The Nebraska softball team begins a 10-game homestand Tuesday with a pair of games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers take on Northern Colorado at Noon followed by a 5 p.m. matchup with Maine.

Admission is free into both Nebraska games Tuesday, as well as a 2:30 p.m. matchup between Northern Colorado and Maine. There will be open seating throughout Bowlin Stadium on Tuesday, as season ticket holders will not be guaranteed their reserved seat since the games were just added to the schedule last week and were not part of the season ticket package.

Fans unable to make it out to Bowlin Stadium on Tuesday can listen to Nate Rohr call both games - and every game this season - for free on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app. Fans can also watch both Nebraska games with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month.

Nebraska is coming off a 3-1 record at the Razorback Rumble in Arkansas last weekend. In the tournament opener, Nebraska defeated Northern Iowa 13-3 in six innings, posting a run-rule victory over the two-time defending Missouri Valley Conference regular-season champions. Nebraska then split a pair of close games with Saint Francis. In the final game of the tournament, Sydney Gray homered twice and Kaylin Kinney tossed a complete game in a 5-1 victory over a South Alabama squad that is receiving votes in the top-25 poll and owns three wins and one tie against ranked opponents this season.

LEADING OFF

- NU's 10-game homestand is its longest at Bowlin Stadium and the longest since a 14-game homestand in 1995.
- The Huskers are on pace for 113 doubles this season, which would break both the Nebraska record (94) and the Big Ten record (110).
- NU leads the Big Ten with 47 doubles, ranking fourth nationally in doubles and third in double per game (2.1).
- The Huskers have used a different batting order in all 22 games this season.
- Billie Andrews' final hit last weekend was the 200th hit of her career. She is just the 14th Husker with 200 career hits.

- Billie Andrews also hit her 50th career home last weekend. She is just the third Husker with 50 career home runs.
- Billie Andrews has hit safely in 17 straight games. That ties for the longest hitting streak by a Husker since Andrews had a 22-game hitting streak in 2022.
- **Peyton Cody** enters Tuesday with 147 career hits, three shy of 150.
- Sydney Gray is the only player to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- Emmerson Cope has two saves, one shy of the Nebraska freshman record.

Kaylin Kinney went 3-0 with a 0.98 ERA last week, including her first career 7.0-inning complete game. Kinney has earned the win (7) or save (1) in eight of Nebraska's 11 victories in 2024.

- Rhonda Revelle has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,409 of Nebraska's 1,589 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 23 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 23 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

A LOOK AT NEBRASKA'S TEAM & INDIVIDUAL STREAKS

The Nebraska team and several Huskers are riding streaks entering Tuesday's two games.

- As a team, Nebraska has doubled in 14 straight games. The Huskers had a double in 15 consecutive games last season but the last time Nebraska had a double in more than 15 straight games was a 17-game streak during the 2017 season.
- The Huskers have had at least two doubles in nine straight games. Nebraska had multiple doubles in 10 consecutive games last season which is believed to be the longest streak in school history, based on available records.
- Nebraska stole 13 bases in four games last week after swiping just seven bases in its first 18 games of the season. The Huskers have stolen multiple bases in four consecutive games. The last time Nebraska had multiple stolen bases in five consecutive games was in 2003.
- Individually, **Billie Andrews** brings a 17-game hitting streak into Tuesday's games. The last Husker to have a hitting streak of 18 games or longer was Andrews, who had a 22-game hitting streak in 2023 which marked the third-longest hitting streak in school history. There have been only four 20-game hitting streaks in program history and no player has ever had two separate 20-game hitting streaks. Andrews is batting .468 (29-for-62) during her hitting streak with eight doubles, one triple and seven home runs.
- **Brooke Andrews** has hit safely in seven straight games entering Tuesday. She is batting .458 (11-for-24) during the hitting streak with five doubles.
- Bella Bacon has an RBI in four consecutive games, the longest streak of her career and tied for the longest streak by a Husker this season.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews had four stolen bases last week to give her 41 career steals. Andrews also hit her 50th career home runs last week giving her 40 career home runs and 40 career steals.

- Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. Andrews has 50 career home runs and 41 career stolen bases, while Lizama had 47 career home runs and 91 career stolen bases.
- With nine more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.
- Nationally, there are only eight active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those eight, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference, and Andrews and Clemson's McKenzie Clark are the only two players among those four who aren't competing in her fifth or sixth season.

BILLIE ANDREWS CHASING HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks 15th nationally in home runs per game this season with seven homers in 18 games. Andrews is on pace to break Nebraska's career home run record this season.

- Andrews ranks third in school history with 50 home runs. The Husker home run record is 54 by two-time All-American Taylor Edwards, who played from 2011 to 2014.
- Andrews needs four home runs to tie Edwards' Nebraska record and five to break the mark. Andrews is on pace to hit nine more homers this year which would give her 59 career homers.
- Andrews has already tied one home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews ranks 17th among all active Division I players with 50 career home runs. She has
 played at least 10 fewer games than each of the 16 players ranked ahead of her on the active
 home run chart, with the exception of Wichita State's Addison Barnard.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews has a knack for producing extra-base hits during her Husker career and this year has been no different. Andrews ranks fifth in school history with 86 career extra-base hits, including 16 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks 16th nationally 16 extra-base hits in only 18 games this season. Since she has played fewer games than many of her peers, Andrews' average of 0.89 extra-base hits per game ranks second nationally among players with at least 12 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 13 of her 18 games this season, including 10 of her last 12 games. Andrews has also had two games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking second in extra-base hits per game, Andrews is ninth nationally in slugging percentage (.923) and 15th in home runs per game (0.4).
- Andrews ranks 28th among all active Division I players with 83 career extra-base hits. She ranks ninth nationally among active players in career extra-base hits per game (0.49).

2024 NCAA LEADERS IN EXTRA-BASE HITS PER GAME

NEW HITTERS MAKING A BIG IMPACT

Led by first-year transfers **Bella Bacon** and **Peyton Cody**, Nebraska's offensive newcomers have made a big impact at the plate this season. As a group, the newcomers to the Husker lineup have out-paced the returners in batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage, a notable accomplishment considering Nebraska returned the majority of its production from a 2023 offense that was among the best in school history.

- Bacon and Cody are batting a combined .323 (32-for-99) this season as the two transfer additions to the lineup. They have combined for six doubles, two homers and 18 RBIs.
- Freshmen **Samantha Bland** and **Emmerson Cope** are the other two new bats that have been regulars in the Husker lineup this season. Bland and Cope have been among the Huskers' top sluggers, combining for seven doubles, three homers and 21 RBIs.
- With the quartet of productive new hitters, two of the top five batting averages on the team are owned by newcomers (Cody, 2nd and Bacon, 5th). Newcomers also account for two of the three highest home run totals (Cody and Bland tied for 3rd).
- Bacon, who spent her freshman season at Purdue in 2023, has started 21 of Nebraska's 22 games at first base this season. The Omaha native is batting .302 and is third on the team in hits (19), runs (14) and RBIs (12).
- A sixth-year player who spent her first five seasons at St. John's, Cody was limited during the first weekend, going 1-for-2 as a pinch hitter. She has returned as a regular in the lineup with 12 starts in the past 18 games, splitting time with Cope as the designated player. Cody is batting .361 this season, ranking second on the team in average, slugging percentage (.611) and third in on-base percentage (.425) and home runs (2).
- Bland has started 20 of Nebraska's 22 games as a freshman with starts at four different positions. She ranks second on the team in RBIs (14) and is third in doubles (6) and home runs (2).
- Cope has found her way into the starting batting order 11 times despite also pitching for the Huskers. She is batting .250 with two doubles, one home runs and seven RBIs.

HUSKERS PITCHING BY COMMITTEE IN 2024

Nebraska has used multiple pitchers in every game this season but one, utilizing a "pitching by committee" approach. The Huskers have used at least two pitchers in 21 of 22 games, including eight games where three or more pitchers were utilized.

- Nebraska was the last Big Ten team to throw a complete game this season. Each of the other 13 Big Ten teams had a complete game within the first two weeks of the season. Nebraska's first complete game did not come until the fourth week of the season, when Kaylin Kinney went the distance against South Alabama in the Huskers' 22nd game.
- The Huskers have had five pitchers start a game this season. That is a first for Rhonda Revelle, as Nebraska had never used more than four starting pitchers in a season since she took over the program in 1993.

TOP-25 RANKINGS

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

WCWS APPEARANCES

Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won three of the six Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** winning twice and **Billie Andrews** taking home one award.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five contests and fielded all 19 chances at third base.
- In the final game against defending Big Sky regular-season champion Sacramento State on Feb. 18, Gray powered the Huskers' 8-3 come-from-behind victory. Gray had a pair of three-run homers in the win, finishing 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a career-high six RBIs.
- Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble. In four games, she averaged more than 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game while averaging 1.0 extra-base hit per game.
- In the final game of the Razorback Rumble, Gray went 3-for-4 against South Alabama with a double and two homers. She set a career high with three extra-base hits and tied her career high in hits and home runs.
- Andrews was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for the second time in her career following the Mary Nutter Classic, and she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week.
- Andrews put up impressive numbers in five games against top competition. She went 13-for-21 (.619) at the Mary Nutter Classic with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs scored and a 1.238 slugging percentage. Her staggering statistics came as Nebraska played three ranked opponents and a fourth team who was receiving votes in the polls. All five of Nebraska's games at the Mary Nutter Classic were against 2023 NCAA Tournament teams.
- The Mary Nutter Classic featured 30 teams, including nine ranked teams and two more teams who received votes in the coaches' poll. Among that impressive field, Andrews led all players in hits, home runs and slugging percentage while ranking third in batting average and runs scored. Andrews had a hit in all five games, including a two-hit game, two three-hit efforts and a four-hit game.
- Andrews was at her best in Nebraska's three games against ranked teams. She went 3-for-5 with two home runs, two RBIs and three runs against No. 19 UCLA. The next day, Andrews was 3-for-4 with a home run, two RBIs and three runs scored against No. 23 Oregon. On the final day of the tournament, Andrews went 4-for-4 with another homer against No. 20 Utah. In the Huskers' three games against top-25 teams at the Mary Nutter Classic, Andrews went 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.

HUSKERS BATTLING INJURIES

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers are dealing with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players have been limited by injuries through the first two weeks of the season. A total of eight Huskers have missed time this season due to injury, including five returning all-region players.

• **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.

- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American, the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year and one of 10 national finalists for player of the year in both 2022 and 2023.
- **Abbey Newlun's** availability for this season is also in question. Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim has been sideline for nearly one calendar year after suffering a season-ending injury as a freshman in 2023. Tokheim, who did return to practice for the first time in the first full week of March, started 12 games last season before her injury, batting .359 with 10 extrabase hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats.
- Dakota Carter suffered a shoulder injury just prior to the season that required season-ending surgery. Carter appeared in 39 games last season as Nebraska's top pinch runner.
- Billie Andrews, a third-team All-American last season, missed four of Nebraska's five games the second weekend while she was in concussion protocol. Those four games are the only contests Andrews hasn't started at shortstop since the start of the 2021 season.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered an injury in New Mexico that limited her to pinch-running duties for the final three games last week. An All-Big Ten and all-region selection as a freshman in 2023, Caneda had previously started every game at second base since the start of last season.
- **Peyton Cody**, who is dealing with foot problems, was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the opening weekend. Cody has come back to start 12 of Nebraska's last 18 games.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all active Big Ten players in hits (200) and home runs (50) and ranks second in runs (156) while ranking second in runs (156) and third in RBIs (123). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is third in RBIs behind Ohio State's Sam Hackenbracht and first-year Penn State transfer Gaby Garcia, both of whom are in their fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews ranks 17th among all active players in home runs (50) and is 19th in total bases (390) and 26th in runs (156).

ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection.
 In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.


