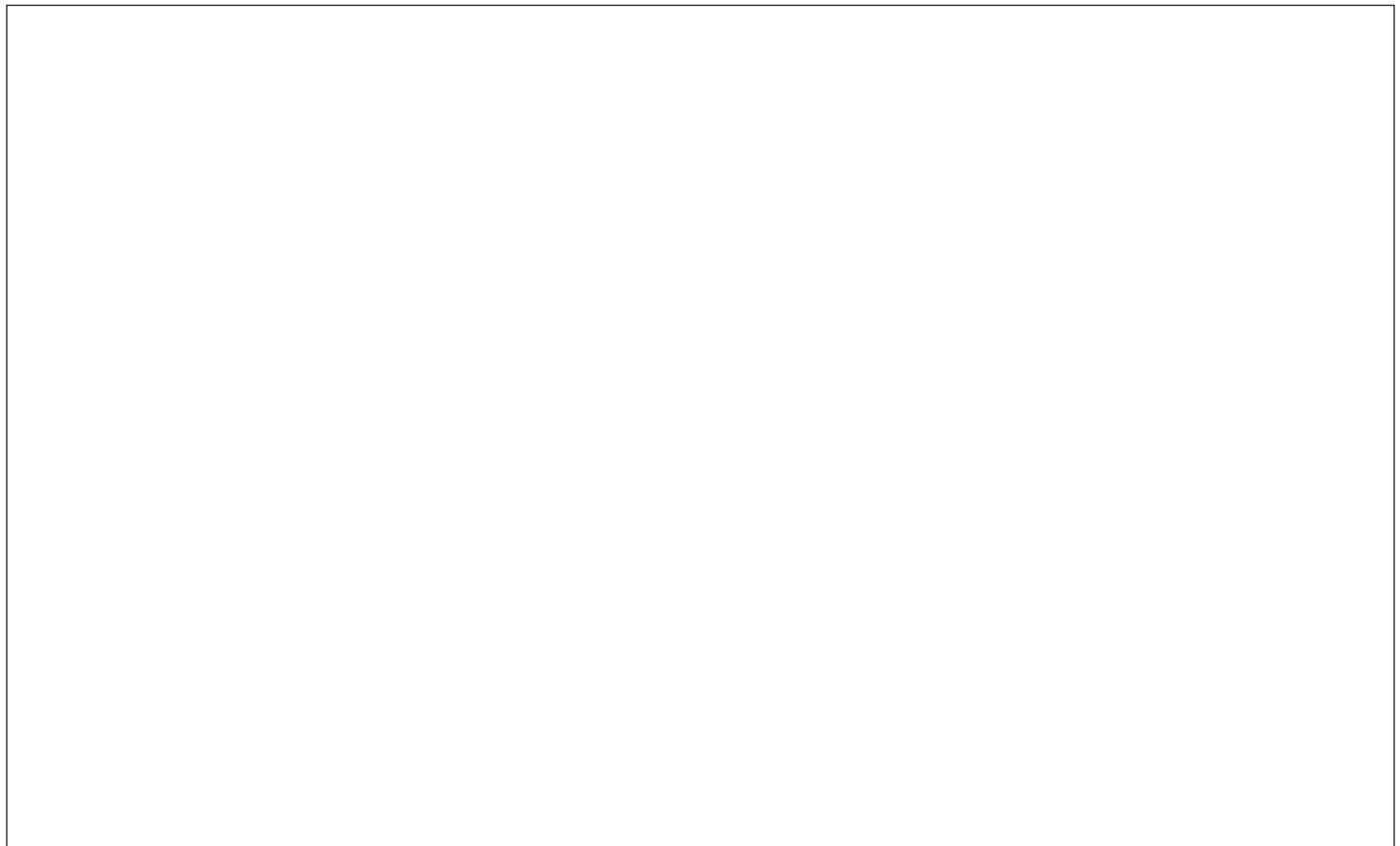

RIFLE GLOSSARY

Air rifle – A gun that uses a .177 caliber lead pellet propelled by compressed air instead of a gunpowder charge. The rifles can weigh up to 12.12 pounds.

Cleaned – A perfect target, in which the shooter hits a 10 on each of the 10 targets on the sheet for a score of 100. Can also be used to refer to a perfect match.

Front sight – The sight attached to the end of the barrel of the rifle, holding the front aperture.

Electronic targets – A target system that uses microphones and sound waves from the bullet or pellet going through the paper to send to a monitor on each point.

Iron sights – Sights that employ no magnification.

Kneeling – Shooting from a kneeling position with a sling and kneeling roll to support the position.

Off hand – The unsupported standing position.

Perfect match score – In air rifle and smallbore, 600 is perfect.

Prone – Shooting from a lying position.

Record shots – Also known as “shots for record,” those shots that are counted toward the match score, with “sighters” not included.

Relay – One group of shooters firing the match at the same time.

Shooting glove – A padded glove, with or without fingers, used to ensure the comfort of the non-dominant hand (i.e., a right-handed shooter wears

a glove on the left hand) as the shooter supports the rifle.

Shooting jacket – The jacket is made of leather or canvas and provides support and pads the shooter to minimize the effect of pulse and recoil. There are strict guidelines regarding the thickness.

Shooting boots – Boots designed for rifle shooting. They have the toe end of the sole and the heel cut flat for stability.

Shooting trousers – Snug canvas and/or leather pants usually worn over running tights or sweatpants. They often have padded reinforcements sewn on both knees and the seat to prevent the slipping of elbows and knees when firing from the kneeling position.

Sighting shots – Practice shots taken before going “for record.” Sighting shots are unlimited and may be fired before the beginning of each position. Once a position’s first record shot has been fired, no further sighting shots are permitted.

Sling – Adjustable strap with buckle adjustments and arm cuffs that provide stability. A sling is attached to the rifle and helps to support it in prone and kneeling positions.

Smallbore – A .22 caliber gun with an iron sight used in competition. It can be customized with special accessories and/or alterations (barrel length and style, stock, design, etc.) to fit the shooter’s needs and comforts.

SCORING SYSTEM

AIR RIFLE

Course of Fire – Competitors stand and shoot lead pellets from .177 caliber rifles at targets 10 meters away.

Rifle – Air rifles can be either air or gas powered and weigh up to 12.12 pounds by NCAA regulations.

Time – Competitors have 75 minutes to fire 60 shots from the standing position.

Perfect Match Score – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for air rifle.

SMALLBORE

Course of Fire – In smallbore three-position rifle, athletes fire .22 caliber rifles from the kneeling, prone, and standing (also called off hand) positions at targets 50 feet away.

Rifle – Smallbore rifles may not exceed 17.6 pounds by NCAA regulations.

Time – Competitors have 105 minutes for 20 record shots in the kneeling position, 20 record shots in the prone position and 20 record shots in the standing position.

Perfect Match Score – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for smallbore.

HUSKERS LOOK TO RETURN TO NCAAS IN 2021

For the Nebraska rifle team, the 2021 season is about unfinished business. The Huskers return five shooters, including All-Americans Elena Flake and Macey Way, and another all-conference honoree, from a team that qualified for last season's NCAA Championships before the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season prematurely.

Elena Flake comes off a breakthrough sophomore season when she collected second-team NRA All-America honors in both disciplines and was a third-team CRCA All-American in 2020. She was one of two Huskers to squad in every event during the season and paced the Huskers in scoring average in both smallbore (580.07) and air rifle (591.63). Her Air Rifle average ranked second in school history, as she had 10 scores of 590 or better highlighted by a school record of 597 against West Virginia. Flake had seven smallbore marks of 580 or higher, including a season-best mark of 590 in the NCAA qualifier at Murray State.

Way looks to build upon one of the best freshmen seasons in school history. The Colorado Springs, Colo., native earned second-team NRA All-America honors in the air rifle, averaging a 591.71 in the event as she was in the squad for every meet of the season. Way was consistent in the event, scoring 590 or better in the event in 11 of her final 12 matches of the year on her way to breaking the freshman season record in the event. Way broke into the smallbore lineup late in the

season, as she squadded in NU's final five events. She was fourth on the team in smallbore average (.572.30) and placed third in the smallbore at the Great America Rifle Conference Championship.

While the Huskers return a pair of All-Americans, Emily Cheramie has been the anchor of the Husker lineup throughout her career. The senior from Georgetown, Ky., is a three-time all-conference honoree, and returns after winning the Great American Rifle Conference title in the smallbore in 2020. Cheramie, who has competed in over 40 matches as a Husker, squadded in all 14 matches last season, while her scoring average in both disciplines ranked third on the team. She tied NU's school mark in the air rifle with a score of 597 at the NCAA qualifier at Murray State, one of seven scores of 590 or better in 2020-21. In the smallbore, Cheramie posted eight marks of 580 or better, including a season high of 588 against Memphis.

Aletto has been a staple of the Huskers' lineup during her first two seasons and is a strong contender to make a major contribution in 2021. She has made 18 appearances in her Husker career, including 10 times as a sophomore. She raised her air rifle average by nearly four points last season as she averaged a 585.60 in the event, including a high of 591 on two occasions. She also squadded five times in the Huskers' smallbore lineup and posted a season best of

572 against TCU.

Elizabeth Lorentz provides depth in the Husker lineup after competing in NU's lineup in her two seasons in the program. As a sophomore, Lorentz competed in four matches and was in NU's squad on two occasions. She posted a season high of 591 in the Air Rifle in a quadrangular match with Air Force, Kentucky and UTEP. Her season best in the smallbore was a 563 against Army West Point.

Martin will also rely on freshmen Madelynn Erickson and Cecelia Ossi to make major contributions to the 2021 squad. Erickson was a four-time Junior Olympics qualifier and earned Elay High School All-America honors in 2019. Ossi also brings strong credentials to the Husker program. She won the New Jersey state championship in three events in 2019 and placed eighth at the 2018 National 4-H Shooting Sports Championships.

The Huskers will have an abbreviated schedule after not competing in the fall. NU will have eight matches before the NCAA qualifier in late February.

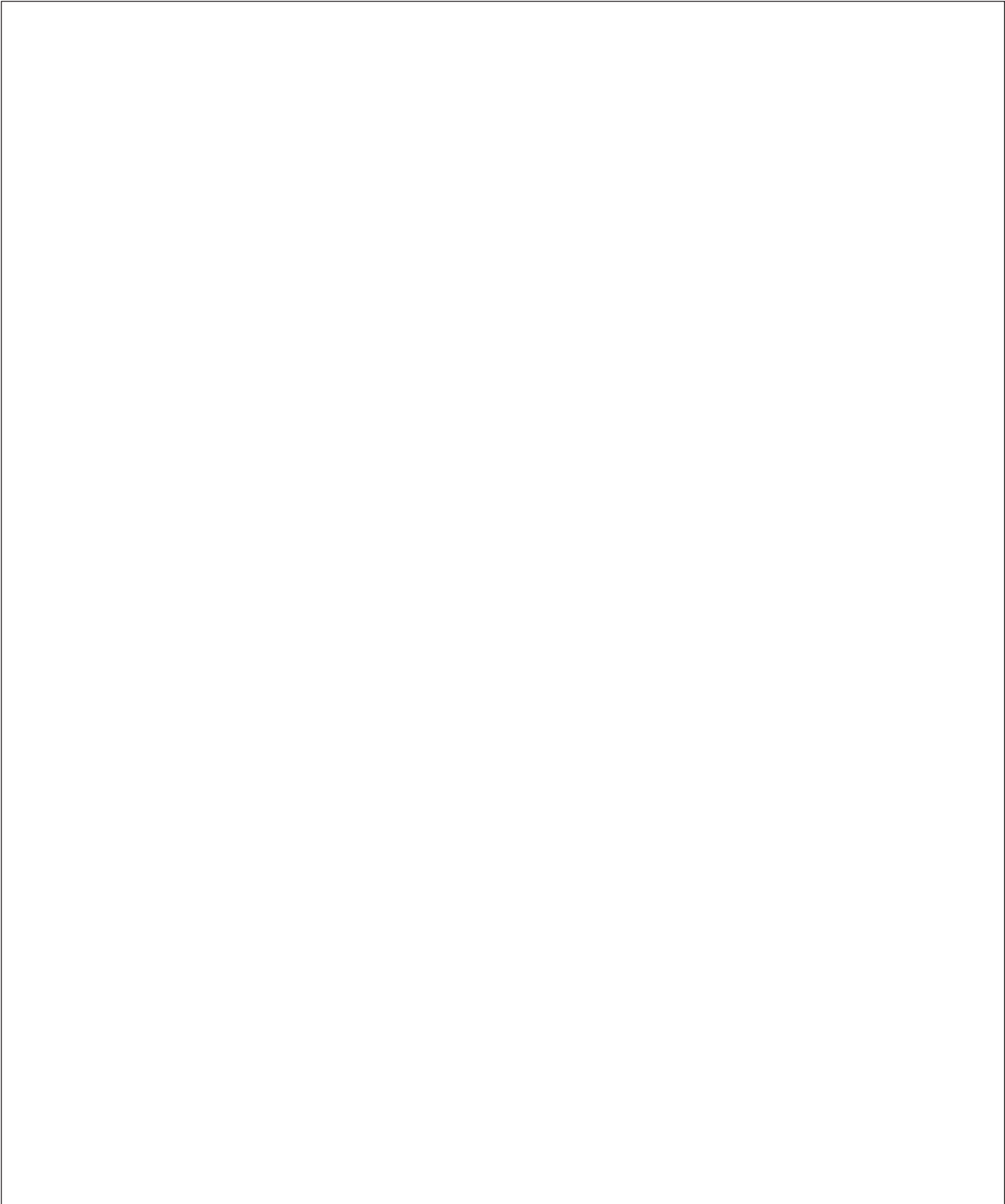

MEET THE TEAM

2020-21 Nebraska Rifle Seniors





RACHEL MARTIN

Head Coach (Second Year)

Rachel Martin was named the sixth head coach in the history of the Nebraska rifle program on April 9, 2019. She begins her second season in 2020-21 after finishing her Husker career as a student-athlete in 2016-17.

Martin led the Huskers to the NCAA Championships in her first season after the team missed them the year before. However, Nebraska never got the chance to compete on the national stage as the championships were canceled due to the Coronavirus pandemic. While Martin didn't get the opportunity to finish the season, she still had a major impact in her debut year. Martin led the Huskers to a third-place regular-season finish in the Great America Rifle Conference (GARC) and a fourth-place finish at the GARC Championships. Individually, Emily Cheramie took home the smallbore title while Macey Way finished third. Under Martin, the Huskers posted the highest score in school history (4,707) and the second-highest air rifle score in school history (2,373). Cheramie and Elena Flake also tied the highest individual air rifle score in school history (597) during the 2019-20 season. Martin also produced three All-Americans in Elena Flake, Hana Musser and Macey Way.

Martin brings extensive experience to Lincoln as a competitive shooter, and she also excelled in her first season as a collegiate rifle coach. Martin spent the 2018-19 season as an assistant coach at Army, where she helped the Black Knights to a sixth-place finish at the 2019 NCAA Championship, the program's first NCAA Championship appearance in four seasons. Individually, Martin helped Payne Nunn post the

highest air rifle score in program history en route to second-team All-America honors.

Martin is no stranger to high air rifle scores herself, as she owns the highest air rifle score in Nebraska history. She was also an NCAA champion and a seven-time All-American for the Huskers from 2014 to 2017. Martin earned All-America honors in both disciplines and was the 2015 NCAA smallbore champion. She competed in both disciplines at the NCAA Championship all four years of her career, posting a top-10 finish in both smallbore and air rifle. Her individual success helped Nebraska to four consecutive top-eight team finishes at the national meet, including a pair of top-five finishes.

After graduating from Nebraska in 2017, Martin moved to Colorado Springs to train at the United States Olympic Training Center. Martin has been a member of the USA Shooting World Cup team since 2013 and is a seven-time national champion. She spent more than a year as a resident athlete at the U.S. Olympic Training Center, during which time she also participated in a year-long internship with the 4th Judicial District Attorney's office in Colorado Springs.

Originally from Peralta, New Mexico, Martin was a three-time academic All-Big Ten selection and made the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll every semester of her career as a religious studies major and political science, global studies and national security studies minor. In addition to excelling in the range and in the classroom, Martin was also an active member of the community during her Husker career, as she was a four-year member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

Five-time All-American and 2021 Olympic hopeful Mindy Miles was hired as an assistant coach in April of 2019.

Miles helped lead the Huskers to the NCAA Championships in her first season after the team missed them the year before. However, Nebraska never got the chance to compete on the national stage as the championships were canceled due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

While Miles didn't get the opportunity to finish the season, she still had a major impact in her debut year. Miles helped the Huskers to a third-place regular-season finish in the Great America Rifle Conference (GARC) and a fourth-place finish at the GARC Championships. Individually, Emily Cheramie took home the smallbore title while Macey Way finished third. Additionally, the Huskers posted the highest score in school history (4,707) and the second-highest air rifle score in school history (2,373). Cheramie and Elena Flake also tied the highest individual air rifle score in school history (597) during the 2019-20 season. Miles also helped produce three All-Americans in Elena Flake, Hana Musser and Macey Way.

Miles was a three-time first-team NRA All-American in the air rifle for the Horned Frogs from 2016 through 2018. She was also a two-time NRA All-American in smallbore during her career (2017, 2018). She finished fifth in the air rifle and added a third-place NCAA finish in the smallbore to help TCU to a third-place team finish at the NCAA Championships.

Her 597.4 air rifle average as a senior ranked No. 2 in the nation, while her 583.7 smallbore average ranked No. 7 nationally in 2017-18.

As a junior in 2016-17, Miles led the nation in air rifle average (596.53), including a score of 599 at Alaska on Oct. 8. She finished fourth in the air rifle at the 2017 NCAA Championships with a score of 596.

Miles was the NCAA air rifle runner-up as a sophomore in 2016, while posting a season average of 594. She added the 2016 NCAA Sportsmanship Award.

As a freshman in 2015, Miles became just the fifth shooter in NCAA history and the second at TCU to shoot a perfect 600, which came in the air rifle at the Patriot Rifle Conference Championships on Feb. 8 to help the Horned Frogs to the team title. She added a second perfect 600 against Nebraska and Memphis on Oct. 28, 2017. Miles was a four-time Patriot Rifle Conference champion.

A 2020 U.S. Olympic hopeful, Miles secured a quota spot for the United States at the Olympic Games in Tokyo by winning gold in the air rifle at the Championship of the Americas in Guadalajara, Mexico in November of 2018. She won the competition with a score of 248.4 to lead a 1-2 finish for the United States along with silver medalist Alison Weisz. Miles is scheduled to compete again for the United States at the 2019 Pan American Games.

She was a two-time U.S. team member at the World Championships (2014, 2018).

Originally from Weatherford, Texas, Miles won the Texas State Junior Olympic Air Rifle titles in 2012 and 2013, while adding a smallbore championship in 2013. She was a Junior World Cup finalist in Suhl, Germany.

At the 2013 Junior Olympics, she earned a silver medal in air rifle and a bronze in smallbore. She was also a bronze medalist at the Rocky Mountain Air Rifle Championships in 2013.

Miles earned her bachelor's degree from TCU in May of 2018 after majoring in strategic communications with an emphasis in public relations and advertising and a minor in business. She was named the TCU Breakout Athlete of the Year in 2015 and was the TCU Pop Boone Award recipient in 2017.





RONNIE GREEN

Chancellor (Fifth Year)

State University, and as the national program leader for animal production research for the USDA's Agricultural Research Service and executive secretary of the White House's interagency working group on animal genomics within the National Science and Technology Council. Prior to returning to NU, Green served as senior global director of technical services for Pfizer Animal Health's animal genomics business.

Green has published 130 refereed publications and abstracts, nine book chapters and 56 invited symposia papers; and has delivered invited presentations in 43 U.S. states and 21 countries around the world. He is a past-president of both the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS) and the National Block and Bridle Club and has served in a number of leadership positions for the U.S. Beef Improvement Federation, National Cattlemen's Beef Association, National Pork Board, the National Research Council of the National Academy of Sciences, the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities, and Alpha Gamma Rho national fraternity. He currently is a member of a number of boards including the Big Ten Conference, Neogen Corporation, and Supporters of Agricultural Research, and was recently named to the Presidential Forum of the NCAA representing the Big Ten Conference. He was named a fellow of ASAS in 2014 and a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science in 2015, and he received the Morrison Award, the highest academic honor given to an animal scientist, in 2017.

Ronnie D. Green became the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's 20th chancellor on May 8, 2016.

Green previously served as the UNL Harlan Vice Chancellor of the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources and NU system Vice President for Agriculture and Natural Resources, and as UNL's interim Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. Green received bachelor's and master's degrees in animal science from Virginia Tech and Colorado State University, respectively. His doctoral program was completed jointly at the University of Nebraska and the USDA-ARS U.S. Meat Animal Research Center in animal breeding and genetics in 1988.

Green has served on the animal science faculties of Texas Tech University and Colorado

TED CARTER

University of Nebraska System President (First Year)

He also formed the nation's first accredited cyber operations major and accredited a nuclear engineering major at the Naval Academy. During his tenure, the academy was ranked as the nation's No. 1 public university by Forbes Magazine. Prior to that role, Carter was president of the U.S. Naval War College in Newport, R.I., where he led 1,600 resident students, 100,000-plus distance education students and 600 faculty and staff in graduate-level education.

Carter was a successful fundraiser in both roles, working with his foundations to raise a total of \$400 million in philanthropic support for academic programs. He also worked with Congress to direct \$120 million toward a new cyber operations building at the Naval Academy; the building will be named after Rear Admiral Grace Hopper, the first at any service academy to be named for a woman. Carter has extensive experience briefing members of Congress and has shared the stage at speaking events with Presidents Donald Trump and Jimmy Carter and Vice Presidents Mike Pence, Joe Biden and Dick Cheney.

Carter also boasts extensive military service, having graduated from the Navy Fighter Weapons School (Top Gun) in Miramar, Calif., in 1985. He was commander for the Carrier Strike Group Twelve, in which he commanded 20 ships, two nuclear-powered aircraft carriers and two carrier air wings that were deployed to Afghanistan and

Walter "Ted" Carter Jr. began his term as the University of Nebraska's eighth president on January 1, 2020.

Carter served as superintendent of the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md., from 2014 to 2019, the longest continuously serving superintendent in Annapolis by special request of the Secretary of the Navy and the Chief of Naval Operations. As superintendent - the Naval Academy's equivalent of a university president - Carter oversaw all functions of the institution, including leadership of 4,400 students and 1,500 faculty and staff, management of a \$500 million budget and oversight of academics, facilities, admissions and policy.

the Arabian Gulf. He is a naval flight officer with more than 6,300 flying hours, and has completed 2,016 carrier-arrested landings, an American record.

Carter earned his bachelor's degree in physics and oceanography from the U.S. Naval Academy. He also has educational credentials from the 18-month-long Navy Nuclear Power School, the U.S. Air Force Air War College, the Naval War College and the Armed Forces Staff College.

The son of an English teacher, Carter was raised in Burrillville, R.I., a rural, one-high school town in the northwest corner of the state where he became an accomplished clarinetist and baritone saxophone player. He and his wife, Lynda, have two adult children, Brittany and Christopher.

Honor the past. Live the present. Create the future. Nine simple words that carry impressive significance and undeniable responsibility. Words that Nebraska's new athletic director uses to lead his programs and set the tone for building champions in competition and in life.

William H. (Bill) Moos was named Nebraska's Athletic Director on Oct. 15, 2017, and fully assumed those responsibilities on Oct. 23.

Moos, who became the 15th athletic director in the history of the storied Cornhusker program, brought nearly 25 years of experience as an athletic director at three Division I schools (Washington State, Oregon, Montana) with him to Nebraska. More importantly, he brings an impressive track record of success in building outstanding programs, developing long-term relationships, and for doing what is best for his schools, its fans and most importantly, its student-athletes.

"When you name the top three, four, five athletic programs in the great positions as an athletic director, Nebraska is in that same breath," Moos said at his introductory press conference at Memorial Stadium. "I want you to know that my motto has always been, in the 25 years I have been a Division I athletic director and it will be here too is very simple - honor the past, live the present, create the future."

In his first six months at Nebraska, Moos made three coaching hires. He drew universal praise for hiring Scott Frost, the 2017 consensus national coach of the year, as Nebraska's head football coach in December. Following the spring semester, Moos also hired Mark Hankins to coach the men's golf team and Sean Maymi to lead the men's tennis program.

Nebraska made national headlines with the hiring of Fred Hoiberg as its new men's basketball coach in 2019. Moos made another impact move with the hiring of former Husker Will Bolt to lead the baseball program, after Major League All-Star, Gold Glove award winner and World Series champion Darin Erstad stepped down from his head coaching position after leading the Huskers to the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

Moos hired Lisa Johnson to lead the women's golf program after the retirement of long-time coach Robin Krapfl. He also hired long-time Husker assistant Paul Klempa to guide the nationally dominant bowling program after the retirement of the legendary Bill Straub, who led the program to five NCAA titles since 2004.

Former Husker national champions Heather Brink (women's gymnastics) and Rachel Martin (rifle) were also hired by Moos to lead those national championship-contending programs.

In competition, the Nebraska volleyball team claimed the 2017 NCAA title just months after Moos was hired, before adding an NCAA runner-up finish in 2018. Both the men's and women's gymnastics

teams finished in the top six at the 2018 NCAA Championships, before the men added a third-place team finish in 2019 - its best team showing since 1999. The bowling team added top-three national finishes in 2018 and 2019, while the wrestling team has produced top-10 NCAA finishes both seasons. The women's basketball team made the NCAA Tournament in 2018, while the baseball team advanced to NCAA Tournament play in 2019.

Nebraska also has continued its excellence in the classroom, producing 11 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans over the last three years, bringing NU's nation-leading total to 340 all-time CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.

Moos came to Lincoln after spending seven-plus years at Washington State (2010-17). He previously served 12 highly successful seasons as the athletic director at Oregon (1995-2007).

During his time at his alma mater, Moos wasted little time in making his impact felt in Cougar Athletics, spearheading a department-wide rebranding effort with Nike while securing a 10-year, \$35 million marketing rights agreement with IMG College.

In addition, the 2004 WSU Alumni Achievement Award winner gained Regents approval for a \$130 million addition and remodel of Martin Stadium, featuring a remodeled press box with luxury seating, including suites, loge boxes and club room.

Also included in the project was a state-of-the-art video board and an 80,000-square-foot football operations building that served as the stadium's showpiece and opened in May 2014.

As the dean of Pac-12 athletic directors, Moos was at the forefront of the conference's procurement of a 12-year, \$3 billion television contract with FOX and ESPN, a landmark agreement in college athletics. Under Moos' direction, the Cougar Athletic Fund's Annual Giving program saw an 81 percent increase in gifts while CAF donor members rose from nearly 4,000 to more than 7,500.

Additional facility enhancements under Moos included a center-hung video board in Beasley Coliseum that was installed prior to the 2011-12 season, giving Cougar basketball one of the premier fan experiences in the conference. An indoor golf hitting facility was also completed in early 2013, and Lower Soccer Field underwent a major renovation making the venue TV-ready while also providing one of the best playing surfaces on the West Coast, along with the addition of lights and a new scoreboard.

Other enhancements were made to the Moobery track facility, Bailey-Brayton Field, the basketball practice gym, Gibb Pool and the Simmelink indoor tennis courts. In Moos' seven years at WSU, Cougar student-athletes and coaches accounted for 805 academic all-conference selections, 130 all-conference accolades, 45 All-America honors and three Pac-12 Coach-of-the-Year honors.

Moos served as Oregon's director of athletics from July of 1995 to 2007. While at Oregon he oversaw a 17-sport athletic department that grew to national prominence during his tenure. Oregon's annual athletic department budget grew from \$18.5 million in his first year to more than \$40 million by 2007, becoming 100 percent self-sufficient during that time. Under his direction the Duck Athletic Fund donor base increased from 4,930 to 12,290, resulting in an annual gifts increase from \$4.1 million to \$15.3 million.

Moos initiated more than \$160 million in facility improvements while at Oregon. Included in that was the \$90 million Autzen Stadium renovation in 2002, which added 12,000 new seats, 32 new suites, a new Club at Autzen and a new press box to the

stadium. In his 12 years, the Ducks ranked first in Pac-10 football attendance 11 times, reaching 100 percent capacity in each of those seasons.

During Moos' tenure, Oregon athletics captured 13 Pac-10 championships across six different sports. He increased opportunities for women by adding two intercollegiate programs, soccer and lacrosse, and negotiated an all-inclusive shoe and apparel contract with Nike, one of only 14 in the country at the time. From an academic standpoint during Moos' tenure, Oregon student-athletes collected 722 academic all-conference selections, 34 Academic All-America selections, nine NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipients and one NCAA Top Ten Award.

During his first stint as a collegiate athletic director at Montana (1990-95), Moos created an academic support program and hired its first athletic academic coordinator, developed a facility enhancement plan that created more than \$4 million in improvements, and lifted the school's fund-raising efforts to show a 300 percent increase in private and corporate gifts.

Academically, Montana student-athletes were equally successful as the athletic department achieved a graduation rate 20 percent higher than the general university enrollment. Under Moos' watch Montana garnered 269 academic all-conference selections, five Academic All-Americans and two NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipients.

Moos began his athletic career as an athletic administrator in 1982 as assistant athletic director at Washington State. He also served as the school's associate athletic director (1988-90).

At Washington State, he was director of development for more than five years and associate director for nearly two years, supervising all external operations. Prior to that, he managed and owned private businesses in Washington and Oregon for eight years. He was a student assistant football coach at Washington State for the 1973 season, then spent part of 1974 in Washington, D.C., serving as a government intern.

Raised on a wheat and cattle ranch in eastern Washington, Moos attended high school in Olympia when his father served in the governor's cabinet. Moos earned his bachelor's degree in history from WSU and was a three-year letterman in football before concluding his collegiate career by representing Washington State in the 1972 East-West Shrine All-Star Game in San Francisco.

He served as co-captain on the Cougars' 1972 squad and garnered first-team All-Pac-8 Conference honors. Moos and his wife Kendra have three daughters: Christa, Brittany and Kaiti; and two sons, Bo and Benjamin.

Faculty Athletic Representative (First Year)

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to Chancellor Ronnie Green and consults with Athletic Director Bill Moos. The representative splits academic year time equally between academic responsibilities and faculty representative duties.

"The faculty athletics representative plays a key role as a leader dedicated to protecting and enhancing the student-athlete experience both here at Nebraska and across the NCAA," Green said in announcing Fuess' appointment. "Scott has needed experience with intercollegiate athletics and in training the next generation of athletics administrators. I know he will serve in distinction, continuing Nebraska's tradition as a national leader in the student-athlete experience."

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18.

"It's an honor to serve the university as its faculty athletics representative," Fuess said. "I embrace the challenge to uphold and advance the university's well-earned reputation for

supporting student-athlete academic success, as well as our renown for ethical leadership in intercollegiate sports."

In August 2018, Fuess was named director of the university's cross-disciplinary master's degree program that offers a specialization in intercollegiate athletics administration. The program - which has been completed by 48 Huskers - is built on MBA coursework, allowing students to earn hands-on experiences through Nebraska Athletics, industry professionals, other universities and alumni.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests revolve around issues of economics, primarily in labor, collegiate athletics and Japan.

Scott M. Fuess Jr. was named the University of Nebraska-Lincoln faculty athletics representative on Feb. 21, 2020. He officially began his new role on July 1, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. Areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, NCAA compliance, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference meetings.



EMILY CHERAMIE

Senior Georgetown, Kentucky (Lexington Catholic)

SOPHOMORE (2018-19)

Cheramie played a key role for the Huskers. She competed in 15 matches over the course of her sophomore season, firing team-high scores on multiple occasions. By the conclusion of the season, Cheramie had increased her career averages in both smallbore (578.13) and air rifle (585.43). In the match against Coast Guard she tied her own personal best in smallbore (585) for the fourth time. She set a new career-high mark of 593 in air rifle against Memphis.

Cheramie earned honorable mention All-GARC honors in both smallbore and combined guns at the annual Conference awards banquet. She was also counted as a leader off the range as a member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

FRESHMAN (2017-18)

Cheramie made an immediate impact as a freshman. She led the team with an average smallbore score of 577.73 for the season. Cheramie was honored with a place on the second-team all-conference smallbore team at the annual GARC awards banquet. Cheramie also posted air rifle scores in 12 matches, including a season-best 591.

She also won the 4-H state championship in air rifle three times and claimed the 4-H state title twice in both precision smallbore and precision air rifle. Additionally, she was an 11-time 4-H district champion and a four-time 4-H district runner-up.

Way posted a career-best score of 585 in smallbore and at the GARC Championships, Way claimed the bronze medal in smallbore. However, it was in air rifle that Way really made an impact for the team. Way averaged 591.71 - the highest air rifle average for a freshman in Nebraska school history and the third-highest average among all classes. She shot at least 590 in all but two competitions for Nebraska and posted 596 against Navy which is one point shy of the school record. MARTIN LEADS NU IN RECORD-BREAKING SEASON



The Nebraska rifle team entered a new era in 2019-20 when former Husker All-American and national champion Rachel Martin took over as head coach for the Huskers. In her debut season and alongside assistant coach Mindy Miles, Martin helped the Huskers break several school records and qualify for the 2020 NCAA Championships after missing out on NAAs the previous year.

However, Nebraska never got the chance to compete on the national stage as the championships were canceled due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

While Martin didn't get the opportunity to finish the season, she still had a major impact in her debut year. Martin led the Huskers to a third-place regular-season finish in the Great America Rifle Conference (GARC) and a fourth-place finish at the GARC Championships. Individually, Emily Cheramie took home the smallbore title while Macey Way finished third.

Under Martin, the Huskers posted the highest score in school history (4,707) and the second-highest air rifle score in school history (2,373). Cheramie and Elena Flake also tied the highest individual air rifle score in school history (597) during the 2019-20 season. Martin also produced three All-Americans in Elena Flake, Hana Musser and Macey Way.

NU kicked off the season by competing against Ohio State in Fort Wayne, Ind., on Oct. 5. Martin picked up her first win as a head coach as the Huskers topped the Buckeyes 4,651-4,635.

The following weekend, Nebraska hosted top-ranked West Virginia at the NU Rifle Range on Oct. 12. Flake tied the school record with an air rifle score of 597 but the Huskers couldn't overcome the Mountaineers, falling 4,719-4,642.

After a week off, Nebraska competed against Air Force, Kentucky and UTEP on Oct. 26 in Colorado Springs, Colo. The Huskers placed third in the match with a score of 4,636. The following

day, Nebraska lost to Air Force, 4,664-4,646. The Huskers shot well in air rifle, capturing three of the top five places as individuals. NU's air rifle performance was highlighted three score above 590. Elena Flake fired 596, nearly matching her school-record 597 from two weeks prior. Macey Way posted a then career-best score of 595 and Kinga Aletto, though not squadded, set a new career best with 591. Flake earned second place individually overall. Although not squadded, Mari Butler set a new career best with 588.

On Nov. 9, Nebraska returned home and welcomed Army West Point to Lincoln. The Huskers put together a complete performance to defeat the sixth-ranked Black Knights, 4,677-4,639.

The next weekend the Huskers traveled to Fort Worth, Texas, to compete against TCU and Memphis on Nov. 16. NU finished third with a score of 4,662. The next day, Nebraska looked to bounce back against Memphis but narrowly missed the opportunity, falling 4,669-4,666.

After a two-month break the Huskers were scheduled to take on Ole Miss on Jan. 18 but the match was canceled due to weather affecting travel schedules. Instead, NU opened up 2020 by defeating Navy, 4,671-4,661 in Maryland on Jan. 19. Emily Cheramie led the team in smallbore with a 585 while Way set a new career high in air rifle with a 596.

On Jan. 25, TCU topped Nebraska at home, 4,709-4,686. Despite the loss, several Huskers fired career-high scores. In smallbore Flake led the Huskers with a career-high 589, the highest smallbore score from any Husker of the season and a new career-best for Flake.

Hana Musser followed with 585, a new career-best, and Emily Cheramie added 581. Shooting independently, Macey Way also set a new career-best score with 582. Cheramie was out front for the Huskers in air rifle, firing a career-high 596. She was followed closely by Flake with 593 and

Macey Way with 590. Flake's total combined score of 1,182 was highest on the day for either team.

Nebraska also celebrated senior day against the Horned Frogs, honoring Kayla Gadenken, Maddie Korthas, Samantha Peterson and Bailey Powell for their commitment and dedication to the rifle program.

The Huskers got hot in the month of February, winning four straight matches. On Feb. 2, Nebraska beat NC State, 4,685-4,663 in Raleigh, N.C. On Feb. 8, NU topped Akron, 4,687-4,677, posting the third-highest total team score in school history at the time. On Feb. 14, Nebraska beat Ole Miss, 4,675-4,665 with help from an air rifle score of 2,368, which was the second-highest air rifle school in school history at the time.

On Feb. 22 the Huskers competed against Murray State at the NCAA Qualifiers. Not only did the Huskers beat Murray State (4,707-4,685) and qualify for the NCAA Championships, but they also posted the first-ever score over 4,700. The score of 4,707 was the highest in school history by a significant margin, surpassing the previous high of 4,693 set on Feb. 13, 2005. The total air rifle team score of 2,373 was the second-highest in program history as well, while the total smallbore score of 2,334 was the fifth-highest in program history. Individually, Cheramie tied the air rifle school record with a 597.

At the GARC Championships on Feb. 28-29 in Memphis, Tenn., Nebraska placed fourth with a total two-day score of 4,678. In smallbore, Nebraska had two medalists. Emily Cheramie claimed the conference title with a finals score of 460.2. Cheramie advanced to the finals after a scoring 582 in the qualifying round. Macey Way took third overall with a total finals score of 442.1 and a qualifying score of 584.

At the GARC Banquet, Nebraska was recognized for its third-place regular-season finish. Individually, senior captain Maddie Korthas was named the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete. Emily Cheramie and Hana Musser earned All-GARC honorable-mention in smallbore. Elena Flake and Macey Way earned All-GARC second-team honors in air rifle. Flake earned second-team honors in the combined category, while Cheramie was named an honorable-mention in combined guns.

Nebraska would have competed as a team in the 2020 NCAA Championships March 13-14, but the competition was canceled due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

Several Huskers were honored with postseason awards. Flake notched two awards from the NRA, earning second-team All-America honors in both smallbore and air rifle. Additionally, Flake was named a CRCA third-team All-American (combined). Freshmen Hana Musser and Macey Way also earned All-America honors from the NRA. Musser was recognized in smallbore as an honorable mention, while Way was a second-team air rifle pick.

Additionally, eight Huskers were named CRCA Scholastic All-Americans including Samantha Peterson, Maddie Korthas, Kayla Gadenken, Bailey Powell, Macey Way, Hana Musser, Elizabeth Ewert and Elizabeth Lorentz.

GREAT AMERICA RIFLE CONFERENCE

Nebraska joined the Great America Rifle Conference in 2004-05 after seven years as an independent program. The conference, which enters its 24th year of operation, includes Nebraska, Army West Point, Kentucky, Memphis, Mississippi, West Virginia, Navy, Akron and North Carolina State.



Before joining the organization, the Huskers faced nearly a month-long break between qualifiers and the NCAA Championships. As a member of the GARC, Nebraska can compete for the conference championship in the interim, allowing it to gauge its performance before heading to nationals. Since joining the GARC, Nebraska has finished as high as a program-best second place at the ensuing NCAA Championships.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING

Eight academic counselors, three learning specialists, two assistant academic counselors and one computer specialist are in place to monitor daily academic progress, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, unlimited tutorial support from approximately 75-100 tutors on staff is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. The tutorial program is certified as a model tutoring program by the College Reading and Learning Association.

STUDY HALL

Nebraska's study hall program is housed in the Scott Technology Center within the Student Life Complex. Student-athletes attend a supervised, flex-time study hall that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student-athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week as determined by their academic counselor and/or coach. Additional performance-based or tutor-based study hall also may be determined by the academic counselor.

MENTORING

Academic support staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes and select returning student-athletes. The student-athletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor, or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a consulting neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators, and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across campus.

PERSONAL COUNSELING

Student-athletes will find a supportive and caring environment at Nebraska. Transitional issues, stress management, time management, academic focus and problem resolution are all addressed in a proactive manner throughout the year. If necessary, counseling referrals are also made to designated practitioners.

COMPUTER RESOURCES

New laptops are provided to all student-athletes for use during their academic career at Nebraska. The Herman Student Life Complex has printers and desktop computers available for student-athletes to use in the facility.

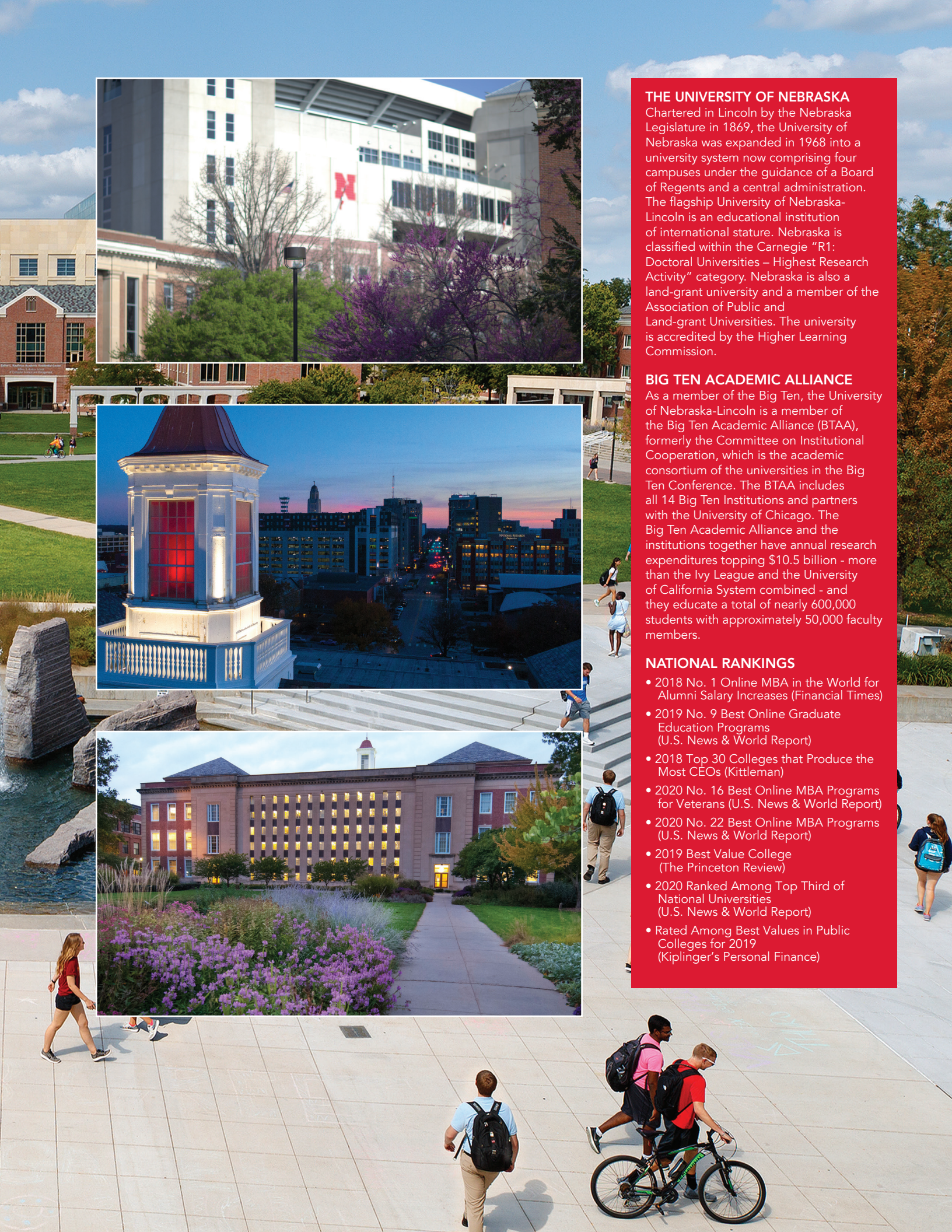

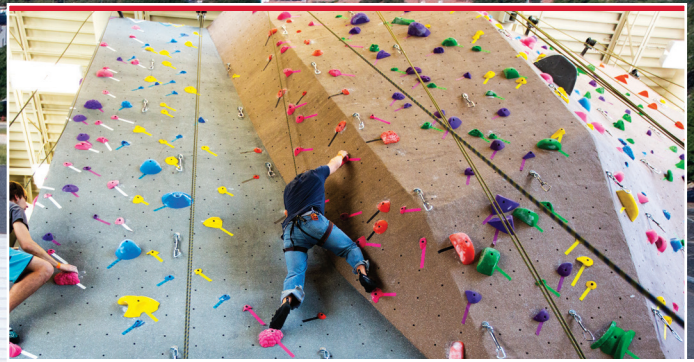
