The two hottest teams in their respective conferences face off this week in Lincoln when the Nebraska softball team welcomes Omaha to Bowlin Stadium on Wednesday.

First pitch is set for 5:30 p.m. as Nebraska continues its 10-game homestand. Tickets can be purchased by visiting huskers.com/softball, calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED or at the Bowlin Stadium ticket office beginning at 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday.

Fans unable to make it out to Bowlin Stadium can listen to Nate Rohr call every game this season for free on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app. Fans can also watch Wednesday's game with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month.

Nebraska brings a five-game winning streak into Wednesday's in-state matchup while Omaha has won 10 consecutive games. The Huskers' five-game winning streak is tied with Penn State for the longest winning streak among Big Ten teams, while Omaha's 10-game winning streak is the top streak in the Summit League.

The Huskers and Mavericks are also two of the highest-rated Midwest teams in the most recent NCAA RPI rankings, released on Monday. Nebraska came in at No. 68 in the NCAA RPI while Omaha was two spots higher at No. 66. The Huskers are going for a season sweep of their in-state opponents after Nebraska defeated Creighton 9-0 in five innings last Saturday at Bowlin Stadium.

LEADING OFF

- Nebraska's current 10-game homestand is the longest in Bowlin Stadium history.
- The Huskers rank third nationally with 56 doubles and are on pace for 106 doubles this season which would break the Nebraska record (94) and challenge the Big Ten record (110).
- NU ranks fourth nationally with 17 double plays this season.
- The Huskers have used a different batting order in all 28 games this year.
- Billie Andrews is tied with Taylor Edwards for the Nebraska all-time home run record. Andrews' next home run will be the 55th of her career, an NU record.

- Billie Andrews is one of only 15 players nationally averaging 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game this season.
- Billie Andrews and Sydney Gray are the only players to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- Brooke Andrews went 5-for-5 in Nebraska's last game against Northern Colorado, the first five-hit game for a Husker since the 2006 season.

- Rhonda Revelle has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,414 of Nebraska's 1,594 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 23 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 23 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

A SISTER ACT AT THE TOP OF THE LINEUP

The Andrews sisters have hit first and second in the Nebraska batting order each of the past 12 games with younger sister **Billie Andrews** leading off and older sister **Brooke Andrews** hitting second. The sisters have proven to be a productive combination at the top of the order.

- During the last 12 games when Billie has led off and Brooke has hit second, Nebraska has averaged 7.2 runs per game. In the first 16 games of the season, the Huskers averaged 4.7 runs per game.
- The duo have hit .410 collectively over the last 12 games while combining to average 2.8 hits per game, 2.7 runs per game and 2.0 RBIs per game.

CANEDA THRIVES AS 'SECOND' LEADOFF HITTER

With the Andrews sisters anchoring the top of the lineup, Nebraska has been searching for a strong No. 9 hitter who can act as a second leadoff hitter batting ahead of **Billie Andrews.** The Huskers may have found that hitter in **Katelyn Caneda**.

- Caneda has found her way at the plate of late after she posted the third-highest batting average (.366) by a freshman in program history last season. Caneda went 6-for-12 in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic last weekend with a .600 on-base percentage.
- As Caneda got hot with the bat, **Rhonda Revelle** chose to move Caneda down in the order to the No. 9 spot in the hopes that Caneda would get on base in front of Billie Andrews.
- Caneda batted ninth in Nebraska's final two games last weekend. In those two games, Nebraska scored 21 runs in only 10 turns at bat.
- Caneda went 4-for-4 with two walks in her two games batting ninth, reaching base in all six of her plate appearances. Caneda scored five runs in the two games after scoring only four times in her first 25 games. By getting on base, Caneda helped Billie Andrews drive in seven runs in the two games Caneda hit ninth, as Andrews drove in Caneda four times in the two games.

OLENSKY STEPPING UP IN THE CIRCLE

With the season-ending injury to two-time first-team All-American Jordy Bahl, each of Nebraska's pitchers has had to step up in Bahl's absence. One pitcher who has emerged is freshman left-hander **Caitlin Olensky**.

- Olensky owns Nebraska's lowest ERA this season, as her 3.37 ERA is a full run lower than any other Husker pitcher. She also leads Nebraska in strikeouts per seven innings (4.2) and opponent batting average (.269).
- Olensky has improved throughout the year which culminated with her best week of the season last week. Olensky pitched in four of Nebraska's six games last week and went 1-0 with a 1.98 ERA in a team-high 17.2 innings. In her lone start of the week, Olensky threw a 5.0-inning shutout against Creighton for her first career shutout and complete game.
- Olensky has seen her workload increase this month. Nebraska played 14 games in February and the Huskers have played 14 games in March. Olensky threw just 13.2 innings in February and posted a 4.10 ERA. This month, she has thrown 32.0 innings and posted a 3.06 ERA.

BILLIE ANDREWS TIES HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks fifth nationally in home runs and fourth in home runs per game with 11 homers in 24 games. Andrews has tied the Nebraska record with 54 career home runs.

- In her last game, Andrews hit her 54th career home run. That tied the Nebraska record first set by two-time All-American Taylor Edwards, who played from 2011 to 2014.
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews ranks 15th among all active Division I players with 54 career home runs. She has played at least nine fewer games than each of the 14 players ranked ahead of her on the active home run chart, with the exception of Wichita State's Addison Barnard.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews enters Wednesday's game against Omaha with 43 career stolen bases and 54 career home runs.

- Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. Andrews has 54 career home runs and 43 career stolen bases, while Lizama had 47 career home runs and 91 career stolen bases.
- With seven more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.
- Nationally, there are only eight active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those eight, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference, and Andrews and Clemson's McKenzie Clark are the only two players among those four who aren't competing in their fifth or sixth season.

BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is beginning to leave its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews is on pace to potentially threaten the Big Ten season home record this spring, and she already finds herself on the all-time Big Ten home runs list.

- Andrews' 54 career home runs rank in a tie for 10th place in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 65 home runs, a total that would rank third in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .692 slugging percentage currently ranks 10th in Big Ten history. Only eight players in Big Ten history have had a career slugging percentage of .700 or higher.
- Based on her current pace and accounting for the 25 games remaining on Nebraska's regularseason schedule, Andrews is on pace to hit 22 home runs this season. The Big Ten record for home runs in a season is 24 by Illinois' Angelena Mexicano in 2008.
- Although Andrews has not yet met the minimum of 100 at bats to be considered for Big Ten season records, her performance over the first half of the season has put her in position to challenge the conference's slugging percentage record. Andrews owns a .954 slugging percentage this season. That would currently rank as the second-highest slugging percentage in Big Ten history, with the record being a 1.007 slugging percentage by Penn State's Cassidy Bell in 2013.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews has a knack for producing extra-base hits during her Husker career and this year has been no different. Andrews ranks fifth in school history with 91 career extra-base hits, including 21 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks eighth nationally with 21 extra-base hits in only 28 games this season. Since she has played fewer games than many of her peers, Andrews' average of 0.88 extra-base hits per game ranks third nationally among players with at least 15 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 17 of her 24 games this season, including 15 of her last 18 games. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking third in extra-base hits per game this season, Andrews is fourth nationally in home runs per game (0.46), fifth in slugging percentage (.954) and eighth in runs per game (1.25). Andrews is one of only three players nationally and the only player from a Power Conference who ranks in the top 10 nationally in each of those three categories.
- Andrews ranks 20th among all active Division I players with 91 career extra-base hits. She
 ranks eighth nationally among active players in career extra-base hits per game (0.49).

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

WCWS APPEARANCES

Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four of the seven Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** and **Billie Andrews** each winning the award twice. Gray and Andrews are the only two players who have won two Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, and Nebraska is the only team with more than one Big Ten Player of the Week award.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five contests and fielded all 19 chances at third base. Her best game of the week came against defending Big Sky regular-season champion Sacramento State on Feb. 18, when Gray had a pair of three-run homers in the win, finishing 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a career-high six RBIs.
- Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble. In four games, she averaged more than 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game while averaging 1.0 extra-base hit per game. In the final game, Gray went 3-for-4 against South Alabama with a double and two homers.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up impressive numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs scored and a 1.238 slugging percentage. Her staggering statistics came as Nebraska played three ranked opponents and a fourth team who was receiving votes in the polls.
- Andrews was at her best in Nebraska's three games against ranked teams. She went 3-for-5 with two home runs, two RBIs and three runs against No. 19 UCLA. The next day, Andrews was 3-for-4 with a home run, two RBIs and three runs scored against No. 23 Oregon. On the final day of the tournament, Andrews went 4-for-4 with another homer against No. 20 Utah. In the Huskers' three games against top-25 teams at the Mary Nutter Classic, Andrews went 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS BATTLING INJURIES

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers are dealing with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players have been limited by injuries through the first two weeks of the season. A total of eight Huskers have missed time this season due to injury, including five returning all-region players.

• **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.

- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American, the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year and one of 10 national finalists for player of the year in both 2022 and 2023.
- **Abbey Newlun's** availability for this season is also in question. Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim was sidelined for nearly one calendar year after suffering a season-ending injury as a freshman in 2023. Tokheim, who made her season debut on March 12 as a pinch runner and defensive replacement, started 12 games last season before her injury, batting .359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats.
- Dakota Carter suffered a shoulder injury just prior to the season that required season-ending surgery. Carter appeared in 39 games last season as Nebraska's top pinch runner.
- Billie Andrews, a third-team All-American last season, missed four of Nebraska's five games the second weekend while she was in concussion protocol. Those four games are the only contests Andrews hasn't started at shortstop since the start of the 2021 season.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered an injury in New Mexico that limited her to pinch-running duties for the final three games last week. An All-Big Ten and all-region selection as a freshman in 2023, Caneda had previously started every game at second base since the start of last season.
- **Peyton Cody**, who is dealing with foot problems, was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the opening weekend.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all active Big Ten players in hits (210) and home runs (54) while ranking second in runs (166) and RBIs (137). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (175) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind first-year Penn State transfer Gaby Garcia (146), who is in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews ranks 15th among all active players in career home runs (54), 17th in total bases (413) and 25th in runs (166).

ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection.
 In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

Tatum and Taylor Edwards led Nebraska on the road in 2015. Tatum homered and tossed a one-hit shutout with 10 strikeouts. Taylor walked four times, tying the school record for walks in a game and passing Jennifer Lizama for NU's all-time walk record (125).

SCOUTING OMAHA (21-7)

Omaha is 21-7 entering Wednesday's game, and the Mavericks have won 10 straight games. Omaha, which swept a three-game series at Purdue last weekend, has not lost since an 8-4 setback to James Madison on March 1. The Mavericks are 11-1 this month. During its 10-game winning streak, Omaha has outscored its opponents 52-13 with five shutouts.

The Mavs are 6-2 in true road games this season, including a 4-2 road mark against Big Ten and Pac-12 programs. Nebraska and Omaha share three common opponents in Northern Iowa, Long Beach State and Northern Colorado. The Huskers posted a 4-1 record against that trio while the Mavericks went 3-0.

Omaha is hitting .285 as a team and averaging 5.1 runs per game. Defensively, the Mavericks boast a 2.96 ERA and a .979 fielding percentage while allowing 3.3 runs per contest. UNO ranks eighth nationally in shutouts (9) and 13th in fielding percentage

- Maggie O'Brien leads the team with a .376 batting average as one of three Mavericks hitting above .350. She also leads Omaha in hits (35) and stolen bases (6).
- Sydney Ross is batting .371 and paces the Mavs with nine doubles, 26 RBIs and a .477 on-base percentage.
- Lynsey Tucker owns a .352 average and leads the team with two triples and 17 walks while adding seven doubles and three home runs.
- **Sydney Thomason** is hitting .287 and leads Omaha with seven homers, 13 extra-base hits and a .609 slugging percentage.
- In the circle, Omaha boasts one of the best 1-2 combinations in the country in **Kamryn Meyer** and **Sydney Nuismer.**
- Kamryn Meyer is 11-3 this season with a 2.56 ERA in a team-high 79.1 innings. Opponents are hitting just .229 against her, and Meyer leads the Mavericks in wins, strikeouts (107), appearances (17), complete games (7) and saves (2). She ranks fourth nationally in strikeouts and 10th in wins.
- A fifth-year pitcher, Meyer ranks in the top 30 among all active Division I pitchers in career strikeouts (2nd, 887), shutouts (6th, 24), saves (10th, 10), innings (11th, 626.0), appearances (12th, 130), wins (13th, 57), starts (16th, 91), complete games (17th, 57) and ERA (27th, 2.02).
- Meyer is 0-2 in her career against Nebraska with a 3.31 ERA in two starts. She has allowed only two extra-base hits in her 12.2 innings against the Huskers. Last season, Meyer tossed a complete game and allowed only two runs in a 2-1 Nebraska victory.
- Sydney Nuismer is 7-3 with a 2.42 ERA in 69.1 innings this season. She leads the Mavericks in ERA, starts (14) and shutouts (3), ranking ninth nationally in shutouts. Nuismer has pitched against Nebraska once in her career, taking the loss in game two last season after allowing 10 runs (nine earned) in 5.1 innings.
- Mike Heard is in his third season at Omaha, where he owns an 86-38 record. Heard led the Mavericks to the Summit League Tournament title and a berth in the 2023 NCAA Tournament, Omaha's first postseason appearance since moving to Division I.
- Heard previously posted a 152-96 record in six seasons at Midland, where he was named GPAC Coach of the Year three times. Heard is 238-134 in nine career seasons.
