The Nebraska softball team travels to Minneapolis this weekend for a three-game series against Minnesota to close out the regular season. Friday's opener will start at 6 p.m. with Saturday's game slated for a 2 p.m. first pitch and Sunday's finale set for Noon.

Nebraska (27-21) and Minnesota (26-22) are both battling to be one of the four teams that receives a bye for next week's Big Ten Tournament. The Gophers enter the final weekend in fourth place in the Big Ten standings with a 12-8 conference record. The Huskers are just a half game behind in fifth place with a 10-8 Big Ten record.

It should be a close series as Nebraska and Minnesota are similar on paper. Both teams boast one of the top offenses in the Big Ten. The Huskers are hitting .290 as a team and average 5.7 runs per game while the Gophers are batting .292 and score an average of 6.1 runs per game. Nebraska has hit 86 doubles and 52 home runs while Minnesota has totaled 83 doubles and hit 51 home runs.

In the circle, Minnesota's team ERA of 4.22 is nearly identical to Nebraska's 4.26 ERA, and the Gophers allowed 4.8 runs per game compared to 4.9 runs per game by the Huskers. The teams are also the top two fielding teams in the Big Ten as Minnesota leads the league with a .972 fielding percentage and Nebraska ranks second, fielding at a .971 clip.

The first two games of the series will air on the Big Ten Network while Sunday's final game can be seen with a subscription to Big Ten + , with subscriptions starting at $\$ 9.99$ a month.

## LEADING OFF

■ Six of Nebraska's 24 players ( 25 percent of the roster) are out for the season with an injury (list on page 7).

■ Nebraska leads the nation with an average of 1.8 doubles per game.

- Nebraska has played nine extra-inning games this season, its most extra-inning games in a season since 1982 (11).
- Ten of Nebraska's 18 Big Ten games have been one-run games, including six extra-inning games.
- Nebraska has come from behind in 16 of its 27 wins. The Huskers have won four games when trailing after six innings, their most such wins this century.
- Billie Andrews enters the weekend with 97 career extra-base hits. Ali Viola is the only Husker to total 100 extra-base hits.
- Billie Andrews is two home runs shy of becoming the sixth player in Big Ten history with 60 career home runs.
- Billie Andrews needs two stolen bases to become the first player in school history with 50 career steals \& 50 career homers.
- Kaylin Kinney ranks 12th nationally with 36 pitching appearances this season, pitching in 75 percent of NU's games.

■ Kaylin Kinney entered the week as one of eight pitchers who rank in the top 40 nationally in both wins and saves.

## HUSKERS TO WATCH



Emmerson Cope was in the lineup just once in a 34-day span due to a back injury. She has returned to bat in nine straight games, going 8 -for-31 (.381) with three homers in that stretch.


Sydney Gray has been at her best when Nebraska plays on the road this season. In 11 true road games, Gray is hitting . 410 (16-for-39) with four doubles, two home runs and 12 RBls.

- Revelle is in her 32nd season. She is tied with former women's golf coach Robin Krapfl as the longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,423 of Nebraska's 1,605 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska played 21 home games this season, which marked the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- This year will mark the first time Nebraska has played more home games (21) than true road games (14) in a season since 2010.
- NU is on pace for a 21-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers did not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

## A BATTLE FOR A BIG TEN TOURNAMENT BYE

Heading into the final weekend of the Big Ten season, no team has been officially eliminated from the Big Ten Tournament and nine teams are still in contention for a top four seed and a first-round bye at the conference tournament.

- Northwestern and Michigan have already clinched two of the four byes in next week's Big Ten Tournament. The Wildcats and Wolverines are guaranteed to be the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds, although which team will be the top seed is still undetermined.
- Rutgers, Minnesota, Nebraska, Indiana, Penn State, Purdue and Ohio State are all still in contention for the final two byes, although the best the Buckeyes could finish is a tie for fourth place, where the Big Ten Tournament seeds would be sorted out via tiebreakers.
- Nebraska must win this weekend's series in order to be in contention for a top four seed.
- A sweep this weekend and Nebraska would be guaranteed to be either the No. 3 or No. 4 seed at the Big Ten Tournament.
- A 2-1 series victory would put Nebraska in strong position for a top four seed but would not guarantee the Huskers a top-four seed. With a series win, the Huskers would fall below the No. 4 seed only if either Indiana swept Northwestern or Purdue swept Michigan State.

## HUSKERS HAVE FACED BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULE

The fact that Nebraska enters the final weekend in a strong position to secure a top four seed at the Big Tournament is a testament to the toughness and fight the Huskers have shown this season. Not only has Nebraska remained near the top of the Big Ten standings while playing most of the conference schedule with 25 percent of its roster sidelined with injuries, the Huskers have also played the Big Ten's toughest schedule.

- In Wednesday's NCAA RPI ranking, Nebraska had the No. 38 strength of schedule in the country. The Huskers have faced the toughest schedule this season of any Big Ten team according to the RPI, as Purdue ranks second with a No. 43 strength of schedule.
- In conference play, Nebraska and Ohio State are the only Big Ten team who have played - or will play - each of the top four teams in the current conference standings.
- The Huskers not only played - or will play - each of the current top four Big Ten teams, nine of their 11 games against those opponents were on the road. Nebraska hosted only Northwestern in its four series against the top four teams but the third game of that series was unable to be completed after Nebraska built a 5-0 lead after three innings.
- On the flip side, NU played only four games against the current bottom four teams in the conference standings. Maryland and Nebraska are the only two teams who have played - or will play - fewer than five games against the bottom four teams in the Big Ten standings.
- Nebraska's eight Big Ten opponents - including Minnesota - boast an 87-71 record in conference play entering this weekend. For comparison's sake, the Golden Gophers' eight conference opponents enter the weekend with a combined 66-91 record in Big Ten play.


## BIG RED COMEBACKS ON DISPLAY IN 2024

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 16 of their 27 wins, including nine times when Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit. The Huskers' largest comeback this season has been five runs, twice.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is $4-12$ when trailing after six innings in 2024 after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons combined.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings are its most since the 2016 team also won four times when trailing after six innings. Another win when trailing after six innings would give Nebraska its most such wins in a since at least the start of this century
- Twice NU has won on a walk-off home run when trailing in the bottom of the seventh inning.

## NAIL BITERS FOR THE BIG RED

Not surprisingly given its tough schedule, Nebraska has become accustomed to playing close games. The Huskers have played 17 games decided by one run ( 35 percent of their schedule).

- Nebraska's 17 one-run games are its most in 11 seasons since the 2013 Huskers played 18 games decided by one run - in 13 more games than this year's team.
- The Huskers are 10-7 in games decided by one run, its most one-run wins in a season since 2007, when the Huskers were 15-10 in one-run games.
- Nebraska has also played nine extra-inning games this season, which matches the total of extra-inning games the Huskers played in the 2022 and 2023 seasons combined.
- The nine extra-inning games for Nebraska this season are its most since the 1982 team - of which Rhonda Revelle was a member - played 11 extra-inning games.
- Nebraska is 5-4 in extra innings this season. The five extra-inning wins are the most by a Husker team since the 2007 squad went 6-2 in extra-inning games.
- Ten of Nebraska's 18 Big Ten games have been decided by one run (56 percent). The Huskers are 5-5 in one-run games during the conference season.
- The Huskers have also played six extra-inning games in their first 18 conference games. Nebraska is 4-2 in extra innings in Big Ten play.


## OFFENSE RANKS HIGHLY IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Nebraska boasts one of the top offenses in school history this season. The Huskers are also tied for the national lead with an average of 1.8 doubles per game.

- Nebraska's 86 doubles already rank fourth in school history. The Huskers are on pace for 93 doubles, which would be one shy of the school record (94).
- The Huskers are averaging 5.7 runs per game. That currently ranks as the fourth-highest scoring average in school history. Nebraska has a chance to become just the third team in school history to average 6.0 runs per game, joining the 2015 ( 6.9 runs per game) and 2022 (6.0 runs per game) teams.
- Nebraska has totaled 143 extra-base hits and is on pace for 155 extra-base hits this season. That extra-base hit total would rank fourth in school history.
- Nebraska owns a . 477 slugging percentage that is on pace to rank fifth in school history.

## MINNEAPOLIS MATCHUP: TWO OF THE NATION'S BEST SHORTSTOPS

Two of the nation's top shortstops will be on the field this weekend in Minneapolis in Nebraska senior Billie Andrews and Minnesota sophomore Jess Oakland.

- On Wednesday, Softball America released its updated list of the top 10 shortstops in the country and Oakland came in at No. 2 on the list while Andrews was No. 4.
- Andrews and Oakland have combined for 34 home runs and 62 extra-base hits this season. To put those numbers in perspective, the duo's 34 home runs are more than 216 Division I teams have hit this season and the 62 extra-base hits are more than the total for 56 teams.


## BILLIE ANDREWS NAMED NU'S FEMALE STUDENT-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Billie Andrews won Nebraska's most coveted award at the Huskers' annual recognition banquet on Sunday when she was named the 2023-24 Nebraska Female Student-Athlete of the Year. With the honor, Andrews will be the Huskers' Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient this season.

- Andrews is just the third softball player to be named the Female Student-Athlete of the Year in the 34 years the award has existed. The other softball players to win the honor were Mattie Fowler (2016) and Jenny Smith (1998).
- Andrews owns the distinction of being chosen as both the Nebraska Female Athlete of the Year (2022) and the Female Student-Athlete of the Year (2024). She joins volleyball player Mikaela Foecke and diver Abigail Knapton as the only three women to win both awards.


## YOUNG HUSKERS SWINGING HOT BATS

Nebraska's regular starting lineup features five juniors and seniors. But recently, it's been two Husker freshmen and one sophomore who have stood out at the plate.

- Over the past 10 games, the only three Huskers hitting .300 are freshmen Emmerson Cope and Samantha Bland and sophomore Katelyn Caneda. Together, that trio has combined for seven doubles, six homers and 19 RBIs while hitting .349. The rest of the Husker roster has produced nine doubles, four home runs and 25 RBls with a .245 average.

## BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks 23rd nationally in home runs per game (0.3) with 15 homers in 44 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 58 career homers.

- Andrews hit the record-breaking 55th home run of her career against Illinois on March 22. Nebraska's previous home run record was 54, set by Taylor Edwards (2011-14).
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews has 15 home runs this season. She is the first Husker to hit 15 or more home runs in three different seasons and just the second to have two 15 -homer seasons.
- Andrews ranks 14th among all active Division I players with 58 career home runs.


## BILLIE ANDREWS JOINS 40-40 CLUB \& NEARS 50-50 MARK

Billie Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With two more stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.

- Nationally, there are only nine active Division I players with 40 career home runs and 40 career stolen bases. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four players who has played her entire career in a power conference.
- With two more stolen bases, Andrews would become just the fourth active player with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases. The only three active players with 50 career homers and steals entering this week were: Addison Barnard (Wichita State), Kiki Milloy (Tennessee) and Karli Spaid (Miami [Ohio]).


## BILLIE ANDREWS IN THE BIG TEN RECORD BOOK

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is leaving its mark in the Big Ten record book. Andrews already finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list and she is also looking for a place on the Big Ten's career slugging percentage top 10.

- Andrews' 58 career home runs rank sixth in Big Ten history. Andrews is on pace to finish her career with 60 home runs. If she reaches the mark, she would become just the sixth player in Big Ten history to hit 60 career home runs.
- Andrews owns a .669 career slugging percentage and it would take a .678 slugging percentage to move into 10th place in Big Ten history.


## BILLIE ANDREWS WITH MORE CAREER HITS THAN GAMES PLAYED

Billie Andrews has produced 230 hits in only 203 career games. She ranks eighth all-time at Nebraska in hits and has played fewer career games than every player ahead of her on the list.

- Andrews is guaranteed to become just the seventh four-year Husker to finish with more hits than games played. Andrews has 26 more hits than games played, a difference that ranks third in school history behind multi-time All-Americans Ali Viola and Tobin Echo-Hawk.

## HUSKERS RACKING UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Huskers have won four Big Ten Player of the Week awards this season, with Sydney Gray and Billie Andrews each winning the award twice. Gray, Andrews and Minnesota's Jess Oakland are the only three Big Ten players who have won more than one player of the week award.

- Gray won her first award this season following the Troy Cox Classic. She won for a second time this year and for the third time in her career following the Razorback Rumble.
- Gray went 5-for-16 at the Troy Cox Classic with three homers and 10 RBIs. She averaged 1.0 hit, 1.0 run and 2.0 RBls per game over five games. Gray won her second award after going 5 -for-16 (.385) with one double, three home runs and five RBIs at the Razorback Rumble.
- Andrews won her first award this season following the Mary Nutter Classic, when she was also named the NCAA Player of the Week. Andrews won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 18 after helping NU to a 5-1 record the previous week.
- In five games at the Mary Nutter Classic, Andrews went 13-for-21 (.619) with one double, four home runs, six RBls, eight runs and a 1.238 slugging percentage. In three games against ranked teams, Andrews 10 -for- 13 with four home runs, five RBIs and seven runs scored.
- Her second award came after Andrews went 10-for-22 (.455) with one double, four home runs, 10 runs score and 14 RBIs in six homes games during the second full week of March.


## HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. Six Huskers have suffered season-ending injuries and a total of 12 players have missed at least one game this season due to injury, including six returning all-region players.

- Abbie Squier, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- Jordy Bahl suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023. She was the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year both seasons after going 44-2 with a 0.99 ERA.
- Caitlin Olensky suffered a season-ending injury against Illinois on March 22. She owns Nebraska's lowest ERA this season by nearly a full run.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Upon her return, Tokheim hit three home runs in six starts before she suffered a season-ending injury against Penn State on April 7.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- Abbey Newlun suffered a knee injury during the fall that required season-ending surgery.


## ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN \& NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (230) and home runs (58) while ranking second in runs (184) and RBIs (150). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (189) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBls behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (168), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews is ranked 14th among all active players in career home runs (58), 17th in total bases (448) and 22nd in runs (184).

Nebraska completed a three-game sweep of Minnesota with an 11-8 come-from-behind victory on Easter in 2022. The Huskers trailed $8-1$ in the third inning before scoring the game's final 10 runs. The seven-run comeback tied the largest comeback in program history. The win marked the final victory in Nebraska's 18-game winning streak during the 2022 season.

## SCOUTING MINNESOTA (26-22, 12-8 BIG TEN)

Minnesota is $26-22$ on the season and enters the weekend in fourth place in the Big Ten standings with a 12-8 conference record. The Gophers are coming off a three-game sweep at lowa last weekend.

Nebraska and Minnesota share six common opponents this season in Illinois, lowa, Northwestern, San Diego State, Washington and Wisconsin. The Huskers posted a 7-4 record against that group while the Gophers also went 7-4.

Minnesota is batting . 292 as a team while averaging 6.1 runs per game, a total that ranks 27th nationally. The Golden Gophers lead the Big Ten and rank 12th nationally in walks. Defensively, Minnesota owns a 4.22 ERA and a . 972 fielding percentage while allowing 4.8 runs per game. The Gophers lead the Big Ten and rank 30th nationally in fielding percentage.

- Jess Oakland is Minnesota's top hitter and is among the best hitters in the country. Oakland is hitting more than .100 higher than any other Gopher, as she leads the team with a . 455 average, 71 hits, 16 doubles, 19 homers, 64 runs and 54 RBIs.
- Oakland has put up remarkable statistics in Big Ten play. She is batting . 523 in the conference season with 34 hits, 11 doubles, 11 home runs and 34 runs.
- With three conference games still remaining, Oakland already ranks second in Big Ten history for home runs in a conference season (11, one shy of tying the record) and runs in a conference season ( 34 , four shy of tying the record). Oakland's 11 doubles currently rank as the fourth-most in conference season in Big Ten history.
- On the season, Oakland leads the Big Ten in batting average, hits, home runs, runs, on-base percentage (.552) and slugging percentage (.923) while ranking second in the conference in RBls.
- Nationally, Oakland ranks third in runs per game and slugging percentage, sixth in batting average, home runs and on-base percentage and 19th in RBIs.
- Morgan DeBord is batting . 354 this season and has produced eight doubles, three home runs and 27 RBls.
- Taylor Krapf owns a . 306 average and has 12 doubles, 10 home runs and 45 RBIs.
- Sydney Strelow is hitting . 299 and has tied Oakland for the team lead with 35 walks.
- Breezy Burnett has started every game and is a perfect 13-of-13 on stolen bases.
- In the circle, Bri Enter has seen the most action but she has not pitched since April 17. Enter is 12-7 on the year with a 3.16 ERA in 110.2 innings. She leads the Gophers in wins, ERA, innings, starts (19), complete games (4) and strikeouts (67) while tying for the team lead with one save.
- Jacie Hambrick is $6-8$ on the year with one save and a 4.80 ERA in 89.0 innings. She leads Minnesota with 30 appearances and ranks second in starts (16) and innings.
- Macy Richardson and Sydney Schwartz have also seen significant time in the circle. Richardson is $5-4$ with a 5.30 ERA over 27 appearances, 10 starts and 67.1 innings. Schwartz is $3-2$ with one save and a 3.21 ERA in 28.1 innings over 10 appearances.
- Jessa Snippes ( $0-1,6.66$ ERA in 13.2 IP) and Cameron Grayson (0-0, 3.50 ERA in 8.0 IP) round out the Gopher staff.
- Piper Ritter is in her fourth season as Minnesota's head coach. She has guided the Gophers to a 122-80-1 record. Prior to becoming the head coach, Ritter spent the previous 13 seasons as Minnesota's pitching coach.
