2005, and a seven-time conference coach of the year, including Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016 and 2017, his first and second Big Ten honors with the Huskers in their Big Ten era (2011-present).
- Cook is one of only two active coaches and one of six all-time to be a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year and was honored in 2008 by USA Volleyball, receiving its All-Time Great Coach Award.
- Cook was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in 2017, joining former Husker volleyball coach Terry Pettit in the hall.

MURRAY NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Nebraska freshman outside hitter Harper Murray was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Monday by the conference office.
- In her first collegiate matches, Murray led the Huskers to a 3-0 record at the Ameritas Players Challenge. The Ann Arbor, Mich., native averaged 3.67 kills per set with a .343 hitting percentage. She also posted 2.33 digs per set and totaled six blocks, five aces and four set assists.
- Murray had nine kills on .350 hitting with five blocks and four digs in her collegiate debut against Utah State. She followed with 10 kills on .389 hitting with seven digs and three aces. Murray finished the weekend with 14 kills on .310 hitting with 10 digs for her first collegiate double-double.

SEASON PREVIEW

- Nebraska is coming off a 26-6 (16-4 Big Ten) season and second-place finish in the Big Ten. The Huskers advanced to an NCAA regional semifinal, where they lost to Oregon in five sets. NU ended the year at No. 9 in the AVCA Coaches Poll, its 11th straight year finishing in the top 10 of the AVCA poll.
- Nebraska had a nation-leading opponent hitting percentage of .128 this season. Junior libero and co-captain Lexi Rodriguez is back to lead the Huskers defensively once again. Rodriguez is a two-time AVCA All-American

and is 12 digs away from reaching 1,000 for her career.

- Sophomore middle blocker Bekka Allick was named to the AVCA All-Region Team in 2022 after finishing her first season as a Husker with 1.89 kills per set, 1.01 blocks per set and a team-high .326 hitting percentage. Allick was an All-Big Ten Second Team and a unanimous All-Big Ten Freshman Team member.
- Junior opposite hitter Merritt Beason was an All-SEC and AVCA All-Region selection as a sophomore at Florida in 2022 before transferring to Nebraska and being named a team captain for the 2023 season. In her sophomore season at Florida, Beason helped the Gators win a share of the SEC Championship by averaging 3.35 kills per set with a .261 hitting percentage.
- Junior outside hitter Lindsay Krause averaged 2.25 kills per set with a .269 hitting percentage and totaled 44 blocks and 45 digs last season. Over the final 12 matches of the season, Krause averaged 2.72 kills per set with a .359 hitting percentage.
- Ally Batenhorst posted 2.33 kills per set to go with 1.06 digs per set in 2022. The junior outside hitter was named to the Louisville Regional All-Tournament Team after 15 kills and 12 digs against No. 9 Oregon in the NCAA regional semifinal.

Huskers Add Transfer Merritt Beason

The Nebraska volleyball program announced the addition of Florida transfer Merritt Beason on Dec. 23. Beason, a 6-3 opposite hitter, joined the Huskers in January after playing the last two seasons at Florida, where she was an All-SEC and AVCA All-Southeast Region honoree in 2022, as well as an All-SEC Freshman Team selection in 2021.

As a sophomore at Florida in 2022, Beason helped the Gators win a share of the SEC Championship by averaging 3.35 kills per set with a .261 hitting percentage. She had double-digit kills in 21 of 28 matches played and had a career-best 21 kills with eight digs, three aces and a pair of blocks in a five-set win at Wisconsin in September. Beason also led the Gators with 38 service aces on the season – ranking third in the SEC - and contributed 1.92 digs per set and 0.88 blocks per set. She led the Gators in kills and aces per set and was second in digs and third in blocks. Beason received All-America honorable mention by VolleyballMag.com following the season after captaining the Gators to an NCAA regional semifinal appearance.

Beason was named the MVP of the 2022 Pan American Cup as the U.S. Women's U21 National Team won gold last June in La Paz, Mexico. Beason played alongside current Huskers Lexi Rodriguez and Bekka Allick on the team. In the 3-1 championship win over Argentina, Beason had a team-high 14 kills and three blocks, while Allick had 12 kills and two blocks and Rodriguez had 24 digs.

Volleyball Day in Nebraska Coming Aug. 30

The Nebraska volleyball program will look to shatter the NCAA volleyball attendance record on Wednesday, Aug. 30 when it hosts the University of Nebraska Omaha in Memorial Stadium on "Volleyball Day in Nebraska". The final capacity for the event is expected to be approximately 91,000, not including credentialed media and staff. Only a few hundred standing-room only tickets remain.

The record crowd for any NCAA volleyball match is 18,755 when Nebraska played Wisconsin on Dec. 18, 2021, in the NCAA Championship at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The largest NCAA volleyball regular-season crowd is 16,833 when Wisconsin hosted Florida at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis., on Sept. 16, 2022.

The largest crowd to attend a women's sporting event in the USA was 90,185 for the 1999 Women's World Cup Final between USA and China at Rose Bowl Stadium. That remained as a world record until 91,553 surpassed it when Barcelona played Real Madrid in Spain in a UEFA Women's Champions League match on March 30, 2022. Barcelona broke their own record a month later on April 22 as 91,648 gathered for a match in Camp Nou against Wolfsburg in a Women's Champions League semifinal.

Nebraska volleyball fans have continued to set the bar for attendance throughout the years:

- Eight of the top nine crowds in NCAA volleyball history are matches that have involved the Huskers.
- Of the 14 largest NCAA volleyball regular-season crowds, 13 have been Nebraska matches.
- The Husker volleyball program has sold out 303 consecutive regular-season matches dating back to 2001. The streak is an NCAA women's record.

Jordan Larson Named Assistant Coach

Nebraska volleyball and U.S. Women's National Team legend Jordan Larson has been named a full-time assistant coach for the Nebraska volleyball program, head coach John Cook announced June 13. Larson will join Cook and assistant coaches Jaylen Reyes and Kelly Hunter on the Husker staff once her summer playing schedule wraps up in September. The NCAA Division I Council adopted a proposal in January that, among other changes, allows teams that utilize a volunteer coach to add a full-time coach position beginning this season.

"One of the greatest honors of being the Nebraska volleyball coach is when I have the opportunity to coach with a former player," Cook said. "Jordan and I have talked for years about coaching at Nebraska. She will bring a wealth of experience that she can share with our players. There is no place like Nebraska!"

One of the greatest American volleyball players in history, Larson was the team captain, Best Outside Hitter and Most Valuable Player when the U.S. won its first Olympic women's volleyball gold medal in Tokyo in 2021. After the Olympics, she continued to play club volleyball in China and Italy but planned to retire from international competition. However, in May she announced her return to the national team.

A native of Hooper, Neb., Larson was a standout on some of the greatest teams in program history from 2005 to 2008 and was inducted into the Nebraska Athletic Hall of Fame in 2020. She helped Nebraska to a top-five NCAA Tournament finish in each of her four seasons. The Huskers went 127-8 during her career with four Big 12 Conference titles and three trips to the NCAA semifinals, including the 2006 national title and a runner-up finish in 2005.

Individually, Larson was an All-American on the court and in the classroom. She was a three-time All-American and a two-time first-team All-American. At the conference level, Larson was a two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and the 2008 Big 12 Player of the Year. She was also an Academic All-American as a senior. Larson finished her Husker career with 1,600 kills, 1,410 digs and a school-record 186 aces.

Huskers Welcome Five Talented Freshmen

The Nebraska volleyball team took a foreign team trip to Brazil in June 2023. The Huskers spent 17 days traveling in Belo Horizonte, Rio de Janeiro, Saquarema and Búzios. Nebraska went 5-0 on the trip and was crowned tournament champions. The highlights included a 4-1 win against the Brazil U21 National Team and a 3-2 win over the Brazil Military Selection Team after the Huskers trailed 2-1. The Huskers visited Sugarloaf Mountain and the Christ the Redeemer statue and also spent time at outreach events with local youth.

"It was perfect for us," Cook said. "The great thing was that we could play two teams because we took 14 players. Sometimes you don't get to take everybody so it was great. We had one team one night and then we switch setters and play another team. We mix them up, and so it was very productive in that way. We won a lot of close games. I think we only lost one close, deuce game. So we won all the other ones. I saw them step up. We were down, I think, 24-21 in a game and we made three unreal plays to tie it up and then win it. They were bigtime plays. So it's good to see your team step up on the road like that and be able to win those.

Beason, Rodriguez Named Team Captains

Junior opposite hitter Merritt Beason and two-time All-American libero Lexi Rodriguez will serve as the Huskers' team captains for the 2023 season. Rodriguez was one of three team captains as a sophomore last year, while Beason is in her first year in the program after transferring from Florida, where she was a captain in 2022. The Huskers have no seniors on their roster. Rodriguez and Beason were notified of their captaincy by the captain of the flight home from Brazil.

Rodriguez is a two-time AVCA All-American and All-Big Ten libero. She was also a third-team Academic All-American in 2022 majoring in advertising and public relations. Rodriguez led the Huskers to a nation-leading .128 opponent hitting percentage with 4.26 digs per set in 2022. Beason was an All-SEC and AVCA All-Region selection as a sophomore at Florida in 2022. As a sophomore she helped the Gators win a share of the SEC Championship by averaging 3.35 kills per set with a .261 hitting percentage.
