COMING BACK TO NEBRASKA

Dalmagro becoming the 10th head coach in the history of the Husker program. Dalmagro's time as associate head coach at Nebraska was a rousing success. He helped the Huskers earn a top-60 national ranking in each of his five seasons, including a high of No. 21 in the 2017-18 season. The women's tennis program also excelled academically during his tenure, as the tennis team earned the Herman Award for the top GPA among all women's programs in both 2014 and 2018.

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Dalmagro comes to Nebraska after spending the 2023 season as the head coach of the Arkansas State women's program, adding head coaching

experience to a strong resume of success throughout his career. He returns to Lincoln after serving as the Huskers' associate head coach for five seasons from 2014 to 2018, when he helped Nebraska improve its win total every season.

ALBERTS ON DALMAGRO

"We are excited to welcome German and his family back to Nebraska and look forward to him leading our women's tennis program. German has a strong record of recruiting and developing outstanding players, and he has extensive experience in the Big Ten Conference including his previous success at Nebraska. He was also an excellent collegiate singles and doubles player, allowing him to relate well to the players in his program."

Dalmagro has nearly two decades of overall collegiate coaching experience, including nine seasons in the Big Ten Conference.

GERMAN DALMAGRO

Head Coach | First Season | Córdoba, Argentina

Before taking over the Arkansas State program in January of 2023, Dalmagro was the associate head coach at Illinois for four seasons.

Dalmagro has helped the Illini secure top-25 ranked recruiting classes two out of his final three years in Champaign. In 2022, Illinois wrapped up the regular season with a 15-8 overall record and finished tied for third with an 8-3 record in the Big Ten Conference.

In the 2020-21 campaign, Illinois was 9-9 playing a conference-only schedule, finishing the season with a 4-3 victory over seventh-ranked Northwestern. In November of 2022, he helped the doubles team of Kate Doung and Meagan Heuser win their first professional tournament at the Fighting Illini Women's Open USTA/ITF 15k in Champaign, marking the first pro tournament title by a doubles team in school history.

In Dalmagro's first season in 2018-19, Illinois posted a 16-12 overall record, earning three wins over top-20 programs and seven wins over top-50 opponents. The Illini advanced to the Big Ten Tournament Finals for the first time since 2001 and made the NCAA Tournament.

While with the Illini, Dalmagro assisted in the development of the second All-American in program history, Asuka Kawai. Kawai was the first Illini individual since 2005 to qualify for the NCAA Singles Tournament, reaching the quarterfinals for the best finish in program history.

Dalmagro served as assistant women's

tennis coach at Kansas from 2006 to 2013 helping the program earn seven All-Big 12 singles and doubles honors. The Jayhawks reached the Elite 8 in doubles at the All-American Championships in 2009. The program had 13 Academic All-Big 12 players in his tenure with the Jayhawks.

Dalmagro began his coaching career at the University of West Florida for the 2005-06 season. As an assistant coach for men's and women's tennis, he helped both squads reach the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament. Both squads attained a top-five national ranking as Gulf South CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS.

COLLEGE CAREER

Dalmagro was a standout player at West Florida and Abrahama Baldwin Agricultural College. He helped lead West Florida to back-to-back NCAA Division II Championships in 2004 and 2005 and was part of the 2005 Gulf South Conference champion team and 2004 Gulf South runner-up squad. His career was highlighted by All-America honors in 2004 (doubles), 2003 (singles and doubles) and 2002 (SINGLES AND DOUBLES). He was ranked nationally as high as No. 3 in doubles and No. 11 in singles

Kobelt was an assistant coach at Kenyon College (2018-20), helping lead the team to a No. 11 ITA Division III ranking and two NCAC Conference Championships. She is the sister of Nebraska men's tennis coach Peter Kobelt.

A veteran administrator and College Football Hall of Famer, Trev Alberts was named Vice Chancellor for Athletics at the University of Nebraska on July 14, 2021. Alberts returned to his alma mater after spending 12 years at Nebraska-Omaha, guiding the program through a successful transition to the Division I level.

Alberts' tenure leading UNO athletics was marked by successes in competition and in academics; by transitioning the university's athletic programs to NCAA Division I in 2011; and by establishing new homes for many UNO athletics teams, including Baxter Arena, the Maverick Park baseball/softball complex and the soccer pitch at Caniglia Field.

Alberts took the bold step in announcing that Omaha would reclassify from Division II to Division I in all sports in 2011 and simultaneously securing conference affiliation with the Summit League for all of the department's then-Division Il programs. His vision for UNO's reclassifying teams was demonstrated even before the fouryear transition period had ended. The Omaha baseball team won back-to-back Summit League regular-season championships in 2013 and 2014, while the men's basketball team made its first

Division I postseason appearance in 2014 with a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

During UNO's time in the Division I ranks under Alberts tenure, the Mavericks had six teams and four student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Tournament, including hockey advancing to the Frozen Four in 2015 and men's soccer reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament in the spring of 2021. He also expanded opportunities, adding men's golf and men's soccer in 2011 and Omaha will begin a men's swimming and diving program in 2021-22.

Throughout his tenure in Omaha, Alberts was focused on enhancing the student-athlete experience, including the construction and staffing of the Hamilton Academic Excellence Room and the development of the Ethel S. Abbott Student-Athlete Development Wing. Those efforts paid off in Nebraska-Omaha student-athletes posting consistent collective semester grade point averages above 3.3 for 18 consecutive semesters, including at least a 3.5 in each of his final three semesters.

The facilities around Omaha Athletics received a major uplift during his tenure. Maverick Park opened in March of 2021 to rave reviews as the home to the Mavericks' baseball and softball programs. Funding for the complex, which includes a 1,500-seat baseball facility and a 650-seat softball facility, were raised privately and provided both programs a permanent on-campus home for the first time.

Another crowning achievement was the opening of Baxter Arena in 2015. Alberts directed efforts to secure community support and funding to build the on-campus arena, which allowed the nationally prominent hockey program to play on campus and also serve as the home of the men's and women's basketball and volleyball programs. Caniglia Field underwent renovations in 2012, making it one of the finest collegiate soccer facilities in the country, highlighted by a FIFA 2-star rated playing surface and one of the largest LED videoboards in a soccer-only college facility.

Alberts' work on behalf of hockey, UNO's

established Division I sport, also paid dividends. He successfully guided the Mavericks into the new National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The following year, Omaha reached the 2015 NCAA Frozen Four.

In addition, Alberts and his team led Omaha Athletics into a partnership with Learfield, a national leader in the marketing of collegiate athletics, and developed Omaha Sports Properties. As the exclusive corporate sponsorship sales unit for UNO Athletics, Omaha Sports Properties further enhanced revenue and increased brand prominence locally, regionally and nationally.

As part of UNO's reclassification to Division I, Alberts oversaw the rebranding of UNO athletics with new primary and secondary logos and a greater focus on strengthening the Maverick brand both regionally and nationally.

As a student-athlete, Alberts was an All-American on and off the football field as a Husker Blackshirt. Petitti is a proven leader who brings nearly four decades of sports, business and media industry acumen to the Big Ten Conference. He served as deputy commissioner and chief operating

A 14-time National Sports Emmy Award winner, Petitti has held senior executive roles at CBS Sports and ABC Sports overseeing rights acquisition deals for a variety of sports leagues and collegiate and professional sports events, including the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, regular season men's basketball, college football, NFL, PGA Tour, the Masters, U.S. Open Tennis Championships, and the Little League World Series, as well as leading in the creation of the Bowl Championship Series to determine college football's national champion.

The search for the seventh Big Ten Conference commissioner was led by the Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors' Executive Search Committee. University of Maryland President Darryll J. Pines served as chair alongside University of Minnesota President Joan Gabel, The Ohio State University President Kristina M. Johnson, and Chair of the Council of Presidents and Chancellors and University of Illinois Chancellor Robert Jones.

"The Big Ten Conference is in an extraordinary position of strength. He closely collaborated with 30 MLB team owners and presidents, and key business and operational partners to incorporate ideas and feedback to improve the creation and execution of strategic initiatives. Petitti also participated on MLB's Competition Committee.
































CHAMPIONS IN ATHLETICS, ACADEMICS, LIFE

The Nebraska women's tennis program has established itself as a national contender. In 2013, the Huskers advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 and played host to the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time. It was Nebraska's sixth NCAA appearance in an eight-year span.

Coach Scott Jacobson is in his 31st season as the winningest coach in Nebraska tennis history. He helped 2013 All-American Mary Weatherholt to a second-place finish at the 2013 NCAA Singles Championship. Weatherholt added an NCAA Elite Eight finish alongside fellow 2013 All-American Patricia Veresova in doubles. Weatherholt also captured the 17th of Nebraska's NCAA-leading 18 NCAA Top Ten Award, after being named Nebraska's Female Student-Athlete of the Year.



Left: Mary Weatherholt set the all-time record for career wins at 208, the first and only women's player in Nebraska history to surpass the 200-win mark. Weatherholt was the 2013 NCAA Singles runner-up, 2013 NCAA/ITA All-American in both singles and doubles, Big Ten Women's Tennis Athlete-of-the-year in both 2012 and 2013 and earned the NCAA Top Ten Award for her performance on the court, in the classroom and community.
