### SCOUTING THE PURDUE BOILERMAKERS

Third-year head coach Katie Gearlds led Purdue to the NCAA First Four last season, finishing with a 19-11 overall record that included a 9-8 Big Ten mark. This season, Purdue worked its way to a 6-3 start, but has gone 3-8 since with six consecutive Big Ten losses dating back to a 77-76 win over Rutgers in West Lafavette, Ind. (Jan. 2).

Purdue is 8-3 at home this year with its only losses coming to current top-10 Big Ten foes lowa (96-71), Indiana (74-68) and Ohio State (71-68). The Boilermakers are just 1-8 away from Mackey Arena, including 1-6 in true road games.

Fifth-year guard Abbey Ellis, who was a Cal Poly transfer prior to 2021-22, leads an experienced Purdue backcourt with 13.8 points and 3.4 rebounds. The 5-6 Australian attacks the rim and knows how to get to the free throw line.

Fifth-year point guard Jeanae Terry, who started her career at Illinois, has joined Ellis and true senior guard Madison ayden in Purdue's starting backcourt for all 20 games. The 5-11 Terry averages 5.7 points and team bests of 7.1 rebounds. and 5.8 assists while leading the team in steals with 31. Layden, a 6-1 guard, has added 10.3 points and leads Purdue in three-point shooting at 47.8 percent (43-90).

Caitlyn Harper, a graduate transfer from Cal Baptist in her second season on the court at Purdue, also has started all 20 games, averaging 10.8 points and 4.1 rebounds. The 6-2 forward is shooting a team-best 54.1 percent from the field. Purdue features two of the Big Ten's top freshmen in starter Mary Ashley Stevenson and key reserve Rashunda Jones. Stevenson, a 6-2 forward, is averaging 9.4 points and 5.4 rebounds. Jones, a 5-8 guard, has added 9.7 points and 2.5 rebounds while playing more minutes than any other Boiler reserve. A third freshman, Sophie Swanson, has added 5.7 points with consistent three-point shooting (.395) over 13 games. She missed time early this season recovering from injury.

Junior Jayla Smith returns as a significant contributor from a year ago (7.8 ppg, 2.1 rpg), but her production has slipped to 3.7 ppg, 1.6 rpg in about five fewer minutes per game.

As a team, Purdue is averaging 68.7 points while allowing 68.9 points per game The Boilermakers have hit just 42.2 percent of their shots from the field, but have hit a strong 34.1 percent of their threes. They are also a solid 77.6 percent at the free throw line. Defensively, Purdue opponents are hitting 42.6 percent from the field, including a sizzling 35.5 percent from three and 77.4 percent at the free throw line. Purdue is basically even with the opposition on the boards and in the turnover department.

#### HUSKERS SET FOR KEY CLASH WITH PURDUE

Nebraska returns home tonight after a two-game Big Ten road trip hoping to get back on the winning track against the Purdue Boilermakers.

While the Huskers are hungry for a win after taking back-to-back losses at Penn State (Jan. 21) and No. 5 Iowa (Jan. 27), the Boilermakers come to Lincoln trying to snap a six-game losing streak.

Although Purdue carries just a 9-11 overall record and a 2-7 Big Ten mark, the Boilers battled Ohio State to a 71-68 decision in West Lafayette on Sunday, before the Buckeyes moved into the national top 10 in the AP Poll on Monday. Purdue also played in-state rival and current top-10 Indiana within six points (74-68) at Mackey Arena on Jan. 21.

Nebraska and Purdue feature two of the best freshman classes in the Big Ten. The Husker first-year players are led by 6-2 forward Natalie Potts. The five-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week ranks second among conference freshmen in scoring (10.6 ppg) while leading all league freshmen in rebounding (5.6 rpg), field goal percentage (.556) and free throw percentage (.841).

Potts will go head-to-head with 6-2 Purdue freshman Mary Ashley Stevenson, who ranks fourth among Big Ten freshmen in scoring (9.4 ppg) and second in rebounding (5.4 rpg). Purdue's top player off the bench is Rashunda Jones, who ranks third among Big Ten freshman scorers (9.7 ppg).

Logan Nissley (5.9 ppg) and Jessica Petrie (4.2 ppg) add firepower to Nebraska's freshman class, while Sophie Swanson (5.7 ppg) gives the Purdue freshman class three significant contributors as well. Nebraska's top three freshmen have combined for 411 points and 188 rebounds, while Purdue's top three rookies have teamed up for 417 points and 162 rebounds.

The Huskers hit the turn at the halfway point in the Big Ten Conference regularseason schedule with a 5-4 mark, matching Michigan and Michigan State in a tie for fifth place in the league standings. Nebraska owns a head-to-head tiebreaker over both Michigan schools and one-game leads over Maryland and Minnesota, who are tied for eighth in the conference at 4-5.

The Huskers also own the head-to-head tiebreaker with Maryland. Minnesota defeated Nebraska earlier this season in Minneapolis, but the Huskers will have a chance to avenge that loss in Lincoln on Feb. 24.

Iowa, Indiana and Ohio State sit atop the Big Ten standings in a three-way tie for first at 8-1, while Penn State is alone in fourth place at 6-3.

#### NEBRASKA VS. PURDUE SERIES

• Purdue leads the all-time series with Nebraska, 10-8, but the Huskers have won back-to-back games in the series, including a 71-64 victory at Mackey Arena last season (Jan. 18, 2023). Alexis Markowski led Nebraska with 19 points and 10 rebounds, while Maddie Krull pumped in 15 points despite coming off the bench while battling illness. Sam Haiby closed the game strong with 14 points, while Callin Hake and Kendall Moriarty each contributed eight big points off the bench. Abbey Ellis led Purdue with 20 points on 4-of-7 three-point shooting. Caitlyn Harper contributed 15 points, while Jayla Smith put three Boilers in double figures with 11 points, seven rebounds and four assists.

• Nebraska snapped a three-game series losing streak to Purdue with an 81-66 win in Lincoln (Jan. 30, 2022). Alexis Markowski led four Huskers in double figures with 23 points and seven rebounds. Nebraska hit 11-of-20 threes against Purdue, including a 3-for-3 shooting night from Markowski.

• Jayla Smith led Purdue in Lincoln with 16 points in 21 minutes off the bench,

## THREE THINGS TO WATCH

Graduate guard Jaz Shelley and junior center Alexis Markowski have both moved into the top 25 on Nebraska's career points list. Markowski ranks 23rd with 1,148 points, while Shelley is 24th with 1,145. Both are closing in on Nebraska's first 1,000-point scorer Jan Crouch, who had 1,183 points (1976-79) at No. 22. Isabelle Bourne sits at 21st (1,218), while Hannah Whitish is No. 20 (1,228).

f 2 Alexis Markowski has been a double-double machine for the Big Red this season, producing 13 double-doubles through Nebraska's first 20 games. She ranks No. 4 in Husker history with 34 career double-doubles and is just two shy of 1993 Wade Trophy winner Karen Jennings, who ranks third at Nebraska with 36. Kelsey Griffin (2006-10) and Jordan Hooper (2011-14) share Nebraska's career double-doubles record with 40. Jennings, Griffin and Hooper were all first-team All-Americans who had their Nebraska jerseys retired. Griffin set the Nebraska single-season double-doubles record with 20 in 2009-10.

**3** Alexis Markowski leads the Big Ten with 10.6 rebounds per game, which ranks as the second-best rebounding average in school history behind only school-record holder Janet Smith (13.5 rpg, Jr., 1980-81). Only five Huskers in history have averaged doublefigure rebounds in a season at Nebraska.

including a 4-for-4 effort from three-point range. Cassidy Hardin added 11 points, including a trio of three-pointers, as Purdue sank 10-of-31 threes.

• In the first-ever meeting between the two schools in women's basketball, Nebraska fought its way to an epic 93-89 triple-overtime win at Mackey Arena (Feb. 2, 2012). Later that same season, Purdue defeated the Huskers 74-70 in double-overtime in the Big Ten Championship Game in Indianapolis.

• The third game between the schools also went overtime, a 69-66 loss for the Huskers in Lincoln on Jan. 5, 2013. None of the other 14 games in the series have gone overtime. • After winning the series opener in 2011-12, Nebraska suffered five straight losses

to Purdue. Since 2014-15, Nebraska owns a 7-5 edge in the series.
