HUSKERS BID FOR 4-0 START ON WEDNESDAY VS. STONY BROOK

The Nebraska men's basketball team looks to improve to 4-0 for the first time since 2018 on Wednesday as the Huskers play host to Stony Brook in the second game of the Cornhusker Classic at Pinnacle Bank Arena.

Tipoff between the Huskers and Seawolves is set for 7 p.m. and tickets are available for the matchup by visiting Huskers.com/Tickets, calling 800-8-BIGRED during business hours (Mon.-Fri., 8 a.m.-5 p.m.) or at PBA beginning at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday.

The Cornhusker Classic is a four-team event with Nebraska, Rider, Stony Brook and Duquesne that takes place between Nov. 13-22. All four teams will play each other during that time frame.

Nebraska (3-0) used a strong performance on the defensive end to subdue Rider's upset bid in a 64-50 win on Monday night. The Huskers held the Broncos to 30.4 percent shooting, including 23.1 percent in the second half, and used a 47-34 advantage on the glass to take control in the final 10 minutes. The Huskers used a 17-0 spurt, holding the Broncos scoreless for over nine minutes to pull away.

C.J. Wilcher led three Huskers in double figures with 13 points and five rebounds, while Rienk Mast posted his second double-double of the year with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Mast comes into Wednesday's contest second in the Big Ten in rebounding (11.7 rpg), a big reason the Huskers lead the Big Ten in rebounding margin at +12.1 per contest.

Stony Brook (1-2) comes off an 85-63 loss to Duquesne on Monday. In that game, Aaron Clark had a game-high 22 points and four assists, but the Seawolves shot just 33 percent in the loss.

LOOKING AT STONY BROOK

Stony Brook comes into Wednesday's game with a 1-2 mark after an 85-63 loss at Duquesne on Monday night. In that game, Aaron Clarke had a team-high 22 points, including five 3-pointers, while Tyler Stephenson-Moore added 14 points, including four 3-pointers. The pair combined for nine of Stony Brook's 12 3-pointers, but the Seawolves shot just 33 percent from the floor, including 24 percent in the first half.

Stony Brook is in its second season in the Coastal Athletic Association and went 11-22 in its first season in the league. The Seawolves, who return a pair of starters and 10 letterwinners, were picked ninth in the Coastal Athletic Association preseason poll. They have retooled their roster with three transfers in their starting lineup and sixth-year senior Aaron Clarke returned after playing just three games last year before suffering a season-ending injury. The Seawolves have been challenged early, falling 90-74 to St. John's in the season opener before Monday's loss to Duquesne. Stephenson-Moore was a preseason All-CAA pick as he averaged 14.3 points per game last season.

Geno Ford is in his fifth season in charge of the Stony Brook program after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons under Jeff Boals. Ford had previously served as the head coach at Kent State (2008-11), Bradley (2011-15), Muskingum (2005-07) and Shawnee State (2001-02).

Wednesday's meeting is the first matchup between the Huskers and Stony Brook. NU is 8-1 all-time against CAA teams but has not met a CAA opponent since 2010.

LAST TIME OUT: HUSKERS GRIND OUT 64-50 WIN OVER RIDER

The Nebraska men's basketball team used a 17-0 second-half spurt to avert Rider's upset bid in NU's 64-50 win at Pinnacle Bank Arena on Nov. 13.

Rider used an 8-0 run to trim Nebraska's lead to 47-46 after DJ Dudley's basket with 10:41 remaining, but could get no closer as the Huskers used timely shooting and a strong defensive effort to earn the win. Keisei Tominaga ignited the rally with consecutive 3-pointers to give NU a 53-46 lead and force a Bronc timeout. From there, it was all Huskers, as Nebraska held the visitors scoreless for over nine minutes and forced 12 consecutive missed shots.

Josiah Allick and Rienk Mast combined for nine straight Husker points before Jarron Coleman's basket with 1:44 left gave NU a commanding 64-46 advantage. Mast posted his second straight double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds while Allick added 10 points and six boards.

Postgame Notes

- Nebraska's 17-0 run was its longest of the season. NU has had a double-figure scoring run in each of its first three games.
- Rienk Mast posted his second straight double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds. It is his 22nd career double-double and second straight as a Husker.
- Nebraska held Rider scoreless for a 9:11 stretch in the second half. The Huskers forced the Broncs into 12 consecutive missed shots during the scoreless stretch.
- The Huskers out-rebounded Rider, 47-34. Nebraska posted a +13 advantage on the glass against a Rider squad that ranked 37th nationally in rebounding margin last season.

Nebraska's 30 3-pointers are the most after three games since the 2018-19 team had 31 in their first three contests. The Huskers are one of four Big Ten teams currently averaging at least 10 3-pointers per game.

Nebraska held Rider to just 30.4 percent shooting, including 6-of-25 from 3-point range. The Broncos shot just 23.1 percent in the second half.

C.J. Wilcher led the Huskers (3-0) with 13 points, including a trio of first-half three-pointers, while Tominaga had nine points in 22 minutes in his first appearance since suffering an ankle injury on Oct. 29. Brice Williams added seven points and eight boards, as Nebraska enjoyed a 47-34 advantage on the glass.

WORTH NOTING

- Nebraska has been stout on the defensive end during the early portion of the season. The Huskers lead the Big Ten in points per game (52.0), field goal percentage defense (.311) and rebounding margin (+12.3). NU is also 42nd nationally in defensive efficiency according to KenPom following Monday's games.
- Rienk Mast now has 22 career double-doubles entering Wednesday's game with Stony Brook. The 6-foot-10 forward is 22nd nationally among all active players and trails only Zach Edey (41) among current Big Ten players. Mast's two double-doubles tie for the national lead.
- If Mast can record a double-double on Tuesday, he will be the first Husker with three straight double-doubles since Isaiah Roby from Feb. 10-18, 2018. Roby is the only Husker to post three straight double-doubles in the Big Ten era (2011-12 to present).
- Nebraska's bench has provided a spark early on. The Huskers bench has chipped in an average of 27.6 points per game in the first three contests. Sam Hoiberg led NU with 15 points in the opener, while C.J. Wilcher paced the Big Red with 13 points in Monday's win over Rider. In addition, Eli Rice had 16 off the bench against Florida A&M, but was not the Huskers' leading scorer that game (Mast, 20).
- Nebraska has had double-figure scoring runs in each of its first three games (10-0 vs. Lindenwood; 12-0 vs. FAMU; 17-0 vs. Rider).
- Nebraska is 16-4 under Hoiberg when scoring at least 80 points including 11-1 over the last three seasons. The only loss was a 104-100 quadruple overtime game at North Carolina State in 2021. NU has won its last nine games when reaching the 80-point plateau.

MAST'S MASSIVE NIGHT

Rienk Mast put together a strong performance in Nebraska's win against Florida A&M on Nov. 9. The 6-foot-10 forward had game highs of 20 points and 16 rebounds for his first double-double as a Husker.

- He became the first Husker in the Big Ten era (2011-12 to present) to have a game with at least 20 points and 15 rebounds, and the first Husker to do so since All-Big 12 performer Aleks Maric in 2008.
- Since 1990, only six Huskers have had games with at least 20 points and 15 rebounds. That list includes Aleks Maric, Kimani Ffriend, Venson Hamilton, Mikki Moore and Eric Piatkowski.
- Mast's 16 rebounds were the most by a Husker since Yvan Ouedraogo had 19 rebounds against Northwestern on March 1, 2020, and the second-highest rebound total in Hoiberg's four-plus seasons at Nebraska.
- Mast leads NU in scoring (15.0 ppg, 19th) and rebounding (11.7 rpg, 2nd) and is second in assists (2.3 apg).

FINDING BALANCE

Nebraska relied on its depth and balance early in the season. While the Huskers have three players averaging double figures, four others are at between 7.0 and 9.0 ppg after three games.

- Nebraska has had six different players reach double figures in the first three contests and have had a different leading scorer in each of the first three games.
- No Husker averages more than 27 minutes, while mine players are averaging at least double figures in minutes.
- NU has gotten at least one double-figure effort from its bench in each of the first three contests.
- The Huskers are starting to get more of their lineup back. Keisei Tominaga made his 2023-24 debut and had nine points in 22 minutes. Tominaga led NU in scoring at 13.1 ppg in 2022-23. In addition, Juwan Gary (9.6 ppg) has not played in NU's first three contests.
- Seven of the 12 players who played in the season opener were making their Husker debut. In fact, C.J. Wilcher was the only player who appeared in both the 2022-23 and 2023-24 openers.

Nebraska posted a team GPA of 3.14 during the 2022-23 academic year. The Huskers were a finalist for the Herman Team GPA award for the first time in program history. In addition, NU matched a school record with six Academic All-Big Ten selections.

TOMINAGA'S RETURN PROVIDES A BOOST

Nebraska regained the services of senior All-Big Ten performer Keisei Tominaga against Rider on Monday after missing NU's first two games with an ankle injury. Tominaga finished with nine points, but provided a spark after Rider closed to within 47-46. Tominaga hit two straight 3-pointers to ignite NU's 17-0 spurt over the next nine minutes.

NEW FACES, NEW ROLES

Nebraska made a big splash in the transfer portal, adding five players to the roster, and their impact is already being felt during the early portion of the season. The group of Josiah Allick (New Mexico), Jarron Coleman (Bradley), Rienk Mast (Bradley), Ahron Ullis (Iowa) and Brice Williams (Charlotte) combined for more than 4,300 points, 2,100 rebounds and 800 assists entering this year. All but Ullis has played in NU's first three games.

Mast leads the Huskers in both scoring (15.0 ppg) and rebounding (11.7 rpg) as he ranks second in the conference in rebounding. The 6-foot-10 forward has been in double figures in all three contests - the only Husker to do so - including a 20-point, 16-rebound effort against Florida A&M.

Allick has been a force inside, averaging 8.7 points per game on 73 percent shooting and 6.3 rebounds per game. He is second on the team and 18th in the Big Ten in rebounds, and is a big reason why the Huskers lead the conference in rebounding margin. Allick has two double-figure efforts in the first three games, including 11 points and eight boards against Lindenwood.

Williams has started all three contests and is second on the team in scoring (11.7 ppg) and third in rebounding (5.0 rpg) while shooting 39 percent from 3-point range. The 6-foot-7 guard has been in double figures twice, including a 15-point effort against Florida A&M and had seven points and eight boards in Monday's win over Rider.

Coleman has come off the bench in all three contests and leads NU with 3.0 assists per game while also adding 4.0 points and 4.0 rebounds. He has nearly a 2-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio while averaging nearly 19 minutes off the bench.

TOMINAGA NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

Nebraska senior guard Keisei Tominaga was honored on Oct. 6, as he was one of 10 players selected to the preseason All-Big Ten team.

The 10-member team included four unanimous selections: Terrence Shannon (Illinois), Jahmir Young (Maryland), Boo Buie (Northwestern) and Zach Edey (Purdue). Edey, the reigning national player of the year, was tabbed as the Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year.

Tominaga becomes just the third Husker to be named preseason All-Big Ten since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011-12, joining James Palmer Jr. (2018) and Terran Petteway (2014). Last season, he averaged 13.1 points per game on 53 percent shooting, including 40 percent from 3-point range, while appearing in all 32 contests. Tominaga led the Huskers in 3-pointers with 66 and was one of only six players nationally to average double figures and shoot 50 percent from the field, 40 percent from 3-point range and 85 percent from the foul line.

During Big Ten play, he led NU in scoring at 14.2 ppg to rank 15th in the conference while also ranking among Big Ten leaders in field goal percentage (.512, seventh) and 3-pointers per game (2.3, sixth) as he shot 41 percent from beyond the arc. He had seven of his nine 20-point games during Big Ten contests, including a career-high 30-point effort against Penn State, and added 23 points in NU's loss to Minnesota in the Big Ten Tournament.

A QUICK LOOK AT THE HUSKERS

Nebraska enters the 2023-24 season with its most experienced roster in Fred Hoiberg's five seasons at the helm. The Huskers returned seven letterwinners and three redshirts while adding seven new players to the roster.

• For the first time since 2018-19 and the third time since 2012-13, the Huskers return more than 50 percent of their scoring from the previous year.

• NU also returns 86 starts, which is the most since the 2018-19 NIT team. That breakdown is as follows: C.J. Wilcher (26); Keisei Tominaga (25); Juwan Gary (17); Jamarques Lawrence (12); Blaise Keita (5); Sam Hoiberg (1). Wilcher and Tominaga are the only two Huskers who have played in every game the past two seasons.

• The Huskers return five of their top eight scorers from a year ago, as Keisei Tominaga's 13.1 ppg is the highest for a Husker returnee since James Palmer Jr. in 2018-19 (17.2 ppg). NU also returns its fourth leading scorer (Juwan Gary, 9.5 ppg) as well as C.J. Wilcher (8.0, sixth), Jamarques Lawrence (5.0, seventh) and Sam Hoiberg (4.1, eighth).

• The 2023-24 Huskers are an experienced bunch with nine of the 13 scholarship players in at least their fourth season of college basketball. The group features one sixth-year senior in Jarron Coleman and five others who are in their fifth season of college basketball.

• The 2023-24 roster has combined for 766 games, including 409 starts, at the Division I level entering the season. That does not include two seasons of junior college basketball for both Keisei Tominaga and Blaise Keita.

HUSKERS TO BE CHALLENGED IN 2023-24

Nebraska will play 12 games this season against ranked teams or teams receiving votes in either the Associated Press or the USA Today Coaches preseason polls.

• Nebraska's home schedule features three preseason top-10 opponents in No. 3/2 Purdue, No. 4/4 Michigan State and No. 8/8 Creighton. In addition, NU also hosts three other teams receiving votes: Wisconsin; Indiana; and Ohio State.

• Nebraska travels to No. 25/RV Illinois and also makes trips to four other teams that received preseason votes in Kansas State, Maryland, Indiana and Ohio State.

• Last year, the Big Ten had 12 teams which reached postseason play, including NCAA teams that reached the NCAA Tournament.

HUSKERS COMPLETE SPAIN TRIP WITH 3-0 MARK

Nebraska made its first overseas trip since 2019 and went 3-0 against teams in Madrid (89-84, OT), Valencia (86-83) and Barcelona (82-62) despite having just nine players available for the trip.

C.J. Wilcher led five Huskers who averaged double figures with 17.0 ppg, while Brice Williams (16.3 ppg) and Eli Rice (16.0 ppg) both averaged at least 16 points per game. Redshirt freshman Cale Jacobsen led NU in rebounding at 8.3 per game and tied Jamarques Lawrence for the team high in assists per game (4.3 apg).

TOMINAGA, MAST SPEND SUMMERS WITH NATIONAL TEAMS

A pair of Huskers spent the summer representing their national teams in international events. Rienk Mast represented the Netherlands in the FIBA Olympic Pre-Qualifying Tournament in Turkey, while Keisei Tominaga played for Japan in the FIBA World Cup.

• Mast played in all three games for the Netherlands, averaging 6.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.3 assists per game as the team posted a 1-2 record. His best performance was an eight-point, seven-rebound effort in a win over Belgium.

• Tominaga played in all five games for Japan, averaging 11.4 points per game in helping the team qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympics as the highest finishing team from Asia. He was named player of the game in the win over Cape Verde, finishing with 22 points on 8-of-11 shooting from the field, including 6-of-8 from 3-point range. Of the five NCAA players who played in the World Cup, Tominaga was the only one to average double figures.

HUSKER COACHING STAFF RETURNS INTACT

Nebraska's full-time coaching staff remains the same as it was during the 2022-23 season with Nate Loenser, Adam Howard and Ernie Zeigler joining Head Coach Fred Hoiberg on the Husker bench.

• Loenser begins his third season on the Husker staff. He joined the Husker program after spending five seasons with the Chicago Bulls organization. Loenser was an assistant coach for the Bulls under both Fred Hoiberg and Jim Boylan for three seasons. He also served as the Bulls' video coordinator and head coach of the Windy City Bulls. Loenser worked with Hoiberg at Iowa State for two seasons.

• Howard is in his second year on the coaching staff. He was selected to participate in the 2023 TopConnect Basketball Symposium, an event featuring some of the nation's top assistant coaches. Prior to joining the NU staff, he spent four years at South Alabama, helping the program to 75 wins in that span after the program had seven straight losing seasons. In 2021-22, South Alabama won 21 games, the school's highest total since 2008. Howard

MCGOWENS HELPS USA TO GOLD

Former Nebraska men's basketball player Trey McGowens earned a gold medal this past October, leading Team USA to a gold medal in the FIBA 3x3 U23 World Cup on Sunday in Lublin, Poland.

McGowens, who played at Nebraska for two seasons (2020-22), was named MVP of the Tournament and named to the Team of the Tournament, as the United States went 7-0. McGowens, who played for the Long Island Nets in the NBA G League last season, led all tournament players with 54 points during the competition.

At Nebraska, McGowens was a two-year starter for the Huskers (2020-22). He averaged 9.2 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 steals per game at NU while he was often assigned to the opponent's top perimeter scoring threat.

HOIBERG'S HUSKER TIES

While Fred Hoiberg grew up in Ames and played his high school (Ames High School) and college basketball (Iowa State) there, he was born in Lincoln and has numerous ties to the city and to the University of Nebraska.

- Fred's father (Eric) and mother (Karen) both earned their undergraduate degrees from Nebraska in 1966. In fact, Eric earned his undergraduate degree, Master's degree, and Ph.D. in sociology from the university.
- His maternal grandfather was former Husker basketball coach Jerry Bush. Known as the "Big Bear of the Coliseum," Bush guided NU from 1955 to 1963, and directed two of the greatest upsets ever – a 43-41 victory over top-ranked Kansas and Wilt Chamberlain, and a 55-48 victory over No. 4 Kansas State and Olympian Bob Boozer during the 1957-58 campaign.
- His paternal grandfather (Otto) received his Master's Degree and Ph.D from Nebraska. He joined the faculty of the University of Nebraska in 1948, where he taught sociology and served as director of the community development program in the University of Nebraska Extension Division.
- Fred's son (Sam) is in his third season on the Husker basketball team after walking on. Fred and Sam are one of 22 father-son duos in Division I this season.

also coached at Troy, Tennessee, Southern Miss and Morehead State after playing collegiately at Western Kentucky.

- Zeigler is also in his second year at Nebraska. He joined the NU staff in August of 2022 after spending six years on Ben Howland's staff at Mississippi State. The Bulldogs had four postseason appearances between 2018-22. Zeigler spent six seasons as the head coach at Central Michigan (2007-12) and previously served stints at UCLA, Pittsburgh, Kansas State, Detroit and Bowling Green.

QUICK HITTERS

- Nebraska improved its win total from 10 to 16 games in 2022-23. NU was one of four Big Ten teams which increased its win total by at least six games last season (also Northwestern, Maryland and Penn State). Of Nebraska's 16 losses this season, 12 were against NCAA Tournament qualifiers.
- Nebraska has improved its season record in each of the last three years under Fred Hoiberg and increased its win total in each of the last two seasons. If Nebraska can increase its win total in 2023-24, it will mark the first time since the mid-1960s (1963-64 to 1965-66) that the Huskers increased their win total for three straight years.
- The Huskers posted five wins over teams which made the NCAA Tournament (Creighton, Iowa-2; Penn State, Maryland) and two others against teams which made the NIT (Rutgers and Wisconsin).
- Nebraska's nine Big Ten wins were the most since winning a school-record 13 Big Ten games in 2017-18. It was NU's third-highest conference win total since joining the Big Ten in 2011-12. In all, 11 Big Ten teams reached postseason play, including eight NCAA Tournament teams, in 2022-23.
- Nebraska tied a school record with its four overtime games in 2022-23, matching a mark which has been set six other times (also 2019-20, 2007-08, 1996-97, 1986-87, 1979-80 and 1955-66) and went 3-1 in OT games. Nebraska's three overtime wins were the most for the program since the 1986-87 team won a school-record four overtime games.
- Nebraska had multiple All-Big Ten selections with Derrick Walker and Keisei Tominaga. It marked the first time since 2017-18 that NU had multiple all-conference picks. Walker became the first Husker to receive second team or higher All-Big Ten honors since James Palmer Jr. in 2017-18.
- Derrick Walker became the first Husker to ever lead Nebraska in scoring, rebounding and assists in the same season. He was one of just 11 players nationally - and two in power conferences - that led his team in all three categories. He was selected to the NABC All-Star game at the Final Four, marking the Huskers' first selection to the event since 2019.

HUSKER ROSTER HAS INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

NU's roster has had an international flavor in recent seasons and that trend will continue in 2023-24. Four Huskers hail from overseas, including Keisei Tominaga (Moriyama Nagoya Aichi, Japan), Matar Diop (Dakar, Senegal), Blaise Keita (Bamako, Mali), and Rienk Mast (Groningen, Netherlands).

In five seasons under Hoiberg, NU has had players on its roster from a host of countries, including Australia, Canada, England, France, Iceland, Lithuania and Slovenia.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Several members of the 2023-24 Huskers have family members who have played basketball at the college or professional levels. The list is led by Fred Hoiberg, who played in the NBA for a decade after a standout career at Iowa State. In addition, Ramel Lloyd was a Parade All-American who scored over 1,600 points at the college level at Syracuse and Long Beach State, while Henry Williams scored a school-record 2,383 points at Charlotte and his number 34 jersey was retired by the school. Keisei Tominaga's father didn't play college basketball but was a center on the Japanese national team at the 1998 FIBA World Championship and played professionally in Japan for a decade.

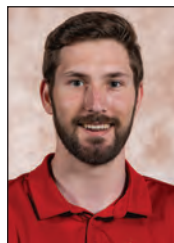

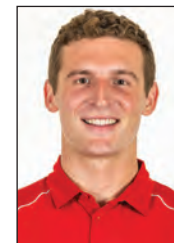

NEBRASKA HEAD COACH FRED HOIBERG

NEBRASKA (2019-PRESENT)

- Hired as Nebraska's 28th men's basketball coach on March 30, 2019, a position his grandfather (Jerry Bush) held for nine seasons from 1954 to 1963.
- Is the only coach in school history with two road wins against top-10 teams
- Guided Nebraska to three consecutive road wins over ranked opponents (No. 23 Ohio State and No. 10 Wisconsin in 2021-22 and No. 7 Creighton in 2022-23) for the first time in school history
- Brought in the highest-ranked recruiting class in school history, as his 2021 class was ranked 13th nationally by ESPN.com
- Had NBA Draft Picks in both 2021 (Dalano Banton) and 2022 (Bryce McGowens) and has produced 12 players who have reached the NBA

CHICAGO BULLS (2015-18)

- Coached the Chicago Bulls for three-plus seasons, posting a 115-155 record.
- Became just the fifth coach in franchise history to post a winning record in his debut season.
- Took the Bulls to the 2017 NBA Playoffs where they won the first two games against the top-seeded Boston Celtics, as the Bulls were the first No. 8 seed to take a 2-0 lead against a No. 1 seed since 1993.
- Was the fifth coach in NBA history to have each of his first two career playoff victories come on the road.

IOWA STATE (2010-15)

- Served as head coach at his alma mater for five seasons, posting a 115-56 record, which is the top winning percentage in school history (.673).
- Led the Cyclones to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances - a program record - while his 115 wins were the most in a five-year stretch in school history.
- Guided Iowa State to back-to-back Big 12 Tournament titles in 2014 and 2015.
- Produced four All-Americans, 12 All-Big 12 honorees and 10 players who played in the NBA.
- Named Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2012, as the Cyclones went from three conference wins to 12 in one season.
- Won 28 games and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2014.
- Led the Big 12 in scoring offense in two of his last four seasons and topped the conference in 3-pointers four times in five years.

MINNESOTA TIMBERWOLVES (2005-10)

- Served as Vice President of Basketball Operations in 2009-10, overseeing the day-to-day operations of basketball programs including college and pro scouting, salary cap management and NBA Draft preparations.
- Was the Assistant General Manager for three seasons, helping the Timberwolves orchestrate a draft-day trade for five-time all-star Kevin Love in 2008.

AS AN NBA PLAYER (1995-2005)

- Spent 10 years in the NBA with the Indiana Pacers (four seasons), Chicago Bulls (four seasons) and Minnesota Timberwolves (two seasons) after being selected in the second round of the 1995 NBA Draft.
- Was a member of three NBA Playoff Teams, including a Timberwolves team that reached the 2004 Western Conference Finals.
- Shot 40 percent from 3-point range during his career and led the NBA in 3-point shooting in his final season (48.3, 2004-05).
- Ended his NBA career abruptly at the age of 33 after undergoing open-heart surgery to repair an aneurysm in his aortic root.

- Started all four seasons at Iowa State, averaging 15.8 points, 6.9 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.6 steals per game in his collegiate career.
- His No. 32 was retired by Iowa State in 1997 and Hoiberg is a member of the Iowa State Hall of Fame.
- Garnered third-team All-America honors as a senior in 1994-95, averaging 19.9 points per game to help the Cyclones win a then-school-record 23 games and was named Big Eight Co-Male Athlete of the Year in 1995.
- Two-time Academic All-American who was inducted into the CSC Academic Hall of Fame in 2016.
