## **SCOUTING THE ALCORN STATE LADY BRAVES**

Alcorn State returns four starters and its top four scorers from a team that finished 12-17 overall and 8-10 in the SWAC last year.

The Lady Braves opened this season with a 77-42 loss at Mississippi State (Nov. 6). MSU advanced to the 2023 NCAA Tournament after taking a 73-65 overtime loss to Nebraska (Nov. 26, 22) in Puerto Rico.

Destiny Brown, a 6-3 junior forward and preseason All-SWAC selection, managed just three points and seven boards in the loss to the Bulldags. Last season, Brown led the Lady Braves with 13.6 points, 8.4 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game. ASU was led in the opener by 5-6 junior guard, Zy'nyia White, who had 11 points and five rebounds. White averaged 9.5 points and 2.9 rebounds a year ago as a starter.

Nakia Cheatham, a 6-0 senior guard/forward, added eight points and four boards. Cheatham averaged 7.1 points and 6.0 rebounds as a regular starter last season.

Kiarra Henderson, a 5-9 senior starter, pitched in five points and seven rebounds. She averaged 5.1 points and 4.4 boards primarily off the bench last season.

Senior guard Ashanti Backus rounded out the Alcorn State starting five with three points. She made six starts last season but averaged just 2.1 points per game.

Akryiale Ford contributed eight points and seven rebounds off the bench. The 6-2 graduate forward is in her third season with ASU. She averaged 3.3 points and 2.3 rebounds a year ago.

Senior Jeanee Anderson and sophomore Jazmine Jackson were the only other Lady Braves to find the scoring column against Mississippi State.

Returning starter Tyginae Wright (8.1 ppg, 2.3 rpg, 2.4 apg, 2022-23) did not play in the opening loss to Mississippi

The only regular starter lost from last year's Alcorn State squad is Cayla Obillo, who averaged 6.9 points, 2.8 rebounds and team bests of 3.6 assists and 1.9 steals per game.

Nebraska leads the all-time series with Alcorn State 1-0, with the Huskers winning the only previous meeting between the schools, 83-49, on Nov. 16, 2014.

#### **HUSKERS BACK HOME TO BATTLE BRAVES**

Nebraska returns home after a 2-0 opening week when the Huskers welcome Alcorn State to Pinnacle Bank Arena tonight.

The Big Red completed an unbeaten first week with a 71-52 victory at Wyoming on Friday in Laramie. Alexis Markowski notched her first double-double of the season with game highs of 17 points and 13 rebounds to lead Nebraska. The 6-3 center from Lincoln scored the first 10 points of a decisive 19-2 second-half surge to power the Huskers to victory over the Cowgirls.

Markowski finished the week by averaging a double-double with 15.0 points and 10.5 rebounds to earn a spot on the Big Ten Conference Weekly Honor Roll announced on Monday afternoon.

Natalie Potts also enjoyed an award-winning opening week for the Huskers. The 6-2 forward was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after averaging 12.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.0 block while hitting 78.6 percent (11-14) of her shots from the field. Potts, who was a two-time Missouri High School Player of the Year, scored 15 points on 6-of-7 shooting, including her first career three-pointer, in Nebraska's win at Wyoming. She opened her career with 10 points and five rebounds in NU's win over Northwestern State (Nov. 6).

Darian White joined Potts as newcomers making instant impacts on the Nebraska lineup. White, a 5-6 graduate guard, averaged 12.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists in her first two regular-season games as a Husker. She also teamed with Potts to wreak havoc at the front of Nebraska's full-court press at Wyoming, allowing Nebraska to take control of the game.

First-team All-Big Ten guard Jaz Shelley continued to play outstanding basketball. The graduate student from Moe, Australia averaged team bests of 16.0 points, 6.5 assists and 3.0 steals during the opening week.

Kendall Moriarty completed her first full week as a starter with a 2-0 record while supplying solid defense to the Husker lineup. Through the first two games, Nebraska has produced runs of 18-0 (at Wyoming), 16-0, 12-0 and 10-0 (vs. Northwestern State) and a 19-2 second-half surge at Wyoming.

The Huskers have also received consistent offensive contributions off the bench from senior Annika Stewart and sophomore Callin Hake, who both averaged 9.0 points per game in Nebraska's 2-0 start

#### **FACTS & FIGURES**

- Alexis Markowski is tied for seventh in Nebraska history with 22 career doubledoubles, after producing her first double-double of the year with 17 points and 13 rebounds at Wyoming (Nov. 10).
- Jaz Shelley needs 13 assists to move into the top 10 in Husker history. She heads into the Alcorn State game with 379 assists in two-plus seasons at Nebraska. Shelley needs 13 to match two-time WNBA All-Star and Husker All-American Anna DeForge in 10th with 392 (1995-98).
- Shelley needs nine three-pointers to climb into the top five in NU history. She enters tonight's game with 164 threes as a Husker. All-American Lindsey Moore ranks fifth in Nebraska history with 173 (2010-13).
- Annika Stewart needs four points to reach 500 in her career.
- Natalie Potts has opened her Husker career by hitting 10 of her first 11 two-point field goal attempts (.909 FG pct.), while Markowski opened the season by hitting 10-of-14 two-point field goal attempts (.714) through the first two games.
- As a team, Nebraska hit 60.9 percent of its two-point field goal attempts last week and just 26.5 percent (13-49) of its three-point tries.

## **THREE THINGS TO WATCH**

- I Graduate guard Darian White has produced double-figure points 99 times in her college career, including each of her last 10 games. White, who has scored 1,740 points as a collegian, will be shooting for 100th career game in double digits tonight.
- **2** Alcorn State's Nate Kilbert will be making his fifth all-time head coaching appearance against the Huskers tonight. Kilbert, who is in his 22nd season as an NCAA Division I women's basketball coach, made his first trip to Lincoln as the coach of Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 15, 2011. The two-time SWAC Coach of the Year returned two years later as the head coach of Arkansas Pine Bluff (Nov. 21, 2013). He returned with UAPB on Nov. 14, 2015 and Dec. 2, 2017. He is in his fourth season at Alcorn State.
- $oldsymbol{3}$  Nebraska has hit 10 or more three-pointers 28 times in the last 75 games, including 15 times in 2022-23. Nebraska opened 2023-24 by hitting 10-of-32 threes in the win over Northwestern State (Nov. 6). Last season, the Huskers hit a season-best 14-of-34 threes against Omaha (Nov. 7, 2022). In the first 20 seasons of the three-point shot (1988-2007), NU hit 10 threes just six times in 591 games.
- Through two games Nebraska has hit 78.6 percent of its free throws while attempting 19 more free throws than the opposition.
- Nebraska has posted double-digit rebound margins in each of its first two games of 2023-24, including a plus-18 margin in the home-opening win over Northwestern State
- The last time Nebraska started a season 3-0 was 2021-22, when the Huskers started 12-0 on their way to an NCAA Tournament berth. Nebraska has posted a 3-0 record in three of the past four seasons.
- Nebraska has won its first two games by an average of 33.5 points. In 2021-22, NU won its first three games by a school-record average of 56.0 points per contest.
- The Huskers have hit at least one three-pointer in 466 straight games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2009. Nebraska has hit at least two three-pointers in 345 consecutive games.
