The Nebraska softball team travels to Piscataway, N.J., this weekend for a three-game Big Ten series against the Rutgers Scarlet Knights at the Rutgers Softball Complex.

The Rutgers series is the first of two consecutive Big Ten road series for the Huskers. Including this weekend, three of the four Big Ten series between Nebraska and Rutgers have been played in Piscataway. The Huskers hold a 5-2 record at the Rutgers Softball Complex, but the Scarlet Knights have won the last two meetings in Piscataway.

Nebraska brings a 23-15 record into the series, and the Huskers sit in fourth place in the Big Ten standings. Rutgers is 25-16 overall and in sixth place in the Big Ten standings (7-4). Nebraska is coming off a series loss at home last weekend to Penn State. The Nittany Lions hit a game-winning two-run homer in the sixth inning of game one before hitting a gametying two-run homer in the seventh inning of game three, which they won in 10 innings.

This weekend's matchup pits two of the Big Ten's best sluggers against each other. Rutgers' Morgan Smith leads the Big Ten with 30 extra-base-hits and 17 home runs, while Nebraska's Billie Andrews ranks second in the conference with 25 extra-base hits and 14 homers.

Fans can watch all three games this weekend with a subscription to Big Ten+, with subscriptions starting at \$9.99 per month. A free radio broadcast of every game of the series - and every game this season - will be available on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app.

LEADING OFF

- This weekend will mark Nebraska's third conference series in Piscataway while Rutgers has come to Lincoln just once.
- Nebraska is averaging 6.0 runs per game this season. Only twice in program history (2015 and 2022) has a Husker team averaged 6.0 runs per game.
- Nebraska is tied for the Big Ten lead and ranks eighth nationally with 70 doubles.
- The Huskers rank ninth nationally with 21 double plays this season.
- NU leads the Big Ten with 116 extra-base hits. Individually, Billie Andrews ranks second in the Big Ten with 25 extra-base hits behind Rutgers' Morgan Smith (30).

- Nebraska has won four games when trailing after six innings this season, its most such wins in a season this century.
- Billie Andrews needs one more home run to become the first player in school history to have three seasons with 15 or more home runs.
- Billie Andrews and Sydney Gray are the only players to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- Brooke Andrews enters this weekend's series with 99 career RBIs.
- Kaylin Kinney is one of four pitchers to rank in the top 25 nationally in victories and saves.

Caitlynn Neal went 6-for-10 in four games last week. She has started the past two games in right field and is 4-for-7 with one double, one home run and five RBIs in those two starts.



Kaylin Kinney has pitched in 11 straight games, going 6-2 with three saves in those 11 games. Kinney ranks ninth nationally in appearances (29), 22nd in wins (14) and 24th in saves (4).

- Rhonda Revelle has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,419 of Nebraska's 1,601 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 22 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 22 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

A LOOK AT THE LINEUP

Nebraska's batting lineup has begun to take shape since Big Ten play began. The Huskers used a different batting order in each of the first 33 games this season, but Nebraska has used the same batting order in back-to-back games twice in the last six games.

• Billie Andrews and Brooke Andrews have hit first and second for the past 22 games. During those 22 games, Nebraska has averaged 6.9 runs per game. In the first 16 games this season, NU averaged 4.7 runs per game. The sisters have combined to average 2.6 hits, 2.3 runs and 1.8 RBIs per game when hitting first and second in the lineup.

KINNEY PITCHING WELL DESPITE INCREASED WORKLOAD

Kaylin Kinney has pitched in 76 percent of Nebraska's games, ranking ninth nationally with 29 appearances, including pitching in 11 straight games. She has made 12 starts with 113.2 innings pitched in 2024 after combining for 14 starts and 114.1 innings in her first three seasons.

- Kinney is 14-10 this season with four saves. She has earned either the win of the save in 18 of Nebraska's 23 victories. Kinney has been involved in the decision in each of Nebraska's last 11 games, posting a 6-2 record with three saves during that stretch.
- Kinney ranks 22nd nationally in wins and 24th in saves. She is one of only four Division I pitchers who rank in the top 25 nationally in wins and saves. The other three pitchers are: NiJaree Canady (Stanford); Emiley Kennedy (Texas A&M); and Emily Winburn (Delaware).

HUSKERS SHOWING COMEBACK ABILITY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 14 of their 23 wins, including eight times when Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 4-9 when trailing after six innings this season after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings match the 2016 team for the most wins in a season when trailing after six innings since at least 2000.

NEBRASKA LEADING THE BIG TEN IN EXTRA-BASE HITS

- Individually, **Billie Andrews** ranks second in the Big Ten with 24 extra-base hits. **Ava Bredwell** is tied for eighth in the Big Ten with 19 extra-base hits.

BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks eighth nationally in home runs per game (0.4) with 14 homers in 34 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 57 career homers.

- Andrews hit the record-breaking 55th home run of her career against Illinois on March 22. Nebraska's previous home run record was 54, set by Taylor Edwards (2011-14).
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews has 14 home runs this season. With one more home run, she will become the first Husker to have three seasons with 15 or more home runs.
- Andrews ranks 13th among all active Division I players with 57 career home runs.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With five more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.

• Nationally, there are only nine active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.

- Andrews' 57 career home runs rank eighth in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 62 home runs, a total that would rank fourth in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .686 career slugging percentage currently ranks 10th in Big Ten history.
- · Andrews is on pace to hit 19 home runs this season. Andrews is bidding to become just the third player in Big Ten history with two 20-home run seasons. The only two Big Ten players with two 20-home run seasons are Michigan's Sierra Romero and Samantha Findlay.

- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up big numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21
 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage.
 In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. A pair of Husker starters out for the year, while several other players - including five returning all-region players - have missed multiple games due to injuries this season.

- **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons.
- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023.
- Emmerson Cope missed nine games in March due to a back injury.
- Abbey Newlun had a knee injury last fall that required surgery, and she is out indefinitely as she continues her rehab. Newlun started seven games last season.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Upon her return, Tokheim hit three home runs in six starts before she suffered a season-ending injury against Penn State on April 7.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- Billie Andrews missed four games in New Mexico while in concussion protocol.
- Katelyn Caneda suffered a hand injury in New Mexico that forced her to miss three starts.
- Peyton Cody was limited to only two pinch-hit at bats in the first week due to foot issues.
- Caitlin Olensky, who owns Nebraska's lowest ERA this season, suffered a season-ending injury against Illinois on March 22.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (220) and home runs (57) while ranking second in runs (177) and RBIs (146). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (181) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (157), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews is ranked 13th among all active players in career home runs (57), 15th in total bases (434) and 21st in runs (177).

NOTABLE GAMES NEBRASKA 15, RUTGERS 12 APRIL 8, 2017

In the second game of a doubleheader, Nebraska rallied from a seven-run deficit to post a 15-12 victory. The Huskers trailed 8-1 after one inning and 12-8 after four innings before scoring the game's final seven runs. The seven-run comeback ties for the largest in school history while the 12 runs are the most ever allowed by Nebraska in a victory. Alyvia Simmons went 5-for-5 in the game to tie the school record for hits in a seven-inning game. As a team, Nebraska had 19 hits, including five home runs.

TEAMS SPLIT A FOUR-GAME SERIES APRIL 2-4, 2021

In the conference-only season of 2021, Nebraska and Rutgers split a four-game series in Piscataway. The Huskers won the first two games before Rutgers won the next two games. The four-game series was notable from for Tristen Edwards who posted a statistically perfect weekend. Edwards made 15 trips to the plate in the four games and reached base in all 15 plate appearances. She finished the series 1-for-1 with a home run, nine walks (two intentional) and five hit-by-pitches. Edwards posted a perfect batting average (1.000), on-base percentage (1.000) and slugging percentage (4.000) in the series.

NEBRASKA SWEEPS RUTGERS IN LINCOLN APRIL 1-3, 2022

In the most recent matchup, Nebraska swept a three-game series from Rutgers at Bowlin Stadium in 2022 in the only three games in series history played in Lincoln. Billie Andrews nearly matched Tristen Edwards' perfection from the previous season. Andrews reached base in 10 of her 11 plate appearances in the series, going 0-for-1 with 10 walks (one intentional). She tied the Nebraska record for walks in game (4) in both game one and game two of the series.



SCOUTING RUTGERS (25-16, 7-4 BIG TEN)

Rutgers is 25-16 after sweeping a doubleheader at Maryland on Wednesday. The Scarlet Knights are 7-4 in Big Ten play, with the seven conference victories ranking second in the Big Ten. Rutgers has won five of its last six games, all against Big Ten teams.

Nebraska and Rutgers share three common opponents this season in Duke, UCLA and Wisconsin. The Huskers went 3-2 against that group while the Scarlet Knights were 2-3. Rutgers hits .295 as a team and leads the Big Ten with 253 runs while averaging 6.2 runs per game. The Scarlet Knights are limiting their opponents to 3.8 runs per game and fielding at a .963 clip. Rutgers has outscored its opponents by 98 runs this season, the best run differential of any Big Ten team.

- Offensively, Rutgers has started the same nine players in the batting lineup in all 41 games this season.
- Morgan Smith is the Scarlet Knights' top hitter and one of the top hitters in the Big Ten and the country. Smith leads the team with a .457 average, nine doubles, four triples, 17 home runs, 57 RBIs, a .984 slugging percentage and a .503 on-base percentage.
- Smith leads the Big Ten in hits (59), home runs, RBI and slugging percentage and ranks second in triples and third in batting average.
- Nationally, Smith ranks second in RBIs, third in home runs, fourth in slugging percentage, eighth in hits and ninth in batting average.
- In game two Wednesday at Maryland, Smith had five RBIs to increase her season total to 57, setting a school record for RBIs in a season.
- **Kyleigh Sand** is hitting .375 with eight doubles, four triples and 20 RBIs. She leads the team in triples, runs (45), walks (27) and stolen bases (11). Sand ranks second in the Big Ten and 10th nationally in runs scored.
- LA Matthews (.308) and Kayla Bock (.302) give Rutgers four starters hitting above .300. Matthews has added nine doubles and 21 RBIs while Bock has five doubles, two homers and 25 RBIs.
- Katie Wingert is batting .287 with seven doubles, 11 home runs and 35 RBIs.
- In the circle, Rutgers has relied heavily on the duo of **Mattie Boyd** and **Morgan Smith**. Those two have combined to throw 231.1 of Rutgers' 276.2 innings (84 percent).
- Boyd is 14-6 on the season with two saves and a 2.42 ERA in 127.1 innings. She leads the Scarlet Knights in ERA, wins, saves, innings, appearances (26), starts (20), complete games (13), shutouts (2), strikeouts (117) and opponent batting average (.197).
- Boyd ranks second in the Big Ten and 22nd nationally in wins. She also ranks 15th nationally in starts, 18th in complete games and 24th in innings pitched.
- Smith is 8-8 with a 3.37 ERA in 104.0 innings over 23 appearances and seven starts. She has thrown six complete games including one shutout and has limited opponents to a .241 batting average.
- Laurelai DePew (1-0, 2.47 ERA in 11.1 IP) and Georgia Ingle (2-2, 1 save, 4.12 ERA in 34.0 IP) round out the Rutgers staff.
- Kristen Butler is in her sixth season at Rutgers, where she owns a 129-147 record. Butler led the Scarlet Knights to a 32-25 record last season, the program's first 30-win season since joining the Big Ten. With 25 wins this season, Butler is on the verge of leading Rutgers to back-to-back 30-win seasons for the first time in the 50-year history of the program.
- Butler previously spent four seasons at Toledo from 2015 to 2018. She had a 104-122 record at Toledo and is 233-269 in 10 career seasons.
