SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska will host five home meets at the Bob Devaney Sports Center in 2024. The Huskers host Illinois, Michigan, Penn State, a meet with North Carolina, Southeast Missouri State and Illinois State and the 2024 Master's Classic.
- The Huskers will face reigning Big Ten Champions, Michigan at the Bob Devaney Sports Center on Jan. 27 at 3 p.m.
- NU will take on Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Rutgers at the Big Five meet in State College, Pa., on Friday, Feb. 23.
- Nebraska will host the Master's Classic on March 9 at the Devaney Center. The meet will include Eastern Michigan, Lindenwood and Florida and will start at 6 p.m.
- The Big Ten Championships will take place in East Lansing, Mich., on Saturday, March 23.
- The Big Red will face 12 teams this season that reached NCAA Regionals, including Florida, which reached the NCAA Final.
- Postseason will begin with NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals, which will take place April 4-6 at four sites around the country. During the first round of regional competition -- to be held the first day -- two teams at each site will compete in a play-in. The winner of each meet will advance to a regional session. On the second day, eight teams will compete in two sessions of four, and the top two in each of those sessions will advance to the Super Regionals the next day. On the final day, four teams will compete in one session, and the top two teams will advance to the finals site.
- Eight teams will advance to the NCAA Championships, which are set for April 18-20 in Fort Worth, Texas. A pair of four-team semifinals will be held with the top two teams from each advancing to the "Four on the Floor" final. The top finisher at the final will be crowned NCAA champion.

Heather Brink was named the fifth head coach in the history of Nebraska women's gymnastics in February of 2019. Brink started the 2019 season as the program's interim head coach following three seasons on the Husker staff as Nebraska's associate head coach. Overall, Brink will enter her 13th season on the Husker coaching staff in 2024 including her earlier stint as assistant coach from 2011-15. She was also an 11-time All-American at Nebraska.

She has not only helped develop one of the most talented beam squads in the nation during her tenure on Nebraska's staff, but Brink has also demonstrated unprecedented leadership in and out of the gym. With over 30 years of gymnastics experience, Brink plays an important role in recruiting, program development and team building. Her dedication to the rich program tradition is unparalleled, as she looks to continue leading the Huskers to success in the years to come.

Brink coached the 2023 Huskers to a postseason berth, reaching the NCAA Denver Regional. She coached three gymnasts to All-Conference honors while Emma Spence was named Co-Regional Gymnast of the Year. Brink helped the Huskers score a 197.500, the best team score in five years while recording the 10th-best event scores in program history on floor and uneven bars. She coached individuals to 30 career-high scores while the Big Red took home 31 individual event titles throughout the season.

In 2022, Brink coached two Huskers to a postseason berth as Kinsey Davis and Clara Colombo competed at the NCAA Seattle Regional. She also coached Davis to first-team All-Big Ten honors.

In 2021, Brink and the Huskers returned to the gym for an unprecedented year after having the 2020 season cut short due to COVID-19. Brink coached two All-Conference gymnasts, Kaitlyn Higgins and Anika Dujakovich. The season ended for the Huskers at the NCAA Athens Regional where six individuals competed in seven events.

Although the 2020 year was cut short because of the COVID-19,

Taylor Houchin earned All-America honors while helping NU to an 8-4 record. Sierra Hassel also continued NU's tradition of excellence in the classroom, as she was named Nebraska's Student-Athlete of the Year.

Brink helped Nebraska to a sixth-place national finish in 2018, when the Huskers produced eight All-America awards. Brink helped Taylor Houcin and Grace Williams to second-team All-America honors on beam. NU posted a seventh-place national finish in 2017, and the Huskers won a Big Ten regular-season championship. Brink coached Danielle Breen to second-team All-America honors on beam, as Breen finished tied for sixth at the NCAA Semifinal with a score of 9.900. The Husker beam squad came up clutch in two of NU's most important meets of the season, as Nebraska finished on the event at both the B1G Five meet and the NCAA Lincoln Regional. At the B1G Five meet, NU clinched the Big Ten regular season title following Grace Williams' career-high 9.95. The Huskers needed a strong beam performance at the regional to advance to the NCAA Championships, and Williams posted a 9.90 and Breen scored a career-high 9.95 to seal the trip to nationals. At the NCAA Semifinal, NU posted a season-high 49.3000 on the event, led by Breen's score. Brink also helped Ashley Lambert to a pair of second-team All-America honors on vault and floor and Sienna Crouse to first-team recognition on vault.

In 2016, Brink's first season as associate head coach, Nebraska finished eighth nationally at the NCAA Championships. The Huskers' beam squad was among the strongest in the country, ranking in the top-10 for most of the season. Williams captured eight beam titles on the season, including the Big Ten beam title. Brink also helped Hollie Blanske to first-team All-America honors on vault and second-team All-America honors on floor exercise and in the all-around.

In 2015, Brink helped guide the Huskers to an eighth-place national finish and a third-place finish at the Big Ten Championships. Nebraska's beam lineup posted a season-high score of 49.475 at the B1G Five qualifier, while the Huskers captured six individual beam titles on the season. Brink was instrumental in helping to develop Blanske, Jessie DeZiel and Lambert into All-America performers in the 2015 season.

Brink helped Nebraska's beam lineup to a record-breaking performance at the 2014 NCAA Championships, as the Huskers posted a 49.450 to secure their spot in the Super Six finals. In addition, Blanske, DeZiel, Jamie Schleppenbach and Emily Wong took home All-America honors on the event. NU collected nine event titles on beam including a Big Ten champion in Wong.

Brink contributed to Nebraska's continued success in 2013 as the Huskers claimed 13 beam titles including the Big Ten Championship beam title with Wong and Jennifer Lauer posting 9.90 scores. Wong went on to claim second-team All-America accolades on the event.

In her first season as an assistant with the Huskers in 2012, Brink helped coach Wong to first-team All-America honors on beam. Brink's assistance with NU's floor routines also guided DeZiel to first-team All-America honors and Wong to second-team honors on the event.

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Brink, who competed for the Huskers from 1997 to 2000, permanently etched her name in the Nebraska record books by winning two national titles at the 2000 NCAA Championships in Boise, Idaho. Brink became the first Husker female to win an all-around national title and the second to win a vault national title in leading the Husk-

ers to the Super Six Finals and a fourth-place national finish. Brink was selected as the Honda Award winner in 2000, representing the nation's top female collegiate gymnast. Brink owns the third-highest uneven bars score in program history and the eighth-highest all-around score. She became the first Husker gymnast to score a 10.0, and recorded three perfect scores during her senior season. She closed her collegiate career as one of the most decorated gymnasts in school history, earning two NCAA titles, 11 All-America awards, six regional titles and eight conference crowns. Brink was inducted into the University of Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame in 2016.

Brian Amato enters his third season with the Nebraska women's gymnastics program as an assistant coach. He originally joined the Huskers in August of 2020.

In 2022, Amato helped two Huskers (Kinsey Davis and Clara Colombo) to the NCAA Seattle Regional as individual qualifiers.

In 2021, Amato finished his first season as a Husker assistant coach. Amato helped the Huskers to numerous individual honors. Two Huskers earned spots on the Big Ten All-Championships team as Amato helped Kaitlyn Higgins and Anika Dujakovich to successful performances. Amato also helped six Huskers advance to the NCAA Athens Regional.

Amato spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at Oregon State. He helped lead Oregon State to a sixth-place finish at the 2019 NCAA Championships. The Beavers' bars team was challenged with replacing half of the previous season's lineup due to graduation and injury. Amato's squad did not suffer a fall in the final nine meets of the season. He coached Hallie Briscoe to second-team All-America honors on bars in 2019.

In 2018, Amato led the Beavers' bars squad to a No. 21 ranking with a team Regional Qualifying Score (RQS) of 49.200 and a season high of 49.400. In 2017, Amato coached Kaytianna McMillan to Oregon State's first 10.0 score on bars since 2008, as he earned NACGC/W West Region Assistant Coach-of-the-Year honors.

Amato's uneven bars lineup in 2016 finished the season tied for 10th in the nation. McMillan earned first-team NACGC/W Regular Season All-America honors under Amato's guidance on the bars after ending the regular season ranked No. 7 with an (RQS) of 9.925. Amato coached his first gymnast to All-America honors in 2015, when Erika Aufiero earned first-team All-America honors.

He also served as faculty advisor/trip leader for 2018 Beavers Without Borders, a student-athlete service-learning study abroad program consisting of a short-term service trip to the Dominican Republic to engage in experiential service-based learning outside of the usual classroom setting.

Prior to his time at Oregon State, Amato served as the head bars coach at Brandy Johnson's Global Gymnastics in Clermont, Fla. (2008-13). In 2013, Amato's team won the Level 10 Florida

State Championship and was voted the nation's Level 10 Team of the Year in 2012. In 2011, Amato developed and coached a new JO bar release move – the Sims – that was added to the Junior Olympic Code of Points in 2012. During his 17 years of club coaching, Amato helped 20 gymnasts earn Division I scholarships.

Amato is the current Vice-President of the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association. He received his bachelor's degree from Portland State in liberal studies with a focus on exercise physiology in the winter of 2016. Amato is currently pursuing his MBA in sports business from Saint Leo University.

He also is on the board of directors for DamWorthIt Co, a nationally recognized student-athlete founded and led non-profit organization that utilizes the influential platform of sport partnered with the power of storytelling to end the stigma surrounding mental health.

Amato and his wife, Tori, have two children, Alex and Brooke.

Oleksii Koltakov joined the Nebraska Women's Gymnastics staff as an assistant coach in July of 2022. The 2022-23 season will be Koltakov's first season with the Huskers.

Koltakov spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the volunteer assistant coach at Alabama. He helped lead Alabama to the 2021 SEC Championship title and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. In 2022, Koltakov coached Alabama to a runner-up finish at the SEC Championships and the NCAA Finals.

Prior to his time at Alabama, Koltakov coached club gymnastics in Austin, Texas as well as serving as a High Performance coach at numerous camps and clinics across the United States.

Koltakov began his coaching career at the Piddubny Olympic College in Ukraine and Azerbaijan Gymnastics Federation in 2013.

A former member of the Ukraine National Team, Koltakov competed at the 2009 European Championships in Milano, Italy as well as the 2009 World Cup in Ostrava, Czech Republic, where Ukraine was a finalist. He also helped lead Ukraine to the finals of the 2011 World Cup in Stuttgart, Germany.

He was a five-time Ukrainian Pommel Horse Champion from 2008-12 and the Ukrainian Floor Exercise Champion in 2011. He led his team to the Ukrainian Championship in both 2009 and 2011.

In addition to coaching and competing, Koltakov performed as a highbar catcher in Cirque du Soleil's show Alegria.

Dr. Rodney D. Bennett is the 21st chancellor of the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Land-Grant and Big Ten institution. He is a 30-year

veteran of higher education with a track record of growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment. retention and outcomes. including for the 30 percent of USM students who were firstgeneration. His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

While at USM, Dr. Bennett established new faculty positions in high-growth areas and increased the average salary for

full-time faculty; oversaw \$300 million in facilities work; and launched the largest fundraising campaign in the University of Southern Mississippi's history. He was a strong champion of the Division I athletics program, investing in new facilities and programs to support student-athletes, including a dedicated mental health counselor to serve student-athletes. Throughout his time as president, he brought a conservative approach to budget management, meeting or exceeding the budgetary goals set by the Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning Board of Trustees.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. He was the senior administrator for student programs and services for Georgia's 34,000-plus students; oversaw \$150 million in capital projects; and made key staff and programmatic investments in extracurriculars, mental health programs and other areas to better support students.

Dr. Bennett has also been the dean of students at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and associate dean of student life at Middle Tennessee State University.

Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. He has served on numerous boards, including the Mississippi Aquarium, Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America, Catholic Health East (Philadelphia), and St. Mary's Health Care System in Athens, Georgia. He is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity and Past Sire Archon for Sigma Pi Phi fraternity, The Boulé.

Dr. Bennett earned a bachelor's degree in mass communication, a master's degree in educational administration, and an education specialist degree from Middle Tennessee State. He earned his Doctor of Education degree from Tennessee State University.

He and his wife, Temple, are the parents of two adult daughters, Colby and Logan.

on the Athletic Department's Executive Staff. His areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, NCAA and Big Ten Conference compliance, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the

university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference meetings.

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to Chancellor Ronnie Green and consults with Athletic Director Trev Alberts. He splits time between faculty representative duties and academic responsibilities.

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18. He also has served on numerous Big Ten Conference committees, including the Sports Management Committee, the Compliance and Reinstatement Committee and the Legislative Review Committee.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests are labor economics, the economics of collegiate sports, and the economy of Japan. He has earned numerous "Distinguished Teaching" awards. In 2016 he received the UNL College of Business "Distinguished Service" award.

VICE CHANCELLOR DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS THIRD YEAR

A veteran administrator and College Football Hall of Famer, Trev Alberts is in his third year as Director of Athletics at the University of Nebraska in 2023-24. Alberts returned to his alma mater after spending 12 years at Nebraska-Omaha,

guiding the program through a successful transition to the Division I level.

In his first season at Nebraska in 2021-22, Alberts helped the Huskers navigate the ever-changing landscape of Name, Image and Likeness guidelines for the benefit of Nebraska student-athletes. He led the development of the N-Vest Nebraska program to award \$5,980 per year to student-athletes who meet academic benchmarks. Alberts also spearheaded the charge to complete the fundraising for Nebraska's Go Big Project, which will provide Nebraska football with a new facility scheduled to open this fall. The project will also house academic, life skills, nutrition and support services for all Nebraska student-athletes.

A tireless worker who puts both the interests of student-athletes and fans first, Alberts helped orchestrate a qualitative survey of Nebraska's fan base to help shape the future of Memorial Stadium's game-day atmosphere. Alberts has also focused much of his time on developing the first strategic plan for Nebraska Athletics in 15 years. He has also committed himself to providing intense support and a unifying vision for Nebraska's coaches across all sports.

He continued to make a mark on Nebraska Athletics in his second year. Alberts conducted a thorough, nationwide search for a new leader for the Husker football program in the fall of 2022 that resulted in the hiring of Matt Rhule as Nebraska's new head coach. Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder at the college level, winning conference championships at both Temple and Baylor. Since his hiring, Rhule has energized the Nebraska fan base and attracted a top-25 recruiting class to the Husker program.

Alberts also spearheaded a new 15-year multimedia right agreement between Nebraska Athletics and Playfly Sports, an emerging leader in sports marketing, media and technology. The partnership is one of the nation's most comprehensive multimedia rights agreements and has a total value for \$301 million for Nebraska over the life of the contract.

Nebraska's athletic achievements in 2022-23 included a NCAA top-10 finishes by wrestling, rifle, bowling, women's outdoor track and field, men's gymnastics and men's indoor track and field. In all, 10 Husker teams posted top-20 national finishes, while the men's track team captured the Big Ten outdoor title under first-year coach Justin St. Clair.

Academically, Nebraska student-athletes continued to shine with a school-record 95 percent graduation rate across all sports for the second straight year. All of Nebraska's programs had at least an 88 percent GSR score in the most recent report.

Alberts' impact on college athletics stretches beyond the Nebraska campus. A respected leader at the Big Ten and national level, Alberts serves on both the NCAA's Division I Football Oversight Committee and the NCAA Division I Competition Committee.

Alberts' tenure leading UNO athletics was marked by successes in competition and in academics; by transitioning the university's athletic programs to NCAA Division I in 2011; and by establishing new homes for many UNO athletics teams, including Baxter Arena, the Maverick Park baseball/ softball complex and the soccer pitch at Caniglia Field.

Alberts took the bold step in announcing that Omaha would reclassify from Division II to Division I in all sports in 2011 and simultaneously securing conference affiliation with the Summit League for all of the department's then-Division II programs. His vision for UNO's reclassifying teams was demonstrated even before the four-year transition period had ended. The Omaha baseball team won back-to-back Summit League regular-season championships in 2013 and 2014, while the men's basketball team made its first Division I postseason appearance in 2014 with a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

During UNO's time in the Division I ranks under Alberts tenure, the Mavericks had six teams and four student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Tournament, including hockey advancing to the Frozen Four in 2015 and men's



soccer reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament in the spring of 2021. He also expanded opportunities, adding men's golf and men's soccer in 2011, and Omaha began a men's swimming and diving program in 2021-22.

Throughout his tenure in Omaha, Alberts was focused on enhancing the student-athlete experience, including the construction and staffing of the Hamilton Academic Excellence Room and the development of the Ethel S. Abbott Student-Athlete Development Wing. Those efforts paid off in Nebraska-Omaha student-athletes posting consistent collective semester grade point averages above 3.3 for 18 consecutive semesters, including at least a 3.5 in each of his final three semesters.

The facilities around Omaha Athletics received a major uplift during his tenure. Maverick Park opened in March of 2021 to rave reviews as the home to the Mavericks' baseball and softball programs. Funding for the complex, which includes a 1,500-seat baseball facility and a 650-seat softball facility, were raised privately and provided both programs a permanent on-campus home for the first time.

Another crowning achievement was the opening of Baxter Arena in 2015. Alberts directed efforts to secure community support and funding to build the on-campus arena, which allowed the nationally prominent hockey program to play on campus and also serve as the home of the men's and women's basketball and volleyball programs. Caniglia Field underwent renovations in 2012, making it one of the finest collegiate soccer facilities in the country, highlighted by a FIFA 2-star rated playing surface and one of the largest LED videoboards in a soccer-only college facility.

Alberts' work on behalf of hockey, UNO's established Division I sport, also paid dividends. He successfully guided the Mavericks into the new National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The following year, Omaha reached the 2015 NCAA Frozen Four.

In addition, Alberts and his team led Omaha Athletics into a partnership with Learfield, a national leader in the marketing of collegiate athletics, and developed Omaha Sports Properties. As the exclusive corporate sponsorship sales unit for UNO Athletics, Omaha Sports Properties further enhanced revenue and increased brand prominence locally, regionally and nationally.

As part of UNO's reclassification to Division I, Alberts oversaw the rebranding of UNO athletics with new primary and secondary logos and a greater focus on strengthening the Maverick brand both regionally and nationally.

As a student-athlete, Alberts was an All-American on and off the football field as a Husker Blackshirt. He was Nebraska's first Butkus Award winner in 1993, helping Coach Tom Osborne's Huskers to an undefeated regular season and an Orange Bowl appearance against Florida State. A first-team All-American by every major publication in 1993, he was also the Football News National Defensive Player of the Year, the Big Eight Male Athlete of the Year, and the Big Eight Defensive Player of the Year. His No. 34 jersey was retired at the 1994 Red-White Spring Game. In 2015, he was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame.

Off the field, Alberts earned the NCAA's highest honor, The Today's Top Six Award. A three-time Academic All-Big Eight honoree, he was a CoSIDA Academic All-American in 1993. He graduated from Nebraska before his senior season.

Alberts was the fifth pick in the 1994 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts and played for the Colts until 1996. Following his NFL career, he served as an analyst on college and professional football games for major national networks, including ESPN, CNN/SI and CBS Sports Network.

Alberts and his wife Angela have three children – Chase (and his wife, Cassie), Ashtynne and Breanna. Trev and Angela have one grandson, Walker John.

At Iowa, Colombo competed on uneven bars, receiving a 9.825. Colombo competed on bars in a win against Illinois. Against Ohio State, Colombo earned a 9.850 on both bars and beam. Colombo matched her then-career high on bars at Maryland with a 9.875. Colombo also competed on beam against the Terrapins. The junior claimed the uneven bars title at the Big Five meet with a career-high 9.900. Colombo competed on bars (9.900) and beam (9.825) against Michigan. In the final home meet, Colombo competed on bars, earning a 9.750. Colombo competed on uneven bars earning a 9.775 at the Denver quad meet. Colombo competed on uneven bars at the Big Ten Championships and finished tied for fifth after notching a 9.900. NEBRASKA'S NCAA CHAMPIONS

MICHELE BRYANT: NU'S FIRST CHAMPION



Michele Bryant 1990 NCAA Vault Champion

Michele Bryant will forever hold one distinction that no other Husker female gymnast can claim

A native of Blue Springs, Mo., Bryant became the first female gymnast in school history to win a national title, capturing the NCAA vault championship with a score of 9.85 at the 1990 NCAA Championships in Corvallis, Ore. Bryant's vault score

also set a Nebraska school record held until 1994.
Bryant's NCAA championship capped an impressive Husker career that saw her earn three first-team All-America honors and four Big Eight Championships.

A four-time all-conference selection, Bryant led Nebraska to a 59-20 regular-season record and four Big Eight championships during her collegiate career. It was the first time a gymnastics team had won four straight conference titles in Big Eight history.

At the national level, the Huskers also qualified for the NCAA Championships all four years she competed, the first time in school history the Huskers qualified for nationals in four straight years, while guiding the Huskers to a pair of top-five finishes. As a junior, Bryant earned first-team All-America honors on uneven bars, as the Huskers finished fourth, their best finish in school history. In addition to her vault title, she placed sixth on uneven bars, becoming the first Husker gymnast to earn All-America honors in consecutive seasons, as the Huskers finished fifth at the 1990 NCAA Championships.

The first three-time All-America gymnast in school history, Bryant shared the Big Eight all-around title with fellow Husker Lisa McCrady in 1989 with a score of 38.900, while winning the balance beam title as a junior and the vault title as a senior. Bryant finished her career as Nebraska's school record holder in the all-around (39.000) and vault (9.85).

Bryant's contributions to Husker athletics were recognized with her selection as one of Nebraska's 25 Women of Distinction during the Athletic Department's 25-year celebration in April of 2000. Bryant married John McJunkins in 2005 and has a son, Austin, a stepdaughter, Johnna and a stepson, Jaryd. She currently works as an accountant in Benton, Ark.

HEATHER BRINK: THE BEST OF 2000

The 2000 season was the culmination of an outstanding career for Heather Brink. The senior from Lincoln permanently etched her name into the record books, winning two national titles at the NCAA Championships in Boise, Idaho, as the Huskers placed fourth at nationals – equaling their best finish in school history.

Brink became the first Husker female to win an all-around national title, scoring a 39.600 to lead the Huskers to the Super Six Finals for the third time in four years. Entering the final event, Brink was in third place and needed a 9.925 for a share of the all-around title. Brink came through with the finest floor routine of her career, scoring a 9.95 and equaling NU's school record to win by .025 of a point.

In the Super Six Finals one night later, Brink was flawless, posting the top score of the evening with a 39.625, including a 9.95 on vault and a 9.925 on uneven bars, as the Huskers recorded their best finish in 11 years. In the event finals, she won her second NCAA title, placing first on vault with a 9.95, while finishing second on uneven bars (9.925) and eighth on floor exercise (9.80). Overall, she earned five All-America honors (four first-team and one second-team).

For her efforts, she was selected as the Honda Award winner, representing the nation's top female collegiate gymnast. Brink joined softball standout Denise Day (1985) and volleyball players Karen Dahlgren (1987) and Allison Weston (1995) as NU's fourth Honda Award winner. Greichaly Cepero won NU's fifth Honda Award in 2000, as the nation's top volleyball player, while Sarah Pavan added honors in 2006.

The 2000 Big 12 and Region 3 Gymnast of the Year, Brink posted eight of the top 10 all-around totals in school history, including a school record of 39.70 at the NCAA Regional. She also became the first Husker gymnast to score a 10.00, recording the mark on vault against lows State on Feb. 15, one of three perfect 10s during the season. She closed her collegiate career as the most decorated gymnast in school history, earning two NCAA titles, 11 All-America awards, six regional titles and eight conference titles.

Brink joined the Nebraska staff as assistant coach before the 2012 season and was named associate head coach prior to the 2016 season. She will begin her fifth season as head coach in 2023. Brink and her husband, Jon, have two sons. Jaxon and Hunter.

RICHELLE SIMPSON: THE NATION'S FINEST



Richelle Simpson 2003 NCAA All-Around and Floor Exercise Champion

Richelle Simpson holds a special place in Nebraska gymnastics history after her recordsetting performances in 2002, 2003 and 2005.

As the only Husker gymnast to ever earn first-team All-America honors on all four events and the all-around in the same year, Simpson garnered five first-team awards at the 2003 NCAA Championships, leading

the Huskers to a fourth-place national finish at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

Entering the week of the championships as the nation's top-ranked all-arounder, she captured the NCAA all-around crown with a 39.675, edging out 2002 NCAA Champion Jamie Dantzscher of UCLA, who earned the top all-around performance in Session I of the NCAA Preliminaries with a 39.650.

At the NCAA Super Six Finals, Simpson went on to dominate the competition, producing the top individual performance with scores of 9.925 or better on all four events for an all-around total of 39.800. In the individual event finals, Simpson added an NCAA individual floor title (9.963) to her arsenal of accomplishments.

After being granted a medical hardship year in 2004 by the NCAA, Simpson returned with a vengeance in 2005, leading NU to its first-ever No. 1 ranking after the Masters Classic.

The Toronto, Ontario, native provided an unmatched spark in Nebraska's run to the NCAA Super Six Finals, as the Huskers reclaimed the Big 12 Conference championship.

Simpson, the 2005 South Central Regional Co-Gymnast of the Year, holds or shares records in four categories on Nebraska's all-time charts.

Simpson also became NU's first AAI Award winner in 2005, an honor annually given to the nation's top gymnast on the basis of athleticism, academic excellence and civic responsibility.

She capped her career by earning the first NCAA Top Ten Award in the history of Nebraska women's gymnastics. Simpson became NU's 15th student-athlete across all sports to win the Top Ten Award, which is the highest honor given by the NCAA. Nebraska currently leads the nation with 18 all-time NCAA Top Ten Award Winners.

Simpson was also the Big 12 Female Sportsperson of the Year, Nebraska's Female Student-Athlete of the Year and was awarded NCAA and Big 12 Postgraduate Scholarships at the conclusion of her final season in 2005. In the fall of 2015, she was honored as the first women's gymnast in the Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame.

Simpson now lives in Las Vegas and performs in the Cirque du Soleil show Mystère with former Husker gymnast A.J. Lamb. Simpson made her debut with Cirque du Soleil in September 2006 and specializes in Chinese poles and the teeterboard.

NEBRASKA'S ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

For the Nebraska women's gymnastics program, academic success is as paramount as athletic accomplishments. With 11 gymnasts capturing 17 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and 68 women capturing 140 WCGA Scholastic All-America awards since 1994, the Huskers have maintained a high standard of academic excellence and set high expectations at the University of Nebraska.

Since 1988, 11 Husker gymnasts have earned CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition, while Nebraska boasts an NCAA Division I-leading 348Academic All-America honors across all sports.

Mary Ocel was the first NU gymnast to earn Academic All-America status, garnering third-team honors in 1988 with a 3.9 GPA. Jane Clemons earned a third-team spot in 1990 with a 3.663 GPA in addition to her Big Eight all-around title that year. In 1993 and 1994, Nicole Duval was named a third-team academic All-American before garnering first-team accolades as a senior, becoming the only Husker to ever earn the honor three times. Duval also became the first Husker gymnast to be named Nebraska's Female Student-Athlete of the Year in 1994-95.

Joy Taylor, the 1996 Academic All-American Gymnast of the Year, graduated with a 4.0 GPA in biological sciences in 1996. A two-time Academic All-America selection, she was the first Husker female gymnast to earn both athletic and academic All-America honors in the same season. Her teammate, Kim DeHaan, who was a first-team Academic All-America selection, followed in Taylor's footsteps by earning scholastic and athletic honors in the same season.

Bree Dority-O'Callaghan captured third-team Academic All-America and second-team All-America honors on the uneven bars in 2001. She graduated in August 2003 with degrees in economics and finance.

In 2002 and 2003, Jen French was named to the Academic All-America second team, while her teammate Libby Landgraf was named first-team Academic All-American in 2004, becoming the eighth honoree.

Richelle Simpson, who was NU's Female Student-Athlete of the Year in 2004-05, was named to the second team and earned a multitude of national awards in her junior and senior seasons, including the AAI Award and the NCAA Today's Top Ten Award. She was also the NCAA all-around champion in 2003.

Emily Wong earned second-team selection in 2013 and first-team honors in 2014. An 11-time All-American in competition and Nebraska's second AAI Award winner, Wong capped one of the program's most successful senior seasons in 2014. The Big Ten Gymnast of the Year collected numerous awards through her final season at Nebraska and earned her second CoSIDA Academic All-America award.

Danielle Breen is the most recent Husker to earn Academic All-America honors, as she claimed second-team honors in 2017 and first-team accolades in 2018 to become Nebraska's fifth multi-time academic All-American. Breen also earned second-team All-America honors for the Huskers on balance beam in 2017. In 2018, Breen was the first Husker to win the NCAA Elite 90 Award, given to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative GPA competing in the NCAA Championship.
