The Nebraska softball travels to Las Cruces, N.M., this weekend for five games in three days on the campus of New Mexico State University.

The Huskers open their schedule with their first two true road games of the season, taking on New Mexico State on Friday in a doubleheader scheduled to start at 4 p.m. (Central). On Saturday, the Huskers face Montana at 10:30 a.m. (Central) followed by a game against Sacramento State at 1 p.m. (Central). Nebraska closes out the tournament on Sunday at 10 a.m. (Central) with a second game against Sacramento State.

All five games this week - and every game this season - will have a free radio broadcast with Nate Rohr on the call. The radio broadcast is available at Huskers.com/listen and on the official Huskers app.

Nebraska went 2-2 in Mexico last weekend at the season-opening Puerto Vallarta College Challenge. The Huskers opened the season with back-to-back losses to current top-10 teams (No. 5 Washington and No. 10 Duke). NU rebounded to win its next two games, defeating Long Beach State (7-2) and Utah Valley (3-2).

The Huskers' three opponents this weekend combined for a 9-4 record last week. New Mexico State went 4-0 at home, Montana went 2-3 in Louisiana and Sacramento State went 3-1 while hosting three home games and playing a road contest at UC Davis.

LEADING OFF

- Nebraska has won 31 of its last 37 games at the NM State Softball Complex, dating back to the 2011 season.
- Two of NU's three most recent no-hitters have come in Las Cruces against this week's opponents (2023 at New Mexico State and 2015 vs. Montana).
- **Billie Andrews** has started 163 consecutive games at shortstop. She has also hit leadoff for the Huskers in 70 straight games.
- Andrews has six games with multiple home runs in her career. The Nebraska record for most career multi-homer games is seven by Tristen Edwards.
- With five extra-base hits last week, Andrews became the eighth player in NU history with 75 career extra-base hits.
- **Katelyn Caneda** has started 62 consecutive games at second base.
- **Sarah Harness** went 2-0 in Las Cruces last season, allowing only one hit in 11.0 scoreless innings. That included a no-hitter against New Mexico State, Nebraska's first seven-inning no-hitter since 2007.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is one win shy of recording her 1,100th win as a Husker. Only two active Division I coaches have won 1,100 games at their current schools (Patty Gasso and Patrick Murphy).

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Billie Andrews, a returning All-American who is ranked as the No. 42 overall player in the country, had five extra-base hits in four games last week, including a pair of home runs.



Kaylin Kinney was the winning pitcher in each of NU's two wins last week. She threw a combined 7.1 innings of scoreless, two-hit relief in victories over Long Beach State and Utah Valley.

• **Rhonda Revelle** has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.

• Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

• Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.

• Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,403 of Nebraska's 1,580 all-time victories (89 percent).

• Nebraska is scheduled to play 21 home games, which would tie for the most regular-season home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.

• NU has 21 home games scheduled along with 15 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.

• Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.

• Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.

• The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

KINNEY & ANDREWS SISTERS HIGHLIGHT OPENING WEEKEND

Nebraska posted a 2-2 record at the season-opening Puerto Vallarta College Challenge last week in Mexico. The Huskers opened the season with a pair of losses to ranked opponents Washington (No. 7) and Duke (No. 11) before defeating Long Beach State and Utah Valley.

- **Kaylin Kinney** returned to action for the first time since February of 2023. Kinney pitched in three of Nebraska's four games in Mexico, posting a 2-1 record with a 2.27 ERA. She earned the win in relief against both Long Beach State and Utah Valley, combining to pitch 7.1 shutout innings with only two hits allowed in those wins. Kinney limited opposing hitters to a .200 average in the tournament, while allowing only two extra-base hits (both doubles).
- **Billie Andrews** averaged more than one extra-hit per game in Mexico. She finished the tournament with a .357 average (5-for-14) with two doubles, one triple and two home runs. Andrews led Nebraska in hits (5), runs (4), doubles (2), triples (1) and home runs (2).
- **Brooke Andrews** produced four of Nebraska's 11 RBIs in the opening week. In addition to the run production, Andrews was second on the team in batting average (.222) and hits (2).

HUSKERS HAVE IMPRESSIVE HISTORY IN LAS CRUCES

Nebraska has played 110 games in Las Cruces in its 49-year history. The Huskers boast a 76-34 all-time record in Las Cruces, including a 42-14 mark under Rhonda Revelle.

- Nebraska is 28-6 in its last seven trips to Las Cruces, which dates back to 2012. Overall, the Huskers have won 31 of their last 37 games at the NM State Softball Complex.
- Offensively, Nebraska's active hitters - minus Abbie Squier who is out for the season - boast a collective .331 batting average in Las Cruces.
- **Billie Andrews** has hit .351 in her 10 games at the NM State Softball Complex with five homers, seven extra-base hits and 11 RBIs.
- **Sydney Gray** is 9-for-30 (.300) with four homers and 12 RBIs in 10 games in Las Cruces.
- As freshmen last year in Las Cruces, **Ashley Smetter** (2-for-2, 2B), **Talia Tokheim** (2-for-3, 1 HR, 2 RBIs), **Katelyn Caneda** (5-for-10, 1 HR, 6 RBIs) and **Alina Felix** (2-for-5, 1 2B, 1 HR, 3 RBIs) combined to go 11-for-20 (.550) with two doubles, three home runs and 11 RBIs.
- **Ava Bredwell** (.333) and **Caitlynn Neal** (.318) are also career .300 hitters in Las Cruces.
- In the circle, **Sarah Harness** and **Kaylin Kinney** are a combined 3-0 with one save and a 0.50 ERA at the NM State Softball Complex. The duo have combined to allow only two runs and just one extra-base hit (a double) in 25.0 career innings in Las Cruces.
- Last season, Kinney and Harness threw 25 of Nebraska's 31 innings in Las Cruces and combined to go 3-0 with a one save and a 0.28 ERA with 24 strikeouts and only three walks.
- Harness went 2-0 last season, allowing only one hit in 11.0 scoreless innings. She threw a seven-inning no-hitter with 10 strikeouts against New Mexico State.
- In what proved to be her final action of the 2023 season, Kinney went 1-0 in Las Cruces, allowing one run in 14.0 innings. She surrendered only one run in 6.0 innings against No. 4 Oklahoma State and finished the tournament with 12 strikeouts and no walks.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers are dealing with multiple injuries. **Jordy Bahl** and **Abbie Squier** are out for the season, while three other players are currently sidelined by injury.

Dakota Carter was unavailable in the opening weekend and is listed as day-to-day, while **Abbey Newlun** and **Talia Tokehim** are both out as they continue to recover from offseason knee surgery. Additionally, **Peyton Cody** was limited to pinch-hit duty in the opening weekend as she battles injuries.

Nebraska has six players currently hampered by injury, with three of those players having previously been all-conference and all-region performers. With Bahl going down in Nebraska's first game of the season, this marks the second straight season that the Huskers lost one of their primary pitchers in the opening month of the season (Kaylin Kinney last year).

WHAT NEBRASKA RETURNS ON OFFENSE IN 2024

Nebraska returns the majority of its offensive production from 2023 even with **Abbie Squier** out for the year. The Huskers must replace only three hitters from last season - including Squier - while returning 14 hitters, including six who had at least 150 plate appearances in 2023.

- From a production standpoint, Nebraska's available returning players accounted for more than 70 percent of the 2023 team totals in at bats, hits, doubles, triples, home runs, runs, RBIs and walks. Nebraska returns its 2023 statistical leader in every offensive category.
- Third-team All-American **Billie Andrews** is back after leading NU with 16 homers, 29 extra-base hits, 50 runs, 28 walks, a .677 slugging percentage and a .441 on-base percentage last season. She ranked sixth in school history in extra-base hits and seventh in home runs.
- All-Big Ten and all-region selection **Katelyn Caneda** returns after she led NU with a .366 batting average in 2023. The .366 average was the third-highest mark by a freshman in school history while Caneda was the first freshman to lead NU in average since 2013.
- **Brooke Andrews** led Nebraska with 45 RBIs last season and was second on the team with a .575 slugging percentage while earning all-conference and all-region recognition.
- Rounding out Nebraska's four returning .300 hitters is **Caitlynn Neal**, who batted .307 last season and led the Huskers with 14 doubles.
- **Sydney Gray** is a career .305 hitter, and she was an all-region selection in 2022 after batting .313 that season with eight doubles, 11 home runs and 45 RBIs.
- **Ava Bredwell**, the 2022 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, hit .285 last season and was second on the team with 36 runs scored.
- Sophomores **Talia Tokheim**, **Alina Felix** and **Ashley Smetter** are back after being productive in limited action as freshmen last season. Tokheim hit .359 with 10 extra-base hits in only 39 at bats before suffering a season-ending injury. Felix started 10 games and hit .259 while scoring seven runs. Smetter was 3-for-8 (.375) in limited at bats with one double.
- Nebraska has four other hitters - **Dakota Carter**, **Mckinley Malecha**, **Abbey Newlun** and **Haidyn Warner** - who all had at bats in 2023.

WHAT NEBRASKA RETURNS IN THE CIRCLE IN 2024

Nebraska returns two its four pitchers from last season. That includes the return of **Kaylin Kinney**, who had a 0.84 ERA while appearing in seven of the first 15 games last year before missing the rest of the year with an injury. NU must replace Courtney Wallace, who appeared in 48 of Nebraska's 58 games in 2023 and picked up the win or save in 28 of the Huskers' 36 wins.

- **Sarah Harness** appeared in 31 games last season with 25 starts, posting a 10-5 record with a 3.40 ERA. A former all-conference and all-region selection at Southern Illinois, Harness led Nebraska in ERA, strikeouts per seven innings (6.3) and opponent average (.230) in 2023.

A LOOK AT THE EIGHT NEBRASKA NEWCOMERS

Nebraska returns 16 players from last year's roster, but the Huskers also welcome eight newcomers in 2024. The eight newcomers include three Division I transfers and five freshmen.

- **Jordy Bahl**, who suffered a season-ending injury in Nebraska's first game, was a first-team All-American and the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year in both 2022 and 2023. She boasts a 44-3 career record and a 1.06 ERA in the circle with a .350 career batting average.
- **Peyton Cody** transferred to Nebraska for her sixth season after spending the last five years at St. John's. Cody started 139 games at St. John's and posted a .316 average with 29 doubles, 20 home runs and 100 RBIs. She was the Big East co-Freshman of the Year in 2019, when she was also a first-team all-conference and third-team all-region selection.

Nebraska has won 65 games in its 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (65-56). The 65 postseason wins rank 20th in NCAA history.

Huskers have combined to earn 30 Academic All-America honors, a total that ranks third among all Division I softball programs.

29 ALL-AMERICANS
A total of 18 Huskers have combined for 29 All-America awards, including seven multi-time All-Americans.

26 NCAA TOURNAMENTS
The Huskers have made 26 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 26 postseason appearances rank 14th in NCAA history.

23 REVELLE ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has guided 15 players to a total of 23 All-America awards in her first 31 seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

20 CONFERENCE TITLES
Nebraska has won a total of 20 conference championships. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six Big 12 crowns and have captured a pair of Big Ten titles.

15 TOP-25 RANKINGS
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

14 REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

7 WCWS APPEARANCES
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

4 SOFTBALL OLYMPIANS
Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

- Omaha native **Bella Bacon** joins the Huskers after spending her freshman season at Purdue. Bacon started three games last week after batting .250 at Purdue in 2023.
- Freshman **Samantha Bland** was a two-time league MVP and two-time Los Angeles Times all-star for Chino Hills High School in California. Bland started every game last week.
- **Emmerson Cope** was the nation's No. 26 overall recruit. Cope, who started three games last week, hit .577 as a high school senior with 15 home runs and 43 RBIs.
- **Elisa Gulfin** was a standout pitcher for Saint Paul High School in California. She was the Del Ray League Pitcher of the Year and a first-team all-league and all-area selection.
- Nebraska's first left-handed pitcher since 2018, **Caitlin Olensky** is just the second New Jersey native to play for the Huskers. Olensky was ranked as the nation's No. 60 overall recruit after posting a 0.92 career ERA and .449 career batting average at Montville High. Olensky made two relief appearances against ranked opponents last week.
- Lincoln native **Malia Thoms** was a four-time all-conference and four-time all-state selection for Waverly High School. She was tabbed as the No. 42 recruit in the country by Extra Inning Softball.

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in home runs and ranks in the top three in three other categories, and she also ranks highly among the active national leaders as well.

- Andrews leads all active Big Ten players in home runs (45) while ranking second in runs (140) and hits (176) and third in RBIs (114).
- Nationally, Andrews ranks 16th among all active players in home runs (45) and is 23rd in total bases (345) and 26th in runs (140).

ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection. In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

HUSKERS RANKED AMONG NATION'S TOP PLAYERS

In its preseason list of the top 100 players in the country, D1Softball ranked two Huskers among the nation's top 50 players. **Jordy Bahl**, who suffered a season-ending injury in game one this season, was tabbed as the No. 2 player in the country, while shortstop **Billie Andrews** was ranked as the No. 42 player nationally. Both were also ranked among the nation's top 10 players at their position, as was sophomore **Katelyn Caneda**.

- Nebraska and Indiana were the only Big Ten teams with multiple players on the D1Softball Top 100. Bahl and Andrews were the No. 1 and No. 2-ranked Big Ten players on the list.
- Bahl was the only Big Ten player named to the 50-player preseason watch list for the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award. She has been one of 10 finalists for the award in each of her first two collegiate seasons.
- Bahl is also one of only three active pitchers who is a multi-time All-American along with Clemson's Valerie Cagle and Oklahoma's Kelly Maxwell.
- Andrews was the highest-ranked Big Ten position player on the D1Softball Top 100. She came in at No. 5 on D1Softball's list of the top shortstops.
- Andrews is one of only five returning 2023 All-America shortstops, along with Florida's Skylar Wallace, UCLA's Mya Brady, Kentucky's Erin Coffel and Boston's Kayla Roncin.
- Caneda, the only Big Ten player named to the all-conference, all-freshman and all-tournament teams in 2023, was ranked as the nation's No. 9 second baseman. Nebraska had the highest-ranked pitcher, second baseman and shortstop in the Big Ten Conference.

SCOUTING NEW MEXICO STATE (4-0)

New Mexico State opened its season with four home wins last weekend. The Aggies swept doubleheaders from Monmouth and Abilene Christian, outscoring their opponents 26-6. NMSU hit .308 as a team while averaging 6.5 runs per game. The Aggies allowed only 1.5 runs per game and posted a 0.81 ERA with a .967 fielding percentage.

- **Kayla Lunar** led the way offensively last week batting .556 (5-for-9) with a triple and three RBIs. **Devin Elam** also hit .500 in the opening weekend, going 3-for-6 with a pair of RBIs. **Riley Carley** gave NMSU a third .400 hitter as she batted .444 (4-for-9) with five RBIs.
- **Desirae Spearman**, the reigning Conference USA Freshman of the Week, hit .364 in the opening weekend with a triple, two homers and five RBIs.
- **Spearman** was also the Aggies' top pitcher last week, as New Mexico State used three primary pitchers in the opening weekend. Spearman threw half of the team's innings, posting a 0.00 ERA in 13 innings en route to a 2-0 record. She struck out 14 and did not allow an extra-base hit while limiting opponents to a .213 average.
- **Emily Dix** and **Jaileen Mancha** saw the most action behind Spearman. Dix went 2-0 with one save and a 0.84 ERA in 8.1 innings. Mancha was 1-0 last week with a 1.75 ERA in 4.0 innings. **Laurali Patane** (0-0, 10.50 ERA in 0.2 IP) rounds out the Aggie staff.
- **Kathy Rodolph** is in her 21st season at New Mexico State, where she owns a 582-505 record. The Aggies' all-time wins leader, Rodolph led NMSU to 10 total WAC conference championships before the Aggies moved to Conference USA this season.

- A Montana native, **Melanie Meuchel** is in her seventh season as the Griz head coach. Meuchel owns a 113-170 record with the Griz and as a collegiate head coach.

Sacramento State went 3-1 in the opening weekend. The Hornets lost a 1-0 decision to Cal Poly in their season opener before winning their next three games against San Jose State, Middle Tennessee and UC Davis by a combined score of 17-5. Sacramento State hit .356 last weekend while averaging 4.3 runs per game. Defensively, the Hornets committed only one error in four games while posting a 1.35 ERA and allowing just 1.5 runs per game.
