
Briar's Creek is also proud to support intercollegiate women's golf and all the valuable lessons that come with intercollegiate competition.

Briar's Creek Invitational History

The Briar's Creek Invitational returns for its 11th edition this year. SMU won the 2023 event finishing 13 under par to outlast the UCF Knights who finished three shots behind the Mustangs. The field vying for the 2024 title includes 10 teams who competed in the NCAA post season last year. Thirteen of the 17 teams reside in Power 5 conferences. The field is also headlined by three teams that have been ranked inside the top 25 this year: Florida currently 10th, UCF (16th) and Purdue currently 27th.

Notre Dame won the inaugural event in 2013 with Ashley Armstrong leading the way for the Fighting Irish. Armstrong earned medalist honors with a one over par 217 in difficult conditions.

The University of Florida is the only multi time winner earning championship honors in 2015, 2016 and 2017. Other past champions include Texas Tech (2014), North Carolina (2018), Michigan State (2019), Campbell (2022) and College of Charleston (2021). North Carolina owns the tournament scoring record with a 16 under par 848 in 2018. The University of Florida has the largest margin of victory winning by 18 shots in 2017.

The Briar's Creek Invitational has never had a two-time individual winner. Furthermore, no school has had multiple individual winners. The medalist has been from ten different schools in ten years. Lauren Olivares of N.C. State will look to change that trend as she looks to defend her individual championship from last year. Michigan State's Allyson Geer-Park owns the individual tournament record with a 13 under par 203 in 2019.

The tradition of excellence at the Briar's Creek Invitational continues this year as some of the best collegiate players in the country vie to put their names in the tournament record book. Look for another exciting year as the latest chapter of the Briar's Creek Invitational unfolds in 2024!



The Trophies


Every great tournament has a trophy to hold high and through the efforts of John and Dianne Culhane the Briar's Creek Invitational has two special trophies. The team champions will lift up an ornate silver bowl made in 1934 in Sheffield, England and the individual champion will see their name engraved on a silver cup crafted in 1862 in London, England.

"We actually made a trip to the wood carver's shop in the hinterland of Essex to ensure he understood the spirit of the trophies before he started to carve. He was "over the moon" to be part of the team creating a lasting tribute to women's golf in America."

"England's silversmiths are world renown for creativity, craftsmanship and quality; we felt that Briar's Creek and the C of C women's golf tournament deserved something special and so we set out to find trophies that were unique and made by some of England's finest craftsmen."

John and Dianne are long time sponsors or the College of Charleston women's golf team. Since they have homes at Kiawah Island and in Eton/Windsor, England and enjoy golf this special gift has great significance and meaning to them and the Briar's Creek Invitational.

We look forward to another great Briar's Creek Invitational in 2024. Some of the finest teams and players in the country will be vying to have their name etched into these breathtaking trophies. Many thanks to the Culhanes for starting this tradition at Briar's Creek!


