- Rhonda Revelle has won more games than any other head coach (male or female) in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,423 of Nebraska's 1,605 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska is scheduled to play 22 home games, which would be the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- NU has 22 home games scheduled along with 14 true road games. The last time the Huskers played more home games than road games in a season was 2010.
- Nebraska is set for a 22-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers will not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.

NAIL BITERS FOR THE BIG RED

Nebraska has become accustomed to playing close games this season. The Huskers have played 16 games decided by one run (35 percent of their schedule)

- Nebraska's 16 one-run games this season are its most since NU played 17 one-run games during the 2016 season. The last time Nebraska played more than 17 one-run games in a season was 2013, when the Huskers played 18 games decided by one run.
- The Huskers are 10-6 in one-run games this season. The last time Nebraska won more than 10 one-run games in a season was 2016 (11). NU has not won more than 11 one-run games in a season since 2007 (15 one-run wins).
- Nebraska has also played nine extra-inning games this season, which matches the total of extra-inning games the Huskers played in the 2022 and 2023 seasons combined.
- The nine extra-inning games for Nebraska this season are its most since the 1982 team of which Rhonda Revelle was a member played 11 extra-inning games.
- Nebraska is 5-4 in extra innings this season. The five extra-inning wins are the most by a Husker team since the 2007 squad went 6-2 in extra-inning games.
- In 16 Big Ten games this season, Nebraska has played nine one-run games. The Huskers are 5-4 in one-run games during the conference season.
- The Huskers have also played six extra-inning games in their first 16 conference games. Nebraska is 4-2 in extra innings in Big Ten play.
- In each of Nebraska's first six Big Ten series including Tuesday's doubleheader against Iowa at least one game has gone to extra innings in every series.

HUSKERS SHOWING COMEBACK ABILITY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 16 of their 27 wins, including nine times when Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 4-11 when trailing after six innings in 2024 after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings match the 2016 team for the most wins when trailing after six innings since at least 2000.

TAYLOR EDWARDS TO HAVE HER JERSEY RETIRED ON SATURDAY

Nebraska will retire the No. 12 jersey of Taylor Edwards in a post-game ceremony on Saturday. Edwards will become the sixth Husker to have her jersey retired.

- Edwards was a four-year starting catcher from 2011 to 2014. A three-time all-conference performer, Edwards earned third-team All-America accolades as a freshman in 2011, when she was one of 25 finalists for the USA Softball Player of the Year Award.
- Edwards earned All-America recognition again as a senior in 2014, when she was named a first-team All-American. Edwards was just the sixth Husker to be named a first-team All-American. She was also chosen as the nation's top catcher as a senior, becoming the first Husker to win the Diamond Sports/NFCA Division I Catcher of the Year award.
- Edwards ended her career with 17 school records and a pair of NCAA records. The national records she held included most grand slams in a game (2 in 2013) and most consecutive games with a home run (6 in 2011). Edwards ended her time at Nebraska with Husker career records with 54 home runs (since passed by Billie Andrews), four grand slams, 150 walks and 39 hit-by-pitches. She also owned three Husker season records (walks, hit-by-pitches and grand slams) and three game records (runs, walks, RBIs and hit-by-pitches).
- In her career, Edwards hit .327 with 220 hits, 177 runs, 41 doubles, 54 home runs, 202 RBIs and 150 walks. She posted a .471 on-base percentage and a .629 slugging percentage.

OFFENSE RANKS HIGHLY IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Nebraska boasts one of the top offenses in school history this season. The Huskers rank third nationally in doubles per game, 33rd in home runs per game and 38th in scoring.

- Nebraska's 85 doubles already rank fourth in school history. The Huskers are on pace for 98 doubles, which would break the school record of 94 doubles set in 1995 and matched in 2023.
- Nebraska owns a .479 slugging percentage that is on pace to rank fifth in school history.
- The Huskers are averaging 5.8 runs per game. That currently ranks as the fourth-highest scoring average in school history. Nebraska has a chance to become just the third team in school history to average 6.0 runs per game, joining the 2015 (6.9 runs per game) and 2022 (6.0 runs per game) teams.
- Nebraska has totaled 139 extra-base hits and is on pace for 160 extra-base hits this season. That extra-base hit total would rank fourth in school history.

NEBRASKA RANKS SECOND IN THE BIG TEN IN EXTRA-BASE HITS

Nebraska has hit 85 doubles, five triples and 49 home runs for a total of 139 extra-base hits this season. Individually, a pair of Huskers rank in the top 10 in the conference in extra-base hits.

- Nebraska is second in the Big Ten with 139 extra-base hits, one fewer than Penn State. The Huskers lead the Big Ten with 85 doubles.
- Individually, **Billie Andrews** ranks third in the Big Ten with 27 extra-base hits. **Ava Bredwell** is tied for eighth in the Big Ten with 23 extra-base hits.
- Sydney Gray and Billie Andrews each have at least 10 doubles and 10 home runs. Gray and Andrews are two of only nine Big Ten players with at least 10 doubles and 10 home runs this season.
- A total of 19 Big Ten players have 20 extra-base hits, and three of those players are Huskers.

KINNEY SHOULDERING BIG WORKLOAD IN THE CIRCLE

Kaylin Kinney has pitched in 34 of Nebraska's 46 games (74 percent), ranking ninth nationally in appearances. Kinney has pitched in 16 of Nebraska's last 19 games and in 13 of the Huskers' 16 Big Ten Conference games. She has started 16 games and thrown 138.2 innings this season after combining for 14 starts and 114.1 innings in her first three seasons.

- Kinney is 16-12 this season with four saves. She has earned either the win of the save in 20 of Nebraska's 27 victories. Kinney has been involved in the decision in 15 of Nebraska's last 17 games, posting an 8-4 record with three saves during that stretch.
- Kinney is one of only eight Division I pitchers with at least 15 wins and four saves this season.

BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks 15th nationally in home runs per game (0.4) with 15 homers in 42 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 58 career homers.

- Andrews hit the record-breaking 55th home run of her career against Illinois on March 22. Nebraska's previous home run record was 54, set by Taylor Edwards (2011-14).
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews has 15 home runs this season. She is the first Husker to hit 15 or more home runs in three different seasons and just the second to have two 15-homer seasons.
- Andrews ranks 12th among all active Division I players with 58 career home runs.

BILLIE ANDREWS BECOMES SECOND HUSKER IN 40-40 CLUB

Billie Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With two more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.

- Nationally, there are only nine active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.
- With two more stolen bases, Andrews would become just the fourth active player with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases. The only three active players with 50 career homers and steals entering this week are: Addison Barnard (Wichita State), Kiki Milloy (Tennessee) and Karli Spaid (Miami [Ohio]).

BILLIE ANDREWS MOVING INTO BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is leaving its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list and she is also looking for a place on the Big Ten's career slugging percentage top 10.

- Andrews' 58 career home runs rank sixth in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 61 home runs, a total that would rank fifth in Big Ten history.
- Andrews' .672 career slugging percentage currently ranks 11th in Big Ten history. It would take a .678 slugging percentage to move into 10th place in Big Ten history.
- Andrews is on pace to hit 18 home runs this season. Andrews is bidding to become just the third player in Big Ten history with two 20-home run seasons. The only two Big Ten players with two 20-home run seasons are Michigan's Sierra Romero and Samantha Findlay.

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG NATION'S EXTRA-BASE HIT LEADERS

Billie Andrews ranks third in school history with 97 career extra-base hits, including 27 this season. Forty-two percent of her career hits have gone for extra bases.

- Andrews ranks 23rd nationally with 27 extra-base hits. She ranks 15th in extra-base hits per game (0.64) and fifth among Power Conference players.
- Andrews has at least one extra-base hit in 23 of her 42 games this season. Andrews has also had three games this season with multiple extra-base hits.
- In addition to ranking 15th in extra-base hits per game, Andrews ranks 14th nationally in home runs per game (0.4) and 18th in runs per game (1.1).
- Andrews ranks 22nd among all active Division I players with 97 career extra-base hits. She ranks ninth in career extra-base hits per game (0.49).

BILLIE ANDREWS WITH MORE CAREER HITS THAN GAMES PLAYED

Billie Andrews has produced 227 hits in only 201 career games. She ranks eighth all-time at Nebraska in hits and has played fewer career games than every player ahead of her on the list.

• Andrews is guaranteed to become just the seventh four-year Husker to finish with more hits than games played. Andrews has 26 more hits than games played, a difference that ranks third in school history behind three-time All-American Ali Viola and two-time All-American Tobin Echo-Hawk.

HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four of the eight Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with **Sydney Gray** and **Billie Andrews** each winning the award twice. Gray and Andrews are the only two Big Ten players who have won more than one player of the week award this season.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBIs per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5-for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- Andrews put up big numbers in five games at the Mary Nutter Classic. She went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBIs, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage. In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10-for-13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March. She averaged 1.7 hits, 1.7 runs and 2.3 RBIs per game over the six games. Andrews homered in both of Nebraska's midweek games then went 7-for-15 with a double, two homers, eight runs and nine RBIs in four games at the Big Red Spring Classic.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. Six Huskers have suffered season-ending injuries and a total of 12 players have missed at least one game this season due to injury, including six returning all-region players.

- Abbie Squier, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- Jordy Bahl suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023. She was the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year both seasons after going 44-2 with a 0.99 ERA.
- Caitlin Olensky suffered a season-ending injury against Illinois on March 22. She owns Nebraska's lowest ERA this season by nearly a full run.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Upon her return, Tokheim hit three home runs in six starts before she suffered a season-ending injury against Penn State on April 7.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- Abbey Newlun is considered the sixth Husker with a season-ending injury. Newlun suffered a knee injury during the fall that required surgery and has not played in a game this year.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (227) and home runs (58) while ranking second in runs (183) and RBIs (150). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (187) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (166), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews is ranked 12th among all active players in career home runs (58), 15th in total bases (445) and 21st in runs (183).

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN (29-9, 15-2 BIG TEN)

Northwestern enters the weekend series at Nebraska with a 29-9 overall record, with the Wildcats boasting the top winning percentage (.763) in the conference. Northwestern is atop the Big Ten standings with a 15-2 record in conference play as the Wildcats seek their third consecutive Big Ten regular-season title.

Nebraska and Northwestern share three common opponents this season in Illinois, Michigan and UCLA. The Huskers posted a 2-4 record against that trio while the Wildcats went 5-1.

Northwestern bats .280 as a team while averaging 5.7 runs per game. The Wildcats rank 15th nationally and lead the Big Ten with an average of 1.4 home runs per game and are 23rd in the country with a .403 on-base percentage. Defensively, Northwestern boasts a 2.11 ERA and a .969 fielding percentage while allowing only 2.6 runs per game. The Wildcats lead the Big Ten and rank 15th nationally in ERA.

The Wildcats have outscored their opponents 109-39 in their first 17 Big Ten Conference games, winning by an average of more than four runs per game. Northwestern has also hit 34 home runs in its 17 conference games while allowing only five home runs.

- Kansas Robinson leads Northwestern with a .422 batting average, 49 hits, 10 doubles, 10 homers, 33 RBIs, an .802 slugging percentage and a .524 on-base percentage. Robinson ranks second in the Big Ten in average and on-base percentage and is third in slugging percentage and walks per game (0.7).
- Kelsey Nader is second on the team with a .358 average, 43 hits, 28 runs and seven doubles.
- Angela Zedak is the Wildcats' third .300 hitter as she boasts a .322 average. Zedak leads Northwestern with 30 runs scored and has added seven doubles, five homers and 24 RBIs.
- **Bridget Donahey** has drawn a team-high 30 walks and leads the Big Ten and ranks 19th nationally with an average of 0.8 walks per game. Donahey has added eight home runs to complement a .282 batting average.
- In the circle, **Ashley Miller** has statistically been the Big Ten's best pitcher. The reigning two-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week, Miller is 16-4 on the season with a 1.14 ERA in 135.2 innings. She has thrown more than 55 percent of Northwestern's total innings while appearing in 27 games with 18 starts. Miller has thrown five shutouts among her 15 complete games and has added four saves. Opponents are hitting just .161 against her, and Miller has struck out 155 batters while averaging eight strikeouts per seven innings.
- Miller ranks 11th nationally in fewest hits allowed per seven innings (4.0), 12th in ERA, 24th in shutouts and 25th in strikeouts. On the conference level, Miller leads the Big Ten in ERA, opponent batting average and is tied for the league lead in saves.
- **Riley Grudzielanek** has seen the most time behind Miller, appearing in 13 games with nine starts and posting a 6-1 record with a 3.40 ERA in 45.1 innings.
- Cami Henry is 3-2 with a 3.63 ERA in 34.2 innings with two saves in 12 appearances and eight starts.
- **Renae Cunningham** rounds out the Northwestern staff. Cunningham is 4-2 with a 2.80 ERA in 30.0 innings. She has added one shutout and two saves over 12 appearances and three starts.
- Kate Drohan is in her 23rd season at Northwestern where she owns a 774-422-1 record. Northwestern softball's all-time wins leader, Drohan has won four Big Ten titles with the Wildcats while advancing to 15 NCAA Tournaments and three Women's College World Series.
