The Nebraska softball team plays its first home games this weekend when the Cornhuskers welcome Wichita State and Missouri to Bowlin Stadium for a three-team round-robin Big Red Invitational. The tournament begins with a single game on Friday followed by three games on Saturday and two games on Sunday.

One ticket is good for admission into each game that day. Fans can purchase tickets by visiting Huskers.com/softball, by calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED or by visiting the Bowlin Stadium ticket office beginning one hour prior to the first game of the day. Fans unable to attend can watch every Husker game this weekend with a subscription to Big Ten+ or listen to a free radio broadcast of every Nebraska game on Huskers.com/listen. A subscription to Big Ten+ is available for as low as $\$ 9.95$ per month.

Nebraska opens the tournament at 5:30 p.m. Friday against Wichita State. The Huskers and Shockers played two classic games in the NCAA Tournament last year, with Wichita State rallying for a win in the first round followed by Nebraska rallying for a win the next day in an elimination game. On Saturday, NU is scheduled to take on Wichita State again at 1:30 p.m.

Nebraska's second game on Saturday is against No. 14 Missouri at 4 p.m. The Huskers wrap up the Big Red Invitational with a Sunday matchup against the Tigers scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Nebraska and Missouri have not met since 2020, and the Tigers are the first SEC team Nebraska has hosted at Bowlin Stadium since Georgia in the 2007 NCAA Lincoln Regional.

## LEADING OFF

■ Friday's game will tie for the earliest home game in school history. The 2006 squad also played its first home game on March 1.

- NU is five games into a stretch where the Huskers play 10 consecutive games against 2023 NCAA Tournament teams.
- The Huskers are the only Big Ten team without a complete game this season.

■ NU leads the Big Ten and ranks 23rd nationally with 27 doubles.

- The Huskers lead the Big Ten and rank 14th nationally in double plays per game (0.6).

■ Five of Nebraska's eight returning allregion players have missed multiple games due to injury this season.

- Missouri is the first SEC team to play at Bowlin Stadium since Georgia in the 2007 NCAA Lincoln Regional.
- Billie Andrews has six home runs in 10 games this season. She is one of only two players nationally with six or more home runs in 10 or fewer games.
- Ava Bredwell is expected to make her 100th career start at catcher on Friday.

■ Emmerson Cope ranks 11th nationally with two saves, one shy of the Nebraska freshman record.

Billie Andrews was named the Big Ten Player of the Week after going 13 -for- 21 in five games last weekend. In three games vs. top-25 opponents, Andrews was 10 -for-13 with four home runs.


Samantha Bland went 6-for-15 (.400) with two doubles and her first two career home runs last weekend. She drove in eight runs, ranking fifth in RBIs among all players in the 30-team field.

- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,409 of Nebraska's 1,586 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 21 home games, which would tie for the most regular-season home games in the 23year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 21 home games scheduled along with 15 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

## HUSKERS SET FOR 23RD SEASON AT BOWLIN STADIUM

Nebraska plays its first home games this weekend. This year marks the 23rd season the Huskers have called Bowlin Stadium home, dating back to the stadium's first season in 2002.

- Nebraska is playing its home opener on March 1. That is believed to tie for the earliest home game in program history. In 2006, NU hosted Division II Missouri Western in a doubleheader on March 1, impromptu games that were added to the schedule one day earlier.
- The Huskers own a 263-110 all-time record at Bowlin Stadium. Nebraska has posted a winning record at Bowlin Stadium every season except 2019 (7-9) and 2020, when the season was canceled prior to NU playing a home game.
- Nebraska has won its home opener in each of the past three seasons. Overall, NU owns a 17-4 record in its first home game of the season since Bowlin Stadium opened in 2002.
- The matchup with Wichita State will mark the fourth time Nebraska has opened its home schedule against the Shockers. NU went 2-0 against Wichita State in the home-opening weekend of the 2022 season. In 2018, the Huskers and Shockers played a three-game series at Bowlin Stadium with Wichita State winning two of the three games. The teams also played a three-game series in 2016 with Nebraska winning two of the three games.
- Bowlin Stadium will have a new look this spring as additional seating has been added after more than 1,700 season tickets were sold. The previous grass berms behind each dugout have been converted to permanent chairback seats, while two additional bleachers have been added on the third-base concourse and one on the first-base concourse.


## BILLIE ANDREWS NAMED NCAA \& BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Billie Andrews was named the Big Ten Softball Player of the Week Monday following an outstanding performance at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic. Andrews was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for the second time in her career, and she was then honored as the NCAA National Player of the Week on Tuesday.

- Andrews put up impressive numbers in five games against top competition. She went 13-for-21 (.619) at the Mary Nutter Classic with one double, four home runs, six RBls, eight runs scored and a 1.238 slugging percentage. Her staggering statistics came as Nebraska played three ranked opponents and a fourth team who is receiving votes in the polls. All five of Nebraska's games last weekend were against 2023 NCAA Tournament teams.
- The Mary Nutter Classic featured 30 teams, including nine ranked teams and two more teams receiving votes in the coaches' poll. Among that impressive field, Andrews led all players in hits, home runs and slugging percentage while ranking third in batting average and runs scored. Andrews had a hit in all five games, including a two-hit game, two three-hit efforts and a four-hit game.
- Andrews was at her best in Nebraska's three games against ranked teams last weekend. She went 3 -for-5 with two home runs, two RBIs and three runs against No. 19 UCLA. The next day, Andrews was 3 -for- 4 with a home run, two RBls and three runs scored against No. 23 Oregon. On the final day of the tournament, Andrews went 4-for-4 with another homer against No. 20 Utah. In the Huskers' three games against top- 25 teams at the Mary Nutter Classic, Andrews went 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBls and seven runs scored.


## BILLIE ANDREWS STARS IN ANOTHER BIG TOURNAMENT

The Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic and the Clearwater Invitational are widely considered the top two regular-season tournaments in college softball. The Huskers have played in each of the prestigious tournaments over the past two seasons with Billie Andrews producing impressive numbers in both events while facing some of the best teams in the country.

- Nebraska faced four top-10 teams in five games at the 2023 Clearwater Invitational. In those five games, Andrews hit . 385 (5-for-13) with one double, three home runs and four RBIs. She slugged 1.154 at the tournament.
- Last week at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, Nebraska played three of its five games against ranked teams. Andrews shined again, batting .619 (13-for-21) at the tournament with four home runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage.
- In three games against ranked opponents (UCLA, Oregon and Utah) last weekend, Andrews was 10 -for- 13 (.769) with four home runs.

## FRESHMEN BATS SHINE AT MARY NUTTER COLLEGIATE CLASSIC

Nebraska freshmen Samantha Bland and Emmerson Cope came up big with the bat last weekend in a challenging five-game schedule at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic. Each player hit their first career home run last weekend.

- Bland and Cope combined to go 9-for-22 (.409) with two doubles, three home runs and 12 RBIs last weekend. They combined for 50 percent of Nebraska's RBI total (12 of 24).
- Bland went 6-for-15 with two doubles and her first two career home runs. She led Nebraska - and ranked fifth in the 30-team tournament - with eight RBls while ranking second on the team in hits, doubles and home runs. She was 5 -for-11 with two doubles, two home runs and seven RBIs in Nebraska's three games against ranked opponents (UCLA, Oregon and Utah).
- Bland tied her career high in hits (2) twice in California while also tying her career high with two doubles against No. 19 UCLA and driving in a career-high four runs against No. 20 Utah.
- Cope went 3-for-7 (.429) with a home and four RBIs at the Mary Nutter Classic. She ranked second on the team in batting average last weekend and was third in RBls. Cope hit a threerun homer against Cal State Fullerton as part of a 3-for-3 day that included career highs in hits (3) and RBIs (3).
- Cope also pitched in three games at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, including starting Nebraska's win over Cal State Fullerton and allowing only one run in a start against San Diego State.


## TRANSFER HITTERS MAKING A BIG IMPACT

Nebraska first-year transfers Bella Bacon and Peyton Cody have both proven to be big additions to the Husker lineup. Together, the duo are batting . 391 (25-for-64) this season with five doubles, two home runs and 11 RBIs.

- Bacon, who spent her freshman season at Purdue in 2023, has started 13 of Nebraska's 14 games at first base this season. The Omaha native is tied for the team lead in walks (4) and ranks second in hits (13) and runs (10) and fourth in batting average (.351) and doubles (3). Bacon also ranks second on the team with four multi-hit games.
- Bacon had 32 at bats as a freshman at Purdue in 2023 and has 37 at bats through her first three weeks as a Husker. Her production has improved dramatically at Nebraska, as Bacon has already exceeded her 2023 season total in hits (13-8), doubles (3-0), RBIs (6-5) and runs (10-1) while matching last year's total with four walks.
- A sixth-year player who spent her first five seasons at St. John's, Cody was limited to pinchhitting duties during the first weekend, going 1 -for-2 as a pinch hitter. She has returned in a big way, starting eight games the past two weeks and going 11-for-26 (.423) with two doubles, two homers and five RBIs in those eight starts.
- On the season, Cody leads Nebraska with a 500 on-base percentage and ranks second on the team in batting average (.444) and slugging percentage (.741) and is third in hits (12), home runs (2) and walks (3).

## HUSKERS PITCHING BY COMMITTEE IN 2024

Nebraska has used multiple pitchers in every game this season, utilizing a "pitching by committee" approach. The Huskers have used at least two pitchers in all 14 games, including seven games where three or more pitchers were utilized.

- Nebraska is the only Big Ten team who has not had a pitcher throw a complete game this season. While no Husker pitcher has thrown a complete game, 30 Big Ten pitchers have thrown a complete game, combining for a total of 52 complete games.
- The Huskers have had five pitchers start a game this season. That is a first for Rhonda Revelle, as Nebraska had never used more than four starting pitchers in a season since she took over the program in 1993.
- In this new approach, the staff has been particularly effective in relief. Nebraska's staff has combined to post a 6-3 record with a 2.66 ERA in 44.2 relief innings compared to a 2-3 record with a 3.87 ERA in 47.0 innings as the starter. Opponents are hitting only .218 against NU's relief pitchers with just four extra-base hits in 165 at bats.
- Sarah Harness has been NU's most effective starter, despite a record of only 1-0. Harness has started six of the Huskers' 14 games and owns a 1.62 ERA in 21.2 innings as a starter.
- Nebraska's other pitchers have been effective in relief as Kaylin Kinney, Caitlin Olensky and Emmerson Cope all own a lower ERA as a reliever than a starter. Kinney is $3-3$ with one save as a reliever with a 3.05 ERA over seven appearances and 20.2 innings. Olensky is 2-0 as a reliever with a 2.21 ERA in 12.2 innings. Cope is $1-0$ with two saves and a 1.31 ERA in four relief appearances totaling 5.1 innings.

## GRAY NAMED BIG TEN CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Third baseman Sydney Gray was named the Big Ten Softball Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 19 following an outstanding weekend at the Troy Cox Classic in New Mexico.

- Gray won the second Big Ten weekly award of her career, as she was also the co-player of the week on Feb. 21, 2022.
- Gray went 5-for-16 in New Mexico with three homers and 10 RBls. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five contests and fielded all 19 chances at third base.
- Gray drove in the game-winning run in NU's victory over New Mexico State on Feb. 16. She then went 2 -for-5 in a pair of wins on Feb. 17 with a homer, three runs scored and three RBIs.
- In the final game against defending Big Sky regular-season champion Sacramento State on Feb. 18, Gray powered the Huskers' 8-3 come-from-behind victory. Gray had a pair of threerun homers in the win, finishing 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a career-high six RBls.

## HUSKERS BATTLING INJURIES

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers are dealing with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players have been limited by injuries through the first two weeks of the season. A total of eight Huskers have missed time this season due to injury, including five returning all-region players.

- Abbie Squier, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.
- Jordy Bahl suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American, the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year and one of 10 national finalists for player of the year in both 2022 and 2023.
- Abbey Newlun's availability for this season is also in question. Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim has been sideline for nearly one calendar year after suffering a season-ending injury as a freshman in 2023. Tokheim started 12 games last season before her injury, batting .359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats.
- Dakota Carter suffered a shoulder injury just prior to the season that required season-ending surgery. Carter appeared in 39 games last season as Nebraska's top pinch runner.
- Billie Andrews, a third-team All-American last season, missed four of Nebraska's five games the second weekend while she was in concussion protocol. Those four games are the only contests Andrews hasn't started at shortstop since the start of the 2021 season.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered an injury in New Mexico that limited her to pinch-running duties for the final three games last week. An All-Big Ten and all-region selection as a freshman in 2023, Caneda had previously started every game at second base since the start of last season.
- Peyton Cody, who is dealing with foot problems, was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the opening weekend. Cody has come back to start eight of Nebraska's last 10 games.


## ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN \& NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in runs and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all active Big Ten players in home runs (49) and runs (148) while ranking second in hits (190) and third in RBls (120). Nationally, Andrews ranks 16th among all active players in home runs (49) and is 21 st in total bases (372) and 26th in runs (148).

## ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection. In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three firstteam All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

## SCOUTING WICHITA STATE (7-3)

Wichita State, who received one vote in the coaches' poll, brings a 7-3 record into this weekend. Each of the Shockers' three losses are to ranked teams (Clemson, Auburn and Arkansas), and WSU also has two wins against ranked opponents (South Carolina and Arkansas).

The Shockers are batting .285 as a team while averaging 5.4 runs per game. Wichita State entered the week ranked 22nd nationally in home runs per game (1.30). The Shocker pitching staff has a 4.67 ERA while allowing 5.0 runs per contest.

- CC Wong, a first-year transfer from Grand Canyon, has been one of the nation's top hitters in the first month of the season. Wong is batting .548 with 17 hits, 10 runs, five home runs and 13 RBIs, leading the Shockers in each of those categories. Nationally, Wong entered the week ranked fifth in on-base percentage (.650), eighth in slugging percentage (1.129), 10th in home runs per game ( 0.50 ) and 11th in batting average (.548).
- Beatrice native Addison Barnard is second on the team with a .344 average and four home runs. She entered the week ranked third nationally among all active Division I player with 73 career home runs and was fourth in slugging percentage (.838) and seventh in runs (184).
- Omaha native Bailey Urban is the third Shocker hitting above . 300 this season. Urban is batting . 333 and ranks second on the team with 11 hits and 11 RBls while leading Wichita State with four doubles.
- In the circle, freshman Chloe Barber has been impressive in her debut season. Barber is $3-0$ with one save and a 2.33 ERA in 24.0 innings. Opponents are hitting just .179 against her with only two extra-base hits - both doubles - in 84 at bats. She has also struck out 49 batters, as she entered the week leading the nation in strikeouts per seven innings (14.3).
- Allison Cooper is 2-1 this season with a 4.04 ERA. She has thrown a team-high 26.0 innings over three starts and six appearances. Opponents are hitting .277 against her.
- Alex Aguilar and Lauren Howell round out the Shocker staff. Aguilar is 2-1 with a 6.77 ERA in 20.1 innings while Howell is $0-1$ with a 10.50 ERA in 8.2 innings.
- Kristi Bredbenner is in her 13th season at Wichita State, where she owns a 376-281-1 record. In 20 seasons as a collegiate coach, Bredbenner is 702-382-1. Bredbenner has led the Shockers to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including three straight.

## SCOUTING \#14 MISSOURI (13-2)

Missouri is off to an impressive start this season, as the Tigers are 13-2 and bring a No. 14 ranking into this weekend. Missouri started 10-0 before going 3-2 last week at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic. The Tigers lost to San Diego State and No. 22 Baylor last week, and they own victories over ranked opponents Utah and Clemson. Nebraska and Missouri share three common opponents (Cal State Fullerton, San Diego State and Utah). The Huskers went 1-2 against that trio while Missouri went 2-1.

Missouri is batting . 290 as a team while averaging 5.0 runs per game. The Tigers entered the week ranked 23rd nationally in doubles (25). Defensively, Missouri is allowing just 1.7 runs per game while posting a 1.43 ERA that ranked 12th nationally entering the week. The Tigers also ranked among the national leaders in shutouts (19th, 4) and fielding percentage (18th, .980).

- Jenna Laird leads Missouri with a . 415 batting average, 20 runs, 10 walks and seven stolen bases. She ranked 18th nationally in runs per game (1.3) entering the week.
- Alex Honnold is also batting above .400 as she holds a .408 average. Honnold leads the Tigers in hits (20) and doubles (8) and is tied for the team lead in RBls (11). Nationally, Honnold entered the week ranked fourth nationally in doubles.
- Maddie Gallagher (.333) and Katie Chester (.308) are both batting above .300. Gallagher has scored 10 runs to rank third on the team in that category while Chester leads the Tigers with three home runs and is tied for the team lead with 11 RBls.
- In the circle, Missouri has primarily relied on Laurin Krings and Cierra Harrison. Krings is 6-1 this season with a 1.64 ERA in a team-high 42.2 innings. She entered the week ranked seventh nationally in wins while leading the Tigers in appearances (8), starts (7) and complete games (5). Opponents are hitting just . 212 against Krings.
- Harrison is $4-0$ with a 0.70 ERA in 30.0 innings. She is limiting opponents to a .130 batting average with only one extra-base hit in 100 at bats. Harris entered the week ranked 16th nationally by allowing only 3.0 hits per seven innings.
- Taylor Pannell is $1-1$ this season with a 0.00 ERA and two saves in 5.1 innings. She has allowed only one unearned run while entering the week ranked 11th nationally in saves.
- Marissa McCann ranks third on the team with 11.2 innings pitched, and she is $1-0$ with a 3.00 ERA. Opponents are hitting just . 200 against her, and she averages more than one strikeout per inning.
- Rounding out the Missouri staff are Jayci Kruse (0-0, 0.00 ERA in 1.0 IP ), Lily Whitten (1-0, 1.17 ERA in 6.0 IP) and Nathalie Touchet ( $0-0,7.00$ ERA in 1.0 IP).
- Larissa Anderson is in her sixth season at Missouri. She owns a 182-99 record with the Tigers and a 312-172-1 career record in 10 seasons. Anderson has guided the Tigers to an NCAA Regional in each of her first five seasons, with the exception of 2020 when there was no postseason due to the pandemic.
