The Nebraska softball team continues Big Ten play this weekend when the Huskers travel to Wisconsin for a three-game series in Madison. NU hits the road following a 7-2 homestand that included a two-game sweep of Illinois last weekend to begin conference play.

The Huskers and Badgers are scheduled to open their series Friday at 3 p.m. Saturday and Sunday's games are both slated for a 1 p.m. first pitch. Fans can watch all three games with a subscription to Big Ten + , with subscriptions starting at $\$ 9.99$ per month. A free radio broadcast of all three games this weekend - and every game this season - will be available on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app.

Nebraska opened conference play with a weather-shortened two-game sweep of Illinois last weekend. The Huskers came from behind in both the seventh and eighth innings to win 5-4 in the opener. The next day, Nebraska exploded for 16 runs in a five-inning victory, its most runs in a Big Ten game since 2016. Wisconsin opened its Big Ten schedule with a series loss at lowa. The Badgers dropped the first two games before shutting out the Hawkeyes 2-0 in the series finale.

Nebraska and Wisconsin have split the past six meetings, with UW winning the series 2-1 in 2022 and NU winning 2-1 in 2023. Three times in the past six meetings the victorious team has scored the winning run in its final at bat (Wisconsin twice and Nebraska once). The past six games have all been decided by two runs or less, including three straight one-run games.

## LEADING OFF

- Nebraska entered the week ranked in the top 10 nationally in doubles $(6$ th, 58$)$ and defensive double plays (7th, 18).
- The Huskers have used a different batting order in all 31 games this year.
- NU has won three games when trailing after six innings, matching its win total from the previous five seasons combined.
- Entering this week, two Huskers ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten in extra-base hits: Billie Andrews (1st, 22) and Ava Bredwell (7th, 16).

■ Billie Andrews and Sydney Gray are the only players to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.

■ Entering the week, Billie Andrews ranked in the top 10 nationally in extrabase hits per game (6th), home runs per game (6th), runs per game (9th) and slugging percentage (10th).

- Billie Andrews entered the week as one of only 12 players nationally averaging 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game.
- Billie Andrews is Nebraska's all-time home run leader and ranks eighth in Big Ten history with 55 career home runs.
- Ava Bredwell has had a hit, a run and an RBI in seven consecutive games.
- Sydney Gray (96) and Brooke Andrews (94) are both nearing 100 career RBIs.


## HUSKERS TO WATCH



Ava Bredwell is hitting .436 (17-for-39) over the last three weeks with 10 extra-base hits and 14 RBIs in 13 games. She is batting . 542 (13-for-24) during her seven-game hitting streak.


Katelyn Caneda is batting . 395 (15-for-38) over the last three weeks. Since moving to the No. 9 spot in the lineup five games ago, Caneda is 8 -for-12 with three walks and eight runs.

- Rhonda Revelle has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,414 of Nebraska's 1,596 all-time victories ( 89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 22 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 22 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

## HUSKERS SHOWING COMEBACK ABILITY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 12 of their 18 wins, including eight times where Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit.

- The Huskers have won three times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 3-8 when trailing after six innings this season after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons.
- Nebraska's three wins this season when trailing after six innings of play are already its most in a season since 2017, when the Huskers were 3-18 when trailing after six innings.


## A SISTER ACT AT THE TOP OF THE LINEUP

The Andrews sisters have hit first and second in the Nebraska batting order each of the past 15 games with younger sister Billie Andrews leading off and older sister Brooke Andrews hitting second. The sisters have proven to be a productive combination at the top of the order.

- During the last 15 games when Billie has led off and Brooke has hit second, Nebraska has averaged 7.3 runs per game. In the first 16 games, Nebraska averaged 4.7 runs per game.
- The duo has hit . 343 collectively over the last 15 games while combining to average 2.7 hits per game, 2.4 runs per game and 2.0 RBls per game.

## CANEDA THRIVING AS ‘SECOND’ LEADOFF HITTER

With the Andrews sisters anchoring the top of the lineup, Nebraska has been searching for a strong No. 9 hitter who can act as a second leadoff hitter batting ahead of Billie Andrews. The Huskers appear to have found that hitter in Katelyn Caneda.

- Caneda, who posted the third-highest batting average (.366) by a freshman in program history last year, has bounced back from a slow start to the season. In the last three weeks, Caneda is batting . 395 (15-for-38) with a . 489 on-base percentage, 11 runs and 11 RBIs.
- As Caneda has gotten hot, Rhonda Revelle has chosen to move Caneda down in the order to the No. 9 spot in the hopes that Caneda will get on base in front of Billie Andrews. The move has proven effective as Nebraska has scored 44 runs in the five games Caneda has hit ninth ( 8.8 runs per game) with Caneda scoring eight runs and Billie Andrews totaling 11 RBIs.
- Since moving into the No. 9 spot in the lineup five games ago, Caneda is 8 -for-12 with three walks, reaching base in 11 of her 15 plate appearances for a .733 on-base percentage.

## BREDWELL \& BLAND SWINGING HOT BATS

While the top and bottom of the Husker lineup have been strong of late, two big bats in the middle of the order have been productive as well. Ava Bredwell and Samantha Bland have both been enjoying hot stretches over the past three weeks.

- Bredwell has been on fire the last three weeks. During that stretch, she is 17 -for-39 (.436) with four doubles, two triples, four homers and 14 RBls.
- Bredwell has at least one hit, one run and one RBI in each of her last seven games. During her seven-game hitting streak, Bredwell is 13-for-24 (.542) with three doubles, a triple, three home runs and nine RBls with a 1.125 slugging percentage and a .607 on-base percentage.
- Bland is hitting . 385 (15-for-39) over the last three weeks with four doubles, a homer and 11 RBIs. She has produced multiple hits in five of her last seven games and had a walk-off homer against North Dakota on March 15 and a walk-off single vs. Illinois on March 22.

## BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews entered the week ranked sixth nationally in home runs per game with 12 homers in 27 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 55 career homers.

- Andrews homered in Nebraska's first at bat of the game against Illinois on March 22. That home run was the 55th of her career and made her Nebraska's all-time home run leader. She broke the previous Husker career home run record of 54 set by two-time All-American Taylor Edwards, who played from 2011 to 2014.
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews entered the week ranked 14th among all active Division I players with 55 career home runs. She has played at least 10 fewer games than each of the 13 players ranked ahead of her on the active home run chart, with the exception of Wichita State's Addison Barnard.


## BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews enters this weekend's series at Wisconsin with 43 career stolen bases and 55 career home runs.

- Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. Andrews has 55 career home runs and 43 career stolen bases, while Lizama had 47 career home runs and 91 career stolen bases.
- With seven more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.
- Nationally, there were only eight active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases entering this week. Of those eight, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.

## BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is beginning to leave its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews is on pace to potentially threaten the Big Ten season home record this spring, and she already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list.

- Andrews' 55 career home runs rank in a tie for eighth place in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 64 home runs, a total that would rank fourth in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .690 slugging percentage currently ranks 10th in Big Ten history. Only eight players in Big Ten history have had a career slugging percentage of .700 or higher.
- Based on her current pace and accounting for the 21 games remaining on Nebraska's regularseason schedule, Andrews is on pace to hit 21 home runs this season. The Big Ten record for home runs in a season is 24 by Illinois' Angelena Mexicano in 2008.
- Although Andrews is just shy of the minimum of 100 at bats to be considered for Big Ten season records, her performance in 2024 has put her in position to post one of the top slugging percentages in Big Ten history. Andrews owns a .918 slugging percentage, which would currently rank as the fourth-highest slugging percentage in Big Ten history. The record is a 1.007 slugging percentage by Penn State's Cassidy Bell in 2013.


## BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews has a knack for producing extra-base hits during her Husker career and this year has been no different. Andrews ranks fifth in school history with 92 career extra-base hits, including 22 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews entered the week ranked seventh nationally with 22 extra-base hits. Since she has played fewer games than many of her peers, Andrews' average of 0.82 extra-base hits per game ranked fourth nationally among players with at least 20 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 18 of her 27 games this season, including 16 of her last 21 games. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking third in extra-base hits per game, Andrews entered the week ranked sixth nationally in home runs per game (0.44), ninth in runs per game (1.2) and 10th in slugging percentage (.918). Andrews is one of only three players nationally - and the only player from a Power Conference - who ranks in the top 10 nationally in each of those three categories.
- Andrews entered the week ranked 21st among all active Division I players with 92 career extra-base hits. She ranked eighth in career extra-base hits per game (0.50).

## HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four of the eight Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with Sydney Gray and Billie Andrews each winning the award twice. Gray and Andrews are the only two players who have won multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5 -for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBls at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up big numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage. In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBls in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7 -for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBls in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

## HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players - including five returning all-region players - have missed multiple games due to injuries this season.

- Abbie Squier, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.
- Jordy Bahl suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023.
- Emmerson Cope has not played in Nebraska's last nine games due to a back injury.
- Abbey Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Tokheim hit . 359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats in 2023.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- Billie Andrews missed four games in New Mexico while in concussion protocol.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered a hand injury in New Mexico that forced her to miss three starts.
- Peyton Cody was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the first week due to foot issues.
- Caitlin Olensky's availability is in question after she exited with an injury after throwing 1.0 inning against Illinois on March 22. Olensky owns Nebraska's lowest ERA (3.30) this season.


## ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN \& NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (213) and home runs (55) while ranking second in runs (169) and RBIs (141). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (178) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBls behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (155), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews entered the week ranked 14th among all active players in career home runs (55), 16th in total bases (419) and 24th in runs (169).

## ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection. In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three firstteam All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

## SCOUTING WISCONSIN (12-17, 1-2 BIG TEN)

Wisconsin brings a 12-17 record into its first home games of the season this weekend against Nebraska. The Badgers are 1-2 in Big Ten play after losing two of three games at lowa last weekend. Nebraska and Wisconsin share five common opponents this season in Long Beach State, Maine, Missouri, Utah and Washington. The Huskers posted a 2-4 record against that group while the Badgers went 3-5.

Wisconsin is hitting . 269 as a team and averaging 4.3 runs per game. Defensively, the Badgers own a 4.19 ERA and are allowing 4.7 runs per game. Wisconsin entered the week leading the Big Ten and ranking 16th nationally with nine shutouts this season.

- Hilary Blomberg leads Wisconsin with a . 355 average as one of four starters batting above .300. Blomberg has added six doubles and eight RBIs.
- Emily Bojan is second on the team with a . 333 average with three doubles and one homer.
- Ava Kuszak is batting . 325 and leads the Badgers with 26 hits and seven doubles.
- Fiona Girardot is hitting . 305 in 22 starts and Skylar Sirdashney owns a . 304 average in 14 starts.
- Emmy Wells is the top power hitter as she leads Wisconsin with eight home runs, 19 RBls and a .575 slugging percentage.
- Peyton Bannon and Danielle Lucey add speed to the team with 23 stolen bases in 27 attempts between them.
- In the circle, Tessa Magnanimo has seen the most action. Magnanimo is 5-7 with a 3.53 ERA. She leads the Badgers with 19 appearances, 13 starts and 75.1 innings. Magnanimo has struck out 54 batters and opponents are hitting .301 against her. She ranks second in the Big Ten - behind teammate Gabi Salo - in shutouts (3).
- Shelby Jacobson is 2-8 with a 5.42 ERA in 60.2 innings. She ranks second on the team in appearances (16), starts (9) and innings pitched.
- Gabi Salo boasts the Badgers' lowest ERA, as she is $5-2$ with a 2.64 ERA in 45.0 innings. Salo has struck out 50 batters in her 45.0 innings, and opponents are hitting just .246 against her. Salo leads the Big Ten and entered the week ranked 13th nationally with four shutouts.
- Hilary Blomberg (0-0, 21.00 ERA in 2.2 IP) rounds out the Badger staff.
- Yvette Healy is in her 14th season at Wisconsin, where she owns a 401-274-1 record. Healy has led the Badgers to one Big Ten tournament title and six NCAA Tournament appearances. She has taken Wisconsin to six of its nine all-time trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- Healy was previously the head coach at Loyola Chicago, where she went 131-172-1 in six seasons. In her career, Healy owns a 532-446-2 record in 20 seasons.
