The Nebraska softball team continues a 10-game homestand with the Big Red Spring Classic at Bowlin Stadium this week. The Huskers will play four games in four days in the tournament.

The tournament begins on Thursday when the Huskers host Northern Colorado at 5:30 p.m. On Friday, Nebraska takes on North Dakota at 5:30 p.m. Saturday sees the Huskers take on in-state rival Creighton at 4:30 p.m. Nebraska then closes the weekend with another game against Northern Colorado on Sunday at 11 a.m.

Fans unable to make it out to Bowlin Stadium can listen to Nate Rohr call every game this season for free on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app. Fans can also watch all four games this week with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month. Saturday's matchup with Creighton will be televised within the state of Nebraska on Nebraska Public Media, with Larry Puntenev and Mattie Fowler Burkhardt on the call.

Nebraska has won four of its last six games after splitting a pair of home games on Tuesday. The Huskers lost to Northern Colorado before rebounding with a 10-0 run-rule victory over Maine. Nebraska is 12-12 this season, but entering the week the Huskers had played the 24th-toughest schedule in the nation according to the NCAA RPI and the 18th-toughest non-conference schedule. Entering this week, Nebraska had played 11 of its 22 games (50 percent) against opponents ranked in the top 50 of the RPI.

### LEADING OFF

- Nebraska's current 10-game homestand is the longest in Bowlin Stadium history and is the program's longest since a 14-game homestand in 1995.
- The Huskers are on pace for 106 doubles this season, which would break the Nebraska record (94) and challenge the Big Ten record (110).
- NU leads the Big Ten with 48 doubles, ranking fourth nationally in doubles.
- The Huskers have used a different batting order in all 24 games this year.
- **Billie Andrews'** final hit last weekend was the 200th hit of her career. She is just the 14th Husker with 200 career hits.
- **Billie Andrews** hit two home runs on Tuesday. She ranks third in school history with 52 career home runs, two shy of Taylor Edwards' school record (54).
- **Billie Andrews** has hit safely in 19 straight games. Andrews is looking to become the first player in NU history with two separate 20-game hitting streaks.
- **Sydney Gray** is the only player to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- **Emmerson Cope** has two saves, one shy of the Nebraska freshman record.
- **Kaylin Kinney** has 99 career strikeouts, one shy of 100.

### HUSKERS TO WATCH



Reigning Big Ten Player of the Week **Sydney Gray** hit .385 last week with three homers and five RBIs in four games. In a pair of games Tuesday, Gray went 1-for-2 with five walks.



**Kaylin Kinney** went 3-0 with a 0.98 ERA last week, including her first career 7.0-inning complete game. Kinney has earned the win (7) or save (1) in eight of Nebraska's 12 victories in 2024.

• **Rhonda Revelle** has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.

• Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

• Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.

• Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,410 of Nebraska's 1,590 all-time victories (89 percent).

• Nebraska is scheduled to play 23 home games, which would be the most regular-season home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.

• NU has 23 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.

• Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.

• Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.

• The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

### A LOOK AT SOME HUSKER STREAKS

• **Billie Andrews** brings a 19-game hitting streak into the Big Red Spring Classic. The hitting streak is the longest by a Husker since Andrews had a career-long 23-game hitting streak in 2022. Andrews is batting .464 (32-for-69) during her hitting streak with eight doubles, one triple and nine home runs.

• **Billie Andrews** is looking to become the first player in school history to have two separate 20-game hitting streaks. There have been only four 20-game hitting streaks in program history and no player has ever had two separate 20-game hitting streaks.

- **Brooke Andrews** has started 66 consecutive games, the longest active streak on the team.
- **Brooke Andrews** has also scored a run in six consecutive games and reached base in nine consecutive games.
- **Bella Bacon** has an RBI in five consecutive games. That marks the longest streak of her career and the longest streak by a Husker this season.
- **Sarah Harness** has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 12 of her 14 appearances this season, including a five-inning shutout of Maine on Tuesday.
- **Caitlin Olenky** has gone 12.0 consecutive innings without walking a batter and 23.2 consecutive innings without allowing a home run.

### BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

**Billie Andrews** enters the Big Red Spring Classic with 41 career steals and 52 career homers.

- Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. Andrews has 52 career home runs and 41 career stolen bases, while Lizama had 47 career home runs and 91 career stolen bases.
- With nine more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.
- Nationally, there are only eight active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those eight, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference, and Andrews and Clemson's McKenzie Clark are the only two players among those four who aren't competing in their fifth or sixth season.

### BILLIE ANDREWS CHASING HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

**Billie Andrews** ranks fifth nationally in home runs per game this season with nine homers in 20 games. Andrews is on pace to break Nebraska's career home run record this season.

- Andrews ranks third in school history with 52 home runs. The Husker home run record is 54 by two-time All-American Taylor Edwards, who played from 2011 to 2014.
- Andrews needs two home runs to tie Edwards' Nebraska record and three to break the mark. Andrews is on pace to hit 10 more homers this year which would give her 62 career homers.
- Andrews has already tied one home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews ranks 15th among all active Division I players with 52 career home runs. She has played at least 10 fewer games than each of the 14 players ranked ahead of her on the active home run chart, with the exception of Wichita State's Addison Barnard.

**BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS**

**Billie Andrews** has a knack for producing extra-base hits during her Husker career and this year has been no different. Andrews ranks fifth in school history with 88 career extra-base hits, including 18 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks eighth nationally with 18 extra-base hits in only 20 games this season. Since she has played fewer games than many of her peers, Andrews' average of 0.90 extra-base hits per game ranks second nationally among players with at least 12 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 15 of her 20 games this season, including 12 of her last 14 games. Andrews has also had two games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking second in extra-base hits per game, Andrews is fifth nationally in home runs per game (0.5) and sixth in slugging percentage (.958).
- Andrews ranks 23rd among all active Division I players with 88 career extra-base hits. She ranks eighth nationally among active players in career extra-base hits per game (0.49).

### NEW HITTERS MAKING A BIG IMPACT

Led by first-year transfers **Bella Bacon** and **Peyton Cody**, Nebraska's offensive newcomers have made a big impact at the plate this season. As a group, the newcomers to the Husker lineup have out-paced the returners in batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage, a notable accomplishment considering Nebraska returned the majority of its production from a 2023 offense that was among the best in school history.

- Bacon and Cody are batting a combined .311 (32-for-103) this season as the two transfer additions to the lineup. They have combined for six doubles, two homers and 20 RBIs.
- Freshmen **Samantha Bland** and **Emmerson Cope** are the other two new bats that have been regulars in the Husker lineup this season. Bland and Cope have been among the Huskers' top sluggers, combining for eight doubles, three homers and 21 RBIs.
- With the quartet of productive new hitters, two of the top five batting averages on the team are owned by newcomers (Cody, 2nd and Bacon, 5th). Newcomers also account for two of the three highest home run totals (Cody and Bland tied for 3rd).
- Bacon, who spent her freshman season at Purdue in 2023, has started 22 of Nebraska's 24 games at first base this season. The Omaha native is batting .288 and is third on the team in hits (19) and runs (14) and fourth in RBIs (13).
- A sixth-year player who spent her first five seasons at St. John's, Cody was limited during the first weekend, going 1-for-2 as a pinch hitter. She has returned as a regular in the lineup with 13 starts in the past 20 games. Cody is batting .351, ranking second on the team in average and slugging percentage (.595) and third in on-base percentage (.415) and home runs (2).
- Bland has started 21 of Nebraska's 24 games as a freshman with starts at four different positions. She ranks third on the team in RBIs (14), doubles (6) and home runs (2).
- Cope has found her way into the starting batting order 11 times despite also pitching for the Huskers. She is batting .250 with two doubles, one home runs and seven RBIs.

### HUSKERS PITCHING BY COMMITTEE IN 2024

Nebraska has used multiple pitchers in every game this season but one, utilizing a "pitching by committee" approach. The Huskers have used at least two pitchers in 22 of 24 games, including eight games where three or more pitchers were utilized.

- Nebraska was the last Big Ten team to throw a complete game this season. Each of the other 13 Big Ten teams had a complete game within the first two weeks of the season. Nebraska's first complete game did not come until the fourth week of the season, when Kaylin Kinney went the distance against South Alabama in the Huskers' 22nd game.
- Nebraska has had a pitcher go the distance in two of its last four games, including the first shutout by a Husker pitcher (Sarah Harness) on Tuesday against Maine.
- The Huskers have had five pitchers start a game this season. That is a first for Rhonda Revelle, as Nebraska had never used more than four starting pitchers in a season since she took over the program in 1993.

**NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS**

**65 NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS**  
Nebraska has won 65 games in its 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (65-56). The 65 postseason wins rank 20th in NCAA history.

**30 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**  
Huskers have combined to earn 30 Academic All-America honors, a total that ranks third among all Division I softball programs.

**29 ALL-AMERICANS**  
A total of 18 Huskers have combined for 29 All-America awards, including seven multi-time All-Americans.

**26 NCAA TOURNAMENTS**  
The Huskers have made 26 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 26 postseason appearances rank 14th in NCAA history.

**23 REVELLE ALL-AMERICANS**  
Rhonda Revelle has guided 15 players to a total of 23 All-America awards in her first 31 seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

**20 CONFERENCE TITLES**  
Nebraska has won a total of 20 conference championships. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six Big 12 crowns and have captured a pair of Big Ten titles.

**15 TOP-25 RANKINGS**  
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

**14 REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**  
Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

**7 WCWS APPEARANCES**  
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

**4 SOFTBALL OLYMPIANS**  
Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

**HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS**

Huskers have won three of the six Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** winning twice and **Billie Andrews** taking home one award.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five contests and fielded all 19 chances at third base.
- In the final game against defending Big Sky regular-season champion Sacramento State on Feb. 18, Gray powered the Huskers' 8-3 come-from-behind victory. Gray had a pair of three-run homers in the win, finishing 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a career-high six RBIs.
- Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble. In four games, she averaged more than 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game while averaging 1.0 extra-base hit per game.
- In the final game of the Razorback Rumble, Gray went 3-for-4 against South Alabama with a double and two homers. She set a career high with three extra-base hits and tied her career high in hits and home runs.
- Andrews was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for the second time in her career following the Mary Nutter Classic, and she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week.
- Andrews put up impressive numbers in five games against top competition. She went 13-for-21 (.619) at the Mary Nutter Classic with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs scored and a 1.238 slugging percentage. Her staggering statistics came as Nebraska played three ranked opponents and a fourth team who was receiving votes in the polls. All five of Nebraska's games at the Mary Nutter Classic were against 2023 NCAA Tournament teams.
- The Mary Nutter Classic featured 30 teams, including nine ranked teams and two more teams who received votes in the coaches' poll. Among that impressive field, Andrews led all players in hits, home runs and slugging percentage while ranking third in batting average and runs scored. Andrews had a hit in all five games, including a two-hit game, two three-hit efforts and a four-hit game.
- Andrews was at her best in Nebraska's three games against ranked teams. She went 3-for-5 with two home runs, two RBIs and three runs against No. 19 UCLA. The next day, Andrews was 3-for-4 with a home run, two RBIs and three runs scored against No. 23 Oregon. On the final day of the tournament, Andrews went 4-for-4 with another homer against No. 20 Utah. In the Huskers' three games against top-25 teams at the Mary Nutter Classic, Andrews went 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.

**HUSKERS BATTLING INJURIES**

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers are dealing with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players have been limited by injuries through the first two weeks of the season. A total of eight Huskers have missed time this season due to injury, including five returning all-region players.

- **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.

- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American, the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year and one of 10 national finalists for player of the year in both 2022 and 2023.
- **Abbey Newlun's** availability for this season is also in question. Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- **Talia Tokheim** was sidelined for nearly one calendar year after suffering a season-ending injury as a freshman in 2023. Tokheim, who made her season debut on Tuesday as a pinch runner and defensive replacement, started 12 games last season before her injury, batting .359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats.
- **Dakota Carter** suffered a shoulder injury just prior to the season that required season-ending surgery. Carter appeared in 39 games last season as Nebraska's top pinch runner.
- **Billie Andrews**, a third-team All-American last season, missed four of Nebraska's five games the second weekend while she was in concussion protocol. Those four games are the only contests Andrews hasn't started at shortstop since the start of the 2021 season.
- **Katelyn Caneda** suffered an injury in New Mexico that limited her to pinch-running duties for the final three games last week. An All-Big Ten and all-region selection as a freshman in 2023, Caneda had previously started every game at second base since the start of last season.
- **Peyton Cody**, who is dealing with foot problems, was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the opening weekend. Cody has come back to start 12 of Nebraska's last 18 games.

**ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS**

**Billie Andrews** is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all active Big Ten players in hits (203) and home runs (52) while ranking second in runs (158) and third in RBIs (128). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (171) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is third in RBIs behind first-year Penn State transfer Gaby Garcia (140) and Ohio State's Sam Hackenbracht (135), both of whom are in their fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews ranks 15th among all active players in career home runs (52) and is 18th in total bases (399) and 26th in runs (158).

**ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK**

**Billie Andrews** has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection. In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.
