# RIFLE GLOSSARY

**Air rifle** – A gun that uses a .177 caliber lead pellet propelled by compressed air instead of a gunpowder charge. The rifles can weigh up to 12.12 pounds.

**Cleaned** – A perfect target, in which the shooter hits a 10 on each of the 10 targets on the sheet for a score of 100. Can also be used to refer to a perfect match.

**Front sight** – The sight attached to the end of the barrel of the rifle, holding the front aperture.

**Electronic targets** – A target system that uses microphones and sound waves from the bullet or pellet going through the paper to send to a monitor on each point.

**Iron sights** – Sights that employ no magnification.

**Kneeling** – Shooting from a kneeling position with a sling and kneeling roll to support the position.

**Off hand** – The unsupported standing position.

**Perfect match score** – In air rifle and smallbore, 600 is perfect.

**Prone** – Shooting from a lying position.

**Record shots** – Also known as “shots for record,” those shots that are counted toward the match score, with “sighters” not included.

**Relay** – One group of shooters firing the match at the same time.

**Shooting glove** – A padded glove, with or without fingers, used to ensure the comfort of the non-dominant hand (i.e., a right-handed shooter wears

a glove on the left hand) as the shooter supports the rifle.

**Shooting jacket** – The jacket is made of leather or canvas and provides support and pads the shooter to minimize the effect of pulse and recoil. There are strict guidelines regarding the thickness.

**Shooting boots** – Boots designed for rifle shooting. They have the toe end of the sole and the heel cut flat for stability.

**Shooting trousers** – Snug canvas and/or leather pants usually worn over running tights or sweatpants. They often have padded reinforcements sewn on both knees and the seat to prevent the slipping of elbows and knees when firing from the kneeling position.

**Sighting shots** – Practice shots taken before going “for record.” Sighting shots are unlimited and may be fired before the beginning of each position. Once a position’s first record shot has been fired, no further sighting shots are permitted.

**Sling** – Adjustable strap with buckle adjustments and arm cuffs that provide stability. A sling is attached to the rifle and helps to support it in prone and kneeling positions.

**Smallbore** – A .22 caliber gun with an iron sight used in competition. It can be customized with special accessories and/or alterations (barrel length and style, stock, design, etc.) to fit the shooter’s needs and comforts.

## SCORING SYSTEM

### AIR RIFLE

**Course of Fire** – Competitors stand and shoot lead pellets from .177 caliber rifles at targets 10 meters away.

**Rifle** – Air rifles can be either air or gas powered and weigh up to 12.12 pounds by NCAA regulations.

**Time** – Competitors have 75 minutes to fire 60 shots from the standing position.

**Perfect Match Score** – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for air rifle.

### SMALLBORE

**Course of Fire** – In smallbore three-position rifle, athletes fire .22 caliber rifles from the kneeling, prone, and standing (also called off hand) positions at targets 50 feet away.

**Rifle** – Smallbore rifles may not exceed 17.6 pounds by NCAA regulations.

**Time** – Competitors have 105 minutes for 20 record shots in the kneeling position, 20 record shots in the prone position and 20 record shots in the standing position.

**Perfect Match Score** – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for smallbore.

# HUSKERS LOOK TO BUILD OFF RECORD 2022-23

The Nebraska rifle team is coming off of a record-breaking 2022-23 season and will look to continue that success in 2023-24, with Head Coach Mindy Miles at the helm for her third season.

NU will return six of eight shooters from last year's NCAA-qualifying squad, including senior NCAA Smallbore National Champion and All-American Cecelia Ossi. She will be joined by fellow All-Americans in senior Madelynn Erickson and sophomores Emma Rhode and Tori Watts. Junior Mackenzie Strauch and sophomore Camilla Johannessen also return to the team. The Huskers will also add freshman Charlotte Mick this season.

"I am hoping we will see the same amount of success as we did last year," said Head Coach Mindy Miles. "I know we can be competitive, not only within the team but against other teams. We have a strong addition to the team this year, Charlie Mick, as well as our outstanding returners from last season -- Cecelia, Maddie, Emma, Tori, Camilla and Kenzie. With the core returners from last year as well as a strong freshman, it should give us a great chance to break more records as a team this year. I look forward to them pushing each other at each match...each member of our team adds to our team's culture, and they are wonderful student-athletes to work with."

The Huskers will be led by senior Ossi, who won the NCAA Smallbore title last season. She averaged a 588.75 in smallbore, the highest in program history. She was a first-team CRCA All-American in the smallbore, a second-team All-American in the air rifle and a third-team All-American in the aggregate. She earned the highest aggregate average on the team (1,181.92) and the second-highest air rifle average (594.00). Ossi competed in the smallbore event at the 2022 Rifle and Pistol World Championships in Cairo, Egypt, and placed 22nd out of 63 shooters. During the summer of 2023, she won the USA Shooting smallbore national championship and swept the smallbore and air rifle titles at the 2023 National Matches Smallbore and Air Gun competition in Camp Perry, Ohio.

"Cecelia had an outstanding season last year and we are looking forward to her continued success," Miles said. "She is an amazing athlete that continues to push herself match after match. Cecelia does a great job leading our team as the team captain. Her senior year will be impressive to witness."

Erickson competed in all 14 matches for NU last season. She was named an honorable mention smallbore All-American by the CRCA, and posted a 584.21 average in the event, the second-highest on the team. She posted career bests in all three events in 2022-23, 589 in the smallbore, 597 in the air rifle and 1,175 in the aggregate.

"Maddie has always been incredibly consistent, which is a vital part of being a counting member of the team," Miles said.

Emma Rhode was an immediate contributor

last season and competed in every match for Nebraska. She earned second-team air rifle All-America honors from the CRCA and tied the second-highest average on the team in the event with a 594.00. She broke the Husker air rifle record when she shot a 598 at Alaska-Fairbanks. Her smallbore average of 583.62 was the third-highest on the team and is the highest ever for an NU freshman. Her aggregate average (1,178.00) was the second highest on the team.

"Emma had an excellent freshman season," Miles said. "We are looking to continue her momentum into sophomore year as a key member of the counting team. She hits high in both smallbore and air rifle."

Tori Watts was also a CRCA second-team air rifle All-American in 2022. She competed in 13-of-14 matches for NU and led the team with an air rifle average of 594.08. She broke Nebraska's air rifle record with a 598 against Alaska-Fairbanks, and never shot below a 592 in the event. Watts' aggregate average (1,177.08) was third on the team.

"Tori is another extremely high-scoring athlete," Miles said. "She is capable of posting some amazing scores in both guns."

Mackenzie Strauch returns to the team following a season where she competed in every match for the Huskers, including the NCAA Championships. She recorded personal bests in all three events -- 587 in the

smallbore, 592 in the air rifle and 1,179 in the aggregate. She posted averages of 575.08 in the smallbore, 588.69 in the air rifle and 1,163.77 in the aggregate.

"Kenzie had some great matches last year and we are looking forward to some more personal bests from her," Miles said. "She can be a great competitor and she can help push her teammates."

Camilla Johannessen competed in every match for NU last season, except for the NCAA Championships. She posted five top-10 overall finishes and averaged a 573.15 in the smallbore, a 588.31 in the air rifle and a 1,161.46 in the aggregate.

"Camilla is capable of impressive scores in both guns," Miles said. "We would like to focus on consistency with her."

Mick comes from Colorado, where she earned a silver medal in the air rifle at the Colorado State Junior Olympics and was a 4-H state champion for multiple years. She recorded a third-place finish at the CMP Regionals and a fifth-place finish at the Dixie Double Juniors Competition.

"Charlie will be one to watch," Miles said. "She comes to the team as a tough competitor. I look forward to her pushing the rest of her team members."

Former five-time All-American and USA Shooting National Team member Mindy Miles is in her third season in charge of the Husker rifle team after being named head coach on May 24, 2021.

Miles is the seventh head coach to lead the Husker rifle program and took over after serving as the assistant coach for the Huskers for two years.

In 2022-23, Miles led the team to a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Under her tutelage, Cecelia Ossi was the NCAA smallbore individual national champion and Emma Rhode and Tori Watts both broke the Nebraska air rifle record with 598s. Ossi earned CRCA All-America awards in all three events, while Rhode, Watts and Madelynn Erickson earned All-America

honors in the air rifle. As a team, the Huskers posted all top five aggregate scores in program history, along with the top five air rifle scores and top three smallbore scores.

Off the range, the team held a GPA of 3.64. All eight members of the 2022-23 squad were part of the Tom Osborne Citizenship team, and five athletes earned academic medallions. Ossi was named the Huskers' "Best Female Athlete" for her accomplishments over the course of the season, and Erickson earned the Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership award.

During Miles' first year as head coach, Ossi tied the then-Nebraska range air rifle record of 597 and placed ninth in the smallbore at the NCAA Championships. She also set a school record for smallbore average over the course of a season with a 586.3. The team scored the then-second-highest smallbore score in school history in its match against UTEP. Ossi earned CRCA second-team Smallbore All-America honors, and Madelynn Erickson earned CRCA Honorable-Mention Smallbore All-America honors.

The Huskers also held a strong academic standing under Miles. Five Huskers earned CRCA Scholastic All-America awards and five garnered Academic All-Big Ten Awards. Five Huskers also earned academic medallions under Miles - Flake and Ossi received gold medallions for earning a GPA greater than 3.75, Cheramie earned a silver medallion with a GPA greater than 3.50 and Aletto and Erickson earned bronze medallions for a GPA greater than 3.00. All seven 2021-22 rifle athletes were part of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

In 2021, Cheramie earned three CRCA All-America awards under Miles' tutelage, becoming the first shooter in school history to earn three All-America awards in the same season. Cheramie, who was named the 2021 Great America Rifle Conference Senior of the Year, was one of four Huskers to earn All-America honors the past two years, joining 2020 recipients Elena Flake, Hana Musser and Macey Way. The Huskers also finished third in the 2020 Great America Rifle Conference (GARC), while Cheramie and

Way finished first and third, respectively, in the smallbore.

Off the range, NU had 14 CRCA Scholastic All-Americans in two seasons, including all six competitors on the Huskers' 2021 roster, and 29 spots on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll over the last three semesters. In May of 2021, the program took home the women's Herman Team GPA award, signifying the highest GPA for any Husker women's program on campus, posting a 3.744 GPA in the previous two semesters.

Miles served as an assistant coach under Rachel Martin starting in 2019, and she played an instrumental part in the Huskers' accomplishments over those two years. She helped the Huskers qualify for the NCAA Championships both seasons, including a sixth-place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships in March.

As a competitor at TCU, Miles was a three-time first-team NRA All-American in the air rifle (2016-18) and two-time NRA All-American in smallbore (2017-18). As a senior, she placed fifth in the air rifle and added a third-place NCAA finish in the smallbore, leading TCU to a third-place team finish at the NCAA Championships. Miles ranked second nationally in the air rifle (597.4) and seventh in smallbore (583.7) during her senior year. Miles led the nation in air rifle average (596.53) in 2016-17, including a score of 599 at Alaska on Oct. 8. She finished fourth in the air rifle at the 2017 NCAA Championships with a score of 596. She was the NCAA air rifle runner-up as a sophomore in 2016, while posting a season average of 594. She added the 2016 NCAA Sportsmanship Award.

As a freshman in 2015, Miles became just the fifth shooter in NCAA history and the second at TCU to shoot a perfect 600, which came in the air rifle at the Patriot Rifle Conference Championships on Feb. 8 to help the Horned Frogs to the team title. Miles was a four-time Patriot Rifle Conference champion during her TCU career. She added a second perfect 600 against Nebraska and Memphis on Oct. 28, 2017.

Miles represented Team USA in competition dating back to the 2014 World Championships before retiring from competitive shooting in 2020. A two-time World Championships competitor for the United States (2014, 2018), she secured a quota spot for the United States at the Olympic Games in Tokyo by winning gold in the air rifle at the 2018 Championship of the Americas. Miles' score of 248.4 highlighted a 1-2 sweep in the event. Miles won a silver medal in the air rifle at the 2019 Pan American Games.

Originally from Weatherford, Texas, Miles earned a silver medal in air rifle and a bronze in smallbore at the 2013 Junior Olympics. She was a Junior World Cup finalist in Suhl, Germany in 2014.

Miles earned her bachelor's degree from TCU in May of 2018 after majoring in strategic communications with an emphasis in public relations and advertising and a minor in business. She was named the TCU Breakout Athlete of the Year in 2015 and was the TCU Pop Boone Award recipient in 2017.







# JT SCHNERING

Assistant Coach (Third Year)

Former two-time All-American JT Schnering is in his third season as an assistant coach after joining the Husker program in July of 2021.

In his second season as assistant coach, he helped NU qualify for and finish sixth at the NCAA Championships. Cecelia Ossi was the individual smallbore national champion. Ossi, along with Emma Rhode, Tori Watts and Madelynn Erickson, were named CRCA All-Americans. The Huskers shot the top five aggregate scores in program history, along with the top five smallbore scores and top three air rifle scores.

Ossi was named Nebraska's "Best Female Athlete" for her accomplishments in 2022-23. All eight team members were featured on the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team, five athletes earned academic medallions and Erickson was a recipient of the Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership award.

With his assistance in 2021-22, rifle athletes earned honors on and off the range. Ossi represented the Huskers at the NCAA Championships and placed ninth in the smallbore. She also broke the school record for smallbore average over a year (586.30) and tied the range air rifle record (597).

Ossi earned CRCA Second-Team Smallbore All-America honors and Madelynn Erickson earned CRCA Honorable Mention Smallbore All-America honors.

Five Huskers (Ossi, Emily Cheramie, Elena Flake, Payton Fry and Mackenzie Strauch) earned CRCA Academic All-American honors. Five Huskers also earned Academic All-Big Ten awards - Cheramie, Ossi, Flake, Erickson and Kinga Aletto.

Schnering earned All-America honors for Alaska Fairbanks in both 2017-18 and 2018-19, as he helped the Nanooks qualify for the NCAA Championships in each of his four seasons at the school. He competed in 52 matches during his four-year career and posted 39 top-10 finishes as a competitor. His best season was as a senior in 2018-19, when he placed fourth in air rifle and earned second-team NRA All-America honors in the smallbore. He tallied 13 top-10 finishes that season, including a trio of first place showings, as was named team MVP and UAF's Male Athlete of the Year. In his career, he posted personal best scores of 597 in air rifle and 586 in smallbore.

Schnering earned a degree in psychology from UAF in 2019 and in sports and recreation business in 2020. He also helped out the UAF program while working on his second degree and coached club shooters at his home club in Fairbanks.

# RODNEY BENNETT

University of Nebraska Chancellor

a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment, retention and outcomes, including for the 30 percent of USM students who were first-generation. His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

While at USM, Dr. Bennett established new faculty positions in high-growth areas and increased the average salary for full-time faculty; oversaw \$300 million in facilities work; and launched the largest fundraising campaign in the University of Southern Mississippi's history. He was a strong champion of the Division I athletics program, investing in new facilities and programs to support student-athletes, including a dedicated mental health counselor to serve student-athletes. Throughout his time as president, he brought a conservative approach to budget management, meeting or exceeding the budgetary goals set by the Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning Board of Trustees.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. He was the senior administrator for student programs and

services for Georgia's 34,000-plus students; oversaw \$150 million in capital projects; and made key staff and programmatic investments in extracurriculars, mental health programs and other areas to better support students.

Dr. Bennett has also been the dean of students at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and associate dean of student life at Middle Tennessee State University.

Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. He has served on numerous boards, including the Mississippi Aquarium, Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America, Catholic Health East (Philadelphia), and St. Mary's Health Care System in Athens, Georgia. He is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity and Past Sire Archon for Sigma Pi Phi fraternity, The Boulé.

Dr. Bennett earned a bachelor's degree in mass communication, a master's degree in educational administration, and an education specialist degree from Middle Tennessee State. He earned his Doctor of Education degree from Tennessee State University.

He and his wife, Temple, are the parents of two adult daughters, Colby and Logan.

Dr. Rodney D. Bennett is the 21st chancellor of the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Land-Grant and Big Ten institution. He is a 30-year veteran of higher education with a track record of growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from







# TREV ALBERTS

Vice Chancellor, Director of Athletics

A veteran administrator and College Football Hall of Famer, Trev Alberts is in his third year as Vice Chancellor, Director of Athletics at the University of Nebraska in 2023-24. Alberts returned to his alma mater after spending 12 years at Nebraska-Omaha, guiding the program through a successful transition to the Division I level.

In his first season at Nebraska in 2021-22, Alberts helped the Huskers navigate the ever-changing landscape of Name, Image and Likeness guidelines for the benefit of Nebraska student-athletes. He led the development of the N-Vest Nebraska program to award \$5,980 per year to student-athletes who meet academic benchmarks. Alberts also spearheaded the charge to complete the fundraising for Nebraska's Go Big Project, which will provide Nebraska football with a new facility scheduled to open this fall. The project will also house academic, life skills, nutrition and support services for all Nebraska student-athletes.

A tireless worker who puts both the interests of student-athletes and fans first, Alberts helped orchestrate a qualitative survey of Nebraska's fan base to help shape the future of Memorial Stadium's game-day atmosphere. Alberts has also focused much of his time on developing the first strategic plan for Nebraska Athletics in 15 years. He has also committed himself to providing intense support and a unifying vision for Nebraska's coaches across all sports.

He continued to make a mark on Nebraska Athletics in his second year. Alberts conducted a thorough, nationwide search for a new leader for the Husker football program in the fall of 2022 that resulted in the hiring of Matt Rhule as Nebraska's new head coach. Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder at the college level, winning conference championships at both Temple and Baylor. Since his hiring, Rhule has energized the Nebraska fan base and attracted a top-25 recruiting class to the Husker program.

Alberts also spearheaded a new 15-year multimedia right agreement between Nebraska Athletics and Playfly Sports, an emerging leader in sports marketing, media and technology. The partnership is one of the nation's most comprehensive multimedia rights agreements and has a total value for \$301 million for Nebraska over the life of the contract.

Nebraska's athletic achievements in 2022-23

included a NCAA top-10 finishes by wrestling, rifle, bowling, women's outdoor track and field, men's gymnastics and men's indoor track and field. In all, 10 Husker teams posted top-20 national finishes, while the men's track team captured the Big Ten outdoor title under first-year coach Justin St. Clair.

Academically, Nebraska student-athletes continued to shine with a school-record 95 percent graduation rate across all sports for the second straight year. All of Nebraska's programs had at least an 88 percent GSR score in the most recent report.

Alberts' impact on college athletics stretches beyond the Nebraska campus. A respected leader at the Big Ten and national level, Alberts serves on both the NCAA's Division I Football Oversight Committee and the NCAA Division I Competition Committee.

Alberts' tenure leading UNO athletics was marked by successes in competition and in academics; by transitioning the university's athletic programs to NCAA Division I in 2011; and by establishing new homes for many UNO athletics teams, including Baxter Arena, the Maverick Park baseball/softball complex and the soccer pitch at Caniglia Field.

Alberts took the bold step in announcing that Omaha would reclassify from Division II to Division I in all sports in 2011 and simultaneously securing conference affiliation with the Summit League for all of the department's then-Division II programs. His vision for UNO's reclassifying teams was demonstrated even before the four-year transition period had ended. The Omaha baseball team won back-to-back Summit League regular-season championships in 2013 and 2014, while the men's basketball team made its first Division I postseason appearance in 2014 with a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

During UNO's time in the Division I ranks under Alberts tenure, the Mavericks had six teams and four student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Tournament, including hockey advancing to the Frozen Four in 2015 and men's soccer reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament in the spring of 2021. He also expanded opportunities, adding men's golf and men's soccer in 2011, and Omaha began a men's swimming and diving program in 2021-22.

Throughout his tenure in Omaha, Alberts was focused on enhancing the student-athlete experience, including the construction and staffing of the Hamilton Academic Excellence Room and the development of the Ethel S. Abbott Student-Athlete Development Wing. Those efforts paid off in Nebraska-Omaha student-athletes posting consistent collective semester grade point averages above 3.3 for 18 consecutive semesters, including at least a 3.5 in each of his final three semesters.

The facilities around Omaha Athletics received a major uplift during his tenure. Maverick Park opened in March of 2021 to rave reviews as the home to the Mavericks' baseball and softball programs. Funding for the complex, which includes a 1,500-seat baseball facility and a

650-seat softball facility, were raised privately and provided both programs a permanent on-campus home for the first time.

Another crowning achievement was the opening of Baxter Arena in 2015. Alberts directed efforts to secure community support and funding to build the on-campus arena, which allowed the nationally prominent hockey program to play on campus and also serve as the home of the men's and women's basketball and volleyball programs. Caniglia Field underwent renovations in 2012, making it one of the finest collegiate soccer facilities in the country, highlighted by a FIFA 2-star rated playing surface and one of the largest LED videoboards in a soccer-only college facility.

Alberts' work on behalf of hockey, UNO's established Division I sport, also paid dividends. He successfully guided the Mavericks into the new National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The following year, Omaha reached the 2015 NCAA Frozen Four.

In addition, Alberts and his team led Omaha Athletics into a partnership with Learfield, a national leader in the marketing of collegiate athletics, and developed Omaha Sports Properties. As the exclusive corporate sponsorship sales unit for UNO Athletics, Omaha Sports Properties further enhanced revenue and increased brand prominence locally, regionally and nationally.

As part of UNO's reclassification to Division I, Alberts oversaw the rebranding of UNO athletics with new primary and secondary logos and a greater focus on strengthening the Maverick brand both regionally and nationally.

As a student-athlete, Alberts was an All-American on and off the football field as a Husker Blackshirt. He was Nebraska's first Butkus Award winner in 1993, helping Coach Tom Osborne's Huskers to an undefeated regular season and an Orange Bowl appearance against Florida State. A first-team All-American by every major publication in 1993, he was also the Football News National Defensive Player of the Year, the Big Eight Male Athlete of the Year, and the Big Eight Defensive Player of the Year. His No. 34 jersey was retired at the 1994 Red-White Spring Game. In 2015, he was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame.

Off the field, Alberts earned the NCAA's highest honor, The Today's Top Six Award. A three-time Academic All-Big Eight honoree, he was a CoSIDA Academic All-American in 1993. He graduated from Nebraska before his senior season.

Alberts was the fifth pick in the 1994 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts and played for the Colts until 1996. Following his NFL career, he served as an analyst on college and professional football games for major national networks, including ESPN, CNN/SI and CBS Sports Network.

Alberts and his wife Angela have three children – Chase (and his wife, Cassie), Ashtynne and Breanna. Trev and Angela have one grandson, Walker John.



# SCOTT FUESS JR.

Faculty Athletics Representative

to an expected term of five years - reports directly to Chancellor Ronnie Green and consults with the Athletic Director. The representative splits academic year time equally between academic responsibilities and faculty representative duties.

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18.

In August 2018, Fuess was named director of the university's cross-disciplinary master's degree program that offers a specialization in intercollegiate athletics administration. The program - which has been completed by 48 Huskers - is built on MBA coursework, allowing students to earn hands-on experiences through Nebraska Athletics, industry professionals, other universities and alumni.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests revolve around issues of economics, primarily in labor, collegiate athletics and Japan.

Scott M. Fuess Jr. was named the University of Nebraska-Lincoln faculty athletics representative on Feb. 21, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. Areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, NCAA compliance, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference meetings.

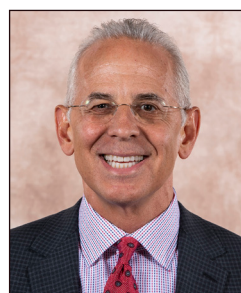

best smallbore performance of the season was a score of 587 against Air Force on Nov. 21, while her season-best air rifle score was a 593 against VMI on Nov. 7 and against UTEP on Oct. 9, both of which were career records for her.

## FRESHMAN (2020-21)

Erickson quickly settled into the Huskers' lineup, competing in every meet and helping the Big Red finish sixth at the NCAA Championships. She ranked second on the team in air rifle (590.9), third on the team in aggregate (1168.0) and fourth in air rifle (577.1). Erickson posted top-six finishes in 11 of 16 meets during the regular season, including a runner-up finish against Murray State in the NCAA qualifier. Her best meet of the year came in a win over Air Force on Jan. 17, when she posted season bests in both smallbore (583) and air rifle (594). It was one of eight air rifle scores of 590 or better for Erickson in 2021. Her work in the community was also recognized, as she was named to the Tom Osborne Citizenship team in 2021.

Madelynn Erickson was a consistent contributor for the Huskers in 2022-23. She competed in all 14 matches for NU, including the NCAA Championships, and placed in the top 10 overall in 10 matches, including two first-place finishes and two second-place finishes. Erickson earned the second-highest smallbore average on the team with a 584.21 and posted averages of 591.71 in air rifle and 1,175.93 in aggregate. She posted personal bests in all three events – 589 in the smallbore (Air Force, 10/2/22), 597 in the air rifle (at Morehead State, 1/14/23) and 1,175 in the aggregate (at Morehead State, 1/14/23). Erickson finished 16th out of 44 shooters in the smallbore event of the 2023 NCAA Championships. She was honored as an honorable mention smallbore All-American by the CRCA.

## SOPHOMORE (2021-22)

Madelynn Erickson competed in 10-of-12 matches for the Huskers in her sophomore season as she was named a CRCA Honorable Mention Smallbore All-American. Her smallbore average average was 583.4, which was third on the squad, while her air rifle average score was a 589.4, which was second. She averaged a 1,172.8 aggregate score over the course of the season. She posted six top-five overall finishes on the season, including two overall first-place finishes and two overall second-place finishes. Erickson finished in the top five of the smallbore in nine of the ten matches that she competed in. She recorded five top-five air rifle finishes on the year, including two first-place showings. She was named Nebraska's "Best Female Athlete" for her accomplishments during the 2022-23 season. During the summer of 2023, Ossi grabbed the USA Shooting smallbore national championship and air rifle and smallbore titles at the CMP National Championships.

## SOPHOMORE (2021-22)

Cecelia Ossi put together a strong season for the Huskers, earning second-team All-American smallbore honors from the CRCA. She competed in all 12 matches for the Huskers, along with the NCAA Championships, where she placed ninth in the smallbore. A team captain in 2021-22, Ossi topped the team in both smallbore (586.30) and the air rifle (590.75), as her smallbore average broke the school record set by Misty Chanek in 2005-06. She also led NU with an average of 1,176.92 in the aggregate. Ossi set personal records in both air rifle (597) and smallbore (589) and posted ten top-five overall finishes – three of them being first-place finishes on the year. She tied NU's record in the air rifle with a score of 597 against Akron on Jan. 15. Overall, she earned eight first-place finishes, five times in smallbore and three times in air rifle.

## FRESHMAN (2020-21)

Ossi made an immediate impact in Nebraska's rifle lineup, as she was one of three Huskers to compete in every meet in 2021. She ranked second on the team in both smallbore (578.9), and aggregate (1168.1) and was fourth in air rifle (589.2), as Nebraska finished sixth at the NCAA Championships. She posted top-six finishes in 11 of 16 events during the regular season, including a first-place finish in smallbore against Air Force (584) and a pair of second-place showings. Ossi finished second in the smallbore at Ohio State (579) and second in the air rifle at Army West Point with a season-best mark of 594. She also tied that mark at the Great American Rifle Conference meet. Ossi earned a spot on the Tom Osborne Citizenship team for her contributions in the Lincoln community.

Ossi brought an impressive shooting resume to Nebraska. ## JUNIOR (2022-23)

Cecelia Ossi was the Huskers' team captain and had a record-setting year in 2022-23. She earned the title of 2023 NCAA Smallbore Champion after an impressive year in the event. Her smallbore average of 588.75 is the highest of any Husker. Twice this season, she shot the second-highest smallbore score in NU history with a 592. She finished in the top 10 in the smallbore in all 12 matches she competed in for Nebraska, and she notched 11 top-10 overall finishes and nine top-10 air rifle finishes in those matches. She tied for the second-highest air rifle average on the team with a 594.00 and finished first on the team in aggregate average with a 1,181.92. Ossi earned recognition from the CRCA in all three events – she was a first-team smallbore All-American, a second-team air rifle All-American and a third-team aggregate All-American. She either tied or recorded new personal bests in all three disciplines. She shot a 592 twice, at Alaska-Fairbanks and Morehead State, a 597 in the air rifle against UTEP and a 1,187 in the aggregate at the PRC Championships. Ossi didn't compete in the Huskers' first two matches this season because she was representing the USA in the

## SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Mackenzie Strauch (pronounced Strau) competed in every match for the Huskers during her sophomore season, including the NCAA Championships. She posted averages of 575.08 in the smallbore, 588.69 in the air rifle and 1,163.77 in the aggregate. She grabbed six top-10 overall finishes, five top-10 air rifle finishes and six top-10 smallbore finishes, including one first-place. Strauch recorded career bests in all three events this season – 587 in the smallbore (vs Ohio State), 592 in the air rifle (5x, at Ohio State/TCU, at Alaska-Fairbanks, vs UTEP, at Morehead State, vs Ohio State) and 1,179 in the aggregate (vs Ohio State).



## FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Mackenzie Strauch competed in all 12 matches in her first season as a Husker and posted three top-five overall finishes on the year. She also had one top-five smallbore finish and a pair of top-five air rifle finishes on the year. She posted an average aggregate score of 1,156.17, which was fifth on the team. Strauch averaged a 571.83 in smallbore and a 584.33 in air rifle. Her best smallbore score of the year was a mark of 582 at the NCAA Qualifiers against Murray State, while her best air rifle score was a 590 against Air Force on Nov. 20.

## BEFORE NEBRASKA

Mackenzie Strauch came to Nebraska after a strong youth career. She attended Montana State University in 2020-21, but did not compete in athletics. She enjoyed a decorated prep career, as she qualified for the Junior Olympics in 2019 and 2021, placing 35th overall. She also won state titles in the smallbore in 2020 and the air rifle in 2018, while attending Belgrade High School. She competed for the Gallatin Valley Sharp Shooters Club and Head Coach Lee Nelson. Strauch placed sixth in the region at the Civilian Marksmanship Program, helping Gallatin Valley to a team title in 2019.

# NU POSTS RECORD SEASON: 2022-23 RECAP



The Nebraska rifle team put together a record-breaking campaign during the 2022-23 season, finishing No. 6 in the College Rifle Coaches Association poll. NU also qualified for the NCAA Championships and placed sixth. Junior captain Cecelia Ossi was the individual national champion in the smallbore event.

The Huskers broke numerous team and individual records. The team shot all five of the top-five aggregate scores in program history. They also shot the top five smallbore scores and the top three air rifle scores.

"We had an excellent season last year," said Head Coach Mindy Miles. "We broke most of the records as a team and some individually."

As an individual, Ossi averaged a 588.75 in the smallbore, the highest in Nebraska rifle history, along with a 594.00 in the air rifle, the highest of an NU junior and the second-highest in program history. Ossi also tied the second-highest Husker air rifle score of 597 and posted the second-highest smallbore score in NU history with a 592.

Freshmen Emma Rhode and Tori Watts both shot a school record score in the air rifle with 598s against Alaska-Fairbanks on Nov. 13, 2022. Watts posted the highest air rifle average in NU rifle history at 594.08, and didn't shoot below 592 once in a match. Rhode tied Ossi for the second-highest average at 594.00 and shot a 590 in the smallbore at The Citadel, the highest score of any Husker freshman. She also posted the highest smallbore average of any NU freshman at 583.62.

Nebraska started off the season with a four-match win streak. The Huskers grabbed victories over The Citadel (4,703-4,624), Georgia Southern (4,677-4,628) and No. 8 Air Force (4,717-4,692/4,706-4,699). Against the Falcons, NU shot its fourth-highest aggregate (4,717) and third-highest smallbore (2,345) scores.

The Huskers took their first loss of the season against No. 11 Ohio State and No. 2 TCU by

scores of 4,699-4,708 and 4,699-4,737. Ossi placed fifth overall in that match.

NU traveled to Alaska to take on No. 4 Alaska-Fairbanks, which would go on to win the NCAA Championship. The Huskers lost by scores of 4,714-4,743 and 4,726-4,740, but had a record-breaking weekend. Their day-two score of 4,726 is the highest team aggregate score in program history. They also shot a program-record air rifle score of 2,381 and tied the third-highest smallbore score in history of 2,345. Rhodes and Watts both posted their record-breaking air rifle scores of 598 on day two against the Nanooks.

NU concluded its fall slate on Nov. 20, 2022 with a 4,712-4,613 victory over UTEP. Huskers swept the top four spots overall – Ossi took first (1,185), junior Madelynn Erickson was second (1,180), while Rhode (1,178) and freshman Camilla Johannessen (1,167) finished in third and fourth, respectively.

Nebraska started the second portion of the season strong after taking almost two months off. The team traveled to Morehead, Ky. and defeated No. 14 Morehead State by a score of 4,719-4,669. NU shot its program-high smallbore score of 2,351 at this match, and shot the third-highest aggregate score in Nebraska rifle history with its 4,719.

The Huskers then returned home to face No. 1 TCU for the second time during the season. They were defeated by a score of 4,710-4,744, but Ossi placed third overall (1,183) and Watts was fifth overall (1,180).

NU took on No. 11 Ohio State at the Nebraska Rifle Range in the last regular-season competition. The team avenged its loss earlier in the season with a 4,715-4,651 win. The Huskers took four of the top five spots in that match, as Rhode placed first (1,181), and Ossi (second, 1,179), Strauch (third, 1,179) and Watts (fifth, 1,177) rounded out the field.

To kick off the postseason, Nebraska traveled to Fairbanks, Alaska, for the Patriot Rifle Conference (PRC) Championships. NU placed third out of six in a conference field that included four of eight NCAA qualifiers. The Huskers shot a 2,348 in the smallbore and a 2,376 in the air rifle to combine for an aggregate score of 4,724.

NU took on then-No. 10 Akron and No. 12 Ohio State at the NCAA qualifier match in Columbus, Ohio, and placed first out of the three teams. Ossi earned a first-place overall finish with a 1,180 aggregate score.

On Feb. 20, the Huskers were announced as one of eight qualifying teams for the NCAA Championships on March 10-11 in Akron, Ohio. The smallbore took place on day one of the championships, and Ossi won the NCAA title in that event. She shot a 590 in the preliminary rounds of competition and defeated Kentucky's Will Shaner in the final by a score of 16-8. As a team, the Huskers placed fourth with a score of 2,340. Day two of the championships was the air rifle event, in which the team shot a 2,366, which combined with their smallbore score for an aggregate of 4,706. Nebraska placed sixth at the NCAA Championships after coming in ranked seventh in the country.

### ACADEMIC COUNSELING

Eight academic counselors, three learning specialists, two assistant academic counselors and one administrative assistant are in place to monitor daily academic progress, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

### TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, unlimited tutorial support from approximately 75-100 tutors on staff is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. Tutorial support is provided both in-person and virtually. Nebraska's tutorial program is certified as a model tutoring program by the College Reading and Learning Association.

### STUDY HALL

Student-athletes attend a supervised, flex-time study hall within the Herman Student Life Complex that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student-athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week as determined by their academic counselor and/or coach. Additional performance-based or tutor-based study hall also may be determined by the academic counselor.

### MENTORING

Academic staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes. The student-athletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

### EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor, or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a consulting neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

### STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators, and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across campus.

### PERSONAL COUNSELING

Student-athletes will find a supportive and caring environment at Nebraska. Transitional issues, stress management, time management, academic focus and problem resolution are all addressed in a proactive manner throughout the year. If necessary, counseling referrals are also made to designated practitioners.

### COMPUTER RESOURCES

All student-athletes are provided the opportunity to have a laptop for use during their academic career at Nebraska. The Herman Student Life Complex has printers and desktop computers available for student-athletes to use in the facility.

### STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE

Nebraska is a leader in providing all the resources and support necessary for student-athletes to become successful in Academics, Athletics and Life. Nebraska will continue to strategically plan for avenues to strengthen the resources to support more than 600 Husker student-athletes across 24 sports.

### UNMATCHED SUPPORT

Nebraska has a history of providing unmatched benefits and support to student-athletes. In 2014, a change in NCAA governance and subsequent legislation paved the way for Nebraska to enhance the benefits for student-athletes. A few examples of these enhanced benefits are:

- All scholarship student-athletes have their scholarship calculated based on the full cost of attendance.
- Each student-athlete is offered a free Apple MacBook Air laptop computer to enhance their learning opportunities.
- Nebraska has increased resources and support in all academic and performance related areas including but not limited to Academic Services, Life Skills, Athletic Medicine, Athletic Training, Strength and Conditioning, Nebraska Athletic Performance Laboratory, Nutrition and Sports Analytics.
- As part of Nebraska's innovative Post-Eligibility Opportunity (PEO) program, every student-athlete graduate who has exhausted their athletic eligibility has the opportunity to pursue (with Nebraska support) an internship, participate in a study abroad program or attend graduate school within the University of Nebraska system.

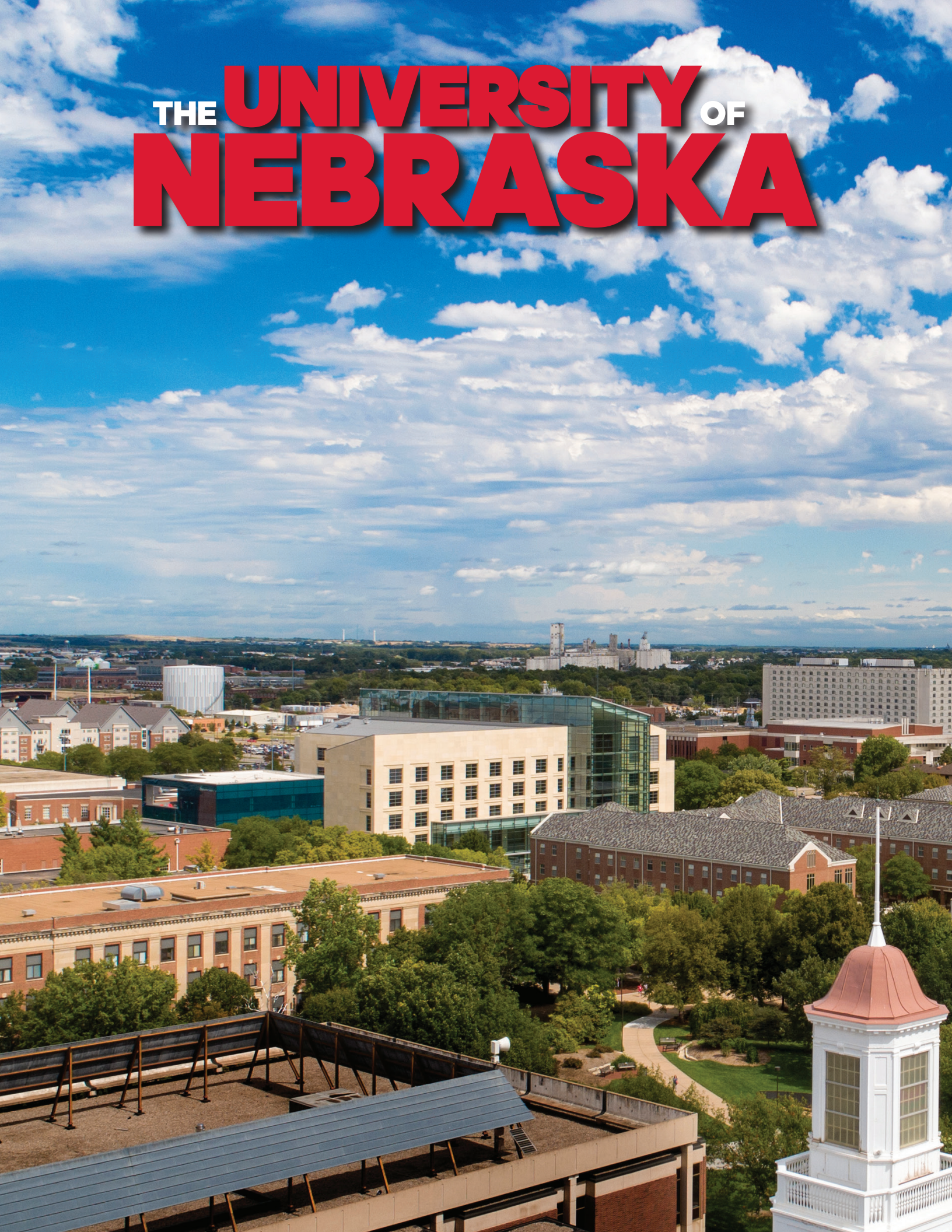
### #NILBRASKA

## THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

Chartered in Lincoln by the Nebraska Legislature in 1869, the University of Nebraska was expanded in 1968 into a university system now comprising four campuses under the guidance of a Board of Regents and a central administration. The flagship University of Nebraska–Lincoln is an educational institution of international stature. Nebraska is classified within the Carnegie “R1: Doctoral Universities – Highest Research Activity” category. Nebraska is also a land-grant university and a member of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities. The university is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.

## BIG TEN ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

As a member of the Big Ten, the University of Nebraska–Lincoln is a member of the Big Ten Academic Alliance (BTAA), formerly the Committee on Institutional Cooperation, which is the academic consortium of the universities in the Big Ten Conference. The BTAA includes all 14 Big Ten Institutions and partners with the University of Chicago. The Big Ten Academic Alliance and the institutions together have annual research expenditures topping \$11.5 billion — more than the Ivy League and the University of California System combined — and they educate a total of nearly 600,000 students with approximately 50,000 faculty members.
