The Nebraska softball team opens Big Ten Conference play this weekend when the Huskers host Illinois for a three-game series on Friday, Saturday and Sunday at Bowlin Stadium.

First pitch on Friday is set for 5 p.m., Saturday's game will start at 1 p.m. and Sunday's finale is slated for Noon. Tickets can be purchased by visiting huskers.com/softball, calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED or at the Bowlin Stadium ticket office beginning one hour prior to first pitch.

Fans unable to make it out to Bowlin Stadium can listen to Nate Rohr call every game this season for free on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app. Friday's game will also be televised on the Big Ten Network, while Sunday's game will air within the state borders on Nebraska Public Media. Fans can also stream the games on Saturday and Sunday with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month. Friday's game will be available on foxsports.com/watch for those who receive the Big Ten Network.

Nebraska is 30-15 in conference play the past two seasons, finishing second in the regularseason standings in 2022 and fourth in 2023. Nebraska and Northwestern are the only two Big Ten teams who have won 30 conference games over the last two seasons.

The Huskers have swept the opening series of the conference season each of the past two seasons. In 2022, Nebraska won both games of a shortened series at No. 19 Michigan. Last year, the Huskers swept a three-game series against Purdue at Bowlin Stadium.

- Ava Bredwell has had both a run scored and an RBI in six consecutive games.
- Ava Bredwell enters Friday's game with 99 career hits, one shy of 100.
- Brooke Andrews went 5-for-5 against Northern Colorado last Sunday, posting the first five-hit game by a Husker since the 2006 season.

- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,414 of Nebraska's 1,594 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 23 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 23 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.

A SISTER ACT AT THE TOP OF THE LINEUP

The Andrews sisters have hit first and second in the Nebraska batting order each of the past 13 games with younger sister **Billie Andrews** leading off and older sister **Brooke Andrews** hitting second. The sisters have proven to be a productive combination at the top of the order.

- During the last 13 games when Billie has led off and Brooke has hit second, Nebraska has averaged 6.8 runs per game. In the first 16 games, Nebraska averaged 4.7 runs per game.
- The duo have hit .385 collectively over the last 13 games while combining to average 2.7 hits per game, 2.5 runs per game and 1.9 RBIs per game.

CANEDA THRIVING AS 'SECOND' LEADOFF HITTER

With the Andrews sisters anchoring the top of the lineup, Nebraska has been searching for a strong No. 9 hitter who can act as a second leadoff hitter batting ahead of Billie Andrews. The Huskers appear to have found that hitter in **Katelyn Caneda**.

- Caneda, who posted the third-highest batting average (.366) by a freshman in program history last season, has bounced back from a slow start to the season. In her last 11 games, Caneda is batting .394 (13-for-33) with a .487 on-base percentage, nine runs and eight RBIs.
- As Caneda has gotten hot, **Rhonda Revelle** has chosen to move Caneda down in the order to the No. 9 spot in the hopes that Caneda will get on base in front of Billie Andrews. The move has proven effective as Nebraska has scored 23 runs in the three games Caneda has hit ninth, with Caneda scoring six runs and Billie Andrews totaling seven RBIs.
- Since moving into the No. 9 spot in the lineup three games ago, Caneda is 6-for-7 with two walks, reaching base in eight of her nine plate appearances.

BREDWELL & BLAND SWINGING HOT BATS

While the top and bottom of the Husker lineup have been strong of late, two big bats in the middle of the order have been productive as well. **Ava Bredwell** and **Samantha Bland** have both been enjoying hot stretches entering Big Ten play this weekend.

- Bredwell has been on fire the last 11 games. During that stretch, she is 15-for-33 (.455) with three doubles, two triples, three homers and 11 RBIs. Over the past 11 games, Bredwell leads NU in batting average, slugging percentage (.939) and on-base percentage (.561).
- Bredwell has been even better the past six games. She has come to the plate 21 times in the last six games and reached base 14 times for a .667 on-base percentage. She is 11-for-18 (.611) the last six games with two doubles, one triple, two homers and seven RBIs. Bredwell has at least one hit, one run and one RBI in five straight games.
- Bland has also been hot the past 11 games. She is batting .344 (11-for-32) during that stretch with four doubles, one home run and 10 RBIs. In four games at the Big Red Spring Classic last week, Bland was 9-for-16 (.563) with three doubles, one homer and seven RBIs.

OLENSKY STEPPING UP IN THE CIRCLE

With the season-ending injury to two-time first-team All-American Jordy Bahl, each of Nebraska's pitchers has had to step up in Bahl's absence. One pitcher who has emerged is freshman left-hander **Caitlin Olensky**.

- Olensky owns the team's lowest ERA (3.37), as she is the only Husker with an ERA below 4.00.
 Olensky also leads NU in strikeouts per seven innings (4.2) and opponent average (.269).
- Over the last 10 games, Olensky is 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA in 22.1 innings. In the first 19 games of the season, Olensky was 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 23.1 innings.

• Olensky pitched in four of Nebraska's six games last week and went 1-0 with a 1.98 ERA in a team-high 17.2 innings. In her lone start of the week, Olensky threw a 5.0-inning shutout against Creighton for her first career shutout and complete game.

BILLIE ANDREWS TIES HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks eighth nationally in home runs and sixth in home runs per game with 11 homers in 25 games. Andrews has tied the Nebraska record with 54 career home runs.

- Last Sunday against Northern Colorado, Andrews hit her 54th career home run. That tied the Nebraska record first set by two-time All-American Taylor Edwards, who played from 2011 to 2014.
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews ranks 15th among all active Division I players with 54 career home runs. She has played at least nine fewer games than each of the 14 players ranked ahead of her on the active home run chart, with the exception of Wichita State's Addison Barnard.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews enters this weekend's Illinois series with 43 career stolen bases and 54 career home runs.

- Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. Andrews has 54 career home runs and 43 career stolen bases, while Lizama had 47 career home runs and 91 career stolen bases.
- With seven more stolen bases. Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.
- Nationally, there are only eight active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those eight, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference, and Andrews and Clemson's McKenzie Clark are the only two players among those four who aren't competing in their fifth or sixth season.

BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is beginning to leave its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews is on pace to potentially threaten the Big Ten season home record this spring, and she already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list.

- Andrews' 54 career home runs rank in a tie for 10th place in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 65 home runs, a total that would rank third in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .687 slugging percentage currently ranks 10th in Big Ten history. Only eight players in Big Ten history have had a career slugging percentage of .700 or higher.
- Based on her current pace and accounting for the 24 games remaining on Nebraska's regularseason schedule, Andrews is on pace to hit 22 home runs this season. The Big Ten record for home runs in a season is 24 by Illinois' Angelena Mexicano in 2008.
- Although Andrews has not yet met the minimum of 100 at bats to be considered for Big Ten season records, her performance over the first half of the season has put her in position to post one of the top slugging percentages in Big Ten history. Andrews owns a .912 slugging percentage, which would currently rank as the fourth-highest slugging percentage in Big Ten history. The record is a 1.007 slugging percentage by Penn State's Cassidy Bell in 2013.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews has a knack for producing extra-base hits during her Husker career and this year has been no different. Andrews ranks fifth in school history with 91 career extra-base hits, including 21 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks sixth nationally with 21 extra-base hits in only 25 games this season. Since she has played fewer games than many of her peers, Andrews' average of 0.88 extra-base hits per game ranks third nationally among players with at least 20 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 17 of her 25 games this season, including 15 of her last 19 games. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking third in extra-base hits per game this season, Andrews is sixth nationally in home runs per game (0.44) and 12th in slugging percentage (.912) and runs per game (1.20). Andrews is one of only three players nationally - and the only player from a Power Conference - who ranks in the top 15 nationally in each of those three categories.
- Andrews ranks 20th among all active Division I players with 91 career extra-base hits. She ranks eighth nationally among active players in career extra-base hits per game (0.50).

HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four of the seven Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** and **Billie Andrews** each winning the award twice. Gray and Andrews are the only two players who have won two Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, and Nebraska is the only team with more than one Big Ten Player of the Week award.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Her best game of the week came against Sacramento State on Feb. 18, when Gray had a pair of three-run homers in the win, finishing 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a career-high six RBIs.
- Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble. In four games, she averaged more than 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game while averaging 1.0 extra-base hit per game. In the final game, Gray went 3-for-4 against South Alabama with a double and two homers.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up impressive numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs scored and a 1.238 slugging percentage.
- In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored. That included three hits and two home runs against No. 19 UCLA, three hits and a homer against No. 23 Oregon and four hits and a home run against No. 20 Utah.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS BATTLING INJURIES

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers are dealing with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players - including five returning all-region players - have missed multiple games due to injuries this season.

- **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.
- Jordy Bahl suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023.
- Emmerson Cope has not played in Nebraska's last seven games due to a back injury.
- **Abbey Newlun** had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim was sidelined for nearly one full year after suffering a season-ending injury in 2023. Tokheim has played in two games this year after she started 12 games last season before her injury, batting .359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats.
- Dakota Carter suffered a shoulder injury just prior to the season that required season-ending surgery. Carter appeared in 39 games last season as Nebraska's top pinch runner.
- Billie Andrews, a third-team All-American last season, missed four games the second weekend while she was in concussion protocol, the only missed games of her career.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered an injury in New Mexico that forced her to miss three starts.
- Peyton Cody was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the first week due to foot issues.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (210) and home runs (54) while ranking second in runs (166) and RBIs (137). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (175) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind Penn State transfer Gaby Garcia (146), who is in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews ranks 15th among all active players in career home runs (54), 17th in total bases (413) and 25th in runs (166).

ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection.
 In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS (12-13, 0-0 BIG TEN)

Illinois brings a 12-13 record into the opening weekend of Big Ten Conference play. The Fighting Illini have won four of their last six games following a 9-2 road win at Illinois State on Tuesday. Illinois has been at its best on the road, posting a 4-2 record in true road games.

Nebraska and Illinois share four common opponents this season in UCLA, San Diego State and Missouri. Both teams went 0-4 against those three opponents.

Illinois is batting .311 as a team, an average that ranks second in the Big Ten. A total of seven starters are hitting above .340. The Illini average 5.3 runs per game. Defensively, Illinois boasts a 4.12 ERA and a .964 fielding percentage while allowing 5.3 runs per game.

- Paige Berkmeyer leads Illinois with a .362 batting average, 20 RBIs and a .451 on-base percentage. She has added four doubles and two home runs.
- Kelly Ryono is hitting .360 and is tops on the team in runs (19), hits (32), doubles (7), triples (1), home runs (5), stolen bases (6) and slugging percentage (.629).
- Adisyn Caryl boasts a .351 average with six doubles and 11 RBIs.
- Abby Ryniec (.347) and Megan Ward (.342) round out the group of seven Illini starters hitting above .400.
- In the circle, **Tori McQueen** has been Illinois' top pitcher, but the Illini have relied on three pitchers throughout this season. McQueen is 6-6 this spring with one save and a 2.26 ERA in 74.1 innings. She leads the Illini in ERA, wins, appearances (16), starts (12), complete games (7), shutouts (2), saves, innings pitched, strikeouts (80) and opponent average (.237).
- McQueen leads the Big Ten and ranks 12th nationally with a 7.27-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio, as she has struck out 80 batters and walked only 11. McQueen also ranks second in the Big Ten in shutouts and walks allowed per seven innings (1.04).
- Lauren Wiles has seen the most action behind McQueen, tying McQueen for the team lead with 16 appearances. Wiles, who has started eight games, is 4-4 on the year with a 5.68 ERA in 49.1 innings. She has walked 27 batters and struck out 22 and opponents are hitting .339 against her.
- **Briana Bower** is 2-3 with a 4.83 ERA in 37.2 innings. She has appeared in 13 games with five starts and has struck out 23 and walked 18.
- Juliana Hooker (0-0, 31.50 ERA in 1.1 IP) rounds out the Illini staff.
- **Tyra Perry** is in her ninth season at Illinois, where she owns a 255-179 record. Perry has led Illinois to four NCAA Tournament appearances in her first eight seasons.
- Perry previously was the head coach at Ball State, Western Kentucky and Birmingham-Southern. She owns a 664-567 record in 23 career seasons as a head coach. Perry is one of only three active head coaches and the only female head coach to take three different programs to the NCAA Tournament.




