The Nebraska softball team plays its final non-conference game of the regular season on Tuesday when the Huskers host the Kansas Jayhawks at Bowlin Stadium.

First pitch is set for 5 p.m. on Tuesday. Tickets can be purchased by visiting huskers.com/softball, calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED or at the Bowlin Stadium ticket office beginning one hour prior to first pitch. Fans can also watch the game with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month. A free radio broadcast of Tuesday's game - and every game this season - will be available on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app.

Nebraska brings a five-game winning streak into Tuesday's game, matching its longest winning streak of the season. Overall, the Huskers have won 10 of their last 11 games. The offense has powered the recent hot stretch as Nebraska is averaging 8.5 runs per game over its last 11 contests.

The Huskers have also won seven of their last eight home games. Nebraska is hosting Kansas for the first time since 2017 as each of the last seven meetings between the programs have been played in Lawrence.

Kansas enters Tuesday's game with a 22-11-1 record after the Jayhawks were swept in a three-game series by No. 1 Oklahoma over the weekend. Kansas was ranked 24th in the USA Softball poll last week and the Jayhawks are No. 30 in the NCAA RPI ranking.

LEADING OFF

- Nebraska enters Tuesday's game with 1,599 wins in program history.
- The Huskers entered the week ranked in the top 10 nationally in doubles (5th, 64) and defensive double plays (4th, 20).
- Nebraska used the same batting order in the final two games at Wisconsin, marking the first time this season NU has duplicated a batting order.
- NU has won four games when trailing after six innings, its most such wins in a season this century.
- Nebraska leads the Big Ten with 106 extra-base hits and is the only team in the conference with 100 extra-base hits.
- Three Huskers rank in the top seven in the Big Ten in extra-base hits: **Billie Andrews** (1st, 23); **Ava Bredwell** (4th, 19); and **Sydney Gray** (7th, 17).
- **Billie Andrews** and **Sydney Gray** are the only players to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- **Brooke Andrews** has 99 career starts in center field and 98 career RBIs.
- **Billie Andrews** entered the week as one of only 15 players nationally averaging 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game.
- **Billie Andrews** is Nebraska's all-time home run leader and ranks eighth in Big Ten history with 55 career home runs.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Sydney Gray went 8-for-12 in the Wisconsin series with one double, two home runs, four runs and seven RBIs. Over the last 16 games, Gray leads NU with a .417 average and seven homers.



Kaylin Kinney was 2-0 with one save and a 0.54 ERA in the Wisconsin series. She ranks seventh nationally in wins and has earned the win or the save in 16 of Nebraska's 21 wins.

• **Rhonda Revelle** has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.

• Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

• Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.

• Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,417 of Nebraska's 1,599 all-time victories (89 percent).

• Nebraska is scheduled to play 22 home games, which would be the most regular-season home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.

• NU has 22 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.

• Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.

• Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.

• The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

HUSKERS SHOWING COMEBACK ABILITY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 14 of their 21 wins, including eight times where Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 4-8 when trailing after six innings this season after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings of play are its most in a season since 2016, when the Huskers were 4-13 when trailing after six innings. A Nebraska team has not won five times in a season when trailing after six innings since at least 2000.

A SISTER ACT AT THE TOP OF THE LINEUP

The Andrews sisters have hit first and second in the Nebraska batting order each of the past 18 games with younger sister Billie Andrews leading off and older sister Brooke Andrews hitting second. The sisters have proven to be a productive combination at the top of the order.

- During the last 18 games when Billie has led off and Brooke has hit second, Nebraska has averaged 7.3 runs per game. In the first 16 games, Nebraska averaged 4.7 runs per game.
- The duo has hit .336 collectively over the last 18 games while combining to average 2.6 hits per game, 2.4 runs per game and 2.0 RBIs per game.

CANEDA THRIVING AS 'SECOND' LEADOFF HITTER

With the Andrews sisters anchoring the top of the lineup, Nebraska had been in search of a strong No. 9 hitter to act as a second leadoff hitter batting ahead of Billie Andrews. The Huskers appear to have found that hitter in **Katelyn Caneda**.

- Caneda, who posted the third-highest batting average (.366) by a freshman in program history last year, has bounced back from a slow start to the season. In the last four weeks, Caneda is batting .333 (15-for-45) with a .444 on-base percentage, 12 runs and 11 RBIs.
- As Caneda has gotten hot, **Rhonda Revelle** has chosen to move Caneda down in the order to the No. 9 spot in the hopes that Caneda will get on base in front of Billie Andrews. The move has proven effective as Nebraska has scored 67 runs in the eight games Caneda has hit ninth (8.4 runs per game) with Caneda scoring nine runs and Billie Andrews totaling 13 RBIs.
- Since moving into the No. 9 spot in the lineup eight games ago, Caneda is 8-for-19 with five walks, reaching base in 13 of her 24 plate appearances for a .542 on-base percentage.

MIDDLE OF THE ORDER SWINGING HOT BATS

While the top and bottom of the Husker lineup have been strong of late, three big bats in the middle of the order have been productive as well. **Ava Bredwell**, **Samantha Bland** and **Sydney Gray** have all been enjoying hot stretches over the past four weeks.

- Bredwell is 17-for-39 (.436) over the last four weeks with seven doubles, two triples, four homers and 15 RBIs in 16 games. Over the last four weeks, she leads Nebraska in doubles.
- Bland is 17-for-51 (.333) over the last four weeks with four doubles, two homers and 13 RBIs.
- Over the past four weeks, Gray leads Nebraska with a .417 average (20-for-48), seven homers, 12 walks, a .917 slugging percentage and a .525 on-base percentage.
- The Huskers have hit Bredwell third, Bland fourth and Gray fifth in each of the last five games. In those five games, NU is averaging 8.8 runs per game.

TOKHEIM RETURNS IN A BIG WAY

Talia Tokheim has returned to the Nebraska lineup in a big way. Tokheim played in just 15 games last season before suffering a season-ending knee injury. She went exactly one year between starts, but Tokheim has returned to start Nebraska's last four games.

- Tokheim is 5-for-14 (.357) with three homers, six runs and six RBIs since returning to the Nebraska starting lineup. She has had a hit, a run and an RBI in three of her four starts.
- Tokheim has three extra-base hits in 15 at bats this season and 13 extra-base hits in 54 career at bats. She averages an extra-base hit every four at bats in her career.

BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews entered the week ranked 12th nationally in home runs per game with 12 homers in 30 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 55 career homers.

- Andrews homered against Illinois on March 22. That home run was the 55th of her career and made her Nebraska's all-time home run leader. She broke the previous record of 54 home runs set by two-time All-American Taylor Edwards, who played from 2011 to 2014.
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews entered the week 14th among all active Division I players with 55 career home runs. She has played at least 11 fewer games than 12 of the 13 players ahead of her on the list.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews enters Tuesday's game with 44 career stolen bases and 55 career home runs.

- Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama (47 homers, 91 stolen bases) as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With six more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.
- Nationally, there were only nine active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases entering this week. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.

BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is beginning to leave its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list and she is also looking for a place on the Big Ten's career and single-season slugging percentage top 10.

- Andrews' 55 career home runs rank in a tie for eighth place in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 62 home runs, a total that would rank fourth in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .685 career slugging percentage currently ranks 10th in Big Ten history.
- Andrews is on pace to hit 19 home runs this season. That would leave her just shy of becoming the third player in Big Ten history - and the first Husker - with two 20-home run seasons.
- Andrews' .862 slugging percentage would currently rank as the 11th-highest season slugging percentage in Big Ten history.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews ranks fourth in school history with 93 career extra-base hits, including 23 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews entered the week ranked eighth nationally with 23 extra-base hits and was fourth in extra-base hits per game (0.77) among players with at least 20 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 19 of her 30 games this season. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking third in extra-base hits per game, Andrews entered the week ranked ninth nationally in runs per game (1.3), 12th in home runs per game (0.4) and 18th in slugging percentage (.862). Andrews is one of only six players nationally - and one of three from a Power Conference - who ranks in the top 20 nationally in each of those three categories.
- Andrews entered the week ranked 22nd among all active Division I players with 93 career extra-base hits. She ranked ninth in career extra-base hits per game (0.49).

HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four of the eight Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** and **Billie Andrews** each winning the award twice. Gray and Andrews are the only two players who have won multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up big numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage. In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players - including five returning all-region players - have missed multiple games due to injuries this season.

- **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.
- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023.
- **Emmerson Cope** missed nine games due to a back injury before returning at Wisconsin.
- **Abbey Newlun** had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- **Talia Tokheim** missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Tokheim hit .359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats in 2023.
- **Dakota Carter**, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- **Billie Andrews** missed four games in New Mexico while in concussion protocol.
- **Katelyn Caneda** suffered a hand injury in New Mexico that forced her to miss three starts.
- **Peyton Cody** was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the first week due to foot issues.
- **Caitlin Olensky** has missed Nebraska's last four games after leaving a game with Illinois on March 22 after just 1.0 inning. Her availability for this week is questionable.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (216) and home runs (55) while ranking second in runs (174) and RBIs (143). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (178) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (157), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews entered the week ranked 14th among all active players in career home runs (55), 18th in total bases (424) and 21st in runs (174).

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection. In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

**NEBRASKA 1, KANSAS 0
MAY 19, 1999**

Nebraska defeated Kansas 1-0 in the opening round of the 1999 Big 12 Tournament. Leigh Ann Walker and Jenny Voss combined on a no-hitter that marked the first combined no-hitter in program history and the first no-hitter of any kind in Big 12 Tournament history.

**NEBRASKA 2, KANSAS 0
APRIL 4, 2006**

Nebraska defeated Kansas 2-0 in the first of two Big 12 games between the programs in 2006. The Huskers won in Lawrence won despite being no-hit, as Nebraska scored its two runs on a passed ball and a wild pitch.

**NEBRASKA 1, KANSAS 0
APRIL 26, 2006**

Three weeks after Nebraska was no-hit by Kansas, Ashley DeBuhr no-hit the Jayhawks in a 1-0 Husker victory at Bowlin Stadium. DeBuhr allowed only two walks and struck out 16 Jayhawks. She struck out the first six batters she faced while her final eight outs were all via the strikeout. The no-hitter marked DeBuhr's ninth shutout in a stretch of 14 starts.

Nebraska avenged a loss a day earlier by eliminating Kansas from the 2014 NCAA Tournament in Columbia, Missouri. Dawna Tyson had a two-run single to lift the Huskers to the victory. NU wrapped up the victory at 10:58 p.m. and then return to the field the next day at Noon and defeated Missouri twice to win the Columbia Regional and advance to the NCAA Tuscaloosa Super Regional.

SCOUTING KANSAS (22-11-1)

Kansas is 22-11-1 on the season, including a 7-5 record in Big 12 Conference play. The Jayhawks, who were ranked in the USA Softball poll last week and were the top receiving votes team in the NFCA coaches' poll, have won nine of their last 13 games despite being swept in a three-game series by No. 1 Oklahoma last weekend. Nebraska and Kansas share five common opponents this season in Creighton, Illinois, Missouri, Oregon and Wichita State. The Huskers went 4-4 against that group while the Jayhawks were 4-2.

Kansas is batting .267 as a team while averaging 4.5 runs per game. In the circle, the Jayhawks boast a 2.84 ERA and a .964 fielding percentage while limiting opponents to 3.3 runs per game.

- **Campbell Bagshaw** is the lone Jayhawk starter hitting above .300. Bagshaw leads the team with a .315 average, two triples and 25 RBIs.
- **Lyric Moore** is hitting .298 and leads KU with five home runs and a .521 slugging percentage. She is also tied for the team lead with two triples.
- **Hailey Cripe** owns a .927 average and leads the team with 30 hits and seven doubles while ranking second with 23 RBIs.
- **Angela Price** leads Kansas with nine stolen bases and a .393 on-base percentage to complement a .274 average.
- In the circle, Kansas has relied on the combination of **Kasey Hamilton** and **Katie Brooks**, who have thrown more than 80 percent of the team's innings.
- Hamilton is 9-7 with two saves and a 2.73 ERA in 115.1 innings. She has appeared in 21 of Kansas' 34 games with 17 starts, 15 complete games and five shutouts. Hamilton is tied for the national lead with 15 complete games and ranks 10th in shutouts and 12th in innings pitched. Opponents are hitting just .224 against Hamilton.
- Brooks is 10-3 with a 2.33 ERA in 75.0 innings. She has appeared in 16 games with 14 starts. Brooks has allowed only one home run this season.
- Five other Jayhawks have seen action behind Hamilton and Brooks. **Olivia Bruno** is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in 16.1 innings while **Addison Purvis** is 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA in 7.0 innings and **Lizzy Ludwig** is 0-0 with a 7.00 ERA in 7.0 innings. **Savanna DesRochers** (1-0, 7.00 ERA in 5.0 IP) and **Anna Soles** (0-0, 7.00 ERA in 1.0 IP) round out the Kansas staff.
- **Jennifer McFalls** is in her sixth season at Kansas. Her 22 wins this season are just three shy of her most in a season with the Jayhawks. McFalls owns a 117-149-1 record at Kansas and in her head coaching career.
