Each position has a designated point value, ranging from one hundred thirty-eight points for first place and one point for fiftieth place. To be ranked student athletes need to equal or surpass the minimum vote criteria, which is one vote for every three ballots submitted. The actual ranking position is determined by using the adjusted point standings, which lists in priority order the total points a student athlete has accumulated after the highest and lowest votes are dropped. The highest student athletes from each region based on final results were named to their respective region's All-Region team.
