Two of the top teams in the Big Ten Conference meet at Bowlin Stadium this weekend when Nebraska hosts Penn State in a three-game series. First pitch on Friday is set for 5:30 p.m. with Saturday's game scheduled for 1 p.m. and Sunday's series finale at Noon.

Nebraska enters the weekend series with a 5-0 record in Big Ten play while Penn State is 5-1. The Huskers are tied with Michigan atop the Big Ten standings and the Nittany Lions are tied for third. Nebraska and Penn State are also two of the three Big Ten teams to have a top-50 ranking in the NCAA RPI, with the Nittany Lions having the highest ranking of any Big Ten team at No. 28 and Nebraska ranking third in the conference with an RPI of 47th.

Nebraska and Penn State boast two of the most powerful offenses in the Big Ten as both teams rank in the top 10 nationally in doubles. The Huskers lead the Big Ten with 108 extrabase hits while Penn State is second with 102 extra-base hits. Individually, only 10 Big Ten players have at least 17 extra-base hits. Six of those 10 will be on the field this weekend as Nebraska and Penn State each have three players with 17 or more extra-base hits.

Tickets for the weekend series can be purchased by visiting huskers.com/softball, calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED or at the Bowlin Stadium ticket office beginning one hour prior to first pitch. Fans can also watch all three games with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month. A free radio broadcast of every game of the series - and every game this season - will be available on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app.

LEADING OFF

- Nebraska is on a season-long six-game winning streak and has won 11 of its last 12 games.
- Nebraska is averaging 6.0 runs per game this season. Only twice in program history (2015 and 2022) has a Husker team averaged 6.0 runs per game.
- Nebraska ranks sixth nationally with 65 doubles while Penn State ranks seventh in the country with 64 doubles.
- Penn State (26-7) ranks 20th nationally in winning percentage. Including the Nittany Lions, Nebraska has played five teams currently ranked in the top 20 nationally in winning percentage.

- Nebraska leads the Big Ten with 108 extra-base hits while Penn State ranks second with 102 extra-base hits.
- Nebraska has won four games when trailing after six innings this season, its most such wins in a season this century.
- Only three players in the country have at least 13 wins and three saves, two of whom are Nebraska's Kaylin Kinney and Penn State's Bridget Nemeth.
- Billie Andrews and Sydney Gray are the only players to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- Brooke Andrews enters this weekend's series with 99 career RBIs.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Sydney Gray went 8-for-12 in the Wisconsin series with one double, two home runs, four runs and seven RBIs. Over the last 18 games, Gray leads NU with a .385 average and seven homers.



Kaylin Kinney is 2-0 with two saves and a 0.45 ERA in Nebraska's last four games. She ranks eighth nationally in wins and has earned the win or the save in 17 of NU's 22 wins.

- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,418 of Nebraska's 1,600 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 22 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 22 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.

HUSKERS SHOWING COMEBACK ABILITY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 14 of their 22 wins, including eight times where Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 4-8 when trailing after six innings this season after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings match the 2016 team for the most wins in a season when trailing after six innings since at least 2000.

NEBRASKA LEADING THE BIG TEN IN EXTRA-BASE HITS

Nebraska has hit 65 doubles, four triples and 39 home runs for a total of 108 extra-base hits this season. That total leads the Big Ten and three Huskers rank in the top 10 in extra-base hits.

- Nebraska leads the Big Ten with 108 extra-base hits. The Huskers also lead the conference with 65 doubles and rank second with 39 home runs.
- Individually, **Billie Andrews** leads the Big Ten with 24 extra-base hits. **Ava Bredwell** is fourth in the Big Ten with 19 extra-base hits and **Sydney Gray** ranks eighth with 17 extra-base hits.

- Bland is 20-for-54 (.370) over the last five weeks with five doubles, two homers and 15 RBIs.
- Gray is batting .385 (20-for-52) over the last five weeks, and she leads the team with seven homers and an .846 slugging percentage.

CANEDA THRIVING AS 'SECOND' LEADOFF HITTER

Until recently, Nebraska had been in search of a strong No. 9 hitter to act as a second leadoff hitter batting ahead of Billie Andrews. The Huskers appear to have found that hitter in returning All-Big Ten selection **Katelyn Caneda**.

- Caneda, who posted the third-highest batting average (.366) by a freshman in program history last year, has bounced back from a slow start to the season. In the last five weeks, Caneda is batting .319 (15-for-47) with a .439 on-base percentage, 12 runs and 11 RBIs.
- As Caneda has gotten hot, **Rhonda Revelle** has chosen to move Caneda down in the order to the No. 9 spot in the hopes that Caneda will get on base in front of Billie Andrews. The move has proven effective as Nebraska has scored 72 runs in the nine games Caneda has hit ninth (8.0 runs per game) with Caneda scoring nine runs and Billie Andrews totaling 14 RBIs.
- Since moving into the No. 9 spot in the lineup nine games ago, Caneda is 8-for-21 with six walks, reaching base in 14 of her 27 plate appearances for a .519 on-base percentage.

TOKHEIM RETURNS IN A BIG WAY

Talia Tokheim has returned to the Nebraska lineup in a big way. Tokheim played in just 15 games last season before suffering a season-ending knee injury. She went exactly one year between starts, but Tokheim has returned to start Nebraska's last five games.

- Tokheim is 5-for-15 (.333) with two walks, three homers, six runs and six RBIs since returning to the Nebraska starting lineup. She has had a hit, a run and an RBI in three of her five starts.
- Tokheim has three extra-base hits in 16 at bats this season and 13 extra-base hits in 55 career at bats. She averages an extra-base hit every four at bats in her career.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG ELITE COMPANY

Billie Andrews enters the weekend with 46 hits, 39 runs and 32 RBIs in 31 games this season. She averages more than 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game.

• Andrews is one of only 13 players nationally - and just seven from a Power Conference - who averages 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 1.0 RBI per game.

BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks ninth nationally in home runs per game with 13 homers in 31 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 56 career homers.

- Andrews hit the record-breaking 55th home run of her career against Illinois on March 22. Nebraska's previous home run record was 54, set by Taylor Edwards (2011-14).
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews ranks 13th among all active Division I players with 56 career home runs. She has played at least 12 fewer games than 11 of the 12 players ahead of her on the list.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With six more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.

• Nationally, there are only nine active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.

BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is beginning to leave its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list and she is also looking for a place on the Big Ten's career and single-season slugging percentage top 10.

- Andrews' 56 career home runs rank eighth in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 62 home runs, a total that would rank fourth in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .687 career slugging percentage currently ranks 10th in Big Ten history.
- Andrews is on pace to hit 20 home runs this season. If she can reach that mark, Andrews would become just the third player in Big Ten history with two 20-home run seasons.
- Andrews' .867 slugging percentage would currently rank as the 10th-highest season slugging percentage in Big Ten history.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS Nebraska has won 65 games in its 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (65-56). The 65 postseason wins rank 20th in NCAA history.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Huskers have combined to earn 30 Academic All-America honors, a total that ranks third among all Division I softball programs.

ALL-AMERICANS

A total of 18 Huskers have combined for 29 All-America awards, including seven multi-time All-Americans.

NCAA TOURNAMENTS

The Huskers have made 26 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 26 postseason appearances rank 14th in NCAA history.

REVELLE ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has guided 15 players to a total of 23 All-America awards in her first 31 seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

CONFERENCE TITLES

Nebraska has won a total of 20 conference championships. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six

Big 12 crowns and have captured a pair of Big Ten titles.

TOP-25 RANKINGS

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

WCWS APPEARANCES

Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

SOFTBALL OLYMPIANS

Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews ranks fourth in school history with 94 career extra-base hits, including 24 this season. Forty-three percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks eighth nationally with 24 extra-base hits and is fourth in extra-base hits per game (0.77) among players with at least 20 games played.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 20 of her 31 games this season. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking fourth in extra-base hits per game, Andrews ranks ninth nationally in home runs per game (0.4), 10th in runs per game (1.3) and 18th in slugging percentage (.867). Andrews is one of only six players nationally - and one of three from a Power Conference who ranks in the top 20 nationally in each of those three categories.
- Andrews ranks 19th among all active Division I players with 94 career extra-base hits. She ranks ninth in career extra-base hits per game (0.50).

NEBRASKA SOFTBALL

- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up big numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage. In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players - including five returning all-region players - have missed multiple games due to injuries this season.

- Abbie Squier, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.
- Jordy Bahl suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023.
- Emmerson Cope missed nine games due to a back injury before returning last weekend.
- Abbey Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Tokheim hit .359 with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBIs in only 39 at bats in 2023.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- Billie Andrews missed four games in New Mexico while in concussion protocol.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered a hand injury in New Mexico that forced her to miss three starts.
- Peyton Cody was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the first week due to foot issues.
- **Caitlin Olensky** has missed Nebraska's last five games after leaving a March 22 game with Illinois after just 1.0 inning. Her availability for this weekend is questionable.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (217) and home runs (56) while ranking second in runs (175) and RBIs (144). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (178) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (157), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews is ranked 13th among all active players in career home runs (56), 16th in total bases (428) and 20th in runs (175).

Nebraska trailed 4-0 going into the bottom of the seventh before scoring five times to record the largest seventh-inning comeback in Bowlin Stadium history. The Huskers sent eight batters to the plate in the inning and five scored.

SCOUTING PENN STATE (26-7, 5-1 BIG TEN)

Penn State brings the Big Ten's best record to Bowlin Stadium this weekend. The Nittany Lions are 26-7 on the season, leading the conference and ranking 20th nationally in winning percentage. Penn State also leads the Big Ten with its 26 victories, a total that ranks 19th nationally.

In conference play, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten standings with a 5-1 record. PSU opened Big Ten play with an impressive three-game sweep of Indiana. Last weekend, Penn State went 2-1 against Maryland with its only loss coming in nine innings.

Nebraska and Penn State share two common opponents this season in Kansas and Saint Francis. The Huskers went 2-1 against those two opponents while Penn State was 2-0. The Nittany Lions are just 1-6 in true road games this season. That includes an 0-5 record the first week of March against three quality opponents (then-No. 2 Texas, then-No. 19 Baylor and a 30-8 Texas State squad) when Penn State was without its ace pitcher.

The Nittany Lions bat .296 as a team while averaging 5.4 runs per game. Penn State ranks third nationally in triples per game and fourth in doubles per game. Defensively, the Nittany Lions boast a .961 fielding percentage and a 2.81 ERA that ranks fourth in the Big Ten.

- Gaby Garcia, a first-year transfer from Stephen F. Austin, leads an impressive group of six Penn State starters hitting better than .300. Garcia leads the team with a .373 average, a .651 slugging percentage and a .505 on-base percentage. The Big Ten's active career RBI leader, Garcia is tied for the team lead with 28 RBIs in 2024.
- Kaitlyn Morrison is batting .355, leads the Nittany Lions with 15 walks and is tied for the team lead with four triples and 12 doubles.
- Emily Maddock boasts a .349 average, and she leads Penn State with 37 hits and is tied for the team lead with four triples.
- Maddie Gordon is hitting .330 and leads the team with six home runs, 32 runs and 11 stolen bases. Gordon is also tied for the team lead with 12 doubles.
- Liana Jones (.309) and Haylie Brunson (.305) round out the .300 hitters. Jones is second on the team with nine stolen bases while Brunson is third with 17 extra-base hits.
- In the circle, Penn State has utilized four pitchers this season, primarily relying on **Bridget Nemeth** and **Mady Volpe**, who have combined to throw more than 75 percent of the team's innings.
- A freshman, Nemeth has been the Big Ten's best statistical pitcher this spring. She is 15-1 with three saves, 96 strikeouts and a 1.01 ERA in 96.2 innings. Nemeth has appeared in 20 games with eight starts. Opponents are batting just .192 against her with only 10 extra-base hits (nine doubles, one homer) in 359 at bats.
- Nemeth leads the Big Ten in wins and ERA while ranking second in saves and third in opponent average. Nationally, Nemeth ranks third in wins, 13th in ERA, 25th in strikeout-to-walk ratio and 26th in saves.
- Volpe is 7-3 on the year with one save and a 3.55 ERA in 77.0 innings. She leads Penn State with 26 appearances, 15 starts and one shutout. Volpe leads the Big Ten and ranks ninth nationally in appearances.
- Paige Maynard (3-3, 5.66 ERA in 29.2 IP) and Lydia Spalding (1-0, 4.26 ERA in 23.0 IP) round out the Nittany Lion staff.
- Clarisa Crowell is in her fourth season at Penn State, where she owns a 96-79 record. She is just four wins shy of leading the Nittany Lions to a third straight 30-win season after Penn State had totaled 30 wins only twice in the previous 13 seasons.
- Crowell previously spent eight seasons as the head coach of Miami (Ohio) from 2013 to 2020. She compiled a 209-182 record with the RedHawks and has a 305-261 career record.
