The Nebraska softball team will play at home for the first time in more than two weeks Tuesday when the Huskers host the Iowa Hawkeyes for a doubleheader at Bowlin Stadium.

First pitch for game one is at 4 p.m. with game two set to start 30 minutes following game one. Tickets for Tuesday's game can be purchased at huskers.com/softball, calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED or at the Bowlin Stadium ticket office beginning one hour prior to first pitch.

Fans can also watch both games of the doubleheader live on the Big Ten Network or the Fox Sports app. A free radio broadcast of Tuesday's doubleheader - and every game this season - will be available on Huskers.com or the official Huskers app.

The Huskers are coming off a 2-4 road trip that included a series win at Rutgers and a winless series at Michigan last weekend. NU has lost three straight games, just the second time this season Nebraska has lost more than two games in a row.

Two of Nebraska's three losses at Michigan last week were one-run defeats. Close games have been a common theme for the Huskers in conference play even with three run-rule victories. Four of Nebraska's eight Big Ten losses have been by a single run while seven of the Huskers' 14 conference contests have been one-run games (3-4 record). Nebraska has also played five extra-inning games in Big Ten play (3-2 record), with at least one game going to extra innings in each of the Huskers' first five conference series.

LEADING OFF

- Six of Nebraska's 24 players (25 percent of the roster) are out for the season with an injury (list on page 6).
- NU is 3rd nationally with 27 double plays.
- Seven of Nebraska's 14 Big Ten games have been one-run games (3-4 record).
- Only 18 players in the 14-team Big Ten Conference have 20 extra-base hits, and three of those players are Huskers.
- Nebraska has won four games when trailing after six innings this season, its most such wins in a season this century.
- The Huskers have won eight of the nine Big Ten meetings against Iowa in Lincoln.

- Eight of the last 10 games in the series have been played in Iowa City.
- NU is No. 49 in this week's NCAA RPI.
- Billie Andrews is two home runs shy of becoming the sixth player in Big Ten history with 60 career home runs.
- Billie Andrews is expected to make her 200th career start - all at shortstop - in game one on Tuesday.
- Billie Andrews and Sydney Gray are the only players to win multiple Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season.
- Katelyn Caneda is expected to make her 100th career start - all at second base - in game one on Tuesday.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader with 58 home runs, which rank sixth in Big Ten history. In 2024, Andrews ranks in the top 15 nationally in home runs and runs per game.



Sydney Gray went 4-for-10 at Michigan last weekend with two doubles and three RBIs. Gray is one of only six Big Ten players with at least 10 doubles and 10 home runs this season.

OFFENSE RANKS HIGHLY IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Nebraska boasts one of the top offenses in school history this season. The Huskers rank sixth nationally in doubles per game, 30th in home runs per game and 35th in scoring.

- Nebraska's 80 doubles already rank sixth in school history. The Huskers are on pace for 96 doubles, which would break the school record of 94 doubles set in 1995 and matched in 2023
- Nebraska owns a .482 slugging percentage that is on pace to rank fifth in school history.
- The Huskers are averaging 5.9 runs per game. That currently ranks as the third-highest scoring average in school history. Only twice in program history has Nebraska averaged 6.0 runs per game: 2015 (6.9 runs per game) and 2022 (6.0 runs per game).
- Nebraska has totaled 133 extra-base hits and is on pace for 160 extra-base hits this season. That extra-base hit total would rank fourth in school history.

HUSKERS SHOWING COMEBACK ABILITY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 15 of their 25 wins, including nine times when Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 4-11 when trailing after six innings in 2024 after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings match the 2016 team for the most wins when trailing after six innings since at least 2000.

NEBRASKA RANKS SECOND IN THE BIG TEN IN EXTRA-BASE HITS

Nebraska has hit 80 doubles, five triples and 48 home runs for a total of 133 extra-base hits this season. Individually, a pair of Huskers rank in the top 10 in the conference in extra-base hits.

- Nebraska is second in the Big Ten with 133 extra-base hits. Penn State, which has played three more conference games than Nebraska to this point, leads the Big Ten with 139 extrabase hits.
- Individually, **Billie Andrews** ranks third in the Big Ten with 26 extra-base hits. **Ava Bredwell** is tied for eighth in the Big Ten with 22 extra-base hits.
- Sydney Gray has 10 doubles and 10 home runs and is one of only six Big Ten players with at least 10 doubles and 10 home runs.
- A total of 18 Big Ten players have 20 extra-base hits, and three of those players are Huskers.

KINNEY SHOULDERING BIG WORKLOAD IN THE CIRCLE

Kaylin Kinney has pitched in 33 of Nebraska's 44 games (75 percent), ranking 17th nationally in appearances. Kinney has pitched in 15 of Nebraska's last 17 games and in 12 of the Huskers' 14 Big Ten Conference games. She has started 15 games and thrown 130.2 innings this season after combining for 14 starts and 114.1 innings in her first three seasons.

- Kinney is 15-12 this season with four saves. She has earned either the win of the save in 19 of Nebraska's 25 victories. Kinney has been involved in the decision in 14 of Nebraska's last 16 games, posting a 7-4 record with three saves during that stretch.
- Kinney is one of only eight Division I pitchers with at least 15 wins and four saves this season.

BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks 11th nationally in home runs per game (0.4) with 15 homers in 40 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 58 career homers.

- Andrews hit the record-breaking 55th home run of her career against Illinois on March 22. Nebraska's previous home run record was 54, set by Taylor Edwards (2011-14).
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews has 15 home runs this season. She is the first Husker to hit 15 or more home runs in three different seasons and just the second to have two 15-homer seasons.
- Andrews ranks 12th among all active Division I players with 58 career home runs.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With three more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.

- Nationally, there are only nine active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.
- With three more stolen bases, Andrews would become just the fourth active player with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases. The only three active players with 50 career homers and steals entering this week are: Addison Barnard (Wichita State), Kiki Milloy (Tennessee) and Karli Spaid (Miami [Ohio]).

BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is leaving its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list and she is also looking for a place on the Big Ten's career slugging percentage top 10.

- Andrews' 58 career home runs rank sixth in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 61 home runs, a total that would rank fifth in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .677 career slugging percentage currently ranks 11th in Big Ten history. It would take a .678 slugging percentage to move into 10th place in Big Ten history.
- Andrews is on pace to hit 18 home runs this season. Andrews is bidding to become just the third player in Big Ten history with two 20-home run seasons. The only two Big Ten players with two 20-home run seasons are Michigan's Sierra Romero and Samantha Findlay.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews ranks third in school history with 96 career extra-base hits, including 26 this season. Forty-two percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks 25th nationally with 26 extra-base hits. She ranks 16th in extra-base hits per game (0.65) and fifth among Power Conference players.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 22 of her 40 games this season. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking 17th in extra-base hits per game, Andrews ranks 11th nationally in home runs per game (0.4), 13th in runs per game (1.2) and 33rd in slugging percentage (.785).
- Andrews ranks 22nd among all active Division I players with 96 career extra-base hits. She ranks ninth in career extra-base hits per game (0.49).

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews has produced 226 hits in only 199 career games. She ranks eighth all-time at Nebraska in hits and has played fewer career games than every player ahead of her on the list.

• Andrews is guaranteed to become just the seventh four-year Husker to finish with more hits than games played. Andrews has 27 more hits than games played, a difference that ranks third in school history behind three-time All-American Ali Viola and two-time All-American Tobin Echo-Hawk.

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

WCWS APPEARANCES

Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four of the eight Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** and **Billie Andrews** each winning the award twice. Gray and Andrews are the only two Big Ten players who have won more than one player of the week award this season.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up big numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21
 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage.
 In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. Six Huskers have suffered season-ending injuries and a total of 12 players have missed at least one game this season due to injury, including six returning all-region players.

- Abbie Squier, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023. She was the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year both seasons after going 44-2 with a 0.99 ERA.
- Caitlin Olensky suffered a season-ending injury against Illinois on March 22. She owns Nebraska's lowest ERA this season by nearly a full run.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Upon her return, Tokheim hit three home runs in six starts before she suffered a season-ending injury against Penn State on April 7.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- **Abbey Newlun** is considered the sixth Husker with a season-ending injury. Newlun suffered a knee injury during the fall that required surgery and has not played in a game this year.

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection.
 In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

HUSKERS RANKED AMONG NATION'S TOP PLAYERS

In its preseason list of the top 100 players in the country, D1Softball ranked two Huskers among the nation's top 50 players. **Jordy Bahl**, who suffered a season-ending injury in game one this season, was tabbed as the No. 2 player in the country, while shortstop **Billie Andrews** was ranked as the No. 42 player nationally. Both were also ranked among the nation's top 10 players at their position, as was sophomore **Katelyn Caneda**.

- Nebraska and Indiana were the only Big Ten teams with multiple players on the D1Softball Top 100. Bahl and Andrews were the No. 1 and No. 2-ranked Big Ten players on the list.
- Bahl was the only Big Ten player named to the 50-player preseason watch list for the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award. She was one of 10 finalists for the award in each of her first two collegiate seasons.
- Bahl is also one of only three active pitchers who is a multi-time All-American along with Clemson's Valerie Cagle and Oklahoma's Kelly Maxwell.
- Andrews was the highest-ranked Big Ten position player on the D1Softball Top 100. She came in at No. 5 on D1Softball's list of the top shortstops.
- Andrews is one of only five returning 2023 All-America shortstops, along with Florida's Skylar Wallace, UCLA's Mya Brady, Kentucky's Erin Coffel and Boston's Kayla Roncin.
- Caneda, the only Big Ten player named to the all-conference, all-freshman and all-tournament teams in 2023, was ranked as the nation's No. 9 second baseman. Nebraska had the highest-ranked pitcher, second baseman and shortstop in the Big Ten Conference.

Nebraska scored 14 times in the second inning en route to an 18-0 win. The Huskers' 14-run second marked the highest-scoring inning in program history.


SCOUTING IOWA (16-21, 4-11 BIG TEN)

lowa is 16-21 on the season, and the Hawkeyes sit in 12th place in the Big Ten standings with a 4-11 conference record. Iowa has lost nine consecutive games. The Hawkeyes have played three conference series this month and were swept at Purdue, at Michigan and last weekend at home against Indiana.

Nebraska and Iowa share four common opponents this season in Michigan, Sacramento State, Utah and Wisconsin. The Huskers posted a 5-4 record against that group while the Hawkeyes went 4-5.

lowa is batting .256 as a team while averaging 3.6 runs per game. Defensively, the Hawkeyes rank fifth in the Big Ten with a 3.15 ERA and are allowing 3.8 runs per game with a .964 fielding percentage.

- Rylie Moss leads lowa with a .376 batting average and 44 hits. She has two doubles and eight RBIs on the season.
- Jena Young is hitting .360 and leads the Hawkeyes with four home runs, 11 extra-base hits, a .550 slugging percentage and .433 on-base percentage while tying for the team lead with five doubles.
- Soo-Jin Berry is the third Hawkeye starter hitting above .300. Berry owns a .324 average and leads the team with three triples, 22 runs and 25 RBIs while tying Young for the team lead with five doubles.
- In the circle, **Jalen Adams** has thrown more than half of lowa's innings this season. Adams is 9-10, having earned the decision in 19 of lowa's 37 games. She boasts a 2.47 ERA in 124.2 innings. Adams pitches to contact as she has only 41 strikeouts in her 124.2 innings, but opponents are hitting only .255 against her.
- **Devyn Greer** has seen the most action behind Adams. Greer is 2-5 with a 2.54 ERA in 41.1 innings.
- Jaylee Ojo has thrown 38.0 innings and is 3-3 with one save and a 4.05 ERA.
- Haley Downe (1-1, 1 save, 4.82 ERA in 20.1 IP), Andrea Jaskowiak (1-0, 3.28 ERA in 10.2 IP), Maren Judisch (0-2, 1 save, 8.84 ERA in 6.1 IP) and Kelsey Winters (0-0, 7.00 ERA in 1.0 IP) round out the Hawkeye staff.
- Renee Gillispie is in her sixth season as Iowa's head coach. She owns a 134-134 record at Iowa entering Tuesday's doubleheader.
- Gillispie is 963-713-3 in 30 seasons as a collegiate head coach. Prior to Iowa, Gillispie guided UCF to a 625-403-1 record in 17 seasons from 2002 to 2018. From 1996 to 1999, Gillispie went 118-123-1 as Texas Tech's head coach. Gillispie began her head coaching career at Bradley, leading the Braves to a 86-53-1 record in three seasons from 1993 to 1995.
